Resolution—No. 104, Press, dated 21st December 1931.

The Board submits its report on the settlement of Land Revenue in the Madras Presidency for fasli 1340 (1930–31) together with the prescribed statements.

2. *Character of the season.*—The south-west monsoon set in about the middle of June. Under the influence of a depression on the Orissa-Ganjam Coast towards the end of the month the monsoon caused widespread and locally heavy rains on the north Madras coast on the last two days of the month. Outside the West Coast the rainfall in the month was generally above the average. It was feeble during July and August. About the second week of September, however, a depression formed in the Bay resulting in a fair amount of rain throughout the Presidency, although the rainfall was generally below the average except in Ganjam, Tinnevely, and the West Coast. On the whole the monsoon was generally below the average. The north-east monsoon began early in October and gave a copious rainfall throughout the month. A depression in the south-west of the Bay developed into a storm on the Coromandel coast by the 23rd of the month. The storm crossed the coast near Negapatam on the 24th October and, weakening into a depression, passed out into the Arabian Sea by the 26th causing extensive and, in some places, unprecedentedly heavy rainfall on its course. The result was that the Cauvery and its tributaries were in floods, roads, railway bridges and crops, especially in Tanjore and Trichinopoly, were damaged and communications between the south and the rest of the Presidency were cut off for about a week. The monsoon was active during the first week of November. On the 15th of the month a depression formed in the southern portion of the Bay of Bengal; the resulting storm moved in a north-westerly direction across the coast near Masulipatam on the 18th and very heavy rains fell, causing floods and breaches in railway lines on the north Madras coast. A deep depression on the 27th November in the south-west of the Bay developed into a very intense storm on the 28th which moved in a north-westerly direction, crossing the Coromandel coast between Cuddalore and Madras on the 29th of November. The rain and wind breached a number of tanks in Chingleput, South Arcot, Chittoor and North Arcot; the railway line was washed away in parts; and crops and property were damaged to some extent. In December and January the monsoon was generally feeble except in Anantapur, Cuddapah, Nellore, Chittoor, Salem, Coimbatore, and Madura. On the whole the north-east monsoon was generally above the average. There were practically no rains in February

and March. Owing to unsettled conditions in the south of the Bay of Bengal about the middle of the month, the April rainfall was below the average except in Chingleput, South Arcot, Trichinopoly, Tanjore, Madura and on the West Coast. The rainfall in May too was below the average except in Kistna, Kurnool, Bellary, Nellore, Chittoor, Tanjore and South Kanara. The sowings of early crops were generally fair or above normal except in the Carnatic and the central and southern districts. Sowings of the late crops were also generally satisfactory except in the Deccan and on the West Coast.

On the whole the season for the Presidency was fairly satisfactory except in the areas affected by floods and cyclones; both the area cropped and the net area sown were among the highest reported.

3. *Number of ryotwari villages.*—The total number of ryotwari villages in the fasli was 21,610 against 21,955 in the previous fasli. The decrease of 345 villages in the Presidency was the result of a decrease of 351 villages in Malabar and Salem and an increase of 6 villages in Ganjam, West Godavari, Nellore and Ramnad. The decrease of 339 villages in Malabar was due to the adoption, during resurvey in the Ponnani taluk, of the amsam as a unit in place of the desam. In Salem the decrease of twelve villages was due to the changes effected consequent on the resurvey and resettlement operations. The increase of two villages in Ganjam was due to the rectification of the incorrect figure adopted in previous years in the number of villages in Surada taluk. In Nellore the increase of two villages was due to the redistribution of the three bits of Saryepalli village into five. In each of the districts of West Godavari and Ramnad there was an increase of one village which was due to the resumption of an inam village in Chintalapudi taluk of the former and in Tiruvadana taluk of the latter.

4. The land revenue of the Presidency is derived from the following sources:—

- (a) Peshkash or revenue from permanently settled estates;
- (b) Shrotriyam jodi or quit-rent levied on inam villages;
- (c) assessment, including water-rate, on lands held under the ryotwari system; and
- (d) miscellaneous revenue.

5. *Peshkash or revenue from permanently settled estates.*—The total amount of peshkash payable during the fasli was Rupees 50,07,785 against Rs. 49,92,767 in the previous fasli. The increase of Rs. 15,018 is the result of—

7. *Holdings.*—The total extent of ryotwari holdings during the fasli was 27,610,000 acres which exceeded that of the previous year (as now revised) by 107,134 acres. There was an increase in all the districts except Tanjore and Ramnad, where there was a decrease of 522 acres and 260 acres respectively. The increase

was marked in the districts of Anantapur (27,845), South Kanara (11,020), Malabar (8,839), North Arcot (8,400), Kurnool (8,080) and Salem (6,834). The increase in Anantapur was due to the assignments made to the labouring classes and to the favourable season. In South Kanara the increase was due to the assignment of waste lands and to the changes consequent on the resurvey of some villages. In Malabar the introduction of the resurvey accounts in the Ponnani taluk and the transfer of unoccupied dry lands to occupied dry contributed to the increase. In North Arcot new assignments accounted for the increase. In Kurnool the increase was the result of assignments of large areas of waste lands and the resumption of artisan and other unenfranchised inams. The increase in Salem was due to assignment of new areas. The increase in the other districts is ascribed to assignments to siva-jama cultivators and in a minor degree to resumption of inams.

The small decrease in Tanjore was due to the acquisition of land for public purposes. The decrease in Ramnad was small and calls for no remarks.

8. *Assessment.*—The total assessment on holdings was Rupees 575·27 lakhs against Rs. 574·29 lakhs (as now revised) in the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 98,484. There was an increase in all the districts except Tanjore, where there was a decrease of Rs. 1,036. The increase was appreciable in the districts of West Godavari (Rs. 13,209), South Kanara (Rs. 9,904), Salem (Rs. 9,492), North Arcot (Rs. 8,029), Anantapur (Rs. 7,995), South Arcot (Rs. 5,990) and Trichinopoly (Rs. 5,579). The large increase in West Godavari was due to the resumption of an inam village in the Chintalapudi taluk, to the conversion of dry lands to wet and to the transfer of lands from poramboke to ayan. The reasons given in paragraph 7 above account for the increase in the other districts.

The slight decrease in Tanjore was, as already explained, due to the acquisition of land for public purposes.

9. *Cultivation.*—The total area cultivated in ryotwari holdings was 20·87 million acres against 20·90 million acres in the previous fasli. There was a net decrease of 61,671 acres under 'dry' and a net increase of 27,155 acres under 'wet'. The decrease under 'dry' was large in the districts of South Arcot (40,269 acres), Coimbatore (38,859 acres), Trichinopoly (28,846 acres) North Arcot (20,975 acres) and Madura (14,982 acres). The increase under 'wet' was marked in the districts of North Arcot (11,748 acres), West Godavari (8,842 acres) and Chittoor (7,142 acres). The decrease under 'dry' was due to inadequate rainfall during the season of dry cultivation and also to the low price of groundnut especially in South Arcot. The increase under 'wet' was due to

the favourable character of the season. The total 'area cultivated' during the year, including that under 'miscellaneous cultivation' was 21.93 million acres against 21.96 million acres in the previous fasli. There was an increase of 158,860 acres under 'waste charged'. In the area cultivated there was however an appreciable increase under 'dry' in the districts of Anantapur (69,240 acres), Chittoor (34,276 acres) and Kurnool (24,070 acres) due to the more favourable character of the season. Also there was a marked decrease under 'wet' in the Tanjore district (14,771 acres).

10. *Water-rate and second crop charge.*—The revenue derived from these sources amounted to Rs. 36.96 lakhs, against Rupees 32.54 lakhs in the previous fasli. There was a gross increase of Rs. 5,19,337 in certain districts and a gross decrease of Rupees 77,201 in others, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 4,42,136. The increase was marked in the districts of North Arcot (Rs. 1,28,315), Nellore (Rs. 1,13,898), Trichinopoly (Rs. 45,786), South Arcot (Rs. 33,721), Cuddapah (Rs. 30,882) and Anantapur (Rs. 30,571); while the decrease was appreciable in the districts of West Godavari (Rs. 45,972), Tinnevely (Rs. 14,149) and Madura (Rs. 10,512). The increase in North Arcot, Nellore and Cuddapah was due to the more favourable character of the season, as compared with the previous year. In Trichinopoly the increase was due to good rains in dry parts as well as a sufficient supply of water in the rivers. In South Arcot the extension of irrigation in the area under the Toludur Project in the Vriddhachalam taluk and a sufficient supply of water in the irrigation sources contributed to the increase under water-rate and second crop charge. In Anantapur the increase was due to good supplies in irrigation sources. In West Godavari the decrease was due to the conversion of many dry lands charged with water-rate into wet and also to the introduction of the rotation system for second crop. In Tinnevely unfavourable seasonal conditions were the cause of the decrease. In Madura the decrease was due mainly to the late rains and partly to economic depression, which accompanied the fall in prices of food grains, especially paddy.

11. *Remission.*—There was a total net remission during the fasli of Rs. 30,07,794. As compared with the previous year, there was an increase of Rs. 7,66,184. The increase was mostly under 'seasonal remissions' and was due to the unfavourable character of the season and to the inadequate supply of water in irrigation sources.

(i) *Seasonal remissions.*—There was an increase in some districts of Rs. 13,85,388 and a decrease of Rs. 6,25,115 in others, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 7,60,273. The increase

was very marked in Tanjore (Rs. 10,96,580) and was appreciable in the districts of Trichinopoly (Rs. 71,332) and South Arcot (Rs. 67,578) and occurred mainly under the heads 'land submerged or inundated' and 'shavi or loss of produce'.

(a) *Waste remitted.*—Remission under this head amounted to Rs. 2.56 lakhs, or Rs. 86,990 less than in the previous fasli. There was a decrease of Rs. 1,95,572 in some districts and an increase of Rs. 1,08,582 in others. The decrease was marked in the districts of North Arcot (Rs. 64,341), Chittoor (Rs. 38,377) and East Godavari (Rs. 17,493). There was, however, a marked increase in Tanjore (Rs. 77,433).

An amount of Rs. 95 on an extent of 178 acres of dry waste in Bellary was remitted under the authority of G.O. Mis. No. 600, Revenue, dated 16th March 1931, and a dry remission of Rs. 167 on an extent of 80 acres of sanded dry lands in Lalgudi and Trichinopoly taluks was granted under the authority of G.O. Mis. No. 532, Revenue, dated 6th April 1925.

(b) *Shavi and short crop.*—The total amount remitted under this head was Rs. 5,87,596 against Rs. 1,21,194 in the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 4,66,402. The increase was large in the districts of Tanjore (Rs. 3,38,240), Kistna (Rs. 38,749) and Bellary (Rs. 37,894), due to the unfavourable character of the season, while in most of the other districts there was a decrease.

(c) *Tirwakammi remissions* (i.e., the remission of the difference between wet and dry assessment on wet lands cultivated with dry crops owing to insufficiency or failure of water-supply) amounted to Rs. 2,60,495 against Rs. 6,19,719 in the previous fasli, showing a net decrease of Rs. 3,59,224. The decrease was appreciable in the districts of North Arcot (Rs. 1,28,890), Chittoor (Rs. 87,490), Madura (Rs. 35,114) and Nellore (Rs. 25,427); while there was a marked increase of Rs. 22,934 in Vizagapatam district. The decrease in the districts noted above was due to the favourable character of the season and to the irrigation sources having received sufficient supplies.

(d) *Injury by floods.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 6,86,036 against Rs. 4,725 in the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 6,81,311. The increase was large in Tanjore (Rs. 6,53,745) and Trichinopoly (Rs. 17,794) and was due to the damage caused by the floods of 1930.

