PREAMBLE

Extracts from the original Preamble to the Constitution of the Society written by the illustrious founder the Late Gopal Krishna Gokhale, in 1905.

For some time past the conviction has been forcing itself on many earnest and thoughtful minds that a stage has been reached in the work of nation-building in India when, for further progress the devoted labours of a specially trained agency applying itself to the task in a true missionary spirit are required. The work that has been accomplished so far has indeed been of the highest value. The growth during the last 101 years of a feeling of common nationality based upon common traditions and ties, common hopes and aspirations, and even common disabilities has been most striking. The fact that we are Indians first, and Hindus, Mohammedans, Parsees or Christains afterwards is being realised in a steadily increasing measure, and the idea of a united and renovated India marching onwards to a place among the nations of the world, worthy of the great past, is no longer a mere idle dream of a few imaginative minds, but is the definitely accepted creed of those who form the brain of the communitythe educated classes of the country. A creditable beginning has already been made in matters of education and of localself-government; and all classes of the people are slowly but steadily coming under the influence of liberal ideas. The claims of public life are every day receiving wider recognition, and attachment to the land of our birth is gorwing into a strong and deeply cherished passion of the heart. The annual meetings of Congresses and conferences, the work of public bodies and associations, the writing in the columns of the Indian Press-all bear witness to the new life that is coursing in the veins of the people. The results achieved sofar are undoubtedly most gratifying, but they only mean that the jungle has been cleared and the foundations laid. The great work of rearing the

superstructure has yet to be taken in hand, and the situation demands on the part of workers devotion and sacrifices proportionate to the magnitude of the task.

The Servants of India Soceity has been established to meet in some measure these requirements of the situation. Much of the work must be directed towards building up in the country a higher type of Character and capacity than is generally available at present, and the advance can only be slow. Moreover, the path is beset with great difficulties; there will be constant temptations to turn back; bitter disappointment will repeatedly try the faith of those who have put their hand to the work. But the weary toil can have but one end, if only the workers grow not faint-hearted on the way. One essential condition of success in this work is that a sufficient number of your countrymen must now come forward to devote themselves to the cause in the sprit in which religious work is undertaken. Public life must be spiritualised. Love of country must so fill the heart that all else shall appear as of little moments by its side. A fervent partriotism which rejoices at evry opportunity of sacrifice for the motherland, a dauntless heart which refueses to be turned back from its objects by difficulty or danger, a deep faith in the purpose of providence which nothing can shake equipped with these, the worker must start on his mission and reverently seek the joy which comes of spending oneself in the service of one's country.

The Servants of India Society will train men, prepared to devote their lives to the cause of the country in a religious spirit and will seek to promote, by all constitutional means the national interest of the Indian People. Its members will direct their efforts principally towards (1) creating among the people by example and by precept, a deep and passionate love of the motherland, seek its highest fulfilment in service and sacrifice; (2) organising the work of political education and agitation, basing it on a careful study of public questions and strengthening generally the public life of the country; (3) promoting relations of cordial good will and co-operation among the different communities; (4) assisting educational movements especially those for the industrial development of the women, the education of backward classes and industrial scientific education; (5) helping forward the industrial development of the country; (6) the elevation of the depressed classes.

VOWS:

The country shall always be the first in my thought and I will give to her service the best that is in me.

In serving the country I will seek no personal advantage for myself.

I will regard all Indians as brothers and work for the advancement of all without distinction of caste or creed.

I will be content with such provision for myself and my family, as the Society may be able to make. I will devote no part of my energies to earning money for myself.

I will lead a pure personal life.

I will engage in no personal quarrel with any one.

I will always keep in view the aims of the Society, and watch over its interest with the utmost zeal, doing all I can to advance its work. I will never do anything, which is inconsistent with the objects of the Society.

REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2006-2007 INTRODUCTION

The Servants of India Society was founded by Gopal Krishna Gokhale on June 12, 1905. Its objects are the training of national missionaries for the service of India and the promotion by all constitutional means, of the interest of the Indian people without distinction of caste or creed. The members of the Society are pledged to give throughout their lives the best that is in them to the cause of the country in all secular fields. The circumstances in which the Society was founded and the objects, which the Founder had in view in founding it, are explained in the preamble he wrote to its constitution in 1905, extracts from which are given in the preceeding two pages. The Preamble has been a source of inspiration to the Society during the 102 years of its existence.

