2. I also append the reports noted-in the margin submitted by the Collectors and Presidents of the different Boards.

## Statembnt No. I.

3. The area remained the same as last year. The population has been shown as per the Imperial census of 1891.
4. There was no change in the number of the Local Boards, there being six District Boards and forty Talluka Boards as in the preceding year. The former are presided over by the Collectors of the different districts and the latter by Assistant and Deputy Collectors in charge of sub-divisions. The Panch Mabals is the only district in this division to which the elective franchise has not been extended owing to its backward condition.
5. The triennial term of the Táluka Local Boards of the Broach District expired on the 31st March 1900, and new elections were held during the year. The interest evinced in the elections may be judged from the following table:-

The results were meagre, the highest percentage of voters who attended the poll being $17 \cdot 4$ in Wagra.

## No fair inference can be drawn in a year of famine.

6. The number of ex-officio, nominated, aud elected members was the same as last year, viz., 11,391 and 328 , respectively. Out of 730 members 174 were officials and 556 non-oficials against 173 and 555, respectively, in the preceding year. It will thus be seen that the non-official element has remained predominant. The number of Europeans and Eurasians fell from 41 to 37, while there was a proportionate rise in the number of natives.
7. The following table shows the number of meetings held in each district the number of oficial and non-official members on the Boards, and the average, attendance :-

8. The number of meetings held by the several Boards fell from 218 to 202, and the average attendance on the whole shows a corresponding falling off. The attendance of non-official members in the district of Panch Maháls and of official members in the district of Broach shows a slight improvement, the former rising from $2 \cdot 8$ to $3 \cdot 3$ and the latter from $2 \cdot 3$ to $3 \cdot 4$.

The number of meetings adjourned for want of a quorum has been inoluded in column 14 of Statement No. I, and they have also been shown separately in the column of remarks. There were in all 12 such meetings- 5 in Ahmedabad, 3 in Kaira, 1 in Surat_and 3 in Thána, against an aggregate of 4 in the year previous.

These poor results are due to famine, which engrossed the attention of every one.

Excepting Panch Maháls, none of the District Boards failed to hold the prescribed minimum of two meetings, as will be seen from the following table :-

The Collector of Panch Máhals states that one meeting was sufficient to enable the Board to carry out all the necessary business, looking to the disorganized state of the district in consequence of plague and famine. The law however required two meetings to be held.

The Táluka Local Boards noted in the margin failed to hold the minimum of four meetings. But in all these cases the Collectors re. port that the number was sufficient for the disposal of the orlinary business of the Boards.

## Statement No. II.

9. The total income of the several Boards amounted to Rs. 9,86,500-4-5 against Rs. 12,38,999-8-7 in the preceding year, giving a ducrease of Rs. $2,52,499-4-2$, almost wholly owing to the non-realization of the local cess due on land revenue uncollected. Adding to the total income the opening balance of Rs. $5,79,022-7-8$, the aggregate amount available for expenditure during the year was Rs. 15,65,522-12-1 against Rs. 19,06,471-12-9 in the preceding year.
10. The following table exhibits the principal items of income as compared with the receipts in the preceding year:-


The causes of fluctuations are briefly as follows:-
11. VI.-Provincial Rates.-The net proceeds of the one-anna cess levied under the Bombay Local Funds Acts 1869 and 1884, constitute the principal source of income under this head. The following table shows the proportion of the net receipts to the tutal income, and the incidence of the cess per head of population:-

12. As compared with the preceding year there is a net decrease of Rs. 3,13,484-1.2 which is distributed over all the districts, and indicates the effect of famine on the collection of land revenue. All districts shared in it, but Surat and Thisna only to a limited extent.
13. XIX - Education.-There is a net decrease of Rs. 3,950-8-0 spreading over all the districts. In Abmedabad and Broach during the year under report some of the schools were closed. In Kaira the decrease was highest, amounting to Rs. $1,378-1-4$, chiefly due to the fall in the number of school going boys owing to the prevalence of plague and famine. The fluctuations in Panch Maháls, Surat, and Thána are small and call for no remarks.
14. XX.-Medical.-The income from this source amounted to Rs. 51,058-6-0 against Rs. $5,755 \cdot 9 \cdot 5$ in the preceding year showing an increase of Rs. $45,302-12-7$. Most of this is merely nominal being due to the unaccountable inclusion under this head of Rs. 47,872 from realizations by sale of grass to cultivators, \&e. In Thána there was a real increase of Rs. 2,007 due to additional receipts on account of the funds of the Andheri Dispensary opened during the year. In Surat there was a small increase of Rs. 112 . On the other side there was a deficit of Rs. 722 in the Panch Mahills due to full grants having not been awarded by the District Board for want of funds.
15. XXXII.-Civil Works.-The main sources of income under this head are road and ferry tolls, and contributions from private individuals. The total receipts under the head amounted to Rs. 1,48,292-7-6 against Rs. 1,66,197-7-11 in the year preceding giving a net decrease of Rs. $17,905-0-5$ which is shared by all the districts except Thána where in road tolls and popular contributions there was an increase of Rs. 7,026.

Toll Collections.-There was a net decrease of Rs. 16,780-6-1 under this subhead due to famine which interfered with general traffic. In Surat in addition a decrease of Rs. 5,439-12-4 is accounted for by the payment of the Local Fund share of the Hope Bridge toll received from the Municipality representing only a year's dues, whereas last year arrears swelled the item.

Civil Works Miscellaneous.-The receipts under this head amounted to Rs. 8,699-14-6 against Rs. 5,936-3-1 in the preceding year showing a net increase of Rs. 2,763-11-5. There is an aggregate increase of Rs. 4,065 in the districts of Ahmedabad, Panch Maháls and Thána, while there is an aggregato decrease of Rs. 1,301 in the remaining three districts. The sale-proceeds of road-side trees, grass, \&c., are credited to this head as per Government Resolution No. 5130, dated 22nd September 1897.

Contributions under $X X X I I$, Civil Works.-Revenue under this sub-head shows a net decrease of Rs. 4,792-3-4 being 20,803-11-2 gagainst Rs. 25,595-14-6 in the preceding year. The decrease is confined to the distressed districts of Gujarát, while Thána slows an increase of Rs. 4,565.
16. Contributions.-The receipts under this head show this year a net increase of Rs 31,684-10-3 due chiefly to overdrawals which have been treated' as "Contributions" of Rs. 26,480-12-5 and 6,009-4-1 by the District Boards of Ahmedabad and Broach, respectively, to cover theirdebit balances as per Governuent Resolution No. 1210, dated luth March 1900. Gross increase amounts to Rs. 35,197 distributed over Ahmedabad, Panch Maháls, Broach and Surat, while there is a corresponding decrease in the Kaira and Thána districts of Rs. 7,474. In Panch Mahails the increase is explained as due to the receipts during the year of the Government grants, in consideration of the charges on account of the Primary Schools and Dispensary situated within the limits of the defunct Municipality of Kálol which have been borne by the Local Board from January 1899. In Surat, the increase is due to larger receipts from sand and quarry fees, while the decreases in Kaira and Thina are attributed to smaller realizations from the same source.
17. The following table furnishes details of the items comprising these receipts:-

18. Miscellaneous.-The receipts amounted to Rs. 4,713-7-4 against Rs. 7,301-4-5 in the preceding year, and are made up of the following items:-

These items are in themselves of a very fluctuating nature, and consequently the decrease of Rs. 2,587-13-1, which chiefly occurs under "Other receipts," calls for no remark.
19. Cattle-Pound Receipts. -The reccipts under this head amounted to Rs. 16,848-14-4 against Rs. 21,043-1-8 in the preceding year, showing a net decrease of Rs. 4,194-3-4 which is shared more or less by all the districts except Surat where there is an increase of Rs. 934. The falling off of this source of revenue in the other districts is due partly to high mortality among cattle, and partly to total absence of grazing which made it not worth while to search for it.
20. Debt.- There is a net increase of Rs. 9,438-2-9 under this head, the receipts being Rs. 13,678-2-9 against Rs. 4,240 in the year previous. The proceeds represent for the most part the moneys deposited by Contractors and others and not repaid. Surat and Thána show increases of Rs. 10,970 and Rs. 1,182-2-9, respectively, due in the first case to greater number of deposits having been received from Contractors, and in the second case to the Wadia Water-Supply Fund at Andheri being shown as "Debt account" under the orders of the Accountant General. Panch Maháls has neither incroase nor decrease. The decreases in Ahmedabad, Kaira and Broach are attributed to a falling off in the number of deposits from contractors.
21. The incidence of income per head of population in the several districts is represented in the following table:-

The same cause has operated to reduce the average incidence in all the first four districts, though it is concealed in the case of Broach by the credits for grass, the import of which from West Khándesh and sale to cultivators was undertaken in that district by the Local Board.

## Statement No. III.

22. The total expenditure of the several Boards amounted to Rs. 12,72,480-14-8 against Rs. 13,27,449-5-1 in the preceding year, showing a net decrease of Rs. 54,968-6-5. In the following table are given the various - 911-2
items of expenditure under different account heads for the last two years for the purpose of comparison:-

23. Administration.-The expenditure under this head amounted to

- Rs. 35,175-9-3 against Rs. 34,738-9-4 in the preceding year, showing an increase of Rs. 436-15-11. The increase is more or less spread over all the districts except Panch Maháls, where there is a small decrease of Rs. 27-1-10. The high charges on account of travelling allowance to Local Fund Overseers and payment of grain compensation to low-paid servants account for the increases in Ahmedabad and Surat. The fluctuations in Kaira, Broach and Thána are too insignificant for remark. As usual the expenditure under this head includes charges on account of establishments entertained by the several Local Boards under Section 38 of Bombay Act I of 1884, as also the pay and allowances of clerks employed on Local Fund work in the offices of the Divisional Commissioner, the Collectors, the Accountant General and the Educational Inspectors.

24. Police.-The increase of Rs. 709-10-0 under this head occurs in Ahmedabad only and is due to the refund of cattle-pound receipts to Government by way of adjustment under the orders of the Accountant General.
25. Education.-The following comparative table furnishes details of the expenditure incurred under this head during the year, showing a small decrease of Rs. 380-12-6 :-


The districts of Panch Maháls, Surat and Thána exhibit an aggregate increase of Rs. 2,503-10-9, against which there is an aggregate decrease of the remaining districts amounting to Rs. 2,884-7-3, the net deficiency being Rs. 380-12-6. In Panch Maháls as has been said before the Local Board had to bear the cost of primary schools formerly managed by the Kálol Municipality which ceased to exist during the year. The rise in expenditure in the Surat District is due to the payment of the arrears of salaries of school masters employed on plague duty during the preceding year. The decreases in Ahmedabad and Broach are respectively due to the abolition of some of the schools, and the
employment of school-masters on Plague duty in infected villages. The fluc. tuations in Kaira and Thána are comparatively small.
26. Medical.-The charges under this head are comprised of the following items:-


Although there is considerable increase under the first three sub-heads, a heavy fall of Rs. 16,907-8-11 in plague charges resulted in a net decrease of Rs. 10,977-0-8 under the major head. Excepting Kaira where owing to the prevalence of plague there was an increase of Rs. $22,380-5-10$, all the districts exhibit a marked fall in this expenditure. As the whole interest of the Dholera Dharamtaláa fund with a deduction of Rs. 1,000 was paid to the Dholera Municipality as per Government Resolution No. 6556, dated 30th October 1898, the usual grant of Rs. 1,300 to the Dholera Dispensary has been stopped. The decreases in the remaining districts are accountable by the extinction of plague and the consequent reduction in such expenditure.
27. Scientific and other Minor Departments.-The following contrasted statement gives details of expenditure under this head for the last two years:-


The expenditure under this head occurs in Ahmedabad, Kaira and Surat only, all of which participate more or less in the increase of Rs. 3,583-14-8. In Ahmedabad an increment was made to the salary of the Veterinary officer, a new appointment of a Veterinary graduate was created, and additional stalls for cattle and a kennel for dogs were constructed. In Kaira the increase is due partly to similar increment to the pay of Veterinary officers, and partly to the cost of medicines received in the dispensaries during the year. The increase in Surat is not worth noticing.
23. Superamuation Allowances and Pensions.-The expenditure under this head is found in Surat and Thana only, and exhibits an increase of Rs. 68-15-9 which is insignificant.
29. Slationery and Printing.-The charges under this head amounted to Rs. 2,189-12-8 against Rs. 2,868-1-7, showing a net decrease of Rs. 678-4-11, due to less expenditure having been incurred in the printing of forms relating to plague during the year.
30. Miscellaneous.-This. head includes charges on account of Dharmshála and staging bungalow establishments, and other minor expenses. When compared with the preceding year the expenditure exhibits a net increase of Rs. 4,605-9-11. Large fluctuations occur in Ahmedabad, Kaira and Panch Mabals where, owing to (1) larger miscellaneous refunds, (2) filling of water troughs for cattle for a longer period than usual on account of scarcity of water in tanks, \&c., and (3) payment of grain compensation to low paid servants, the expenditure shows a marked increase. The remaining districts, on the other hand, show a petty decrease. The grant of Rs. 814 to Municipalities under Section 47 of Bombay Act I of 1884 in the Broach District has been transferred
from this head to that of "Contributions," sub-head "To other Boards," as per Accountant General's instructions conveyed in his letter No. L. F.-27, dated 7th December 1898.

The charges on account of petty establishments amounted to Rs. 9,521-13-7, out of whioh Rs. 4,965-4-10 were spent on account of the pay and contingencies of establishments entertained to watch and clean staging bungalows and dharmshálas, \&c., the remaining sum of Rs. $4,0556-8-9$ is made up of the following items :-

31. Famine Relief.-This is altogether a new item of expendituremarked feature of the year's administration. The following table furnishes details of expenditure in each district :-


The aggregate charges amount to Rs. 1,24,296-3-4, i.e. $9 \cdot 7$ per cent. of the total expenditure of the year. In Broach, owing to the inclusion of charges on account of grass supplied at about cost price to poor cultivators, \&c., shown under sub-head "Miscellaneous," the expenditure is nominally higher than in other districts, where it mostly consists of repairs to tanks and other sources of water-supply. In Surat, besides five tank excavation works costing Rs. 13,422-14-2, the following test relief works were carried out under the supervision of the Public Works Department:-

The cost of these latter works has not yet been brought to account. The zotual total expenditure under this head is, therefore, considerably in excess of the amount shown in the statement.
32. Civil Works.-The total expenditure amounted to Rs. 5,06,279-0-5 ıgainst Rs. 6,71,610-12-7, showing a net decrease of Rs. 1,65,331-12-2. The persentage of charges under this head to total expenditure during the year comes oo 39.8 against 50.6 in the preceding year. The following table furnishes details If the amount expended on Public Works carried out (a) through the Agency ff establishments entertained by the Boards and (b) through the agency of the Public Works Department as required in paragraph 2 of Government of India's
letter No. 20, dated 26th May 1899, printed in the preamble of Government Resolution No. 2584, dated 19th June 1899 :-

33. Communications.-It will be seen from the foregoing table that Rs. $3,04,711-6-6$, or 23.9 per cent., of the total expenditure were spent on the construction and maintenance of roads against Rs. $4,26,990-10-8$, or $32 \cdot 2$ per cent. in the preceding year. The fall in the percentage is due to the postponement of certain works in favour of famine test works.
34. The following statement gives the expenditure incurred in each district by the Public Works Department and Civil Agency on communica-tions:-

As usual the Public.Works Department was entrusted with the greater portion of expenditure.
35. The following table summarizes the details of expenditure incurred on new buildings in each district :-


Besides the buildings detailed above, three dharmshálas-one at Modása (Rs. 332-1-10), one at Kanbha (Rs, 826-14-3) in the Ahmedabad District, and one at Murbád in the Tbána District (Rs. 294-15-0) were built during the year at an aggregate cost of Rs. 1,453.15-1, which has been debited under Communications, in accordance with the orders convejed in Government Resolution No. 5130, dated 22nd September 1897.

