LAND REVENUE ADMINISTRATION REPORT, PART I, FOR THE PRESIDENCY PROPER.

The following are the reports for the year 1910-11 of the three Divisions of the Presidency proper. The usual appendices are attached. Jamabandi Return No. 6 has not been appended to this report as its preparation has been postponed for the present.

2. Season.

NORTHERN DIVISION.

The season of 1910-11 was on the whole favourable, though circumstances differed considerably in the several districts. The rainfall was below the average in Ahmedabad, seriously so in places, but well timed; erratic in Kaira but generally sufficient; heavier than in the previous five years in the Panch Maháls where continuous rain in July and August injured the maize and bajri; good in Broach and Surat and good too in Thána except for a long break in July, which ruined the "salt" rice, and unseasonably heavy showers at the end of September and October. Rice failed completely in Ahmedabad, except where irrigated from canals and wells, the rain not having filled the tanks. The value of the Khari Cut and Hathmati system was strikingly demonstrated by the collection of the largest revenue yet recorded and that in a year of short rainfall. The rice in south Daskroi was fair, while kharif grain crops were moderate and the rabi wheat very good where the rainfall had sufficed for sowing. In Kaira the late kharif and rabi crops were very disappointing. In the Panch Maháls the season was the best enjoyed for years, while the outturn in Surat was above normal. The late cotton which is the principal crop of Broach and Surat, and is now grown extensively in Kaira and western Ahmedabad, as a result of the high prices realised during the last few years, began well, but suffered a severe set back from frost on the 31st January and 1st February. Curiously capricious this frost seems to have been, affecting, it is said, 75 per cent. of the area in some villages, leaving others untouched except in tiny patches and generally selecting crops on Goradu soil in preference to those on black soil. The injury done was most severe in the north of Broach, in several villages of which it became necessary to suspend the collection of the assessment. The extension of cotton cultivation in Hálol and Kálol of the Panch Maháls is noteworthy; a quarter of the whole cultivable area of Hálol is now under cotton and in this mahál too the crop suffered severely. In Thána the light rice which forms a large percentage of the whole yielded fairly well. The garden crops of Bassein, Máhim and Dáhánu talukas were above the average and the outturn on "warkas" very fair. The mangoes failed, only one-fourth of the average yield being obtained.

Water-supply.—The partially filled tanks in Ahmedabad and Kaira dried up much earlier than usual, but there was no actual scarcity of water except in the Ahmedabad Bhal and similar tracts in Broach. The special grant given by Government was fully utilized in both districts. Ordinary shallow borings are ineffective, for the water found invariably soon becomes brackish, and all hopes are now centred on the possibility of sweet water being found by deep borings such as that made at Viramgám Railway Station, where a supply of 4,000 gallons per hour of sweet water found at a depth of 325 feet is now rising some feet above the surface of the ground. The success of the experiment at Dholka is not yet assured; another is now being made in the town of Broach. The water-supply elsewhere is ordinarily sufficient; but the deepening and improving of tanks for village or irrigational purposes is proceeding steadily. In Thána the Local Boards spent Rs. 15,028 during the year on the construction of new wells, of which four were provided for the use of Mahárs.

Plague, Cholera, etc.—Plague occurred in a few villages of every district and cholera in Kaira and Thána. Small-pox appeared in Ahmedabad, Broach and Surat and was particularly bad in the city of Ahmedabad. Malarial fever prevailed in Olpád of the Surat district and in the interior of Thána.

Cattle Disease.—Outbreaks of rinderpest, aptha epizootica, septicæmia, hæmorrhagia and surra carried off 1,320 cattle out of 4,254 attacked in Ahmedabad, Panch Maháls, Broach and Thána. Of 389 cattle inoculated for rinderpest, only two died in the Ahmedabad district.

CENTRAL DIVISION.

The season of 1910-11 was more favourable than any known for many years past. The rainfall was timely and ample. It was sufficient in Poona, exceptionally good in Ahmednagar and East Khándesh and well above the average in the remaining districts. The outturn of kharif crop was above the average in West Khándesh. In East Khándesh it was somewhat affected by excessive moisture. In other districts the principal kharif crops—jowári and bájri—were good. Grasshoppers appeared in Ráhuri, Kopergaon and Sangamner tálukas of the Ahmednagar district and in Sinnar, Dindori and Chandor tálukas of the Násik district. They damaged to some extent the early kharif crops. The rabi crops were on the whole excellent. The severe frost in January did harm for the most part to the irrigated crops only.

The water-supply was abundant throughout the year. Plague appeared in parts of all the districts. But the epidemic was of a virulent type only in Ráver, Sinnar, Málegaon, Khatáv and Mán tálukas and in few villages of the Sholápur district. Elsewhere the visitation was mild. Cholera is reported to have visited all districts except West Khándesh and Sátára, but the mortality was very low. Small-pox, too, did but little damage. Cattle disease, chiefly rinderpest and foot and mouth, appeared more or less in all districts, but did not hamper the agricultural operations.