ORGANISATION

The Headquarters of the Society are at Pune, where the members meet every year in June for its annual session. The Society has branches in Chennai, Mumbai, Nagpur, Allahabad, Cuttack, Raygada and Kerala.

Shri A. N. Misra is the President of the Society. Shri M. B. Deshmukh is the Secretary of the Society. Shri S. S. Ajgaonkar, Shri R. V. Neve, Shri A. C. Tripathi, Shri Gangadhar Sahoo, Shri Dinesh Misra continued to be the Members of Nagpur, Mumbai, Cuttack and Allahabad branches of the Society respectively. The Chennai Branch was looked after by the head quaters. Shri A. N. Mishra, Ramakanta Lenka, Shri S. S. Ajgaonkar, Shri R. V. Neve, Shri A. C. Tripathi, Shri Gangadhar Sahoo were elected members of the Council.

INCOME TAX

The Society furnished to all the banks necessary application in form 15 H, so that no tax is deducted at source by all banks.

BRANCH ACTIVITIES OF THE SOCIETY SHRI ATMA NAND MISRA

Shri Atma Nand Misra continued to be a member of the Advisory Committee of Uttar Pradesh Vidyalaya Prabandhak Mahasabha (U. P. Manager's Association) as well as the Zonal Secretary of Vindhyachal Division. He attended two meetings of the Advisory committee and two meetings of the State Body during the year under report.

Shri Misra continued to be the Joint Secretary of Girivasi Banvasi Seva Prakalp, Varanasi which is doing a lot of work for Tribal Development in Varansi, Chandauli and Sonebhadra district without any Government grant. He attended almost all the four meetings of the Prakalp held during the year under report.

He was nominated as a member of the Bhartiya Itihas Sankalan Samiti by the Kashi Vidyapith through which they are trying to go deeply in the history of struggle for freedom of India (from 1857 to 1947) but unfortunately so far he could attend only one meeting of the Samiti held on the 10th December 2006. Thereafter, he could not attend any meeting convined by them because of one reason or another.

Being the Chairman of the Board of Management of Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics Shri Misra presided almost all the four meetings of the Board held during the year under report. Apart from this, he faced the expert Committee sent by the U.G.C. to enquire in to the complaints made by some busybodies against Shri P.K. Dwivedi, the then our Acting President and consequently the Chairman of the Board of Management. Shri Misra pleaded Society's side before the committee and tried to justify the action taken by Shri Dwivedi.

Being Secretary of the Mirzapur Centre of the Society, he looked after the day to day management of the Schemes approved by the Government of India (Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment) viz. Ten Primary Schools, Five Women's Welfare Centre, Ashram School Siltham, SC Boys Hostel Ghuwas and Girls Ashram School Khaliyari. Members are aware that grants for these schemes have not been released from the year 1998 which was a great hurdle in smooth management of these schemes. Shri Misra made his best efforts to get the grants released during the year under report as a result of which the Government of India deputed an Under Secretary who has inspected all the schemes and submitted fovaourable report in the first week of March 2007 which is under process.

Apart from the abovementioned schemes, Shri Misra looked after overall functioning and development of the schemes approved by the State Government i.e. Three Junior High Schools, Six Primary Schools and Two SC Boys Hostels and self dependent schemes viz. Adivasi Inter College Siltham, Birla Vidya Mandir High School / Intermediate College Muirpur, Raja Baldeo Das Birla Soneghati Higher Secondary School Salkhan and Ayurvedic Dispensary at Tikuriya. A detailed report on the working of these schemes is submitted separately. Members will feel glad to learn that our Birla Vidya Mandir High School Muirpur has been upgraded to Intermediate College and it has received the recognition of Uttar Pradesh Education Department in the month of August 2006.

Now our only one High School viz. Raja Baldeo Das Birla Songhati Higher Secondary School is remaining to be upgraded to Intermediate College for which Shri Misra has started making necessary efforts.

