BUILDING PERMITS IN THE PRINCIPAL CITIES OF THE UNITED STATES IN 1923¹

INTRODUCTION

This is the fourth annual report concerning building permits issued in the principal cities of the United States which has been published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Immediately after January 1 the bureau mailed a questionnaire to the building inspectors of the 287 cities having a population of 25,000 or over. A large majority of these cities filled out and returned the questionnaires. To a number, however, it was necessary to send agents of the bureau who compiled the data either from records of permits issued or from the original applications for permits. The number of cities to which it was necessary to send agents was smaller this year than in any of the preceding years. Reports were finally obtained from 269 cities.

No report was obtained from 18 cities having a population of 25,000 or over. Most of these cities either do not have a building code or the one on the statute books did not require that a record of the number and cost of the different kinds of buildings be kept, as specified on the bureau's schedule. A few smaller cities are not included because they did not respond and it was impracticable to send an agent for the data. Reports were received for the first time from Elmira and Kingston, N. Y., and Lewiston, Me., new building codes having recently been adopted in these cities.

Table 1 shows the total number of new buildings and the estimated cost of each of the different kinds for which permits were issued in the 269 cities from which schedules were received for the year 1923, the per cent that each kind forms of the total number, the per cent that the estimated cost of each kind forms of the total, and the average per building.

Table 1 shows that 49.6 per cent of all the new buildings erected in cities having a population of 25,000 or over were residential buildings, and that 65.1 per cent of the money spent in the erection of new buildings was for this class of structure.

This is the first year since the bureau has been collecting these data that more permits have been issued for nonresidential buildings than for residential buildings. This is largely due to the increase in the number of private garages erected. It will be seen that 221,825 permits were granted for private garages, being 40 per cent of all the new buildings projected. Next in number are the 211,235 permits for one-family houses. In 1920, 1921, and 1922 more permits were issued for one-family houses than for any other class of buildings. While the number of permits for nonresidential buildings passed that for residential buildings, the estimated cost of the latter class was considerably in excess of that of the former. The table shows that \$2,017,547,489, or 65.1 per cent of the total estimated cost of all new construction, was spent for residential buildings compared with \$1,082,147,416, or 34.9 per cent of the total cost, for nonresidential buildings.

Thus it will be seen that the primary object of builders the past year had been to relieve the housing shortage which undoubtedly still exists in many cities of the United States.

Quite a large sum of money was spent in the erection of buildings paid for by cities, counties, or State governments, practically all of the funds for the erection of buildings shown in general Table A under the headings of Institutions, Public buildings, Public works and utilities, and Schools, Libraries, etc., being raised from public sources.

The largest amount of money estimated to have been spent for any class of nonresidential buildings was for stores and warehouses, the estimated cost of these mercantile buildings being \$192,912,895.

The last column in the table shows the average cost per building of each of the different classes of buildings for which permits were issued.

To the average reader the most interesting of these figures will be those for one-family houses and those for two-family houses. It will be noticed that the average cost of the former was \$4,173 and of the latter \$8,047. This is not a very great difference in the cost per family.

The average amount of money spent for the erection per hotel was \$447,928, costing more per building than any other class of structure.

Schools and institutions were other groups where the average cost was high, that of the former being \$160,229 and of the latter \$152,944.

It must be borne in mind that the costs given in this and other tables in this bulletin are estimated costs taken from the application for a permit to build. The estimates are made by the owner or builder when he applies for his permit and can not be regarded as absolutely accurate. Often a change in the plans after the permit has been issued necessitates a change in the amount of money spent in the erection of the building. Again a man may give an estimate which he knows to be too low because he thinks by doing so he can keep down the assessed value of his property. Another reason for low estimates in some cities is that permits are charged for according to the cost of the building. On the other hand it is charged that some builders state the valuation above the correct figure for its effect on a prospective buyer.

The total estimated cost of all classes of new buildings for which permits were issued in the 269 cities was \$3,099,694,905, the largest amount ever spent in any one year as far as any known records show. As has been stated before, the number of cities from which reports were received differed in the different years. Information was received, however, from 258 identical cities for each of the three years, 1921, 1922, and 1923.

Table 2 shows the number and per cent of families provided for by each of the different kinds of dwellings in the 258 cities from which reports were received each of these years.

The most important fact brought out by Table 2 is the large increase in the number of families provided for in 1923 as compared with either 1922 or 1921, there being 454,192 families provided with new housing accommodations in the 258 cities in 1923, contrasted with 225,138 in 1921 and 377,504 in 1922.

An illustration of how the American home is changing is shown by the fact that 58.3 per cent of the families provided for were housed in one-family dwellings in 1921. In 1922 this percentage shrank to 47.6 per cent and in 1923 to 45.8 per cent. On the other hand, the per cent of families provided for in apartment houses increased from 23.1 per cent in 1921 to 29.3 per cent in 1922 and 30.7 per cent in 1923. In other words, for every three families who found new living quarters in one-family houses two were housed in apartments. The widespread effect of this change is more apparent when one considers that this report includes cities with a population as small as 25,000. In many of the smaller of these cities, which had no apartment houses at all before the war, this class of dwelling is now being built. The percentage of two-family houses has also increased in each of the last two years.

