Read the reports from the Commissioner in Sind and the Commissioners of Divisions on the working of the municipalities and notified areas in the Bombay Presidency for the year 1920-21.

RESOLUTION.—*Number and area.*—The total number of Municipalities in the Presidency including Sind stands unchanged at 157 and that of notified areas in the Presidency proper at 34.

Owing to the creation of the new "Bombay Suburban Division" and "Bombay Suburban District" from part of the old Salsette Taluka of the Thana District, the three Municipalities of Bandra, Kurla and Ghatkopar-Kirol were, with effect from the 1st December 1920, transferred to the newly formed Division and Collectorate. The notified areas of Santa Cruz, Vile Parle, Andheri, Malad and Borivli, which are tax-levying, and those of Goregaon, Kandivli, Vikroli, Bhandup and Mulund, which are non-tax-levying, were similarly transferred. The constitution of a new Municipality at Juhu in the new District was sanctioned during the year. Proposals for turning Kandivli notified area into a tax-levying area were received by Government during the year and have since been sanctioned.

2. *Changes in the population and boundaries.*—The decennial census taken in March 1921 shows an increase in the population of municipal districts of about 81,000 in the Northern Division, 22,000 in the Bombay Suburban Division, 83,000 in the Central Division, 51,000 in the Southern Division and 54,000 in Sind, or 2,91,000 in the whole. The percentage of increase in the case of the three Municipalities in the Bombay Suburban Division, viz., Bandra, Kurla and Ghatkopar, was 22·34, 71·41 and 100·13. In the Central Division an abnormal increase in the population of the Sinnar Municipality from 3,100 to 7,200 is due to the census of 1911 having been taken during a plague epidemic. The same reason accounts for the increase in Satara City (from 16,000 to 20,000) and Wai (from 5,300 to 10,200). The increase in the population of Poona City (from 1,20,000 to 1,33,000, and Poona Suburban Municipalities (from 10,000 to 14,500) is mainly due to the extension of the municipal limits during the last decade, while the increase in Saswad and Baramati (from 2,200 and 7,800 to 4,600 and 8,700 respectively) is due to increased prosperity from irrigation. The increase in some of the municipal districts of East Khandesh, notably Bargaon (from 17,800 to 23,300) and Bhusaval (from 18,300 to 25,600) and in those of Sholapur (from 89,500 to 1,14,000) and Barsi (from 16,700 to 20,500) in the Sholapur District reflects the industrial importance which these cities are assuming. In the Southern Division more than one-third of the increase (51,000) is contributed by the three city municipalities in the Dharwar District. The boundaries of the two Poona Municipalities and of Shikarpur Municipality in Sind were extended during the year.

3. *Elections.*—Triennial elections for the term commencing from 1st April 1920 were held in Prantij, Dhandhuka, Sanand, Broach, Jambusar, Rander, Bulsar, Thana and Bassein in the Northern Division. Bye-elections were held to fill seven vacancies which occurred in Umreth from resignations induced by popular pressure. The difficulties began with private dissensions and were fomented by political agitators. In the Bombay Suburban Division triennial elections were held at Bandra and in the Central Division in the Municipalities of Bhusaval, Dhulia, Jejuri, Sirur, Talegaon-Dabhade, Junnar,

Alandi, Indapur, Saswad, Pandharpur, Karmala and Sangola. Satisfactory public interest was shown in most of these elections. At Pandharpur, Karmala and Sangola more than 50 per cent. of the electors recorded their votes. The terms of office of Baramati, Eraudol and Sangamner in the Central Division and of nine Municipalities in the Southern Division which expired during the year were extended by one year to enable the Boards to take advantage of an extended franchise. In the Southern Division triennial elections were held only at Panwel and Chiplun. 50 per cent. of the voters recorded their votes at Chiplun. In Sind the triennial terms of the Hala, Matiari, Tando Allahyar and Tando Mahomed Khan Municipalities in the Hyderabad District were extended by six months with a view to enabling them to complete the preliminaries necessary to the introduction of an elective franchise. The Municipalities, however, failed to observe the necessary preliminaries, and it became necessary, in order to comply with the law, to reconstitute them under section 14 of the Bombay District Municipal Act, the first three for five months and the last for three months.

4. *Constitution of Municipalities.*—The chief event of the year was the issue by Government of orders already referred to (Government Resolution no. 9693, dated the 24th September 1920) directing that steps should be taken (1) to enfranchise a considerably larger portion of the population of each Municipal District by reducing the qualifying tax; (2) to increase the number of councillors; (3) to fix the maximum proportion of nominated councillors at one-fifth of the total number of councillors; and (4) to adopt the system of multiple-seated constituencies with the cumulative right of voting. In pursuance of these orders the reconstitution of the Municipalities in the Presidency proper specified below* was sanctioned during the year under review with effect from the dates of the expiry of their terms of office. In Sind the Municipalities of Keti Bandar, Kotri, Tando Mahomed Khan, Tando Allahyar, Hala, Garhi Yasin and Kambar have been reconstituted since the close of the year under review. In view of the special position of the Karachi Municipality it has, with effect from 1st May 1921, been reconstituted on a more liberal basis by fixing the proportion of elected councillors at eight-ninths instead of four-fifths.

Certain Municipalities already possessed the right of electing their own President by a two-thirds majority vote and even where so large a majority was not obtained, Government in practice usually appointed the candidate who succeeded in obtaining the most votes. In their Resolution referred to above Government have granted all Municipalities the right of electing their President by a simple majority vote.

5. *Attendance at municipal meetings.*—The total number of meetings held showed a fairly substantial decline in all Divisions except the Central Division and Sind where slightly more meetings were held than last year. The attendance was satisfactory. But most Municipalities would do well to speed up the disposal of business and thus improve the attendance of councillors.

6. *Taxation.—House-tax.*—House-tax was levied for the first time by the Municipality of Jejuri and reintroduced by Manjhand. In Dholka a consolidated tax on letting values was brought into force from the 1st January 1921 but collection had to be postponed owing to an injunction granted in a suit brought by the towns-people against the Municipality. The Ankleshwar Municipality's proposal to double their house-tax was sanctioned by the Commissioner in the previous year but the Municipality, first on the plea of unpopularity and later on on the plea of illegality, postponed collection. The Commissioner has finally instructed the Municipality to collect the increased tax from 1st April 1921. Jambusar Municipality raised its house-tax by 50 per cent. Bhiwandi Municipality cancelled their sliding scale of assessment and adopted a uniform rate at 15 pies in the rupee on the annual letting value. Kurla introduced a tax at 4 per cent. on the rental value of land used for

keeping animals for trade purposes. Ghatkopar has proposed the abolition of their present house-tax and conservancy cess and the introduction instead of a general consolidated tax at 10 per cent. of the letting value of houses and buildings. Panchgani also combined their house and conservancy taxes and revised the rates. A 4 per cent. additional house-tax levied by Karachi Municipality for one year from 1st April 1920 was discontinued from 1st April 1921, the rate of house-tax now levied being 7 per cent.