ADIVASI INTER COLLEGE, SILTHAM - SONEBHADRA

The college is being run without any Grant-in-aid and is depending upon the income from fees only. As a result of this, we are unable to appoint required number of teachers and to allow the admission of all the students who seek admission in this college, though recognition for almost all the subjects except Agriculture and Commerce has been received and eight class rooms were constructed with the generous help of local people and Shri Ram Shakal, Ex. M. P. during his tenure out of local area Development Fund (i.e. M. P. Fund).

This college has got good name and fame in the area and is famous for its standard of education. Details of beneficiaries during the year under report is given below:-

BIRLA VIDYA MANDIR HIGH SCHOOL/INTER COLLEGE, MUIRPUR - SONEBHADRA

The Birla Vidya Mandir High School was upgraded to Intermediate College during the year under report. From the last three years efforts were being made to get the recognition for Intermediate College from the U.P. Education Board. Ultimately in the month of August 2006 we received the recognition.

The College is run without any grant-in-aid and is depending upon the income from the fees only. As a result of this, we are unable to appoint required number of teachers and to allow the admission of all the students who seek admission in this college, though adequate building was constructed by the generous help of Hindalco, Shri Ram Shakal the Ex. M. P. and the Shaktinagar Area Development Authority (SADA).

The college has got good name & fame in the area and is famous for its standard of education. Details of beneficiaries during the year under report is given below:-

PRIMARY SCHOOLS (SIXTEEN)

Out of these Sixteen (16) Primary Schools Two (2) were located in the Mirzapur district and Fourteen (14) were located in the Sonebhadra district. Of these Four (4) Primary Schools of Sonebhadra and two primary schools of Mirzapur district were financed by the U. P. Social Welfare Department and remaining ten primary schools of the Sonebhadra district were financed by the Government of India, Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment (SCD Division). All these schools are duly recognized by the U. P. Education Department and are regularly inspected by its inspectorate.

Out of these 16 primary schools, eight (8) have their own pucea buildings and remaining 6 have Kachcha buildings.

ASHRAM SCHOOL SILTHAM, SONEBHADRA

The Ashram provides free residential accommodation, fooding clothing, oil and soap and reading and writing materials to 100 SC students. Of these 100 SC inmates 20 were reading in class VIth, 25 in Class VIIth, 24 in class VIIIth, 24 in class IXth and 07 in class Xth in the Adivasi Inter College Siltham run by the Society.

GIRLS ASHRAM SCHOOL KHALIYARI - SONEBHADRA

The Ashram provides free residential accommodation, fooding, clothing, oil and soap and reading and writing materials to 50 SC girls of whom 16 in were reading in class Ist, 8 in class IInd, 10 in class IIIrd, 12 in class IVth and 4 in class Vth in the primary school attached with the Ashram.

SC BOYS HOSTEL GHUWAS - SONEBHADRA

The Hostel provides free residential accommodation, fooding, clothing, oil and soap and reading and writing materials to 50 SC students of whom 19 were reading in class Ist, 12 in class IInd, 9 in class IIIrd, 6 in class IVth and 4 in class Vth in the Primary school Ghuwas run by the Society.

HOSTEL FOR SC BOYS (TWO)

During the year, Shri Tripathi persuaded case filed by Shri Bachau and Sons Contractor and eviction of unauthorized occupants of Kahatik in the district court at Allahabad.

Besides these, as a Member In-charge Shri Tripathi looked after the management of various schemes in Allahabad and Mirzapur districts of Uttar Pradesh running under Servants of India Society, in the guidance and instruction of his Senior Member.

Name of the Schemes and their brief reports are given below:

ASHRAM TYPE SCHOOL KHANTARA

With financial help from Govt. of India, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi. The School was maintained by the Society at Khantara in Mirzapur District.

During the session 2006-2007 the beneficiaries' no. on the roll was 60 who were from the SC communities. The Ashram School provided books and stationary fooding, lodging and clothing facilities to the students free of charges.

The total expenditure on the maintenance of the school was Rs. 5,48,470.50 during the year under report.

DR. KUNZRU PRIMARY AND JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL

The school was maintained with its own resources for the educational advancement of the poor students.

During the session no. of students on roll was 95. The total expenditure on the maintenance of the school was Rs. 71,121.00.

As Resident member of the Allahabad Centre Shri Tripathi was looking after the day to day management of Working Women Hostel as well as Jeewan Sathi Guest House in Allahabad.