SOUTHERN DIVISION.

The season was an excellent one in spite of a somewhat lengthy spell of fair weather in the month of July and an excess of rainfall in the month of September.

Grasshoppers caused damage in parts of Dhárwár and gave rise to apprehension in parts of Belgaum and Dhárwár. The cotton crop was slightly damaged by rats in parts of the Dhárwár district.

Water-supply was generally sufficient, but serious drought was experienced in Hubli and some other towns of the Dhárwár district. In the case of Hubli water had to be imported by the Railway Company from a considerable distance.

Plague, small-pox and cholera as well as cattle-disease prevailed to some extent in all the districts.

3. Gross Revenue.

(Column 6 of Appendix I.)

NORTHERN DIVISION.

The net decrease under this head was insignificant; the more important variations in the several districts were as follows.

In Thána a decrease of Rs. 868 resulted from the transfer of a village from the Kalyán tálika to the Kolába district under Government Resolution No. 4528, dated 18th May 1910. In the Panch Maháls a decrease of Rs. 3,968 occurred on account of the afforestation of assessed land. On the other hand, in Kaira there was an increase, including Rs. 4,595 due to the withdrawal of the temporary reduction of the revision rates in certain villages of Nadiád.

The assessment of unassessed land newly brought under cultivation in all districts except Surat caused a further increase of Rs. 1,902.

CENTRAL DIVISION.

The gross revenue shows an increase of Rs. 12,812 due to the following facts:—

(a) The forest lands in the Násik and Poona districts transferred to the Revenue Department were assessed and given out for cultivation.

(b) In East Khándesh the unassessed cultivable lands were assessed and given out for cultivation, and revision survey rates were introduced into an inám village of Páchora táluka.

(c) The original survey settlement was introduced in some villages in the Sátára district.

SOUTHERN DIVISION.

The gross revenue rose from Rs. 1,07,73,738 to Rs. 1,03,10,779. There was a net increase of Rs. 36,991 due to the introduction of second revision settlement in some tálukas of the Dhárwár district and to the introduction of the first revision survey in the Kárwár táluka of the Kánara district. The transfer of a village from the Thána to the Kolába district also contributed to this increase. Bijápur and Ratnágiri districts show decreases owing to the abolition of pátasthal assessment in the former and the reduction sanctioned by Government Resolutions No. 2087 of 5th March 1910 and No. 11341 of 23rd November 1909 of the assessment on some *dongri bágáyat* lands in the Málvan and Vengurla tálukas which had been wrongly assessed as agricultural bágáyat.

4. Alienations.

(Column 9 of Appendix I.)

NORTHERN DIVISION.

The net increase of Rs. 1,471 under this head is accounted for as under:—

Ahmedabad	A decrease of Rs. 317, mainly on account of the forfeiture or relinquishment of inám land.
Kaira	An increase of Rs. 2,037, due mainly to the withdrawal of the temporary reduction of the revision rates in certain villages and to the restoration of forfeited inám land.
Panch Maháls	An increase of Rs. 854, owing chiefly to the remission of "ghásdána" hitherto levied as judi from certain inámdárs.
Broach	A decrease of Rs. 1,180, principally due to the grant of waste land as inám in exchange for service land useful to Government, rendered unfit for cultivation and relinquished.
Surat	A decrease of Rs. 204 on account of forfeiture of inám land.
Thána	An increase of Rs. 281 for the most part in the revenue of sharakati villages.

CENTRAL DIVISION.

There was a net increase of Rs. 1,048 principally due to the introduction of survey settlement into some inám villages of East Khándesh and Sátára during the year under report.

SOUTHERN DIVISION.

There is a net decrease of Rs. 6,988 due to the transfer of kadim cash allowances from net alienation to judi in the Belgaum and Bijápur districts and to the levy of settlement judi on kadim cash allowances in the Bijápur district.

5. Net Government Revenue.

NORTHERN DIVISION.

The net decrease of Rs. 27,260 under this head was due to the variations specified in paragraph 3.

CENTRAL DIVISION.

The net ordinary fixed revenue shows an increase of Rs. 5,371 over the last year's figure, due to the facts mentioned in paragraph 3. The increases and decreases in the several districts of this Division are given below :—

These were all ordinary fluctuations under the following heads :—Rents, sale of occupancy rights of land, sale-proceeds of trees, grass and grazing, fine for appropriating land to purposes unconnected with agriculture, fines for unauthorised cultivation, assessment on unassessed lands cultivated with permission and occasional items of fixed revenue.

The bulk of the large increase in Ahmedabad represents a book adjustment of the capitalized value and assessment of Government land acquired for the railways.

The causes of increase and decrease of these items have not been given, as most of them are of a fluctuating nature, such as occupancy price, revenue from trees, etc. (*vide* Government Resolution No. 1255, Revenue Department, dated the 11th February 1910).