(e) *Remission of second crop charge.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 89,035 as against Rs. 36,001 of the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 53,034. The increase was marked in the districts of Trichinopoly (Rs. 27,974), Tanjore (Rs. 25,532) and South Arcot (Rs. 16,721).

(ii) *Fixed Remissions* (i.e., abatement of demand granted for reasons unconnected with the season) amounted to Rs. 1.36 lakhs against Rs. 1.34 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 1,952. The increase occurred under most of the heads.

(iii) *Beriz deduction*.—Deductions made from village collections in favour of inamdars and religious institutions amounted to Rs. 9.84 lakhs against Rs. 9.80 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a net increase of Rs. 3,959. The increase occurred mainly under 'allowances to religious institutions in lieu of cash payments' and was appreciable in Tanjore (Rs. 34,169) under the same head. The increase was due to the fact that arrears of previous years amounting to Rs. 12,415 were disbursed during the fasli under review.

12. *Miscellaneous revenue*.—The revenue under this head amounted to Rs. 112.77 lakhs against Rs. 119.40 lakhs in the previous fasli. There was an increase of Rs. 3,33,206 in some districts and a decrease of Rs. 9,96,834 in others, resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 6,63,628. The decrease occurred under most of the heads. The several items are dealt with below :—

Item 1—Jodi and quit-rent on minor inams.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 23.51 lakhs against Rs. 23.50 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net increase being only Rs. 692.

Item 2 (a)—Second crop charge on minor inam wet lands in ryotwari villages.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 1.85 lakhs as against Rs. 1.53 lakhs of the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 32,230. The increase occurred in most of the districts, and was marked in Cuddapah (Rs. 27,104) and Nellore (Rs. 11,249).

Item 2 (b)—Water-rate on minor inams in ryotwari villages.—The revenue under this item was Rs. 13.79 lakhs against Rs. 13.85 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 5,844.

Item 3—Charge for water in Zamindari and inam villages including tirwajasti and fasaljasti items.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 24.28 lakhs against Rs. 24.48 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 19,816. The decrease was marked in West Godavari (Rs. 45,364). There was an increase in East Godavari (Rs. 14,120) and Nellore (Rs. 12,704).

Item 4—Enhanced water-rate on lands irregularly irrigated.—The revenue under this item was Rs. 4.73 lakhs against Rs. 6.64 lakhs in the previous fasli. There was thus a net decrease of Rs. 1.91 lakhs and it was marked in Guntur (Rs. 57,708), Kistna (Rs. 35,795) and Madura (Rs. 31,638).

Item 5—Charges levied for occupation (with or without application) of assessed and unassessed lands not assigned.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 6.68 lakhs against Rs. 7.55 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a net decrease of Rs. 87,360. The decrease was large in Kistna (Rs. 39,995) and West Godavari (Rs. 15,168).

Item 6—Charges levied for occupation of poramboke lands.—The revenue derived under this head during the fasli was Rs. 5.63 lakhs against Rs. 6.51 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 88,068. The decrease was appreciable in Guntur (Rs. 25,693), South Arcot (Rs. 20,186) and North Arcot (Rs. 16,812). There was however an increase of Rs. 13,156 in Kistna.

Enhanced charges amounting to Rs. 3,12,097 were levied on an extent of 30,915 acres against Rs. 4,25,323 on an extent of 32,670 acres in the previous year, showing an incidence of Rs. 10 per acre against Rs. 13 per acre in the previous fasli. The highest average rates were Rs. 74 in Ramnad, Rs. 63 in Tinnevely and Rs. 61 in East Godavari and these were evidently due to the levy of prohibitive penalties in the case of persistent encroachments continued from previous faslis.

There were no porambokes to be reclassified in the districts of Madras and Malabar. The work of reclassification is reported to have been practically completed in all the districts. From the reports it is, however, observed that taram assessment was levied on an extent of 99,371 acres of poramboke lands against 88,366 acres in the previous fasli. Such occupation was extensive in the districts of Guntur (14,288 acres), Salem (12,548 acres), Anantapur (11,351 acres), Kistna (9,089 acres), Kurnool (7,541 acres), Tanjore (6,686 acres), Bellary (6,252 acres) and North Arcot (5,011 acres).

In Vizagapatam proposals for the transfer of certain cases of poramboke to ayan have been sanctioned since the date of the last report and some others are pending disposal. In Cuddapah the reclassification of porambokes is reported to have been completed in all the taluks. In Bellary there were unobjectionable occupations mostly by depressed classes and by other longstanding Sivayi-jamadars, pending subdivision and transfer to ayan. The work of assignment is retarded to some extent by the fact that many villages are affected by the Tungabhadra Project, where Government orders prohibiting assignment are in force. In Kurnool the penal provisions of the Land Encroachment Act were freely resorted to in really objectionable cases. An extent of 497 acres of poramboke land was transferred to assessed during the fasli as a result

of inspection. In Chittoor an extent of 6,430 acres of land reserved was assigned to depressed class members to the end of June 1931. An extent of 7,815 acres of land not specially reserved was also assigned to 1,772 members subject to the condition that they should not be alienated. In North Arcot transfer of certain poramboke lands to ayan was sanctioned. Only ordinary rate was charged in cases where the occupation was unobjectionable. In South Arcot drastic steps are being taken to put an end to all objectionable occupations on real porambokes and only taram assessment is usually charged for unobjectionable occupations in 'natham' porambokes for habitation and other domestic purposes, and for cultivation in unreserved forests, swamp and hill porambokes; in that district there was a distinct fall in the unauthorized occupation of porambokes owing to the stringent application of the penal provisions of Act III of 1905. In Tanjore only an extent of 12.28 acres of poramboke was transferred to assessed waste for purposes of assignment, as no assignments can be made in a major portion of the district till the completion of the Cauvery-Mettur Project. In Trichinopoly an extent of 138.74 acres of poramboke land was transferred to assessed waste during the fasli. The remaining cases were such as could not be so transferred. In Madura it is reported that the handling by the Revenue subordinates of cases of poramboke cultivation was unsatisfactory, and clear and detailed instructions on the subject have recently been issued. In the Nilgiris an extent of 580 acres of poramboke land was transferred to assessed waste and assigned during the fasli. The Collectors of the other districts also report that steps have been taken to transfer to ayan poramboke lands, the occupation of which is unobjectionable.

Item 7—Revenue derived from tree tax.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 3.92 lakhs against Rs. 3.85 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net increase being only Rs. 6,557.

Item 8—Commission from estates under Court of Wards management.—The amount of revenue derived under this head was Rs. 43,454 against Rs. 42,122 in the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 1,332. The increase was appreciable in Ramnad district (Rs. 1,515).

Item 10—Sale-proceeds of lands sold.—The revenue shown under this head was Rs. 3.85 lakhs against Rs. 7.19 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a decrease of Rs. 3.34 lakhs. The decrease was large in the districts of Coimbatore (Rs. 1,32,108). The Nilgiris (Rs. 91,305) and South Arcot (Rs. 50,013); and it was probably due to the tightness of the money market.

Item 11—Rent of lankas.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 6.14 lakhs against Rs. 6.42 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 28,511. The decrease was large in West Godavari (Rs. 13,839) and East Godavari (Rs. 13,153).

Item 12—Quit-rent and ground-rent.—The amount of revenue under this head was Rs. 2.20 lakhs against Rs. 2.30 lakhs of the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 9,735.

13. The net ryotwari demand including water-rate, second crop charge and miscellaneous revenue amounted to Rs. 694.93 lakhs against Rs. 703.82 lakhs (as now revised), in the previous fasli. The details for the decrease of Rs. 8.89 lakhs are given below:—

16. *Demand and collection of land revenue and cesses (current).*—The current demand under land revenue and cesses during the fasli was Rs. 8,55,21,246. A sum of Rs. 8,39,39,246 or 98.15 per cent was collected within the fasli and Rs. 96,156 was written off the accounts. The percentage of collection during the previous fasli was 99.27.

17. *Demand and collection of arrears.*—The total arrear demand under all the heads amounted to Rs. 8,31,732. A sum of Rs. 5,67,796 or 68.27 per cent was collected (against 64.25 per cent in the previous fasli) and a sum of Rs. 72,912 or 8.77 per cent was written off the accounts.

18. The balance outstanding at the end of the fasli including both arrears and current was Rs. 16,76,865 against Rs. 8,30,262 at the end of the previous fasli. As reported by Collectors in their demand, collection and balance statements for October 1931 the balance at the beginning of fasli 1341 was Rs. 16,76,834. Up to the end of October 1931 a sum of Rs. 10,56,623 was collected and Rs. 11,180 written off the accounts. Proposals had been made to write off Rs. 1,171. The net recoverable balance on 1st November 1931 was Rs. 6,07,860. Of this amount, the collection of Rs. 3,88,072 was covered by suspensions or postponements chiefly in the districts of East Godavari, West Godavari, Kistna and Bellary. Deducting this amount the collectable balance on 1st November 1931 was Rs. 2,19,788.

19. *Reconciliation of differences between the collection of land revenue and cesses as shown in the jamabandi and the Accountant-General's statements and overpayments.*—This is carried out month by month along with the reconciliation of figures of expenditure.

20. *Adjustment to local boards of cesses collected during the fasli.*—Land revenue and cesses are collected together and the distribution of the total collections between 'land revenue' and 'cesses' is effected in the Collector's office after the compilation of the accounts relating to the fasli year.

Statements showing the amounts collected during fasli 1340 on behalf of local boards, the payments made to them during the fasli and the amounts to be finally adjusted either to their credit or debit are being received from Collectors. After verification by the Accountant-General of the amounts shown by Collectors as payments made to local boards, the recovery of the overpayments is being watched by the Board in accordance with the instructions contained in paragraph 3 of G.O. No. 5197, L. & M., dated the 7th December 1926.

21. *Charges debitable to land revenue.*—The charges of the Land Revenue Department are shown in the accounts under the head '22. General Administration.' The district administration

charges excluding village establishments amounted to Rs. 115·05 lakhs during fasli 1340. The village service charges (including those of proprietary estates) during the fasli were 125·90 lakhs. The total charges amounted to 240·95 lakhs or 28·17 per cent of the total land revenue and cesses collected. It must, however, be borne in mind that this amount does not represent merely the cost of collecting the land revenue. The Land Revenue Department performs multifarious duties of which the control and collection of land revenue is only one. The village establishment in particular is the servant of all departments of the Government. Moreover, a considerable portion of the time of the Collector and his subordinate officials is occupied with magisterial work. While the actual cost of collecting the land revenue cannot be estimated with any degree of accuracy, it is certainly far less than the figure shown above.

22. *Processes under Act II of 1864.*—Statement No. 12 gives particulars of coercive processes issued for the realization of Government dues under Act II of 1864. The following extract shows the number of processes of each kind issued during the year as compared with the figures for the three preceding faslis:—

The increase under all heads is attributed by Collectors generally to the economic depression and the fall of prices of food-crops. In Chingleput, North Arcot, South Arcot, Tanjore and Trichinopoly the larger number of coercive processes was also due to the damage caused to crops by the floods in November 1930.

23. *Demand notices.*—There was an increase in the number of demand notices issued during the fasli as compared with the three previous faslis.

24. *Distrainment or attachment notices.*—There was also an increase in the number of distrainment or attachment notices when compared with the previous faslis.

25. There was a slight increase in the percentage of the number of distrainments and attachments of personal property to that of demand notices when compared with the last fasli. In respect of real property also there is an increase in percentage over that of last fasli by 0·08.

The number of defaulters whose immovable property was attached during the fasli was 21,434 against 15,529 in fasli 1339.

26. *Sale notices.*—Out of 99,469 defaulters whose property was attached only 42.66 per cent paid up the arrears before sale notices were issued as against 43.57 in the last fasli. The number of attachments was largest in South Arcot during the fasli (16,702).

