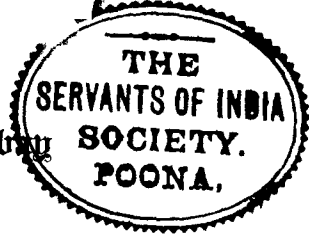

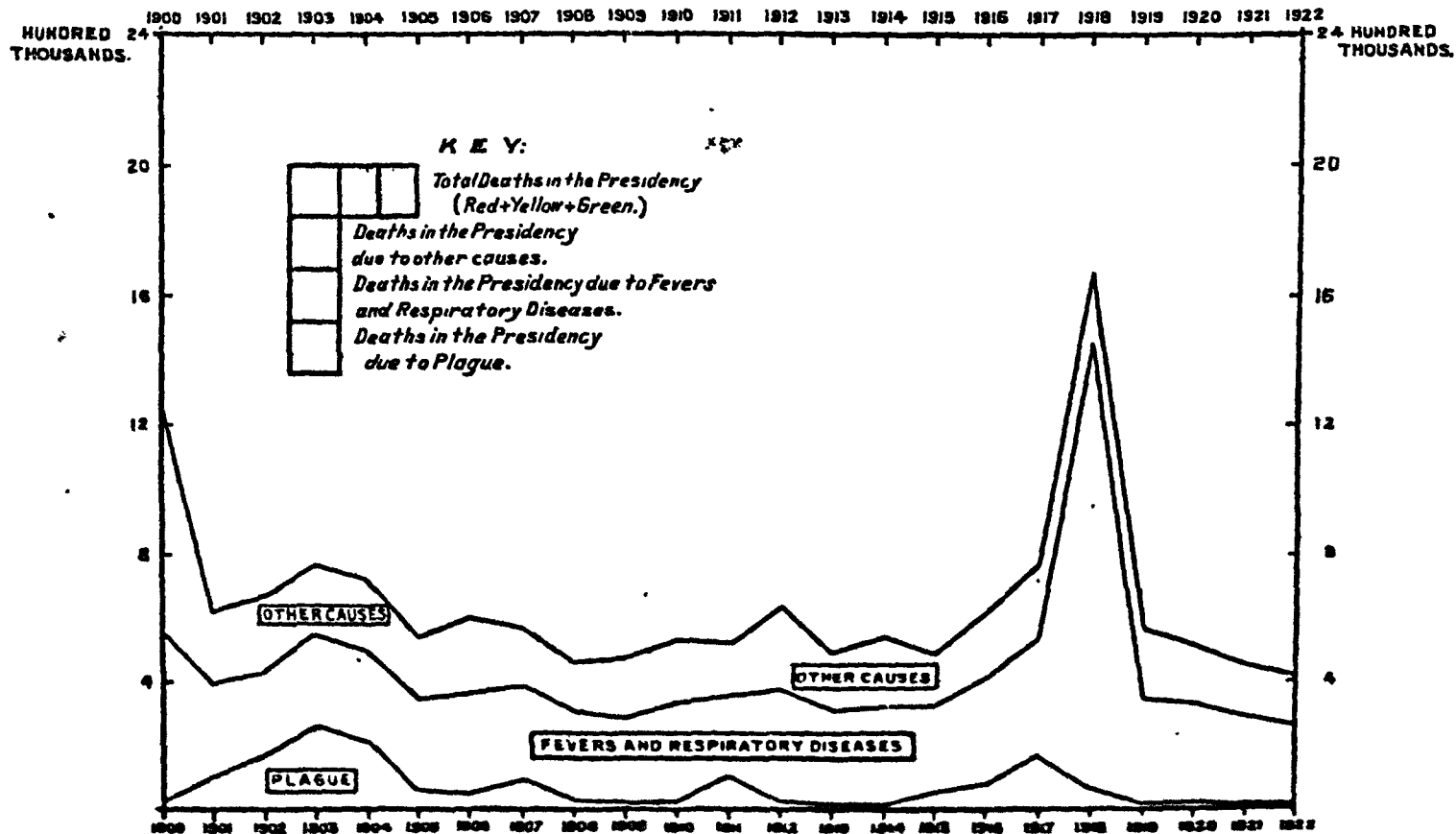

CHART NO. 2 OUTTURN OF FOOD GRAINS IN THE BOMBAY PRESIDENCY.

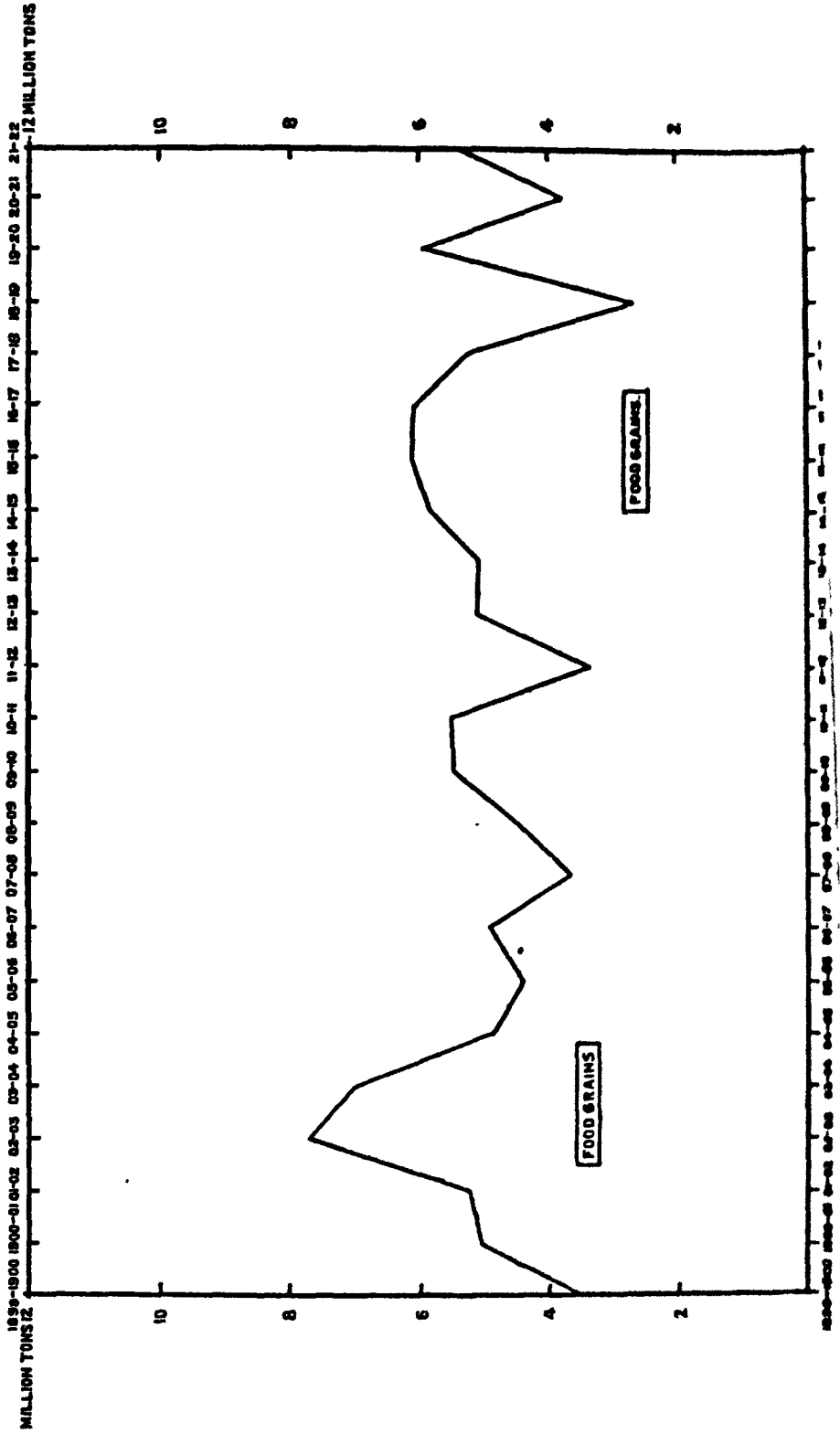
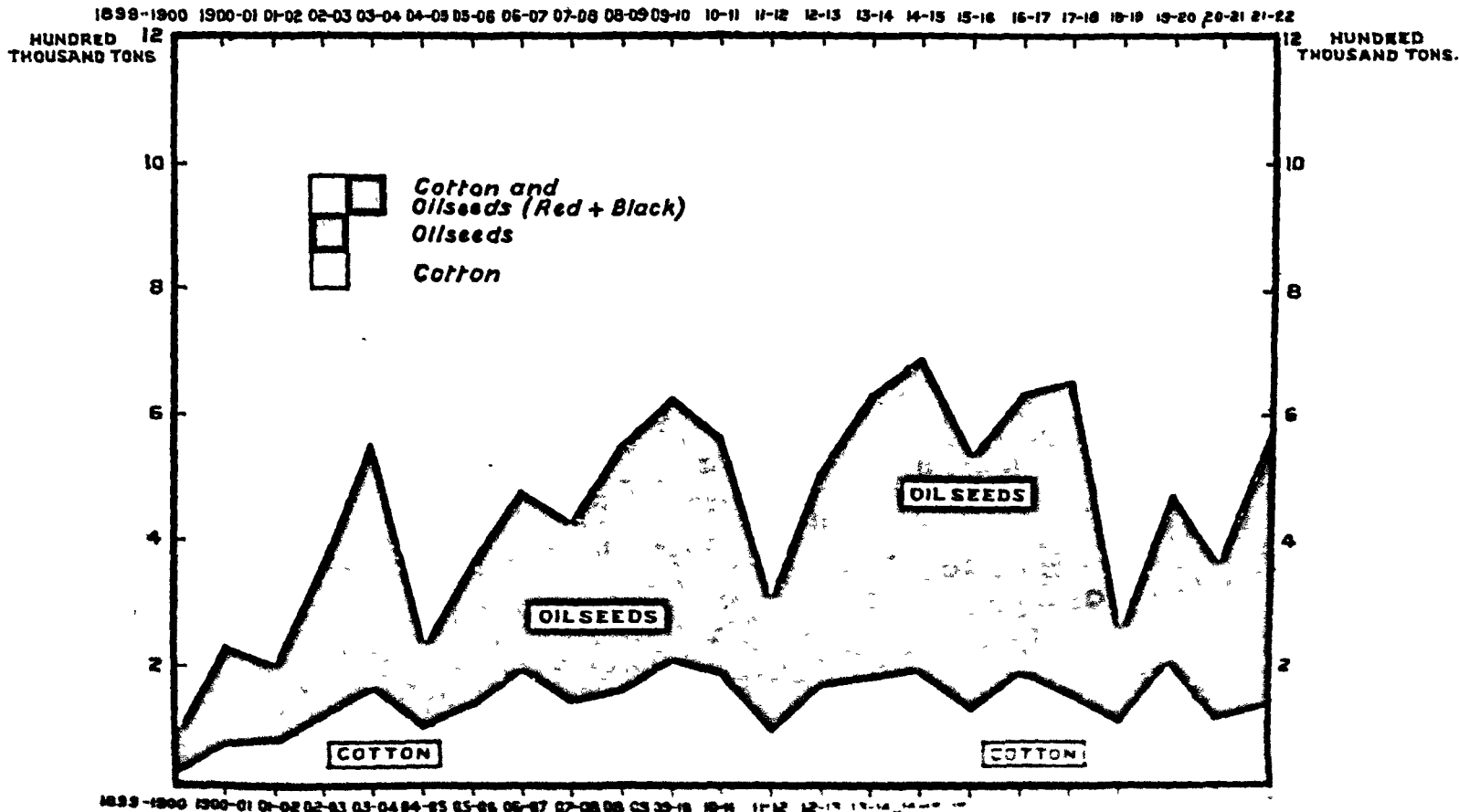


