### Introduction

The Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics is one of the oldest research and training institutes in economics in the country. It was founded on the 6<sup>th</sup> of June 1930 with an endowment offered to the Servants of India Society by the late Rao Bahadur R. R. Kale, Member of Legislative Council from Satara. The Servants of India Society, founded by late Shri Gopal Krishna Gokhale, are the Trustees of the Institute. The Institute is registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860, and the Bombay Public Trusts Act, 1950.

The object of the Institute is to conduct research into the economic and political problems of India and to train research workers in these subjects. Under the pioneering leadership of late Professor D.R.Gadgil, the first Director of the Institute, the Institute set standards for high quality research, teaching and training in a number of branches of economics.

Keeping in view the eminence of the faculty, the contribution the Institute has made in teaching, training and research in economics, the availability of physical infrastructure, and the potential of the Institute, the Government of India, on the advice of the University Grants Commission, declared the Institute as deemed to be a university from May 9, 1993, the birthday of late Shri Gopal Krishna Gokhale after whom the Institute is named. The Institute started functioning as deemed to be a University with effect from that day.

### Research:

The main thrust areas of the Institute, developed over the years through financial assistance from various sources, are agricultural economics and rural development, population studies, input-output studies for planning and development, microeconomics, macroeconomics, monetary economics and finance, public economics, international economics and the study of economics of East European countries.

Various ministries and public funding agencies including the Government of Maharashtra and private foundations like the Sir Dorabjee Tata Trust financed the research activities of the Institute in the early years. Subsequently, in 1954, the Union Ministry of Food and Agriculture established and have supported since then the Agro-Economic Research Centre of the Institute. During the early 50s, the Rockefeller Foundation made a substantial grant, spread over years, for the conduct of a research

programme in rural demography. By the time this grant came to an end, the Union Ministry of Health, which had given grants for conducting some specific demographic studies in 1954-57, decided in 1964 to strengthen and expand the research work on population by financing on a continuing basis a Population Research Centre as an integral part of the Institute. The Ford Foundation gave a very generous financial assistance for more than a decade beginning with the year 1956. Later on, the Ford Foundation in co-operation with the Planning Commission, provided a separate grant for research and training in the areas of planning and development, mainly devoted to input-output studies. The Planning Commission has also given an endowment grant to the Institute to establish a Chair and Unit at the Institute for promoting teaching, research and informed debate on all issues relating to Planning and Development. The above-mentioned Chair is named as 'Professor D. R. Gadgil Chair in Planning and Development'.

In 1962, the University Grants Commission recognised the Institute as a Centre of Advanced Study in Agricultural Economics to start with and later, in 1964, as a Centre of Advanced Study in Economics. In 1977, the UGC, as a part of its Area Studies Programme, established at the Institute a Centre of Study of Economics of East European Countries. In the same year, the Reserve Bank of India instituted a Chair in Finance at the Institute. In 1989, the Ford Foundation gave a generous endowment grant to the Institute to fund a Chair and to establish a section in international economics to carry out research activities in international economics and related subjects. The Ford Foundation grant also included support for the post of a Librarian and for acquisition of books and journals.

## **Teaching:**

The Institute, right from its inception, was affiliated to the University of Bombay, conducted the M.A. Programme in economics and supervised the work of students working for research degrees of that University. In 1949, with the establishment of the University of Poona, the Institute became a constituent recognised institute of the University of Poona. Till a few years ago, the Institute was functioning, for all academic purposes, as the Department of Economics of that University. With the decision of the University of Poona to establish a separate department of economics at its campus, the Institute, as Centre of Advanced Study in Economics, was granted effective autonomy by the University of Poona in 1986 in designing courses and in teaching and examination of M.A. courses in economics. As stated earlier, the Institute has been granted by the Government of India the status of deemed to be a University with effect from May 9, 1993. With the grant of this status, the Institute now awards its own M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in economics. After acquiring the status of deemed to be a University, the syllabi of the courses offered at the Institute were thoroughly revised on the basis of the recommendations of a committee constituted for that purpose. The courses in the M. A. Programme of the Institute are being regularly revised and updated on the recommendations of the Board of Studies and the Academic Council of the Institute.

#### **Training:**

In 1988, the University Grants Commission selected the Institute and extended assistance to it for conducting refresher courses in economics for in-service university and college teachers from the western region of the country. After the grant of deemed to be a university status to the Institute in 1993, the UGC extended the catchment area for the refresher courses to the entire country for the Institute in 1994. The Institute has been regularly conducting UGC - sponsored refresher courses for university and college teachers in economics since the inception of this scheme by the UGC.

### Library:

The Institute shares the Library of the Servants of India Society and has been mainly responsible for building it up during the last seven decades. The library is considered to be one of the foremost specialised libraries in India in the fields of economics and other related social sciences. Last year, the library crossed the 2,50,000 -mark for the number of volumes. The library now has 2,56,962 volumes and 473 journals and periodicals, received on subscription, exchange, gift and depository basis. The library has a microfilm camera, microfilm and micro-fiche readers and a documentation section. With a view to making known addition of books to the library and the contents of the journals currently received in the library, two fortnightly lists, namely, Fortnightly List of Additions and Fortnightly List of Articles on India are brought out regularly and circulated in mimeograph form. A monthly Current Awareness Bulletin is brought out by the Library in mimeograph form. The library has recently initiated a major programme of computerisation with the help of a grant from the UGC as a part of the development assistance under the IX Plan and a grant under the INFLIBNET programme of the UGC.

