*Correspondence of the Resident and Agent, Governor-General,
North-West Frontier, Lahore, and Chief Commissioner of the
Cis and Trans Sutlej Territories, from the 1st January
1848 to the 7th April 1849.*

1. The records of which this is a Press List are contained in Books 172, 173, 190, 191, 192 and 195, and from the 6th March 1848 in Weekly Abstracts of Proceedings. As noted in Volume IX, Mr. J. Lawrence was officiating as Resident at Lahore and Agent, Governor-General, North-West Frontier, pending the arrival of Sir F. Currie, who joined at Lahore on the 6th March 1848. From that date the designation of Resident at Lahore and Agent, Governor-General, North-West Frontier, was altered to Resident at Lahore and Chief Commissioner of the Cis and Trans Sutlej Territories, which territories were transferred from the control of the Government of India to that of the Chief Commissioner.

2. The Resident corresponded as such direct with the Government of India, while his correspondence as Chief Commissioner was conducted through his Secretary, Mr. J. F. D. Inglis. Sir F. Currie continued to hold the offices of Resident and Chief Commissioner until the 1st of February 1849, when he was succeeded by Sir H. M. Lawrence, returned from leave.

3. The correspondence in this volume embraces the period from the 1st January 1848 to the 7th April 1849, when, on the annexation of the Punjab, the post of Resident was abolished and a Board of Administration constituted for the affairs of the Punjab.

4. The Assistants to the Resident during the period in question, *viz.*, 1st January 1848 to 7th April 1849, were—

CAPTAIN J. ABBOTT, Boundary Commissioner, in charge of Hazára.

LIEUTENANT W. A. ANDERSON, 1st Bombay Fusiliers: joined as an Assistant in the Lahore Residency in January 1848. Murdered at Multán in the following April.

MR. L. B. BOWRING, Assistant at head-quarters.

MR. A. H. COCKS, Chief Assistant to the Resident.

ENSIGN H. W. H. COXE, 70th Native Infantry: deputed to Benáres with Maharani Jindan. Appointed an Assistant in the Lahore Residency in September 1848.

MAJOR H. B. EDWARDES, on deputation to Bannu: engaged later in command of Frontier Levies in Military operations against the rebel forces and the investment of Multán.

LIEUTENANT W. S. R. HODSON, Assistant to the Resident and 2nd in Command of the Guides.

LIEUTENANT C. S. HERBERT, 18th Native Infantry: on deputation to Pesháwar and later in command of the Fort of Attock, which he defended as long as possible against the enemy.

LIEUTENANT H. R. JAMES, 44th Native Infantry: employed in his Military capacity before Multán and later as an Assistant to the Resident.

LIEUTENANT E. LAKE, Assistant Commissioner, on Settlement duty in the Bári Doáb, and later as Political Agent with the Baháwalpur Force operating against the Multán rebels.

MAJOR G. ST. P. LAWRENCE, Principal Assistant to the Resident, Pesháwar.

LIEUTENANT H. B. LUMSDEN, Commandant of the Guides.

MAJOR G. H. MACGREGOR, C. B., Principal Assistant to the Resident at Lahore until the 1st February 1848, when he was relieved by Mr. P. A. Vans Agnew.

MR. J. H. MORRIS, appointed an Assistant to the Resident in September 1848.

LIEUTENANT J. NICHOLSON, Assistant to the Resident in the Sind-Ságar Doáb. On the completion of his work there he was deputed to Pesháwar. In July 1848 he proceeded to Attock and was employed in Military operations in that quarter.

LIEUTENANT F. R. POLLOCK, an Extra Assistant in the Lahore Residency; served under Major Edwardes before Multán.

LIEUTENANT R. G. TAYLOR, Assistant to the Resident at Pesháwar: deputed to Banuu in March 1848; summoned by Major Edwardes to Multán, and was present with the force before that place from the 24th September to the 31st October 1848, when he left to rescue Mrs. Lawrence and party at Kohát. They were, however, carried off to Pesháwar, and Lieutenant Taylor remained at Isa Khel. In the month of December 1848 was engaged in the reduction of the Fort of Lakki, which fell early in January 1849. Lieutenant Taylor continued on duty in Bannu after the annexation.

MR. P. A. VANS AGNEW, Assistant to the Resident: deputed to Multán, where he was murdered with Lieutenant Anderson in April 1848.

5. As before noted, the Resident, Lahore, was constituted Chief Commissioner of the Cis and Trans Sutlej Territories from the 6th March 1848. The Commissioners of these territories were Mr. J. Lawrence trans Sutlej for the whole period (1st January 1848 to 7th April 1849), and Major Mackeson, C. B., cis Sutlej, until January 1849, when he was appointed Agent to the Governor-General with the Commander-in-Chief in the field. The Hon^{ble} Mr. J. C. Erskine, who held the post of Civil and Sessions Judge in the Cis-Sutlej Territories, relieved Major Mackeson as Commissioner. The post of Superintendent of the Protected Hill States was held by Mr. W. Edwards.