SOUTHERN DIVISION.

There was a large increase of Rs. 1,55,741 under this head during the year under report. All the districts except Kánara show an increase. In the Belgaum (Rs. 63,354), Bijápur (Rs. 24,351) and Dhárwár (Rs. 40,719) districts the increases are chiefly due to the fact that full assessment was levied, after the jamábandi was over, on the lands of sanadis whose services were reduced in the reorganization carried out as required by Government Resolution No. 10372 of 27th October 1909, Revenue Department, and brought to this head of account. The increase in Ratnágiri represents the selling price of sheri lands given out for occupation on full survey or restricted tenure as in Government Resolution No. 12397, dated 23rd December 1909.

CENTRAL DIVISION.

The suspensions out of current year's demand amounted to Rs. 8,949. As compared with the amount for the previous year under this head, *viz.* Rs. 3,60,758, that of the current year is insignificant, and this indicates fairly the general character of the season throughout the Division. The amount re-suspended out of the suspended arrears for past years was Rs. 10,46,140 against the corresponding figure of Rs. 27,65,048 of the previous year.

Of the total sum unauthorizedly in arrears (columns 28 and 30) the largest amounts were in Ahmednagar and Poona, the districts which showed the heaviest unauthorized arrears in the previous year also.

SOUTHERN DIVISION.

Except in parts of the Hángal and Dhárwár talukas of the Dhárwár district, where a small sum of Rs. 3,945 was suspended on account of failure of crops, no suspensions were granted out of the current year's demand in any of

the districts. The greater part of the suspended revenue of former years was collected and at the end of the year the revenue re-suspended was Rs. 90,328 as compared with Rs. 6,71,270 at the end of the previous year.

9. Revenue for Collection.

The variation is due to the fact that the previous year's figures included former years' arrears, of which Rs. 10,98,474 (column 25 of the previous year's report) were collected last year and Rs. 4,02,114 (column 21) written off this year.

CENTRAL DIVISION.

The amount for collection (after granting remissions but without taking suspensions into account) on account of the year under report was Rs. 1,23,84,649 against Rs. 1,22,07,843. The amount for collection on account of previous years was Rs. 31,01,912, a decrease of Rs. 19,89,732 over the previous year's figures. The result was a gross demand of Rs. 1,54,86,561 (column 23) against Rs. 1,72,99,487.

SOUTHERN DIVISION.

Revenue for collection on account of the current year rose from Rs. 88,03,955 to Rs. 90,60,261. The rise was partly due to the increase of miscellaneous land revenue in the four districts of Belgaum, Bijápur, Dhárwár and Ratnágiri accounted for in paragraph 6 and partly to the introduction of second revision survey settlement in the Dhárwár district. The current year's demand together with the balance on account of former years due for collection in the year under report came to Rs. 99,36,969 against Rs. 1,08,75,509, and excluding suspensions shown in columns 27 and 29 the total demand including former years set down for collection was Rs. 98,42,690 against Rs. 1,01,84,550.

10. Collections.

(Columns 24, 25 and 26 of Appendix I.)

NORTHERN DIVISION.

Of the current year's demand of Rs. 97,67,323 (Rs. 98,33,129—65,806), Rs. 96,44,426 were collected, or 98·74 per cent. as compared with 98·73 per cent. in the preceding year.

CENTRAL DIVISION.

Out of the total revenue for collection (Rs. 1,54,86,561), in all Rs. 1,43,03,525 were collected. Including the amounts suspended, the percentage of collection to the total demand (column 23) was as detailed below:—

Taking the Division as a whole, more than 99 per cent. of the revenue for collection was recovered. All districts except East Khándesh and Sátára show considerable outstanding balances (including suspensions).

SOUTHERN DIVISION.

Against the total demand of Rs. 98,42,690 as shown in the concluding sentence of paragraph 9, the collections were Rs. 97,32,783 or 98.9 per cent. against 97.9 per cent. of the last year. Excluding previous years from consideration, the outstanding balance amounted to Rs. 1,88,705. The collection of Rs. 65,806 was formally suspended, while the unauthorized arrears of the year amounted to Rs. 1,22,899 (column 28). Efforts are being made to collect them.

CENTRAL DIVISION.

Appendix II shows the balances that remained outstanding on 1st August 1911. The outstanding balance at the close of the year was Rs. 11,83,036

against Rs. 38,51,242. Of the balances for collection about 39 per cent. is estimated as irrecoverable. Column 6 of Appendix II includes authorized suspensions.

SOUTHERN DIVISION.

The total outstanding balance (column 31) was less than that of the preceding year by Rs. 6,90,769 and stood on 31st July 1911 at Rs. 2,04,186. Out of this amount the unauthorised arrears amounted to Rs. 43,932 out of the current year's demand and Rs. 65,975 out of the former years' arrears. On 31st July 1910 these figures were respectively Rs. 79,312 and Rs. 1,24,684.