Octroi.—Sinnar introduced octroi. Alibag, Bhatkal, Gogho, Taloda, Sangamner, Pandharpur and Sirsi revised their octroi schedules. Jambusar and Sirur raised their octroi rates by 50 per cent. Kalyan changed the system of levying octroi on cloth from an *ad valorem* rate to a rate based on weight. Government note with satisfaction that an arrangement has been reached between the Municipality and Cantonment of Belgaum by which the former is to pay a fixed contribution to the Cantonment for a period of ten years as the Cantonment share in octroi receipts. As for Sind, a general revision of the octroi schedules of the mofussil municipalities in the Karachi District was made by increasing the rates on important commodities and exempting unimportant articles. Hyderabad, Tando Allahyar and Rohri Municipalities also revised their octroi schedules. The joint octroi system of the Cantonment and Municipality of Hyderabad, which was in force for the last ten years, came to an end on 21st March 1921 and a Committee consisting of representatives of both bodies under the chairmanship of the Collector was appointed to consider the terms of a fresh contract.

Water Rate.—Sirur Municipality imposed a general water rate. Kurla reduced its water rate from 4 annas to 2 annas per 1,000 gallons in the case of religious and charitable purposes. Satara City Municipality imposed a revised rate of annas 3 per 1,000 gallons for water supplied to the Camp. Bijapur, Hubli, Pen and Hyderabad (Sind) revised their water rates for private connections.

Sanitary Cess.—A sanitary cess was imposed by the Municipalities of Anand, Kharda and Jejuri. Ahmedabad, Modasa, Bassein, Dhulia, Shirpur, Alibag and Wai revised their rates of special and general sanitary cesses. Amalner revised its special sanitary cess on factories. Sinnar introduced a privy tax. In Kurla a 4 per cent. conservancy cess was introduced on the rental value of mills and factories. Sangola also introduced a conservancy cess. Barsi revised its conservancy tax schedule. In Sind, a cesspool tax was introduced in Kotri and Hala, and halalkhor cess in Rohri.

Conveyance Taxes and Tolls.—In Ahmedabad the conveyance tax schedule was brought into force from the 1st April 1921. The Municipalities of Bhusaval, Poona City and Uran imposed a wheel tax on motors. Taloda, Barsi, Bijapur and Trimbak revised their wheel tax. Malwan, Sinnar and Pandharpur introduced both toll and wheel taxes. A toll tax was also imposed by Jejuri and the rates of tax revised by Bhatkal. In Sind a wheel tax was introduced in Tatta and the rates revised in Hyderabad, Shikarpur, Sukkur and Rohri.

Pilgrim and miscellaneous taxes.—Nasik Municipality raised their pilgrim tax for the Sinhasth period from 4 to 6 annas and Trimbak from 2 to 4 annas per head. Jejuri levied a pilgrim tax for eight months in the year. Taxes were imposed on theatres, circuses and cinemas by Poona City Municipality. A cotton manufacturing tax was introduced by Chopda Municipality. Baramati imposed a trade registration fee. A lighting tax at 1 per cent. on the annual letting value of buildings was levied by the Poona Suburban Municipality. Mhasvad levied fees on animals brought for sale at the fairs. Barsi Municipality revised its slaughter house fees and Pandharpur its weekly cattle bazar fees. Byadgi raised its tax on tobacco shops from Rs. 15 to Rs. 40 per annum. Bhatkal increased its fish market fees. Stall fees, slaughter house fees and fees for the temporary occupation of land were revised by the Shikarpur and Sukkur Municipalities.

7. *Municipal Income.*—As a result mainly of these enhancements of taxation, a considerable increase from Rs. 162 lakhs to Rs. 230 lakhs was recorded in the aggregate gross income of the Municipalities. Deducting receipts under

“Extraordinary and Debt” the net income amounted to Rs. 180 lakhs as against Rs. 149 lakhs. The following table shows the fluctuations under the principal heads of income :—

8. *Octroi and Terminal Tax.*—Of the very substantial increase of Rs. 5,27,000 under this head nearly one-half was contributed by the Northern Division (2,59,000) and one-fourth by Sind (1,36,000), the remaining one-fourth (1,32,000) being made up by the other three Divisions. The revenue from the terminal tax in Ahmedabad showed an increase of about Rs. 2,40,000 due to the revision of the schedule. Octroi receipts increased at Jambusar, Thana, Kalyan, Bassein and Bhiwandi owing to better trade but fell off at Surat mainly owing to the absence of a marriage season among Hindus during the Sinhasth year, unfavourable exchange rates and frequent stoppages of railway booking. Bandra showed a noticeable increase of Rs. 34,000 in Terminal Tax receipts. In the Southern Division nearly three-fourths of the increase of Rs. 56,000 was contributed by the Municipalities of Athni (Rs. 9,000), Bijapur (Rs. 9,000), Hubli (Rs. 17,000) and Gadag-Bettigeri (Rs. 6,000). The increases were due in Athni to the revision of the rates of octroi, in Bijapur and Hubli to larger imports and in Gadag Bettigeri to better supervision. An increase of Rs. 61,000 in Karachi was due to larger imports owing to the relaxation of the restrictions on exports and of Rs. 71,000 in Hyderabad to a revision of the octroi schedule and the rise in the price of cloth.

9. *Taxes on houses and lands.*—Of the increase of Rs. 5,92,000, nearly 5 lakhs were contributed by Sind alone, the Central Division contributing only Rs. 63,000 and the Northern and Southern Divisions, Rs. 27,000 and Rs. 14,000 respectively. The Bombay Suburban Division showed a decrease of Rs. 10,000. The increase in Karachi was due to the levy of the additional 4 per cent. house-tax. The increase of Rs. 12,500 in the income of the Municipalities in Sukkur District is mainly due to the recovery of arrears. The decrease in the Bombay Suburban Division occurred in the Bandra undeveloped land tax which was the subject of a civil suit brought by the rate-payers.

10. *Water-rate.*—The increases under this head were Rs. 56,000, Rs. 5,000, Rs. 15,000 and Rs. 16,000 in the Northern Division, Central Division and Southern Division and in Sind. Ahmedabad was solely responsible for the large increase in the Northern Division, due to the recovery of taxes for the past three years from the millowners, who had been considered exempt owing to a misapprehension. The increase in the Southern Division was mainly contributed by Hubli (Rs. 6,000) and Bijapur (Rs. 5,000). In the former the increase was due to a revision of rates and in the latter partly to the same cause and partly to the recovery of arrears. The increase in Sind was mostly contributed by Hyderabad (Rs. 12,000), due partly to increased demand for connections and partly to the recovery of arrears.

11. *Recovery of municipal dues.*—Out of an outstanding balance on 1st April 1920 of Rs. 58,928 and a demand for the year of Rs. 7,58,168, Ahmedabad Municipality recovered Rs. 6,98,876 and wrote off as irrecoverable Rs. 38,932. The arrears of taxes at the end of the year amounted to Rs. 78,951, out of which Rs. 23,700 have been recovered since the close of the year. In Kaira