27. *Sales.*—The number of defaulters whose property was sold was greater than in fasli 1339 by 1927. There was an increase in the number of sales of both real and personal property. The percentage borne by actual sales to sale notices in the Presidency was only 11.90 against 12.79 in fasli 1339; but the percentage of the number of defaulters whose properties were sold to the total number of holdings was 0.12 against 0.09 in the previous fasli. The statement below shows the particulars of sales in fasli 1340, compared with those for the preceding three faslis.

Value of lands sold.—Immovable property of the value of Rs. 3,76,530 was sold for the recovery of arrears amounting to Rs. 80,481. The sum realized was Rs. 1,13,025. The value of land was noticeably disproportionate to the arrears in Vizagapatam, Cuddapah, Chingleput, North Arcot, South Arcot, Tanjore, Madura, Ramnad, Coimbatore, Salem and South Kanara. The Collector of Chingleput explains that it was partly due to the fact that in cases of default by military assignees the entire extents assigned are generally attached, and that in many cases they had to be bought in by Government for want of bidders. The Collector of South Arcot remarks that the estimates made by Village Officers were not judicious. The Collector of Tanjore points out that smaller plots proportionate to the arrears were not available for attachment. The Collector of Madura remarks that the discrepancy is due to overestimation, attachment of whole holdings for the arrears and combination amongst bidders, which resulted in the lands being bought in by Government for nominal amounts. - The other Collectors make no special mention of this point, but the reasons are probably similar to those reported to Government in B.P. Routine No. 2337, dated the 21st April 1927. The prices fetched by lands sold to private individuals amounted on the average to $6\frac{1}{2}$ times the assessment in the case of dry lands and $8\frac{1}{2}$ times the assessment in the case of wet lands. In fasli 1339 immovable property of the estimated value of Rs. 2,65,976 was sold for the recovery of arrears amounting to Rs. 46,716 and the amount realized was Rs. 93,442. The average price fetched for lands sold to private individuals was higher than that fetched during fasli 1340 being $7\frac{1}{2}$ times the assessment in the case of dry lands and $9\frac{1}{2}$ times the assessment in the case of wet lands.

Extent of land sold.—The extent of land sold to private individuals in the fasli was 24,588.89 acres under dry and 2,909.64 acres under wet against 8,483.70 acres and 1,187.92 acres respectively in fasli 1339. The total area bought in by Government for want of bidders was 19,427.12 acres under dry and 1,215.94 acres under wet against 3,669.48 and 1,056.75 acres respectively in fasli 1339.

28. *Process-serving establishment.*—Statement No. 13 gives particulars of processes served by the ordinary village agency and by special establishments and of the fees realized during the year. The total number of processes served by the village agency was 1,033,948 or 252,275 more than in fasli 1339. The number of processes served by the special agency (53,123) exceeded that in the previous fasli by 19,511.

29. *Costs in Civil Suits.*—Rupees 30,941 was awarded to Government as costs during the fasli. Including Rs. 39,609, the revised opening balance, the total demand was Rs. 70,550 of which Rs. 26,293 was collected, Rs. 4,460 written off the accounts, and Rs. 31, recommended to be written off. The net recoverable balance at the end of the fasli was Rs. 39,766 made up of the following items:—

30. *Interest on arrears of land revenue (statement No. 14).*—The total demand on account of arrears of land revenue including the balance at the beginning of the fasli was Rs. 35,098 of which Rs. 13,405 was collected and Rs. 2,563 remitted leaving a balance of Rs. 19,130 against 19,088 in the previous fasli. The balance exceeds Rs. 1,000 in the districts of Chittoor, South Arcot, Tanjore, Madura and Ramnad as in the previous fasli.

31. *Sale of lands under Board's Standing Orders Nos. 15, 16, 21, 22, 45, 90 and 91.*—Under the rules for the sale of occupancy right in lands at the disposal of Government (Standing Order No. 15) 3,654.56 acres assessed at Rs. 5,813 were sold for Rs. 24,506; 10.37 acres, 650 square links and 9,077 square feet of house-sites in towns assessed at Rs. 48-4-0 were sold for Rs. 15,866 under Standing Order No. 21; 14.47 acres and 281 square feet occupied by Government departments were sold for Rs. 614 under Standing Order No. 22 and 375.26 acres of land bought in by Government at sales for arrears of revenue were resold under Standing Order No. 45 for Rs. 5,211. 4.96 acres which had been acquired for public purposes and were subsequently relinquished were sold under Standing Order No. 90 for Rs. 653. One cent of land for which the Railway is not likely to have any further use was sold for Rs. 2-8-0 under Standing Order No. 91. Nine grounds and 24 square feet of lands were sold in Madras for Rs. 231 under the special rules governing the disposal of vacant lands in the city.

32. *Subdivision of quit-rent.*—No applications were received during the year under Standing Order No. 58 for the subdivision of joint liability of shareholders in whole villages or inams.

33. *Transfer of registry of holdings.*—Transfers of revenue registry fall under the following main heads:—

(i) Transfers made with reference to applications and notices received from Sub-Registrars, and

(ii) transfers effected on applications and intimations received from parties, village officers and others.

(i) Under the first head 304,277 applications were received during the fasli as against 372,473 in the previous fasli, the decrease being 68,196 or about 18·31 per cent. The bulk of the decrease occurred in Guntur (9,896), South Arcot (9,544), North Arcot (8,780) and Coimbatore (5,907).

(ii) Under the second head the number received was 153,367 against 161,079 in the previous fasli, showing a net decrease of 7,712. The decrease occurred in most of the districts and was marked in Tinnevely (3,540), Chittoor (2,997), Coimbatore (2,482), Bellary (2,427) and Cuddapah (2,102). There was, however, an appreciable increase in Madura (3,587), Ganjam (2,245) and Anantapur (1,096).

The total number of applications of all kinds including the number pending disposal at the beginning of the fasli was 539,451 of which 470,104 were disposed of during the fasli, leaving a balance of 69,347 (or about 12·9 per cent of the total number) as against 81,800 (or about 13·2 per cent of the total number) in the previous fasli. Of the total number of applications disposed of during the fasli 175,399 or about 37·3 per cent were rejected and 3,624 were transferred to Deputy Tahsildars for disposal. The rejections were chiefly due to defective title, failure to produce documentary evidence and failure to pay subdivision fees. The percentage of pendency was high in the districts of Vizagapatam (25), Anantapur (22), Ganjam (21), Guntur (20), Nellore (18), Cuddapah (17), East Godavari (16), South Arcot (16), Kurnool (15), The Nilgiris (15), Bellary (14), Chittoor (14) and North Arcot (14). The Collector of Cuddapah reports that the pendency was due to the receipt of a large number of applications from the Registration Department which the existing taluk staff could not dispose of expeditiously. The Collectors of Bellary and South Arcot expect that the recent orders abolishing the subdivision fees will facilitate this branch of work; and the Board agrees with them in their expectation.

34. *Jamabandi.*—The rule laid down in paragraph 2 of Board's Standing Order No. 12 that the settlement of each taluk should generally be conducted by the Collector himself once in five years was complied with in all the districts except in the case

of the Vinukonda taluk of the Guntur district. -In this case it was conducted by the Personal Assistant Deputy Collector, Guntur, in fasli 1340, this procedure being in accordance with the orders contained in G.O. No. 1050, Revenue, dated 15th May 1931.

35. *Loans and Advances.*—The advances made under the Land Improvement Loans Act during the year amounted to Rs. 4.20 lakhs and those made under the Agriculturists' Loans Act to Rs. 10.56 lakhs making a total of Rs. 14.76 lakhs against Rs. 14.31 lakhs in the previous year. The difference was the net result of an increase in thirteen districts and a decrease in twelve districts. The increase was most marked in Trichinopoly and Tanjore and the decrease in Chittoor.

36. Including the uncollected balance outstanding at the close of the previous year a sum of Rs. 7.79 lakhs was repayable during the year under the Land Improvement Loans Act on account of principal while the amount repayable under the Agriculturists' Loans Act was Rs. 11.51 lakhs. Of these amounts Rs. 6.02 lakhs or 77.3 per cent under the former Act and Rs. 8.92 lakhs or 77.5 per cent under the latter Act were collected. Sums amounting to Rs. 0.51 lakh under the Land Improvement Loans Act and Rs. 0.25 lakh under the Agriculturists' Loans Act were repaid by the borrowers on account of loans the repayment of which had not fallen due, while Rs. 6,158 and Rs. 4,821 were written off as irrecoverable under the Land Improvement Loans and Agriculturists' Loans Act respectively.

37. *Coercive processes.*—The aggregate amount of principal and interest repayable during the year under both the Acts, including the balance remaining unpaid out of sums which fell due in previous years was Rs. 27,24,871 of which a sum of Rs. 6,00,937 or 22.1 per cent was collected without resort to coercive processes, and a sum of Rs. 13,63,579 or 50 per cent after the issue of demand notices. A sum of Rs. 1,50,360 was collected after the attachment of property but before sale, while the amounts realized by the sale of movable and immovable properties were Rs. 5,114 and Rs. 11,751 respectively. A sum of Rs. 12,123 was written off as irrecoverable under both principal and interest under both the Acts. The balance outstanding at the close of the year was Rs. 5,81,007. It was very heavy in Bellary (Rs. 93,914), Anantapur (Rs. 80,482) and Coimbatore (Rs. 1,32,688).

38. The number of wells newly constructed and the number repaired during the year with the aid of loans under the Land

Improvement Loans Act are shown below with the corresponding figures for the previous year:—

The largest number of wells (113) constructed or repaired during the year was in Salem. The numbers were also large in North Arcot (86) and Madura (96).

A sum of Rs. 1,13,050 was spent during the year on the reclamation of 2,412 acres of land against Rs. 89,886 and 1,738 acres in the previous year. The largest amount spent was in Ganjam Rs. 26,825 on 494 acres. Rupees 5,050 were spent in Salem and Tinnevely districts for the installation of oil engines to benefit 31 acres of land. Rupees 18,814 were spent on other improvements such as the removal of nuth grass, the construction of bunds and the lowering of the level of fields, benefiting altogether 703 acres.

The following statement shows the purposes for which the advances made to cultivators under the Agriculturists' Loans Act were utilized during the two faslis 1339 and 1340.

Of the total amount of advances outstanding against Collectors including the amounts referred to above, a sum of Rs. 1,05,976 was adjusted during the year leaving a net debit of Rs. 2,45,970 under 'Revenue Survey Advances—Collectors.'

Under the head 'Cost of survey marks—Collectors' a sum of Rs. 80,436 was collected during the year leaving a balance of Rs. 10,844 to be realized. The arrear outstanding at the beginning of the year under 'Cost of survey marks—Survey Officers' was Rs. 1,19,090. Fresh landholders' bills for Rs. 1,36,239 were received from Survey Officers during the year. Of the total demand of Rs. 2,55,329 a sum of Rs. 1,67,803 was collected leaving a balance of Rs. 87,526. The major portion of the balance is outstanding in the district of Malabar where there is an arrear of Rs. 81,229 to be collected. This amount includes a sum of Rs. 39,253 on account of instalments not due in the year. The actual balance for collection at the end of the year was Rs. 41,976 and this has since been reduced to Rs. 14,547.

40. *Junior Civilian's*.—The reports from Collectors show generally that their Civilian Divisional Officers possessed an adequate knowledge of the vernaculars and that the progress of Assistant Collectors was satisfactory.

41. *Effect of recent legislation on the people*.—No new enactment affecting the agricultural classes generally was passed during the fasli under report. The Madras Hindu Religious Endowments Act has not been in force for a sufficiently long period to call for any special remarks. The Collector of Cuddapah states that not much useful work has as yet been done under the Act and that the people are only just beginning to realize its advantages. The Collector of North Arcot reports that the introduction of the Village Officers' Restoration Act has facilitated prompt collection of land revenue. The Collectors of Trichinopoly and Madura report that the advantages of the Madras Agricultural Pests and Diseases Act are now more appreciated by the ryots than in previous years.

