Read the reports from the Commissioner in Sind and the Commissioners of Divisions on the working of the Municipalities and Notified Areas in the Bombay Presidency for the year 1923-24.

RESOLUTION.

PART I.

Summary.

Number and area.—The total number of Municipalities in the Presidency including Sind, remained the same, *viz.*, 156, during the year under review. The Notified Area Committee of Palej in the Northern Division and that of Alnavar in the Southern Division were abolished and replaced by Village Panchayats. The Notified Area at Hungund was also replaced by a Village Panchayat but as no candidate came forward for election to the Panchayat, the Notified Area was re-established. The number of Notified Areas in the Presidency proper was thus reduced from 14 to 12 (6 in the Bombay Suburban Division, 1 in the Central Division, and 5 in the Southern Division), exclusive of those which merely exist for the control of buildings and do not levy taxes.

2. *Changes in the population and boundaries.*—The population resident in the Municipal Districts, *viz.*, 26,69,000, remained almost the same as in the previous year. The municipal limits of Dholka and Jambusar in the Northern Division, Bandra in the Bombay Suburban Division, Amalner, Parola, Faizpur, Nasik, Poona Suburban and Karmala in the Central Division, Haveri and Gadag in the Southern Division, and Tando Allahyar, Tando Mahomedkhan, Kambar and Sehwan in Sind were altered during the year.

3. *Constitution of Municipalities.*—In the Northern Division, with the exception of Ahmedabad, Nadiad, Umreth, Borsad and Surat, all other Municipalities had elected presidents. In the case of Ahmedabad the two years' period of supersession having expired, the Municipality was re-established with an elected President in February 1924. At Surat, the Committee of Management, which was appointed in 1922 in the place of the superseded Municipality, held office throughout the year. In October 1923, both the President and the Vice-President of the Borsad Municipality resigned their seats and the privilege of electing its President was withdrawn from this Municipality, the Mamlatdar of Borsad being appointed *ex-officio* President. Triennial elections were held at Prantij, Dhandhuka, Sanand, Jambusar, Thana and Bassein. The terms of the Broach, Rander and Bulsar Municipalities were extended up to the 31st March 1924, so that elections could be held on the extended elective franchise based on communal representation. By-elections were held at Ranpur, Godhra, Thana and Kalyan. They were due to the death of councillors at the first three places, and at Kalyan the by-election was due to the resignation of an elected member. At Godhra, a nominated councillor was disqualified under section 15 (2) (e) of the Bombay District Municipal Act, on account of absence without leave for more than four successive months from the Board's meetings and at Kalyan a nominated councillor resigned his seat, and fresh nominations were made at both these places. No keen competition was noticeable in the elections held in the Ahmedabad District. At Jambusar there was no contest at all whereas at Broach the seats in all the wards were keenly contested, the total number of candidates being 51 for 39 seats. The voting is reported to have been influenced more by communal and caste considerations than by fitness and qualifications of candidates. At Rander, Bulsar and Bassein also the elections were keenly contested. In Bulsar the notable feature of the elections was that a depressed class candidate was returned. At Bassein as many as 52 candidates came forward for 16 seats.

In the Bombay Suburban Division, except in the case of the Ghat-Kopar-Kirol Municipality, no triennial elections were held. In this Municipality the number of councillors was increased from 8 to 10 (8 elected and 2 nominated). Bandra, Kurla and Ghat-Kopar elect their own Presidents while the Juhu Municipality, which is almost entirely undeveloped, is presided over by the Salsette Development Officer.

In the Central Division triennial elections were held in 20 municipalities. In Vambori and Ahmednagar the elections were keenly contested, the number of votes recorded in the former Municipality amounting to 55 per cent. of the total number of voters. In Sangamner one elected councillor was disqualified and removed under section 16 of the Bombay District Municipal Act for his unbecoming conduct in municipal affairs and a by-election was held. In Dhulia the elections were very keenly contested, the percentage of votes polled being 66 per cent. of the total. Three civil suits were filed to contest the legality of the election of certain persons. As there were no candidates for election to fill one seat in a by-election of the Erandol Municipality and 3 seats out of 10 vacancies in the by-election of the Shahada Municipality, these 4 vacancies were filled by nominations under section 10 (2) of the Bombay District Municipal Act. One noticeable feature in the by-election of the Shahada Municipality was that 2 members of the untouchable class were elected. By-elections were held at Dhulia, Taloda and Betawad. The terms of office of nine municipalities were extended to enable them to observe the preliminaries necessary to bring into effect the new constitution of the boards.

In the Southern Division triennial elections were held at Gokak, Chiplun and Bagalkot. The elections at Bagalkot were keenly contested: five civil suits were filed questioning the legality of voters' lists and of the elections, of which two were withdrawn, two were dismissed and one was successful. The same interest was displayed in connection with the by-elections held at Bijapur and Bagalkot. By-elections were also held at Saundatti-Yellamma, Bailhongal, Karwar, Haliyal, Dharwar and Hungund. A by-election held at Kumta was set aside by the District Court on technical grounds. Two appeals to the District Court to set aside the last triennial elections in the Navalgund Municipality were rejected. All Municipalities with the exception of Matheran, Gokarn and Ulvi have elected non-official presidents.

In Sind, all the 26 municipalities have now been re-constituted in accordance with the orders contained in Government Resolution no. 9693, dated the 14th September 1920, liberalizing the constitution of Municipalities.

4. *Attendance at municipal meetings.*—In the Northern, Bombay Suburban, Central and Southern Divisions the total number of meetings held rose from 899, 65, 986 and 713 to 950, 75, 1,070 and 818, respectively. The average attendance of all members present at each meeting in the Northern Division rose from 52.5 to 53.3, whereas in the Bombay Suburban, Central and Southern Divisions it fell from 61.17, 61.44 and 62.25 to 60, 59.28 and 59.83 respectively. In Sind the total number of meetings held rose from 677 to 725. The attendance, however, of councillors at the meetings has been reported to be generally not satisfactory.

5. *Changes in the system of taxation.*—*House tax.*—The Jambusar Municipality reduced the rate of house tax. Panchgani introduced combined house tax and conservancy cess. Gadag, Saundatti-Yellamma, Bailhongal, Nipani and Hubli revised their house tax. In Sind, house tax was abolished in Ghotki.

Octroi.—In Surat the rates of octroi on sugar and ghee were increased and the deduction of 10 per cent. on refunds was abolished. Indapur revised its rates of octroi on cloth. Talegaon-Dabhade levied octroi on tea, toys, stationery and soap. Tasgaon, Mhaswad, Satara City, Alibag and Barsi revised their octroi schedules. In Sind, the octroi schedule was revised by the Nasarpur Municipality.

Terminal Tax.—Broach, Nandgaon, Ranebennur and Haveri introduced the terminal tax. Roha deleted from the terminal tax schedule iron and certain other articles imported by the Tata Power Company in consideration of a lump payment of Rs. 15,000 by that Company. Hubli levied a tax on exported cotton bales and cotton seeds. In Sind, terminal tax in place of octroi was introduced in Kotri and Kambar. The terminal tax schedules of the Ghotki and Larkana Municipalities were also revised.

Water rate.—Dhulia levied rate for the supply of water by meter for domestic use. Satara City exempted certain buildings from water rate. It was abolished in Panvel. Hubli revised its water rates.

Sanitary Cess.—The Municipalities of Anand, Dakor, Thana, Faizpur, Raver, Matheran, Yawal and Dharangaon revised their Sanitary Cess so as to do away with the exemption from the payment of the general sanitary cess in the case of those who paid the special sanitary cess. Anand and Indapur revised their special sanitary cess. The Mahableshwar Municipality levied a latrine cess and Panchgani exempted certain institutions from the levy of special sanitary cess. Mahad and Roha introduced a general sanitary cess in addition to the special sanitary cess. Alibag revised its special sanitary cess. The Vengurla Municipality increased it so as to make the service self-supporting. In Sind the halalkhor cess of the Rohri Municipality was revised.

Conveyance tax and tolls.—The Kapadvanj Municipality introduced the levy of tolls. Panchgani raised the rate of the tax on motors. Jambusar abolished the conveyance tax. The Belgaum Municipality revised its wheel tax and Bailhongal, Kumta, Gadag-Bettigeri and Haveri revised the toll and wheel taxes. In Sind, a toll tax was introduced in Bubak. The wheel tax schedules of the Shikarpur Municipality, the wheel and animal tax schedules of the Karachi Municipality and the wheel and toll tax schedules of the Ghotki and Tando Adam Municipalities were revised.