## Communications.

## Ahmedabad.

36. The total expenditure under this sub-head amounted to Rs. 49,122-3-2, which is made up of two items (a) 37,136-4-3 repairs and (b) 11,985-14-11 original works. The followingeis the list of the latter works:-


## Kaira.

The amount expended on communications was Rs. 42,586-5-0, of which Rs. 34,251-10-7 were spent on repairs, and Rs, 8,334-10-5 on original works of communications as detailed below :-



## Panch Maháls

The expenditure on communications in this district was Rs. 3,099-10-10, which consisted of repairs only.-

## Broach.

The aggregate amount spent in this district was Rs. 41,793-4-1, of which Rs. 31,921-12-4 were spent on repairs, and Rs. 9,871-7-9 on original works as detailed below :-


## Surat.

The total expenditure on communications amounted to Rs. 77,034-5-2, of which Rs. 50,337-14-3 were spent on repairs, while Rs. 26,696-6-11 were spent on new works as shown below :-

## Thána.

The amount expended on communications in this district was Rs.91,135-10-3, of which repairs took Rs. $62,2{ }^{7} 1-12-8$, while the remaining sum of Rs. 28,863-13-7 was spent on original works detailed below :-

37. The total expenditure under the sub-head of "Water-supply and Water-works" amounted to Rs. 1,16,934-1-2, the details of which are given in Return No. IV which includes famine works also.
38. The expenditure under the sub-heads "Establishment and Contingencies" (Rs. 49,148-15-5) and "Tools and Plant" (Rs. 11,703-10-9) explains itself and calls for no remark.
39. Besides the above expenditure under Civil Works some minor works of improvement were executed at an aggregate cost of Rs. 3,207-4-3. In accordance with the principle laid down in Government Resolution No. 3847, dated 5th June 18! 1 , only such minor works as are of a permanent nature are shown in columns 22 and 23 of Statement No. IV.
40. Looking to the fall in revenue in consequence of famine, and to the opening of relief works at considerable cost, the amount spent on Civil Works is satisfactory.
41. Contributions.-The total expenditure under this head amounted to Rs. 23,572-15-0 against Rs. 45,264-12-2, showing a net decrease of Rs. 21,691-13-2. The decrease is distributed over all the districts except Ahmedabad, where owing to full payment of the interest of the Dhollera Dharam Taláv Fund to the

Dholera Municipality there is a set-off of Rs. 5,101-10-8 in the form of increase. In Kaira the decrease is attributed partly to there being no charge on account of contribution to Municipalities, and partly to less amount having been assigned to Municipalities under Section 47 in consequence of smaller recovery of cess owing to failure of rains. In Panch Maháls the decrease is accounted for on the ground that no special grants towards irrigation works and Godhra Municipality were made during the year. Similar reasons are assigned for the decrease in Surat and Broach. The fluctuation in Thána is too small to deserve any remark. As has been already remarked in paragraph 30 supra, the grant of Rs. 814 to Municipalities under Section 47 in the Broach District has been transferred to this head from " Miscellaneous."
42. Debt.-There is a net increase of Rs. 10,611-13.2, which is contributed mostly by Surat and Ihána. In the former district a sum of Rs. 5,746-3-10, being an advance to the Executive Engineer for the iron work indented for from England for the Jubilee Bridge at Ichhapore, for which regular accounts have not been rendered, is treated under suspense accounts. Iu Thána the expenditure on the water-supply at Andheri, the funds for which were transferred to the District Board during the year under report, and are treated in the Local Fund accounts as deposits, explains the increase of Rs. 780.
43. Interest on Debt.-There was no payment under this head during the year, and hence the decrease of Rs. 221-13-9.
44. Balance. -The actual balance at the cinse of the year was Rs. $2,93,041-13-5$ agaiost Rs. $5,79,022-7-8$, showing a decrease of Rs. 2,85,980-10-3. The following table exhibits the balances at the credit of the several Boards on the 31st March 1900 (and 1899): -


As was premised in the report for the past year, the accumulated balances of the several Local Boards have been considerably reduced to meet the exigencies of famine. In Ahmedabad and Broach, owing to non-realization of one-anna cess, coupled with the pressing demand for famine expenditure, the surplus balances were exhausted towards the end of the year, and Government permitted the Local Boards of these districts to overdraw to the extent of Rs. 48,000 and Rs. 10,000 , respectively. The overdrawals, however, amounted to only Rs. 26,480-12-5 in Ahmedabad and Rs. 6,009-4-1 in Broach, and these sums have been treated as temporary contributions from Provincial to Local as per orders conveyed in Government Resolution No. 1210, dated 10th March 1900. It may fairly be expected that in view of the favourable prospects of the current year, the Local Boards concerned will be in a position to repay this debt to Government. The balance of the Kaira District Board has been reduced far below the prescribed minimum (viz., Rs. 61,000), but the Board was fortunately not compelled to overdraw. In Pancl Maháls the closing balance has nearly reached the minimum limit. In the remaining two districts the balances lave not been so seriously affected, and the Boards are left with a sufficiency of means to undertake works of public utility, or to meet unforeseen expenditure without borrowing. The large balance in Surat is, however, not without its encumbrances. , The Public Works charges for test relief works are yet to be paid, and about Rs, 8,000 are included in the balance which belong to the ryots
for works not taken up. Moreover, road works which otherivise would have absorbed some part of the balance were not undertaken owing to the failure of the rains.

## Statement IV.

45. The subjoined table furnishes information regarding expenditure incurred in the different districts on village water-supply and sanitation:-

46. The following table gives details of expenditure on the improvement of village water-supply :-

47. The total expenditure on water-supply amounted to Rs. 1,92,786-4-11 against Rs. 1,33,305-13-3 in the year previous. Out of this a sum of Rs. 75,852-3.9 was spent on water-supply works undertaken for famine relief, and the remaining sum of Rs. 1,16,934-1-2 was debited to " 45 -Civil Works." From the aggregate amount, Rs. $77,260-12-7$ were spent on new tanks, Rs. $33,570-15-6$ on new wells and troughs, and Rs. $81,954-8-10$ on repairs to the existing sources of water-supply.
48. Kaira and Broach spent Rs. 449-5-0 and Rs. 987-3-2 respectively on the improvement of village sites. A sum of Rs. $476-12 \cdot 3$ was spent on, conservancy of towns and villages in the Thana District. Besides these, Broach spent Rs. 160-11-5 on repairs to a jetty at Borbhatta ; and in the Surat District an expenditure of Rs. 144-5-1 was incurred on providing lamps on the; road from Jalalpur to the Navsari Railmay Station for the convenience of the rural population. Some minor works of temporary expediency, such as the, construction of dams in the Daskroi and Príntíj Talukas at a total cost of Rs. 581-3-11, and repairs to drains in Dholka and Viramgám at a cost of Rs. 234-8-0, have not been shown in the statement.
49. I append the notes of the several Executive Engineers in this Division showing the original cost, mileage and the present state of the Local Fund roads as required by Government Resolution No. 779, dated 30th January 1890.
50. The following brief resume of the district reports regarding the progress made during the year in material improvements in the several districts is given in accordance with the orders of Government conveyed in paragraph 15 of their Resolution No. 3179, dated 30th July 1895.

Ahmedabad.-Besides large expenditure of Rs. 6,829-2-1 and Rs. 827-5-2 on metalling the Ahmedabad-Bavla and Ahmedabad-Bareja Roads respectively, the following important works were carried out:-

> Re-making the road from Ahmedabad to Dholka to mile No. 8. Construction of a bridge across the Khari Cut Canal.
> Dharmshálas at Modása and Kanbha.
> Extension to the school-house at Sitápur in Viramgím Táluka.
> Additions and alterations to the school-house at Dhansura in Modísa Táluka.

Large and small tanks were excavated. Other projects had to be abandoned partly on account of large sums having been expended on ordinary repairs ta the main roads in charge of the Public Works agency and partly on account of non-realization of the Local Fund Cess.
… Kaira.-The total expenditure on original works of communication was Rs. 8,334-10-5, of which Rs. 4,833-3-4 were spent on metalling the 2nd and 3rd miles of the Mehmclabad-Kaira Road, and Rs. 1,169-4-4 on the construction of the 1st section of the Matar-Cambay Road. A new culvert was constructed over the water-way on the Petlád-Cambay Road at an outlay of R.s. 6,474-9.0; 24 new wells were sunk and 149 existing sources of water-supply repaired. The District Board also maintains two Veterinary Institutions-one stationary at Nadiad and the other itinerating throughout the district with the help of contributions from the Nadiád Municipal Funds and a grant-in-aid from Government. These institutions are every year growing in usefulness.

Panch Maháls.-No important original work was carried out in this district. The expenditure on Public Works was mostly incurred on repairs.

Broach.-The improvement of a portion of the Broach-Jambusar Road at an outlay of Rs. 6,155-15-4, and the construction of a culvert over the Dolia creek on the Jambusar-Tankaria Road at a cost of Rs. 782-8-11, are the only important,original works under "Communication." The Dispensary building at Kávi was completed during the year. No new school buildings were erected, but the existing ones were repaired at a total cost of Re. 1,596-11-5. The sum of Rs. 69,210-11-9 was spent for maintenance and management of vernacular schools, and Rs. 1,840-10-9 for vaccination charges. The District Board also maintained three Travelling Dispensaries for some months during the fever season. As to water-supply Broach has comparatively incurred the highest expenditure. Sixty-four new tanks were excavated at an outlay of Rs. 26,085-13-4, and 10 wells and troughs were newly constructed. Besides, Rs. 14,089-4-6 were spent for the improvement of the existing sources of water-supply.

Surat.-The following works of importance were in progress during the year:-

Road from Olpad to Sahole.
Low-level bridge across the 'Tenna river near Itchhapur.
Koad from the Bárdoli town to the Tapti Valley Station.
Additions to and alterations in the school-house at Sultinpur.
Besides ordinary expenditure of Rs. 14,371.4-6 on the improvement of village water-supply, the following test-works were opened for famine relief:-

Thána.—Under "Communications" the following are worth moticing :Road from Sanján to Nargol.

Dharamsháa at Murbíd.
There was no expenditure on original buildings. Under water-supply 4 new tanks were dug and 201 wells were vewly constructed, 192 existing sources of water-supply were repaired at a cost of Rs. 12,775-0.1.

The subjoined table furnishes statistics of original works under various heads executed in the various districts during the last five years:-


51. Works Committees were duly appointed in all the districts in acoordanoe with rule 2 of the rules under the Local Boards Act. and their working is on the whole reported to be satisfactory. In the Kaira District, the following scheme is adopted :-
"Each Taluka is divided into a certain number of groups and the Committee is formed of as many members as there are groups. To each member is assigned a particular group and he is informed whenever a work is to commence in that area. All bills for materials or labour gre paid only if signed by the member for the group concerned. Visitors' books are kept at each mork wherein the member in charge makes inspectiou memoranda. These memoranda are read at the meeting of the Táluka Board whonever the Sub-Divisional officer presides in person ; and votes of censure or thauks are carried aceording as the members have been slack or active and these are communicated to the members concerned. This practice bas been found to lave the effect of stimulating the interest of menbors."

In Thána most of the members are reported to have shown a good deal of energy and keenness, especially as regards the improvement of water-supply.
52. The following is a brief summary of the remarks made by the several Collectors in this Division as regards the extent with which it has been found possible to interest the villagers in the execution of works in the $m$ mner explained in paragraph 2 of Government Resolution No. 2370, dated 19th May 1898:-

Ahmedabad.-All the Presidents of the Táluka Boards report more or less favourably on the subject. However, owing to want of funds during the year under report, Local Fund works in charge of the Local Boards' Agency were a few only, and accordingly there was not sufficient chance of judging the question properly.

Kaira.-There was little opportunity to make an observation on this point owing to the stopping of important Local Fund works.

Panch Mahóls.-In consequence of plague and famine, the villages having been more or less disorganized it was impracticable to do anything in the way of encouraging the residents of villages to take greater interest in the execution of works.

Broach.-As a rule villagers do not take proper interest on Local Fund works and as the year under report was of famine, most of the Local Fund works, which could be conveniently postponed, were not carried out.

Surat.-Villagers continue to show the same interest in the execution of Local Fund works in their villages by contributing some portion of the cost, by giving carts gratis for bringing materials, and by superintending progress of the works.

Thana.-It appears from the reports of Sub-divisional Officers that the residents of villages in which works were in progress took little interest in their execution except in the tálukas of Bhiwndi and Wáda. In the Bassein Suhdivisiou the villagers are very ready to petition for works, but as a rule they cannot be induced to assist in any way in their execution.

## Sir,

I have the honour to submit the report on the administration of Local Boards in the Central Division for the year 1899-1900, and to append the prescribed Statements Nos. I to IV.

## Statement No. I.

2. There was no change in the number of Boards in office, which remained stationary at 6 District and 66 Táluka Local Boards.
3. The total population within the jurisdiction of the several Boards is the same as in the previous jear. But the area shows a decrease of 4.15 square miles owing to the adoption for the Khandesh District of revised figures furnished by the Survey Commissioner and Director of Land Records and Agriculture.
4. The total number of members serving on the several Boards has fallen from 1,232 in 1898-99 to 1,230 in the year under report. The decrease was due to the fact that the vacancy caused on the Taluka Local Board of Karád and the District Board, Sátára, by the death of an elected member who held both seats was not filled up until after the close of the year.
5. Of the 1,230 members referred to, 6 were ex-officio, 574 elected and 650 nominated. The number of offcial and non-official members was 310 and 920 respectively. The ex-officio members are confined to the Peint Táluka of the Násik District, inhabited by hill-tribes who are not fitted for the exercise of the elective franchise.
6. The average attendance of the official and non-official members at meetings of the Boards calculated in accordance with the instructions contained in Government Resolution No. 2843 of the 25 th May 1897 is exhibited in the following table :-

7. As compared with the preceding year the attendance of official members remained stationary in all districts of the Division save Ahmednagar, where there was a slight falling off. Considering the calls on their time imposed by famine work it is satisfactory to find that there was no appreciable decrease anywhere. The results in respect of the non-offioial members are not as good, as the attendance in Násik, Ahmednagar and Poona shows a substantial decrease,

8. The rules framed under Act $I$ of 1884 require the holding of at least two general meetings by District Boards. There is no similar provision in respect of Táluka Boards, but the standing orders of Government require the holding of four meetings a year. The usual practice is for Boards to meet at least twice during the 12 months and this none of the District or Táluka Boards failed to do, some of them having met oftener during the year. The funds at the disposal of many of the Taluka Boards are so limited that there is probably no necessity for the members to assemble more than once after the annual Budget meeting has been held.