District, Anand, as in the preceding year, had no arrears. Recoveries in Borsad and Umreth were not satisfactory, arrears amounting to Rs. 3,366 and Rs. 3,677, respectively, under house tax being uncollected at the end of the year. Of the two Municipalities in the Panch Mahals, Dohad is to be congratulated on again having a clean sheet; but Godhra, out of a total demand of Rs. 35,616, failed to collect Rs. 4,849 as against Rs. 5,388 last year. In Broach and Surat recoveries of taxes were as unsatisfactory as in the preceding year. Rander has large outstandings under house tax, water tax and conservancy tax. In the Thana District the largest arrears are under house-tax and the Thana Municipality is the greatest offender in this respect in the District. Heavy arrears are also to be found in this Municipality under water rate, while the arrears under general and special sanitary cesses in Thana and Kalyan and under tax on animals and vehicles in Bassein also need prompt attention. The Collector of Thana reports that the collection work was retarded to some extent by census work. In Bombay Suburban Division the arrears in Bandra increased by 73·50 per cent. while those in Ghatkopar doubled. More than half of the arrears in Bandra are under the "land tax." The test cases which were filed by the rate-payers in the Magistrate's Court have now been disposed of in favour of the Municipality. The recovery was postponed pending the decision of these cases, and is now proceeding with the assistance of a special staff. The arrears under house tax include irrecoverable arrears brought over for several years. The Municipality is taking steps to write them off after enquiry. About Rs. 22,000 have been recovered since the close of the year. Ghatkopar finds great difficulty in collecting arrears as tenants and houseowners spend most of the time in Bombay. In the Central Division the heaviest arrears were in Erandol (40 per cent.), Poona City (20 per cent.), Lonavla (27 per cent.), Karad (35 per cent.), and Barsi (25 per cent.), and in the Southern Division in Athni (38 per cent.), Saundatti-Yellamma (40 per cent.), Bail-Hongal (34 per cent.), Bijapur (19 per cent.), Hubli (21 per cent.), Haveri (23 per cent.), Mahad (20 per cent.), Pen (24 per cent.), Uran (57 per cent.) and Malvan (37 per cent.). The reasons given for the heavy arrears are far from satisfactory. For instance, the Commissioner points out that in Bijapur—a large Municipality in serious financial difficulty—the excuse of famine cannot be accepted when there were negligible arrears, or none at all, in the similarly placed Municipalities of Bagalkot, Guledgud and Ilkal. In Hubli, another large Municipality in financial difficulties, for which there is much less excuse than in Bijapur, since the town is prosperous, one of the municipal councillors was himself in arrears and only paid after a special report was called for. The Commissioner points out that "The arrears are principally due to (1) lack of interest on the part of Councillors who are often among the last to pay up; (2) lack of courage on the part of the municipal staff; and (3) failure to use coercive processes, and impose penalties for late payment. The fault really is with the President and Councillors, as it is impossible to expect the staff to be firm in making demands, when the Councillors will not sanction penalties, and are themselves slow in paying."

In Sind, the total outstandings amount to Rs. 2,39,000 as against Rs. 1,07,000 for the preceding year. The arrears against Karachi are in the main due to the non-payment of the bills for February and March before the close of the year. Of the arrears of Rs. 23,482 at Shikarpur, Rs. 5,315 are reported to have been since recovered, still leaving arrears of Rs. 18,167. These large arrears are unsatisfactory.

12. *Revenue derived from municipal property.*—Under this head there was an increase of Rs. 21,84,000, nearly the whole of which was contributed by Sind. Karachi alone showed an increase of Rs. 16,50,000 on account of the sale of building plots, Shikarpur an increase of Rs. 3,47,000 and Sukkur, Hyderabad and Larkana increases of Rs. 63,000, Rs. 24,000 and Rs. 20,000 on the same account. The increase of Rs. 35,000 under this head in the Northern Division was contributed to mainly by Ahmedabad which realized higher rents at auctions of municipal shops and land and obtained better prices for the produce of the sewage farm. The Central, the Southern and the Bombay Suburban Divisions showed increases of Rs. 71,000, Rs. 15,000 and Rs. 6,000, respectively.

13. *Grants and contributions for General and special purposes.*—The receipts under this head, which chiefly consist of grants made by Government to Municipalities for the improvement of water supply and drainage, for the opening of congested areas and for educational purposes, decreased from Rs. 21,35,000 to Rs. 17,75,000. Decreases in the Northern Division and Sind amounted to Rs. 3,43,000 and Rs. 1,73,000 respectively, and increases in the Bombay Suburban, Central and Southern Divisions amounted to Rs. 4,000, Rs. 42,000 and Rs. 1,10,000 respectively. The decrease in the Northern Division is mainly due to the receipt by Ahmedabad of a Government grant of Rs. 4 lakhs for building school houses in the preceding year. Mahudha Municipality received a grant of Rs. 2,000 for water supply and a free grant for the payment of war allowance and increased pay to school teachers. Kapadvanj and Mahudha received grants for medical purposes for the years 1919-20 and 1920-21. Surat received a grant of Rs. 12,076 towards expenditure in connection with the introduction of free and compulsory education. Thana received a grant of Rs. 8,550 for the payment of war and local allowances to school teachers. In the Southern Division the increase is principally due to larger grants from Government towards primary education. Government also contributed Rs. 22,387 for the construction of a new dispensary at Bagalkot. In Sind the decrease under this head is principally due to the Government grants in the previous year to Hyderabad Municipality of Rs. 37,000 for the filling of tank no. 2 and the Domanwah hollows and of Rs. 1,75,000 for the new Water Works Improvement Scheme and to the Sehwan Municipality of Rs. 76,000 for the entire cost of its drainage scheme. On the other hand, the Sukkur Municipality received during the year a grant-in-aid from Government of Rs. 78,000 for its Water Works Improvement Scheme. Grants from Government for educational purposes increased by Rs. 18,000 during the year. Under grants and contributions from other sources the Dhandhuka Municipality received a grant of Rs. 20,000 from Rao Bahadur Shivnarayan Baldevdas Birla for the Birla High School at Dhandhuka. The Thana Municipality received a sum of Rs. 1,000 from the executors of the will of the late Mr. A. V. Kamat as a gift for the Hindu Cremation Ground. The Shikarpur Municipality received contributions from certain philanthropic Sethias for the construction of a hall, a park and a well for female bathing.

14. *Nature of income and incidence per head of population.*—Of the aggregate income of the Municipalities, Rs. 99,35,000 were realized from municipal taxes and rates as compared with Rs. 84,92,000 in the preceding year, direct taxation yielding Rs. 59,10,000 or 59.5 per cent. and indirect taxation yielding Rs. 40,25,000 or 40.5 per cent. of the total. The corresponding percentages in the previous year were 58.8 and 41.2, respectively. The average incidence of taxation per head of population increased from Rs. 3-9-1 to Rs. 3-11-5 and that of income from Rs. 6-4-4 to Rs. 6-11-10, that is to say, the Municipalities raised 2 annas 4 pies per head more than last year and received mainly from Government $7\frac{1}{2}$ annas per head more than last year.

15. *Working of the octroi system.*—In the Northern Division, out of the gross octroi revenue of Rs. 10,49,170 refunds of Rs. 49,350 were granted. The percentage of refunds was, for the year under review, reduced from 7 to 4.5. To this fall in the ratio Broach has chiefly contributed, the percentage of refunds being 13.5 as against 30.3 in the preceding year. The general fall in the ratio of refunds is chiefly due to the replacement of octroi by terminal tax which is not subject to refunds. In the Ahmedabad District, refunds were practically nil, as in the previous year, in the case of octroi-levying Municipalities. None of the three Municipalities in the Bombay Suburban Division, viz., Bandra, Kurla and Ghatkopar, levy octroi. In the Central Division octroi was levied by 34 Municipalities. The gross octroi and terminal tax collections amounted to Rs. 9,38,628 and net receipts to Rs. 8,38,149, the percentage of refunds being 10.6 against 8.4 of last year. In the Southern Division the gross collections amounted to Rs. 4,90,992 and refunds to Rs. 29,828, the percentage of refunds decreasing from 8.6 to 6.1. The percentage was high in Hubli (14.9 per cent.), Karwar (13.8 per cent.), Kumta (13.3 per cent.), Sirsi (26 per cent.) and Honavar (15.2 per cent.). In Dharwar 1,390 refund applications were pending disposal,

involving more than Rs. 8,000 and the delay was due to doubt as to the proper interpretation of the refund rules. Government have since sanctioned the Municipality's proposal to introduce terminal tax in lieu of octroi. The number of applications pending in Hubli was 721, all of which related to the last three months of the year. The substitution of terminal tax for octroi at Hubli was sanctioned during the year but it came into force from the 1st April 1921.