CHART No.3. OUTTURN OF COTTON AND OILSEEDS IN THE BOMBAY PRESIDENCY.



REPORT ON AN ENQUIRY INTO AGRICULTURAL WAGES IN THE BOMBAY PRESIDENCY INCLUDING SIND.

To

THE SECRETARY TO THE GOVERNMENT OF BOMBAY,
Home Department.

Sir,

I have the honour to submit a Report with statistical tables and coloured charts on an Enquiry into Agricultural Wages in the Bombay Presidency from 1900 to 1922.

SECTION I—OBJECT OF THE ENQUIRY.

2. The object of the enquiry was to ascertain the annual changes in agricultural wages throughout the Presidency including Sind from 1900 to the present time,* especially from the pre-war year 1913. The aim was, in brief, to make a study of Indian agricultural wages, based on full and accurate statistics of wages paid in this Presidency during the period under review. It was hitherto impossible to have the data readily available, and to compare the rise in agricultural wages with the rise which has occurred in industrial concerns during a period which is notable for its rapid industrial and commercial progress. The attention of the Labour Office was also drawn to the fact by certain Members of the Legislative Council that enquiries into wages and hours of labour should not be confined as hitherto to industrial concerns only, and that such an enquiry as that now completed would be valuable from a practical point of view. It was pointed out that the International Labour Office had undertaken investigations into wages and hours of agricultural labour in foreign countries, and a collection of similar information in this Presidency would be of considerable value. The Imperial Statistical Conference which met in London in 1920 also recommended that such enquiries should extend to the conditions of labour not only in industrial establishments, but also to agriculture. A complete list of similar enquiries in other countries will be found in the bibliographical appendix on page 119 which has been prepared with the assistance of the International Labour Office.

SECTION II—METHOD OF THE ENQUIRY.

(A) *Collection of Information.*

3. The information was collected briefly as follows :—The Presidency of Bombay is divided for administrative purposes into 26 districts which in turn are grouped into four divisions,—Sind, the Northern Division, the Central Division, and the Southern Division. The statistics have been collected district by district, division by division, and also according to

homogeneous economic circles,—namely, Sind, Gujarat, the Deccan, and the Konkan “The Presidency of Bombay” according to the Report of the Prices Enquiry Committee¹ “contains tracts of country varying greatly in climate and physical aspects. It has been divided into six circles, viz, Bombay (Port), Karachi (Port), Gujarat, the Konkan, the Deccan, and Sind. Sind, the lower valley of the Indus, has no characteristics which would lead one to combine it with the rest of the Presidency from which it is cut off by the desert or the sea. In climate, soil, surface, language, dress and customs of its inhabitants, Sind is altogether dissimilar from the Konkan, Gujarat, or the Deccan. Sind is a dreary desert plain broken here and there only by low cliffs or undulating sand heaps, save only where the life-giving inundations of the Indus or the silver streak of a canal have transformed a waste of sand and scrub jungle into broad acres of smiling crops. In striking contrast to Sind, the fertile and well-cultivated plains of Gujarat, the garden of the Presidency, yield a succession of abundant crops. This circle is watered by many rivers, the most famous of which are the Nerbudda and the Tapti, whose valleys are sheets of unbroken cultivation. The rest of the Presidency falls into two other natural divisions—the Konkan and the Deccan. The Konkan is a continuous coast line, below the Ghats, of rice-bearing areas, and groves of cocoanut palms watered by a neverfailing supply from the storm clouds of the south-west monsoon. ‘Behind the Ghats lie, in the scantily watered tracts of the Deccan plateau, an almost treeless plain sloping from the rock-bound ghat edge towards the level fields of Berar and Hyderabad, protected by the hills from the onset of the monsoon, which at times surmounts their crest only to hurl its heavy clouds across the plains and to leave them unwatered and untilled.’ In the valleys of the large rivers the soil is more productive, but the country is ever haunted by the spectre of famine. To the south of the Deccan proper, however, there are three districts—Belgaum, Dharwar and Bijapur, forming the Karnatak, which are more favoured than the northern plateau. Owing to the edge of the Ghats being thickly wooded to the west of these districts, they enjoy a better water supply than the arid plain further north, and are also able to reckon on a more certain rainfall.” Since the enquiry refers to agricultural wages, two of these six economic circles—Bombay (Port) and Karachi (Port)—have been excluded. The Northern Division is synonymous with the Gujarat economic circle, with the exception that Thana is taken from the Northern Division, and included in the Konkan circle to which economically it belongs. The Deccan circle includes all the districts of the Central Division and also the three districts of the Karnatak, viz, Belgaum, Dharwar and Bijapur, which have been taken from the Southern Division. The remaining three districts of the Southern Division, viz, Kolaba, Ratnagiri and Kanara together with Thana, form the Konkan circle. Sind as an administrative division is identical with Sind as an economic circle.

(B) Classification of Workers.

4. The statistics were collected month by month for each district headquarters town and also for another town, not the district headquarters town, but typical of the more rural areas in that district. In the selection of the non-district headquarters town considerable care was taken as it was desirable to select a representative area. This second group of towns shows the predominant rates paid in rural areas uninfluenced by the industrial or administrative centres of population. The Collector (or District Magistrate) of each district and also the Director of Agriculture were consulted in regard to this. The statistics were collected for three well-known groups of labour which are—

- (1) Field labour,
- (2) Ordinary labour,
- (3) Skilled labour.

5. Firstly with regard to field labour. Field labour represents labour of a casual nature in a centre where the figures are collected. It includes the various classes of agricultural labourers on the field—ploughmen, reapers, sowers, weeders and transplanters. Field labourers ordinarily do all this class of work according to the season. The figures recorded as the wages paid to field labourers are the predominant cash wages for casual labour in the neighbourhood of a centre where the figures are taken, and do not represent the earnings of the permanent farm hands who are paid partly in cash and partly in kind. In some instances agricultural labourers are given a share of the crop, but in most cases cash wages are replacing wages in kind in this Presidency. In the last enquiry held in August 1916 into this it was found that in 990 villages in which enquiries were made, cash wages without supplement were familiar in 967 villages: cash wages with supplement were familiar in 233 villages: and grain wages were familiar in 376 villages. It will be noted that in some of the villages more than one method of payment was in vogue.

6. Secondly with regard to ordinary labour. This class of labour is, perhaps, the most difficult to describe accurately as the term includes the whole class of labour that is intermediate between the skilled artisan and the agricultural labourer who works on the fields. In the more important towns the ordinary labourer is the man who works as a mason's or bricklayer's assistant or as a load-carrying labourer. It is from this class of labour that large numbers are recruited for canal and railway construction. The ordinary labourer is in demand on large agricultural holdings for the purpose of embankment, well-digging, canal-silt clearing, and for all the more important work on a farm which sometimes requires a higher degree of skill than that possessed by the field labourer. The ordinary labourer like the earth worker is emigrating now from village to village and from town to town owing to increased communications, and is selling his labour in the market where there is a demand for it. In rural areas the ordinary labourer is paid more than the agricultural labourer. The rates of wages earned do not show any marked variations

between the urban and rural areas in districts of small importance, but this is not so in the advanced industrial districts of Ahmedabad, Sholapur, Karachi, Surat, and Poona.

7. Thirdly as regards skilled labour In every village or group of villages there is the carpenter, the blacksmith, the mason, and the leather worker who makes, for example, the water bags for irrigation purposes as well as the shoes or sandals for the local inhabitants In the rural talukas these artisans are skilled agricultural labourers, and should be differentiated from the ordinary and the field labourers In the district headquarters town they include the urban skilled worker and, therefore, are not, in the case of towns such as Ahmedabad and Surat, agricultural wage earners. These artisans, however, in district headquarters towns do not necessarily work only in towns, but perform skilled work, etc., such as the making of a wheel or plough, or the building of a house for agriculturists These skilled labourers may be taken to include (1) the village carpenter, blacksmith, mason, or leather worker in the reporting centre where the records are kept; and (2) in the case of district headquarters towns, sometimes the urban artisan who is not an agricultural wage earner in the sense in which the village artisan is In fact he cannot be called in some cases an agricultural worker at all, although the rates paid to him govern the rates paid to the village artisan in the neighbourhood of that town.