## Statement No. II.

9. There was a heavy decrease in receipts during the year. The total income from all sources was Rs. $11,30,780-6-1$, being smaller by Rs. 2,48,176-0-7 than the preceding year's realizations. The loss may presumably be ascribed to the famine. The total amount available for expenditure during the year, inclusive of the opening balance, was Kis. 16,58,787-11-7. In the following statement are contrasted the receipts under the several heads of accounts for the past two years :-

10. The causes of the fluctuations in the various items are briefly explained below:-
I.-Land Revenue.-The sale-proceeds of trees and grass which used to be credited to this head having been transferred to " XXXII Civil Works in charge of Civil Officers" in accordance with the directions of Government contained in Government Resolution, Genera! Department, No. 4509, dated 28th August 1900, there are no receipts under this head.
VI.-Provincial Rates.-The proceeds of the one-anna cess are brought to account under this head. The collections during the year show a decrease of Rs. 2,70,766-4-11 owing to loss of revenue on account of the Famine. The incidence of the cess per head of population shows a proportionate decrease, having fallen from Re. 0-2-2 to Re. 0-1-6. These particulars as well as the proportion which the proceeds of the cess bear to the total income of the District Boards in the Division are exhibited in the following statement:-

XII.-Interest.-The receipts under this head represent the interest received on invested funds in the Násik and Sholápur Districts. The increase of 1Rs. 184-2.8 appearing under this item is due to the interest which accrued on the sum of Rs. 10,000 contributed by Sir Dinshaw Manekji Petit towards the cost of a Dispensary at Níndgaon in the Násik District which, pending the commencement of the work, has been invested in Government Promissory Notes.
XVII.-Police.-The net receipts from cattle pounds, which are brought to credit under this head, fell from Rs. 63,445-3-9 in the year 1898-99 to Rs. 50,395-4-10 in the year of report. The decrease is observed in all the Districts of the Division except Poona and Sholipur and is what might have been expected in a famine year in which there is free grazing in forests and largely diminished impounding of cattle.
$X I X .-$ Education.-The receipts under this head were derived from school fees (Rs. 38,303-4-9), contributions (Rs. 328-12-6) and miscellaneous credits (Rs. 629-9-8) and amounted in all to Rs. 39,261-10-11. The realizations in the preceding year were Rs. 42,013-7-10, the decrease of Rs. 2,751-12-1I being due to a falling off (a) in fees from primary schools as the result of smaller attendance during a famine year and (b) in public contributions towards the cost of school buildings.
$X X$.—Medical.-The receipts under this head comprise the following items:-

The total amounting to Rs. 2,842-2-2 is smaller by Rs. 2,322-4-8 than the realizations in the year 1898-99. The decrease is due principally to diminisherl receipts under the first item in Khandesh and under the second item in Khandesh and Sátára owing to the farine.
XXI.—Scientific and other Minor Departments.-The total receipts have fallen from Rs. 2,634-7-3 in 1098-99 to Rs. 2,005-4-1 in the year under report. They are made up of the following sums:-Rs. 1,536-11-7 in Khándesh and Poona on account of Veterinary receipts ; Rs. 436-6-6 on account of interest on the Mahiji Exhibition Endowment Fund in Khándesh; and Rs. $33-⿳-0$ on account of ground rent recovered from stallholders at the Naitala fair in the Násik District. The decrease referred to above occurred under the first item, Veterinary fees having decreased both in Khándesh and Poona.
$X X V$.-Miscellaneous.-Dntil last year Staging Bungalow and Serai fees used to be included under this head. This item, however, has since been transferred to "Civil Works" and the receipts under "Miscellaneous" are now composed of small items of a fluctuating character. They show an increase of Rs. 689-12-6, which does not call. for any explanation.
$X X X 1 I$.-Civil Works.-The total under this head comes to Rs. $1,42,108-4-1$ and is comprised of the items detailed below :-

No. (IV).-Mriscellaneous.-Includes sale-proceeds of trees and grass and Staging house and Serai fees transferred to this head for the first time during the year under report. The receipts as a whole fell short by Rs. 35,350-7-4 of
the previous year's realizations, the decrease being chiefly due to loss of revenue on tolls, apparently the result of diminished trattic in a famine year.

Contributions.-These fall under two heads, viz.; Contributions from Provincial to Local Funds and Contributions by one Board to the revenues of another. As usual, the latter is a very small item. It appears only in the accounts of one district, viz., Nasik, which received a contribution of Rs. 340 from the Ahmednagar District Board. Contributions from Provinoial to Local Funds amounted to Rs. 2,70,325-9.5. They were made under a number of heads, details regarding which will be observed from the subjoined statement:-


A comparison with the previous year's figures shows a net increase of Rs. 48,066-5-5 under this head, due in great measure to temporary advances drawn from Government to make up Local Fund deficits caused by delays in the recovery of the one anna cess.

Debt.-The total of this head shows an increase of Rs. 28,494-7-2 as compared with the previous year's figures, which is due to Book adjustments in the Sholápur and Sátára Districts not requiring detailed explanation.

11. The expenditure of tha year under all heads amounted to $\mathrm{Rs}_{\mathrm{s}}$ 14,40,375-1-5. As compared with the outlay incurred in 1898-99 there was a

12. The causes of the fluctuations indicated in the foregoing statement are explnined below.
13. Administration.-The increase of Rs. 2,125-12-2 occurred in all Districts except Poona and Sholápur and is ascribed chiefly to the grant of grain compensation to Local Board Establishments owing to famine and to the transfer to this head from Stationery and Printing in accordance with the orders issued in Government Resolution No. 4509, dated the 28th August last, of charges on account of stationery locally purchased.
14. Education.-The increase of Rs. 2,727-0-11 was caused by heavier expenditure on primary schools in Khándesh and Sátára, more particularly in the latter district. The details of the charges recorded under this head are as follows:-

29. Superannuation Allowances and Pensions.-The oharges under this head are necessarily of a fluctuating nature and the increase of Rs. 369-j-5 recorded under this head needs no further remarks.
30. Stationery and Printing.-Some portion of the decrease of Rs. 2,302-7-9 is nominal, the result of the transfer to the head " 18 Administration" of charges on account of stationery locally purchased. The rest is due to smaller expenditure on printing.
32. Miscellaneous. - Nearly the whole of the decrease of Rs. 8,351-6-10 is the result of the transfer from this head to " 45 Civil Works"" of Staging Bungalow and Serai Establishment charges, agreeably to the orders contained in the Government Resolution quoted avove.
33. Famine Reliff.-The expenditure under this head is made up of Public Works and miscellaneous charges amounting respectively to Rs. 1,49,753-12-10 and Rs. 148-3-5. The former item represents the cost of the famine test works carried out during the year.
45. Civil Works.-The total expenditure under this head amounted to Rs. $5,47,854-12-0$, showing a decrease of Rs. $25,641-13$-2. So much was spent on test works during the yedr that the ordinary outlay had necessarily to be contracted to some extent. It is only surprising that the decrease was not larger than that specified above.

Taking' all the foregoing items together, there is a net increase of Rs. 19,978-0.3 over the previous year's accounts and it is chiefly due to the payment to Government of a sum of Rs. 30,000 by the District Board, Khandesh, as its share of the general expenditure incurred on famine relief in the district in 1896-97. The Collector shows a sum of Rs, $35,965-2-10$, but the excess over the sum of Rs. 30,000 referred to above apparently represents other items erroneously included under contributions to famine expenditure.
15. Debt.-The expenditure shown under this lead is made up of two sums, riz., (a) Rs. 4,335-2-9 on account of payment made towards the liquidation of the principal of two loans aggregating to Rs. 40,000 obtained by the District Lecal Board, Poona, for the construction of a bridge across the Indrayani River, and (b) Rs. 21,640-3-8, representing a debit raised by the Public Works Department against the Sátára District Board on account of the cost of Local Fund test works executed under Public Works Agency during the year.
16. Interest.-The sum of Rs. 338-13-3 appearing under this hend represents the charge on account of interest on the loans mentioned in the preceding paragraph.
17. Balances.-The total of the balances to the credit of all the Boards in the Division at the beginning of the year was Rs. $5,28,007-5 \cdot 6$. At the end of the year it was reduced to $2,18,412-10-2$. The following table shows separately for each district and for the Division as a whole the opening and closing balances as well as the receipts and expenditure during the year:-

The closing balance in Sholápur shows an increase as contrasted with the corresponding figures pertaining to the preceding year. The Poona and Khindesh Boards had much smaller balances than in the previous year and in Násik, Ahmednagar and Sátíra the accounts were closed without any balance whatever. The increase in Sholápur was probably fortuitous because, as exemplified by the accounts of the District Boards in the Division, Local Funds were at a low ebb generally during the year in consequence of the famine.

18. The following table shows separately for each district the total expenditure incurred under different heads for the improvement of rillage sanitation:-

19. Inclusive of the sum of Rs. 5,000 annually paid by the Sátáa District Board to the Local Municipality, the funds devoted to the improvement of watersupuly in the Division during the year amounted to Rs. 64,540-12-3. The expenditure in the preceding year was Ris. 47,946-10-9. The increase of Rs. 16,594-1. 6 was due to larger expenditure incurred in sinking new wells or deepening old ones to apert the impending scarcity of water.
20. The outlay of Rs. 612-6-4 on the improvement of village sites represented the cost of the removal of prickly pear in 9 villages of the Násik and 3 villages of the Poona District. The other items are unimportant and require no detailed notice.
21. There is very little to be said about the material progress of the year of which a sketch is to be furished in accordance with the directions given by Government in their Resolution No. 3179 of the 30th July 1895. Owing to famine, which largely reduced the resources of all District Boards, and plague, which entailed more or less heavy expenditure on some of these Bodies, the funds available for useful works were seriously curtailed. This will be clearly observed from the subjoined statement, in which figures for the past five years are given for purposes of comparison:-

22. It will be seen that in 1890-90, the last year in which Local Funds were administered under normal conditions, the expenditure on original
works (buildings communications and water-supply projects) amounted to Rs. 4,48,347-14-11. Last year's total was Rs. $1,27,940$ and small as it is it must be discounted still further in view of the fact that a considerable portion of the outlay was devoted to works taken up less for their intrinsic utility than for the relief of temporary distress. Much the same remarks are applicable to the preceding three years. Nor is the immediate future very promising. The prospects of the current season are more or less unfavourable throughout the Division and Local Fund receipts will therefore be again adversely affected. Most of the Boards will in all probability have to be accommodated with advances by Government and it may take a year or more to repay them, during which expenditure must be limited strictly to what is unavoidable.

24. There are two other points on which remarks are required by Government, viz., (1) the arrangements in force for the supervision and execution of works and (2) the measure of interest taken by the villagers in works.

With reference to (1) there is nothing to add to what has been stated in paragraphs 40 to 42 of the report for the year 1897-98 as to the division of responsibility for the execution of works between the Public Works Department and the Agency employed by the District Boards. As regards (2) little could be done in a famine year in which the village system was disorganised under the stress of famine. The Collector of Ahmednagar repurts however that in two cases in which the construction of wells was entrusted to villagers, the works were not only well executed, but more money than had been assigned from Local Funds was apparently spent by the people in making the wells more permanently useful. This is very satisfactory and shows that with proper encouragement on the part of the Local Fund Executive as well as the Taluka and Sub-divisional officers village communities ean be interested in works pertaining to their localities more largely than is the case at present and the Commissioner would strongly recommend this plan to the consideration of Collectors.

## Sir,

I have the honour to submit the Annual Report on the administration of the Looal Boards in the Southern Division for the year 1899-1900, together with the usual Statistical Returns I to IV, compiled in my office in the prescribed form.

Statement No. I.-Constitution of the Boards.
2. The area remained the same as last year.

Area and population. The population has been, shown according to the Imperial census of 1891.
3. There was no changa in the number and constitution of the Boards, there being 6 District Boards and 50 Táluka Boards

- Number and constitution of the Boards. as in the preceding year. The former are presided over by the Collectors of their respective districts and the latter by the Assistant and Deputy Collectors in charge of sub-divisions. Kánara is the only district in this division where the elective franchise is not fully availed of. In the six" talukas named in - Ankola. Sirsi. margin, only ex-officio members and members Hondrar. Supa. nominated by Government and those elected by the Siddápur. Yellápur. Municipalities, where those exist, sit on the Boards. The number of ex-officio, nominated and elected members was 15,486 and 397 respectively. Of the total number of members ( 898 ), 190 were officials and 708 non-officials against 205 and 691 respectively in the previous year. The number of European and Eurasian members increased from 25 to 29, while the number of natives decreased from 871 to 869.

meetings held in each district, the number of official and non-official members on the Boards and their
average attendance:-


I'he number of meetings held by the several Boards was 317 against 322 in the preceding year. The number of meetings adjourned for want of a в 911-12
quorum was 26 against 28 in 1898.89. At Iudi the average attendance at each meeting is stated to be 4, while the total number of nembers there is 15 . No meetings adjourned for want of a quorum are, however, shown against the Board in statement I. It is not clear, therefore, how some, at any rate, of the meetings could have been held without infringing the provisions of the law regarding a quorum. The average attendance of non-official members shows a warked falling off in Bijapur, Kolába and Ratnágiri, due apparently to the difficulties caused by plague. The other districts also show a decrease. The official attendance was sliglitly better than last year everywhere, except in Kánura, which shows a small decrease. There were only two meetings with a quorum of the Managing Comwittee of the District Local Board, Dharwar, during the year.
5. A satisfactory number of meetings was held by the Rajápur (11), Mahad (10), Hubli (9), Bankápur (9) and Ron (9)

Neetings. of the Taluka Local Bcards.

Táluka local Boards; while the I'aluka Local Boards of Athni, Gokák, Parasgad, lndi, Bágalkot, Dhárwár and Karajgi failed to hold even the prescrited minimum number of meetings. ahe reasons why the Boards in the Belgaum and Bijapur Distriets could not meet even four times during the year have not been explained. The failure on the part of the Dharwar Taluka local Board has been ascribed to the fact that no new works were underiaken by the Board, and it was, therefore, not necessary for it to hold more than two meetings. This explanation is not satisfactory. The Board does not meet only to consider new woiks. The default of the Kaajgi Board is stated to be due to lack of interest and factious tendencies on the part of its members.
6. The District Local Boards held 21 meetings against 20 in the preceding

There is an improvement in Belgaum; Bijapur and Dhárwár; while Kánara, Kolába, and Ratnágiri show a falling off.

7. The opening balance at the commencement of the year was Rs. $3,44,421-0-11$ against Rs. $3,71,952-15-5$ in the preceding year. The total income, excluding the orening balance, amounted to Rs. 10,73,286-4-6 against Rs. 10,82,758-7-5 in the year preceding, showing a decrease of Rs. 9,472-2-11.

The heads under which the decrease principally occurs are (a) Provincial rates, (b) Education and (c) Debt Under (a) it was mainly due to the suspension on account of famine of a large portion of the land revenue in the Bijapur District, with which one-anna cess amounting nearly to Rs. 13,000 was also suspended. The decrease under Education is shared in more or less by all the districts except Kolába, and is the result of the decreased attendance at, and the consequent closing of, some of the sohools owing to plague. Under (c) it was only nominal, there being no considerable advances made to meet emergent. famine expenses and consequent repayment of them as in the preceding year. The several sources of income contributed the following percentages-


The variations under the several heads of income are explained below :-
VI-Provincial rates.-The net proceeds of the one-anna cess levied under the Bombay Local Funds Act coustitute the income under this head. The decrease of Rs. 7,613-9-11 is accounted for above. The following table shows the proportion of the net-receipts from the one-unna cess to the total income and the incidence of the cess per head of the population in each district.


XVII-Police.-The proceeds under this head represent the net receipts under the Cattle Trespass Act. The decrease which has occurred principally in Dhárwár, Bijáppr and Kánara is the result of a decline on account of famine in the number of impoundings in Bijápur and Dhárwár and of increased expenditure on the construotion of and repairs to cattle-pounds in Kánara.

XIX-Education.-As explained above the deorease of Rs. 6,641-11-4 under this head is due to a falling off in the attendance at the schools owing to the prevalepce of plague and famine.

$\boldsymbol{X} X$-Medical.-This item consists of contributions from Municipalitios for the maintenance of vaccination establishments and of hos, 1 ital and dispensary receipts. The net deorease of Rs. $3,248-8-3$ is made up by the decreases in Belgaum, Bijápur and Dhárwár. The increase in Kinara is only nomioal,
being due to the sale of a Rs. 500 Government Promissory Note belonging to the Yellapur Dispensary, the proceeds of which were credited to this head. In Kolába it was due to the opening of a tiavelling dispensary for Roha and Mángaon tálukas, to which Government paid a contribution of Rs. 500 and the Roha Municipality of Rs. 100. The increase in Ratuágıri is small and calls for no remark.
$X X I-S$ Scientific and other Minor Departments.-The receipts under this head occur only in the Belgaum and Dbárwár Districts.

XXV - Miscellaneous.-The large increase of Rs. 11,486-14-0 occurs almost wholly in Dhárwár and is due to cash recoveries on account of advances to Plague officers, and the cost of disinfectants sold to public bodies as well as on account of realization of disinfection charges from the rural public, whose houses were disinfected during the last plague by Plague officers.
$X X X I I$-Civil Works.-The chief items of income under this head are "Tolls on roads and ferries" and "Gontributions." Tue total revenue of Rs. $1,20,981-14 \cdot 6$ consists of :-


The road and ferry tolls show an increase in all the districts except Dharwár. The recovery of arrears of the previous year swelled the receipts in Belgaum and Kolába, while in Dhárwár there is a decrease of Rs. 3,200 mainly owing to restrictions on tralfic imposed by the plague rules. The increases elsewhere were due to higher bids for the farns during the year. The annexed table furuishes particulars of the contributions made by private persons and Municipalities towards the construction of works of public utility. The decrease is accounted for by the fact that last year Rs. 4,000 were paid by Dr. Vishram Ramaji Gholey of Poona to the Ratnágiri District Buard for a technical schoul at Waukaoli, which item does not appear during the current year.