Miscellaneous taxes.—At Surat fees for projections, markets and slaughter of animals and fines for plugging or cutting of water connections were raised. Indapur Municipality levied mandap fees and revised the fees on cattle brought for sale. The Poona City Municipality raised the scale of notice and warrant fees. Vita levied weekly bazar fees and Wai fees for the temporary erections on and occupation of roads. Taxes on cinemas, dramas, etc., were imposed by the Belgaum Municipality. Kumta revised its market fees. In Honavar a tax on tea, bidi and snuff shops was levied while it was abolished in Bhatkal. In Sind, bunder fees were introduced in Rohri.

6. *Municipal income.*—During the year under report the aggregate gross income of the municipalities increased to Rs. 2,90½ lakhs from Rs. 2,54 lakhs in the previous year. Deducting receipts under "Extraordinary and Debt" the net income amounted to Rs. 1,95 lakhs as against Rs. 1,80 lakhs in the previous year. The following table shows the fluctuations under the principal heads of income :—

7. *Octroi and Terminal Tax receipts.*—Of the substantial increase of Rs. 4,44,000 under this head, as much as Rs. 3,21,000 was contributed by Sind. The Central and Southern Divisions also contributed Rs. 54,000 and Rs. 1,14,000, respectively towards the increase, which was counterbalanced by decreases of Rs. 35,000 and Rs. 10,000 in the Northern and the Bombay Suburban Divisions, respectively. In the Northern Division, Ahmedabad alone showed a decrease of Rs. 1,42,000. Nadiad and Jambusar also contributed towards the decrease to the extent of Rs. 7,000 but this total decrease of Rs. 1,49,000 was compensated by the increase shown by the Municipalities of Viramgam, Anand, Godhra, Dohad, Broach, Surat and Bhiwandi in all to the extent of about Rs. 1,14,000. The decrease in Ahmedabad was mainly due to the fact that the figures of the previous years were abnormal owing to the receipts of the last two months of 1921-22 having been accounted for in 1922-23. At Surat the large increase of about Rs. 59,000 was due to the revised rates for sugar and ghee and the abolition of 10 per cent. refunds. At Broach there was an increase of about Rs. 25,000 due to the imposition of terminal tax in lieu of octroi. The decrease of Rs. 10,000 in the Bombay Suburban Division occurred in Bandra and was due to slack trade. Of the increase of Rs. 54,000 under this head in the Southern Division Rs. 46,000 were contributed by the Dharwar District. The increase of Rs. 10,000 in the Dharwar Municipality was due to the fact that terminal tax was levied by it only for five months in the preceding year. The increase in the Hubli Municipality (Rs. 12,000) was caused by the importation of a larger amount of cotton. The revision of octroi rates and closer supervision accounts for the rise of Rs. 3,000 under this head in the Gadag-Bettigeri Municipality. The introduction of terminal tax in the Ranebennur and Haveri Municipalities accounts for an increase of Rs. 21,000. The increase in the Districts of Belgaum (Rs. 20,000) and Kanara (Rs. 5,000) was counterbalanced by a decrease in the Districts of Bijapur (Rs. 9,000), Ratnagiri (Rs. 5,000) and Kolaba (Rs. 3,000). In the Belgaum District the increase was due to larger imports of agricultural produce and in Kanara to better supervision and revised rates. The decrease in Bijapur is ascribed to the unfavourable season and depression of trade) and in Ratnagiri to smaller imports and larger refunds. Curtailment of the terminal tax schedule in Roha, larger refunds in Pen and depression of trade owing to plague in Mahad were responsible for the decrease in Kolaba. In Sind, the increase of Rs. 2,88,000 in Karachi was due to increased imports. The increase of Rs. 10,000 each in Larkana and Mirpurkhas and of Rs. 7,000 in Sukkur was due to the revision of the terminal tax schedule in Larkana, and abundant crops and increased imports in Mirpurkhas and Sukkur. There were decreases under this head in Hyderabad (Rs. 2,000), Shikarpur (Rs. 2,500), Tando Adam (Rs. 5,500) and Jacobabad (Rs. 4,000).

8. *Taxes on houses and lands.*—Under taxes on houses and lands there was an increase of Rs. 1,59,000 in Sind and all the Divisions in the Presidency proper. Towards the increase of Rs. 45,000 under this head in the Northern Division the Municipalities of Borsad, Nadiad, Godhra, Surat, Thana and Bhiwandi have chiefly contributed and at the first four places it was due to the recovery of past arrears. Jambusar, Rander and Kalyan showed a decrease. At Jambusar it was due to the reduction of rates and at the latter two places, to slackness of recovery. In the Bombay Suburban Division the increase of Rs. 8,000 under this head accrued in Ghat-Kopar, Kurla and Juhu and was due to new buildings and better recoveries. The Central and Southern Divisions showed increases of Rs. 67,000 and Rs. 24,000, respectively. In the latter Division the increase was shared by all the Districts except Kanara and Ratnagiri. The increase in the Dharwar District (Rs. 10,000) is explained by the recovery of outstanding arrears in Gadag-Bettigeri and Navalgund. The Belgaum, Kolaba and Bijapur Districts showed increases of Rs. 8,000, Rs. 6,000 and Rs. 4,000, respectively. Nargund showed a decrease of Rs. 6,000 in consequence of the emigration of many of the inhabitants and failure to collect arrears owing to bad crops. In Sind, the increase under this head

of Rs. 15,000 was contributed wholly by the Karachi and Sukkur Municipalities and was due principally to the revision of assessment and larger recoveries.

9. *Water rates.*—The largest portion out of the total increase of Rs. 2,82,000 under water rate was contributed by the Northern Division which was responsible for Rs. 2,66,000. The Central Division contributed Rs. 28,000 towards the increase. In the Northern Division, Ahmedabad alone contributed to the extent of Rs. 2,59,000, the enhanced income being due to the quadrennial revision of house valuation. Surat showed an increase of Rs. 8,000, which was on account of the recovery of the past arrears. The decrease of Rs. 11,000 in the Southern Division was largely contributed by the Dharwar District and was due to the stoppage of the Dharwar Water Works for about 4 months. A decrease of Rs. 3,000 in Kolaba, which was due to the abolition of water rates and full re-payment of the Water Works loan by the Panvel Municipality, was counterbalanced by an increase of Rs. 3,000 in Bijapur consisting mostly of arrears. In Sind, there was a decrease of Rs. 19,000 under this head in Karachi due to the recovery of arrears in the preceding year. On the other hand, there were increases of Rs. 15,500 in Hyderabad due to additional house connections, the supply of more water to the Cantonment and an increase in the rate for water supplied to the Railway authorities and of Rs. 1,500 in Sukkur owing to the enhancement of the rates for house connections.

10. *Recovery of Municipal dues.*—In the Northern Division the Municipalities of Borsad, Nadiad, and Surat added considerably to their receipts during the year by successful recovery of past arrears. Although the Ahmedabad Municipality has left over an outstanding balance of over Rs. 1,67,000, the ratio of collection to the total demand showed a slight improvement over last year's figure. In the Kaira District the arrears still seem to be heavy at Umreth, Borsad, Kapadvanj and Nadiad. In the Panch Mahals, Dohad made good progress. Godhra made some successful effort for the recovery of past arrears which however continued to be heavy as the house tax assessment registers were not ready in time. The collection of taxes at Broach showed a marked improvement owing to the enhanced rates of notice and warrant fees. In Surat the whole procedure for the preparation of bills and collection of taxes was far too dilatory and the work of the collection staff was ineffective. However, the enhanced rates of notice and warrant fees recently sanctioned by Government are expected to improve matters. The Municipalities of Thana and Kalyan have left large arrears to be collected. At Kalyan some of the municipal councillors are reported to have fallen into arrears to a very large extent and the fact has been brought to the President's notice.

In the Bombay Suburban Division, Bandra showed arrears of Rs. 87,000, out of which Rs. 57,000 represent the irrecoverable balances of the undeveloped land tax which has been declared illegal by the Civil Court at Thana. Both Bandra and Ghat-Kopar showed improvement but in Kurla arrears increased from Rs. 28,000 to Rs. 43,000. The scandalous condition of the affairs of this Municipality was brought to the notice of Government, who declared it to be incompetent and directed its dissolution under section 179 of the Bombay District Municipal Act, 1901, as amended by Bombay Act IV of 1924, with effect from the 1st February 1925. A new Municipal Board has since been formed and it is hoped that effective measures will be taken by it for the prompt recovery of the heavy arrears of taxes.

In the Central Division out of a total demand of Rs. 18,24,000 outstanding arrears at the end of the year amounted to Rs. 2,72,000, i.e., about 14.9 per cent. The heaviest arrears were in Yawal (31 per cent.), Chopda (28 per cent.), Sindkheda (55 per cent.), Poona City (22 per cent.), Lonavla (30 per cent.), Junnar (22 per cent.), Indapur (60 per cent.), Sirur (50 per cent.), Ashta (36 per cent.), Karad (44 per cent.), and Karmala (46 per cent.). Nearly half of the total amount of arrears was on account of house tax.