(C) *Computation and Tabulation of Results.*

8. After the monthly statistics were collected, the first step was to scrutinize and then to tabulate the figures month by month and year by year. These were compared with the figures in neighbouring districts in the same homogeneous circle, and no statistics were allowed to pass without fullest investigation. From the monthly figures and the annual figures for each district weighted averages for the division and the economic circle and also for the Presidency including Sind and the Presidency excluding Sind were obtained. These averages were weighted according to population. The statistics are collected in what is known as Taluka Form No. XVIII which has been in existence in its present form since 1900. A short history of this form will be found in Appendix A. In addition to statistics of wages, statistics have been compiled showing population, mortality, the size of holdings, etc., since these are required for an explanation of the fluctuations in wage rates. The form of the tables printed with this Report has been mainly dictated by the many uses to which the figures may be put, and the statistics have accordingly been presented not merely in summary form but in more detail district by district and year by year.

SECTION III—CHANGES IN POPULATION.

(A) *The Economic Outlook*

9. During the last decade the population of this Presidency has actually decreased while the population of India shows an increase of

only 4 millions or very little more than 1 per cent. This is by far the smallest decennial increase recorded since the first general census taken over half a century ago, and is due entirely to the influenza epidemic of 1918-19. In ordinary years the increase in population is checked by the ignorance of or indifference to infant welfare as well as by malaria, by plague, and other epidemics. The influenza epidemic was first recognised in India in July 1918 when it broke out in Bombay, and spread from there eastward and northward in two distinct waves of increasing intensity, so that by the end of August it was general over India. The disease was spread by infection, by railroads, and it is said by water. The second wave, according to the Census Commissioner for India, had its origin in or near Poona in the early part of September, and rapidly spread over the country. It was accompanied by very high mortality chiefly due to pneumonia and other respiratory diseases. The attack fell most heavily on the adult classes between 20 and 40, the mortality among women being higher than among men. The statistics show that the excess mortality in the age categories 20 to 40 was four times the average. It was especially fatal to women in pregnancy. Added to this was the fact that in the ordinary Indian household the woman continues to the last moment to do the work of the house and the nursing of the sick members of the family. During the worst period of the epidemic some villages were absolutely laid desolate by the disease, crops were left unharvested, and the disposal of the dead was extremely difficult. The disease reached its climax in November at a time when prices were high, owing to a bad season. The price of clothing was also exceedingly high. "We thus arrive", says Mr. Marten, the Census Commissioner for India in 1921, "at a total mortality of between 12 and 13 millions for India. It is interesting to note that even this conservative estimate of a mortality, the large part of which occurred in the space of three or four months, exceeds by nearly two millions the total estimated deaths from plague extending over 20 years (1898—1918)... But the loss of population did not stop there. The number of actual deaths was, of course, only a fraction of the number of persons who suffered and the low birthrate of 1918 (34·52) and of 1919 (30·24) are directly due to the debilitated state in which so large a proportion of the population were left by the epidemic." The detailed figures in tables 27 and 28 and also on chart No. 1 (frontispiece) show the deaths from fevers and respiratory diseases. The total *excess* mortality due to fevers and respiratory diseases in 1918 as compared with the average of the previous five years was 1,058,700 for the Presidency, *i.e.*, 1,376,000 for 1918 as compared with 317,300, the average of the previous five years. The actual number of deaths which resulted from influenza does not give a true measure of the total loss of life from this epidemic. The case mortality has been estimated at 10 per cent. of the number of attacks and therefore the total number of persons affected by the disease would be about 125 millions or two-fifths of the total population of India. The detailed statistics of deaths from the principal diseases will be found in tables 23 to 28 on pages 101-112.

10. To sum up, the period between 1900 and 1922, notwithstanding the effects of the various epidemics on population, was one of general prosperity, notable mainly by the expansion of commerce and the development of industry. The period, however, was one in which there was famine of unusual intensity in 1899—1901, high mortality from plague during the years 1901 to 1907 and 1915 to 1918 (the deaths from plague from 1901 to 1907 and 1915 to 1918 were 82 per cent. of the total deaths from plague 1900-1922) and the influenza epidemic of 1918. Vast development schemes have been undertaken in Bombay City and in Salsette. These factors have had considerable influence on wages in agriculture owing to the flow of labourers into industrial and other undertakings. The following table shows the total population of the Bombay Presidency at the various censuses during the last 40 years as compared with the total population of all India :—

The fall in the birthrate in 1918 and 1919 in the above table is noticeable both in the Bombay Presidency and in British India. The stimulus given to agricultural prosperity by good seasons and by canal irrigation led to an earlier recovery in the birthrate in some Provinces.

It is interesting to examine the distribution of the population at the last three censuses in cities, towns and villages in the Presidency. The census figures show that it is not true to say that the people are forsaking the village for the town. The proportion of those residing in the larger cities is certainly increasing but the types of places which are losing to the cities are not the smaller villages but the middle sized country towns and a marked reduction in the class 2,000 to 10,000 in all parts, except in the Konkan, points to the decline of the market towns above the Ghats. The following table analyses the distribution of the total population of the Presidency at the different censuses for places of various sizes :—

It is significant that in 1901 out of every 1,000 persons 653 lived in places below 2,000 inhabitants. The corresponding figure for 1921 is 650. The small village has thus not appreciably lost ground in twenty years. The importance of Bombay urban life rests mainly in the development of its cities. The industrial and commercial progress of the last decade explains the great increase in the population of large cities.

Classification of Workers.

12. Tables 20 and 21 have been constructed to show the number of persons engaged in agriculture, the number of agricultural labourers, the number of unskilled workers, and the number of skilled workers. In table 22 the growth in the number of factory workers in the Presidency from the year 1900 to the year 1922 is also shown by districts, divisions, and economic circles.

(B) Classification of Occupations.

13. One of the greatest difficulties in all censuses of population is the accurate classification of occupation or means of livelihood. This, in India, has always been a matter of considerable thought to statisticians. The enumerating agency and the worker are often unable correctly to define occupations. At the last census in 1921, the non-co-operation movement, apart from direct obstruction, led to a disinclination in some parts to take up, without remuneration, the work which demanded a certain amount of time and inconvenience. At a critical time a large section of the village accountants of the Bombay Presidency who do the enumeration work went on strike for higher pay. The enumerator's work is not only difficult but at times even somewhat hazardous as in the case of an enumerator who was stoned by an infuriated member of one of the lower castes who considered him, as the Census Commissioner for India pointed out, as too inquisitive. Another investigator was beaten because he refused to make an obviously false entry regarding the caste of a certain community which wished to be registered as a higher caste for social reasons. Another difficulty which obviates comparison between the 1901 census on the one hand, and the 1911 and 1921 censuses on the other, is the absence of uniformity in classification, especially with regard to the sub-groups. Fairly accurate comparison, however, can be made between the years 1911 and 1921.

14. In the first place, it was necessary in this enquiry to determine (1) the number of agricultural labourers and the total number of persons engaged in agriculture (dependents were excluded and only actual workers included); (2) the number of unskilled or ordinary labourers; and (3) the number of skilled workers who, in the agricultural sense of the term, could be classified as skilled workers. For both skilled and unskilled workers dependents were excluded.

15. To answer the first of these questions, farm servants and field labourers, herdsmen, shepherds and goatherds were grouped together. These were taken as agricultural labourers. For "persons engaged in agriculture" in table 20 on page 95 ordinary cultivators were included, *i.e.*, cultivating owners, cultivating tenants, and cultivators unclassified. Those who were classified in the census as having income from rent of agricultural lands were excluded. Comparison with 1901 was, as pointed out, impossible. This was due to the fact that in 1901 those possessing income from rent of agricultural land were classified under ordinary cultivators. "The violent fluctuations," Mr. Sedgwick, Superintendent of the 1921 (Bombay) Census, states, "between 'Income from rent of Agricultural Land' and 'Ordinary Cultivators' from 1901 to 1911 were caused by a change of system in 1911. In 1901 cultivators who pay assessment were classified as Rent Receivers. The terms used at that census were 'Rent Receivers' and 'Rent Payers.' Rent Receivers included 'Holders of land who pay revenue to Government and cultivate the land themselves'. The arrangement was obviously misleading. In 1911 the ordinary ryot was classified as a Rent Payer, the term rent

being held to include agricultural assessment, and these rent payers were afterwards described in the Tables as ordinary cultivators."* The same principle was followed in the 1921 census. On this classification the results are of exceptional interest and are summarised in the following table :—

The decrease in agricultural labourers on the classification outlined above is 37 per cent. for the whole of the Presidency including Sind, and a decrease of 14 per cent. for persons engaged in agriculture. The effect of this decrease in the number of agricultural labourers on wages is dealt with in Section IV.

16. To arrive at the number of unskilled or ordinary labourers is an unusually difficult matter. The 1921 census unfortunately shows under "labourers and workmen otherwise unspecified" no less than 834,000 persons as compared with 251,000 persons in 1911. A reference has already been made in the previous paragraph to the difficulties under which the 1921 census took place. After a careful examination of these figures it seems clear that "labourers and workmen otherwise unspecified" should on the whole be included as unskilled or ordinary labourers. For example, in 1911 under "labourers and workmen otherwise unspecified" less than 1 per cent. were shown as "partly agriculturists."† It was, therefore, advisable to classify under unskilled or ordinary labourers the following :—

1. Wood cutters, firewood, catechu, etc. collectors and charcoal burners. (9)‡
2. Lac collectors. (10)
3. Labourers in harbour works and dock-yards. (106)
4. Labourers employed on the construction and maintenance of harbours and docks, streams, rivers and canals. (109)

5. Labourers employed on roads and bridges (construction and maintenance). (112)
6. Porters and messengers. (117)
7. Labourers and coolies employed on railway construction and maintenance. (119)
8. Village watchmen. (160)
9. Municipal and other local servants (not assigned to any other group). (163)
10. Village officers and servants other than watchmen. (164)
11. Domestic servants: cooks, water carriers, door-keepers, private grooms, coachmen, dog-boys, etc. (181 and 182)
12. Labourers and workmen otherwise unspecified. (187)

These workers, as is well-known, at times turn to ordinary agricultural labour. The results are summarised in the following table and show an increase for the Presidency including Sind of no less than 24 per cent. since 1911.