The Madras Decentralization Act, which empowered Tahsildars and Deputy Tahsildars to charge enhanced assessment in cases of unauthorized occupation and to deal with cases of irregular irrigation, is reported to have worked satisfactorily. The new District Municipalities Act, the Local Boards Act and the Village Courts Act afforded greater opportunities to the people to participate in the administration of local affairs and local self-government than before. The panchayat courts are gradually becoming popular. A number of Collectors report that the Sarda Act not having been enforced rigidly, the significance of its provisions has not yet been fully realized by the people. In Vizagapatam some child marriages took place and in one case the accused was fined Rs. 25. In East Godavari one case ended in acquittal. The Collector of Bellary reports that the Act is a dead letter. The Madras Act I of 1908 and the Land Encroachment Act III of 1905 worked well during the fasli. The Collector of Ganjam reports that the number of suits for the recovery of rents was on the increase. The Collector of Madura reports that the relationship between landlords and tenants was generally good. The legislation regarding the enfranchisement of Devadasi inams is appreciated by the people and enfranchisement proposals are under consideration. The benefits of the Hereditary Village Officers' Amendment Act, 1930, affect only those persons who hold village officers' posts. The Madras Local Boards Amendment Act, 1930, the Madras District Municipalities Amendment Act, 1930, and the Motor Vehicles Taxation Act, 1931, have come into force only recently. Ordinary villagers, however, have been much relieved by the abolition of tolls under the latter Act.

42. *Enhanced water-cess on irregular irrigation.*—The system of publishing a general or collective notice in each village in accordance with B.P. No. 58, Settlement, dated 10th April 1919, is reported to have worked fairly well, and the Tahsildars have generally exercised their powers judiciously. In general, the ryots are aware of the rules and make timely representations to the Jamabandi officers. The system resulted in the prompt investigation of objections and a reduction in the number of water-rate appeals. In cases where Government water was taken without permission deterrent penalties were imposed. The Collector of Coimbatore reports that the Tahsildars and Deputy Tahsildars showed a tendency to apply the rules without due discrimination and that a more judicious method of charging penalty was impressed on them.

43. *Tank-bed cultivation.*—There are no tank-bed lands fit for cultivation in the districts of Madras, the Nilgiris, Malabar and

South Kanara. In their Order Mis. No. 1613, Revenue, dated 2nd September 1922, Government withdrew the special concessions relating to tank-bed cultivation. In Nellore tank-bed cultivation was rigidly repressed in the fasli under report. In cases where the depressed classes and others persisted in occupying these lands the occupiers were evicted, and, where this was not possible, deterrent penalties were imposed. In Cuddapah 197 acres of tank-bed lands were cultivated during the fasli and the revenue derived was Rs. 1,164. Enhanced assessment to an extent of Rs. 875 was imposed for unauthorized occupation. Permission for temporary cultivation of the tank-bed of Nayunicheruvu in the Vémula village of Pulivendla taluk was granted by the Collector and an extent of 17.54 acres cultivated in this tank-bed was charged with the highest dry rate of the village. In Anantapur permission was granted in respect of a few tanks for cultivation of tank-beds with melons and cucumbers. Unauthorized cultivation of an objectionable nature was penalized under the provisions of the Madras Act III of 1905. In Bellary permission was granted to cultivate water-melons in the bed of one tank in Rayadrug taluk. In Kurnool and Chingleput there were no cases of such permission being granted during the fasli, and stray cases of unauthorized cultivation were suitably dealt with. In North Arcot an extent of 174 acres was cultivated with melons and food-grains without permission, and the rule of imposing penalty in addition to the highest dry rate was generally carried out. In Trichinopoly an extent of 21 acres in two taluks was cultivated and an amount of Rs. 30 was realized. In Ramnad and Coimbatore there was tank-bed cultivation in certain taluks. In Salem cucumber cultivation in the bed of a tank in Namakkal taluk was permitted by the Collector and the tank was not adversely affected by the cultivation. In other districts there were no cases of tank-bed cultivation.

44. *Examination of Village and Taluk Accounts.*—The maintenance of these accounts was fairly satisfactory and no general errors of a serious nature were disclosed. Such minor defects as were noticed were duly rectified. The Collector of Anantapur reports that the accounts of Anantapur, Kalyandrug, Gooty and Dharmavaram taluks have not been checked, and that the Revenue Divisional Officers concerned have been instructed to complete the work soon. In Bellary the inspection of Taluk Accounts has yet to be completed in the case of Alur taluk and it is reported that the Revenue Divisional Officer concerned is attending to the work. In Chingleput district the Sub-Collector, Chingleput, and the Revenue Divisional Officer, Saidapet taluk, have still to complete the checking of the accounts.

45. *The taluk and village statistical registers.*—The taluk statistical registers prescribed in the Manual of Taluk Accounts (Special) were maintained in the districts of Malabar, South Kanara and the Nilgiris, and the village statistical registers were maintained in all the ryotwari villages of the other districts. The following statement shows the progress made in the writing up and checking of registers up to and during fasli 1340:—

46. *Minor Irrigation.*—Statement No. 19 shows for each district the number of irrigation works in charge of the Revenue Department, the number repaired and the amount spent on them during the official year ending 31st March 1931. It also shows the number proposed for repair during the official year ending 31st March 1932.

47. *Conference with ryots.*—In Ganjam informal conferences were held by Revenue Divisional Officers and by the Executive Engineer, Ganjam, at fixed centres, when revenue and irrigation matters were discussed with ryots and action was taken in all cases. At some of these conferences Agricultural Demonstrators were

present and instructed the ryots in improved methods of agriculture. In Vizagapatam no informal conferences were held during the fashi. The Collector, Revenue Divisional Officers and Tahsildars have, however, made enquiries during their tours regarding the needs of the ryots. In East Godavari the settling officers held conferences with the ryots during jamabandi and the officers of the Public Works Department did so when occasion offered. In West Godavari an informal conference was held by the Collector at Narsapur when questions of general importance were discussed. The Collectors of Guntur and South Arcot report that the ryots were given ample opportunity to represent their grievances during the tours of Government officials as well as at the time of jamabandi, and that their requests were duly considered. In Nellore conferences were held during jamabandi when the grievances of ryots were considered. Special irrigation conferences were also held, as usual, in the taluks of Nellore and Kovur. In Cuddapah the Collector and the Revenue Divisional Officers held informal conferences with ryots during their tours as well as at jamabandi, when matters relating to sanitation, education, grazing fees, repairs to irrigation sources, formation of roads, etc., were discussed and action was taken where necessary. The Collector of Anantapur held a conference with the ryots at Hindupur when the usefulness of the Agricultural Department was clearly explained. In Bellary the Collector held a conference of the ryots and village officers at Paramadevanahalli at which the Deputy Director of Agriculture and his assistants demonstrated the use of up-to-date agricultural implements for ploughing, the preservation of green manure throughout the year, etc.; similar conferences were held by the Revenue Divisional Officers and Public Works Department and Agricultural Officers. In Kurnool the Collector held conferences with ryots during the jamabandi of Pattikonda and Kurnool taluks. The local Agricultural Demonstrator held a conference in Kurnool, when special varieties of seed, grains, manures and improved agricultural implements were exhibited. The Revenue Divisional Officers of Dhone and Markapur also held similar conferences during the jamabandi of Dhone, Sirvel, Markapur and Cumbum taluks. The Collector of Chingleput reports that irrigation conferences were held at the headquarters of the Revenue Divisions of the district in which the Executive Engineer, the Revenue Divisional Officer and the leading ryots took part. During the general tours of the Collector and the Revenue Divisional Officers interviews were freely granted to the leading ryots. In Chittoor the Collector and the Revenue Divisional Officers held informal conferences during jamabandi, when individual requests for repairs

to irrigation sources and matters relating to forest panchayats were considered. Conferences were held with the leading ryots in North Arcot, when lectures were delivered on village sanitation, agriculture, forest, village panchayat and kudimaramat. In Tanjore conferences with the ryots were held in all the taluks, at some of which officers of the Agricultural Department and Public Works Department were present, while in others officers of the Veterinary and the Co-operative departments took part. At these conferences matters relating to irrigation, drainage and improved cultivation were discussed. In Trichinopoly the Collector held conferences with the ryots during jamabandi at Perambalur and Musiri, at which the Deputy Registrar of Co-operative Societies was present. Lectures were delivered on recent improved methods of ploughing, the use of irrigation pumps, the benefits of co-operation and the treatment of epidemic diseases of cattle. In Madura and Tinnevely irrigation conferences were held by the Executive Engineer at certain centres. In Ramnad the Sub-Collector held a conference at Aruppukkottai at which the ryots' grievances regarding transfer of registry were considered. In Coimbatore and the Nilgiris conferences were held by jamabandi officers, at which no special grievances were brought to notice. In Salem the ryots represented their grievances to the jambandi officers, which were duly considered. In South Kanara ryots' conferences were held and the representations made at them were communicated to the heads of the departments concerned, wherever necessary. The main points of discussion related to the eradication of 'touch-me-not' and the necessity of having public wells in certain villages. In Malabar the Revenue officials have kept in touch with the ryots and the Agricultural Officers have utilized the occasion of jamabandi to hold Agricultural demonstrations, which, however, attracted little attention from the public. The ryots of Malabar, as usual, showed little interest in jamabandi.

48. *Extent to which the inspections of subordinate offices have been carried out by the Board, Collectors and Revenue Divisional Officers.*—The reports received from the Collectors show that there were very few subordinate offices which had not been inspected by themselves and their Revenue Divisional Officers.

The Land Revenue Commissioner has so far made a detailed inspection of the Guntur, South Arcot, Cuddapah, Kurnool, Anantapur and Chingleput Collectors' offices.

A scrutiny of the notes of inspection, both of subordinate offices by Collectors and of Collectors' offices by the Board shows that the administration on the whole is in a thoroughly efficient condition, Collectors' notes on divisional offices have been thorough, and the

Board in reviewing them, has (as in the past) taken the opportunity of pointing out any marked defects. Only rarely has it found it necessary to express its displeasure at the work of individual officers. The systematic recording of the work of all junior Revenue Divisional Officers continued throughout the fasli.

49. *Rent roll (quinquennial)*.—Statement No. 20 shows the number of pattas of various values held in the several districts of the Presidency for fasli 1340 (1930–31). Excluding Madras, where the land revenue consists mainly of quit-rent imposed on house-sites, the total number of pattas held during the last fasli of the quinquennium amounted to 5,797,807 or 382,292 more than at the end of the previous quinquennium, i.e., 294,273 under single pattas and 88,019 under joint pattas. There was an increase in all the districts and it was particularly large in Tanjore (39,918), South Arcot (33,497), West Godavari (29,412), Anantapur (29,081), East Godavari (25,913), Malabar (21,299) and Trichinopoly (20,905). These districts alone contributed an increase of 200,025 or about 52 per cent of the total increase. The increase was in the main due to the grant of waste lands on darkhast in the ordinary course and grants to the depressed classes and ex-military men, and partly to the splitting up of joint holdings and the grant of separate pattas, after subdivision, to the several joint owners. The bulk of the increase under single and joint pattas was confined to pattas paying Rs. 10 and less but over Re. 1 a year, which amounted to 232,311 or about 61 per cent of the total increase. Of the total number of pattas held, 3,169,312 or about 55 per cent were assessed at Rs. 10 and less but over Re. 1 a year, the gross assessment thereon being Rs. 1,30,05,233. The average area of and assessment on pattas paying Rs. 10 and less but over Re. 1 work out to about 3 acres and Rs. 4 respectively. The bulk of the land covered by these small holdings is 'dry' (8,792,471 acres).

The Board submits its report on the settlement of land revenue in the Madras Presidency for fasli 1341 (1931-32) together with the prescribed statements.