16. *Terminal Taxes.*—In the Presidency proper the terminal tax system has now been introduced into the following Municipalities :—

Bandra farmed out collection of the tax but the High Court having held this to be illegal, departmental working has been instituted. In Dohad proposals for the levy of the tax on exports by rail have been sanctioned and rules and by-laws are under consideration. In Sind, the terminal tax system was in force in Karachi, Sukkur, Garhi Yasin, Larkana, Mirpurkhas, Umarnkot, Jacobabad and Shikarpur. Proposals submitted by the Ghotki, Kambar, Tando Adam and Shahadadpur Municipalities for a terminal tax are under the consideration of the Commissioner in Sind.

17. *Expenditure.*—The total expenditure of the Municipalities during the year under report was 219½ lakhs as against 178¾ lakhs in the preceding year. Excluding the item of "Extraordinary and Debt" the expenditure amounted to Rs. 164 lakhs as against Rs. 147¼ lakhs. The increase in the ordinary expenditure was therefore 16¾ lakhs. The following table indicates the fluctuations under the principal heads of expenditure :—

18. *General Administration.*—The increase of Rs. 1,54,000 under this head was shared by all the Divisions of the Presidency proper. Sind, however, showed a slight decrease of Rs. 1,300.

19. *Public health and convenience.*—There were increases of Rs. 2,73,000, Rs. 58,000, Rs. 4,44,000, Rs. 61,000 and Rs. 6,04,000 under this head in the Northern, Bombay Suburban, Central and Southern Divisions and in Sind respectively.

20. *Water-supply*.—In the Northern Division the expenditure under “capital outlay” increased by Rs. 21,000, but that under “Establishments, repairs, etc.,” decreased by Rs. 48,000. In the Bombay Suburban Division the increase of Rs. 15,126 under the former sub-head was due to the laying out of new mains along Waterfield and Turner Roads. In the Central Division there was an increase of Rs. 1,31,028 under “Capital outlay” and of Rs. 1,05,380 under “Establishments, repairs, etc.” The increase of Rs. 2,37,555 in Ahmednagar was due to heavy expenditure on Pimpalgaon dam and the purchase of two oil engines and the boring of more wells to meet the water scarcity at Ahmednagar, caused by the failure of the monsoon and the stoppage of the Kapurwadi duct. Government advanced Rs. 50,000 to the Ahmednagar Municipality to relieve the scarcity of water. An increase of Rs. 74,000 in Poona City Municipality was for laying mains of larger diameter in Somwar and Kasba Peths and to (1) the treatment of the settling tank water with sulphate of alumina and (2) the expenditure on chlorination of water supply in 1919-20 having been paid in 1920-21. In Sind there was an increased expenditure of Rs. 83,000 by Hyderabad Municipality. Rs. 70,000 were spent on a Water Works Improvement Scheme, Rs. 21,000 on the purchase of a new boiler for the Fort lift and Rs. 4,300 on the laying of a new service main.

21. *Drainage*.—The only Municipality in the Northern Division which possesses a drainage system is Ahmedabad. Its expenditure showed an increase of Rs. 3,000 under “capital outlay” and of Rs. 11,000 under “Establishments, repairs, etc.”. In the Central Division, increases in Poona City Municipality (Rs. 7,000 under “Capital Outlay” and Rs. 22,500 under “Establishment, repairs, etc.”) are due to that body having paid to Government its share of the excess expenditure on drainage and water supply works. In the Southern Division, there was a decrease of Rs. 5,000 under “Capital Outlay”. Bijapur Municipality constructed three works at a cost of Rs. 6,000 and received a sanitary grant of Rs. 10,000 on condition that all works were completed before the end of December 1921. In Sind, under “Capital Outlay” Karachi Municipality showed an increase of Rs. 1,44,000 spent on the purchase of ejectors, air compressors and Lancashire boilers.

22. *Conservancy*.—The total expenditure under this head during the year under report amounted to Rs. 25,63,000 against Rs. 22,05,000 in the previous year. The large increase under this head was due to improved equipment, the payment of increased salaries and war allowances to the conservancy staff and to the high cost of bullocks maintained for the purpose of conservancy. In the Northern Division, the Ahmedabad Municipality alone contributed Rs. 1 lakh towards the Divisional increase of Rs. 1,59,000. In the Central Division the largest increase was in the Poona City Municipality which contributed Rs. 19,000 to the Divisional increase of Rs. 89,000. Next comes the Trimbak Municipality with a share of Rs. 16,000 expended by it on the employment of the additional staff for the prompt discharge of work in connection with the Sinhasth fair. In the Southern Division nearly half of the increase was contributed by Hubli Municipality (Rs. 22,000). In Sind the net increase of Rs. 56,000 was mainly contributed by Karachi and Hyderabad Municipalities (Rs. 18,000 and Rs. 19,000, respectively) which purchased during the year motor watering lorries.

23. *Road Expenditure*.—The expenditure under this head showed a considerable increase of Rs. 5,21,000 of which Rs. 4,37,000 were contributed by Sind alone. Karachi Municipality was responsible for the very considerable increase of Rs. 4,61,000, the money being spent on the acquisition of land, the extension of the Bunder Road and purchase of a new boiler for steam rollers. Section 91-A of the Bombay District Municipal Act, 1901, as amended by Bombay Act VIII of 1914, imposes upon Municipalities the duty of prescribing a regular line for the boundaries of public streets. In the Northern Division no progress was made by any of the Municipalities in this direction in the Ahmedabad District. Although the city survey at Nadiad has been completed, the Municipality has taken no action. In Kapadvanj the road line for the Palaya Bazar road has been prescribed. The Municipalities of Mehmedabad, Borsad and Umreth have postponed work on one pretext or the other. The Broach Municipality aligned