Bombay (City and Island) has been shown separately as it is not included either in the Northern or Central Division in the tables in this Report.

17. The term "skilled labour" in this report on agricultural wages includes carpenters, turners, joiners, workers on iron and makers of implements and tools, workers on brass, copper, and bell metal, stone cutters and dressers, bricklayers and masons, and sawyers. These form the group heads 43, 44, 48, 49, 87 and 88 in the occupation Table No. XVII of the 1921 census. There has been a fall in these classes of workers for the whole Presidency including Sind of 2 per cent., but if the Presidency Proper, *i.e.*, excluding Sind, be taken there is an increase of 5 per cent. Here again a caveat must be entered regarding the difficulties of obtaining accuracy in the classification of occupation, especially in the 1921 census. The variations by divisions are brought out in the following summary table:—

In the detailed table on page 96 the number of skilled labourers in Ahmedabad and in Thana is noticeable. In the Southern Division the increase is no less than 18 per cent. which is said to be due to the increase in the number of artisans in the three districts of the Karnatak, where there has been constructional work in progress during the last decade. The decrease in Sind is due to the emigration of artisans from Karachi to Mesopotamia and the Gulf in recent years. It has also to be remembered that in the Presidency the trades included under "skilled" are largely hereditary, and emigration or immigration affects the supply more readily than is sometimes anticipated.

SECTION IV.—CHANGES IN DAILY AVERAGE WAGES.

18. In order to bring the results of the statistics into readable compass it will be convenient to divide the wages into urban areas and rural areas. The results have been classified, as has been shown, according to districts, political divisions and economic circles for (1) field labourers, (2) ordinary labourers and (3) skilled labourers. Special emphasis has been laid on the increase from the beginning of the century and also on the increase as compared with the pre-war year 1913. The wages given are nominal or money wages. The real wages, *i.e.*, allowing for the rise in wages as

compared with the rise in prices, will be found in the following section. (Section V, page 23.)

(A) WAGES IN URBAN AREAS.

(1) *Field Labour.*

19. In 1900 the average daily cash wage of field labourers in the Presidency was about 3 annas. To-day it is three times that amount. Before the war the figure was nearly 5 annas. Except in Sind where the average wages of field labourers amounted to 5 annas 6 pies per diem, there was (at the beginning of the century) a considerable similarity in the average daily wages paid. In 1922 the increase in the Northern Division had been greater than in other divisions of the Presidency owing to the large increases in the Thana and Ahmedabad districts. Wages in Sind in 1922 rose to 12 annas 6 pies, in the Northern Division to 10 annas 3 pies, in the Central Division to 8 annas 3 pies and in the Southern Division to 8 annas 9 pies. The results which are interesting are summarised division by division in the following table :—

It is noticeable that wages in each of the three selected years 1900, 1913 and 1922 were highest in the Konkan Circle. This is due to the fact that Thana district which is close to Bombay is administratively a part of the Northern Division, but as part of an economic circle belongs to the Konkan. Industrially, however, the Konkan Circle is not of so much importance as compared with the Gujarat Circle as the former excludes Bombay, and the latter includes the district of Ahmedabad. The quinquennial averages will be found in table 7 on page 52. The quinquennia selected are 1900-1904, 1905-1909, 1909-1913, 1914-1918 and 1918-1922.

(2) *Ordinary Labour.*

20. The wages of ordinary labourers were higher in Sind than in the other divisions or circles in the Presidency in the period under review. In 1900, for the Presidency excluding Sind, ordinary labour was paid at the rate of 3 annas 6 pies per diem, for the Presidency including Sind at the rate of 4 annas 3 pies per diem. In 1922, for the Presidency Proper, wages had risen to 10 annas 6 pies per diem, and for the Presidency including Sind to 12 annas per diem. The rate of wages was as high as a rupee per diem in Sind in 1922. The results are conveniently summarised in the two following tables :—

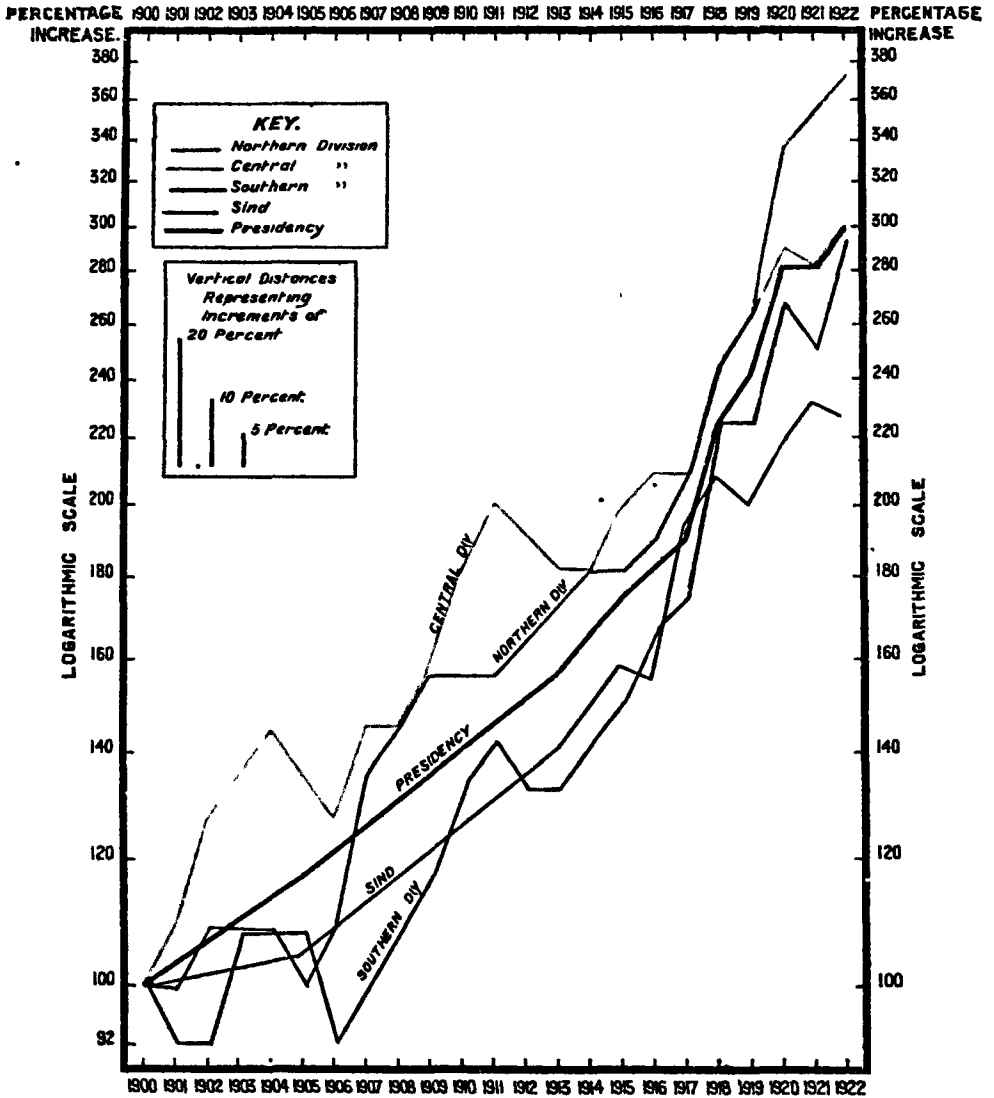

The interest of these tables lies chiefly in a comparison of the rates obtaining in various parts of the Presidency. The advantage of grouping the districts into homogeneous circles, instead of by divisions, is of special value in this connexion. The quinquennial averages will be found in table 9 on page 54.

(3) *Skilled Labour.*

21. A glance at the tables below shows what has been already noted in regard to field labour and unskilled or ordinary labour, *viz.*, high rates prevailing in Sind as compared with other parts of the Presidency. At the beginning of the century skilled labour in Sind earned as much as a rupee a day. To-day the wage is Rs. 2-4-0. In other parts of the Presidency the average in 1900 was 9 annas 6 pies per diem. To-day the wage is Rs. 1-8-9. Wages of skilled labour in the Presidency Proper are highest in the Northern Division, and lowest in the Southern Division. Another noticeable feature is the rise in skilled wages since 1913. This is accounted for by (1) the rapid growth of industry in the Northern Division; (2) the effects of the epidemics of plague and influenza between 1915 and 1918 (which affected skilled labour as much as field and ordinary labour); and (3) the consequent growth in bargaining power of the artisan class. Cities and towns had a continuous demand for these skilled workers for industries, buildings, and general development schemes. The increase in communications made it possible for the skilled labourer to migrate to the large towns like Bombay where he makes his money quickly and returns as early as possible to his home with his earnings.* The two following tables summarise in convenient form the results.