There is a movement now, however, in many of the larger cities which partly offsets this trend toward dwellings designed for more than one family—that is, the large exodus to the suburbs. The high cost of real estate in the cities, the more prevalent use of automobiles, extended street-car lines, and better suburban schedules of railroads have caused many people to build at a considerable distance from their work, quite often outside the city limits. Undoubtedly the large majority of suburban homes are of the one-family type, but as most of them are outside the city limits they do not show in our report.

Table 3 shows the number and cost of each of the different kinds of buildings for the 258 cities from which reports were received in each of the three years—1921, 1922, and 1923—and the percentage of increase or decrease in the number and in the cost in 1923 as compared with 1921 and 1922.

The above figures show that there was an increase of 60.2 per cent in the number of permits issued for all classes of new buildings in the 258 cities in 1923 over the number in 1921 and an increase of 22.3 per cent over that of 1922. There was an increase of 95.3 per cent in the estimated cost of these buildings as compared with 1921 and of 23.4 per cent as compared with 1922.

For residential buildings the number increased 72.8 per cent in 1923 as compared with 1921 and 17.2 per cent as compared with 1922, while the estimated amount expended increased 113.5 per cent during the former period and 24.1 per cent during the latter period.

The number of nonresidential buildings increased 49.5 per cent from 1921 to 1923, and 27.7 per cent from 1922 to 1923. The estimated cost of nonresidential buildings shows an increase of 68.4 per cent in comparing 1923 with 1921 and 22.2 per cent in comparing 1922 with 1923.

EXPLANATION OF GENERAL TABLE

General Table A, pages 12 to 127, shows detailed information concerning building operations in specified cities in 1921, 1922, and 1923. This table is divided into three parts. Part 1 relates to the new residential buildings, giving the number and cost of each kind of dwelling, the number of families provided for, and the ratio of families provided for to each 10,000 of population.

It will be noted that the ratio of families provided for is based on both the population according to the 1920 census and on the estimated population for the specified year. The ratio was worked on the different bases because it was thought that many people would use the 1920 figures for each specified year since they are the latest enumerated population figures. The population figures given for 1921, 1922, and 1923 are estimates but they probably furnish a more nearly exact base for these years than the 1920 census figures furnish.

The estimates of population were made by the Census Bureau of the United States Department of Commerce. It will be noticed that for some cities no estimate was made. To obtain a total estimated population from which to work out the ratio for the entire country for the specified year, the actual population according to the 1920 census was of necessity used for these cities.

The table shows complete reports from 258 cities in 1921. These cities had a population according to the 1920 census of 36,643,576 and homes were provided in new buildings for 225,138 families, this being at the rate of 61.4 per 10,000 of population. In 1922 information was received from 266 cities having a population of 37,054,776. These cities provided new family accommodations for 380,163 families, the ratio being 102.6 to each 10,000 inhabitants. By 1923 this ratio had risen to 123.7 to each 10,000 of population in the 269 cities reporting for that year, there being 459,471 families housed in that year in these cities, which had a population of 37,158,648 according to the 1920 census.

Using instead the estimated population as published by the Census Bureau it is found that the ratio of families to each 10,000 of population was 59.7 in 1921, with 97.8 in 1922, and 115.3 in 1923.

Long Beach, Calif., continues to have the fastest rate of growth of the cities of over 25,000 population in the United States, at least as far as new homes are concerned. This city, having a population of 55,593 according to the 1920 census, has built in the last three years accommodations for over 18,000 families. In 1923 alone, 7,185 families were provided for in new buildings. This is at the remarkable ratio of 1,292.4 to each 10,000 of the city's population according to the 1920 census, or 1,038.1 according to the estimated population for 1923.

Long Beach is the only city where homes were provided for at the rate of 1 for each 10 of the city's population, but its large next-door neighbor, Los Angeles, made almost as remarkable a record. This fast-growing city provided for 43,842 families in 1923, or at the rate of 760.3 families to each 10,000 of population, according to the 1920 census, and at the rate of 657.4, according to the population as estimated for 1923.

Miami, Fla., and Irvington, N. J., were other cities that stood out as great builders of homes, the former city providing accommodations for 2,338 families in 1923 and the latter 1,313. In Miami this meant that for each 10,000 people in the city, according to the 1920 census, 790.6 families were provided with new quarters, or 611.1 families for each 10,000 persons in the city, according to the estimated population for 1923. In Irvington 515.3 families were provided for to each 10,000 of the city's inhabitants, according to the 1920 census, or 432.1, according to the population as estimated for the year 1923.

In New York City the ratio of families provided for to each 10,000 of population in 1923, according to the estimated population for that year, was 178.3. In 1921 the ratio based on the estimated population was 89.3, or only a little over half that of 1923. These figures apply only to buildings erected within the city limits. Undoubtedly the percentage increase would be even larger if records were obtained for all the residential buildings erected in the metropolitan district.

