

GENERAL DEPARTMENT, 1859—1863.

Prefatory Note.

The papers in this section are of a very miscellaneous nature. Many of them were quite valueless and destruction in this Department has been carried out on a much more generous scale than in the other sections. The period was one of quiet progress and order after the disturbances of the Mutiny. Mentions of the latter are still frequent and there are various claims for damages done and services rendered—many of them more or less imaginary. At the beginning of the period, Delhi was still under very strict control and its inhabitants were only gradually allowed to return to their homes.

Looking at the period as a whole one is struck by the very high centralization which prevails. Nothing is done without a reference to the central authority. Even such unimportant items as a Rs. 7 monthly bill for pulling punkahs in a mofussil Church required the sanction of the Secretariat.

The Civil Auditor—the ancestor of the modern Accountant-General—performed the same useful functions that his descendant does to-day and a solid mass of protests against salary bills 'cut' and travelling allowance bills 'edited' has found its way into the waste paper basket.

The period witnessed a great extension of the Telegraph system in the province, not always working in the best state of efficiency, to judge by the frequent complaints of stoppage and delay. The lines across the various rivers seem to have been a great source of trouble especially during the rains.

The Medical College makes its appearance during these years and its first batch of licenciates are passed out into the public service.

The cotton industry was stimulated by the importation of a number of cotton presses which were located at various important points. The experiment seems to have been a success.

The period closes with the death of the Viceroy, Lord Elgin, who expired somewhat suddenly, while on tour in the Punjab, at Dharamsala, on November 20th, 1863.
