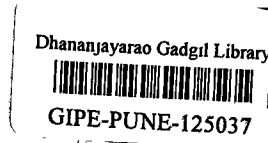

1871.

Act No. I.—An Act to provide for the Cost of Police employed in Towns and Suburbs where Act XXVI. of 1850 is in force.

Act No. II.—An Act for imposing duties on certain of the Non-agricultural Classes in the territories subordinate to the Presidency of Bombay.

1872.

Act No. I.—An Act to amend Act XIII. of 1856.

Act No. II.—An Act to secure the payment to Government of certain additional sums of money by the Corporation of the Justices of the Peace for the City of Bombay.

Act No. III.—An Act to provide for the management of the Municipal Affairs of the City of Bombay, and to make better provision for the Conservancy and improvement of the City, and for the levying of rates, taxes, and other income therein.