2. *Character of the season.*—The south-west monsoon became active on the West Coast from about the middle of June. Rainfall was moderate and interrupted till September except on the West Coast where there was excessive rain in August. A depression formed in the Bay of Bengal off the Circars Coast in the third week of September and brought uniformly good rainfall throughout the Presidency. A further depression in the Bay of Bengal off the Circars Coast caused a storm on the 11th October; this moved westwards and crossed the coast near Calingapatam on the 13th October, Ganjam and Vizagapatam receiving fairly widespread rain between the 13th and the 15th October. As a result of the storm there was considerable damage to crops, property and the railway line in the Vizagapatam district. On the whole, the monsoon was below the average except in East Godavari, West Godavari, Guntur, Nellore, Chingleput, North Arcot and the West Coast. The north-east monsoon set in after the 17th October. A depression which formed in the Bay of Bengal on the 24th, moved in a north-easterly direction and caused fairly widespread rain on the north Madras coast till the 27th. On the 29th of October a depression again formed in the south-west of the Bay of Bengal and resulted in a storm which moved in a north-westerly direction across the coast between Masulipatam and Nellore on the 31st. Fairly widespread and heavy rain fell in the Presidency on the last three days of the month and on the 1st November. The rainfall in October was below the average except in the Circars, Cuddapah, Nellore, Chingleput and Chittoor. The monsoon was active in November in south-east Madras, which received scattered rainfall on most of the days of the month. There was occasional rainfall in Malabar, the Deccan and the north Madras coast. On the morning of the 9th December, a depression formed to the south-east of Ceylon and moved north-westwards to the south-east Arabian sea. As a result of this there was very heavy rain in south-east Madras from the 9th to the 11th, causing floods in the rivers and damage to crops in the Tinnevely district. Conditions were again unsettled in the south-east of Ceylon on the 21st and a storm which formed on the 22nd moved north-westwards crossing the coast about 20 miles south of Negapatam on the 24th evening. It was responsible for fairly widespread rain and locally heavy falls in south-east Madras and for breaches in the railway and telegraph lines. There was no rain in January. On the whole, the north-east monsoon was above the average, except in the Deccan and Malabar. There was local rain in the last week of February. There was practically no rain in March. Unsettled conditions in the Bay of Bengal off the Coromandel coast resulted in thunder-storm rain in certain places between the 12th and the 14th of April. Conditions were again unsettled in the south-west of the Bay of Bengal after the 14th May and fairly widespread thunder-storm rain occurred in south-east Madras from the 15th to 18th and

on the north Madras coast on the 18th. A temporary advance of the monsoon occurred on the 18th in the south-east Arabian sea and conditions became unsettled off Malabar, resulting in widespread and locally heavy rain on the West Coast between the 18th and the 25th. After the 26th the monsoon current began to retreat from the south-east Arabian sea. During the period of retreat, very rough seas and gales were experienced along and off Malabar; a gale accompanied by heavy rain swept over Calicut on the 24th and did considerable damage to railway and telegraph lines and to property. On the whole, the hot weather rainfall was above the average.

The sowings of early crops were generally satisfactory or above normal except in the Deccan and Central districts (dry crops only) and the south. Sowings of late wet crops were satisfactory, while sowings of late dry crops were below normal except in the south. The condition of the early as well as of the late crops was generally fair.

On the whole the season for the Presidency, although not so good as in the previous two years, was fairly satisfactory.

3. *Number of ryotwari villages.*—The total number of ryotwari villages in the fasli was 21,608 against 21,610 in the previous fasli. The decrease of 2 villages in the Presidency was the result of a decrease of 5 villages in East Godavari and Salem and an increase of 3 villages in Ganjam, West Godavari and Anantapur. The decrease of 2 villages in East Godavari was due to the fact that three villages in Amalapur taluk were clubbed into one in fasli 1339; the Collector took this into account only in the fasli under report. In Salem, the decrease of 3 villages was due to the amalgamation of the separate bits of the three villages of Karuppur, Pachanampatti and Surapalli with the adjoining villages of Sangitappatti, Chettipatti and Vanavai respectively. The increase of 1 village in Ganjam was due to the relinquishment of Pedda Abhasingi village of Parlakimedi taluk to the British Government by the Raja of Parlakimedi vide G.O. Ms. No. 1332, Revenue, dated 25th June 1932. The increase of 1 village in West Godavari was due to the resumption of Venkatadrigudem, an inam village in Chintalapudi taluk. In Anantapur, the increase of 1 village was due to the resumption of the shrotriyam village Brahmanapalli of Penukonda taluk in fasli 1340, which was taken into account in fasli 1341.

4. The land revenue of the Presidency is derived from the following sources:—

- (a) Peshkash, or revenue from permanently settled estates;
- (b) Shrotriyam, jodi or quit-rent levied on inam villages;
- (c) Assessment including water-rate on lands held under the ryotwari system; and
- (d) Miscellaneous revenue.

5. *Peshkash or revenue from permanently settled estates.*—The total amount of peshkash payable during the fasli was Rs. 49,91,947 against

Rs. 50,07,785 in the previous fasli. The decrease of Rs. 15,838 is the result of—

7. *Holdings*.—The total extent of ryotwari holdings during the fasli was 27,701,758 acres, which exceeded that of the previous year (as now revised) by 92,966. There was an increase in all districts except South Arcot, Cuddapah, Ramnad and Tanjore where there was a decrease of 746, 702, 454 and 99 acres respectively. The increase was marked in the districts of Malabar (33,154) and Anantapur (15,072). In Malabar the introduction of the resettlement in Calicut, Walluvanad and Palghat taluks, the introduction of resurvey in the Chirakkal taluk, the transfer of unoccupied dry lands to occupied dry and assignments contributed to the increase. The increase in Anantapur was due to assignments made to the labouring classes. The increase in other districts was mainly due to assignments of waste lands to the members of the depressed classes and others and also to the resumption of minor inams. The small decrease in Cuddapah, Tanjore and Ramnad districts calls for no remarks. The small decrease in South Arcot was mainly due to the acquisition of land for public purposes, to the resumption of land assigned to members of the depressed classes for breach of conditions and to land being bought in by Government for want of bidders in the sales held for realization of arrears of land revenue.

8. *Assessment*.—The total assessment on holdings was Rs. 589.17 lakhs against Rs. 575.25 lakhs (as now revised) in the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 13,91,719. There was an increase in all the districts except South Arcot and Ramnad, where there was a decrease of Rs. 1,296 and Rs. 110 respectively. The increase was

appreciable in the districts of West Godavari (Rs. 3,73,458), East Godavari (Rs. 3,68,659), Malabar (Rs. 3,22,434), Kistna (Rs. 2,74,972), South Kanara (Rs. 14,951) and Salem (Rs. 7,427). The large increase in the districts of West Godavari, East Godavari, Kistna and Malabar was due to the introduction of resettlement rates. The reasons given in paragraph 7 above account for the increase in the other districts. The slight decrease in South Arcot has been explained in the last sentence of paragraph 7 above. The decrease in Ramnad is small and calls for no remarks.

9. *Cultivation.*—The total area cultivated in ryotwari holdings was 20.56 million acres against 20.87 million acres in the previous fasli. There was a net decrease of 304,970 acres under 'dry' and 9,266 acres under 'wet.' The decrease under 'dry' was large in the districts of Anantapur (66,842 acres), Coimbatore (57,786 acres), Madura (39,948 acres), North Arcot (34,504 acres) and Tinnevely (28,306 acres). The decrease under 'wet' was marked in the districts of Anantapur (18,148 acres), Chittoor (14,601 acres) and Ganjam (5,263 acres). The decrease under 'dry' was due to inadequate rainfall during the season of dry cultivation. The decrease under 'wet' was due to the somewhat unfavourable season and insufficient supply of water. The total area cultivated during the year, including that under 'miscellaneous cultivation,' was 21.54 million acres against 21.93 million acres in the previous fasli. There was an increase of 373,204 acres under 'waste charged.'

10. *Water-rate and second-crop charge.*—The revenue derived from these sources amounted to Rs. 34.90 lakhs against Rs. 36.96 lakhs in the previous fasli. There was a gross increase of Rs. 2,21,682 in certain districts and a gross decrease of Rs. 4,28,293 in others resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 2,06,611. The increase was marked in the districts of West Godavari (Rs. 90,790), East Godavari (Rs. 48,944), North Arcot (Rs. 35,145) and Chingleput (Rs. 21,353) while the decrease was appreciable in the districts of Nellore (Rs. 66,499), South Arcot (Rs. 65,009), Anantapur (Rs. 59,848), Trichinopoly (Rs. 42,505), Chittoor (Rs. 37,077), Cuddapah (Rs. 32,528), Tinnevely (Rs. 28,379), Madura (Rs. 26,206), Coimbatore (Rs. 16,943) and Ramnad (Rs. 16,163). The increase in West Godavari was mainly due to the large area under second crop, both in the rotation zone and outside, which was permitted as a special case on account of heavy submersion during the first crop season in villages bordering Kollair and also in villages in the lower reaches of the delta. The increase in East Godavari was due to an increase in the second-crop cultivation owing to the copious supply of water in the Godavari during the second-crop season. In North Arcot the increase was due to the fact that water was available in most of the irrigation sources at the end of March 1931, and in Chingleput it was due to timely rains and the favourable character of the season. The decrease in Nellore, South Arcot, Anantapur, Trichinopoly, Chittoor, Cuddapah, Madura, Coimbatore and Ramnad was mainly due to poor or late rain and insufficient supply of water in irrigation sources. In Tinnevely the prospect of heavy penalties stopped the cultivation of a second crop on single-crop lands under restricted sources.

11. *Remission.*—There was a total net remission of Rs. 32,19,802 during the fasli. As compared with the previous year this involves an increase of Rs. 2,12,008 which was mostly under fixed remissions and was chiefly due to the remission allowed on account of the gradual introduction of new rates of assessment in East Godavari, West Godavari and Kistna districts. The increase on this account was Rs. 2,44,237, Rs. 2,40,993 and Rs. 1,84,502 respectively in the above districts.

(i) *Seasonal remissions.*—The amount remitted under this head during the fasli was Rs. 12,55,822 against Rs. 18,87,774 in the previous fasli—a net decrease of Rs. 6,31,952. The decrease was very marked in Tanjore (Rs. 9,55,752) and was appreciable in the district of Trichinopoly (Rs. 81,330) and occurred mainly under the heads "Land submerged or inundated" and "shavi or loss of produce."

(a) *Waste remitted.*—Remissions under this head amounted to Rs. 3.30 lakhs or Rs. 73,876 more than in the previous fasli. There was an increase of Rs. 1,95,649 in some districts and a decrease of Rs. 1,21,773 in others. The increase was marked in the districts of Anantapur (Rs. 90,088), Chittoor (Rs. 62,944) and Cuddapah (Rs. 18,284). There was a marked decrease in Tanjore (Rs. 68,712). An amount of Rs. 5,843 on an extent of 16,499 acres of dry waste in Bellary district was remitted under the authority conveyed in G.Os. No. 378, Revenue, dated 16th February 1932, No. 55L, Revenue, dated 7th March 1932, and No. 665, Revenue, dated 21st March 1932, and a dry remission of Rs. 128 on an extent of 67 acres of sanded dry lands in Lalgudi and Trichinopoly taluks was granted under the authority of G.O. Mis. No. 532, Revenue, dated 6th April 1925.

(b) *Shavi and short crop.*—The total amount remitted under this head was Rs. 5,17,798 against Rs. 5,87,596, the net decrease being Rs. 69,798. The decrease was marked in Tanjore (Rs. 2,37,237) owing to a more favourable season. There was, however, an increase in Bellary (Rs. 2,65,247) due to the opposite cause.