The outstandings shown against Ratnágiri are almost all on account of *japti* expenses of khoti villages under Government management to be recovered when the khots resume the management of the villages or written off when the villages lapse to Government (*vide* Government Resolution No. 4417, dated 5th May 1906). If this item (Rs. 39,882*) is excluded from calculation it will be seen that a large reduction has been effected in unauthorised arrears. Appendix II shows that out of over Rs. 2,04,000 outstanding, only Rs. 9,203 are regarded as being irrecoverable. The Collector of Ratnágiri has shown the attachment expenses referred to above under 'recoverable.' The amount ought properly to come under column 8 'doubtful.'

A comparison of the cultivable occupied area (column 12) in 1910-11 with the corresponding area for the previous year shows a net increase of 12,410 acres. In all 18,497 acres of unoccupied and disforested land were brought under cultivation as shown in the margin; while lands thrown up during the year on account of forfeitures and relinquishments were as shown in the margin.

SOUTHERN DIVISION.

There has been a net increase of 1,391 acres under occupied assessed land (column 12) contributed to by all the districts except Ratnágiri where there has been a net decrease of 2,698 acres. The decrease in Ratnágiri is explained by the fact that the total area of the village of Gaokhadi was on actual measurement found to be less by 3,289 acres than the estimated area hitherto reported.

In the Bijápur district no land was voluntarily relinquished during the year. The area of occupied land forfeited and of unoccupied land or land set apart for special purposes taken up for cultivation during the year was as shown in the margin.

NORTHERN DIVISION.

Changes in the average incidence of land revenue per head of population are too insignificant to need comment.

CENTRAL DIVISION.

The decrease (Rs. 0-1-6) in the incidence of land revenue per head of population is chiefly due to the increase in the total population (column 14). There is no variation from the previous year in the average incidence of land revenue per acre of fully assessed area.

SOUTHERN DIVISION.

The incidence of land revenue per head of population for Government rayatwari villages is Rs. 2-2-8 against Rs. 2-1-3 of last year. This increase is due to increase in revenue, of which the causes have been reported in the foregoing paragraphs, and to the decrease in the population in the Belgaum, Dhárwár and Kánara districts recorded at the recent census. The decrease against Government villages for which statistics are not available is due to the fact that the village of Gaokhadi in the Ratnágiri district was transferred from class 3 to class 1 owing to survey settlement having been extended to it.

15. Coercive Processes.

A penalty was inflicted under section 148 of the Land Revenue Code in 374 cases against 499 in the preceding year, Surat showing a remarkable decrease (from 161 to 2 only) and Panch Maháls and Broach having none. Thána was responsible for an increase of 55 cases.

Distrains and sales of moveable property on the other hand increased from 467 to 648, Kaira being the chief offender. There was however a decrease of 722 in the number of forfeitures, 2,383 cases having been reported against 3,105 in the preceding year, as explained in the table next following:—

CENTRAL DIVISION.

The number of notices issued under section 152 (column 3) decreased from 19,278 to 7,789, and this decrease is shared by all the districts in the Division. The total number of cases of penalty under section 148 also fell from 4,313 to 1,707.

The number of persons proceeded against under section 154 comes to 1,368 against 2,328 of the year preceding. The notices for forfeiture under section 153 were less than one half, the figures being 4,254 against 9,780.

The provisions of section 157 were resorted to in Ahmednagar, Poona, Sátára and Sholápur districts. There were in all 68 cases, of which 56 persons were detained for periods not exceeding a day.

SOUTHERN DIVISION.

The number of notices issued under section 152 decreased from 7,471 to 6,161, although Dhárwár shows an increase. The decrease is due to the good harvests of the year and to greater activity on the part of the Revenue staff. The number of cases of penalty under section 148 increased from 296 to 338. While Kánara shows a great drop from 259 to 87 cases, Belgaum and Dhárwár figures have risen from 3 and 31 to 105 and 132 respectively. The increase in the number of coercive processes in Dhárwár is said to be due to the contumacy of rayats. There is also an appreciable fall in the number of distraints under section 154 from 507 to 278. In Dhárwár there were 23 cases against 324 of last year, while Kolába and Ratnágiri show increases from 0 and 150 cases to 23 and 201 respectively. There was only one case in which sale of immoveable property was resorted to under section 155 against 4 of last year.

The number of notices and cases of forfeiture this year under section 153 fell from 555 and 545 to 442 and 354 respectively, the decrease being shared by all the Karnátic districts except Bijápur, where in Indi táluka forfeiture had to be freely resorted to on account of the habitual contumacy of the cultivators of that part. The area of lands declared forfeited is 5,687 against 8,471 acres, and the area returned to defaulters is 744 acres against 1,055.

16. Non-rayatwari Holdings.

(Appendix VII.)

NORTHERN DIVISION.