only about 930 ft. of street roads. No attention has been paid by the Municipalities in the Surat District to this subject. The Thana Municipality has postponed chalking out a regular line until the services of an engineer are secured. In Kalyan the demarcation of roads is being taken up, now that the city survey is completed. The Bassein Municipality proposes to mark out street lines when the city survey is introduced. The Bhiwandi Municipality has taken the work in hand in accordance with the proposals received from the Select Committee appointed by it. In the Central Division, the Collector of Ahmednagar reports that action under section 91-A is being taken by all the Municipalities in the District. The Sangamner Municipality has fixed the line of its roads and has asked for the introduction of a city survey. In West Khandesh the work of prescribing regular lines was in progress in the suburbs of Dhulia. In Taloda two surveyors were employed last year for a period of two months and maps were prepared by them. Yeola Municipality in the Nasik District has resolved to fix regular lines of 12 main streets and this has been done in the case of one street already. Out of the total length of 44.85 miles of roads and 20.87 miles of lanes within the limits of Poona City Municipality, regular lines were fixed in respect of 32.62 miles of roads and 13.92 miles of lanes up to the end of 1920-21. The work of the remaining streets is in progress. Poona Suburban Municipality did not take any action in the matter as its roads are in charge of the Public Works Department. The Municipalities of Baramati, Talegaon-Dabhade and Junnar have already fixed regular lines for their public streets. In Satara District, the Satara Suburban, Mahabaleshwar and Wai Municipalities have completed the work of laying out regular lines while in Rahimatpur, Panchgani and Vita Municipalities action is being taken. Sholapur Municipality has fixed regular lines of four new streets during the year. Barsi and Pandharpur expect to finish the work at an early date. In the Southern Division, Nipani and Gokak are reported to have made some progress in this direction while Athni is considering its Sub-Committee's report on the subject; nothing was done by Belgaum, Bail-Hongal and Saundatti-Yellamma. Their attention has been drawn by the Collector to the necessity of taking action in the matter. Bijapur aligned one road and Bagalkot 22. No action was taken by Guledgud, Ilkal or Haliyal for want of funds. None of the Municipalities in the Kolaba District took any action on the ground that there were no properly prepared survey maps of the towns. Chiplun has appointed a surveyor to draw a map for this purpose. Ratnagiri has surveyed its streets but further action has been deferred in consequence of the probability of the introduction of a city survey. Malwan has prescribed a regular line of streets and Vengurla has prepared a map of its streets but has not yet prescribed a regular line. Only two Municipalities in the Dharwar District, *viz.*, Byadgi and Ranebennur, are reported to have taken action. Concerning Sind, the Commissioner reports that the fact that most of the municipal towns are not surveyed prevents compliance with the provisions of section 91-A. In Karachi the resurvey of the city is still in progress. In Kotri the alignment of three more streets has been completed. In Hyderabad the work of prescribing the regular line of streets in quarters other than the congested portion on the plateau is in progress. An accurate map of the city of Shikarpur is under preparation. The city survey operations of Garhi Yasin having been completed, the Municipality proposes to take up the alignment of streets. At Rohri city survey operations were still in progress. The Commissioners should be requested to bring to the notice of such Municipalities as have not yet taken action in this matter the necessity of carrying out the duties imposed upon them under the section as delay in this subject leads to the loss of opportunities of making valuable street improvements.

24. *Appropriation of wheel tax and road tolls.*—In the Northern Division the Ahmedabad Municipality has not only spent the whole of the revenue from the wheel tax and the surplus for the preceding year upon its roads but has contributed a large sum of Rs. 45,000 from general revenues to the same purpose. Dholka, Viramgam, Modasa, Dhandhuka, Gogha, Ankleshwar, Jambusar, Surat, Rander, Bulsar, Thana, Kalyan and Bhiwandi among the Northern Division Municipalities are all offenders against the rule that the whole of the proceeds of wheel tax and road tolls must be spent on the maintenance of

roads. Thana Municipality has spent even less than 50 per cent. of its income from this source upon roads but explains this as due to difficulties in obtaining road metal. Bhiwandi Municipality pleads financial difficulties but this is an excuse which cannot be accepted. It is satisfactory to note that the Municipalities of Kapadvanj, Nadiad, Godhra, Dohad, Broach and Bassein have spent much more than their incomes from these sources upon their roads. The Municipalities of Prantij, Sanand, Dholera, Umreth, Anand, Borsad, Dakor, Mahudha and Kaira, although deriving no income from these sources, have looked after the condition of the roads and incurred expenditure on repairs to them. In the previous year Bandra Municipality was unable to spend the whole of their receipts from these taxes on account of their roller being out of order but the deficiency has been made good during the year under report. In the Central and Southern Divisions, the Collectors generally state that the municipal boards in their districts are making real efforts to keep their roads in good repairs and that the orders of Government with regard to forming a special fund from the balance from the proceeds of wheel-tax and road tolls are being followed. But in Satara District, with the exception of Satara City, Panchgani and Mahableshwar, the expenditure on roads has been much less than the receipts for wheel-tax and road tolls. In the Southern Division, the principal offenders are Bail-Hongal, Bagalkot, Ratnagiri, Hubli and Mahad. The Hubli Municipality for instance realized Rs. 24,000 from wheel tax and tolls but spent only Rs. 13,000 on roads and used the balance for general purposes. Mahad made a similar default though it has opened a separate account to show the unspent amounts. The Collectors in the Southern Division have been asked by the Commissioner to inform Hubli and other Municipalities which do not spend the receipts on roads that if the proceeds are utilized on objects other than roads the levy of the taxes will not be permitted. In Sind, the Municipalities of Tatta, Kotri, Shikarpur, Garhi Yasin and Rohri failed to carry out the policy enjoined by Government:

25. *Public Instruction.*—The total expenditure under this head amounted to Rs. 30,34,000 against Rs. 26,69,000 in the preceding year. There were increases of Rs. 1,27,000, Rs. 26,000, Rs. 68,000, Rs. 50,000 and Rs. 94,000 in the Northern, Bombay Suburban, Central and Southern Divisions and in Sind, respectively. The increased expenditure was mainly attributable to the revision of the pay of primary school teachers and the grant of war allowances to them. The Ankleshwar Municipality spent on primary education Rs. 13,000 which was more than 43 per cent. of the total income. In Surat Municipality the increase is due to the introduction of the compulsory education. The decrease in the Sholapur District was mainly due to the abolition of the Commercial School by the Sholapur Municipality. In the Southern Division free primary education has been introduced in the Municipalities of Athni, Saundatti, Dharwar, Byadgi, Haliyal, Honavar, Matheran, and Panwel. Chiplun, however, discontinued free education from the 1st August 1921 in view of its financial condition and of the fact that the attendance had not increased. It is reported that only three of the nine Municipalities made any effort to increase their staff and only two attempted to increase the accommodation. On the experience of these Municipalities the Commissioner remarks as follows :—

“Unless both staff and sitting space are increased there can be no real advantage in an increase in the number of pupils, and there can be no real increase in the number of low or depressed class boys, for whom free education is particularly required. The introduction of free education has thus simply meant that the Municipalities lose the fees, while the present class of boys, most of whose parents can well afford to pay the low scale of fees previously charged, get the benefit without any appreciable increase in numbers.”

In Sind, Karachi opened three new schools and entertained additional staff. In Sukkur increased expenditure was due to extensive additions and alterations to school buildings, maintenance of a private school taken over from the Education Society, Sukkur, and payment of compensation for the furniture taken over from the Society. Tando Adam placed with the Executive Engineer a sum of Rs. 17,586 for additions and alterations to the vernacular school.

26. *Closing Balances.*—The year's working resulted in an increase of Rs. 10,96,000 in the total closing balance. The increases in the Central and Southern Divisions and in Sind amounted to Rs. 2,07,000, Rs. 4,000 and Rs. 14,21,000, respectively. There were decreases of Rs. 5,31,000 in the Northern Division and Rs. 5,000 in the Bombay Suburban Division. The aggregate closing balance of the Municipalities amounted to Rs. 74,35,000 as against Rs. 63,39,000 in the preceding year.