(c) *Tiryakamma remissions* (i.e., remission of the difference between wet and dry assessment on wet lands cultivated with dry crops owing to insufficiency or failure of water-supply) amounted to Rs. 3,45,269 against Rs. 2,60,495 in the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 84,774. The increase was appreciable in the districts of Anantapur (Rs. 60,655), Salem (Rs. 36,762), Chittoor (Rs. 23,445), Cuddapah (Rs. 20,775) and North Arcot (Rs. 12,946) and was due to the unfavourable character of the season. There was a decrease in East Godavari (Rs. 23,155) due to an abundant supply of water in the upland irrigation sources.

(d) *Injury by floods.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 50,732 against Rs. 6,86,036 in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 6,35,304. The decrease was very marked in Tanjore (Rs. 6,28,290) and it was due to the fact that only a portion of the district was affected by floods during the fasli 1341, while the entire district was affected in the previous abnormally bad fasli.

(a) *Remission of second-crop charge.*—The amount remitted under this head was Rs. 7,931 as against Rs. 89,035 of the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 81,104. The decrease was marked in the districts of Trichinopoly (Rs. 27,926), Tanjore (Rs. 22,267) and South Arcot (Rs. 16,213).

(ii) *Fixed remissions*, (i.e., abatement of demand granted for reasons unconnected with the season) amounted to Rs. 9.78 lakhs against Rs. 1.36 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 8,41,644. The increase, as already stated, was mostly due to the remission allowed on account of the gradual introduction of new rates of assessment in East Godavari, West Godavari and Kistna districts.

(iii) *Barid deductions.*—Deductions made from village collections, in favour of inamdars and religious institutions amounted to Rs. 9.86 lakhs against Rs. 9.84 lakhs in the previous fasli resulting in a net increase of Rs. 2,916. The small increase calls for no remarks.

12. *Miscellaneous revenue.*—The revenue under this head amounted to Rs. 106.58 lakhs against Rs. 112.77 lakhs in the previous fasli. There was an increase of Rs. 1,66,829 in some districts and a decrease of Rs. 7,85,293 in others, resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 6,18,464. The decrease occurred under most of the heads. The several items are dealt with below:

Item 1—Jodi and quit-rent on minor inams.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 23.40 lakhs against Rs. 23.51 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 10,393. The decrease was marked in West Godavari (Rs. 6,164).

Item 2 (a)—Second-crop charge on minor inam (not ryot) wari villages.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 2.10 lakhs as against Rs. 1.85 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a net increase of Rs. 24,732. The increase occurred in most of the districts and was marked in West Godavari (Rs. 40,262).

Item 2 (b)—Water-rate on minor inams in ryotwari villages.—The revenue under this item was Rs. 13.36 lakhs against Rs. 13.79 lakhs in the previous fasli, resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 43,437. The decrease was marked in West Godavari (Rs. 34,930).

Item 3—Charge for water in zamindari and inam villages including tirvajasti and fastijasti items.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 25.10 lakhs against Rs. 24.28 in the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 82,361. The increase was marked in West Godavari (Rs. 53,358), East Godavari (Rs. 26,340) and Kistna (Rs. 10,510).

Item 4—Enhanced water-rate on lands irregularly irrigated.—The revenue under this item was Rs. 4.21 lakhs against Rs. 4.73 lakhs in the previous fasli resulting in a net decrease of Rs. 51,741. The decrease was marked in Tinnevely (Rs. 13,803), Guntur (Rs. 13,751), Coimbatore (Rs. 11,654), Nellore (Rs. 10,208) and South Arcot (Rs. 9,529). There was a marked increase in East Godavari (Rs. 11,871) and Tanjore (Rs. 5,142).

Item 5—Charges levied for occupation (with or without application) of assessed and unassessed lands not assigned.—The revenue under

this head was Rs. 6.42 lakhs against Rs. 6.68 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a net decrease of Rs. 26,109. The decrease was large in Anantapur (Rs. 15,406), Malabar (Rs. 9,437) and South Arcot (Rs. 9,153).

Item 6—Charges levied for occupation of poramboke lands.—The revenue derived under this head during the fasli was Rs. 4.13 lakhs against Rs. 5.63 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 1,50,372. The decrease occurred in most of the districts and it was appreciable in Kistna (Rs. 34,353), Nellore (Rs. 12,848), Guntur (Rs. 12,296), South Arcot (Rs. 12,292), Kurnool (Rs. 12,055), East Godavari (Rs. 11,519) and North Arcot (Rs. 10,255).

Enhanced charges amounting to Rs. 2,10,850 were levied on an extent of 21,555 acres against Rs. 3,12,097 on an extent of 30,915 acres in the previous year, showing an incidence of Rs. 10 per acre as in the previous fasli. The highest average rates were Rs. 65 in Tinnevely, Rs. 55 in Chittoor, Rs. 45 in Ramnad and Rs. 44 in East Godavari and these were due to the levy of prohibitive penalties in the case of persistent encroachments continued from previous faslis.

There were no porambokes to be reclassified in the districts of Madras and Malabar. The work of reclassification is reported to have been practically completed in all the other districts. From the reports it is, however, observed that taram assessment was levied on an extent of 1,04,060 acres of poramboke lands against 99,871 acres in the previous fasli. Such occupation was extensive in the districts of Anantapur (17,785 acres), Guntur (13,396 acres), Salem (13,259 acres), Kurnool (9,443 acres), Bellary (8,951 acres) and Tanjore (6,451 acres).

In Vizagapatam proposals for the transfer of poramboke to ayan have been sanctioned in certain cases since the date of the last report and some others are pending disposal. In Cuddapah the reclassification of porambokes is reported to have been completed in all the taluks. In Anantapur also this work has been completed already and poramboke lands the occupation of which was on inspection found to be unobjectionable, were transferred to ayan for assignment. In Bellary there was a number of cases of unobjectionable occupation, mostly by depressed classes and by other longstanding aiyajamadars, pending subdivision and transfer to ayan. The work of assignment is retarded to some extent by the fact that many villages are affected by the Tungabhadra Project, where Government orders prohibiting assignment are in force. In Kurnool extents of 936 and 5,209 acres of poramboke land were transferred to assessed and unassessed respectively during the fasli as a result of inspection by aymoishing officers. In Chittoor an extent of 6,574 acres of reserved land was assigned to depressed classes. An extent of 8,521 acres of land not specially reserved was also assigned to 2,883 people of these classes subject to the condition that the land should not be alienated. In North Arcot transfer of certain poramboke lands to ayan was sanctioned; in cases where the occupation was unobjectionable only the ordinary charge was levied. In South Arcot there was a distinct fall in the unauthorized occupation of porambokes owing to the strict application of the penal provisions of Act III of 1905. In Tanjore

an extent of 12.89 acres of poramboke was transferred to assessed waste for purposes of assignment; assignment of lands in villages affected by the Cauvery-Mettur Project has been prohibited. In Arichinopoly an extent of 99.03 acres of poramboke land was transferred to assessed waste during the fasli; the remaining cases of encroachment were such as could not be so dealt with. In the Nilgiris an extent of 1,355 acres of poramboke land was transferred to assessed waste and assigned during the fasli. The Collectors of the other districts also report that steps have been taken to transfer poramboke land, the occupation of which is unobjectionable, to ayan.

Item 7—Revenue derived from tree-tax.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 3.77 lakhs against Rs. 3.92 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 15,045. The decrease was marked in Tinnevely (8,209) as there was no palmyra enumeration in that district during the fasli.

Item 8—Commission from estates under Court of Wards.—The amount of revenue derived under this head was Rs. 84,643 against Rs. 43,454 in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 8,811. The decrease was appreciable in Ganjam (Rs. 5,411) and was due to the rendition of Bodokhmedi Estate.

Item 10—Sale proceeds of land sold.—The income under this head was Rs. 3.10 lakhs against Rs. 3.85 lakhs in the previous fasli, showing a net decrease of Rs. 74,926. The decrease was marked in Coimbatore (Rs. 81,160). This was due to the natural decrease in the extent of valuable land at the disposal of Government.

Item 11—Rent of tankas.—The revenue under this head was Rs. 4.82 lakhs against Rs. 6.14 lakhs in the previous fasli, the net decrease being Rs. 1.32 lakhs. The decrease was marked in East Godavari (Rs. 1,16,753) where the heavy losses incurred, owing to an unfavourable season and economic depression in the previous fasli caused a decided fall in the bids offered.

Item 12—Quit-rent and ground rent.—The amount of revenue under this head was Rs. 2.38 lakhs against Rs. 2.20 lakhs of the previous fasli, the net increase being Rs. 17,934.

13. The net ryotwari demand, including water-rate, second crop charge and miscellaneous revenue, amounted to Rs. 698.46 lakhs against Rs. 694.91 lakhs (as now revised) in the previous fasli. The details for the increase of Rs. 3.55 lakhs are given below:—

16. *Demand and collection of land revenue and cesses (current).*—The current demand under land revenue and cesses during the fasli was Rs. 8,71,38,627. A sum of Rs. 8,54,28,115 or 98.04 per cent was collected within the fasli and Rs. 40,963 were written off the accounts. The percentage of collection during the previous fasli was 98.15.

17. *Demand and collection of arrears.*—The total arrears demand under all the heads amounted to Rs. 16,60,041. A sum of Rs. 12,10,410 or 72.91 per cent was collected (against 68.27 per cent in the previous fasli) and a sum of Rs. 1,69,144 or 10.19 per cent was written off the accounts.

18. The balance outstanding at the end of the fasli including both arrears and current was Rs. 19,50,036 against Rs. 16,76,865 at the end of the previous fasli. As reported by Collectors in their demand, collection and balance statements for October 1932, the balance at the beginning of fasli 1342 was Rs. 19,49,816. Up to the end of October

1932, a sum of Rs. 12,09,938 was collected and Rs. 63,967 were written off the accounts. Sanction has since been accorded to write off a sum of Rs. 170, while proposals had been made to write off Rs. 2,559. The net recoverable balance on 1st November 1932 was thus Rs. 6,73,182. Out of this amount a sum of Rs. 4,73,036 is covered by suspensions or postponements, chiefly in the districts of Bellary, Anantapur and East Godavari. Deducting this amount, the realisable balance on 1st November 1932 was Rs. 2,00,146.

19. *Reconciliation of differences between the collection of land revenue and cesses as shown in the jamabandi and the Accountant-General's statements and over-payments.*—This is carried out month by month along with the reconciliation of figures of expenditure.

20. *Adjustment to local boards of cesses collected during the fasli.*—Land revenue and cesses are collected together and the distribution of the total collections between "Land Revenue" and "Cesses" is effected in the Collector's office after the compilation of the accounts relating to the fasli year.

Statements showing the amounts collected during fasli 1341 on behalf of local boards, the payments made to them during the fasli and the amounts to be finally adjusted either to their credit or debit are received from Collectors. After verification by the Accountant-General of the amounts shown by Collectors, as payments made to local boards, the recovery of over-payments is being watched by the board in accordance with the instructions contained in paragraph 3 of G.O. No. 5197, L. & M., dated the 7th December, 1926.

21. *Charges debitable to land revenue.*—The charges of the Land Revenue Department are shown in the accounts under the head "22. General administration." The district administration charges excluding village establishments amounted to Rs. 103.04 lakhs during fasli 1341. The village service charges (including those of proprietary estates) during the fasli were Rs. 120.66 lakhs. The total charges amounted to Rs. 223.70 lakhs or 25.82 per cent of the total land revenue and cesses collected, compared to 28.17 per cent in fasli 1340. It must, however, be borne in mind that this amount does not represent merely the cost of collecting the land revenue. The Land Revenue Department performs multifarious duties of which the control and collection of land revenue is only one. The village establishment in particular is the servant of all departments of the Government. Moreover a considerable portion of the time of the Collector and his subordinate officials is occupied with magisterial work. While the actual cost of collecting the land revenue cannot be estimated with any degree of accuracy, it is certainly far less than the figure shown above. The fall in the charges is mainly due to the measures of economy adopted during the fasli under report.