(In the Southern Division the Athni Municipality in the Belgaum District is again reported to be responsible for the largest arrears amounting to Rs. 13,000 or 50 per cent. of the total demand. The Municipality is in the habit of suspending the collection of house tax and sanitary cess in years of famine, which have lately been frequent. It has been pointed out to the President that such a concession is not necessary in the case of municipal taxes. The President promises to make efforts to clear off these arrears early. The Belgaum Municipality continues to be a persistent defaulter with an outstanding of 25 per cent. of the total demand. Gokak has recovered nearly the whole of its arrears. The Bijapur Municipality still continues to show very heavy arrears (Rs. 21,000), some of them of long standing and some due from municipal councillors including the Vice-President himself. The Municipality has after due scrutiny written off Rs. 8,000 as irrecoverable. Rs. 3,000 have been collected during the current year and the Collector remarks that the arrears have now been reduced to Rs. 2,000 by these methods. Government concur with the Commissioner that such methods of clearing arrears are not satisfactory. In Gadag-Bettigeri the percentage of arrears fell from 56 to 36. Navalgund also showed improvement, the arrears being 17 per cent. against 33 per cent. in the previous year. The arrears in Dharwar were only 7 per cent. of the total demand. At Hubli the percentage of arrears (8 per cent.) remained stationary. Ranebennur has shown a clean sheet.) In Malwan the arrears were heavy as usual—viz.: Rs. 3,518 out of a total demand of Rs. 9,580. The reason ascribed by the President that the establishment was engaged in the work of revising assessment of house tax is far from satisfactory. Vengurla also shows an outstanding of 35 per cent. of the total demand. The collections in the Kolaba District showed great improvement, most of the Presidents having responded to the Collector's appeal for greater effort in this direction. The Roha Municipality showed a clean sheet. The Panvel Municipality recovered the major portion of the outstandings amounting to over Rs. 11,000 and Pan and Mahad cleared off past arrears. The Collector points out that Uran is the only board that has shown culpable indifference to the state of its finances, which he believes to be due to caste distinctions being allowed to govern collections and to an abuse on the part of several councillors of their official position. He has, however, since reported that the Municipality has now reduced its arrears from Rs. 4,800 to Rs. 1,750 and is collecting the remainder.

In Sind the total outstandings amounted to Rs. 2,38,000 against Rs. 2,99,000 in the preceding year. Arrears amounting to Rs. 1,96,000 were shown by the Karachi Municipality alone and are explained by the late issue of bills owing to delay in the disposal of appeals and the non-payment of the bills for February and March before the close of the year.

Government notice with regret the general lack of interest displayed by municipal bodies in recovering their taxes. Councillors themselves are often defaulters with the natural result that coercive processes are not adequately employed and penalties for late payment of taxes are not imposed. The attention of the Municipalities whose arrears of taxes are heavy should be invited to the concluding remarks in paragraph 10 of Government Resolution no. P.—55, dated the 6th October 1924 and they should be warned that Government will be constrained to take serious notice of their persistent default in the performance of this important branch of their duties.

11. *Revenue derived from municipal property.*—Under the head "Revenue derived from municipal property" there was a decrease of Rs. 24,000. Sind and the Southern Division contributed Rs. 2,44,000 and Rs. 22,000, respectively, towards the decrease which was counterbalanced by an increase of Rs. 80,000 in the Northern Division, Rs. 1,60,000 in the Central Division and Rs. 2,000 in the Bombay Suburban Division. In the Northern Division, Ahmedabad and Surat contributed very largely towards the increase of Rs. 80,000 under this head. In the former Municipality the increase was due to the enhanced rents of municipal shops and of telephone posts, increased receipts from fines and the increased interest realized on account of larger investments. At Surat the increase was on account of the

sale of securities of the face value of Rs. 53,200. (In the Southern Division the decrease of Rs. 38,000 shared by the Bijapur and Dharwar Districts (Rs. 18,000 and Rs. 20,000) was counterbalanced by an increase of Rs. 14,000 in all the other Districts particularly in Belgaum. The decrease in the Dharwar District is explained by the fact that last year's figures were unusually high owing to the extra revenue derived by the sale of market plots by Dharwar and of sandalwood trees by Nargund. The decrease in Bijapur is reported to be due to a reduction in the number of lands and footpaths sold during the year. Sale of plots in the extension at Belgaum and recovery of market fees and cattle market fees in Gokak were responsible for an increase of Rs. 9,000 in the Belgaum District.) For the decrease of Rs. 2,44,000 in Sind, Karachi (Rs. 1,01,000), Hyderabad (Rs. 98,500) and Sukkur (Rs. 84,000) were mainly responsible. In Karachi the decrease was due to the absence of demand for land owing to tightness of the money market and the slump in land values. In Hyderabad there were fewer land sales. In Sukkur in consequence of the orders of Government laying down that the Municipality is liable to be assessed to land revenue in respect of plots which vested in it for public purposes before 1876, but which are now being leased out by it and that Government have a right to repossess themselves of such lands as have been disposed of on a 99 years' lease or in perpetuity when required for a public purpose, sales of land are in abeyance.

12. *Grants and contributions for general and special purposes.*—The receipts under this head, which chiefly consist of grants made by Government to municipalities for the improvement of water supply and drainage, for the entertainment of health officers and sanitary inspectors and for educational purposes, increased by Rs. 1,93,000 to Rs. 22,79,000. The Southern Division showed an increase of Rs. 1,40,000, Northern Division of Rs. 54,000 and Sind of Rs. 51,000. This increase was counterbalanced by a decrease of Rs. 51,000 in the Central Division. In the Northern Division the increase under this head would have been far greater; but it was counterbalanced by larger decreases shown in the receipts of the Ahmedabad and Surat Municipalities which spent less on education. Godhra, Kapadvanj, Nadiad, Broach, Jambusar and Thana largely contributed towards the increase. In the case of Kapadvanj and Nadiad the increase is ascribed to the fact that Kapadvanj received a large building grant while Nadiad accepted the Government grant for education which the Non-co-operating Board had refused to take in the previous year. In the Bombay Suburban Division the increase of Rs. 3,900 under grants for educational purposes is due to an increased Government grant towards free and compulsory education in Bandra. (In the Southern Division the large increase of Rs. 1,40,000 was shared by the Districts of Dharwar (Rs. 86,000), Bijapur (Rs. 36,000), Kolaba (Rs. 17,000) and Belgaum (Rs. 16,000). Larger educational grants amounting to Rs. 3,58,000 as against Rs. 2,70,000 chiefly account for this increase. The increase in the Dharwar District was mainly attributable to a grant-in-aid of Rs. 15,000 for the water supply scheme at Nargund, receipt of arrears of dispensary grants in Hubli and Nargund and more liberal grants for primary education in Dharwar, Hubli, Nargund and Gadag-Bettigeri. Bijapur received from Government new grants of Rs. 3,000 for general purposes and Ilkal, a building grant of Rs. 12,000 for the construction of a school and Bagalkot, a grant of Rs. 8,000 for anglo-vernacular and primary schools.) Matheran received an assignment of land revenue amounting to Rs. 25,000 accrued within the hill station. Increased educational grants were responsible for an increase in Belgaum. The Kanara and Ratnagiri districts, however, showed a decrease of Rs. 12,000 and Rs. 3,000, respectively; mainly owing to non-receipt of Government grants by certain municipalities. In Sind, Hyderabad showed a large increase owing to the receipt from Government of a grant-in-aid of Rs. 1,03,000 towards the Water Works Improvement Scheme. On the other hand Sukkur showed a decrease of Rs. 92,000 owing to the receipt in the preceding year of a larger grant-in-aid towards the Water Works Improvement Scheme. Karachi showed an increase of

Rs. 18,000 due to the receipt of an increased Government grant owing to enhanced expenditure on education. The small increases and decreases in several other municipalities call for no remarks.

13. *Nature of income and incidence per head of population.*—Of the aggregate income of the municipalities, Rs. 1,33,85,000 were realized from municipal taxes and rates as compared with Rs. 1,22,71,000 in the preceding year, direct taxation yielding Rs. 74,69,000 or 55·8 per cent. and indirect taxation yielding Rs. 59,16,000 or 44·2 per cent. of the total. The corresponding percentages in the previous year were 55·4 and 44·6, respectively. The average incidence of taxation per head of population increased from Rs. 4-9-7 to Rs. 5-7-1 and that of income also increased from Rs. 6-11-11 to Rs. 7-15-4, that is to say, the municipalities raised 13 annas 6 pies per head more than last year and also received 3 annas 5 pies per head more than last year.