Chicago, too, provided for a greater percentage of families in 1923 than in preceding years. The ratio of families provided for to each 10,000 of the city's population was over 100 for the first time since the records have been compiled, being 124.1, based on the census of 1920, or 116.2 based on the estimated population for 1923.

A study of the table will show that the crest of residential building has been reached in some of the cities as a slight falling off is noted in a few cities, both large and small, in the number of families provided for in 1923, as compared with 1922.

Part 2 of General Table A gives the number and cost of new non-residential buildings for each city from which reports were received.

Part 3 shows the number and cost of additions, alterations, and repairs to old buildings; the number and cost of installations, and the grand total of all buildings both new and old.

The bureau attempted to classify additions, alterations, and repairs under headings of repairs, etc., for housekeeping dwellings, non-housekeeping dwellings, and nonresidential buildings. Many of the cities which reported by mail, however, grouped them. In 1921 permits were issued for 226,602 additions, alterations, and repairs in 258 cities, and \$273,439,727 was expended. In 1922 in the 266 cities reporting for that year 247,929 such permits were granted for \$286,723,251, while the 269 cities reporting in 1923 showed 272,514 permits and \$340,215,978 as the amount expended.

The number of installation permits and the construction cost was obtained whenever issued by the building inspector. In a number of cities, however, these permits were issued by offices other than that of the building inspector.

In 1923 the 269 cities covered in this report issued a grand total of 910,164 permits for new construction, repairs, and installation, \$3,471,366,667 being the estimated cost thereof.

Previous to the year 1920 the Geological Survey of the United States Department of the Interior collected and published data concerning the number and cost of buildings. The figures shown below are the total amounts of money spent in 130 identical cities from which information was obtained during the years 1914 to 1923, inclusive. From 1914 to 1919, inclusive, the figures are taken from the publications of the Geological Survey; for 1920, 1921, 1922, and 1923 from the records of the Bureau of Labor Statistics:

These figures, giving the cost of buildings as shown by building permits, can not be interpreted to indicate the relative physical amount of building construction, because the costs of both materials and labor used in such construction have varied from year to year.

The following information taken from the Monthly Labor Review for January, 1924, shows in comparison the changes in the cost of building material, building wage rates, and the cost of living, from 1913 through the war period and down to 1923. The information is presented in the form of index numbers (percentages) in which 1913 is the base year.

Wholesale prices of building material are available for each month of the period. Union wage scales are available only as of May each year. Cost-of-living figures are available as of December each year down to 1918 and later semiannually or quarterly. The table following is abridged and contains index numbers for yearly averages or for certain months.

The group of all "building materials" includes all the major articles entering into building construction. In addition to the index numbers for building material as a whole, separate index numbers are given for two of the principal articles in the group, lumber and common brick.

Union wage rates obtain so generally in the building trades that such union rates are here accepted as representative of building wages. A composite figure is given for all building trades and for two of the principal trades included therein; namely, bricklayers and carpenters.

The cost-of-living figures include family expenditures for food, clothing, housing, fuel and light, and miscellaneous items.

Quoting from monthly figures, only in part appearing in the table, wholesale prices of building material went as low as an index of 88 in November and December, 1914, and January, 1915. From that time on the trend was upward with slight recession in the fall of 1917 and in the winter of 1918-19, until in April, 1920, prices reached an index of 300. In other words, the prices in that month were, on an average, three times the prices of 1913. Lumber went higher than the group as a whole, reaching an index of 373 in March, 1920. Then came the rapid slump in prices, with building material as a whole falling to 156 in August and September, 1921. Radical but not such meteoric changes occurred in wage rates and in cost of living. Figures for every month are not available, but it is believed that the index numbers shown in the table fairly represent the changes in wages and cost of living throughout the period.

Building has been active in recent years to catch up with the loss of building construction during the war period, and there has been a strong demand and at times keen competition for building labor. Building wage rates as a whole in May, 1921, reached a rate twice that of 1913. There was a slight recession in 1922 but in May, 1923, building wages as a whole reached an index of 207 as compared with 100 in 1913, making the highest level on record. It will be observed that neither bricklayers' nor carpenters' wages got to so high an index in 1923 as the general level of all building trades. Certain other building trades advanced above the general level for all trades combined. Wages of painters, stonemasons, building laborers, and helpers for several of the different trades, had advanced beyond the level of the group as a whole, steamfitters' helpers reaching an index of 240 in 1923. Cost of living reached its peak in 1920, the index for June of that year being 217.

Tracing the movement through the period 1913 down to and including 1920, it is seen that wages did not keep up with cost of living nor with building material after 1915. In the three years since 1920 wages have held above material prices and cost of living, and building mechanics have had some chance to make up for the adverse conditions in the earlier years.

In June, 1923, building material wholesale prices stood at an index of 194, with lumber and brick, however, at 212 and 216, respectively, the difference between the index numbers for these two items and for the group as a whole being due to the greater decrease in the price of other items within the group. In the same month cost of living stood at an index of 170, and at practically the same date, May, 1923, building wages had an index of 207, with bricklayers and carpenters at 191 and 204, respectively.