22. *Processes under Act II of 1864.*—Statement No. 12 gives particulars of coercive processes issued for the realization of Government dues under Act II of 1864. The following extract shows the number of

processes of each kind issued during the year, as compared with the figures for the three preceding faslis—to ascertain and show what has been done to reduce the number of such processes.

There is a decrease under demand notices. The increase under the other heads is attributed by Collectors to the economic depression and the fall in the prices of food crops.

23. *Demand notices.*—There is a decrease in the number of demand notices issued during the fasli as compared with the previous fasli; but it is higher than that of faslis 1338 and 1339.

24. *Distrain or attachment notices.*—There is an increase in the number of distrain or attachment notices when compared with the previous fasli.

25. There is an increase of 3.43 in the percentage of the number of distraints and attachments of personal property arising from demand notices when compared with the last fasli. In respect of real property also there is an increase in percentage over that of last fasli by 0.26.

The number of defaulters whose immovable property was attached during the fasli was 28,957 against 21,434 in fasli 1340.

26. *Sale notices.*—Out of 137,135 defaulters whose property was attached 51.23 per cent paid up the arrears before sale notices were issued, as against 42.66 per cent in the last fasli. The number of attachments during the fasli was largest in South Arcot (19,434) as in fasli 1340 (16,702).

27. *Sales.*—The number of defaulters whose property was sold was greater than in fasli 1340 by 3,267. There was a decrease in the number of sales of personal property. The number of sales of real property (7,555) was almost double that of last fasli (3,907). The percentage borne by actual sales to sale notices in the Presidency is 15.04 against 11.90 in 1340. The percentage of the number of defaulters whose properties were sold out of the total number of

holdings in 0-17 against 0-12 in the previous fasli. The statement below shows the particulars of sales in fasli 1341 compared with those for the preceding three faslis:—

Rs. 6,87,967 was sold for recovery of arrears amounting to Rs. 93,414. The sum realized was Rs. 1,13,058. The value of land was noticeably disproportionate to the arrears in the districts of East Godavari, Kistna, Chingleput, North Arcot, South Arcot, Tanjore, Madura and Ramnad. The Collector of Chingleput remarks that the disparity is due to the fact that in the case of default by military assignees, the entire extents assigned are generally attached. The Collector of Tanjore remarks that larger extents were attached as smaller plots proportionate to the arrears were not available for attachment. The Collector of Madura points out that entire fields in the holdings of ryots had to be sold in auction even though the value of these fields was large when compared with the arrears due. The other Collectors make no special mention of this point, but the reasons are probably similar to those reported to Government in B.P. Rout No. 2337, dated 21st April 1927. The prices fetched for lands sold to private individuals amounted on the average to 3½ times the assessment in the case of dry lands and 4½ times the assessment in the case of wet lands. In fasli 1340 immovable property of the estimated value of Rs. 3,76,530 was sold for the recovery of arrears amounting to Rs. 80,481 and the amount realized was Rs. 1,13,025. The average price fetched for lands sold to private individuals was higher in fasli 1340 being 6½ times the assessment in the case of dry lands and 8½ times the assessment in the case of wet lands.

Extent of land sold.—The extent of land sold to private individuals in the fasli was 12,628.36 acres under dry and 4,018.81 acres under wet, against 24,588.89 acres and 2,009.64 acres respectively during fasli 1340. The total area bought in by Government for want of bidders was 8,485.57 under dry and 2,189.44 acres under wet against 19,427.12 and 1,215.94 acres respectively in fasli 1340.

28. Process-serving establishment.—Statement No. 13 gives particulars of processes served by the ordinary village agency and by special establishments and of the fees realized during the year. The total number of processes served by the village agency was 10,66,368 or 32,420 more than in fasli 1340. The number of processes served by the special agency (45,748) was less than that in the previous fasli by 7,375.

29. Costs in civil suits.—A total of Rs. 28,071 was awarded to the Government as costs during the fasli. Including Rs. 39,276, the revised opening balance, the total demand was Rs. 67,347; of which Rs. 26,856 were collected, Rs. 1,602 were written off the accounts and Rs. 816 were recommended to be written off. The net recoverable balance at the end of the fasli was Rs. 38,073, made up of the following items:—

30. Interest on arrears of land revenue (Statement No. 14).—The total demand on account of arrears of land revenue including the balance at the beginning of the fasli was Rs. 42,159 of which Rs. 19,627 were collected and Rs. 1,399 were remitted, leaving a balance of Rs. 21,133 against Rs. 19,130 in the previous fasli. The balance exceeds Rs. 1,000 in the districts of East Godavari, South Arcot, Tanjore, Madura and Ramnad.

31. Sale of lands under Board's Standing Orders Nos. 15, 16, 21, 22, 45, 90 and 91.—Under the rules for the sale of occupancy rights in lands at the disposal of Government (Standing Order No. 15) 4,162.24 acres assessed at Rs. 4,763 were sold for Rs. 1,73,671; 74.44 acres 2,553 square yards and 5 square feet of house-sites in towns assessed at Rs. 162-15-0 were sold for Rs. 32,966 under Standing Order No. 21; and 145.04 acres of land bought in by Government at sales for arrears of revenue were re-sold under Standing Order No. 45 for Rs. 1,431. 11.24 acres which had been acquired for public purposes and were subsequently relinquished were sold under Standing Order No. 90 for Rs. 5,199. 7.38 acres of land for which the Railway is not likely to have any further use were sold for Rs. 575 under Standing Order No. 91. One cawny 16 grounds and 2,182 square feet of lands were sold in Madras for Rs. 396-13-0 under the special rules governing the disposal of vacant lands in the city.

32. *Subdivision of quit-rent.*—No applications were received during the year under Standing Order No. 88 for the subdivision of joint liability of share-holders in whole villages or inams.

33. *Transfer of registry of holdings.*—Transfer of revenue registry falls under the following main heads:

(i) Transfer made with reference to applications and notices received from Sub-Registrars, and

(ii) transfer effected on applications and intimations received from parties, village officers and others.

(i) Under the first head, 492,881 applications were received during the fasli as against 304,277 in the previous fasli, the increase being 188,104 or about 61.82 per cent. The increase occurred in all the districts except in Bellary where 7,042 applications were received during the fasli as against 7,123 in the previous fasli.

(ii) Under the second head, the number received was 258,177 against 153,367 in the previous fasli, a net increase of 104,810. The increase occurred in all the districts except in Ganjam and West Godavari where the decrease was 2,477 and 311 respectively.

The total number of applications of all kinds, including the number pending disposal at the beginning of the fasli, was 819,905; of which 639,154 were disposed of during the fasli, leaving a balance of 180,751 (or about 22 per cent of the total number) as against 69,347 (or about 12.9 per cent of the total number) in the previous fasli. Of the total number of applications disposed of during the fasli 59,917, or about 9.4 per cent, were rejected and 4,022 were transferred to Deputy Tahsildars for disposal. The causes of rejection were mainly defective title and failure to produce documentary evidence. The percentage of pendency was appreciable in the districts of Nellore (51), Guntur (43), Ganjam (42), Chingleput (41), Vizagapatam (36), South Kanara (28), Cuddapah (27) and South Arcot (26). It is hoped that the pendency will be considerably reduced owing to the recent orders of Government (G.O. Ms. No. 2203, Revenue, dated 29th October 1932) approving the abolition of notices to parties to put up ridges in cases in which there are no marks of enjoyment on the ground and notices to the joint holders in cases of transfer of the interest of one of them in the joint holding.

34. *Jamabandi.*—The rule laid down in paragraph 2 of Board's Standing Order No. 12 that the settlement of each taluk should generally be conducted by the Collector himself once in five years was complied with in all the districts except in the case of the Ponnani taluk of the Malabar district and the Cuddapah taluk of the Cuddapah district. In the case of the Ponnani taluk, the Personal Assistant Deputy Collector of the district conducted the jamabandi in fasli 1341, the procedure being in accordance with the orders contained in G.O. No. 1050, Revenue, dated 15th May 1931. In the case of the Cuddapah taluk of the Cuddapah district, the reason was that under the orders conveyed in G.O. Ms. No. 2621, Revenue, dated 11th December 1931, Kamalapuram taluk was merged with Cuddapah taluk from 1st May 1932, the Collector proposed that the settlement of Cuddapah taluk might be done

in fasli 1341 by the Revenue Divisional Officer and that the Collector would himself settle that taluk in fasli 1342 as otherwise the villages of Kamalapuram taluk settled by the Collector in fasli 1337 might escape settlement by the Collector for five more years to come; his proposal was approved by the Board.

35. *Loans and advances.*—The advances made under the Land Improvement Loans and the Agriculturists' Loans Acts during the year amounted to Rs. 3.22 lakhs and Rs. 9.16 lakhs respectively making a total of Rs. 12.38 lakhs against Rs. 14.76 lakhs in the previous year. The difference was the net result of an increase in 7 districts and a decrease in 18 districts. The increase in Guntur, Bellary and Tanjore and the decrease in Anantapur, Chingleput, Trichinopoly and Madura were marked.

36. Including the uncollected balance outstanding at the close of the previous year the amount repayable during the year on account of principal was Rs. 8.27 lakhs under the Land Improvement Loans Act and Rs. 12 lakhs under the Agriculturists' Loans Act. Of these amounts Rs. 6.64 lakhs or 80.3 per cent under the Land Improvement Loans Act and Rs. 9.95 lakhs or 82.9 per cent under the Agriculturists' Loans Act were collected. Sums amounting to Rs. 0.49 lakh under the Land Improvement Loans Act and Rs. 0.24 lakh under the Agriculturists' Loans Act were repaid by the borrowers on account of loans the repayments of which had not fallen due, while Rs. 3,322 and Rs. 9,440 were written off as irrecoverable under the Land Improvement Loans and Agriculturists' Loans Acts respectively.

37. *Coercive processes.*—The aggregate amount of principal and interest repayable during the year under both the Acts including the balance remaining unpaid out of sums which fell due in previous years was Rs. 28,29,961, of which a sum of Rs. 5,19,911 or 18.4 per cent was collected without resort to coercive processes, and a sum of Rs. 16,63,144 or 55.2 per cent was collected after the issue of demand notices. A sum of Rs. 1,42,538 was collected after the attachment of property but before sale, while the amounts realized by the sale of movable and immovable properties were Rs. 5,398 and Rs. 25,887 respectively. A sum of Rs. 15,214 was written off as irrecoverable under both principal and interest under both the Acts. The balance outstanding at the close of the year was Rs. 4,73,083. It was very heavy in Bellary (Rs. 87,145) and Coimbatore (Rs. 1,43,342).

38. The number of wells newly constructed and the number repaired during the year with the aid of loans under the Land Improvement Loans Act are shown below with the corresponding figures for the previous year:—

The largest number of wells (105) constructed or repaired during the year was in Salem. The number was also large in Anantapur (56), North Arcot (79) and Madura (58).

A sum of Rs. 1,00,702 was spent during the year on the reclamation of 1,906 acres of land against Rs. 1,13,050 and 2,412 acres in the previous year. The largest amount spent was in Ganjam (Rs. 38,070 on an extent of 802 acres). A sum of Rs. 500 was spent in Salem for the installation of oil engines to benefit 20 acres of land. A sum of Rs. 27,853 was spent on other improvements such as the removal of kuth grass, the construction of bunds, the lowering of the level of fields, etc., benefiting altogether 1,279 acres of land.

Of the total amount of advances outstanding against Collectors including the amounts referred to above, a sum of Rs. 1,06,057 was adjusted during the year, leaving a net debit of Rs. 2,59,818 under "Revenue survey advances—Collectors."