27. *Audit of accounts.*—The Accountant General's Local Audit Department audited the accounts of all the Municipalities in the Presidency including Sind during the year, with the exception of Satara City, Karad, Barsi, Karmala, Sangola, Larkana, and Keti Bandar. In the Northern Division the audit of the accounts of the Ahmedabad Municipality was hitherto carried out by their Chief Accountant and Auditor but during the year under report the Municipality created a separate appointment of "Auditor". Thus the combined treasury and audit work was placed under an independent officer. Under the new arrangement, which is expected to effect a great improvement in the accounts system, all the bills including establishment bills are subjected to pre-audit by the auditor and all receipts are checked by him monthly. Except in Modassa, where a short credit of twelve tins in the kerosene oil accounts was detected by the Examiner, no serious irregularities were noticed. In the Central Division the accounts of Karad and Chopda Municipalities are reported to have been maintained in an extremely unsatisfactory manner, no attention having been paid by them to the remarks and advice of the Audit Department and no reply given to the audit notes. The Collector has invited the special attention of the President of the latter Municipality to this undesirable state of things, and has referred the President to his powers and duties as set forth in section 24 (1) (c) of the Bombay District Municipal Act. Some mismanagement and fraud were suspected in Sindkheda and the Collector of West Khandesh, therefore, carried out a special audit of the accounts and discovered that Rs. 500 had been embezzled. The Municipality sanctioned the prosecution of the Secretary and the case against him was pending in the Sessions Court at the close of the year. At the time of the last audit of the Dhulia Municipality the auditors discovered after a special census of all the privies in the town that as many as 96 privies besides a considerable number of privy seats had been left out of account in the demand register with the result that the Municipality had been losing Rs. 400 a year in special sanitary cess. The Commissioner, Central Division, observes :—

"The full benefit of the audit will never be obtained until the audit notes are sent in vernacular. English notes are unintelligible in many Municipalities to everyone except the Secretary and he is of course the last person to bring irregularities prominently to the notice of his Board".

With reference to these remarks the Commissioner's attention should be invited to Government Order no. 217, dated the 7th January 1921, in which Government have expressed the opinion that it would be sufficient if the Local Fund Auditors bring to the notice of the Collector concerned every case in which a local body fails to dispose properly of audit notes on account of ignorance of English on the part of those whose duty it is to supervise their disposal, and that the Collector should then arrange to have the audit note translated for such local bodies only. The question, however, of issuing the audit notes of the Examiner, Local Fund Accounts, in the vernacular in all cases has not yet been finally disposed of.

In the Southern Division as also in Sind no serious irregularities were disclosed though many defects were brought to light. The disposal of the audit notes on the Bijapur Municipal accounts from 1915-16 was still uncompleted. With reference to these notes the Commissioner, Southern Division, observes :—

"These audit notes have great value. They show up the weak and slack points of the municipal administration and in many cases they indicate the line of improvement. They naturally cover a wide ground, but rarely go beyond their province. Many Presidents do their best to profit by

them, but in far too many cases the disposal of the audit notes is too long delayed and their educative value is thus greatly impaired”.

Government fully endorse the Commissioner's remarks and the attention of the Presidents of the Municipalities concerned should be especially invited to them.

28. *Municipal needs.*—As usual a wholesome and plentiful water-supply, efficient drainage, the opening up of congested and insanitary localities, good roads, hygienic school buildings with adequate play grounds, improved conservancy arrangements, municipal office buildings, dispensary buildings, markets, slaughterhouses, etc., are stated to be pressing and general wants of the Municipalities, most of which suffer from want of funds. For this the Municipalities have primarily themselves to blame. Government, however, have hitherto, so far as the state of their finances permitted, assisted these bodies towards the attainment of the more important desiderata by granting loans and liberal grants-in-aid from time to time. In the Northern Division the crying need of the Ahmedabad Municipality is a drainage system. Surat also requires an underground drainage and a surface drainage in localities where it does not exist at present. A scheme for pumping plant at Dakor is under investigation by the Sanitary Department. Boring work at Nadiad is in progress while at Kaira it has been partially successful. A water works scheme at Kapadvanj is ready in rough. An electric installation at Godhra is in the course of construction by Lady Chinubhai and it is expected to be completed shortly. In the Central Division the question of extending the Poona Drainage Scheme and of remedying its existing defects in accordance with the recommendations made by Mr. Watson is under the consideration of Government. In the Bombay Suburban Division the question of improving the water-supply and providing a drainage system in Bandra is at present engaging the attention of the Development Department. As regards lighting, the Municipality already possesses an electric license and the question of providing funds is before the Board. Drainage for Kurla is also under the consideration of the Development Department. In the Southern Division the Matheran Water-supply Scheme is at present being revised by the Sanitary Engineer to Government in the light of certain suggestions made by Lieut.-Colonel H. A. F. Knapton, I.M.S., and Mr. P. G. Gordon, I.C.S. The larger and more expensive scheme for the supply of water to the town of Uran has been abandoned and a simpler and cheaper scheme for supplying the Kharapat villages with water has been approved by Government. The fair plans and estimates of the project are being prepared by the Sanitary Engineer. The Nipani water-supply project is also being revised. Gadag received Rs. 73,000 from the sale of 19 plots for a cloth market and there are yet 27 plots to be sold. The Municipality proposes to utilize the sale proceeds on surface drainage work. The scheme for improving the water-supply of Nargund is being examined by the Executive Engineer, Southern Sanitary District. Government have promised a grant-in-aid of Rs. 5,000 to the Dharwar Municipality for the scheme of masonry gutters in the town if that body will supplement funds to complete the work by taking a loan from Government. The Sanitary Engineer has been asked to draw up a drainage scheme for Gokarn. In Sind the Karachi Municipality has prepared a comprehensive water-supply and drainage extension scheme for meeting immediate requirements and for providing for the future residential and industrial development of the city and the Municipality's application for permission to raise a loan of Rs. 36½ lakhs in the open market for that purpose has also been recently sanctioned by the Government of India. In Hyderabad improvements in the water works are in progress. The plans and estimate of a scheme for improving the Sukkur water-supply are still awaited by Government. A complete water works scheme for the town of Jacobabad estimated to cost Rs. 5½ lakhs is being prepared by the Sanitary Engineer to Government. Mirpurkhas Municipality is considering the question of a drainage scheme for the town.

29. *Grants for sanitary and town improvement schemes.*—A sum of Rs. 11,00,000 was provided in the budget for the year 1920-21 under the head “24-B—Sanitation” (now “33—Public Health”) to meet demands from local bodies for sanitary projects. A similar provision was also made out of the

surplus excise revenue on account of grants to local bodies for the promotion of sanitary improvements. The principal grants and advances made during the year were:—

30. *Remarks regarding the principal municipalities : Ahmedabad.*—The terminal tax and water rate brought in a considerable increase of income. Good work was done in the recovery of taxes and it is satisfactory to note that there remained at the end of the year only Rs. 78,000 to be recovered, of which Rs. 24,000 have been recovered since the close of the year. The Municipality has given much attention to the question of water supply and drainage. The construction of two new infiltration wells has increased the daily water supply by nearly 7 lakhs of gallons and this increase is expected to relieve to some extent the hardships caused by shortage of water during the hot weather months. The erection of a third engine at their pumping station has enabled the Municipality to increase its drainage connections which must directly help to improve the health of the locality served. Towards the end of the year the Municipality adopted the policy of non-co-operation in educational matters.

