INTRODUCTORY NOTE.

The census, the statistics of which are embodied in this volume, was taken on March 10th, 1911.

At previous censuses the Sironj, Chhabra, and Pirawa Parganas of Tonk State, though included in the Provincial Tables, were excluded from all the Imperial Tables. But having been transferred in 1910 from the Central India to the Rajputana Agency they are included now in the Tonk figures in the Imperial Tables.

The figures for the detached tracts of Central India, namely Nandwas, belonging to Indore State, and Gangapur, belonging to Gwalior State, which are situated in the Mewar Agency, are included, as before, in the statistics of Mewar State in the Imperial Tables, and excluded from the Provincial Tables.

The figures for Nimrol village, situated in the Central India Agency, have been excluded from Dholpur State in the Imperial Tables and included in the Provincial Tables.

The figures for the pargana of Sambhar, held jointly by the Jaipur and Marwar Darbars, have been divided between the two States in the Imperial and Provincial Tables.

The figures for areas under British administration in Rajputana are included, in the Imperial and Provincial Tables, in the statistics of the States in which they are situated.

At previous censuses the figures for the Province of Ajmer-Merwara were published in separate volumes. They are printed now with the Rajputana figures throughout the Tables.

The 21 inhabited villages belonging to the Marwar Darbar, and the 92 belonging to the Mewar Darbar, which are all situated in the Merwara District of Ajmer-Merwara and administered, on certain conditions, by the British Government, have been excluded from the Ajmer-Merwara figures in the Provincial Tables and included in the statistics for the two States in question, and *vice versa* in the Imperial Tables. At previous censuses they were incorporated in the Ajmer-Merwara figures.

The optional Tables, XV-C and XV-D, prescribed by the Government of India, have not been compiled for Rajputana and Ajmer-Merwara; and Table XVI has been prepared only for Europeans and allied races, Armenians, and Anglo-Indians.

Detailed statistics of area, houses, population, religion, and literacy, for the various administrative units (*i.e.*, Parganas, Tahsils, etc.) in the States and Districts, will be found in the Provincial Tables I and II at the end of this volume.