Under the head "Costs of survey marks—Collectors" a sum of Rs. 85,154 was collected during the year leaving a balance of Rs. 10,546 to be realized. The arrear outstanding at the beginning of the year under "Cost of survey marks—Survey officers" was Rs. 87,646. Fresh landholders' bills for Rs. 1,36,416 were received from survey officers during the year. Of the total demand of Rs. 2,24,062, a sum of Rs. 1,30,377 was collected leaving a balance of Rs. 93,685. The major portion of the balance is outstanding in the district of Malabar where there is an arrear of Rs. 83,999 to be collected. This amount includes a sum of Rs. 41,167 on account of instalment not due in the year. The actual balance for collection at the end of the year was Rs. 42,832 and this has since been reduced to Rs. 31,734.

40. *Junior civilians.*—The reports from Collectors show generally that their civilian divisional officers possessed an adequate knowledge of the vernaculars and that the progress of Assistant Collectors was satisfactory.

41. *Effect of recent legislation on the people.*—No new enactment affecting the agricultural classes generally was passed during the fasli under report. The Collector of North Arcot reports that the introduction of the Village Officers' Restoration Act has facilitated the prompt collection of land revenue. The Collectors of Trichinopoly and Madurai report that the advantages of the Madras Agricultural Pests and Diseases Act are more appreciated by the ryots than in previous years. The Madras Decentralization Act, which empowered Tahsildars and Deputy Tahsildars to charge enhanced assessments in cases of unauthorized occupation and to deal with cases of irregular irrigation is reported to have worked satisfactorily. The new District Municipalities Amendment Act, the Local Boards Amendment Act and the Village Courts Act afforded greater opportunities to the people to participate in the administration of local affairs. It is reported that the significance of the provisions of the Sarda Act has not yet been fully realized by the people. In Vizagapatam some child marriages took place and in two cases the accused were convicted and fined. In East Godavari there were three cases of which one ended in acquittal and the other two in conviction. The Collector of Cuddapah reports that

the Sarda Act has had no effect on the people and that child marriages appear to be still going on. In Bellary a few cases of child marriages were tried by the Collector and the parties were sentenced to fine and imprisonment. The effect of the legislation regarding the enfranchisement of devadasi inams is understood by the people and enfranchisement is proceeding. The Collector of Cuddapah reports that the people feel the abolition of toll-gates to be a relief.

42. *Enhanced water-cess on irregular irrigation.*—The system of publishing a general or collective notice in each village in accordance with B.P. No. 68, Settlement, dated 10th April 1919, is reported to have worked well and the Tahsildars have generally exercised their powers judiciously. The ryots are aware of the rules and make timely representations to the jamabandi officers. The system resulted in the prompt investigation of objections and a reduction in the number of water-rate appeals. In cases where Government water was taken without permission, deterrent penalties were imposed.

43. *Tank-bed cultivation.*—There are no tank-bed lands fit for cultivation in the districts of Madras, the Nilgiris, Malabar and South Kanara. In their Order Mis. No. 1613, Revenue, dated 2nd September 1922, Government withdrew the special concessions relating to tank-bed cultivation. In Nellore, tank-bed cultivation was rigidly repressed in the fasli under report. In cases where the encroachers persisted they were evicted, and where eviction was not possible, deterrent penalties were imposed. In Cuddapah 310 acres of tank-bed lands were cultivated during the fasli and the revenue derived was Rs. 1,765. Enhanced assessment to an extent of Rs. 1,182 was imposed for unauthorized occupation. Permission for temporary cultivation in the beds of four tanks in three villages of the Pulivendla taluk was granted by the Collector. An extent of 116.32 acres was cultivated in these four taluks out of which an extent of 44.97 acres was penalized for violation of the conditions under which such permission was granted. The remaining extent was charged with the highest dry rate of the village. In Anantapur general permission for cultivation of tank-beds was granted for all the taluks except Kadiri by a special order on account of the insufficient rainfall and scanty supply of water to the tanks during the year. Unauthorized cultivation of an objectionable nature was dealt with under the provisions of the Madras Act III of 1906. In Bellary permission was granted to cultivate water-melons, cucumbers and the like in the beds of certain tanks in Rayadrug taluk. In Kurnool and Chingleput there were no cases of such permission during the fasli and stray cases of unauthorized cultivation were suitably dealt with. In North Arcot there were a few cases of unauthorized cultivation of tank-beds; in unobjectionable cases the highest dry rate was charged, and in objectionable cases penalty was levied. In Tanjore, an extent of 9.12 acres of tank-bed land in the Arantangi taluk was cultivated during the fasli. In Trichinopoly an extent of 87 acres in three taluks was cultivated and an amount of Rs. 104 was realized. In Ramanad and Coimbatore there was tank-bed cultivation

in certain taluks. In Salem no permission was granted during the fasli for cultivation of tank-bed lands and in one case of unauthorised tank-bed cultivation in Dharmapuri taluk the highest dry rate was charged. In other districts there were no cases of tank-bed cultivation.

44. *Examination of village and taluk accounts.*—The maintenance of these accounts was fairly satisfactory and no general errors of a serious nature were disclosed. Such minor defects as were noticed were duly rectified. The Collector of Ganjam reports that the Revenue Divisional Officers, Chicacole and Ghumsur, have yet to submit to the Collector their reports on the result of the inspection of taluk accounts. In Anantapur, the Revenue Divisional Officers of Gooty and Anantapur, have not yet inspected the accounts of Gooty, Tadpatri, Anantapur and Kalyandrug taluks and they have been reminded to expedite their inspections. In Kurnool the examination of taluk accounts is being attended to by the Revenue Divisional Officers. In Chingleput all the Revenue Divisional Officers except the Revenue Divisional Officer, Trivellore, have still to complete the checking of the accounts.

45. *The taluk and village statistical registers.*—The taluk statistical registers prescribed in the Manual of Taluk Accounts (special) were maintained in the districts of Malabar, South Kanara, and the Nilgiris and the village statistical registers were maintained in all the ryotwari villages of the other districts. The following statement shows the progress made in the writing up and checking of registers up to and during fasli 1341:

46. *Minor irrigation.*—Statement No. 19 shows for each district the number of irrigation works in charge of the Revenue Department, the number repaired and the amount spent on them, during the official year ending 31st March 1932. It also shows the number proposed for repair during the official year ending 31st March 1933.

47. *Conference with ryots.*—In Ganjam informal conferences were held at six fixed centres, and revenue and irrigation matters were discussed with the ryots. Agricultural demonstrators who attended the conferences lectured to the ryots on improved methods of agriculture and exhibited samples of paddy, ragi and manure leaf seeds. In Vizagapatam no informal conferences were held during the fasli. The Collector, Revenue Divisional Officers and Tahsildars, however, made enquiries during their tours regarding the needs of the ryots. In East Godavari the settling officers held conferences with the ryots during jamabandi and the officers of the Public Works Department did so when occasion offered. In West Godavari an informal conference was held by the Collector at Ellore when questions of general importance were discussed. The Collectors of Guntur and South Arcot report that the ryots were given ample opportunity to represent their grievances during the tours of Government officials as well as at the time of jamabandi and that their requests were duly considered. In Nellore conferences were held during jamabandi when the grievances of ryots were attended to. As usual special irrigation conferences were held in the taluks of Nellore and Kovvur. In Cuddapah, the Collector and the Revenue Divisional Officers held informal conferences with ryots during their tours as well as at jamabandi, when matters relating to sanitation, education, grazing fees, repairs to irrigation sources, the formation of roads, etc., were discussed. In Anantapur, the Executive Engineer, Bellary, held a conference of ryots with the help of Tahsildars and the Agricultural Demonstrators and explained to them the advantages of raising paddy seeds for transplantation in the months of July and August. In Bellary the Revenue Divisional Officer held a conference of the ryots at Bellary, the ryots asked for the grant of loans and remissions of land revenue, and most of their requests were complied with. At Kudligi the Agricultural Demonstrator exhibited a modern oven for boiling sugarcane juice. The Executive Engineer held a few irrigation conferences. In Kurnool informal conferences with ryots were held by the Collector and the Revenue Divisional Officers of Kurnool, Dhone and Markapur during the jamabandi of the taluks conducted by them. In Chingleput irrigation conferences were held at the headquarters of the Revenue divisions of the district in which the Executive Engineer, the Revenue Divisional Officer and the leading ryots took part. During the

general tours of the Collector and the Revenue Divisional Officers interviews were freely granted to the ryots. In Chittoor the Collector and the Revenue Divisional Officers held informal conferences during jamabandi when individual requests for repairs to irrigation sources and matters relating to forest panchayats and panchayat courts were considered. In North Arcot conferences were held with the ryots when lectures were delivered on village sanitation, agriculture, forests, village panchayats and kndimaramat. In Tanjore conferences with ryots were held in all the taluks except Pattukkottai and Arantangi at which officers of the Public Works Department and the Agricultural Department were present. At these conferences the matters brought forward by the ryots related chiefly to irrigation and drainage and were in many cases a reiteration of old and inadmissible requests. In the conference held at Mannargudi the Special Revenue Officer, Tanjore, and the Special Engineer, Cauvery-Mettur Project, were present and they explained to the ryots certain matters connected with irrigation under the Cauvery-Mettur channels. In Trichinopoly, the Collector held a conference with the ryots during jamabandi at Lalgudi, at which the Deputy Director of Agriculture, the Health Inspector, and the Veterinary Surgeon were present. There was an agricultural exhibition of different sorts of paddy, cotton, sugarcane and manure seeds. Similar conferences were held by the Revenue Divisional Officers during jamabandi at Karur and Jayankondasholapuram. In Madura, irrigation conferences were held by the Executive Engineer and the Revenue Divisional Officer at certain centres. In Ramnad, the Sub-Collectors, Ramnad and Sivakasi, held conferences with ryots in three taluks when the representations made by the ryots were attended to. In Coimbatore and the Nilgiris conferences were held by jamabandi officers. In Salem the ryots represented their grievances to the jamabandi officers and steps were taken where necessary to remedy them. In South Kanara, ryots' conferences were held and the representations made were duly considered and communicated to the heads of the departments concerned, wherever necessary. The Collector, however, states that these conferences have ceased to evoke any popular enthusiasm and that no one attended the conferences held at Mangalore and Puttur. In Malabar, the revenue officials have kept in touch with the ryots and the agricultural officers have utilized the occasion of jamabandi to hold agricultural demonstrations, which, however, were practically confined to village officers, as the ryots do not generally attend jamabandi.

48. The Board wishes to take this opportunity of mentioning that most satisfactory progress was made during the fasli in the eradication of prickly-pear, and it expects that in a few years this obstacle to the expansion of dry cultivations will have disappeared. The Board itself has been steadfastly refusing to sanction any estimates for the clearing of prickly-pear by manual labour and has been insisting on the introduction of the cochineal insect on bunds and on the banks of channels.

49. *Extent to which the inspections of subordinate offices have been carried out by the Board, Collectors and Revenue Divisional Officers.*—The reports received from the Collectors show that practically all the

subordinate officers were inspected by them and their Revenue Divisional Officers. The Collector's notes of inspection of the Revenue Divisional offices have on the whole been thorough, and the Board has been critically reviewing the state of the offices as well as the work of individual Revenue Divisional Officers. The Board has also been systematically recording the work of all Junior Revenue Divisional Officers.

The Commissioner of Land Revenue has inspected the offices of the Collectors of Malabar, Nellore, Coimbatore, North Arcot, Tanjore and Chittoor, the Sub-Collector's office, Tellicherry and (in his capacity of Court of Wards Member) the Estate Collector's office, Sivaganga. The office of the Collector of Trichinopoly was inspected by the Commissioner of Land Revenue and Settlement. These inspections showed that, with one exception, there had been no deterioration in the standard of efficiency.

The administration in the districts continues to be on the whole efficient.