14. *Working of octroi and terminal tax systems.*—In the Northern Division only 8 municipalities, *viz.*, Viramgam, Gogho, Ranpur, Surat, Bulsar, Thana, Kalyan and Bassein levy octroi. Out of the gross receipts of Rs. 4,17,000 a sum of Rs. 24,000 was granted as refund, the percentage of which works out at 5·7 as against 4·2 in the previous year. This rise in percentage was due to greater refunds granted at Surat, Bulsar and Thana. The percentage at Bulsar was as high as 19. No refunds were given at Viramgam, Gogho, Ranpur and Bassein. None of the four municipalities in the Bombay Suburban Division levy octroi. In the Central Division, 34 municipalities out of 58 levy octroi. The gross octroi collections amounted to Rs. 13,11,000 and net income to Rs. 12,36,000, the percentage of refund being 5·6 against 6·4 of last year. In the Southern Division the gross octroi collections amounted to Rs. 5,18,000 and refunds to Rs. 36,000 the percentage of refund to gross collections increasing from 4·2 to 6·9. The percentage was high in Chiplun (40·3), Karwar (22·84), Bagalkot (22·5), Honavar (18·9) and Panvel (15). The Collector of Bijapur reports that the octroi system worked satisfactorily in all municipalities except Bagalkot where refund work is heavy. The President of this Municipality is of opinion that the octroi rules are defective inasmuch as the system of allowing agents to receive refunds encourages fraud as there is no provision for Naka karkuns—to satisfy themselves as to the identification of goods for which refunds are claimed. The Collector is asking the Municipality to consider the revision of the rules at an early date. In Sind, the joint octroi system for the cantonment and municipal areas in force in Hyderabad for the last ten years came to an end on 31st March 1921. The terms of a fresh contract for the decade commencing from 1st April 1921 have been settled and under it the Cantonment Authorities are to receive Rs. 12,000 per annum as against Rs. 7,500 per annum in the preceding decade.

In the Northern Division as many as 21 municipalities out of 29 now levy the terminal tax. In the Bombay Suburban Division Bandra alone levies the tax. In the Central Division only eight municipalities, *viz.*, Ahmednagar, Jalgaon, Raver, Dharangaon, Amalner, Chalisgaon, Dhulia and Nandgaon levy the tax. (In the Southern Division the tax is in force in 8 municipalities, *viz.*, Dharwar, Hubli, Kumta, Roha, Malvan, Vengurla, Ranebennur and Haveri. The excess of the terminal tax receipts over the octroi receipts in the Hubli and Dharwar Municipalities is again noticeable, there being an increase of Rs. 10,000 and Rs. 12,000, respectively. The Collector was asked to examine the accounts of the tax and to report what percentage of the increase was really due to development of trade. The result of the Collector's inquiry is awaited.) In Sind, the terminal tax system already in force in the Karachi, Keti-Bandar, Sukkur, Shikarpur, Garhi-Yasin, Ghotki, Larkana, Mirpurkhas, Umarnot and Jacobabad Municipalities was introduced in the Kotri and Kambar Municipalities.

15. *Expenditure.*—The total expenditure of the municipalities during the year under report was Rs. 260 lakhs as against Rs. 240 lakhs in the preceding year. Excluding the item of "Extraordinary and Debt" the

expenditure amounted to Rs. 192½ lakhs as against Rs. 175½ lakhs. The increase in the ordinary expenditure was therefore Rs. 17½ lakhs. The following table indicates the fluctuations under the principal heads of expenditure:—

16. *Public Health and Convenience.*—There were increases of Rs. 4,49,000, Rs. 92,000, Rs. 31,000 and Rs. 5,73,000 under this head in the Northern, Central, and Southern Divisions and in Sind, respectively. The Bombay Suburban Division showed a decrease of Rs. 24,000.

17. *Water Supply.*—In the Northern Division the expenditure under “capital outlay” showed a considerable increase of Rs. 3,80,000 and that under “Establishment and repairs” also increased by Rs. 48,000, for which the Municipalities of Ahmedabad, Surat and Thana are chiefly responsible. The increase of Rs. 3,59,000 shown against the Ahmedabad Municipality under the head “Capital Outlay” is due to the fact that the Ahmedabad Municipality paid an amount of Rs. 2,70,000 to Government on account of the cost of the new engine and had to incur increased expenditure for laying new water pipes in outlying areas and for sinking new wells. The increase of Rs. 48,000 under “Establishment, repairs, etc.”, is explained by the fact that the outstanding adjustments of previous years were brought to account during 1923-24. At Surat the increase of Rs. 20,000 under “Capital Outlay” is due to the laying of new pipes in the bed of the river and the decrease of Rs. 16,000 under “Establishment, repairs, etc.”, is on account of the smaller expenditure on repairs. The Thana Municipality’s increase of Rs. 11,000 under “Establishment, repairs, etc.”, was due to the enhanced rate charged by the Bombay Municipality for the water supplied from the Tansa Mains during the hot weather. In the Central Division all the districts except Ahmednagar, West Khandesh and Poona showed an increase under “Water Supply”. The heaviest increase (Rs. 35,000) occurred in the Nasik District and was due to the adjustment of accounts relating to the Sinhastha period and to the construction of a new bandhara by the Yeola Municipality. The increase was also due to the expenditure incurred on repairs to new engines by the Nasik Municipality and to the sinking of a well for Mahomedans by the Malegaon Municipality. In East Khandesh the Jalgaon Municipality was alone responsible for the increase of Rs. 10,000 due to laying a 6" pipe in place of a 4" pipe and extending the new well in the Meherun Tank. The Dharangaon Municipality deepened a tank and incurred an expenditure of Rs. 1,000. The Sholapur District showed an increase of Rs. 17,000, for which the Sholapur Municipality was mainly responsible as that body purchased and laid new pipes during the year; money was also spent on chlorination. In the Southern Division the expenditure under “Capital Outlay” increased by Rs. 11,000 and that under “Establishment, repairs, etc.”, by Rs. 12,000. The increase under the former was partly due to a larger expenditure (Rs. 10,000 against Rs. 2,000) incurred by Matheran on the renewal of a sluice gate and certain other works of Lake

Charlotte which had been washed away in the last monsoon and partly to the purchase of more iron pipes for private connections in Nipani and Hubli. Matheran also incurred an expenditure of Rs. 1,000 in connection with experiments carried out by a water diviner for sinking wells on the Hill. The increase under "Establishment, repairs, etc.", is accounted for by (1) Rs. 18,000 spent by Roha on special repairs to its water works, (2) Rs. 7,000 on account of the working of the Dharwar Water Works during the whole year as against only 9 months last year, (3) Rs. 3,000 incurred by the Gokarn Municipality on special repairs to the Kotitirtha Tank and (4) Rs. 2,000 in Athni owing to special efforts made by the Municipality to meet water scarcity. This increase was, however, counterbalanced by a decrease of (1) Rs. 14,000 in Bijapur owing to the fact that last year Rs. 21,000 were paid to the Public Works Department on account of arrears of maintenance charges of Bhutnal Water Works; and (2) of Rs. 7,000 in Hubli due to curtailment of hours of water supply. In Sind the increase of Rs. 2,39,000 under "Capital Outlay" was almost wholly contributed by the Karachi Municipality, where it amounted to Rs. 3,73,000 and was due to the expenditure on the new conduit at Karachi and the laying of water mains in Clifton and Frere Town Quarters and on the Atmaram (Trans Lyari Quarter) and Ghizni Roads. On the other hand, there was a decrease of Rs. 1,32,000 in the Hyderabad Municipality due to non-recoupment of certain advances to the Public Works Department on account of the water Works Improvement Scheme. Under "Establishment, repairs, etc.", Karachi showed increases of Rs. 33,000 and Rs. 14,500, respectively. In Karachi the enhanced expenditure was incurred on account of pumping at Dumlotte and payment of arrears of the revised pay of the staff. At Sukkur it was due to the payment of a higher price for fuel, larger consumption of fuel owing to the installation of large and improved engines and heavier repairs. There were increases of Rs. 8,000, Rs. 3,000, Rs. 1,000 and Rs. 1,500 in Hyderabad, Shikarpur, Kambar and Jacobabad, respectively, which were due to clearance and repairs of wells, extension of and repairs to bathing ghats, etc.