SHRI GANGADHAR SAHOO

Shri Gangadhar Sahoo looked into the regular activities of the units of the Choudwar Centre of the Servants of India Society, assigned to him.

During the year, Shri Sahoo paid regular visits and looked into the smooth management of 20 Creche Centres and 5 E.C.E. Centres run in the villages of Tangi-Choudwar and Athgargh Block of Cuttack District along with Choudwar Muncipality. In these centers more than 700 children within the age group of 0-6 years are being provided with supplementary nutrition and education through play way method in a beautiful homely atmosphere. 50 nos. of trained lady workers are engaged in these centers to take care of the children. Shri Sahoo attended several meetings and get together of villages of the concerned villages, adopted for Creche and ECE activities. He also attended zonal committee meeting of staff members of the said program.

During the year, 15 batches of training were organized in the Anganwadi Workers Training Centre in which 365 untrained lady Anganwadi Workers from various ICDS projects were imparted with practical training in ICDS activities. Shri Sahoo looked into the overall management of the said unit and took the trainees out for field placement in various ICDS Projects. During the year, Anganwadi Helpers Training Unit in the Premises of the Choudwar Centre, covered 15 batches of training and imparted training to 486 untrained Anganwadi Helpers of various ICDS Projects. Shri Sahoo looked into the overall management of such unit.

Shri Gangadhar Sahoo coordinated almost all the National Pulse Polio Program of the Government Organized during the year. 70 lady social workers of the Choudwr Centre of the Society fed polio drops to 4500 children of Choudwar Muncipality area time to time. In the programme the volunteers went to every doorstep, for two days, in each programme and covered 100% children within the age group of birth to five years of the area by feeding polio drops.

Shri Sahoo monitored National AIDS Awareness Campaign in the Choudwar Muncipality two times during the year. 46 lady social workers of the Choudwar Centre paid doorstep visits, distributed AIDS related leaflets and made the people aware of AIDS and its prevention.

Shri Sahoo, during the year attended Block level and District level Disaster Management Preparedness Committee meetings as a representative of the Society. The social workers of the Choudwar Centre have made survey of 6 adopted Panchayats of the Tangi Choudwar block and tained the people of said Panchayats on their preparedness at the time of natural calamities. Shri Sahoo visited several State Government offices and had discussion with the officials on various problems of the area.

Shri Sahoo attended 3 days long meeting on management of Creche programmes, organized by the NIPCCD and BAJSS at Thakkar Bapa Smarak Sadan, New Delhi. Shri Sahoo also attended the General council meeting of B.A.J.S.S., New Delhi. He actively participated in the 141th Gokhale Jayanti organized by the Orissa Branch of the society. He also took part in the 33rd Foundation Day Celebration of Sishu Sadan and 44th death anniversary of Padmashree L. N. Sahu organized in the premises of Choudwar Centre. Shri Sahoo continued to be the honorary correspondent of the leading Oriya daily newspaper "The Prajatantra".

SHRI DINESH MISHRA

Shri Dinesh Mishra Continued to be a member of Narendra Memorial Shiksha Sansthan, Bazpur. Through which nursery and Primary school name Modern Public School is being run. Shri Mishra also a member of Serve India Shiksha Samiti, Bazpur, Udham Singh Nagar.

Shri Dinesh Mishra also continued to be member of management committee of Shri Nehru Gram Madhyamik Vidyalay, Saraibanshi in Allahabad District and attended its meetings held during the year.

As the member incharge of the Palia Centre he looked after the day-to-day management of the Tharu Janjati Boys Hostel and Balika A.T.S. in the District of Lakhimpur Kheri in Uttar Pradesh.

BALIKA ASHRAM TYPE SCHOOL PALIA KALAN

With financial help form Government of India, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, New Delhi, the Residential School was maintained by the Society at Palia Kalan in Lakhimpur Kheri District for educational advancement of girls belonging SC community.

During the session 2006-2007 the total number of the beneficiaries is 101 who were form the SC communities. The Ashram School Provided fooding, lodging, clothing, books and stationary and medical facilities to the inmates free of charges. The total expenditure on the maintenance of the school was Rs. 9,47,058.50 during the year under report.