The last Jamábandi Return No. 7 was submitted with the report for the year 1904-05. It has been submitted this year in accordance with Government Resolution No. 10755, dated 15th November 1911. There are no important variations under any head.

CENTRAL DIVISION.

Appendix No. VII relates to estates and villages held on tenures other than rayatwari. As compared with the figures for 1904-05, the year in which Jamábandi Return No. 7 was submitted for the last time, there was a decrease of 223½ villages of the Khándesh district and 22 villages of the Násik district held on 'other' tenures such as Bigheriwaji, Najarandaji, etc., owing to the introduction of survey settlement into some of these villages and owing to some of the villages being included in forest area. Similarly 16 villages held on Udhad Jamábandi tenure in the Khándesh district disappear from this year's statement owing to the introduction of survey settlement therein.

The decrease in the Government revenue (column 6) is chiefly due to the fact that allowances payable to haldárs in dumala villages which had hitherto been included in judi were excluded from that item since the year 1907-08.

SOUTHERN DIVISION.

Appendix No. VII shows the number and extent of villages and estates held on tenures other than rayatwari and of unsurveyed Government villages. This appendix was last submitted for the year 1904-05, but its annual submission was discontinued and it was made a decennial one by Government Resolution No. 5361, dated 1st June 1906, which also directed that the decennial return should be first submitted for the year 1910-11.

The decrease in the number and area of holdings is due to the fact that a large number of khoti villages lapsed to Government during the last seven years and were entered as Government villages. The decrease in revenue is due to this cause and also to the fact that in the Belgaum and Bijápur districts, the kadim cash allowances payable to the hakdárs which were formerly included in the judi are now excluded from it and included in the alienated revenue.

17. Miscellaneous Land Revenue not included in the Taleband.

NORTHERN DIVISION.

There was a decrease of Rs. 4,414 due to miscellaneous causes under this head.

The sale of the trees on land in the village of Gota in the Daskroi táluka, the lease of which has expired, is still in progress.

CENTRAL DIVISION.

A comparison of figures in column 32 of Appendix I shows that there was a net increase of Rs. 53,912. This was due chiefly to the collection of city survey and sanad fees in Ahmednagar and to the recoveries of fees of Government servants and of expenditure incurred in connection with pót hissa mapni in the East Khándesh and Poona districts, and measurement and partition cases in the Ahmednagar district.

SOUTHERN DIVISION.

The revenue under this head amounted to Rs. 45,546 and shows a net increase of Rs. 11,456. The increase has been made up mostly by Belgaum (Rs. 3,557) and Bijápur (Rs. 7,746) and has not been explained.

18. Refunds.

LAND REVENUE ADMINISTRATION REPORT, PART I, SIND.

The following is the report for the year 1910-11 of Sind. The usual appendices are attached. Jamábandi Return No. 6 has not been appended to this report as its preparation has been postponed for the present.

2. Season.

The year was generally favourable except in the Karáchi district. The river began to rise in the beginning of June 1910 but did not reach the fair irrigating level of 13' at Bukkur till the 29th of July 1910. It remained at or above that level for 23 days only, as against 31 days in the preceding year. The highest level recorded was 14·5', nearly the same as last year. But the late arrival and short duration of the fair irrigating level were more than compensated for by the steady maintenance of the river at a level of not less than 12' from the 23rd of June to the end of August and by plentiful rainfall throughout the Province. The sudden and somewhat premature fall of the river in the beginning of September 1910, however, had an unfavourable result on the kharif crops in some districts. The rainfall was generally beneficial, both for kharif and rabi crops except in the Karáchi district, where the rice cultivation in the low-lying lands of the delta was destroyed by the heavy fall in July, and where the absence of a second shower in the barani tracts caused all the crops to wither before maturity. The early rise of the river in 1911 also caused considerable damage to rabi crops in parts of Lárkána and Hyderabad districts.

As a result of the generally favourable character of the season, the area under cultivation rose by nearly 3 lákhs of acres and the revenue by about 10 lákhs of rupees.

The public health was not as good as could be desired. Plague ran its usual course in Karáchi, the epidemic being more virulent and of longer duration than usual. A few cases were imported into the Hyderabad and Sukkur districts, almost all of which proved fatal. Cholera and small-pox broke out in the Lárkána, Sukkur, Upper Sind Frontier and Hyderabad districts, and the former assumed somewhat serious proportions in the two first named districts. Malaria also made its appearance throughout the Province, but except in the town and cantonment of Hyderabad and in parts of the Thar and Párkar and Sukkur districts was not of a severe type.

Fodder was sufficient throughout except in the Kohistan tract of the Karáchi district and the desert portion of the Thar and Párkar district, where scarcity was felt towards the close of the year owing to absence of rain. The condition of cattle was generally good. There were outbreaks of rinderpest in all districts except Thar and Párkar, the most severe being in Lárkána, Sukkur and Upper Sind Frontier. Slight outbreaks of other diseases such as Hæmorrhagic Septicæmia, Hydræmia, Surra and pleuro-pneumonia occurred in the Karáchi and Hyderabad districts. In Thar and Párkar 2,500 head of cattle succumbed to small-pox and a disease of the glands.