18. *Financial working of water supply installations.*—In the Northern Division the income of the Ahmedabad Municipality from water rates increased from Rs. 7,63,268 to Rs. 10,32,537, of which Rs. 5,07,342 against Rs. 3,77,575 in the previous year was derived from the direct sale of water and Rs. 5,25,195 against Rs. 3,95,693 from the general water rate. The total expenditure including Rs. 26,002 as interest on loans, Rs. 19,216 on sinking fund instalment and Rs. 12,000 for depreciation charges amounted to Rs. 2,76,040 against Rs. 2,37,652 in the preceding year. The Surat Municipality has been represented to have made a profit of Rs. 2,649 during the year against the loss of Rs. 21,814 during the preceding year but this year again the situation seems to be rather apparent than real as the Municipality's expenditure on capital outlay was much greater than in the previous year (Rs. 57,078 against Rs. 37,546). The Thana Municipality realized a profit of Rs. 6,845 which yielded a percentage of 4.3 against 14.96 in the preceding year on the capital outlay of Rs. 1,22,025 with an expenditure of Rs. 19,949. The abnormal fall in profits was due to the fact that the Municipality had on account of the scarcity of water to incur expenditure of Rs. 12,305 for the purchase of Tansa water against Rs. 3,727 in the previous year. The Bhiwandi Municipality realized a profit of Rs. 1,824, *i.e.*, 3.7 on the capital outlay of Rs. 44,436 with an income of Rs. 2,522 and expenditure of Rs. 698.

In the Bombay Suburban Division none of the Municipalities own independent water systems. Bandra and Kurla get their supplies from the Bombay municipal mains. They buy water at 8 annas per 1,000 gallons and sell, Bandra at 12 annas and Kurla at 1 rupee. These Municipalities reap a small profit on the cost of distribution.

In the Central Division the Ahmednagar, Jalgaon and Dhulia Water Works showed a profit. Of these Dhulia had no Government loans to repay while Ahmednagar could only repay Rs. 25,000 out of the Pimpalgaon

Water Works loan and a sum of Rs. 1,000 on account of interest. The financial position of the Jalgaon Municipal Water Works is sound and the Municipality has now repaid all the sums due to Government. The Nasik Municipality has still got to pay a considerable balance to Government while it is running its water works at a loss.

In the Southern Division the total revenue from the water works at Bijapur amounted to Rs. 35,988 and the expenditure to Rs. 60,017 of which Rs. 15,088 was the instalment of the loan. The handing over of the management of the storage reservoir and the rising main to the Municipality resulted in a complete transfer of the control of the water works to the Municipality which promises to bring down the expenditure under this head without impairing efficiency. The expenses of management already show a considerable reduction, though the services have been extended. The Municipality have now under consideration the question of making the works really efficient by remodelling the distribution system so as to provide water all over the municipal area and for industrial purposes near the railway station. (In Dharwar and Hubli the income from water works was Rs. 36,221 and Rs. 43,212 and the expenditure Rs. 41,890 and Rs. 33,473, respectively.) Both the Alibag and Roha Ashtami installations worked at a loss. The Alibag Works have been in disrepair for a long time, the Municipality not having sufficient funds to put them in order. No revenue was consequently derived and the maintenance expenses of Rs. 296 was a net loss. The Roha Works fetched an income of Rs. 3,001 and cost Rs. 19,539, of which about Rs. 18,000 were spent on special repairs. Panvel and Pen worked at a profit; the water rate in these municipalities yielded Rs. 4,721 and Rs. 2,522, respectively, and the working expenses amounted to Rs. 1,451 and Rs. 1,679, respectively.

In Sind, the water supply accounts of the Hyderabad Municipality showed a total revenue of Rs. 1,43,000 and an expenditure of Rs. 1,06,000, leaving a closing balance of Rs. 37,000. In the Sukkur Municipality a sum of Rs. 14,900 only was derived from the direct sale of water, while the expenditure amounted to Rs. 56,700.

19. *Drainage*.—The only municipality in the Northern Division which possesses a drainage system is Ahmedabad. The expenditure showed a considerable decrease of Rs. 1,35,000 under "Capital Outlay" and of Rs. 7,500 under "Establishment, repairs, etc.". The Central Division showed a small decrease of Rs. 5,000 under "Drainage". (In the Southern Division the Dharwar District was responsible for a decrease of Rs. 12,000 (Rs. 7,000 under "Capital Outlay" and Rs. 5,000 under "Establishment, repairs, etc."), owing to less expenditure on repairs and construction of new gutters in Hubli. Bagalkot showed an increase of Rs. 4,000 due to the construction of new gutters and the widening and repairs of drains. In Sind there was a net increase of Rs. 93,000 under "Capital Outlay", of which Rs. 75,000 and Rs. 13,000 were contributed by Karachi and Hyderabad respectively.) In Karachi the increase was due to the laying of a 24" discharge main along Napier Road to River Road and purchase of a new plant for the compressor and in Hyderabad to the construction of new drains. Hala and Sukkur also showed increases of Rs. 2,000 and Rs. 4,000, respectively, on the same account.

20. *Conservancy*.—The total expenditure under this head which during the year under report amounted to Rs. 29,97,000 exceeded that of the previous year by Rs. 1,56,000. This increase is generally attributable to improved equipment, construction and repairs of latrines, payment of increased salaries and allowances to the conservancy staff and the high cost of bullocks maintained for the purpose of conservancy. The Northern, the Bombay Suburban and the Central Divisions and Sind contributed Rs. 68,000, Rs. 11,000, Rs. 37,000 and Rs. 43,000, respectively. The Southern Division showed a slight decrease of Rs. 3,000. In the Northern Division the increase under this head, which is mainly shared by the Municipalities of Ahmedabad, Viramgam, Borsad, Godhra, Surat and Thana, is counter-balanced by the decrease shown by Anand and Broach. The chief items of

expenditure in Ahmedabad which involved an excess expenditure of Rs. 45,000 are the storm water drains, purchase of motor lorries and the overhead tanks on the Shahi Bagh road. In the Central Division all districts except Nasik contributed to the increase of Rs. 37,000 under "Conservancy". The heaviest increase was in the Poona District for which no explanation has been given. For almost the whole of the increase of Rs. 43,000 in Sind under this head Karachi was responsible. It was due to the payment of the revised pay of sweepers for the full year instead of only a few months in the preceding year and revision of the pay of Inspectors, etc.

21. *Road expenditure and appropriation of wheel tax and road tolls for that purpose.*—The expenditure incurred under this head amounted to Rs. 15,57,000 against Rs. 18,45,000 in the previous year, showing a decrease of Rs. 2,88,000, for the largest share of which Sind (Rs. 2,27,000) alone was responsible. The Bombay Suburban, the Central and the Southern Divisions also contributed Rs. 16,000, Rs. 64,000, and Rs. 10,000, respectively, to the general decrease. Only the Northern Division showed an increase of Rs. 32,000 towards which the Municipalities of Viramgam, Anand, Nadiad, Godhra, Surat and Bhiwandi contributed. The Rander Municipality spent about Rs. 5,000 less than in the preceding year. At Anand a new road was constructed in the Bazar. In Godhra special repairs were done to the roads which were in a very bad condition. In Surat large amounts were spent in metalling the roads and a new road between Pagathia street and Hinglokwa street was constructed. Although the Bhiwandi Municipality has spent more than last year on roads it has not fully utilized all its receipts from wheel tax and tolls. In the case of Dholka, Modasa, Dhandhuka, Rander and Bulsar the default is considerable. In the Bombay Suburban Division, Bandra spent Rs. 5,678 less as metal from the Development Department did not arrive in time and Kurla spent Rs. 11,270 less as their contractors failed to supply the materials required.

In the Central Division, Sangamner and Vambori in the Ahmednagar District, Yawal, Parola and Chalisgaon in East Khandesh, Nandurbar, Shahada and Taloda in West Khandesh, all the municipalities in the Nasik District except Igatpuri, the Municipalities of Saswad, Jejuri, Indapur, Alandi and Junnar in the Poona District, all the municipalities in the Satara District with the exception of Ashta, Malcolmpeth, Panchgani, Rahimatpur, Satara Suburban and Wai and all the municipalities in the Sholapur District with the exception of Sholapur spent smaller amounts on roads than their receipts from wheel tax and road tolls.

In the Southern Division fewer repairs and lower rates for materials resulted in a decrease of Rs. 14,000 in the Dharwar District, Gadag-Bettigeri alone being responsible for nearly the whole of it. The Bijapur District contributed a decrease of Rs. 6,000. The Kanara, Belgaum and Ratnagiri districts showed increases of Rs. 5,000, Rs. 1,000 and Rs. 3,000, respectively, on account of repairs to roads. The Mahad Municipality in Kolaba was the principal defaulter in respect of the rule that the whole of the proceeds of wheel tax and road tolls should be expended on maintenance of roads. The Municipality pleads that it is not in a position to comply with the rule until the income from other sources is increased and proposes to effect this increase by substituting a terminal tax for its octroi. But the Collector has pointed out to the Municipality that a terminal tax should not ordinarily exceed in income the octroi it supersedes. In view, however, of its habitual misapplication of the funds, the Commissioner has called upon the Municipality to show cause why the levy of these taxes should not be cancelled. All other Municipalities except Saundatti-Yellamma have either spent all the receipts on roads or funded the balance separately.

