IN THE YEAR 1913.

L. An Act to amend the Indian Extradition Act, 1903

- II " to consuldate and amend the law constituting the office of Official Trustee.
- III. " to consolidate and amend the law relating to the office and duties of Administrator General.
- IV. " for settling certain properties belonging to Sir Currimbhoy Ebrahm, Baronet, so as to accompany and support the title and dignity of a Baronet lately conferred on him by His Majesty King Goorge V to hold to him . and the heurs male of his body lawfully begotten, and to be hegotten, and for other purposes connected therewith
- V. " to prohibit the importation, manufacture and sale of matches made with white phosphorus



An Act to prohibit the importation, manufacture and sale of matches made with white phosphorus.

WHEREAS it is expedient to prohibit the importa-tion, manufacture and sale of matches made with white phosphorus; It is hereby enacted as follows ----

1. (1) This Act may be called the White Phos- Short title, extent and phorus Matches Prohibition Act, 1913. commence-

(3) It shall come into force on the first day of July, 1913, with the exception of section 6, which shall come into force on the first day of July, 1914

An Act to deelare the rights of Mussalmans to make settlements of property by way of "wakf" in favour of their families, children and descendants

WHEREAS doubts have arisen regarding the validity of wakfs created by persons professing the Mussalman faith in favour of themselves, their families, children and descendants and ultimately for the benefit of the poor or for other religious, pious or charitable purposes; and whereas it is expedient to remove such doubts; It is hereby enacted as follows —

1. (1) This Act may be called the Mussalman Short tute and Wakf Valuating Act, 1913

(2) It extends to the whole of British India

• 2. In this Act unless there is anything repugnant Definitions. in the subject or context,

- (1) "Wakf" means the permanent dedication by a person professing the Mussalman faith of any property for any purpose recognized by the Mussalman law as religious, pious or charitable
 - (2) "Hanafi Mussalman" means a follower of the Mussalman faith who conforms to the tenets and doctrines of the Hanafi school of Mussalman law.

3. It shall be lawful for any person professing the asimas to Mussalman faith to cleate a wakf which in all other errate crite a respects is in accordance with the provisions of Mus-wakfa salman law, for the following among other purposes.—

> (a) for the maintenance and support wholly or partially of his family, children or descendants, and