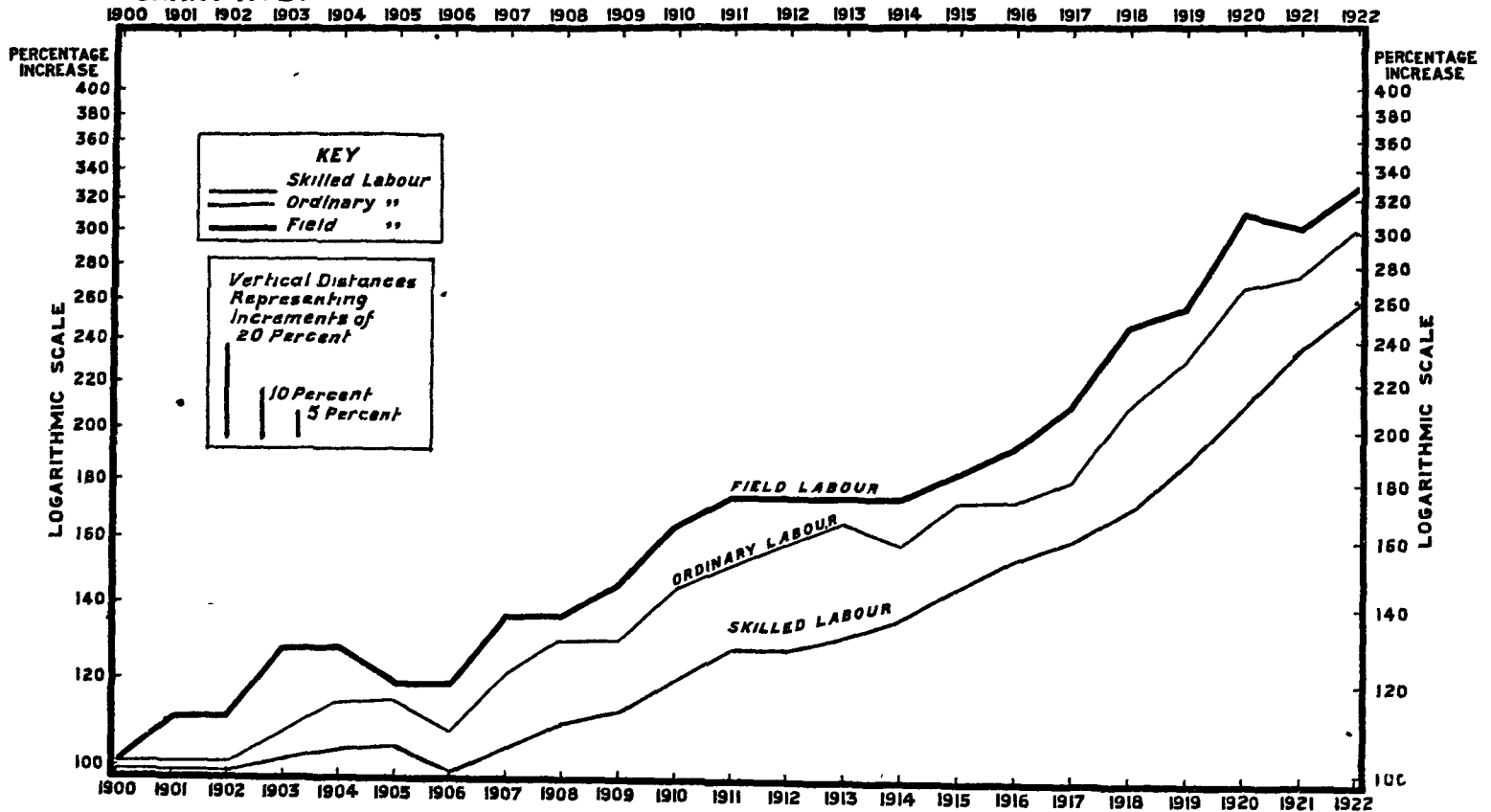
One of the most important features of this table is the similarity in the increase percentages for all three classes of labour as compared with the pre-war year for the Presidency as a whole.

23. The expression “urban areas” is somewhat of a misnomer as it refers to wages paid around the headquarters town in each district, and differs in some respects from the movement of wages in rural areas.

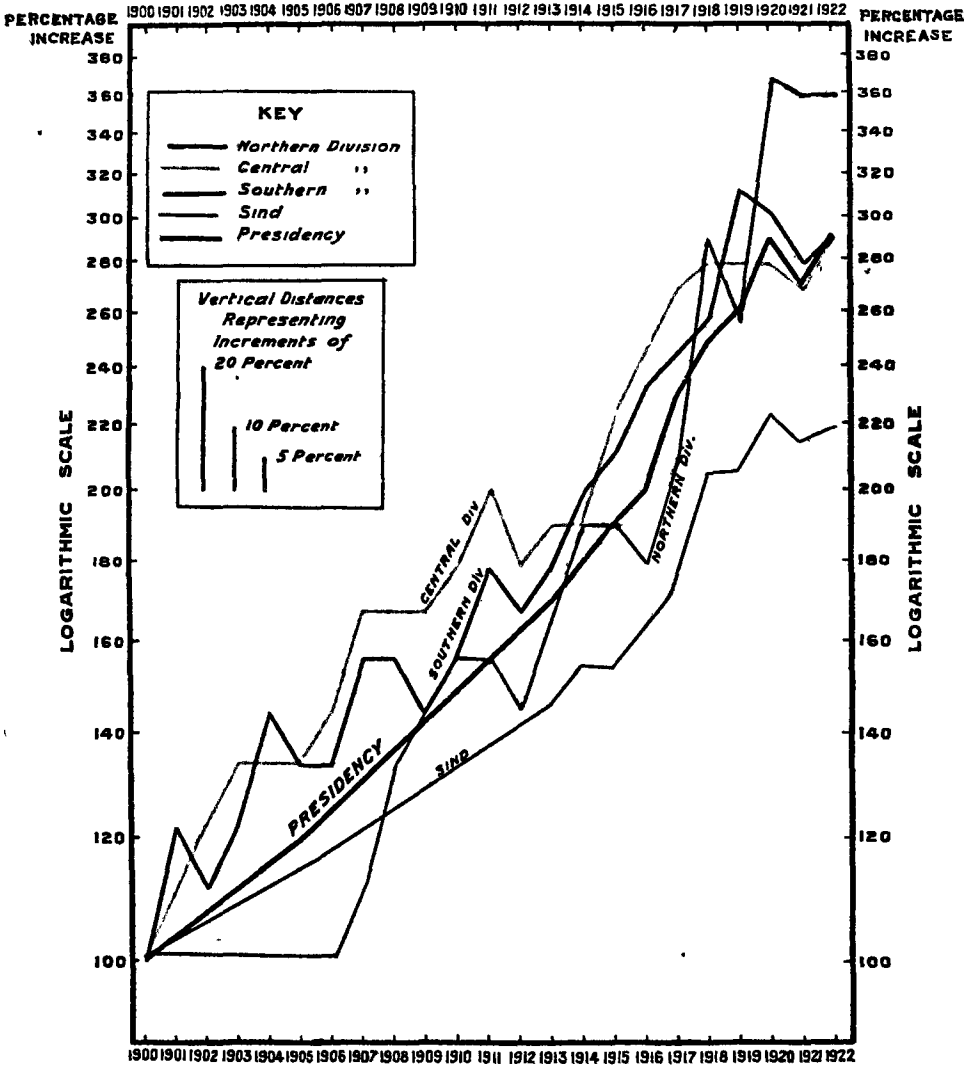

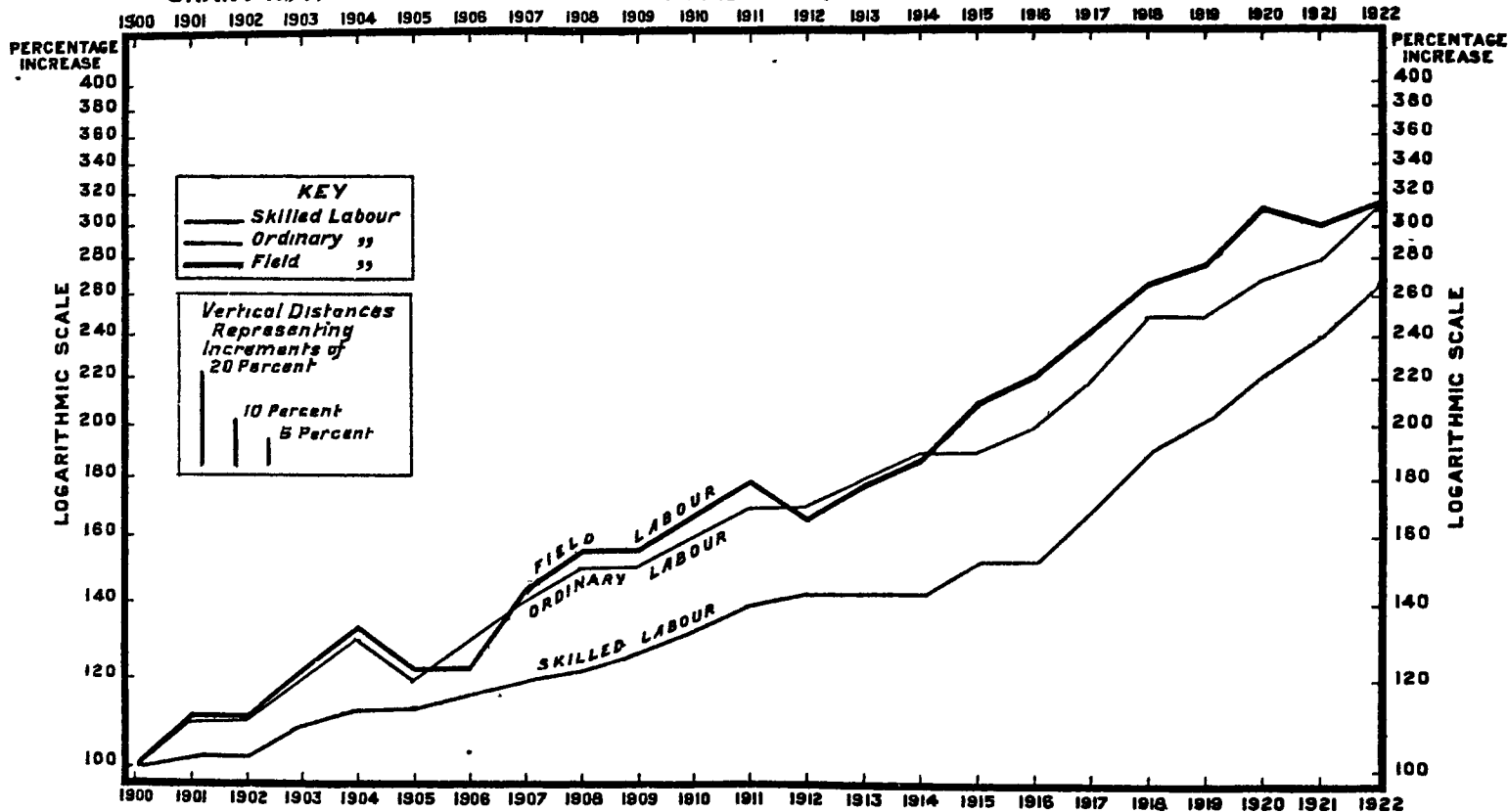
WAGES OF FIELD LABOURERS IN THE BOMBAY PRESIDENCY

(C)—THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN WAGE RATES IN URBAN AND RURAL AREAS.

