The test of literacy adopted at the Census was the ability to both read and write a letter, people of whatever age, who could write a letter to a friend and read the answer to it being entered as literate, and those who could not as illiterate.

This table contains statistics for certain selected castes, tribes and races in Calcutta and its suburbs, corresponding to those given for the whole population in Table VII, with this difference that age-periods 5—12 and 12—15 have been substituted for the quinquennial periods 5—10 and 10—15.

Statistics have not been prepared for all the castes numerically the most important in Calcutta, but figures have been given for typical castes from each section of the community :—

Among the Hindus—

- for Brahmins, typical of the highest grade in Hindu society,
- for Baidyas, typical of the upper middle class (professional and ministerial),
- for Agarwals, typical of the up-country trading classes,
- for Shahas, typical of the Bengali trading classes,
- for Jugis and Jogis, the weavers, typical of the industrial community ordinarily divorced from agricultural pursuits,
- for Chasi Kaibarttas (Mahisya), typical of the cultivating classes,
- for Jalia Kaibarttas (Adi-Kaibarttas), typical of the fishing castes,
- for Bauris, typical of the labouring classes,
- for Doms, typical of the lowest grade of Hindus, and
- for Baishnabs, followers of Vaishnavism, and
- for Brahmos.

Statistics have been given for the Saiyads, so that by comparison with figures in Table VII, the characteristics of the highest Muhammadan classes might be contrasted with those of the great bulk of the community. Statistics have also been given for Anglo-Indians and Indian Christians.

Occupations.

This Table corresponds with that which appeared as Number XV, Part A, in the Census Statistics for 1911. The scheme of classification of occupations has been only very slightly varied from that used ten years ago, which was drawn up on the basis of the classification devised by M. Bertillon, first used in France and now generally accepted as a basis for schemes of this sort. The occupations are divided into the same four main classes and 12 subclasses as in 1911, except that Subclass XI—"Persons living principally on their income" has been transferred from Class C—"Public Administration and Liberal Arts" to Class D—"Miscellaneous," but no alteration of numbering is involved by the change. Two new orders have been inserted, 19 for "Transport by Air" under Subclass IV—Transport, and 43 for "Air Force" under Subclass VI—Public Force, but what was order 19 "Industries connected with refuse matter" has been placed with order 18, which is now "Other miscellaneous and undefined industries," and what was order 40 "Trade in refuse matter" has been placed with 41 "Trade of other sorts" so that the orders 1 to 17 and 20 to 39 and 44 to 54 and the numbers they bear have not been changed. An order 56 has been added at the end of the classification for "Other unclassified unproductive industries" separate from 55 "Beggars, vagrants and prostitutes." The groups and their numbering have been somewhat changed.

Figures are given for the total numbers supported by each occupation as well as separate figures for male workers, female workers and dependents in (a) Calcutta and Suburbs, (b) the City alone, (c) the Suburbs in 24-Parganas and (d) Howrah. Statistics are also given for the number of workers in each occupation who had subsidiary occupations in agriculture.

In this table statistics are given to show to what extent persons belonging to certain castes with clearly defined traditional occupation, who live in Calcutta and its suburbs, have continued in those occupations, and to show also what occupations have been taken up by those who have given up the traditional occupations of their castes.

The tabulation of the statistics was undertaken for castes selected for the Province as a whole. The largest castes were not always selected, but castes were chosen from every grade of Hindu society and an endeavour was made so that each class of traditional occupation should be included. Statistics have been included to show the occupations of Anglo-Indians, Armenians and Europeans, and, among the Muhammadans, Saiyads, in order that by comparison with the statistics for the whole bulk of the Muhammadan community given in the preceding table, the characteristics of the distribution by occupation of a section, representative of the better classes among the community may be brought out.

Industrial Statistics.

The statistics which appear in this table correspond to those of Table XV-E of 1911, but have been somewhat amplified. They were obtained not from the Census Schedules, but from a special Industrial Return which was required to be filled up by the managers of every concern which employed as many as ten persons. The corresponding limit in 1911 was 20, so that factories employing between 10 and 20 hands are now included, whereas they were excluded in 1911.

The statistics are given in 7 parts—

Part I shows the number of establishments engaged in each particular form of industry in Calcutta and its Suburbs together, classified according to the number of employees in each and according as mechanical power is employed or not, and the employees in each are divided into managers, supervising and technical staff, clerical staff, skilled workmen and unskilled labourers; Europeans and Anglo-Indians are shown separately from Indians; among the artizans and labourers females are shown separately from males; and among the unskilled children are shown separately from adults.

Part II gives the same statistics for the City and its Suburbs separately, but in this part factories are not classified according to size or according as mechanical power is used or not.

Part III shows the concerns of each industry classified according to the caste or race of the owners and managers. The statistics of these first three parts correspond to the statistics given in 1911 with the exception that factories with 10—20 employees are now included.

Part IV shows the caste or race and birthplace of skilled workmen classified according to their industry and the particular occupation in that industry which each follows. Males and females, and children under 14 and adults are separated. In each case the castes of the employees are placed in order according to the numbers belonging to each, and in an appendix is given a table showing for all industries together the numbers belonging to each caste who have found employment. For those born in Bengal they are separated into those born in the district in which the factory is situated, those born in contiguous districts and those born in other parts of the Province. Those born outside Bengal are classified according as they were born in North Bihar, South Bihar, on the Chota Nagpur plateau in the Province of Bihar and Orissa, in Orissa, in the United Provinces, in the Madras Presidency, in other parts of India or outside India. Such a classification, it is found, leaves only two per cent. of the total number of skilled workmen to be shown in the last two classes.

Part V gives similar statistics for the unskilled labourers employed in each industry.

Part VI gives details of the power employed in factories engaged in each industry. First appear the numbers of establishments (with the number of their engines and the total horse-power) in which steam-engines, oil-engines, water-power or gas-engines are used to drive the machinery directly; second, the number of establishments using electric power generated on the premises, classified according as the prime-movers are steam-engines, oil-engines or water-power (the number and horse-power of the prime-movers is given and the number and power of the dynamos in use in kilowatts); and third, the number of establishments using electricity supplied from outside with the number and horse-power of the motors installed.

Part VII gives the number of looms worked by power and by hand (with and without fly-shuttles separately) in use in textile establishments, in the City and Suburbs separately.