THARU BOYS HOSTEL PALI KALAN

With financial help from Government of India, Ministry of Tribal Affairs, New Delhi. The Hostel was maintained by the Society at Palia Kalan in Lakhimpur Kheri District.

During the session 2006-2007 the total number of beneficiaries on Roll was 42 who were from the Schedule Tribes Communities. The Hostel provided fooding, lodging, books and stationary other facilities to the students free of charges.

The total expenditure on the maintenance of the hostel was Rs. 3,61,503.00 during the year under report.

Schduled cast girls Ashram Padhati School Palia Kalan communication Palia mondal was given 100 blanket and (BHL) Bajaj Sugar factory Palia was given 50 blanket and Rotary club Palia was given 101 bed sheet and 101 slipper and a eye's camp in Ashram all girls given Medicine and spectacles and all A.T.S. girls was given chicken pox measure and Rotary club also given Ashram a Usha Sewing Machine.

And also Bajaj Sugar Mills Ltd., G. M. Shri Kamal Mehta Ji all Ashram girls was given 101 bed sheet, 101 plate, 101 spoon he also given personally. Fruit and biscuits were distributed also many times to the girls of scholl by Rotary Club Samvedana Samiti.

SHRI DAMODAR SAHOO

During the year 2006-2007 Shri Damodar Sahoo looked after the official matters of the Orissa Branch as well as the Choudwar Centre of the Society. He organised meetings on public issues in different times i.e. Child Labour problem, in Country adoption, Atrocity on woman int heoffice of the Orissa Branch attended by members of different organisations, educationists, politicians, journalists and intellectuals. The 140th Birth

Anniversary of the founder of the Society Mr. Gokhale was observed on 9th May 2006 followed by the public meetign held in Nari Seva Sangh, Cuttack. The meeting was presided over by Dr. Radhanath Rath a retired Professor and a great intellectual of Orissa, Professor Hrudananda Roy and Professor Kishore Ch. Tripathy were the learned speakers on the occasion.

The 13th death anniversary of late S.S. Misra the then President of the Society was observed on 8th December 2006 in the office of the Orissa Branch. Meetings of Utkal Kendriya Bal Seva Sangh in which Shri Sahoo is acting as General Secretary held in the office building of the Branch under the chairmanship of Dr. Satya Roy. As the President of the Sarvodaya Relief Committee, Shri Sahoo attended the meetings held in Gunanidhi Bhawan, Cuttack. The meeting of Naturepathy Council, Orissa held int he office of the Servants of India Society under the Chairmanship of Swami Arupananda. As a member of Utkal Sahitya Samaja, Shri Sahoo attended most of the meetings held in the Sriramchandra Bhawan, Cuttack.

CHOUDWAR CENTRE

During the year under report Shri Sahoo looked after the activities of the Choudwar Centre and devoted his time for smooth functioning of the institutions i.e. Servindia Destitute Children's Home, Leprosy Clinic, Vocational Unit and Training Centre etc. managed by the Society. During the year two girl inmates of Home, Saraswati & Kishori got married. He organised the 44th death anniversary of late L. N. Sahu and 34th Foundation Day of Servindia Home followed by Mass Prayer, Children's Rally, Inter School Competitions, distribution of cloths to the patients suffering from Leprosy & public meeting. He welcomed the visitors including Gvernment officials, Political leaders, Research Persons and Social Activities in different times on behalf of the Society at Choudwar.

OTHERACTIVITIES

As a founder member of the Poly Technic Society, Government of India, he attended most of the meetings held in the Collector's Residence under the Chairmanship of District Collector, Cuttack and organised Self-Help programmes, Awarness Training Programmes on behalf of the Society in different Districts.

He devoted his time to look after the activities of B.A.J.S.S. in Kalinganagar, Jajpur. He also associated himself for smooth management of the "Model Schools" and "Children in the Middle" organisations established by Shri Golap Pradhan who recently passed away. Shri Sahoo also contributed his time for smooth functioning of the Holze Memorial Hospital mainly dedicated for poor tribals of Kalinganagar in the Dist. of Jajpur. During the year he attended 5 Medical Camps organised by the Holz Memorial Hospital int he Panchayat of Dangadi Block.