Rn. $620-3$-4 on gocount of private contributions for school buildinga appear in oolumin 24 of Statement II undor XIX-Education.
Contributions.-The receipts under this hcad show a net increase of Rs. 3,001-5-9. Ratnágiri has a large increase of Rs. 9,019 against a more than countervailing decrease in Bijápur, Belgaum, and Kolába. The increase in Ratnágiri is due to Government grants for famine relief works (Rs. $4 ; 000$ ) and for the construction of a school-house at Málvan (Rs. 5,024 ). The decrease is the result of the absence of Government grants similar to those made last year for water-supply in Bijápur and for school buildings in Bijápur and Dhárwár.

In Dharwár while there is an increase under contribution in lieu of excise revenue of over Rs. 5,000 , there is a decrease of nearly Rs. 8,009 in the Government grants for primary education. The decrease in Kolába is explained by the fact that large arrears for the sand and quarry farm of $1896-97$ were recovered and credited during the last year, there being no such unusual item during the year under report.

Debt.-The receipts under this head represent the repayments of advances made to meet famine and plague expenses.

Incidence. -The incidence of taxation and that of income (excluding balance) per head of population for the division were annas 2 pies $\cdot 5$ and annas 3 pies $7 \cdot 3$, respectively, against annas 2 pies 8 and annas 3 pies $7 \cdot 7$ in the preceding year.

## Statement No. III.-Expenditere.

8. The total expenditure of the Boards amounted to Rs. $11,05,078-1$-10 as compared with Rs. $11,10,290-5-11$ in the year 1893-99. There was thus a decrease of Rs. 5,212-4-1. The following statement gives the expenditure under the different heads for the last two jears:-


The inercases and decreases under the various heads àre explained below.
18. Administration.-The expenditure under this head amounted to Rs. 34,526-6-7, against Rs. $34,338-11-9$, showing an increase of Rs. 187-10-10. This head includes oharges on account of establishments entertained by the several Local Boards under Section 38 of the Local Bourds Act as also the pay and allowances of clerks employed on Local Fund work in the oflices of the Divisional Commissioner, the Accountant General, the Collectors and the Educational Inspectors.
22. Education.-The outlay under this head aggregated Rs. 4,30,550-13-0 as ompared with Rs. 4,27,525-12-0 in the preceding year, and is composed of the following items:-
(a) Rs. 7, 997-7-9 on aecount of the Ratnágiri School of Industry (establishment charges) against Rs, $8,687-8-8$ in 1898-99. The decrease is not explained.
(b) Rs. 3,72,769-4-0 on acsount of estallishment charges of primary and secondary schools.
(o) Rs 12,59+15-2 on account of grants towards primary education against Rs. 13,802-14-4 in 1898-99, the falling off being due to no grants-inaid having been paid in Dhárwár.
(d) Rs. 9,690-9-11 on account of scholarships awarded to students attending training Colleges, special schools and middle and primary schools.
(e) Rs. 22,445-7-4 miscellaneous against Rs. 19,591-3-4 in the previous year. The increase occurs in Ratnágiri against the School of Industry, and is due to the purchase of timber worth Rs. 3,022-2-0.
$(f)$ Rs. 5,053-0-10 refunds against Rs. $314-4-0$ in the preceding year. This excess is due to the fact that in Belgaum and Bijáperr several contributions which had been received from private sources towards school houses had to be repaid in consequence of the ivability of the Local Boards to provide money for carrying out the works.

The number of primary and secondary schools maintained by the District. Local Boards during the year under report as well as in the preceding year is contrasted in the following table :-

24. Medical.-The charges under this head amounted to Rs. 1,36,682-7-2 against Rs. 1,74,528-0-8 in 1898-99 or a decrease of

RG, $69,127-2-5$. Rs. 37,845-9-6 against the abnormal expenditure caused by plague in the previous year. The total outlay is still much in excess of the normal as will be seen from the figures given in the margin.* The details for the amount are given below.
(1) Hospitals and dispensaries, Rs. 22,354-9-6 against Ms. 24,485-7-5 last year. The decrease appears in Bijápur and is due to Dispensaries re. maining closed for the greater portion of the year and the Hospital Assistants doing plague or famine work elsewhere. In Kolába an expenditure of Rs. 1,109-14-5 was incurred on the new travelling dispensary given to the Roha and Mángaon Tálukas.
The subjoined is the statement of grants made to the several dispensaries in the Districts of this Division, during the year under report, and those made during 1898-99.


In Bijapur the balances at the credit of the Dispensary funds are said to be accumulating, and the Collector reports that the necessary steps, either to invest the surplus portions in Government promissory notes or to have them utilized by curtailing the local fund erants, are being taken. The travelling dispensary at Bankipur was closed during the year owing to want of funds. The Local Board grant to the Civil Hospital at Alibág was paid in May 1900, and is, therefore, not shown in the above table.

The details of expenditure on plague operations for each district during the year under report and the preceding year are given below:-

26. Scientific and other Minor Depxitments.-The expenditure amounted to Rs. $5,308-6-5$ against Rs. $5,529-11-10$ in 1898-99, and occurs only under the sub-head "Veterinary clarges," in the Belgaum, Kolába and Ratnágiri districts.

30 Stationery and Printing. -The expenditure under this head declined to Rs. 3,425-14-5 from Rs. 4,122-1-10 in the preceding year. The charges on account of country stationery appear only in Dhárwír and Kolaba. The printing charges have decreased in all districts except Dhárwár, where there is a small increase.
32. Miscellaneous.-The increase of Rs. 4,663-5-1 under this head is due to a refund of Rs. 5,000 to Provincial on account of toll collections at Samasgi toll bar in the Dhárwar District, which were wrongly credited to Local Funds in the previous years. The details of the total expenditure under this head are :-

33. Famine Relief.-This is an unusual item of expenditure. The Bijápur Board spent during the year Rs. 19,843-1-4, the Dharwár Board Rs. 1,190, and the Ratnágiri Board His. 700. No famine relief work, as such was started in Dhárwár during the year, and the expenditure on test works opened for the relief of needy persons which amounted to Rs. 8,295-7.10, is included under Civil Works. 'The sum of Rs. 1,190 shown under 33 -Famine Relief-is on account of advances made to the different Boards to onable them to make omergent payments to coolies on famine test works. As regards the Bijapur Board, Government have, in their Resolutions Nos. 1953 (General Department) and 1825 (Famine Departmeut), dated 6th and 9th April 1900, respectively, promised to exempt it from all famine liabilities, and the expenditure of ts. 19,843-1-4 incerred by it is only nominal as it will eventually be refunded by Government. Rs. 700 were apent by the Ratnagiri District Board on repairs to a road in the Deogad 'laluka, which work was carried out to meet the demand for labour in that táluka.
34. Civel Works.-The amount of expenditure under this head during the year rose from Rs. $4,00,832-14-6$ to Rs. $4,12,88 \varepsilon-3-11$ during the year under
report, exhibiting an increase of Rs. 12,055-5-5 due to some of the Boards having opened test famine relief works. The total expenditure is distributed as shown below:-

(1) Civil Buildings.-Rs. 20,693-13-4 were spent under this head as shown in the following table, which compares the figures of the year under report with those of 1898-99:-


Rs. 4,926-2-5 were laid out on original works, of which Rs. 4,341-6-6 were on account of 6 new school-buildings as shown below, and the remainder on account of special repairs and extensions, \&c., to existing school-houses and Rs. 38-11-11 in Kinara on the construction of a store-house at Honzwar.

Famine and plague charges prevented the District Local Boards of Bijaipur and Kolába from undertaking the construction of new school-buildings. In Dhárwár also, for the same reason, the expenditure on new school-houses was very much less than in 1898-99.
(2) Communications.-The total outlay is classified below both for 1899-1900 and 1898-99 :-


The mileage original cost and present condition of the Local Fund roads in the Division in charge of the Public $W$ orks Department are given in the notes of the several Executive Engineers, forming Appendix 5 to this report.

The Bijípur Board spent Rs. $38-10-4$ on the construction of a chavdi and the Ratnágiri Board Ks. 110 on a dharamsala. In 1898-99, 7 chavdis and 3 dharamsalas were constructed at a cost of Rs. 2,046-5-7.
(3) Water-supply and Water-works.-The expenditure on watersupply amounted to Rs. 43,245-9-6 against Rs. 41,411-15-6 in the preceding year. Full details of the works carried out by the several Boards will be found in Statement No. IV.
(4) Drainage Works.-Only Rs. 58-14-6 were spent under this head in the Belgaum District.
(5) Other Works of Public Inprovements.-Rs. 575-5-3 were expended under this head as constrasted with Rs. 919-6-3 in 1898-99, the chief objects of improvements being construction of and repairs to piers and dams, removal of prickly-pear, repairs to ferry boats, \&c.
(6) Establishment and Contingencies.-Under this sub-head an outlay of Rs. 48,141-11-4 was incurred as compared with Rs. 47, 229-3-11 in the preceding year.
(7) Tools and Plant.-The tools and plant purchased for the Local Board Establishment and the Government Public Works Establishments cost Rs. 4,493-15-3 against Rs. 5,413 in the previous year.
(8) Miscellaneous.-Rs. 323.

In compliance with paragrapl 2 of Government Resolution No. 4876 of 8th September 1897, details of the expenditure on public works carried out through the agency of the Public Works Department and through the establishments entertained by the several Boards are given in the annexed table, As compared with the outlay on Civil Works in 1898-99 there are large increases during the year against Belgaum and Dhárwár, due to the famine test works carried out by

Contributions.-The contributions "to Provincial" and "to other Boards" amounted respectively to Rs. 7,652-7-9 and to Rs. 12,117-11-2 against Rs. 8,717-4-10 and Rs. 15,995-4-0 in the preceding year, exhibiting a net decrease of Rs. 1,064-13-1 under the former and of Rs. 3,880-8-10 under the latter head. Debt and interest on debt.-Of the total outlay of Rs. 19, 231-1-2 under "Debt," the Bijápur District Local Board paid Rs. 3,597-15-5 in liquidation of the loan of Rs. 50,000 granted to that Board by Government for expenditure on the Begum Tank at Bijápur in the famine of 1876-77, and the Ratnágiri District Local Board paid Ro. 4,461-1-9 towards the payment of the last instalment of the Ambaghát loan. Of the former loan only Rs. 615-2-2 remained to be liquidated on 1st July 1900. The Dhárwár District Local Board also paid Rs. 9,772 in repayment of the loan made to it under Government Resolution No. 1043 of 26 th March 1895. On the interest account the following sums were paid during the jear under report :-

Balances.-Excluding the amount of deposits and permanent advances to the several Boards in the Division, the total balance amounted to Rs. 3,12,629-3-7 at the close of the year against Rs, 3,44,421-0-11 in ${ }^{*} 1893-99$. The subjoined statement gives the details regarding the income and closing balance of the several Local Boards for the last two years as well as the minimum balance prescribed by Government:-


That there is a steady attempt to reduce the balance is apparent from the fact that the excess of the Divisional balance over the prescribed minimum, which was 46 per ceut. on 31 st March 1898, was reduced to 35 per cent. at the end of 1898-99, and at the end of the year under report it is only 23 per cent. The balance of the Belgaum Board is much below the minimum. The excess in Bijápur and the defect in Dharwar are trifling. The other three districts show large surpluses. Prevalence of plague and an impending famine, with the consequent necessity of keeping reserves for expenditure on their account, is, as usual, the reason assigned for the accumulation of the balances in those districts. Tho Collectors explain that the Budgets were originally framed with a view to keeping the balances up to the prescribed limit, but the occurrence of scarcity led to the curtailment of all avoidable expenditure.
9. The following table shows the proportion of their respective expenditure which the several Boards contributed during the year under report to educational and medical objects, to Civil Works and to administration :-


The above statement shows that as in the past year the Ratnagiri Board incurred the largest proportion of its total expenditure on educational objects and the Kolaba Board on medical. objects. The percentage of expenditure on public works is highest in Dhárwár and that on adninistration in Kolába. Dhárwar is lowest in the percentage both under Educational and Medical objects.

10. A comparative statement for the years 1898-99 and 1899-1900 of the expenditure incurred under the principal heads of village sanitation is given below :-

11. The details of expenditure on the improvement of water-supply in the six districts of the Division are given in the sub-joined statement :-


Special activity in the direction of the improvement of water-supply is noticeable in Dhárwár. Kolába shows a small increase, while the remaining districts all show a falling off. Rs. 210 were spent by the Belgaum District Board on the eradieation of prickly pear and rank vegetation and Rs. 836-4-0 by the Kánara Board on conservancy.
12. On the subject of interesting villagers in local works, this year again Interesting villagers in no progress has been made and the subject is not works near their villages. likely to receive more attention until the return of reported that several temporary water-works were exeouted with the assistance the villagers contributed. The Villagers' Committees in Rajapur and Vengurla are said to have rendered considerahle assistance to the Vice President.
13. In material improvements also little progress is observable. All the Boards were handicapped by having to make provi-
Progress in material improvements. sion for plague expenditure, even if such expenditure was afterwards found not to be required and useful works had to be postponed. In Dhárwár the increased expenditure on Civil Works represents the outlay the Board had to incur on works undertaken in relief of famine. Generally speaking most of the sum spent on Civil Works was confined to maintenance.

Communications.-In the Belgaum District an outlay of Rs. 3,401-9-7 w8s incurred on original works and Rs. 68,054-13-4 on repairs. Among the original works carried out were the planting of road-side trees on the NipaniMahálingpur Road, which cost Rs. 1,272, and the completion of the Saundatti Dhárwár Road on which Rs. 827 were expended. It is not understood why the full amount of the contribution of Rs. 2,000 by the Kolhápur Durbar for playta
ing road-side trees on the Nipáni-Mahálingpur Road has not been expended. The Collector has been asked to report on this point. The most important Local Board Roads in the Bijápur Listrict, viz., the Bijápur-Sindgi, Indi-Sindgi, Bagevádi-Telgi and the Bágewadi-Bijápur Roads, had several material improvements effected on them and the usual repairs to these and other roads were carried out at a cost of Rs. 22,849-13-2. Rs. 853-1-2 were also expended on the planting of road-side trees. The Dhárwár Board spent Rs. 91,666-1-9 on repairs and Rs. 2,005-4-2 on Arboriculture, while about Rs. 4,000 nere spent on the construction of the Karajgi-Devárgudda Road and the AdvisomapurHarlápur Railway Station Road and the improvements to certain petty roads. In the Kanara District Rs. 2,991-1-11 were expended on special repairs to roads, bridges, and dharmshálas, and Rs. $32,453-3-4$ on repairs. The Sadashiv-gad-Kadra Road was improved at a cost of Rs. 295, and the survey of Hebanlerighát Road was undertaken. The Collector considers the Forest Department. sontribution of R, 1,800 per annum to the Local Board towards the maintenance of roads to be inadequate and his report on the matter stated to to have been submitted through the Conservator of Forests, Southern Circle, is still with that otticer. The transfer from Local to Provinoial of the two roads, viz., Ankola-Madras Frontier Road and the Yellápur Kodkani Road, is under

- the consideration of Government, aud if sanctioned will give much relief to the Boards of this district. As the Kolíba Board has to provide Rs. $2 \overline{\mathrm{n}, 000}$ for meeting plague charges in 1899-1900 it was uvable to undertake any important road works. It spent, however, Rs. 26,i05-9-5 on repairs, and undertook the surveys of the following Roads, viz., Bhorkas to Yatnus, Patnus to Kolad, Kashelle to Khandus, Kudus to Bhivápur, Kashelle to Neral, and Bhivapur to Kashelle. The Ratnágiri Board was greatly hampered by plague charges and could spend only some Rs. 863 -2-10 on original works, and Rs. 18,445-7-7 on repairs. It is gratifying to note tbat the Ambaghát loan has now been fully paid up, the last instalment having been paid during the year under report. Nearly Rs. 7,000 were spent on the tollowing hoads to meet demaud for labour, viz., 1 Marsi Bridge to Machemad Creek, 2 Málwan-Sukalwad Road, 3 PhundaKadávli Road, 4 Rájápur-Ansura Road, 5 Chiplun-Chickhi Road and 6 Bharve-. Amboli Road.

Water-supply, improvement of Village sites, qc.-What progress was made in this direction has been shown in the remarks on Statement IV. Plague made it necessary to limit other expenditure, and Government grants for watersupply baving been stopped no material improvement is noticeable.