3. Gross Revenue.

(Column 6 of Appendix I.)

There was a net increase of nearly 4 lákhs or 1·06 per cent. in the gross revenue of the Province. Taking each district separately the figures show a decrease in the case of Sukkur and Karáchi to the extent of Rs. 11,030 and Rs. 32,090, respectively, due in the case of the former chiefly to erosion by the river of a large area, and of the latter to reduction in the amount of assessment on unoccupied cultivable lands which is calculated according to the average rate deduced from the assessment of the area actually cultivated. The increase

in the Hyderabad district of Rs. 1,36,433 is attributable to the increase in the average rate above referred to, while a similar increase in each of the two districts of Lárkána and Thar and Párkar is due to extension of cultivation consequent on the favourable character of the season.

4. Alienations.

(Column 9 of Appendix I.)

There is a net falling off under this head of Rs. 10,921 shared by all districts except Upper Sind Frontier and Karáchi where there is a slight increase owing to reduced cultivation in alienated lands. The decrease of Rs. 1,248 and Rs. 2,129 respectively in Lárkána and in Thar and Párkar is accounted for by the exclusion from column 9 (net alienations) of seri grants and their inclusion in column 12 (land free or specially reduced), while the shortage of Rs. 1,855 in Sukkur is chiefly due to an increase in hakabo. The resumption of a political inám is the principal cause which contributed to the decrease of Rs. 7,292 in the Hyderabad district.

5. Net Government Revenue.

(Column 13 of Appendix I.)

Under this head there is a rise of nearly 10 lákhs of rupees, due for the most part to the good inundation. This, however, does not completely compensate for the loss of 11½ lákhs of rupees caused by the previous year's unfavourable season. The improvement is noticeable in all districts, but chiefly in Sukkur and Lárkána, which alone contribute more than 7 lákhs. In Lárkána the increase was also due in a measure to enhancement in the rates of assessment consequent on the revision of settlements of the Lárkána, Kambar and Rátodero tálukas. As usual the figures in column 13 include hakabo (water-rate) levied on alienated holdings and credited to the Public Works Department. It amounted to Rs. 82,600 during the year under report as against Rs. 82,000 in the previous year.

6. Miscellaneous Government Revenue as shown in the Talebands.

(Column 16 of Appendix I.)

The provincial totals under Miscellaneous Government Revenue show an improvement of nearly 3 lákhs, though there is a falling off to the extent of over 8 thousand in the Lárkána and Karáchi districts. The increase is largest in Thar and Párkar, amounting to Rs. 1,87,707, due chiefly to recovery during the year of the second half of malkano on Jamráo lands. In Sukkur and Hyderabad it appears mostly in the sale-proceeds of occupancy rights and in fines under sections 66 and 148 of the Land Revenue Code, while in Upper Sind Frontier the major portion of the increase is under fines under sections 61 and 66. The decrease in the Lárkána district is mainly in the sale-proceeds of occupancy rights.

7. Remissions.

(Column 20 of Appendix I.)

Remissions amounted to Rs. 5,35,500 as against Rs. 3,31,300 in the previous year. They were heaviest in the Karáchi district where they amounted to Rs. 2,08,600 or about 39 per cent. of the entire amount. The principal cause was loss due to floods which was responsible for the remission of Rs. 2,81,500, Karáchi district alone contributing Rs. 1,68,600 owing to the unfavourable conditions brought about in the delta by heavy rains. In Lárkána, which suffered next, the loss was caused by heavy rain-fed torrents and river floods. There was a considerable decrease in the amount of remissions granted for insufficiency of water-supply, the total amount remitted under this head being Rs. 77,200

against Rs. 1,41,300 in the previous year. The amount remitted on account of time-expired fallows was Rs. 92,700 as compared with Rs. 87,200 in 1909-10. The more important of the remaining contributory causes were:—

- (a) Injury to crops by locusts and other insects—Rs. 8,400 against Rs. 40,100 in the preceding year ;
- (b) Injury to crops on account of frost—Rs. 15,500 against Rs. 200 in the previous year.

General remissions were granted in the Kohistan and Band Virah tracts of the Karáchi district to the extent of Rs. 25,000 owing to the poor circumstances of the zamindars who had suffered heavily from the rain-storms of July 1908 and July 1910.

8. Suspensions.

(Columns 33 and 35 of Appendix I.)

As a result of the generally favourable character of the season there was a large decrease during the year in the amount of land revenue suspended, the total amount being Rs. 1,98,870 as against Rs. 4,34,489 in the previous year. Of this Rs. 70,008 belonged to the year under report and Rs. 1,28,862 to former years. These figures are included in the balances outstanding at the close of the year and will be dealt with in paragraph 11 below.