As an executive member of B.A.J.S.S. he attended most of the meetings held in New Delhi in different times. As a member of Child Welfare Committee Shri Sahoo attended the monthly meetings held in the Basundhara for discussion ont he rehabilitation of the uncared and abonded children of the state. He has devoted his time for attending the programme of "Swarnalata Smruti Sansada" as the President, Staff Selection Committee for I.C.D.S. Programme, District Development Committee as the members and shared in smooth management of the Organisations. He wrote 3 articles published in Souvenir and local daily. He gave a talk on 'Jibe Daya' in A.I.R., Cuttack. As the founder Secretary of the Gokhale Ideal College Shri Sahoo contributed his service for management of the College.

He devoted his time in the Bhajans of Bhagawan Satya Sai Baba organised by the Satya Sai Seva Samittee in Choudwar Central Jail. The Samittee organised the programme in every 2nd Sunday of the month in the Cell of Woman Prisoners and 3rd Sunday in the Cell of Male Prisoners. Shri Dwivedi managed 4 hostels, 2 Balika Ashram Type Schools, 5 Creches and 14 primary schools for the eeducational development of the Buxa and Tharu communities, under the banner of the Servants of India Society with its center office at Bazpur, Udham Singh Nagar. He attended the branch meeting int he month of August 2006 convened by the senior member of U. P. branch. On the request of the Social Welfare Department Shri Dwivedi arranged a photo exhibition at district head quarters in Udham Singh Nagar which was highly appreaciated by the masses.

Shri Dwivedi continued to be the special life memebr and executive member fo Adarsh Kanya Intermediate College, Bazpur and attended its meetingsheld from time to time.

Shri Dwivedi is a founder member of the Serve India Siksha Samiti, Bazpur. The Serve India Siksha Samiti managed Serve India Intermediate College at Dopulia and Purv Madhyamik Vidyalaya at Mazravidhi. The Serve India Siksha Samiti is registered under Society's Registration act XXI 1960. Shri Dwivedi is a founder member of Hriday Nath Kunzuru Memorial Seva Samiti which is registered under Society's Registration act 1960. The organization was started in the memory of late Pt. Hriday Nath Kunzuru the former president of the Servants fo India Society. H. N. K. Memorial Seva Samiti is maintaining a junior high schol and creches with the financial help of the Central Social Welfare Board, New Delhi.

Shri Dwivedi continued to be the trustee of the Purna nand Tiwari Jan Hitkari Nyass which was registered as apublic trust. The Nyass is maintaining an Ayurvedic dispensary and a public libary at Bazpur, Udham Singh Nagar. He played an active role in developing the works of the nyass and organized several lectures and semianrs under the banner of the jan Chetna Manch, a branch of the Purna nand Nyass.

Shri Dwivedi attended the general meeting of the Bhartiya Adim Jati Sevak Sangh and a Tribal conferene at Jaipur, Rajasthan in the month of August form 23rd to 25th. Honourable Smt. Pratibha Patil and Hnourable Mr. M.M. Jacob Governors of Rajasthan and Meghalya respectively were present along with Smt. Rajani Patil Chairperson, Central Social Welfare Board New Delhi.

Being the member of the executive committee of B.A.J.S.S. Shri Dwivedi attended its meetings held from time to time. He started new creche programs int he districts of U. S. Nagar, Nainital, Almora and Pauri (Garhwal) of Uttarakhand. About 2000 children are taking advantage of these creche centers.

Shri Dwivedi visited the tribal belt of Bundelkhand area in Lalitpur district which was covered with Sahariya Adivasis. He started 5 centres in Tal Behat Block of Lalitpur district of Uttar Pradesh. The responsibility of the smooth management was given to Mr. Jai Prakash Mehrotra who has recently retired from the post of Special Secretary, Women and Child Welfare Board, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh.

ASHRAM TYPE SCHOOLS FOR TRIBAL GIRLS:

To meet the need of education among the tribal girls, the Society is running 2 Ashram Type Schhols, one of them for the educational upliftment of the Buxa girls at Bazpur and the other one for the advacement of the girls belonging to the Tharu Community at chandanchowki in Lakhimpur Kheri District.

The Ashram Type School is a residential school where fooding, lodging, sports material and medicine etc. are prvided free of cost to the inmates.