26. The question now arises as to the comparison of wage rates for the classes of labour taken in this report between urban and rural areas. In 1900 and 1913 the difference between urban and rural wage rates was less than at the present time. This is evident from the following summary tables showing the daily average rates of field labour, ordinary labour, and skilled labour :—

The daily average rates in rural areas are less, as is to be expected, than in centres of large population. The increase in prices especially from 1905, the decrease in the supply of labour as compared with the demand owing to plague during the years 1902 to 1907 and influenza in 1918, the increased mobility of labour consequent on an increase of communications, and the general expansion of commerce and industry mainly account for the large leap upwards in wages in this Presidency during the first two decades of the present century.

SECTION V—REAL WAGES.

27. A study of the increase in money wages would be incomplete by itself without an examination of the movement in real wages. Real wages are the amount of commodities which the labourer can buy with his money wages, and are calculated by the following formula :—

Real Wage index number

$$= \frac{\text{Money wage index number} \times 100}{\text{Cost of living index number.}}$$

The cost of living index for the Presidency was arrived at by taking the prices of food articles district by district and division by division. Fuel and lighting consists in this case of Kerosene only since the agricultural labourer, unlike his confrère in Bombay City, obtains his fuel at little

expense. He collects the dried up branches of trees or burnt cowdung prepared into cakes by the womenfolk of his household. The prices are in all cases district prices, except those for clothing (cotton piece-goods made in Indian mills) which are those in Bombay, these having been taken to represent the increase in the price of clothing throughout the Presidency. Rent has not been included as the agricultural labourer generally does not pay house-rent. It will be seen from the following table that clothing (cotton piece-goods) has risen, as is to be expected, more than any other group in the index.

28. The daily average wages for 1914, 1921 and 1922 have been taken in the calculation of the real wages in the tables below. It will be seen that in 1922 the cost of living was about 100 per cent. more than in 1900 and about 72 per cent. more as compared with the pre-war year. The standard of living is assumed to be the same throughout the period, i.e. that the proportional expenditure on the various items in 1922 was the

same as in 1900 and in the pre-war month of 1914. The change in real wages is as follows :—

The main features of these tables are—

(a) Over long periods, i.e., as compared with 1900, real wages have risen both in "urban" and "rural" areas.

(b) In the short period (i.e., a decade ago or just before the outbreak of war) real wages have risen except in the case of field or ordinary labour in "rural" areas.

Similar results are brought out in the coloured charts Nos. 8-A and 8-B, which are intended to show real wages as calculated on the price of six chief important food-grains in the Bombay Presidency, year by year between 1900 and 1922. As pointed out in Table XX of the Report on an Enquiry into Working Class Budgets in Bombay, the expenditure on food in India is in Assam as high as 83·2 per cent., in Bengal 73·5 per cent. in the case of the non-agricultural family in indigence, 68·5 per cent. for the agricultural family in indigence and 58·2 per cent. for the agricultural family in comfort. In the Presidency of Bombay the figure is 59·2 per cent. and in Bombay City 56·8 per cent.* In other words, from three-fifths to three-fourths of the expenditure of the labourer may be said to be on food which is not surprising in view of the comparatively low standard of living. The chart brings out the effect of bad years on wages whether the agricultural wage-earner is a field worker, an ordinary worker, or a skilled worker. The nature of the seasons, year by year, from 1910-11 may be conveniently summarised as follows:—

The crop of 1921-22 was required to balance the deficit of the preceding year. As the agricultural Adviser with the Government of India (Mr. S Milligan) points out, we have to remember that the greater part of India's produce consists of food-grains, and that by far the greater part of that is consumed by the growers and their families as also by the workers. Any increase in crop outturn, therefore, accordingly represents a much greater corresponding surplus. "With a 50 per cent. home consumption an increase of 25 per cent. (the difference between a fair and a good crop) becomes 50 per cent. in saleable surplus. This, however, does not apply to what are generally called the revenue crops such as cotton, jute, oil-seeds, etc., the whole produce of which is practically sold by the cultivator. Taking this into consideration, I should say that the cultivator must have this year (April 1923) a 50 per cent. surplus for sale above that which he had in the year preceding the war. Although the cost of farm materials and cattle has gone up considerably, the effects of two good seasons and the high price of some of the principal revenue crops would leave the balance for expenditure on household necessities such as kerosene, clothes,

 (EXCLUDING SIND)

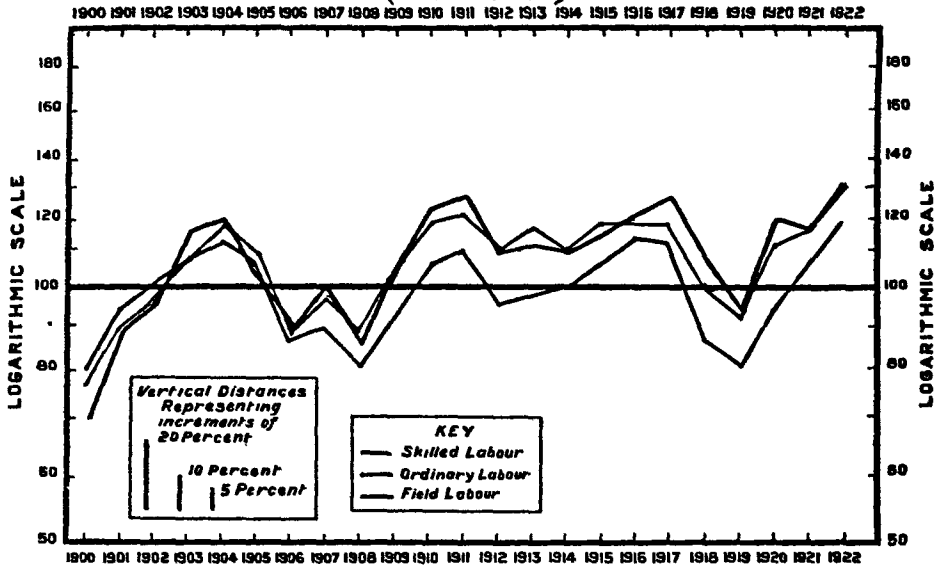
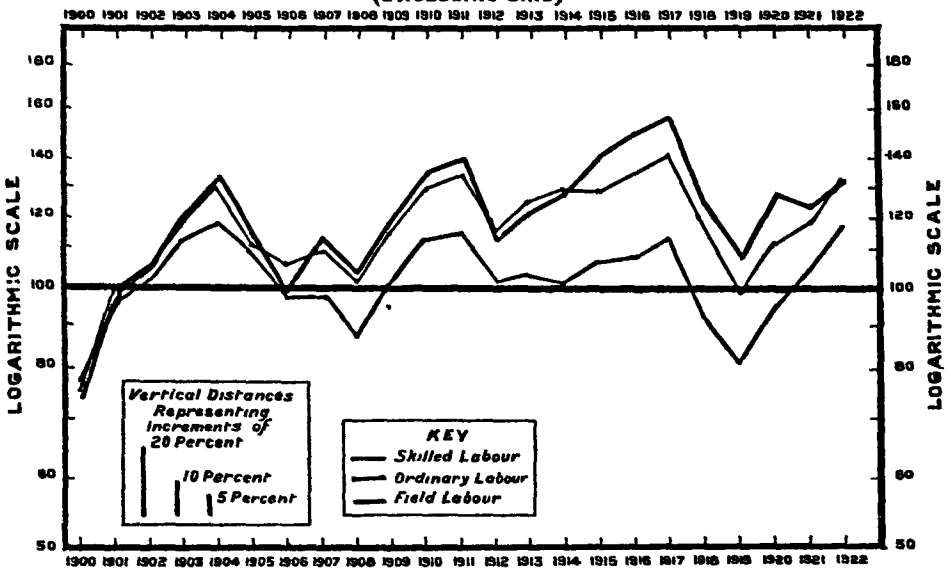


CHART N° 8-B

etc. at 50 per cent. more this year than in the year preceding the outbreak of war. The cost of cloth, etc., has however increased so much that it is extremely doubtful if the cultivator will be in a position to purchase his full pre-war quantities of household necessities."

29. In any examination of the purchasing power of the agriculturist one has to differentiate between the effect of an increase in prices on labourers as compared with a similar increase on cultivators. In speaking of cultivators it is necessary to group these into various categories such as cultivators who own and cultivate their own lands, tenants who cultivate land belonging to others, cultivators of large holdings, cultivators of medium-sized holdings, and cultivators of small holdings. Conditions vary so much within the Presidency that generalisations on purchasing power are not possible. Experienced officers throughout the Presidency were addressed by the Labour Office in regard to this question, and the replies, read in the light of the statistics above, are of much interest. The Commissioner in Sind (The Honourable Mr. J. L. Rieu) is of opinion that the purchasing power of agricultural labourers has risen, a view which is shared by the Commissioner of the Northern Division (Mr. F. G. Pratt). The Commissioner of the Central Division (Mr. G. W. Hatch) endorses the opinion that the material condition of the rural population is now generally improving. The Commissioner of the Southern Division (Mr. L. J. Mountford) holds that "the purchasing power of the rural population and especially of the agriculturist has increased in the last 10 years. Labour tends to rise and the price of food-grains, which is the main factor in a labourer's budget, has reached a high figure and is now showing a downward tendency, while labour is getting more independent year by year and that itself shows it is in a strong position. I consider that the purchasing power of the agricultural labourer especially of the agriculturist, has been more than the cost of living. . . . The labourer knows his worth as he is scarce and so gets a good wage. He has little wants and few ambitions and he does not save, so he works just as few days in the week as will supply his wants and knocks off. The scarcer the labour, the higher the wage; the higher the wage, the less days of work . . . Epidemics of plague and a very bad influenza epidemic decimated the labour market. In 1918-19 influenza wiped out 10 per cent. of the population and very largely the workers of a family, and until we at least work off the results of this epidemic labour will continue scarce, independent and costly". The Registrar of Co-operative Societies (Mr. Otto Rothfeld) points out that conditions vary so much within the Presidency that it is impossible to generalise. He does not think that the purchasing power of the labourer has risen but there has been, he believes, an improvement in his condition during the last two years. The one outstanding fact is, he points out, that the demand for a higher standard is very much greater than it used to be, and this, it might be argued, implies higher purchasing power.

