† Bom. VI † of 1912. WHEREAS it is expedient further to amend the Bombay Medical Act, 1912, hereinafter called "the said Act" in manner hereinafter appearing; It is hereby enacted as follows:—

- 1. This Act may be called the Bombay short title. Medical (Amendment) Act, 1916.

An Act further to amend the Bombay Landing and Wharfage Fees Act, 1882.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Bombay
Landing and Wharfage Fees Act, 1882;
It is hereby enacted as follows:—

- 1. This Act may be called the Bombay Landing Shorttutle. and Wharfage Fees (Amendment) Act, 1916.
- 2. In section 4 of the Bombay Landing and Wharfage Fees Act, 1882, hereinafter called the said Act—