In Sind there was a very large decrease of over 2 lakhs in Karachi owing to reduced expenditure on the construction of new roads and the acquisition of land. There were decreases also aggregating Rs. 68,000 in the Municipalities of Tando Allahyar, Sukkur, Shikarpur and Larkana. On the other hand, Hyderabad, Garhi Yasin, Rohri, Shahadadpur, and

Mirpurkhas showed increases amounting to Rs. 45,000 on account of enhanced expenditure on the construction of footpaths, improvements to inclines, new roads, acquisition of land for widening streets, etc. The Garhi Yasin, Rohri and Ghotki Municipalities in the Sukkur District and the Larkana, Kambar and Rato Dero Municipalities in the Larkana District did not spend fully the income which accrued during the year from the levy of wheel tax and road tolls. While the municipalities of the Sukkur District have credited the balances to a special fund for future expenditure on the construction and maintenance of roads, it has not been stated whether the municipalities of the Larkana District have done the same. The Collector is being asked to report whether this has been done or not and, if not, to call upon the municipalities concerned to carry out the policy enjoined by Government. The Commissioners should be requested to bring to the notice of the defaulting municipalities the obligation to spend the whole proceeds of the wheel tax and road tolls on roads only and they should be warned that failure on their part to comply with repeated instructions on this subject will be met with drastic action.

Section 91-A of the Bombay District Municipal Act, 1901, as amended by Bombay Act, VIII of 1914, imposes upon municipalities the duty of prescribing a regular line for the boundaries of public streets. In the Central Division the Collector of Ahmednagar reports that action under section 91-A is being taken by all municipalities. None of the municipalities in the Districts of Poona, East Khandesh, and West Khandesh, except Dhulia, took any action in prescribing regular lines of public streets. At Dhulia the work of prescribing a regular line of streets was completed and a sub-committee was appointed to consider cases where any modifications are necessary. In the Nasik District the only municipalities that took action under the section were Nasik and Nandgaon. Nasik fixed a regular line for two streets and Nandgaon spent about Rs. 200 in measuring two main roads. In the Satara District, the Satara Suburban, Mahableshwar, Wai and Satara City Municipalities have laid out regular lines of public streets. The Panchgani Municipality has prescribed lines in respect of the areas covered by Town Planning Schemes nos. I and II. The Islampur Municipality has taken this work in hand. The Presidents of other municipalities have reported that the question is receiving the attention of their boards. In Sholapur new regular lines of five streets were fixed by the Sholapur Municipality only. In the Southern Division Nipani and Bijapur are awaiting the completion of the City survey maps which have been sent to the Photozinc office. A regular line was prescribed in 22 streets in Bagalkot and set backs were enforced. Hubli fixed regular lines on some roads and Gadag-Bettigeri on seven. Ranabennur has completed the alignment work and acquired some land for widening the roads. No action could be taken by Sirsi owing to the untimely resignation of the Chief Officer. It has now appointed a qualified man and proposes to take up the work when he joins. In Kolaba, Matheran was the only Municipality that followed a definite policy. Action in other places is pending completion of the city survey operations. In Sind, the fact that most of the municipal towns are not surveyed prevents compliance with the provisions of section 91-A. In Karachi and Hyderabad re-survey has been completed. No regular lines were prescribed in Karachi during the year under report but at Hyderabad this was done in the case of 33 streets.

No information on the subject has been furnished by the Commissioner, Northern Division, and the Commissioner, Bombay Suburban Division, whose attention should be invited to this omission.

22. *Public Instruction.*—The total expenditure under this head amounted to Rs. 40,83,000 as against Rs. 36,58,000 in the preceding year, thus showing a considerable increase of Rs. 4,25,000 which was contributed by all the Divisions and Sind. The largest increases occurred in the Northern Division (Rs. 1,91,000) and Sind (Rs. 1,56,000). The Southern Division contributed Rs. 69,000. In the Northern Division there was a

rise of Rs. 1,22,000 in Ahmedabad, which contributed Rs. 1 lakh towards the construction of schools. The Kapadvanj Municipality has undertaken the construction of buildings for primary schools. At Broach and Thana the increase is attributed to the payment of teachers at renewed rates of pay and at Kalyan it is on account of the Municipality's attaching English classes to primary schools and the purchase of furniture on that account. The Central Division showed an increase of Rs. 7,500, which was shared by the Districts of Ahmednagar and East and West Khandesh. In West Khandesh heavy increase occurred in the Dhulia Municipality, and was due to the (1) opening of 14 new schools under the free and compulsory education scheme and the additional staff maintained for the same, (2) payment of the amount of pension contribution for two years and (3) payment of probable cost of acquisition of land for a playground of school No. 9. In Ahmednagar and East Khandesh the increase was generally due to the payment to teachers of increased pay according to the revised scale. In the Southern Division there were increases of Rs. 26,000, Rs. 14,000 and Rs. 30,000 in the Districts of Belgaum, Bijapur, and Dharwar, respectively. The increased expenditure is mainly attributable to the payment of pension contribution on account of primary school teachers and the revision of their pay. Nipani opened an English High School and Bailhongal took over from the District Local Board the management of all the primary schools. The following municipalities have introduced free primary education.

Guledgud and Bailhongal have also introduced free primary education but the effects on attendance in these two towns have not been reported. In Sind, Karachi incurred an increase of Rs. 1,00,000 under this head on account of the opening of 20 new schools and the construction of a building for the Gujarati School in the Ramswami quarter, and Hyderabad, Rs. 18,000 on account of the grant of annual increments to teachers, purchase of furniture and construction of a new building. Karachi also paid (1) a contribution of Rs. 9,000 to N. E. D. Civil Engineering College and (2) additional contributions to Schools. Tando Allahyar and Shikarpur showed increases of Rs. 8,500 and 7,000, respectively, on account of the revision of pay of the establishment and construction of two rooms for the school-house in the former municipality and the grant of Sind allowance and increased pay to teachers in the latter. Sukkur and Jacobabad were each responsible for an increase of Rs. 4,500 due to the construction of peons' quarters and appointment of a graduate headmaster and additional trained teachers. Jacobabad also purchased science apparatus consequent on the opening of

the VII standard. The increases and decreases in other municipalities do not call for any remarks.

23. *Closing balances.*—The year's working resulted in an increase of Rs. 31,00,000 in the total closing balance. Of this amount Sind alone contributed Rs. 24,83,000 and the Northern, Bombay Suburban, Central and Southern Divisions contributed Rs. 98,000, Rs. 11,000, Rs. 3,16,000 and Rs. 1,72,000, respectively. The aggregate closing balance of the municipalities amounted to Rs. 1,17,87,000 as against Rs. 87,26,000 in the preceding year. In Sind, the total income rose by Rs. 16,53,000 and the total expenditure by Rs. 3,59,000. The actual balance excluding deposits amounted to Rs. 87,50,000 of which Rs. 70,46,000 represent the closing balance of the Karachi Municipality.

24. *Audit of Accounts.*—The Accountant General's Local Audit Department audited the accounts of all the municipalities in the Presidency including Sind during the year under review, with the exception of Karmala. These audits have proved very useful in pointing out irregularities in the accounts of municipalities. In the Central Division a fraud in the Chopda Municipality was detected in regard to a sum of Rs. 11 in the collection of taxes for the year 1917-18. The clerk concerned was prosecuted but acquitted. In Taloda serious irregularities including temporary misappropriation were pointed out and the President was asked to take immediate steps for remedying them. The affairs of the Sindkheda Municipality are in a chaotic condition and the attention of the Mamlatdar, who is a member on the Board, has been specially drawn to this matter. In the Nandgaon Municipality 12 cases of misappropriation and irregular account procedure were detected. The unsatisfactory state of affairs was chiefly due to the inefficiency of the late President who failed to perform even his statutory duties. The Municipality was declared by Government to be incompetent and ordered to be superseded for a period of six months by Government Resolution no. 5799, dated the 19th November 1924. The question of illegal utilization of the advance grant made by Government to the Parola Municipality for the construction of the Urdu Boys' School having been referred to Government, the Municipality was called upon to get the building completed before the end of March 1925 and that body was warned that in case of failure Government would be constrained to require it to refund the whole of the Government grant received by it. In the Southern Division, the collecting Karkun in Gadag-Bettigeri, who misappropriated a sum of Rs. 241 in 1920, is still reported to be absconding. The audit note for 1921-22 for this Municipality discloses a number of frauds committed by Nakedars which has been attributed to lack of supervision on the part of octroi inspectors. The Collector has impressed upon the President the imperative need of greater vigilance and better supervision on the part of the inspectors and the Chief Officer. The Navalgund defalcation case has ended in the conviction of the Secretary who has been sentenced to rigorous imprisonment aggregating two years and three months and a fine of Rs. 1,500. The accounts in Athni were found in a mess, but the President has since evolved some order out of the chaos. Vengurla got itself into a complete tangle over its house tax list and the Collector is in consultation with the Government Pleader over the legal position. In Sind no serious irregularities were brought to light.