30. Emphasis has been laid on the difficulty in generalising regarding the purchasing power throughout the Presidency as a whole on account of differences in conditions. While it is true that the agricultural labourer

in Sind, for example, is as well off as the agricultural labourer in the Deccan, owing to the fall in 1922 in food prices, this cannot be applied to cultivators generally in both the Deccan and Sind who have to pay the same high wages as before. In the Deccan the owner cultivator cannot as a rule live only on the produce of his land. He has to supplement this by migrating to industrial areas. The small holding in the Deccan is uneconomic, and there is nowadays a growing interdependence between agriculture and industry. In Sind, however, most of the land is owned by Zemindars and cultivated by tenants-at-will. The tenants take their share of the produce, one half or two-thirds, according to the mode of irrigation. They do not supplement their income by industrial labour as there are no industrial centres to which they can migrate, but many of them make profits from agricultural labour and cart hire.

SECTION VI—REAL WAGES IN OTHER COUNTRIES.

31. A comparison of the real wages in the Bombay Presidency with those of other countries has been rendered possible owing to the assistance of the International Labour Office. In the following statement there are difficulties which make it impossible to ensure strict comparability. In some cases agricultural workers receive additional payments in kind and all such payments should be included in the amount of the nominal wage if strictly accurate results are to be obtained. This has been as far as possible attempted. The workers in the table below are generally those who are not provided with board and lodging and whose payments in kind are comparatively few. Again, special payments are sometimes made at harvest time, but the data below are average wages. Another point which renders strict comparability not always possible is the fact that the index numbers of the cost of living vary from country to country on account of the difference in the construction of the indexes. The cost of living data used are those published officially in different countries.

Real wages in Bombay as compared with those in England and Wales, the United States, Australia, and Continental Europe are especially interesting. The fall in real wages in the United States and the large increase in Australia speak for themselves.

SECTION VII—HOURS OF LABOUR.

32. Enquiries were made regarding the hours of work of agricultural labourers throughout the Presidency. The most interesting fact is that the general concensus of opinion is that, as compared with a decade ago, the working hours in agriculture are considerably less than what they used to be. The Deputy Director of Agriculture, North Central Division, gives the total number of hours in the prewar year at 12 but to-day these have decreased to about 8 to 10 in the case of labourers engaged by the year. The hours are usually from 7 a.m. to 11-30 a.m. and from 2 p.m. to 5-30 p.m. For casual labour the hours are now 9½ to 10. The ordinary labourer works from 8 or 8-30 a.m. to 6 p.m. with a two hours' interval. In the Konkan, before the war, the labourer worked for 12 hours. He is now stated as working for 10 hours and the tendency is towards a

further reduction. As the Deputy Director of Agriculture, Konkan points out "there has been a tendency towards reduction of working hours by the agricultural labourer in localities which have come in touch with large labour employing centres such as Bombay, the Railway Companies, and the Tata Development Schemes. In Kanara which has been out of touch with such openings for large labour employing organisation there has been no such change except in the forest exploiting centres. The labourer in the former case commences his work one hour late in the morning and has moreover been very much irresponsible and in different particularly when working on hire for others at daily wages". The Deputy Director of Agriculture in Gujarat, however, reports that "there has been practically no change in hours of agricultural labour during the last ten years. In some places the labourers go about an hour late in the morning and in that case the noon recess is proportionately decreased. In this connection I may mention here that the labourer has turned rather indifferent as there are more fields for employment now than 10 years back and better wages can be earned in industrial and big cities".

33. The Deputy Director of Agriculture from the South Central Division, Poona, writes, that men in the Kopergaon Tract (District Ahmednagar) work from 7 a.m. to 12 noon with one hour's recess, and from 2 or 3 p.m. to 6-30 or 7 p.m.; while women work from 9-30 to 1 p.m. without recess, and from 2 or 2-30 to 6-30 or 7 p.m. He reports that the general understanding is that men work about 8 hours and women about 7 hours. In the Manjri Tract (Poona District) men work from 10 a.m. to 5 or 6 p.m. with one hour's recess, while women work from 11 a.m. to 5-30 p.m. with one hour's recess. In the Walva Taluka (District Satara), both men and women work from 10 a.m. to sunset with one hour's recess, but ten years ago labourers used to begin work much earlier than at present. In the picking of chillies, groundnut, cotton, etc., the contract system is in force, i.e., the labourers get a portion of the produce as wages. In the harvesting of jowar this system also prevails in this tract, the worker taking so many sheaves per 100 sheaves. In Ahmednagar, men engaged for one year work from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. Ten years ago they worked from 5 a.m. to 9 p.m. including indoor work. A day labourer now works from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. with one hour's recess whereas ten years ago he worked from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. with three hours' recess. In Sholapur the labourer is said to work from 8 a.m. to 12 noon and from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m. In the Walva Taluka in the Satara District it is said that agricultural labourers start work at 10 a.m. This seems peculiar to this area, but the Director of Agriculture states that further enquiries have been made, and that men and women work from 10 a.m. till sunset with one hour's recess in the eastern part of Walva, whereas in the western part of Walva men and women both work from 7-30 or 8 a.m. to 12 noon and from 1-30 or 2 p.m. to 6-30 p.m. The Deputy Director of Agriculture, Southern Division, Dharwar, reports that labourers work from 7 a.m. to 12 noon and from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m. Generally speaking the number of hours varies from 8 to 10 and are reported to be less than they were 10 years ago. In Sind, the Deputy

Director of Agriculture reports that working hours per day rarely exceed 9 against $10\frac{1}{2}$ ten years ago. The longest working hours are at Larkana, where in summer, the hours are now 10 against $11\frac{1}{2}$ ten years ago. During winter the working day has remained steady at 8 hours.

SECTION VIII—SIZE OF HOLDINGS.

34. It has been stated in paragraph 29 that the cultivator in the Decan leaves his holding because it is unable to support him and his family throughout the year. It is interesting, therefore, to examine the figures showing the size of holdings throughout the Presidency. Comparative figures are available only for 1921-22 and five years previously, namely for 1916-17. The size of each holding, the number of holdings and the average acreage of holdings are given in table Nos. 29, 30 and 31 on pages 113—117. Holdings, it will be seen, have increased in 5 years by 66,809 and this increase is spread over the Presidency as follows :—

35. The number of holdings of agriculturists has increased by 60,271 and of non-agriculturists* by 6,538. In the same period, however, the average size of holding has decreased from 15·8 acres to 15·4 acres. The decrease is small and is shown by divisions in the following table :—

The average size of the agriculturist's holding in the whole Presidency is 15 acres in 1921-22 as against 15·5 acres in 1916-17 and the non-agriculturist's holding is 18·9 acres in 1921-22 as against 18·8 acres in 1916-17. The most noticeable feature of this table is the smallness of the holdings in the Northern and Central Divisions especially as compared with those in Sind. Detailed figures will be found in table 31.

SUMMARY OF CONCLUSIONS.

36. For convenience of reference the points referred to in the Report may be summarised as follows :—

(i) The object of the enquiry was to ascertain the annual changes in agricultural wages from 1900 to the present time in all districts of the Presidency. Districts have been grouped by administrative divisions, and also by economic circles. (Paragraph 2.)

(ii) Statistics of the rates paid in or near the headquarters town in each district as representing wages in urban areas and for one other town in each district as representing wages in rural areas were collected. (Paragraph 4.)

(iii) The main groups of wage earners were classified as field labour, ordinary labour, and skilled labour.

(iv) The first half of the period under review was marked at the beginning by famine (in 1900-1901) and also by a considerable development in trade especially from 1904-1905. The second half of the period was the period of the world war. It was accompanied by the great influenza epidemic of 1918 and by a severe famine in 1918-19. The population which in 1911 amounted to 27·1 millions fell to 26·8 millions in 1921. (Paragraph 10.)

(v) It has not been possible, owing to differences in classification, to compare the numbers engaged in each occupation in 1901 with those in similar occupations in the censuses of 1911 and 1921. It is, however, possible to compare the census statistics of occupation in 1911 with those of 1921. (Paragraph 12.)

(v) The number of persons engaged in agriculture in the Presidency (excluding Native States) between 1911 and 1921 fell by 14 per cent. and the number of agricultural labourers by 37 per cent. in the same period. (Paragraph 15.)

(vi) The number of ordinary labourers in the Presidency (excluding Native States) has increased by 24 per cent. between 1911 and 1921. This is to be expected with the industrial growth of the Province. (Paragraph 16.)

(viii) The number of skilled labourers in the Presidency (excluding Native States) fell by 2 per cent. between 1911 and 1921. (Paragraph 17.)

(ix) The number of factory workers in the Presidency (excluding Native States) increased in 1921 by 49 per cent. over the number in 1911 and by 129 per cent. over that of 1900. (Paragraph 16.)

(x) The daily average wages of field labourers in urban areas in the Presidency (including Sind) amounted to 3 annas in 1900, to 4 annas 9 pies in 1913 and to 9 annas in 1922. The increase in the pre-war year (1913) as compared with 1900 amounted to 58 per cent.; in 1922 as compared with 1913 to 89 per cent. and in 1922 as compared with 1900 to 200 per cent. (Paragraph 19.)