9. Revenue for collection.

(Column 21 of Appendix I.)

The net revenue for collection, after deducting remissions, rose from nearly 97½ lakhs in 1909-10 to 108 lakhs. Adding to this the previous year's balances, the total amount for collection was Rs. 1,16,38,000, against Rs. 1,08,04,000 in the preceding year.

10. Collections.

(Column 32 of Appendix I.)

The total amount recovered on account of the current year's revenue was satisfactory, being Rs. 1,03,61,000 or 96·02 per cent. of the demand of Rs. 1,07,94,000, against a percentage of 95·96 in the preceding year. The percentages of such collections for the different districts are compared below with those of the previous year:—

There was a fairly good rise in Hyderabad and Thar and Párkar, the falling off being most noticeable in the Karáchi district, where, as shown above, the conditions were most unfavourable. The apparent decrease in Lárkána is due to the inclusion in the figures for collection of over Rs. 68,000 which is under correspondence for remission, while in Upper Sind Frontier it is ascribed to the laxity of the late Mukhtyarkar of Kandhkot who has since been convicted of corruption. The collections on account of past years amounted to Rs. 3,98,000 out of a demand of Rs. 8,44,000 or 47·15 per cent. against 52·67 per cent. in 1909-10. Here also the decrease is most marked in the Karáchi and Upper Sind Frontier districts for reasons given above, the percentages being 28·39 and 45·40 respectively against 39·52 and 77·96 in the preceding year. The Sukkur, Lárkána and Hyderabad districts show a fair improvement under this head. Under Government Resolution No. 5420, dated the 2nd August 1890, the collections of land revenue including miscellaneous items not brought to account in the jamábandi are to be compared with the collections shown in the Accountant General's books. The difference amounts to Rs. 35,185 and is explained in Statement A. An excess of Rs. 37,923 in the Accountant General's figures is

due to (1) adjustment of errors, (2) over-collections, (3) collections on account of future years, and (4) sale-proceeds of land credited direct in the Treasury and not included in jamábandi return No. 1 for the Karáchi district. On the other hand the figures in jamábandi return No. 1 show an increase of Rs. 2,738, of which Rs. 1,475 represent adjustment of errors in accounts, and Rs. 1,263 collections made during the preceding year on account of the year under report.

11. Balances.

(Columns 33—37 of Appendix I and Appendix II.)

The total outstanding balance at the end of the year was Rs. 8,75,662 against Rs. 8,97,736 or about Rs. 22,000 less than in the previous year. Out of this Rs. 37,487 have since been recovered, Rs. 99,237 are irrecoverable, having been remitted during the year and after, Rs. 19,134 are under correspondence for remission, and the recovery of Rs. 2,154 which have been misappropriated by tapadars is doubtful. Thus the net unrecovered balance at the close of the year was Rs. 7,17,650, of which Rs. 3,00,129 belong to the year under report and Rs. 4,17,521 to former years. Of this net balance, (a) Rs. 1,98,871 are under postponement, (b) Rs. 42,981 are under correspondence for postponement, (c) Rs. 94,660 are due from the Manager, Encumbered Estates in Sind, (d) Rs. 646 are due on account of malkano recoverable in future years, (e) Rs. 864 are due from minors under guardianship, and (f) only Rs. 3,79,628 are practically unauthorized arrears of which Karáchi alone is responsible for Rs. 2,06,918 or about 55 per cent. In spite of fairly liberal postponements granted in the Karáchi district on account of special conditions, and in parts of the Hyderabad district where the rabi crop had suffered considerably, there was a satisfactory decrease under (a) due to the generally favourable character of the season. The balances due from the Manager, Encumbered Estates in Sind, were also reduced from Rs. 1,10,733 in the year 1909-10 to Rs. 94,660 in the year under report or by 14.51 per cent.

As required by Government Resolution No. 5140, dated the 22nd July 1890, the previous years' balances which were shown as recoverable in Appendix II for the year 1909-10 and were not recovered in the year under report, have to be separately accounted for. Such balances amounted to Rs. 4,31,429. Out of this Rs. 12,271 were recovered after the close of the year, leaving a balance of Rs. 4,19,158 which is accounted for in Statement B.

12. Takavi.

(Appendix III.)