25. *Grants for sanitary and town improvement schemes.*—As usual a wholesome and plentiful water supply, efficient drainage, the opening up of congested and insanitary localities, good roads, hygienic school buildings with adequate play-grounds, improved conservancy arrangements, municipal office buildings, dispensary buildings, markets, slaughter houses, etc., are reported to be the pressing and general needs of the municipalities, most of which suffer from want of funds. For this the municipalities have primarily themselves to blame owing to their unwillingness to impose adequate taxation. Government have hitherto, so far as the state of their finances permitted, assisted these bodies towards the attainment of the

more important desiderata by granting loans and liberal grants-in-aid from time to time. The principal grants made during the year were:—

PART II.

REMARKS REGARDING THE PRINCIPAL MUNICIPALITIES.

26. *Ahmedabad*.—The Committee of Management, which superseded the Municipality, worked until the 9th February 1924, when the Municipality was re-constituted. It now consists of 60 councillors, 48 elected and 12 nominated. The Committee of Management did valuable work during its period of office and in spite of many difficulties discharged its task with a genuine desire to do the best for the city. The revenue from "Rates and Taxes" rose from Rs. 19,94,996 in the preceding year to Rs. 21,43,878 in the current year and it is gratifying to note that the financial condition of the Municipality showed a steady growth of revenue from *direct* taxation which increased during the year under report to Rs. 15 lakhs from Rs. 8½ lakhs in 1920-21. Out of a demand of Rs. 15,20,158 the Municipality recovered Rs. 12,89,791, the amount remitted during the year being Rs. 62,853. The outstanding balance on the 31st March 1924 was Rs. 1,67,513. The ratio of collection to the total demand was 88·5 as against 87·51 during the previous year.

Surat.—The Committee of Management during the temporary supersession of the Municipality has worked with much zeal and success. They were hampered by many and various difficulties such as the campaign of

non-payment of taxes; nevertheless, its output of work and service is reported to be excellent. The Committee since it took charge—

- (1) completely revised all Rules and Bye-laws;
- (2) completely re-organised the establishment;
- (3) revised taxation so as to assure an increased revenue of about 1½ lakhs;
- (4) completely overhauled the water-works head works as they stand;
- (5) arranged for the extension of electric street lighting;
- (6) brought up the school attendance in municipal school from 1,900 to over 5,000;
- (7) made a beginning with the improvement of main road and street surfaces;
- (8) arranged for proper road access to Varachha Water Works and to the Night Soil Depôt;
- (9) provided a motor fire engine;
- (10) made better arrangements for keeping the kachha road drainage system of the town in working order during the rains;
- (11) made arrangements for the supply of road materials at reduced rates which should save about Rs. 10,000 a year or allow of 20 to 25 per cent. additional work being done annually.

Poona.—On the administration report for 1922-23 Government remarked that the financial condition of the Municipality was not sound and asked the Commissioner to call upon the Municipality to submit their proposals for increased taxation without further delay. After a good deal of correspondence the President made it clear that additional taxation could not be passed during the term of the existing Board, which expired in March 1925. This was reported to Government who have directed that the question should be put before the new Board as early as possible. The proposals of the new Board on the subject are awaited. Progress has been made with the Poona Drainage Improvement Scheme. It has been decided to take up the scheme in stages and orders providing funds for the work have been already issued by Government.

Karachi.—The administration of the Karachi Municipality continues on the whole to be progressive and generally efficient under the able presidency of Mr. Jamshed N. R. Mehta, and the financial condition of the Municipality is sound, as evidenced by the readiness with which the loan of Rs. 30 lakhs in connection with the Water Works Improvement Scheme was subscribed by the public. The Municipality has made primary education wholly free, a step which has been accompanied by the opening of 21 new schools. They have also paid special attention to the provision of medical relief, three new dispensaries having been established, one exclusively for women. The question of the improvement of the water supply has also been seriously tackled, and the first part of the general scheme, which comprises the construction of a duplicate and larger conduit, is in process of execution.

Hyderabad.—The Commissioner in Sind observes that the administration of the Municipality during the year has been distinctly commendable in point of efficiency and progressiveness, a fact which is very largely due to the ability, energy and tact of its Chief Officer, Mr. Daulatram Bulchand. The financial position of the Municipality is sound, and the closing balance has been increased as a result of the year's working by nearly half a lakh. The Municipality is reported to have also a reserve fund of Rs. 7½ lakhs, which is intended exclusively for expenditure on remunerative works. As regards the question of congestion in the City, Government have approved the proposal for the development of vacant sites within the City and to the south of the railway line. They have also approved the suggestion that the Consulting Surveyor should make further investigations in direct consultation with the Civil, Military and Municipal Authorities concerned. The Consulting Surveyor's report has been received and is at present under the consideration of Government.

PART III.

GENERAL REMARKS.

29. Government note with satisfaction that the year under report was on the whole one of fair progress so far as the general administration of municipalities in the Presidency, including Sind, is concerned. The net income of the Municipalities which was Rs. 1,95 lakhs, exceeded the previous year's income by about Rs. 15 lakhs. The ordinary expenditure, which amounted to Rs. 192½ lakhs, was also in excess of the previous year's expenditure by Rs. 17½ lakhs and was, generally speaking, equitably distributed in satisfaction of the various public requirements. Cases, however, of maladministration are noticeable in certain municipalities as will be evident from the recent dissolution of the Kurla Municipality and supersession of the Nandgaon Municipality. In the opinion of Government, this state of affairs is due to the want of proper control on the part of the Presidents and Vice-Presidents who not infrequently are unable to realize their own responsibility and to exercise proper control over their subordinates. The existence of parties and factions among municipal councillors is another unfortunate feature and the spirit engendered by these often vitiates and hampers municipal administration. A third regrettable feature is the contumacy on the part of the Councillors themselves in the payment of their taxes in view of which the heavy arrears of municipal dues are not surprising. For the recovery of these arrears, increased vigilance on the part of the collecting staff and a freer use of coercive processes and penalties are the most effective remedies. The reluctance on the part of municipal bodies to enhance taxation, particularly direct taxation, still continues to retard progress. The tendency to seek salvation along the line of least resistance by concentrating on indirect taxation is still strong as will be evident from the fact that the direct taxation during the year under report yielded only 55·8 per cent., *i.e.*, a little over one half of the total income from municipal taxes and rates. The conservancy services are still partly supported from general revenues. The unsatisfactory financial position of many of the municipalities—verging on actual bankruptcy in some cases—and their inability to provide even for their irreducible current necessities are the natural result of this state of things. Government hope that this unsatisfactory position is but a passing phase and that members of municipalities will commence to realize more fully, their corporate duty and responsibility, without which no proper administration is possible.

THE PROGRESS OF MAHOMEDAN EDUCATION.

Northern Division.—In the Ahmedabad District Dholka, Viramgam, Prantij, Modasa, Dhandhuka and Ranpur maintain Urdu schools. At Prantij and Dhandhuka these schools have girls' classes attached to them and at Ranpur there is a separate Urdu school for girls. At Viramgam Mahomedan education is making sound and steady progress. The Municipality has engaged one Arabic-knowing teacher who imparts lessons in Koran-e-Sharif. At Modasa the Urdu school is made free. The Ranpur Municipality spent Rs. 3,300 on Mahomedan education during the year. In the Kaira District, except Dakor, each Municipality has at least one Urdu school. The Umreth Municipality opened a class for girls and made the post of the temporarily appointed Mulla permanent. The attendance of Mahomedan boys and girls at Umreth and Kapadvanj is reported to be satisfactory. The President of the Kaira Municipality states that the Urdu schools are not working satisfactorily and that so far no students from these schools have come forward to take advantage of higher education. He proposes to amalgamate the schools with the vernacular schools and to keep a separate class for Urdu training. At Godhra there are 3 primary schools—2 for boys and 1 for girls—and education is made free. Besides these schools, there are a number of private schools in the town where only religious teaching is imparted. At Dohad there are two primary schools—one for boys and one for girls. The Municipality spent Rs. 5,378 on these schools against Rs. 4,386 in the preceding year. No marked progress in Mahomedan education was noticeable in the Broach District during the year. At Thana there is a municipal Urdu school for boys and girls, but the attendance is poor as parents prefer to send their children to a private Urdu School where religious instruction is also imparted. Owing to the inability of the Municipality to provide such facility no material improvement in the number of Mahomedan pupils attending their school is possible. In Kalyan there is only one municipal Urdu school and all other private schools are closed. The municipal school is in a fairly prosperous condition. The Bassein Municipality maintains 3 Urdu schools teaching the first three standards. In Bhiwndi there are 5 Urdu schools—2 for boys, 2 for girls and 1 night school for boys. The Bhiwndi Municipality is reported to have made good progress in this respect under a Mahomedan President.