Schools and other buildings.-Seven new schools, one chavdi and one dharmshala were constructed during the year at a cost of Rs. 4,528-12-9 against 10 schools and 10 chavdis, \&c., costing Rs. 15,475-13-11 in 1898-99. On repairs to the existing buildings Rs. 15,767-10-11 were spent.

Medical objects. - In the Dhárwár District the travelling Dispensary at Bankápur was closed during the year for want of funds. It is, however, reported that definite proposals are under consideration for establishing one -at Hángal. A dispensary at Ron is reported to be one of the main wants of that táluka, but the necessary popular contributions are not forthcoming. In the Kolába District a new travelling Dispensary for the Roha and Mángaon Tálukas was opened during the year which is expected to prove very useful. The Veterinary Dispensaries at Belgaum, Dhárwár, Ratnágiri and alibag are much appreciated and largely used.
14. Works Commitfees are reported to be in existence in all the Boards. Works Committees. A Code of rules on the lines of the Surat Code, has already been introduced in Kávara, and will be shortly introduced in Dhárwár and Kolába. In Bijápur and Ratnágiri the rules have been drafted and await discussion at the next meeting of the District Local Boards concerned. In Belgaum the draft from the Conimittee appointed to report on the matter is still awaited. The Collector should expedite the introduction of the Code, the usefulness of which was impressed on the Presidents of all the District Boards by Government so far back as in May 1897 (Government Resolution No. 2843, General Department of 1897, paragraph 16). In Belgaum
the members of the works committees generally inspect works in progress near their homes, but the responsibility for superintending and carrying them out devolves mainly on the Mámlatdár Vice-Presidents, aided by the Local Board sub-overseers and maistries employed under Taluka Boards. The Collector of Bijápur reports that in his district the members apportion the works between them, visit them while under construction and certify to their completion after personal inspection. In the Dhárwár District, the works committees of the Dhărwár, Hublí, Bankápur, Kalghatgi, Navalgund and Gadag Táluka Boards are reported to be taking fair amount of interest in their work, while the Hángal and Ránebennur committees are not favourably mentioned. The Collector states that the members of most of the Committees prefer to get their works executed by contracts rather than departmentally and remarks that the code of rules prepared on the lines of the Surat Code, which is now ready to be introduced, contains provisions calculated to check effectually this tendency. As regards Kánara the Collector reports that in tálukás the Mámlatdárs and in pethas the Mahálkaries have to bear the brunt of the Local Board work, and the majority of the non-official members take little interest in the management. In Kolaba the general indifference pointed out in the last year's report was to some extent overcome during the current year and some of the Táluka Committees have been favourably reported on. The works committee of the District Local Board showed zeal and energy in doing its business. The Collector of Ratnágiri states that a works committee of the District Board has been formed, but as important works are usually done by the Public Works Drpartment they have no supervision to do. The committees of Rájápur, Devgad, Málvan, Vengurla, Chiplun and Dápoli are spoken of favourably while the work of the Ratnagiri and Sangameshvar Committees is said not to be very satisfactory.
15. The following table will show at a glance the extent to which Local Boards have been compelled in recent years to defer' expenditure on original works on account of their having to provide funds for plague measures :-

16. The remarks of the several Collectors and Presidents of the District Local Boards are summarized below.

Belgaum.-Mr. Bonus states that the Divisional Officers report that little interest is displayed by the villagers in the work of the Boards and that the present position of the District Board is not encouraging. The reduction of the Board's balance below the prescribed minimum and the consequent necessity of abstention from practically all construction of new works (exclusive of those debitable to the educational part of the budget) promise to render the Board's operations of an extremely hum-drum character for some years to come. So far as present indications go there is a probability of saving money on the plague estimates, but this is discounted by the necessity for refunding popular contributions collected for works which the Board is unable to carry out. The leper-house scheme is indefinitely shelved, pending the decision of Government on the question of a new Civil Hospital.

Bijúpur.-The Collector, Mr. Drew, reports that the District Board has done its best to keep the existing Local Fund works in proper condition though it has been able to do little new work, and states that Ráo Bahadur A. R. Chitre, Huzúr Deputy Collector and Vice-President of the District

Local Board, and Messrs. Sheshgirrao, Government Pleader, and Basangowda Sadashivagowda Patil of Mangoli, continued to evince the same interest in Local Board affairs as before.

Dhárwár.-Mr. Doderet acknowledges the praiseworthy interest taken in Local Board work by Messrs. Krishnarao Valvekar and Ráo Sáheb Ramrao Desai, non-official Vice-Presidents of the Hubli and Dhárwár Táluka Boards, and the steady work of Mr. Ramráo Bellary, Chairman of the Dis* trict Board, Dhárwár.

Kánara.-The Collector states that in addition to the inadequate grant from the Forest Department for roads, the Board labours under the difficulty of maintaining the many existing roads at a large cost. If the transfer of the Local Fund roads referred to above to Provincial is sanctioned the Boards will be free to undertake new works of improvement. The sanitary condition and the water-supply of the coast talukas in this district are always good, but in the above ghat talukas malaria is always provalent in the cold season and water becomes scanty in the hot weather. Mr. Brown's predecessor, Mr. Lucas, has recorded a note to the effect that the District and Táluka Local Boards are not in a satisfactory state and that under the pretence of road repairs money is squandered and misappropriated. Mr. Brown is being asked to report what steps he has taken to remedy the state of affairs complained of.

Kolába.-Mr. Bagnell is of opinion that the Local Boards worked more satisfactorily during the year under report than in the preceding year. He states however that there is still room for improvement. Of the seven members of the District Local Board works committee the names of three, Messrs. Kawat, Agarkar and Dosabhoy Shapurji, are mentioned with approval for the zeal and energy displayed by them in looking after the affairs of the Board.

Ratnágivi.-The Collector states that the great want of the district is facility of communication, a want which it is not practicable at present to provide for. The outlook is not a hopeful one, each succeeding year brings to light new wants and emphasizes the necessity for the old ones, while the income is inelastic and shows no signs of increase. Mr. Bomanji further states that to add to the troubles of the Boards, money which could and should have been used to meet some of the needs of the district has for the last three years been diverted to plague and famine expenditure. The relief prayed for by the Board at the hands of Government in the matter of plague charges has been refused and the situation is, in his opinion, very discouraging.
17. The administration of the Boards was, under the peculiar circumstances of the year, on the whole satisfactory. The Boards have loyally co-operated with Government in the campaign against plague and famine and deserve thanks for their public spirit.

## Memorandum.

The Commissioner in Sind has the honour to submit the annual report on the administration of Local Boards in the Province of Sind for the year 18991900, together with Statements I to IV, compiled in his office.
2. The subjoined table shows the dates on which the reports were received from the several Collectors and Deputy Commissioners, as also the dates on which their final replies to references asking for further information or explanation were received :-

## Statement No. I.-Constitution of Boards.

3. No change took place in the number and constitution of the Boards during the year under report, there being five District and 49 Taluka Boards as in the preceding year.
4. A slight change was made in the areas of the Tando Alahyar and Mirpur Khas Táluka Boards in the Hyderabad and Thar and Parkar Districts respectively; owing to the transfer to the latter district of the uninhabited portion of the village of Godho in the Tando Alahyar Taluka, comprising 2.10 square miles of waste lands-vide Government Notification Nos. 8320 and $8320-\mathrm{A}$. of the 21st November 1899, published at pages 1723 and 1724 of the Bombay Government Gazette, Part I, for 1899. No changes in the areas of the other District Boards took place.
5. The elective franchise was in force in the Karichi, Hyderabad, and Shikalpur Districts aud in the Mirpur Khás Táluka of the Thar and Párkar District, to which it was extended in 1894, when forming part of the Hyderabad District. 'The members of the otiaer Boards in Thar and Párkar and the whole of the Upper Sind Frontior Districts are nominated, the elective system not having been extended to those areas owing chiefly to the backward condition of the iubabitants.
6. The number of nominated as well as elected members was the same as in last year.
7. The number of meetings held during the year under report was 313, including 19 adjourned for want of a quorum, against 357 in the previous year.

The District Local Board, Karáchi, again held only one half-yearly meeting owing to the prevalence of plague in the early part of the year. The rest of the District Local Boards held two half-yearly meetings. The в $911-16$

Karáchi, Hyderakad and Shikírpur Districts are mainly responsible for the decrease in the number of meetirgs held by the 'Jáluka Local Boards. The provisions of Section 34 of the Local Board Act were, however, availed of in nearly all the districts.
8. This year the average attendance of the members shows a slight improvement over that of last year, being 5.83 against $5 \% 75$.
9. The income of the several District Boards during the year under report amounted to lis. 8,24,348-5-7 as detailed below, showing a decrease of Rs. $41,451-\odot-1$ as compared with $18 \subseteq 8-i 9$, which is distributed generally throughout the whole of the Province :-

10. The causes for the fluctiations in the various items are briefly explained below :-
11. VI-Procincial Rates.-There is a general falling off in the receipts under this head in all the districts, the income this year being Rs. 4,84,398-13-7 as against Rs. $5,42,089-8-3$ last jear.

The poor inundation and the consequent failure of crops resulting in a decrease of Land Rerenue is the principal cause of the decrease. Its effects were felt thoughout the Province, but the decrease was most noticeable in the Shikárpur District, where the income under this head feil from Rs. $2,13,213$ in 1898-99 to Rs. $1,86,910$ in 1899-1900.

- 12. XII.-Interest.-The small increase of Rs. 66 calls for no explanation.
13.-XVII.-Police.-The proceeds under this head represent receipts under the Cattle Trespass Act, which this year amounted to Rs. 20,595-4-11, while last year the income was Rs. 18,805-8-1. The increase of Rs. 1,789-12-10 is shared by four out of the five districts, and is due to the impounding of a larger number of cattle which were probably allowed to stray in search of fodder during the scarcity prevailing during the year under review.
$X I X .-$ Education.-The income under this head is derived from the following sources, viz. :-

The increase under (1) school fees is contributed to by the Karáchi, Hyderabad and. Shikárpur Districts, and in the two former districts is attributed to improved attendance and in the latter district to the imposition of a "nominal fee" on the scholars of most of the important schools having more than 50 pupils on their rolls. The Commissioner notices with regard to the levy of the "nominal fee" by the Shikarpur Boards that the Educational Inspector was rather averse to the innovation, but doubtless the Resolution now passed by the Board and approved of by the Educational Inspector in regard to this point, by

Which certain schools are exempted from paying the fees, will remove the Educational Inspector's apprehension. The arrangement can only be regarded as an experiment and its effect most carefully watched. The only contributions received this year were by the Hyderabad Boards, which aggregated Rs. 2,300 against Rs. 300 in the previous year, the increase being due to receipt of arrear contributions from the Hyderabad Municipality.

There is an increase of Rs. 799-10-8 under (3) Miscellaneous this year, due principally to the refund of a sum of Rs. 616 on account of books supplied to the Indigenous schools, which was erroneously debited to Educational Local Funds in the Hyderabad District.
$X X$.-Melical.-As compared with the preceding year there is an increase in the income during the year under report of Rs. 2,317-2-8, the receipts during the two years 1899-1900 and 1898-99 being Rs. 3,739-1-0 and Rs. 1,421-14-4, respectively, the details of which are given below :-


The chief contributor towards this result is the Shikarpur District, which shows an increase of Rs. 2,957 under "Contributions," due to Ghotki Municipality contributing a sum of Rs. 3,000 towards the construction of a new dispensary at Ghotki, which was completed in 1897-98. The receipts from the other districts, both under "Contributions" and other heads, were normal and require no remarks.
$X X I$.-Scientific and Other Minor Departments.-The realizations under this head amounted to R. 12,113.8-2 as compared with an income of Rs. 11,539-6-5 during the previous year, resulting in an increase of Rs. 574-1-9, for which the receipts ander "(1) Botanical and other public gardens" are largely responsible as shown in the subjoined comparative statement :-


The Hyderabad and Thar and Parkar Districts show an increase of Rs. 314-14-0 and Rs. 716-2-6, respectively, due in the case of the former to larger receipts from the Hyderabad Economic Garden and in the case of the latter to higher bids received for garden produce.
XXV.-Miscellaneous.-The revenue derived from this source amounted during the year under review to Rs. 2,810-15-0 as against Rs. 2,878-12-3 last year.
XXXII.-Civil Works.-The income derived from this source decreased by Rs. $5,332-9-8$, being Rs. $49,943 \cdot 0-3$ against Rs. 55,275-9.11 in the preceding year, as detailed below:-

From the above statement it will be seen that the decrease occurs chiefly under the fluctuating heads of "Tolls on roads and ferries" and "Contributions," and call for no comment. It might, however, be added that the decrease under the first named item was common to all districts, and under the latter the Karáchi and Upper Sind Frontier Districts showed increases, which, however, were too small to balance the decrease in the other districts.

Contributions.--These amounted to Rs. 2,39,131-5-11 during the year under report, whereas the contributions received last year totalled Rs, $2,25,758-0-2$, showing an increase of Rs. 13,373-5-9; the actual increase, however, should be Rs. 10,437-5-9, as a sum of Rs. 2,936, on account of the educational share of the contribution in lieu of the oze-anna cess on Excise revenue in the Hyderabad District, was not taken into account as in the previous year.

The provincial contributions amounted to Rs. 2,28,440-8-8, as shown in the subjoined table, against Rs. 2,20,570.0.2 last year :-

The sum of Rs. 187-13-4 shown in the above statement under "Govern" ment grant towards plague charges" was sanctioned in Government Resolution No. 1325 of 15 th March 1899 on account of expenditure incurred at the Observation Camp at Mehrabpur in connection with plague.

The contributions from other Boards shown in Statement II amounted to Rs. 10,640-13-3 or almost double the amount realized last year which was Rs. 5,188 . The increase is due mainly to the contributions received by the Karáchi District Board towards the Malir Camp expenses which were shared by all the District Boards proportionately to their income, the sum contributed by the other Boards on this account amounting to Rs. 4,538-8-4. The other contributions were for-

$X V-$ Post Officr. - The expenditure of a sum of Rs. 31-11-9 shown under this head was incurred by the Taluka Board of Umarkot in the Thar and Parkar District and represents the pay of a postal runner, employed from Local Funds from 2nd November 1899 to the 28th February 1900 between the Shadipalli Station on the Hyderabad-Umarkot Railway and Dhengan-Bhurgiri, at which place a branch post office has been opened.

XVIII-Administration.-The expenditure under this head increased by Rs. 647-0-10 during the year under report, the figures for the two years 1898-99 and 1899-1900 being respectively Rs. 25,227-4-11 and Rs. 25,874-5-9.

XXII-Education. - The total expenditure incurred under this head during the year under report amounted to $\mathrm{Ks} .2,29,705-0-2$ as against Rs. 2,40,492-0-1 in the previous year, the decrease being Rs. 10,786-15-11 for which the Shikárpur, Hyderabad and Thar and Párkar Districts are mainly responsible.

In the Shikárpur as well as the other two districts the principal decrease occurred under "Grants-in-aid" due chiefly to the fact that no special grants were made for repairs to the Madressah building at Karáchi during the year under report. The contributions for that purpose during the previous year amounted to Rs. 6,190.

In 1898-99 the Shikarpur District made a grant, which was not repeated this year, of Rs. 1,500 to the Sind Arts College and the Sind Madressah on behalf of the Sukkur Municipality, as the latter body was unable to pay its annual grants owing to financial embarrassment caused by heavy plague expenditure.
$X X I V$-Medical. - The following table giving the items which are responsible for the expenditure incurred under this head, shows that the expenditure during the year under report amounted to Rs. 99,187-11-3 against Rs. 1,30,078-11-5 during the preceding year.

Plague charges show a decrease of Rs. 35,873-0.7, due to smaller contributions having been made on this arcount, chiefly by the Shikarpur Board. There is also a decrease of Rs. 1,026-11-3 under "Sanitation charges," nothing having been spent in this connection by the Shikárpur and Thar and Párkur District Boards.

The amount shown under "Cholera charges" was spent by the Karichi and Tatta Táluka Boards, on account of the treatment of cholera-stricken patients by the former; and of the preventive measures adopted by the latter.