(xi) The daily average wages of ordinary labourers in the urban areas of the Presidency (including Sind) were 4 annas 3 pies in 1900, 6 annas 3 pies in 1913, and 12 annas in 1922. The increase in the pre-war year, (1913) as compared with 1900 amounted to 47 per cent., in 1922 as compared with 1913 to 92 per cent. and in 1922 as compared with 1900 to 182 per cent. (Paragraph 20.)

(xii) The daily average wages of skilled labourers in the urban areas of the Presidency (including Sind) were 10 annas 9 pies in 1900, 13 annas 9 pies in 1913 and Rs. 1-10-9 in 1922. The increase in the pre-war year (1913) as compared with 1900 amounted to 28 per cent., in 1922 as compared with 1913 to 95 per cent. and in 1922 as compared with 1900 to 149 per cent. (Paragraph 21.)

(xiii) The daily average wages of field labourers in the rural areas of the Presidency (including Sind) amounted to 2 annas 6 pies in 1900, to 4 annas 3 pies in 1913 and to 7 annas 3 pies in 1922. The increase in the pre-war year (1913) as compared with 1900 amounted to 70 per cent., in 1922 as compared with 1913 to 71 per cent. and in 1922 as compared with 1900 to 190 per cent. (Paragraph 24.)

(xiv) The daily average wages of ordinary labourers in the rural areas of the Presidency (including Sind) amounted to 3 annas in 1900, to 5 annas 3 pies in 1913 and to 8 annas 6 pies in 1922. The increase in the pre-war year (1913) as compared with 1900 amounted to 75 per cent., in 1922 as compared with 1913 to 62 per cent. and in 1922 as compared with 1900 to 183 per cent. (Paragraph 24.)

(xv) The daily average wages of skilled labourers in the rural areas of the Presidency (including Sind) amounted to 9 annas in 1900, to

11 annas 9 pies in 1913 and to Rs. 1-5-0 in 1922. The increase in the pre-war year (1913) as compared with 1900 amounted to 31 per cent., in 1922 as compared with 1913 to 79 per cent. and in 1922 as compared with 1900 to 133 per cent. (Paragraph 24.)

(xvi) Real wages have increased in 1922 as compared with 1900 for all classes of labour. (Paragraph 28.)

(xvii) Real wages in urban areas as compared with the pre-war level have increased for all classes of labour ; in rural areas real wages have also risen for skilled labour, but have slightly fallen in the case of ordinary and field labour. (Paragraph 28.)

(xviii) Real wages in the Bombay Presidency have been compared with real wages in other countries including England and Wales, Australia and the United States. (Paragraph 31.)

(xix) The purchasing power of the agricultural labourer is summarised in paragraph 29.

(xx) The hours of labour have decreased on the whole as compared with 10 years ago. (Paragraph 32.)

(xxi) The number of holdings in the Presidency including Sind have increased by 3 per cent. as compared with five years ago. (Paragraph 34.)

(xxii) The average holding has fallen from 15·8 acres five years ago to 15 4 acres at the present time. (Paragraph 35.)

37. This Report is the second of a series in which the results of enquiries into the wages and hours of labour in the Bombay Presidency are analysed. In the preparation of the Report I should like to express my great obligations to the Commissioners of Divisions, District Officers, and especially to the Director of Agriculture (Dr. H. H. Mann, D.Sc.) and to the Deputy Secretary (Mr. A. R. Dalal, I.C.S.), Revenue Department. Acknowledgment is also due to the Printers (the Government Central Press and Photozinc Press) whose energetic co-operation is so well-known.

APPENDIX A.

History of Taluka Form No. XVIII.

In 1886, Mr. Ozanne, Director of Agriculture, drafted a memorandum on the method to be adopted for the recording of the prices of food-grains, fodder, and the price of labour ('wages of labour per diem for a man'). The division, at present in vogue, of the three main classes was introduced from that date and returns for three bazaar market towns in each taluka were prescribed. The figures were collected for one particular month in each year, and were intended to be the average of the daily rates in that month. The form drawn up by the Director of Agriculture was approved and incorporated into the 3rd edition of Symonds' "Manual of Revenue Accounts" as form No. 38. Commissioners were instructed to request the Collectors or district officers under them to supply to the Director of Agriculture the information in the form on the 10th April in each year. This continued from 1887 to 1899. The Settlement Officer appointed to revise the settlement of a part of the Taloda Taluka Khandesh, brought to the notice of Government the unreliable nature of the statistics collected in his report No. 80 dated 20th October 1896. The matter was referred for opinion to the Director of Agriculture, and to the Superintendents of Land Records. It was found that the form in which prices were recorded was defective and Mr. Symonds, the Survey Commissioner and Director of Land Records suggested a revised form No. 38 which was approved of by the Divisional Commissioners. Government sanctioned the use of this form in the Revenue Department Government Resolution No. 7110 dated the 7th October 1899 and prescribed (1) that the figures should be collected for the headquarters town of each Taluka and (2) that the monthly prices and wages instead of being forwarded once in each year should be submitted monthly. The revised form continues upto the present date with the exception that it has been renumbered in the Manual of Revenue Accounts by Mr. F. G. H. Anderson as Taluka Form No. XVIII.

This may be consulted for wages and other labour conditions in which the Ministry stated, in February 1923, that there had been little change since the report of the Enquiry. The Belgian Labour Party is now collecting information for the issue of a detailed statement on present remuneration in cash and kind.

Bulgaria.—Bulletin Statistique Mensuel de la Direction Generale de la Statistique du Royaume de Bulgarie. No. 7/8, 1922. The figures given are unweighted averages of the rates of wages of ploughmen with two oxen, in the neighbourhood of ten chief towns.

Czechoslovakia.—Bulletin de Statistique de la Republique Tchecoslovaque (monthly) and Rapports de l'office de Statistique de la Republique Tchecoslovaque (which appear at short intervals) both issued by the State Statistical Office, Prague, have already published material extracted from collective agreements in agriculture, and returns of agricultural wages are to be included in one or the other of these publications in the near future.

Denmark.—Arbejdslønninger i Landbruget (Official publication issued yearly, 1922 issue now due) in the series S. Meddelelsen. Copenhagen.

Statistisk Aarbog, 1920. Vort Landbrug, 12th April 1923. Det land økonomiske Driftsbureau. The pre-war figure is for the year 1910 and is an average for the whole country, including the peninsula and the islands, of the daily wages of adult male workers who provided their own board. The figure given for 1922 is an average for two periods November 1921—April 1922, and May 1922—October 1922, of the average daily wages of permanent workers who provided their own board.

France.—La main d'œuvre agricole. Monthly publication of la Société française de la Main d'œuvre agricole, 55, rue de Bellechasse, Paris. (Returns at irregular intervals give wages under collective agreements).

Bulletin de la Statistique Generale de la France, July 1917.

Bulletin du Ministère du Travail, January, February, March 1923. The pre-war figure is based on an enquiry conducted by the Ministry of Agriculture, and is an arithmetic average of the average daily wage in the different regions of the country of male agricultural workers in various Departments as fixed under the terms of the accident insurance law of 15th August 1914. The rates so fixed appear to differ somewhat from the actual rates paid, and are not strictly comparable with the pre-war rates.

Germany.—Fluctuations of wages are occasionally noted in the official publications of the various states, but the basic salary, which is chiefly in kind, is rarely given. The Labour Press is a good source particularly the *Korrespondenzblatt des Allgemeine Deutschen Gewerkschaftsbundes*, Berlin; see, for instance, article in issue of 23rd December 1922, for agricultural wages in kind at that date.

Italy—*Bollettino del Lavoro e della Previdenza Sociale*. Ministero per il Lavoro e la Previdenza Sociale, Rome, still appeared monthly through 1922 and gave returns of agricultural wages at irregular intervals. For a full record of rates of wages under collective agreements in 1920, see *I concordati collettivi di Lavoro stipulati dalla Federazione Nazionale dei lavoratori della terra*. Tipografia delle cartiere centrali, Rome, 1921. Published as supplement 36 to the *Bollettino del Lavoro*. Up to January 1923 collective agreements showed little change in agricultural wage rates since this record was published. In 1923 the Ministry of Labour was abolished.

Netherlands—*Maandschrift van het Centraal Bureau voor de Statistiek*. (monthly), gives wages as fixed by collective agreements, including agriculture (Can be obtained from N. V. Boekh, V II, Gebr. Behinfante, S-Gravenhage)

Norway.—*Arbeidslønnen i jordbruket*. Published yearly by the Kgl. Selskab for Norges Vel Christiania. (Royal Society for Norway's Welfare).

Arbeidslønninger, 1910; Arbeidslønnen i jordbruket for 1921-1922. The average daily wage rates in the summer half of the year 1910 are given of workers not provided with board. The post war figure, which is for the year 1921-1922 should be regarded as that in force in the summer of 1921, and is compared with the cost of living index number for July 1921. It is the average wage for work other than spring and harvest work. It is not clear whether the pre-war rate is for ordinary summer work or includes an allowance for the higher rates paid during the harvest season.

Poland—(Congress Poland). Wages of permanent agricultural labourers are given in *Livret de salaires des ouvriers permanents 1922-1923*, a report issued by the Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs, Warsaw. It may be obtained from Warsaw, Depot principal, ul. Sniadeckich, 5. For the territory formerly Prussian and Austrian, collective agreements in agriculture for 1922-23 are fully set out in the *Monitor Polski*. The official gazette of the Polish Government in the following numbers, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 7th, 9th and 10th October, 1922. The *Monitor* is published in Warsaw, ul. Miodowa, 22.

Sweden.—*Arbetartallgang. Arbetstad och arbetslön inom Sveriges jordbruk*. Stockholm. (In the series of Swedish official statistics). The Swedish Agricultural Labour Report, published by the Government Delegation to the Third International Labour Conference, 1921, also contains information on farmworkers' wages.