Bombay Suburban Division.—Only two municipalities out of four in this Division, *viz.*, Bandra and Kurla, maintained Urdu schools. The former had 2 schools for boys and 2 for girls, and the latter, three schools for boys only. In Bandra the average attendance of boys decreased from 196 to 90 and of girls from 110 to 42. This follows a fall from 308 to 196 and 115 to 110 in the previous year and the Commissioner has asked the President to re-examine and explain these somewhat startling figures. In Kurla the attendance of boys increased from 156 to 160 and of girls from 76 to 101. In Ghatkopar and Juhu the Mahomedan population is very small and hence there is little possibility of Urdu schools being opened in the near future.

Central Division.—The Collector of Ahmednagar reports that Mahomedan education has progressed in all the municipalities. In East Khandesh all municipalities maintained Urdu schools for boys and girls. In West Khandesh the Dhulia Municipality maintained 7 Urdu schools—3 for boys and 4 for girls. Owing to the increase in attendance of pupils additional assistant teachers were appointed by the Municipality. Besides, there are some schools conducted by the local Anjuman-i-Islam Institutions of the community. The state of the Urdu Girls' school at Nandurbar and the Urdu schools at Sindkheda and Taloda is unsatisfactory. The Urdu school at Betawad is reported to be improving and the Municipality has taken steps to appoint a new second year Urdu trained master in the place of a first year trained man. In the Nasik District the municipalities of Nasik, Yeola, Malegaon, Sinnar, Igatpuri and Nandgaon maintain Urdu schools. Although four-fifths of the population of Malegaon consists of Mahomedans, the majority of them are weavers and illiterate and are reluctant to send their boys to school as the daily earnings of a boy supplement to some extent the income of the family. The progress of the school at Sinnar is unsatisfactory. The question of the Urdu Girls' school at Igatpuri could not be settled owing to the difficulty of finding a Mahomedan lady teacher. The Poona City Municipality maintained 9 Urdu day schools—5 for boys and 4 for girls. The English class attached to the Urdu full primary school showed good progress during the year. The Baramati Municipality continues to maintain the special Urdu school for boys and girls. The Poona Suburban and Lonavla municipalities have Urdu classes attached to their vernacular schools. In the Satara District the municipalities of Islampur, Karad and Satara City have maintained separate Urdu schools. The Ashta Municipality has lately opened such a school while the Mhaswad Municipality closed its Urdu schools for want of pupils. In the Sholapur District, the Sholapur Municipality has 6 Urdu schools, Barsi has two and Karmala and Pandharpur, one each. Scholarships amounting to Rs. 23 are given by the Sholapur Municipality in Urdu schools. Sangola has no separate Urdu school. There are only 30 Mahomedan boys in the Municipal Marathi school. Of these 4 get free-studentships.

Southern Division.—In the Belgaum District there were two Urdu schools for boys and 2 for girls, the number of pupils being 252 boys and 195 girls. Athni had 1 school for boys with 144 pupils and 1 for girls with 65 pupils. Nipani, Gokak and Saundatti-Yellamma had each one Urdu school, the total number of pupils attending them being 299 boys and 42 girls. Six boys were sent up for the Vernacular School Final Examination and 4 came off successful. Bijapur maintained 8 Urdu schools including 2 classes. Bagalkot and Guledgud maintained, respectively, 3 and 2 schools and Ilkal, 1. The average attendance at each of these schools was 86. In Dharwar there were 6 Mahomedan schools—3 for boys and 3 for girls—and in Hubli 8—5 for boys and 3 for girls. A night school was also maintained at Hubli by the Anjuman-i-Islam with free studentships for poor students. The Anjuman has also started a Mahomedan library to which the Municipality contributed Rs. 150 annually. Gadag and Ranabennur have two Urdu schools each and Navalgund, Byadgi and Haveri, one each. In Kanara the number of schools (seven, including one girls' school and two classes) remained unchanged. In

Karwar the average daily attendance was 75.8 and in the two schools at Kumta 31.1 and 16.3, respectively.] The total number of pupils on the rolls at Sirsi was 102 against 107, at Haliyal 87, and at Bhatkal 60. In the Kolaba District Mahad, Panvel and Pen have one school each and Roha has two. The Chiplun and Vengurla municipalities maintain no separate schools for Mahomedans but have 84 and 15 Mahomedans, respectively, on the roll. Ratnagiri has two schools, one having 56 students and the other 39, and Malvan has one with 61 students.

Sind.—In the Karachi District, the number of Mahomedan students who received instruction in municipal primary schools was 1,594 boys and 865 girls against 964 boys and 512 girls in 1922-23. The expenditure incurred by the Municipality was Rs. 98,000 against Rs. 87,000 last year. 21 new schools were opened of which 12 are mainly attended by Muslim pupils: Of these 9 are for boys and 3 for girls. Seven Mahomedan girls were educated free. The Municipality also paid grants-in-aid amounting to Rs. 12,000 to 12 Mahomedan boys' schools and 7 girls' schools as against Rs. 14,000 in the previous year. Kotri maintains 2 schools in the villages of Nango Lane and Khairpur, which are mainly attended by Mahomedans. A girls' school exists in Nango Lane Village solely for Mahomedan girls. In the Tatta Municipality the number of Mahomedan students in the English school and the vernacular school was 31 and 101, respectively. The Mahomedan boys who attended the night school numbered 13. At Keti-Bandar the number of pupils who attended the school was 39. The Mahomedan population in the town of Manjhand is one-third of the total population. The parents are generally very poor, most of them living on daily wages. The Municipality is trying its best to popularize education among them by offering many of them free admission. The proportion of the Mahomedan students to the total number of boys is 17 per cent. In the District of Hyderabad the number of Mahomedan boys and girls attending the municipal schools in Hyderabad was 430 and 137, respectively, out of a total number of 1,312 boys and 584 girls attending them. Free education has been introduced in Hyderabad, Tando-Allahyar and Matiari. The small number of Mahomedan boys receiving education in municipal schools is due in part to the existence of Mulla schools. In the Sukkur District the number of Mahomedan pupils, both boys and girls, in primary and secondary schools is on the increase on the whole. The indifference of the Mahomedans towards education is gradually diminishing and the municipalities are doing something to help the spread of education in this community by maintaining schools and boarding houses and by giving scholarships and free-studentships. The Larkana Municipality had during the year, in all its 4 schools, 785 pupils of whom 169 were Mahomedans as against 195 out of 736 boys in the year previous. There is also a Madressa-Tul-Islam with a boarding house at Larkana for Mussalmans only. It receives a donation of Rs. 300 from the Municipality and has two councillors as representatives on the Madressah Board. The Madressah is under the management of the District Local Board, Larkana, the attendance being at present 30. In the Kambar Municipality there was an increase of 5 boys in the vernacular school. Ratodero has both a vernacular and an Anglo-Vernacular school and the number of Mahomedan boys in each was 63 and 13, respectively. In the Sehwan Municipality 37 Mahomedan pupils attended the vernacular school. Of these, 15 were exempted from the payment of fees. The total number of students on the roll was 174. The Anglo-Vernacular school, which has 5 standards only, had on its rolls 112 students of whom 15 were Mahomedans, 5 being exempted from the payment of fees. In the girls' schools Mahomedans were conspicuous by their absence. At Bubak there is only one vernacular school, in which 62 Mahomedan boys received education. Of these 25 were free students. In the Nawabshahi District the number of Mahomedan boys attending the schools in Tando Adam and Shadadpur was 18 and 20, respectively. There were also 7 boys on the rolls of private schools. There is also one Mulla school at Tando Adam and one at Shadadpur, the number of boys on the rolls of these

schools being 48 and 28, respectively. There are 7 girls in the Shadadpur Mulla schools. These schools receive a grant of Rs. 100 and Rs. 50, respectively, from the municipalities. In the Thar and Parkar District the Mirpurkhas Municipality owns one primary school. Out of a total number of 151 children in the school only 25 are Mahomedans. Most of the Mahomedan boys take education at the Madressah which has also a Sindhi Branch attached to it. The Zamindars in this district are still backward in educating their children. The attendance of boys and girls in the Umarkot schools fell from 113 and 44, respectively, in the preceding year to 109 and 38 in the year under report. The decrease in the case of girls is due to the abolition of the sewing class in the girls' school, which the Municipality has again introduced from the current year. In Umarkot there was a slight increase in the attendance of the Mahomedan boys. In the Upper Sind Frontier District every effort is being made to encourage Mahomedan education. The result is that the number of Mahomedans on the roll is increasing every year. In order to encourage it further the Jacobabad Municipality has raised the number of free studentships in the Municipal High School.