Surat.—The Commissioner, Northern Division, remarks:—

“The expenditure of the Municipality has exceeded the income; the renewal of the machinery at the head water works and the drainage scheme, which is under consideration, will impose a heavy financial burden on the Municipality to meet which considerable extra taxation, which the Municipality have not yet undertaken, will be necessary. Education suffers for want of decent and well ventilated school buildings. In face of the pressing need for more money with which to meet urgent demands the Municipality have adopted the policy of non-co-operation and renounced the Government educational grants.”

Nadiad.—The Collector of Kaira observes:—

“The most striking feature of the year was the wilful abandonment by the Nadiad Municipality of the Government grant for education and the “nationalizing” of their schools. This action is an unfortunate instance of how a political faction in order to further its own ends sacrifices the interests of the population.”

Poona.—The Collector observes:—

“On the whole the municipal report shows a satisfactory year’s work, though the number of meetings is still excessive and much time is wasted in unnecessary and fruitless discussion. The attitude of the Municipality to the Sanitary Department of Government is not always fair or reasonable, but there has been some justification for discontent with the working of the drainage pumps, and this has naturally helped to accentuate the admitted difficulties of the present position. The Municipality has been too wise to be infected by the virus of non-co-operation; in fact it spends a good deal of its time asking Government for loans or concessions or assistance of some sort.”

The normal income of the Municipality still continues to be below the normal expenditure, but the Board will now have to grapple seriously with the question of finding ways and means to execute the proposed drainage works.

Dhulia.—The Collector observes:—

“Dhulia is in many ways a model municipality. The town is excellently laid out and there is no heritage of slums. There is a pleasant public park which the people actually make use of. The official quarters also contain good sites for future Government buildings and there is a good *maidan*. The Municipality has been efficiently managed. The financial position appears at first thoroughly sound—no debt and the income greatly in excess of expenditure on the present scale. The Municipality have, however, many ambitious schemes in view, which will take up a lot of money. The relaying of pipes, through which the water supply comes, is an essential and urgent matter for the public health and it will probably run to some lakhs. The Municipality have eagerly taken up compulsory education at the earliest moment possible for them.”

Karachi.—The receipts during the year showed a substantial increase of about Rs. 23 lakhs (excluding deposits), but of this sum Rs. 16½ lakhs represents capital, being on account of the sale proceeds of land. The true income of the Municipality has increased by about Rs. 6 lakhs only, of which nearly Rs. 3 lakhs was produced by the temporary 4 per cent. increase of the house tax which terminated at the end of the year. It is regrettable that the Municipality should have discontinued the levy of the additional house tax, by doing which the Municipality has surrendered a much needed additional income. Government, however, removed the exemption from the liability to terminal taxation of Government goods entering the limits of the Karachi Municipality, which has helped the expansion of its resources. The Municipality has resolved to proceed with the water-supply extension scheme from its reserve fund, pending the raising of a loan of Rs. 36½ lakhs in the open market for the purpose, permission for which has been recently granted by the Government of India. The draft of a special Municipal Act for the city of Karachi prepared by the Special Officer appointed for the purpose is at present under the consideration of Government.

Hyderabad.—Government some time ago sanctioned the grant to the Municipality of 15 acres of land in the Fort, but the Municipality had not as yet taken steps to dispose of this land. The report of the Committee appointed by the Government of India on the question of the removal of the Cantonment has been received and is under the consideration of Government.

31. *General Remarks.*—The year under report was one of progress in the general administration of the Municipalities as a whole. The net income of the Municipalities, which was Rs. 180 lakhs, exceeded the previous year's income by about Rs. 31 lakhs. The ordinary expenditure which amounted to Rs. 164 lakhs was in excess of the previous year's expenditure by Rs. 16½ lakhs, and was, generally speaking, equitably distributed in satisfaction of the various public requirements. It is gratifying to note that the virus of non-co-operation has not to any appreciable extent affected any Municipalities except two large Municipalities of Gujarat, Ahmedabad and Surat, and the small Municipality of Nadiad, which in consequence allowed their finance and with it their administration to drift into chaos, the interests of the rate-payers being sacrificed to political ends. The tendency on the part of other Municipalities is on the contrary to depend more and more on increased grants from Government, especially for educational needs. The policy of obstruction is not, however, quite unknown. With the increased cost of administration all Municipalities are finding it difficult to secure incomes sufficient to meet normal obligations with a small working margin for emergencies. The tendency to shirk the task of increasing direct taxation is nearly general. In Sind, there were few indications of the recognition by the Municipalities of the necessity of a higher standard of municipal administration. No Municipality took serious steps during the year to exploit new sources of income by direct taxation and the local bodies appear to be content with making alterations in their rates of indirect taxation. Government are convinced that the only way out of the impending bankruptcy in the case of several Municipalities is to resort to direct taxation. It is to be hoped that with the liberally extended elective franchise and the appointment of elected non-official presidents the sense of civic duty will be developed.

The Progress of Mahomedan Education, Northern Division.—In Ahmedabad the total number of Mahomedan students attending both Gujarati and Urdu schools during the year 1920-21 was 1,715 (1,445 boys and 270 girls), as against 1,624 in the previous year. The percentage of Mahomedan pupils to Mahomedan population was 3·8 as against 3·5 of the preceding year. Excluding the infant classes, 632 pupils appeared for the annual examination. Of these 444 passed, bringing the percentage to 70·2 which is fairly satisfactory. In Ahmedabad District the Municipalities of Dholka, Viramgam, Prantij, Modasa, Dhandhuka, Gogha and Ranpur each maintained one Urdu school. The average attendance was fairly good. Sanand maintained no separate Urdu school, and there were only three Mahomedan girls and boys studying in the municipal schools. There is also a grant-in-aid Urdu school at Modasa called "Kasbatiwada Urdu Arabic Madressah" in which 28 boys and 29 girls received education. In the Kaira District, except at Anand and Dakor, each Municipality has at least one Urdu school. Arrangements were being made to open a school at Anand. The attendance of Mahomedan boys except at Borsad was moderately satisfactory. There is one Municipal Urdu school with 232 boys in Godhra. 71 Mahomedan boys and one Mahomedan girl attended the Municipal Gujarati schools. Godhra Municipality resolved to open one Urdu branch school for Mahomedan girls and two branch schools for Mahomedan boys. The total expenditure per head of the Urdu school was Rs. 15-7-0. There are also Madressahs where the boys and girls are taught only the Koran. Out of the six primary schools in Dohad two are for Mahomedans. There were 122 boys in the Urdu school and 113 girls in the Girls' school, as against 115 and 122, respectively. Urdu is taught through the medium of Gujarati. The number of Urdu schools for boys and girls in the Broach Municipality, where girls are given free education, rose from two to four. The Municipality spent Rs. 4,452 on Mahomedan education as against Rs. 3,528 in the preceding year. The Municipality also gave grants amounting to Rs. 388 to three private Mahomedan institutions. No such progress was noticeable at Ankleshwar or Jambusar. In Surat the number of municipal Urdu schools is 16 as last year but the number of pupils increased from 1,034 to 1,411. Besides municipal schools, there are ten recognised and thirteen unrecognised schools and Madressahs in the city. The percentage of children receiving elementary education out of a Mahomedan population of 24,345 is 10·7, which shows there is much scope for expansion. The municipal schools employed 65 teachers of whom 12 were trained, 8 qualified and 45 unqualified. The vernacular final class opened last year has justified its existence inasmuch as 11 students who were trained there have all passed the examination. In the Thana District the Kalyan Urdu school was closed in November last as on account of the non-co-operation movement parents withdrew their children from the school. The Bassein Municipality has now two primary Urdu schools which are attended by about 60 children. The attendance in the Bhiwandi schools has risen from 186 to 238.