#### **Computer Section:**

In the Computer Section, the facilities for data processing are available to researchers. The Institute offers consultancy and guidance services in data processing in collaboration with the Indian Council of Social Science Research. The Computer Section is well-equipped with hardware and software to support the research, teaching and training programmes in the Institute. The Institute has now made computers available to most of the faculty members in their own offices. A one-year Certificate Course on Computer Applications for Economic Analysis has been introduced for the past and present M.A. and Ph.D. students of the Institute to complement the training in economics received by them at the Institute.

### **Publications:**

The Institute has been regularly publishing a quarterly journal of economics in English, *Artha Vijnana*, since 1989. This journal publishes results of research work carried out in the Institute as well as works of scholars from outside the Institute after a rigorous refereeing process. The Institute also publishes research works in the form of books and mimeograph series. The R.B.R.R. Kale Memorial Lecture, organised by the Institute every year on the occasion of the Founder's Day, is published under the Kale Memorial Lecture Series.

Teachers from universities and colleges from fifteen states, namely, Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Delhi, Goa, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Orissa, Meghalaya, Pondicherry, Punjab, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh and Uttaranchal participated in the Refresher Courses. Eminent economists from various academic and research institutions and the members of the faculty of the Institute delivered lectures in these courses. The participants appreciated the refresher courses very much and expressed their satisfaction about the course content, effectiveness in teaching, reading material provided and library facilities made available to them. They felt that the courses had widened the horizon of their knowledge in Macro Economics and Development Economics, and that this will be useful for them in improving their teaching and research abilities.

## XII Late Professor D. R. Gadgil Birth Centenary Year:

A National Seminar on the Rural Economy of India: Status, Prospects and Policies was organised by the Institute on April 8-9-2001 in its seminar hall. The two days' programme of the seminar included the inaugural session and technical sessions on the development of agriculture, rural population, development of rural health, family planning programmes, cooperation, agriculture and the concluding session. Twenty-four papers were submitted in the technical sessions. Thirty-one economists, social workers, administrators and sociologists from all over the country participated in the seminar.

Professor V. S. Chitre, Director of the Institute, in his opening address, paid tributes to Professor D. R. Gadgil for his pioneering efforts to study the rural economy of India and introduced the theme of the seminar by briefly summarising the development strategy for rural development and employment as formulated by the late Professor D. R. Gadgil.

The Seminar was inaugurated by Dr. R. Radhakrishnan, Director, Indira Gandhi Institute of Development Research, Mumbai. He recollected the contributions made by Professor Gadgil to the study of Economics. His work on the industrial evolution of India was an important study. He never took any position out of ideological and emotional reasons. He stood for a model suitable for the Indian conditions. However, he had great faith in the cooperative order. His role in the growth of sugar cooperatives was laudable.

Village and city surveys were also his major contribution. The All-India rural credit survey was conducted under his direction. He was not for aggregation. He believed that the processes of change varied between different regions and among different communities in the same region. Overall, his writings were still valid today.

Dr. Radhakrishnan also talked about the other matters of concern for the country. People talked about the 'Hindu' rate of growth. But the country had gone beyond it and the rate of growth could be still higher in the future. While the country had accumulated stocks of foodgrains, hunger still prevailed. There was a need to evaluate the employment programmes.

Prof. V. M. Rao, ICSSR National Fellow, Institute for Social and Economic Change, Banglore gave the valedictory address. He recalled the research tools employed when he had started his career. There had been a radical improvement since then. The financial support for the research projects had also become greater. In many respects these were healthy developments. A young researcher today was in a happy position. All the same, there were several over-worked subjects, with the same analysis and the same diagnosis. Hence, there were some overlooked subjects. An individual researcher often did not know what should be his priorities. A scholar should find out his own area of research and then his efforts could be more value added.

He regretted that the researcher looked only at one side of the rural economy. The other side was the black economy or informal sector. He might come across processes, which were different. He might think that the data were wrong and tend to keep them aside. But this might not be true. There was a need to look more deeply into the rural situation.

He said that the PDS offtake was declining and even in many villages, landless labourers depended more on the market than on the PDS. Therefore, it might be worthwhile to find out what their priorities were. Some villages had become growth centres and were undergoing a process of change.

He also referred to the important field material collected by the Institute as also other institutions. Data collected from field surveys today might be even more useful and interesting than they were at time the surveys were carried out. These data must be preserved for the future use. This was true not only for this Institute, but also for other institutions.

Finally, he said that from time to time institutions should review the research work done by them. Research was an individual activity. Hence, an overall view of the total research done in an organisation would also be useful.

## **XVI** Development of Infrastructure:

Substantial development of infrastructure and major repairs and maintenance work in the Institute and the staff quarters and hostels of the Institute were initiated with the help of development assistance received from the UGC during the IX Plan. The rewiring and painting works of the Institute's offices, staff quarters and hostels were completed during the year. The problems of water supply and drainage system were completely solved by construction/repair of underground tanks and drainage lines at the staff quarters and hostel premises of the Institute. Moreover, internal tar roads were also completed at the campus of the Institute.

The computer facilities at the Institute were further strengthened during the year. Personal computers were provided in the offices of a number of faculty members.

The programme of computerisation of the library, initiated in 1999-2000, made substantial progress during the year. About 1.92 lakh records have been entered in the data base, covering acquisitions of the library from 1964 till date. Besides, more than 1500 records have been entered in CDS/ISIS database during the year. An On Line Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) is made available for the use of the readers from December 2000.

Students' amenities in the hostel were also considerably enhanced.