XXVI-Scientific and other Minor Departments.-Under this head the expenditure amounted to Rs, 48,913-4.2 against Rs. 51,561-6-9 in the preceding year, resulting in a decrease of Rs. 2,648-2-7. The amounts spent under the several items during the year under report are compared below with those spent in the year 1898-99. The transfer of charges on account of feed and keep of Bulls and Stallions from Local Funds to Imperial Revenues under Government Resolution No. 1877 of the 13th March 1899, contributed in a large measure towards the decrease. The actual saving on this account being Rs. 4,614-6-5, which was however more than counterbalanced by the increased expenditure under (1) Veterinary charges (Rs. 3,205-2-9), (2) Botanical and other Public Gardens (Rs. 2,009-5-8), the saving of Rs. 3,277-1-8 under "Public Exhibitions and Fairs" restored the balance and the result was a net saving of Rs. 2,6ts-2-7 as reported above.

The Shikirpur and Karachr Districts are mainly responsible for the increase under Veterinary charges, due in the case of Shikírpur to the payment, in addition to other minor charges, of a sum of Rs. 1,926.5-4 as compensation on the resumption of the old Post Olfice site, which was let on lease, for the Veterinary Dispensary.

In the Karichi District the increase is due to the entertainment of an Itinerating Veterinary Assistant. The increase under Botanical and other Puble Gardens is general throughout the districts and is especially noticeable in the Karachi, Hyderabad, and Thar and Párkar and Shikárpur Districts where scarcity in fodder, \&c., incroased the charges on account of the feed and keep of the live-stock employed in the gardens.

$X X X$-stationery and Printing.-The expenditure under this head amounted to Rs. $3,805-15-1$ against Rs. $2,219-3-11$ in 15:8.99. As the items are of a fluctuating nature no remarks are called for,
$X X X I I$.-MFiscellaneous.-The total expenditure incurred amounted to Rs, 24,568-14-1 during the year under report as compared with Rs. 21,966-9-3, showing an increase of Rs. 2,602-4-10, whioh occurs chiefly under (1) "Miscellaneous and Unforeseen Charges," (2) "Miscellaneous Refunds," and (3) "Staging Bungalows and Serai Establishment Charges."
$X L V$.-Civil Works.-In accordance with the orders of the Government of India conveyed in Bombay Government Resolution No. 2584 of the 19th June 1899, the revised set of sub-heads under "45-Civil Works" in Statement III have been substituted for the former set ; the details of the amount expended on Public Works carried out (a) through the agency of the Public Works Department and (b) through the agency of Establishments entertained by the Boards, have been given in the body of the several reports, as directed.

The total amount expended under this head during the year under report was Rs. $3,44,269-9-4$ against Rs. $4,21,488-1-11$ in the previous year.

The decrease may be attributed mainly to the orders contained in Government Circular No. 4086 of the 30th August 1899, on the subject of husbanding all resources-Imperial, Provincial and Local-with a view to meeting the then impending scarcity.

Contributions.-These amounted to Rs. 40,552-2-11 during the year under report, of which Rs. 18,044-13-11 were contributed to "Provincial" and Rs. 22,507-8-0 to "Other Boards," respectively.

The balances of the Karáchi, Hyderabad and Thar and Párkar, respectively, show a decroase, while those of the Shikarpur and Upper Sind Frontier Districts have increased, which is due to their resources having been husbanded in accordance with Government orders. The strengthened balance in the case of the Shikárpur District Board is satisfactory, as its opening balance was somewhat low. The other Boards had adequate opening.balances, and in no case was there any undue reduction. The Upper Sind Frontier Board, as remarked last year, shows a tendency to maintain an unnecessarily large balance; the closing balance now exceeds its normal annual income.

The expenditure incurred this year shows a decrease of Rs. 5,853-4-6 as compared with the amount spent last year. The decrease occurs in all the districts except that of the Upper Sind Frontier, in which there was a slight increase of Rs. 265-14-6, which does not call for comment.

A sum of Rs. 19,992-6-2 was spent on the improvements of water-supply, which included the sinking of 22 new wells and the excavation of a drain, at a total cost of Rs. 6,857-14-1; repairs to existing wells, tanks, \&e., cost Rs. 11,565-6-9; and a sum of Rs. $1,369-1-4$ was spent by the Shikarpur District Local Board in paying the establishment entertained in guarding the sources of drinking water.

Under " Improvements of village sites, \&c.," a sum of Rs. $6662-8$ was spent, of which Rs. 616-2-8 was on account of the laying out of streets; drains, \&c., the remainder, Rs. 50, being for the removal of "prickly-pear and rank vegetation " in two villages in the Karáchi District.

The conservancy of towns and villages cost Rs. 327-1-7 against Rs. 1,222-3-2 in the previous year.

A sum of Rs. 548-3-4 was spent by the Shikirpur Board on sanitary arrangements at fairs and festivals.
15. The number of Local Fund Roads in charge of Public Works Officers are three in the Indus Right Bank Division under the care of the Executive Engineer, Karáchi Canals, and 7 in the Indus Left Bank Division under the Executive Engineer, Central Hyderabad Canals. All the other roads are in charge of the Mukhtyárkars, who, under the orders of the Assistant and Deputy Collectors, carry out the necessary repairs. The reports of the Chief and Superintending Engineers, Indus Right and Left Bank Divisions, respectively, as well as the statements accompanying them are attached as required by Government Resolution No. 779 of the 30th January 1890.

18. The reports from the several Collectors and Presidents of District Local Boards in the Province of Sind are appended.
19. The system under which the execution and supervision of works is carried out in the whole Province is the same as hitherto followed and described in the report for 1897-98, and need not be repoated here.
20. The administration of the Local Boards during the year under report may be considered satisfactory. Plague preventive measures again entailed some expenditure of Local Funds, mainly on the Malir Medical Examination Camp, but the total amount was comparatively small, and the incomes of the Boards were almost entirely available for the more ordinary objects of Looal Fund expenditure. The falling off in receipts owing to the unfavourable season, together with the admonition of Government that resources should be husbanded on account of possible famine expenditure, restricted the outlay on new works to some extent, but, as shown above, a number of useful new works were undertaken. The expenditure on water-supply and sanitation appears small, and shows a general tendency to decrease.

[^0]6. VI.-Provincial Rates-Local Rates.-Receipts under this head amounted to Rs. 66,098-8-8 against Rs. 76,186-1-6 in the previous year, showing a decrease of Rs. $10,087-8-10$, which is chiefly due to failure of crops caused by low inundation and absolute want of rain last year.
7. XII. -Interest on Dispensary Securities.-Under this head there is an increase of 40-12-10, the receipts during the year being Rs. 595-14-8 against Rs. $555-1-10$, in the previous year. The increase is due to interest accrued on Rs. 2,400 of the Johi Dispensary Fund invested in Government Securities during the year under report.
8. XVII.-Police Receipts under Crillle Trespass Act.-Receipts under this head amount to Rs. 3,04,2-0-11 against Rs. 2,255-2-1, showing an increase of Rs. 756-14-10. The increase, which occurs chiefly in Sujáwal and Mirpur Bathoro Tálukas, is due to a large number of cattle laving been brought into these talukas for grazing from Cutch and Thar and Parkar District.
9. XIX.-Education.-Receipts under this head amount to Rs. 1,212-7-8 against Rs. 1,162-11-2, showing an increase of Rs. 49-12-6 which occurs chiefly in School Fees and is explained by the Educational Inspector in Sind to be due to increased attendance in schools.
10. XX.-MEdical Hospital and Dispensary Receipts.-Receipts under this head, which are composed of Hospital Stoppages and sale-proceeds of old and unserviceable articles, amounted to Rs. 21-4-0 against Rs. 15-15-3 in the previous year, showing an increase of Rs. $5-4-9$, which is chiefly due to more old and unserviceable articles of the Jerruck Dispensary having been sold in 1899-1900.

Contributions.-Rs. 110 were recovered and credited in 189!1-1900 on account of popular contributions towards the Johi Dispensary Fund in addition to Rs. $2,395-8$ credited in previous years.,

The grants-in-aid to the several dispensaries are the same as those in the previous year. The decrease of Rs. 65-11-3 in the charges of the ward attached to the North-Western Railway Dispensary at Dadu is due to the fact that the figures for $1898-39$ include the cost of Dead Stock articles purchased during that year to furnish the ward. The inerease of Rs. 2,283-8-2 in the expenditure of the dispensaries is due (1) to the expenditure incurred on account of the Jati Dispensary with a Branch Dispensary at Ladiun, which were opened to the public in April 1899, and (2) to all the dispensaries having, unlike the two next preceding years, remained open almost throughout the year 1899-1900, as the Hospital Assistants in charge thereof were not deputed to plague duty for long periods; and were in some cases replaced by temporary Hospital Assistants.

## Horse and Cattle Shows.

This year the only horse show held was that at Moro on the 18th, 19th and 20th January 1900.

The total sum placed at the disposal of the Horse Show Committee was Rs. 3,700, of which Government contributed Rs. 700 and the District Local Board Rs. 2,000. The Táluka Local Boards provided the balance of Rs. 1,000 in the following proportions:-


The details of expenditure were as follows :-


The show was not so successful as that of the previous year owing to the general failure of crops, consequent of the deficiency of canal water, low floods, want of rain and scarcity of grass, all of which had a depressing effect on exhibitors. This was shown by the number of exbibits, which fell from 942 to 659. Only 76 exhibits were brought from other districts, inclusive of His Highness the Mir's Territory. There were 64 mules and 95 foals and yearlings, sired by Government stallions, posted in the Naushahro Division. The Hyderabad and Thar and Párkar Police obtained 10 remounts, and it is said that the other stock fit for police work was available but was not purchased owing to the high prices asked by owners. After very careful consideration it was decided not to hold the Talhar show, the Zamindárs being very averse to the usual show on account of their having experienced a very bad season, and fodder being very scarce.

A sum of Rs. 548-3-4 was spent on sanitary arrangements on fairs this year against Rs. 252 last year.

## Veterinary Charges.

The total expenditure incurred under this head anoounted to Rs. 4,431-12-4 against Rs. 4,296.1-9 last year. Government contributed Rs. 775 towards the maintenance of the Veterinary Dispensary at Hyderabad and Rs. 480-2-0 for the Itinerating Veterinary Dispensary at Naushabro. The total sum of Rs. 1,255-2-0 has been shown under the head of Provincial contributions.

## Teterinary Dispensary at Hyderabad.

The total number of cases during the year was 1,014 against 1,111 last year. The decrease of 94 cases in the attendance of out-patients may probably be ascribed to the prevalence of plague at Hyderabad, which almost emptied the town for several months. The work of the construction of the new dispensary was completed by the end of July, and the building was occupied in the following month. The total amount expended on the construction of the building was Rs. 13,526-11-9, inclusive of the sum of Rs. 1,500 contributed by private persons
on the understanding that the dispensary be named after Mr. Steele, late Collector of Hyderabad, and that the following additional accommodation be provided :-

1. $\mathbf{A}$ dog shed.
2. Sweepers' quarters.
3. Water service.
4. Additional accommodation for the Veterinary Graduate in charge of the Dispensary. The dispensary was formally opened by the Commissioner in Sind, Mr. R. Giles, C.I.E., in August last.

The levy of fees at the dispensary is a new experiment, which was commenced in the month of November last. So far it appears to have had no ill effect, but a more definite judgment on the result of the experiment can be given when next year's report goes in.

Mr. Asudamal, the Veterinary Graduate who has remained in charge of the dispensary throughout the year, continues to take the greatest interest in his work, and to him is due the success which has attended the opening of the dispensary.

## Itinerating Veterinary Dispensary.

Of the seven, two horses belonged to the Mounted Police, Naushahro Division, and the remaining five were private property. Efforts to induce Zamindárs to have their horses castrated are being made, but no noteworthy headway has yet been made. No cases of rinderpest occurred in the Naushahro Division during the year. (10) A landhi for the stallions located at Hala was constructed at a cost of Rs. 188.
(11) A new well was constructed at Shahdádpur at a cost of Rs. 420.
(12) Additions and improvements and repairs of existing sources of water-supply were carried out at an outlay of Rs. 2,809-10-11.
(13) Repairs to existing roads and bridges were carried out at a cost of Rs. 38,220-1-6. The work of planting and preservation of trees also received attention and Rs. 7,910-2-11 were spent on it.
(14) Additions, alterations and repairs to the existing Scbool Buildings were carried out at a cost of Rs. 5,357-3-10.
(15) Repairs to Musafarkhánás and other buildings were carried out at an outlay of Rs. 3,293-9-6.
(16) Repairs to Dispensary Buildings were carried out at a cst of Rs. 755-2-7.

## 29.-Execution and Supervision of works.

The works undertaken by the Boards are carried out either by Public Works Agency at a charge of 12 per cent. or by the overseers employed by the Board. The system is regulated by the Bombay Local Board Act, I of 1884, and the rules framed thereunder by which-
(1) Works costing Rs. 500 and less are executed by the Boards who make their own plans and estimates.
(2) Works costing over R.s. 500 up to Rs. 2,500 are also executed by the Boards, but the plans and estimates are reviewed by the Public Works Department at a-charge of 1 per cent. on the cost of the work.
(3) Works costing oyer Rs. 2,500 are executed by the Public Works Department at a charge of 12 per cent. on the cost of the works.
(4.) In the case of roads, the cost of which exceeds Rs. 50-0.0 per mile, the plans and estimates are reviewed by the Public Works Department at a charge of 1 per cent. To assist the Boards in carrying out their own works, Overseers, Sub-Overseers, and Maistries are employed, and these prepare the plans and estimates for the works to be carried out either by Public Works or Civil Agency.
(30.) Works Committees are appointed to superwise works in progress and to attest the certificates of completion of the works. Experience has shown that non-official members rarely take any interest in this matter; the supervision consequently falls practically on the Mukhtyarkars, who are the Vice-Presidents of the Boards. The Collector and President of the District Local Board, and the Presidents of the Táluka Local Boards, i.e., the Assistant and Deputy Collectors, also inspect the works during the touring season, and the initiative in works of improvement is in reality taken by them.
(31.) The work of the Local Fund office has been carried on by Mr. Narainsing, the Local Fund Accountant, whose services have been retained permanently now that the former incumbent has retired. He has continued to work with the same zeal as hitherto, and has brought the Local Fund work to a highly efficient state.

I have the honour to submit my annual report on the working of the Local Boards in this district for the year 1899-1900, together with the usual statements I to IV, i.e.,-

Statement No. I.
Constitution.
2. The area and population of the district and the number and constitution of the Boards underwent no change. The vacant seat of the representative of the holders of entire alienated villages in the Larkhána Taluka referred to in the last year's report remains still unfilled, the President of the Board stating that the holders of such villages oould not find a competent and fit person to represent their interests on the Board.

One elected member of each of the Táluka Looal Boards of Kambar and Rato-dero, representing those Boards on the District Board, as also one nominated member of the Nasirabad Taluka Board died during the year, and their places were filled up in due course.

