- Para. 229, line 13, for the words "first five miles" to "gravelled" substitute "whole of its length, 42 miles, in the district".*
- Line 20, for the words "for 25 miles and a fairly smooth one" substitute "throughout its length in the district 53½ miles and is".*
- Line 22, add after "the 54th mile". "the crossing of the river Bila in the 36th mile being the only obstacle".*
- Line 28, for the words "32 out of 35 miles in the district are" substitute "the whole length in the district is".*
- Line 29, delete "(1904)."*
- Para. 230, line 8, for the words "eight or ten" substitute "four or five".*
- Line 20, for "half the distance of 28 miles" substitute "the whole distance of 25½ miles".*

- Para. 283, end, delete the words from "and an Executive Engineer" to end and substitute "Till recently there was also an Executive Engineer in charge of a Public Works Division but Saugor is now only the headquarters of a sub-division with an Assistant Engineer in residence".*
- Para. 287, add "The revenue derived from country liquor in 1911-12 was Rs. 84,942, this being the highest point yet reached. The contract supply system has been introduced; and a higher rate of duty has been fixed for Saugor town and the surrounding country than for the out-lying parts of the district."*

Para. 288, add "The revenue derived from opium in 1911-12 was Rs. 28,088 and from ganja Rs. 19,538, 49 shops are licensed for the sale of opium, and 50 for ganja. The consumption of ganja has greatly increased, and the duty was raised in 1911 and again in 1912."

Para. 289, "The district has six registration offices, including that of the District Registrar at headquarters, Sub Registration offices at each tahsil, and one other office at Decri in Rehli tahsil. The sub-office that formerly existed at Sehora has been abolished and the sub-district amalgamated with the Saugor sub-district. The receipts from registration were Rs. 4,500 at the commencement of the decade 1901—1911, and rose to Rs. 8,000 in 1909 owing to the amendment of the Limitation Act. At the end of the decade they again declined, to Rs. 6,600".

Para. 291, "The average income of the Saugor Municipality for the decade ending 1911 was Rs. 80,000, the average municipal income per head being Rs. 2-7-3."

Para. 292, "The Village Sanitation Act has been in force in Rahatgarh since 1-10-1906."

Para. 293, "A new Civil Court-house has just been completed at a cost of Rs. 57,600."

For para. 294 read: "The total sanctioned strength of the police force is 643 officers and men, this number including 40 officers and 7 mounted constables. A special trained reserve of 54 men under command of a European sergeant is maintained for dealing with serious crime in Saugor and the adjoining districts. A force of one officer and 34 men is stationed in the Cantonment. The district has usually a Superintendent, District Assistant and Deputy Superintendent, 7 Inspectors, 30 Sub-Inspectors and 3 Sergeants. A small body of Railway Police is maintained at Saugor and Bina Railway Stations, and this is under the orders of the Superintendent, Government Railway Police. Owing to the proximity of the Native States of Bhopal, Gwalior and Panna, great difficulty is experienced in dealing effectually with crime in the border villages, and the district is subject to the inroads of dacoits and robbers from the States.

The native police is almost equally recruited from Saugor and the adjoining districts, and from the upcountry districts of the United Provinces. Brahmins and Muhammadans predominate in its ranks. The total annual cost of the police is Rs. 1,54,000. The whole of the 26 outposts, with the exception of one or two on the more important highways which have been converted into road-posts, were abolished

in 1908 in accordance with the new scheme proposed by the Police Commission. The district has now 21 station houses. These station houses are located at Saugor City and Cantonment, Naraoli, Rahatgarh, Jaisinagar, Surkhi, Sanodha in the Saugor tahsil; Khurai, Etawah, Khimlasa, Bandri, Malthone, in the Khurai tahsil; Rehli, Deori, Garhakota, Maharajpur, Kesli, in the Rehli tahsil and Banda, Baretha, Behrol, and Shahgarh in the Banda tahsil.

A training school for Sub-Inspectors of police has since 1906 been established in Saugor City. The average number of students is 65; these after a course of training extending over a year, are deputed as Sub-Inspectors on probation to all districts of the Central Provinces and Berar."

Para. 297, page 209, line 27, after the words "88 %" add the following sentence: "In 1911-12 there were 564 pupils, i.e., 186 boys in the high school and 378 in the middle school classes, the average attendance being 85 percent and the annual expenditure Rs. 26,312. Owing to the large increase in numbers during the last five years the present school building is now too small to accommodate them all, and another is shortly to be built on the out-skirts of the town for the high school classes."