Bombay Suburban Division.—Out of the three Municipalities in this Division, *viz.*, Bandra, Kurla and Ghatkopar, the first has two Urdu schools for boys and two for girls. The number of boys increased from 194 to 278 and that of girls from 61 to 137. Kurla has three Urdu schools for boys and the attendance rose from 68 to 91. Ghatkopar has no considerable Mahomedan population.

Central Division.—The Collector of Ahmednagar reports that in spite of financial difficulties the Municipalities have not neglected the subject. In East Khandesh all Municipalities maintain Urdu schools for boys and girls. In West Khandesh there are 12 Urdu schools. In Nasik, the Municipalities of Nasik, Yeola, Malegaon, Sinnar and Igatpuri maintain Urdu schools. Poona City Municipality maintained nine Urdu schools and one night school, six for boys and four for girls. The English class attached to the Urdu full primary school is reported to have shown good progress. Baramati Municipality continues to maintain a special Urdu school. The Junnar Municipality maintains an Urdu school to which is also attached a class for Mahomedan girls. The Poona Suburban, Khed and Sirur Municipalities have Urdu classes attached to their vernacular schools. At Talegaon-Dabhade Mahomedan boys are instructed in a municipal vernacular school. Indapur Municipality has, with the sanction of the educational authorities, introduced the teaching of Urdu to Mahomedan boys as a second language and the teaching of all other subjects through the medium of Marathi. The Municipalities of Sholapur, Barsi, Karmala and Pandharpur in Sholapur District and Islampur in Satara District maintain Urdu schools. Sangola has no separate Urdu school. There are 22 Mahomedan boys in the municipal boys' Marathi school of whom four get free studentships.

Southern Division.—Except for the opening of an Urdu class for girls at Nipani, the number of Urdu schools and classes in the Municipalities of Belgaum District remained the same, the attendance being 744 boys and 417 girls. A candidate sent up by the Urdu Boys' school at Belgaum passed the Vernacular School Final Examination. There were five schools including two classes in Bijapur, three in Bagalkot, two in Gulegdud and one in Ilkal with a total attendance of 828. In the Municipalities of the Dharwar District, Urdu schools for boys numbered 15 and those for girls six. The Dharwar Municipality maintained three boys' and three girls' schools which were managed by Mahomedan teachers, the attendance on the roll being 659. In Hubli schools, which numbered seven including two girls' schools, the attendance increased from 1,355 to 1,407.

The number of schools and classes maintained by the Municipalities in the Kanara District remained unchanged. In Karwar the attendance was 44 boys and 44 girls, who were also taught sewing. In Kumta the number on the rolls was 48 boys and 28 girls. The attendance in Sirsi fell from 120 to 88 owing to the opening of a national school. The attendance at Haliyal was 95. An Urdu class at Honavar with an attendance of 24 children is reported to have been showing satisfactory progress. In Bhatkal the attendance fell from 181 to 134 owing to the opening of an Anjuman school. The Municipality proposed to open a girls' school but the Mahomedans want to open a girls' school of their own. In Kolaba District the Municipalities of Alibag, Mahad, Panvel, Pen and Roha have one boys' school each and Uran has two. All these schools are poorly attended and badly conducted. No trained teachers are available, and the people concerned take little interest. In the Ratnagiri District, Ratnagiri and Malwan has each one Urdu school with 42 and 61 students in them, respectively. The former school is not doing well as the teachers are incapable but the Malwan school is flourishing.

Sind.—During the year under report 899 Mahomedan boys and 674 girls and 10 Mahomedan mistresses received instruction in municipal schools in Karachi at a cost of Rs. 64,000. Of these 899 boys, 58 after finishing the primary course qualified to join English schools. Of the 31 boy pupils belonging to various communities who were admitted free in the municipal schools, 23 were Mahomedans. In the Female Normal Class 10 out of 23 mistresses receiving training were Mahomedans, 4 of whom were stipendiaries. The Municipality also paid grants-in-aid amounting to Rs. 11,500 to 21 Mahomedan Boys' schools and 8 Girls' schools. On the attendance rolls of these aided schools there were 2,465 boys and girls. Out of the total municipal expenditure of Rs. 2,17,500 on education for the year under report Rs. 75,300 were spent on the education of Mahomedans, i. e., about 34.60 per cent. In the Tatta Municipality the number of Mahomedan students in the English and Vernacular schools was 25 and 88 respectively as against 21 and 88 last year. A night school is also held in which the number of Mahomedan boys was 15 against 11. The number of Mahomedan boys in the Keti Bandar municipal school stood stationary at 26. At Kotri there were 45 Mahomedan boys out of a total of 204 in the vernacular school and 19 out of 61 in the Anglo-Vernacular School, besides 28 out of 34 in the Khanpur school and 33 Mahomedans in Nangoline school. The Municipality maintains a girls' school in Nangoline where 33 girls received education during the year. Mahomedan education in the town of Manjhand is generally poor. The Municipality has resolved to make primary education free and it is hoped that it will have sufficient attraction for Mahomedans. In the District of Hyderabad the number of Mahomedan boys and girls attending municipal schools was 679 and 48, respectively, out of a total number of 1,875 boys and 512 girls attending them. The number of free pupils was 579. The small number of Mahomedan boys attending municipal schools is due to the existence of Mulla schools in the municipal areas. In the Sukkur District the number of Mahomedan pupils is on the increase, their progress being so good that some of them now occupy the first benches in the classes. Indifference towards education on the part of Mahomedans is gradually vanishing. The Municipalities are helping the spread of education amongst Mahomedans by maintaining schools and boarding houses, by giving scholarships and by increasing the percentage of free studentships. During the year under report, Larkana Municipality had in all its 4 schools 668 boys, out of whom 149 were Mahomedans as against 137 out of 579 last year. Within its limits there are also Mulla schools for Mahomedan boys besides one Madressah-tul-Islam, which receives Rs. 300 a year from the Larkana Board. The Madressah-tul-Islam, Larkana, which used to attract Mahomedan boys from the towns and mofussil is to be closed as a school and maintained as a Mahomedan hostel in connection with the High School. In the Kambar Municipality the education of Mahomedans is making good progress. In the vernacular school at Sehwan 30 Mahomedan boys received education. Of these 8 were exempt from payment of school fees. In the Anglo-Vernacular school there were 11 Mahomedan boys, of whom 5 were exempt from school fees. There is only one vernacular school at Bubak wherein 40 Mahomedan students received education, 10 being exempt from school fees. There is one municipal primary school at Mirpurkhas which had 164 boys on its roll during the year. Of these 25 were Mahomedans. At Umarnkot, after the appointment of a Mahomedan Chairman on the School Board, the attendance of Mahomedan boys slightly improved and the sons of the peasant class living in the vicinity of Umarnkot are reported to have joined the school. In the Nawabshah District the number of Mahomedan children at schools showed no progress. At the municipal schools there were 16 boys in Shabdadpur and 30 boys in Tando Adam. In the Upper Sind Frontier in order to encourage primary education it was made free during the year under report, the number of boys on the roll being 57 per cent.