The foregoing statement shows that the number of meetings held was 85 against 99 in the preceding year. The Taluka Looal Boards responsible for the decrease are those of Shikárpur, Nausharo, Rohri, Mirpur, Labdaria, Rato-dero, Mehar and Nasirabad. In the absence of any rule fixing the number of meetings for the Táluka Local Boards in the Sukkur Division, the meetings held by the Shikarpur and Nausharo Táluka Local Boards are not too few, nor those held by the Boards of Rohri and Mirpur Talukas, for whom four meetings only are prescribed by their rules. The remaining Boards, which ought to meet every month, account for the deficiency by stating-LLabdaria and Nasirabad that they had no work, and Rato-dero and Mehar that their Vice-Presidents were absent, The provisions of Section 34 of the Local Boards Act were resorted to twice only by the District Board owing to the difficulty of calling a meeting for urgent business,

## Statenent No. II.

## Income.

4. The opening balance was Rs. 29,845-12-7, and the closing balance Rs. 49,776-6-7 for the whole district.
5. The figures under various heads of receipts and the causes of their increase and decrease are explained as follows:-
6. IV.-Provincial Rates-Local Rates.-This is the principal source of revenue, and receipts from it amounted to Rs. 1,86,910-6-8 against Rs. 2,13,212-15-7 in the preceding year, showing a decrease of Rs. 26,302-8-11 due to the decrease in land revenue.
7. XII.-Interest.-The interest on Government Securities belonging to Dispensary Funds was Rs. 97-12-2 against Rs. 98.3-2 in the previous year, showing a decrease of Rs. 0-7-0 only, a sum too insignificant to require explanation.
8. XVII.-Police.-Receipts under the Cattle Trespass Act fall under this head. They amounted to Rs. 8,070-14-2 against Rs. 7,248-10-5 in the preceding year, showing an increase of Rs. $822-3-9$, due to the fact that less expenditure was incurred on the construction and repair of cattle pounds in the and is credited to Local Funds year. This is an item of assigned revenues, and is credited to Local Funds after the expenditure is deducted.
9. $X I X$-Education.- Onder this head there are only two sources of income, viz., "School Fees" and "Miscellaneous." The former amounted to Rs. 309-13-6 against Rs. 193-12-0 in the preceding year, showing an inorease of Rs. 116-1-6 due to the imposition of a "nominal fee" on the scholars of most of the important schools having more than 50 pupils on their rolls. The Deputy Educational Inspector in his Administration report states that no less than five Local Board schools get numbers of pupils from adjoining villages about a mile or two distant (which shows the desire of the people of outlying villages to give primary education to their children), and expresses a fear that the introduction of the system of fee-lery will affect this desire considerably, specially when full fees are charged. - This question was brought before the Shikarpur District Local Board also in their half-yearly meeting held on the 26th May last, when the Educational Inspector in Sind, $\boldsymbol{R}$. $B$. Seth Alumal, was present, and after a protracted discussion the following resolution was unanimously passed :-

Resolution:- "The District Local Board adopt the general principle that in all schools under their control fees should be levied from the scholars, with the exception suggested by the Educational Inspector, viz-

> I—Girls schools. II—All now school III—Partial exemp areag.

II-All now schools for the first two years.
III-Partial exemption of schools in epecially backward and poverty-stricken
"The rates (as per margin) suggested by the Educational Inspector are
lat Standard and infant class, 6 pies der mensem.
2nd, 3rd and 4th Standards, 1 anna per mensem.
6th and 6th Standarde, 2 .annas per mengem. accepted and should be levied from the 1st October next. As prescribed by rules 4, 5 and 6 of draft II under Section $48 \cdot(b)$ of the Local Boards Act, the visiting committees of the Taluka Local Boards should settle the free list of the several schools within the limits prescribed by the Educational Department. The free list may extend at present to 30 per cent. in villages of over 500 inhabitants and 50 per cent in villages of 500 and fewer inhabitants.

With reference to exception III above, the Taluka Local Boards should be at liberty to make reoommendations to the District local Board for the entire as well as the partial exemption from payment of fees in schools in specially backward parts of the country, regarding whioh the Educational Department will be consulted by the District Local Board."

Miscellaneous receipts amounted to Rs. 197-7-7 against Rs. 293-13-0, showing a decrease of Rs. 96-5-5 due to the fact that, unlike last year, no recovery of excess payment was made from contractors.
10. $X X$-Medical.-The receipts under the head Hospitals and Dispen: saries amounted to Rs. $84-6-2$ against Rs. $35-1-5$, showing an increase of Rs. 49-4-9 due partly to the fact that savings were effected in the purchase money of a promissory note for the Ubauro Dispensary sent in advance, the note having bsen bought at a discount, and partly to the fact that privilege leave allowance to a Hospital Assistant payable usually from Provincial Fund was erroneously paid from Local Funds, and subsequently re-adjusted by the order of the Accountant General.
(b) Contributions amounted to Rs. 3,068 against Rs. 101 only, which latter representing municipal contributions to vaccination remains the same every year. The difference this year is accounted for by the facts that Rs. 33 due by the Garhi Yasin Municipality has not yet been credited, and the Ghotki Municipality contributed Rs. 3,000 towards the construction of a new dispensary at Ghotki completed in 1897-98.
(c) There were no receipts under "Miscellaneous" (other receipts), because no disinfectants or other medicines were sold during the year.
11. XXI-Scientific and other Minor Departments.-Botanical and other garden receipts amounted to Rs. 2,576-1-7 against Rs. 2,566-7-3 in the preceding year, showing an increase of Rs. $9-10-4$, a sum too insignificant to require explanation.

II-Veterinary Receipts.-The receipts under this head amounted to Rs. 8-14-0 against Rs. 9-14-0 in the previous y€ar, the former representing the B 911-27
cost of medicines supplied for Government stallion recovered from the Superintendent, Civil Veterinary Department, Beluchistan and Sind, and the latter the travelling allowance of the Veterinary Graduate recovered from the Khyrpur State as shown in the last year's report.

12. This bead has three sub-heads, viz.:-

L-Sale of old stores and materials.
II.-Fees of staging bungslows.

The receipts from the first (sale of old stores and materials) amounted to Rs. 11 against Rs. 102 in the last year, showing a decrease of Rs. 91, duc to the fact that none of the Boards sold anything of the kind during the year, and the materials belonging to their schools were also sold to a less extent in tha year of report.
(ii) The receipts realized from staging bungalows amounted to Rs. 41-8-0 against Rs. 8 only in the preceding year. The increase is mostly in the receipts of the Pano Akil bungalow which was occupied for a longer period in the year of report than in the preceding year.
(iii) The receipts under other items amounted to Rs. 1,083-3-0 against Rs. $4 \mathbf{5} 7-1.5$ in the last year. The increase of Rs. 626-1-7 is due to the following facts:-

1. that owing to change in the management of Government stallions and transfer of the charge entirely to Government, as per Gov-. - ernment Resolution No. 1877, dated 13th March 1899, one moiety of the cost of feed and keep of stallions paid by the Local Board was recovered from Government during the year;
2. ttat the cost of disinfectants for Rádhan Camp paid from Local, Funds at the time was reeovered from Government during the year;
3. that proportionate share of charges incurred on the printing of forms for Rádhan Camp was recovered from several Municipalities during the year.

(i) The receipts from tolls on ferries amounted to Rs. 10,532-0-2: against Rs. 11,911-2-11 in the last year. The decrease of Rs. 1,379-2-9. is: due to the fluctuating nature of the receipts, and can bardly be explained.
(ii) The receipts from the rent of buildings and lands amounted to Rs. 1,379-0-9 against R. $1,403-10 \cdot 0$ in the last year. The decrease of Rs. 24-9-3 is a fluctuation, which needs no comment.
(iii) Rs. 800 were realized from the sale of Bugri garden land in the Rohri Taluka. The sale of old stores and materials fetched Rs. 48-5-6 against nil last year, owing to none baving been sold in that year.
(iv) Miscellaneous receipts or receipts from road-side trees, as in the heading, represent sale-proceeds of road-side trees, babul pods and dead-wood. They amounted to Rs. 2,229-4-0 against Rs. 2,329-10-6 in the preoeding year. The small decrease of Rs. $100-6-6$ is due to the fluctuating preceding

## Contributions.

14. Contributions from Provincial to Local-


The subjoined statement will show in detail the several objects for which these contributions were granted, with the figures of each for the year under report and the previous year, and with the amounts of increase and decrease in the same, as, without such a statement, the expression " contributions from Provincial to Local" does not convey any idea as to the nature of the grants :- .


It will be seen from this statement that there is a variation under "sand nnd quarry fees" and "fishery fees," both of which are of fluctuating nature, the former showing an increase owing to greater competition, and the latter a decrease owing to less competition.

Another item in the statement which requires an explanation is the "grant to Primary Sohools." It shows an inorease of Rs. 3,000, which, according to Government Resolution No. 592 of the 11th May 1899, was added to the original grant of this District, being taken from the grant of the Upper Sind Frontier Distriot on the ground stated in the preamble of that resolution that the grant of that District was in excess of their wants and that of the Shikarpur District was inadequate.

The Sanitary Committees having kept separate accounts the grants to village sanitation no longer appear in this report.

During the year under report as in the previous year Rs. 3,355 were recovered from Government on account of contribution towards the maintenance of Dispensaries as below:-

This sub-head inoludes pay and allowances as also travelling allowance of Head Masters and teachers and the pay of servants. The decrease falls chiefly under sub-head "Masters and teachers" due to the decrease in the average pay of untrained Head Masters which the Deputy Educational Inspector, Shikárpur, states in his annual report to be Rs. 10 against Rs. 13-14-7 in the last year, and the reduction in the number of that class of teachers with a proportionate increase in the number of untrained and unpassed assistants drawing Rs, 8 and odd, the number of teachers as a whole remaining the same. There was an increase of 75 in the number of pupils.

No contribution to special or other repairs to Madressah were paid and none to that institution or the Sind Arts College on behalf of the Sukkur Municipality as was done in the last year, which accounts for the decrease of Rs. 4,582 shown above.
(c) Scholarships.


The decrease is accounted for by the fact that the Training College at Hyderabad had to draw no arrears for any period of the preceding year as was done in the last year.

The Veterinary student of the Bombay College remained sick throughout the year and drew no scholarship. Only Rs. 60 were paid on account of his College fee against last year's expenditure of Rs. 235-4-11.

Refunds-Rs. 2-1-0. This represents the refund of travelling allowance received hy Mr. Abu Bakar, Head Master, Vernacular School, Bichanji, from the Sub-Civil Court, Sukkur, and erroneously credited to Local Funds.
20. XXIV-Medical.-The payments under this head are made up of-

1. Grants to hospitals and dispensaries Rs. 6,800 the same as in the last year.


The decrease has no significance and requires no explanation. This drug is purchased every year for distribution among the poor population of the District who are out of reach of the public dispensaries.
3. Maintenance of the Local Fund Disponsaries Rs. 4,201-11-6 against Rs. 3,143-13-8 in the preceding year, showing an increase of Rs. 1,057-13-10 due to the Ubauro Dispensary baving purchased a five hundred rupees Promissory Note, having paid their Hospital Assistant at a higher rate of pay and having purchased Medical Stores, and to the Dokri Dispensary having bad to pay more than in the last year on account of petty supplits and petty repairs.
4. Vaccination Establishment charges, Rs. 6,313-3-6, against Rs, 6,398-5-0 in the last year, showing a decrease of Rs. 85-1-6, a sum too small to require explanation.
5. Medical Schools and Colleges Rs. 500 , the same as was contributed in the last year to the Medical School at Hyderabad.
6. Plague charges Rs. $9,668-13-8$ as compared with Rs. $40,745-5-9$, spent in the previons year, the decrease of Rs. 31,076-8-1 being due to the fact that no contribution was made to the Karachi or Sukkur Municipality as was done in the last year. The expenses incurred in the year of report were on account of the camps opened at the Rádhan and Rohri Railway stations against arrivals from Hyderabad and Karáchi for the protection of the Shikarpur District as also on account of some small quota paid towards the Malir camp expenses. There was no plague in the Shikarpur District in the year under report.
21. $X X V$-Scientific and other Minor Departments.-The Board contributed Rs. 1,000 as usual to the Sind Horse show held at Jacobabad in 1900.

The succession of three years in which Government Resolution No. 6237, dated 21st August 1897, decided the show to be held at Jacobabad is over, and it has to be considered whether the former rotation should again be resorted to. Mr. Mules, however, made a suggestion, in which the Superintendent, Civil Veterinary Department, Beluchistan and Sind, and the Veterinary Inspector General concurred, that there should be an annual local show at Shikárpur. The Board at their last meeting approved of the suggestion, and the Collector is in correspondence with the Superintendent, Civil Veterinary Department, who has fixed 18th February 1901, and the following days as the dates on which the show will be held. The prospectus is in course of preparation and will be sent to the Commissioner's Press to be printed with the sanction of the Commissioner in Sind. Owing to the institution of the District Horse Show the grant to the Upper Sind Frontier District has been reduced by half, i.e., Rs. 500, of which the Deputy Commissioner of that District has been informed.

This item consists of the pay and allowances of establishment contingencies and travelling allowance; and the increase is due (1) to the leave allowance paid to the Veterinary Graduate, who was granted privilege leave during which time another graduate was appointed to act for him; (2) to the travelling allowance paid to that graduate from Bombay to Shikárpur; and (3) to Rs. 1,926-5-4, paid as compensation on the resumption of the old post office site originally intended for the dispensary, but subsequently let on lease till it was finally decided to use it as the Veterinary Dispensary.

Of the number admitted, 84 were in-patients against 115 in the last year. There were no stables for the last three months, the materials of the stables having been removed to be utilized in building new stables, and this is alleged to be the reason for the serious falling off in the number. In the year under report as in the preceding year no case of rinderpest was treated by the Veterinary Graduate. (d) Botanical and other Public Gardens.-Ris. 4,969-14-11 were expended under this head during the year under review against Rs. 4,663-10-2 in the preceding year, showing an increase of Rs. 306-4-9 chiefly, in the contingencies of the Mirpur Táluka Local Board, due to the scarcity of fodder in that táluka.

## Works in charge of Public Works Department Officerg. Original Works-Civil Buildings.

Construction of two stables, one at Dokri and the other at Kambar, Kis. 1,783-10-2. This was formerly a Provincial Charge and Local Fuads had only to pay a moiety of the cost of feed and keep of the stallions. The Goverament of India; in their orders embodied in Government Resolution No. 2877, dated 13th March 1899, made "feed and keep" entirely an Imperial charge and transferred the construction and repair of stables to Local Funds. This is, therefore, the first report in which the charge has appeared.

Communications.

Thus the total expenses incurred on works carried out by Public Works Agency amounted to Rs. 8,591-3-5 against Rs. 18,444-15-5 in the preceding year the decrease being due to the opening of plague observation camps at Radhan and Rohri, to provide for the maintenance of which some of the works provided for in the budget were postponed. The amount of percentage on account of establishment charges and audit fees for works carried out by the Public Works Department was Rs. 1,030-15-2 against Rs. 2,328-11-5.

## Contributions.

26. Rupees 17, under Provincial, represents contributions towards the maintenance of the Ghar Canal embankment, paid to the Public Works Department.

Out of Rs. 2,788-0-0 (contributions to other Boards), Rs. 1,000 was paid towards the Sind Horse Show held at Jacobabad, Rs. 1,100 to the Hyderabad Female Training College as usual, and the remainder to the several Sanitary Committees in the District.

The closing balance of the year under report was Rs. 49,776-6-7 as against Rs. 29,84.5-12-7, the increase being due to the fact that the funds had no sudden call on them as they had iast year in the shape of a large contribution of Ks. 35,000 to aid the plague expenses incurred by the Karáchi Municipalty and also to the fact that in accordance with Government orders all non-emergent works were postponed on account of the famine. The balance will probably be fully atilized in the current year.

## Statement No. IV.

This statement shows in detail the works undertaken for the improvement of village sanitation.

Eleven new wells were sunk during the year, and one drain was constructed at a total cost of Rs. 3,800-14-1 against 15 wells in the preceding year at a cost of Rs. 5,778-4.0. Also one tank was dug in the Kákar Táluka during the year of report at a cost of Rs. 200.

Rs. 4,625-14-4 were spent on improving 110 wells, one khuhado and 8 tanks with steps, against Rs, 5,401-0-3 on 121 wells and 8 tanks in the preceding year. Ks. 1,369-1-4 were spent on the entertainment of watchmen for watching the sources of water-supply against Rs. 1,390 in the last year.

Local Funds contributed Rs. 688 to Sanitary Committees in the District for the maintenance of their conservancy establishments and for village sanitation in general, against Rs. 1,902 in the preceding year, the share of the Kákar Táluka Committee remaining undrawn. The decrease is due to the decrease in popular contributions.

I have the honour to submit my report on the administration of Local Boards in this District for the year 1899-1900, together with the statements Nos. I to IV, and to offer the following remarks on the same.