At the end of the paragraph the following note supplementing the information given in the latter half of the paragraph may be added:—

"The important changes that have taken place during the last decade are—the abolition of the combined and the result-aided systems in 1902; the provincialization of the girls' schools in 1903; the transfer of branches of English schools from the charge of the head masters of the latter to that of the Deputy Inspectors of Schools in 1907-08; and the improvement in the pay and prospects of vernacular teachers. The system of payment by the result of annual examinations was considered to foster cramming and was therefore discarded. The schools in the rural tracts worked on the combined and the results-aided systems were, with the exception of such as did not seem likely to do any useful work, converted into Board schools under District Council management, and those within Municipal limits were allowed a fixed annual grant. On 31st March 1912, there were in the district 130 vernacular schools, recognized by the Education Department, of which 101 were for boys and 29 for girls with 8,080 boys and 1,793 girls in them showing an increase of 2,048 boys and 503 girls over the figures for 1902-03

Out of 130 schools, 25 are maintained by the department, 83 by the District Council and 10 by Municipalities, 10 are aided on the fixed grant system and the remaining 2 are unaided. There are first grade vernacular middle schools at Rehli, Garhakota Rahatgarh, Shahgarh, Gourjhamar, Jaisinagar, Saugor, Khurai Deori and Etawah, the first six being under District Council management and the remaining four under Municipal management. The first two were organized in 1911, as selected middle schools, their chief duty being to prepare suitable candidates for admission into the normal school for men. There are also two vernacular middle schools for girls, one at Saugor and the other at Khurai which have training classes attached to them and present and pass candidates at the female teachers' certificate examination. The total expenditure on vernacular education in the district for the year 1911-12 was Rs. 75,983, from Provincial Revenues Rs. 42,520, the District Fund Rs. 12,312, the Municipal funds Rs. 12,684 Fees Rs. 3,330, and all other sources Rs. 5,137. This large increase in expenditure is mainly due to the improvement in the pay and prospect of teachers and the provision of school buildings. The decade under report has been a period of progress, the increase in scholars being 85 per cent within Municipal, and 10 per cent, within District Council limits. The percentage of enrolment to children of school-going age is 23 for boys and 4.6 for girls."

Page 242, line 9, for the words "The Tahsil offices are located in the Fort" read "The Tahsil offices were till the present year (1912) located in the Fort, but have now been removed to new buildings near the Railway Station."

Page 255, line 8, delete the words "a detachment of British infantry is in contemplation" and add "The cavalry school, providing an eight months, course (from August to March for Native Officers and from September to April for British Officers and non-commissioned officers) for officers selected from the various British and Indian cavalry regiments in India, was started here in 1910. A nucleus wireless telegraph company is also stationed here, and Saugor is to be an important centre for this branch of military communications."

For the last sentence of the "Descriptive and Historical" para. on page 257 read: "There are three large and eight small mosques. A public library, known as the Edward Library, in commemoration of King Edward VII, has

recently been established in the Town Hall. It contains a large selection of English and Vernacular books. The Police Officers' Training School, which was started on 1st January 1906, is located in the Fort."

To the para. on "Municipal undertaking," add the following note:—"The proprietor of Saugor is now Jagannath Prasad, son of the late Har Prasad Dube. The total population within Municipal limits according to the census of 1911 is 34,876. The area of Municipal Nazul is 868 acres, including the lake. The Municipality has 27 miles of metalled road under its management. Extensive drainage and water works schemes are in contemplation."

To the para. on "Trade" add "Saugor is the centre of a large export trade in grain, hides, and dried meat. There is one slaughter-house near the town and others at Rahatgarh and Khurai."

For the passage beginning "Attached to the High School" and ending "Eurasian children," *substitute:—*

"There are a Vernacular Middle School and 5 Primary Schools with a total of 1,180 pupils, under the management of the Municipal Committee. These are not now attached to the High School, but are under the direct supervision of the Deputy Inspector of Schools. There are also two Government Schools, four Mission schools and one private School for girls, and one private Vernacular school, one Mission School and two private Primary Schools for boys. Urdu is taught in one Primary School, Marathi in one and Hindi in the rest. The grant to the Saugor Marathi School was discontinued in 1907. There is a Roman Catholic Orphanage about two miles from Saugor at Shampura, and there are five other unrecognised institutions."