## Statement I.

2. With the exception of the Mirpurkhás Board transferred from the Hyderabad Collectorate with effect from 1st August 1894, the District and Täluka Boards were constituted under Government Resolution No. 1293, dated 12th February 1885, as modified by Government Resolution No. 4389, dated 29th June 1891.
3. The total population and area within the limits of the district shown in columns 4 and 5 , is the same as shown last year, the area and population of the Municipal towns of Umarkot and Mithi having been omitted from these columns.
4. The total number of nembers constituting the several Boards has been the same as last year, viz. 68, of which 60 are nominated and 8 are elected. The extension of the elective franchise to this district (exclusive of the Mirpurkhás Táluka transferred from the Hyderabad District during the year 1894), was not considered expedient, owing to the comparatively backward conditiou of the people. Out of the 8 elected members, 6 were returned on the Mirpur Board in which taluka the elective system is in force, the remaining two members are representatives of the Municipalities of Umarkot and Mithi.
5. The number of meetings held during the year was 57 , showing an increase of 1 as compared with the last year. The following details will show the increase and decrease in the number of meetings held by each Board as compared with 1898-99:-


A sufficient number of meetings has been held in consideration of the work to be done. The funds at the disposal of some of the Táluka Boards were, however, so insignifioant that it was not necessary to hold more meetings.

The provisions of Sections 34 of the Act were also availed of on 28 occasions for the circulation of propositions amongst the members of the District Board. The business of the Board is practically carried on by the official members. The non-officials as yet take but little interest in their duties and content themselves with attending. the meetings and agreeing to the proposals brought forward by the official members, who have worked satisfactorily.
6. The inadequate attendance of members at the meetings is due to the fact that some of them live in villages situated at a considerable distance from the head-quarter station.

## Statement II.

7. The year opened with a balance of Rs. 40,111-15-11. The income of the several Boards during the year under report amounted to Rs. 67,935-5-3. The total amount at the disposal of the Boards was thus Rs: 1,08,047-5-2. The items of income and the reisons for increases and decreases as compared with the last year are given below.

> VI.-Provincial Rates-Local Rates.
8. Receipts under this head amounted to Rs. 48,659-1.0 against Rs. 49,246-12-0 in the previons year, showing a decrease of Rs. 587-11-0, whioh is due to the failure of crops in the Desert Tadukas.
XII.—Interest.
9. The sum of Rs. 715-11-2 is on account of the interest on the closing balances of certain minor Municipalities which have been abolished. These balances were invested in Government paper, and the interest is annually credited to Local Funds, in consideration of which the Local Boards have undertaken to maintain certain institutions in the villages concerned.

The sum of Rs. 13v-4-0 against Dispensaries under the same head is on account of the interest on Rs. 4,000 invested in Government paper on account of the following Dispensaries :-


The increase of Rs. 26-2-5 under this head as compared with the last year's figures is owing to the investment of Rs 1,000 more in Government paper at $3 \frac{1}{2}$ per cent. of the Cháchro Dispensary Fund.
10. XVII—Police.-Receipts under Cattle Trespass Act.-The rêceipts under this head amounted to Rs. 4,516-11-6 as against Rs. 4,373-3-10 in the previous year, showing an increase of Rs. 143-7-8 which is due to the trespass by cattle brought by the people of the desert in the Nara Valley owing to failure of crops in the desert.
11. XIX-Education:-The sum of Rs! 60-6-0 represents fees levied in Khan and Mirpur schools in Taluka Mirpurkhás. In other tálukas of this distriet no regular school fees are levied, as the district is generally in a backward condition as compared to other parts of Sind.

As compared with the last year's figures there is an increase of Rs. 1000-6 under this head which is owing to the inoreased attendance at the above mentioned schools.

16. XXI.-Scientific and other Minor Departments.-Botanical and other public garden receipts amounted to Rs. 2,000-14-1 as against Rs. 1,284-11-7, showing an increase of Rs. 716-2-6, which is due to higher bids received for garden produce during the year under report.
17. The sum of Rs. 6-8-0, shown under head "Receipts on account of experimental [cultivation," is on account of the cost of vegetable and lawn grass soeds supplied to the Vice-President, Umarkot Municipality. The sum of Rs. 2-3-5, shown under the head "Miscellaneous," is on account of bull and stallion charges erroneously paid from Local Funds and subsequently refunded, as charges of such a nature are from 1st April 1899 debitable to Imperial Funds under the orders contained in Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 2184 of 26 th March 1898.
18. $X X V$.-Miscellaneous.-The sum of Rs. 2-10-0 is on account of saleproceeds of old materials. The amount shown under "Serái Fees," viz., Rs. 233, represents rents paid by Government servants for occupying quarters built by Local Boards and also rent realized from the market at Nagar Párkar. As there is no special column provided for the above items in Statement No. II, they have been shown under this head as directed by Government Resolution No. 3847, dated 5th June 1891.

As compared with the last year's figures, there is a decrease of Rs. 5,082-4-6, which is due to the Government grant for the Primary Schools in this district having been decreased from Rs, $7,345-3-8$ to Rs. $6,345-3-8$; owing to the closure of the Englishs school at Miranjo Tando in Táluka Mirpur Khás, and also to the fact that the Special Salt Inspector in May 1899 brought to the notice of the Collector of Salt Revenue that the minoral locally known as Kharo or Chaniho (the farm of the right of excavating which is leased out annually) dug
and collected by the farmer in the Khipro and Sánghar Tálukas, was greatly impregnated with salt, and was consequently fit for human use as salt. The Collector thereupon, apprehending danger to Government revenue, addressed my predecessor, Mr. J. L. Rieu, on the sulject, who issued orders preventing the contractor from remoring the mineral, pending inquiries into the question, which have now resulted in its being shown beyond all doubt that it cannot be used as salt. The matter has been reported by you to Government (vide your No. C-319 of 2nd May 1900). The farm for the next year will, it is hoped, be let out as usual.
22. The incidence of taxation and that of income per head of population is shown against each Board. The incidence of taxation on the whole district population is $\mathrm{Re} .0-2-4$ per head and that of income (excluding opening balance) is Re. 0-3-3 per head. This shows a decrease of 4 pies on the latter as compared with that of the previous year. The decrease is due to the deorease in total amount of income.

## Statement III.

23. 34. As in previous years the district was fortunately free from plague, Owing to the re-appearance of plague at Karichi, precautions were, however, taken at Mirpur Khids, where all passengers were carefully examined before they could enter the district.

The total expenditure incurred by the Board during the year under report in connection with plague charges amounted to Rs. 1,654-4-0 as per details given below, the main item of expenditure being the contribution of Rs. 986 paid by the Board towards the maintenance of the Malir Camp which is felt in the Thar and Parkar Distriet to be an inestimable boon. It is in great measure due to it that the district has continued to enjoy immunity from plague.


## 26.-Scientific and other Minor Departments.

35. The sum of Rs. 89-8.0 shown under experimental cultivation is on account of the cost of English vegetable seeds obtained for experimental purposes.

## Veterinary charges.

36. The sum of Rs. $373-0.0$ shown against the District Board, General, is on account of the pay and contingencies of a student, by name Wahidbuksh walad Faiz Mahomed, who has joined the Veterinary College on the condition that on finishing his course at the College he will serve this district for a period of not less than 3 years on a salary of Rs. 50 plus travelling allowance admissible under the rules when proceeding from one Taluka Head-quarter station to another. As compared with the last year's figures there is a decrease of Rs. 168-4-2, which is chiefly due to the purchase of books and instruments for the student's second year's course of study during the year 1898-99.
37. The sum of Rs. $2-3-5$ shown under "Bull and Stallion charges" is on account of the feeding charges of the donkey stallion. As this amount was debitable to Imperial Funds it was subsequently refunded to Local Funds during the year under report.
38. The sum of Rs. 2,230-7-7 shown against BotanicaI and other Public gardens is made up as follows:-


As compared with the last year's figures, there is an increase of Rs. 258-8-11, which is chiefly due to the grant on account of grain compensation paid to Local Fund servants drawing salary less than Rs. 16, and also on account of miscellaneous contingencies.

> 30.-Stationery and Printing.
39. The sum of Rs. 47-8-0 represents the cost of forms. The decrease of Rs. 43-3-10 under this head is due to a smaller number of forms having been purchased during the year under report than the previous year.
32.-Miscellaneous.
40. The sum of Rs. 2 shown under the head " Rewards for the destruction of dogs" is on account of killing stray dogs.
41. The sum of Rs. 1,313-11-5 represents the pay of the watchmen employed at dharmshálas.

As compared with the last year's figures, there is an increase of Rs. 310-12-2, which is due to the grant of grain compensation to Local Fund servants and also to the appointment of new watchmen for the dharmshálas in tálukas Umarkot, Diplo and Sanghar, and to the increment in the pay of the dharmshala servant at Shadipalli.
42. The sum of Rs. 275-8-0 under "Other petty establishment" represents the expenditure for the maintenance of two boats at the 18th and 24th miles of the Mithrao Canal and at Gher Sihojee on Nára Dhora. As compared with the last year's figures, there is an increase of Rs. 102-2-10 under this head, which is chiefly due to, the appointment of two boatmen at Rs. 8 each per mensem at Gher Sihojee, táluka Khipra, from the lst October 1898, in order to cross Marwari immigrants free of charge in consequence of the prevalence of famine, and also to the grant of grain compensation to boatmen.
43. The sum of Rs. 1,350 shown under "Miscellaneous Refunds" was at first credited to the Thar and Parkar Local Funds on the 20th March 1899 by the contractor of the mineral alkali on account of the third instalment of the farm, but the amount was subsequently refunded to him-vide your letter No. 3642, dated 22nd June 1899.

As compared with the last year's figures, there is an increase of Rs. 1,164-7-7 under this head, which is chiefly due to the construction of the Dispensary building at Khipro.
45. As desired in your No. 1733, dated the 6th August 1895, I here mention the progress made in material improvements in this district during the year under report.

The coustruction of the Dispensary building at Khipro was undertaken as per standard plan and estimate sanctioned by the Government of Bombay.

The cost of the building amounts to Rs. 8,022-4-9, of which Rs. 13-5-5 were spent in 1898-99 and Rs. 8,008-15-4 during the year under report. The work was completed during the month of March 1900 and the new Dispensary building was occupied by the Hospital Assistant on the 1st April 1900. Out of the above amount of Rs. 8,022-4-9, the sum of Rs. 2,000 was paid as a contribution towards the construction of the building by Haji Khudabuksh Khan Mari, one of the most influential Zamindars of the Nára Valley, on the condition that this Dispensary be named after him, and the balance, Rs. 6,022-4-9, was paid from the District Board General. Four bridges were constructed on the road from Shadipalli to Pir Pithoro at an aggregate cost of Rus. 1,273-11-0, and the sum of Rs. 2,299-9-3 was spent in improving the same road in order to facilitate traffic between Shadipalli and Umarkot. .

Two new schools at Adhigam and Kasbo and a school-room at Virawah and Nagar in Nagar T'áluka and one school-room at Chore in Umarkot Tíluka were constructed, and additions and alterations to the school-house at Islamkot in Mithi táluka were made, and a compound wall, privy and additional room for the sohool-house at Shadipalli in tiluka Khipro was constructed at an aggregate cost of Rs. 1,822-0-9.

A verandah to the Dispensary building at Mirpur Khás was constructed at a cost of Rs. 161.

In order to improve village water-supply a sum of Rs. 507 was spent in constructing two wells in táluka Khipro.

A sum of Rs. 1,248-13-10 has been spent in repairing the road along the banks of the Mithrao and Thar Canals to facilitate communication with the railway.

47. The closing balance on the 31st March 1900 at the disposal of the Boards, including the sum of Rs. 1,500 on account of the permanent advance placed at the disposal of the Mukhtyarkars, was Rs, 40,157-3-4. The minimum balance required to be maintained by. the District and Táluka Local Boards is Rs. 8,000 ouly. The heavy balance is due to non-execution of several works provided for in the budget for 1890-1900, in accordance with the instructions contained in Government Resolution No. 4086, dated the 20 th August 1899. These works have again been provided in the current year's budget.

## Arrangements for the execution and supervision of the works carried out by Local Boards.

48. Under Section 61 of the Bombay 'Local Boards Act I of 1884, the works costing over Rs. 2,500 are carried out by the Executive Engineer, Public Works Department, and those below that amount are carried out under the supervision. of the Mukhtyárkars of the tálukas, who give works to petty contractors. Where, however, professional agency is necessary, as for instance in construction of wells, bridges, new buildings, \&c., up to Rs. 2,500, the Local -Fund Overseer, who is employed in this distriot, prepares plans and estimates, and also supervises and measures up the works. The Deputy Collector, Nara Valley and of the Desert Talukas, exercises supervision, and the Deputy Commissioner general control.

## Statbient IV.

49. In the jear under report two wells were sunk and eleven wells repaired.
50. A statement of the mileage of old and new avenues, as required in your No. 1223 of the 10th April last, will be forwarded shortly.

## General remaris.

51. I consider the administration of the Local Funds of this district to be perfectly satisfactory. The want of a really competent Local Fund Overseer has for long been felt, but it is difficult to get a highly trained man on the salary which the Board can afford to give, and frequent changes have somewhat gone against the efficient carrying out of some of the Local Fund works. However, I am glad to say that a trained man has been procured since the close of the year.

The Local Fund Establishment have, as usual, worked very well, and special praise is due to Mr. Ghanshamdas, ${ }^{5}$ the Local Fund Accountant, whose experience, industry and integrity have been as conspicuous as ever.

ing of the Local Boards in the Upper Sind Frontier District for the year 1899-1900, together with the statistical tables I to IV in the forms prescribed by the Government of India.

## Statement No. I.

2. This statement shows the strength of each Local Board, the number of meetings held and the average attendance at each.

The Local Boards of this district are constituted in accovdance with Government Resolution No. 9547, dated the 3rd December 1884.
3. The total population and the area of the district remained unchanged in the year under report.
4. The number of meetings held during the jear was sufficient.
5. The District Local Board held two half-yearly meetings. On 22 occasions the provisions of Section $3 t$ of the Local Boards Act were availed of.
6. The business of the Board is, as usual, carried on by the official members ; the others do little more than attend and acquiesce in proposals placed before them. They occasionally make suggestions, but, with one or two exceptions, they do no supervision work, and are apathetic to a dogree. They have been addressed on this subject, and, with a considerable change in the constitution of the Board, it is hoped that some improvement will be shown in next year's report. A new triennial term of office of all the District and Táluka Boards, sanctioned under your notification No. G-155, dated 17th April 1900, published at page 22, Part I-A of the Sind Official Gazette dated 19th April 1900, has been commenced from 10th April 1900, the old term of the Boards having expired on the 31st March 1900, and certain useful members liave been appointed instead of illiterate ones. The result of the change will be noted in next year's report.

33. The sum of Ris. 1,329-9-10 shown under the sub-head "Establishment and Contingencies" appertaining to Public Works subordinate to " 45 Civil Works" in charge of Civil Officers represents the pay, travelling allowance and contingencies of the Overseer's estahlishment.'

The Orerseer prepares plans and estimates and inspects works and thereby causes a distinct saying to the Board of 12 per cent.

## Public Works Charges.

The works under each Board in my District are inspected by Works Committees appointed for each Táluka Local Board in terms of Rule 2 of the Local Board Rules consisting of not less than 5 members.

The several works in progress in each taluka are inspected by them at the request of the Presidents and Vice-Presidents. In consequence however of the members being very illiterate, the measurement of works and assistance of every
description such as is obtainable in the more advanced districts of the Province is unobtainable here.
34. The total expenditure on Civil Works amounted to Rs. 29,453-15-9 against Rs. 39,110-0-9 last year, showing a decrease of Rs. 9,656-1-0.

In view of the prevailing famine and plague several works, which were provided in the Budget estimate of the year under report, were held in abeyance in order to reserve as large a balance in the treasury as possible as decided by Government in their Resolution No. 4446, dated 28 th November $1 \leqslant 96$.
35. The entire expenditure of the year under report was Rs. 67,969-4-2 against Rs. 84,332-0-2 last year, leaving a balance of Rs. 85,077-12-0 at the close of the year.

36. This statement shows the number and cost of new wells and other sources of water-supply repaired by each Board and requires no comment.
37. The Village Sanitation Act is not in force in any of the villages in this district though in certain selected villages sanitary books are kept.

Whilst works of petty construction such as landbis for travellers, repairs to roads, musafirkhánas, travellers' bungalows, bridges, schools, \&c., are executed through the local contractors or through establishment entertained by the Boards and superintended by the Vice-Presidents and mombers of the Boards.

Plans and estimates for all original works which require engineering skill are prepared by the Board's Overseer, and those estimated to cost over Rs. 500 each are sent to the Government Executive Engineer for review under the rules, for which a percentage of rupee one is paid to the Public Works Department.