Takávi advances made during the year amounted to Rs. 4,12,916 under Act XIX of 1883, and to Rs. 4,34,438 under Act XII of 1884 as against Rs. 3,64,299 and Rs. 3,67,593 respectively in the previous year. The increase was chiefly in the Karáchi district where liberal grants were necessitated by the extraordinary rains of July 1910, both for repairing bunds which had suffered general damage and for the purchase of seed and cattle for the cultivation of the barani areas. In the Sukkur and Hyderabad districts the increase under the Agriculturists' Loans Act of Rs. 12,000 and Rs. 31,000 respectively was due to increased popularity of takávi loans in these districts, while the decrease in the Lárkána district of Rs. 37,000 under the Land Improvement Loans Act is attributed to the favourable character of the season. The total amount of advances including the previous years' balances was Rs. 27,06,615, out of which Rs. 7,55,611 were collected as against Rs. 7,05,607 in the previous year, and Rs. 13,929 written off, leaving a balance of Rs. 19,37,075. This includes a sum of Rs. 15,53,120 which is due for collection in 1911-12 and subsequent years. The remainder amounts to Rs. 3,83,955 as against Rs. 4,46,958 in the previous year and is composed of Rs. 2,11,087 on account of arrears of past years and Rs. 1,72,868 which were due for collection in the year under report. Of this Rs. 8,367 have been recovered since the close of the year and Rs. 3,076 are the subject of correspondence for remission. The remaining arrears are accounted for in Statement C. Here also the unauthorized arrears are heaviest in the Karáchi district which is responsible for more than half the total amount. There is much improvement in the figures for the Hyderabad district which were reduced from Rs. 1,40,276 to Rs. 59,806. The amount outstanding is, however, still large and

this will be pointed out to the Collector. In the Lárkána district these arrears have actually increased from Rs. 37,505 to Rs. 54,294, and no explanation has been offered by the Collector. His attention will be drawn to the omission and he will be asked to take such action as may be necessary for clearing the outstandings.

13. Area.

(Appendix IV.)

The small decrease of 1,505 acres in the total area of the Province (column 3) calls for no explanation.

Under "Unassessed cultivable" there is a decrease of 40,023 acres which is shared in by all districts except Karáchi where there is an increase under this head owing to the correction of an error made last year in showing an area of this column under column 5 "Uncultivable land". The decrease in other districts is due to increased cultivation as a result of good inundation and heavy rainfall. For the same reasons there is decrease in all districts under "Uncultivable land" of the total area of 46,734. In the Upper Sind Frontier district this is also due to some extent to survey operations, which account for the increase of 4,200 acres under "Unoccupied cultivable assessed land"—column 11. The falling off under this head in the districts of Sukkur, Hyderabad, Lárkána and Karáchi is attributable to expansion of cultivation. The following table shows the areas taken up permanently and relinquished in each district during the year under report:—

The area taken up shows a net increase of 462 acres although there is a decrease under this head in every district except Thar and Párkar and Upper Sind Frontier. The decrease is noticeable particularly in Lárkána where there is restriction on the permanent grant of land on canals. The large increase occurring in Thar and Párkar is due to the causes shown in last year's report. The area relinquished shows a falling off of 5,181 acres which occurs almost entirely in the tract administered by the Colonization Officer, Jamráo Canal. The information required by Government Resolution No. 8294, dated the 20th November 1899, is given in the subjoined statement:—

The difference of 13,969 acres between the total of the areas accounted for in this statement and the total given in column 5 of the preceding statement represents the area of fallow, forfeited and relinquished land restored to original occupants on the payment of arrears or otherwise. Of the total area granted free of malkano 5,885 acres were given out on the Jamráo in peasant grants. The remaining area is composed of petty grants made in lieu of lands relinquished or in consideration of frontage claims. The aggregate realizations from malkano are larger than in the previous year and the average rate per acre is Rs. 4-8-0 as against Rs. 2-12-0 in 1909-10.

14. Non-Rayatwari tenure.

(Appendix V.)

This appendix was last submitted for the year 1904-1905. The figures given in the present appendix show slight variations as compared with those last reported and call for no remarks, except in the case of column 2 'Number of estates or villages'. The increase of 89 under this head occurs mostly in the Hyderabad district and is due to the fact that in the previous return the figures given in the corresponding column represented the number of holders of estates, whereas the figures now supplied correctly represent the number of dehs in which the estates are situated.

15. Average incidence of land revenue.

(Appendix VI.)

The incidence of land revenue per head of population (columns 19 and 36) shows an increase in proportion to the improvement in the amount of land revenue, caused by the favourable inundation of the year. The slight increase of two pies in the incidence per acre (column 31) calls for no comment. The figures of population given in this appendix are according to the census of 1911.

16. Coercive Processes.

(Appendix VII.)

There is an increase of 1,544 in the number of notices issued under section 152 of the Bombay Land Revenue Code, due generally to the increased land revenue for collection. The same reason accounts for the increase under column 4. More extensive use was made of the provisions of section 148, Land Revenue Code, specially in the Hyderabad and Upper Sind Frontier districts where the number of cases dealt with rose from 39 and 349 to 3,066 and 1,132 respectively. The effect of this measure will be better realized in the current year. Experience in the Lárkána district has been that a judicious use of these provisions had a salutary effect in the year under report in enforcing more prompt payment by zamindars hitherto contumacious. There is a slight falling off in the provincial figures of the number of distraints and sales of moveable property under section 154. But an examination of the district figures shows marked variations in the Hyderabad and Thar and Párkar districts. In the former the number rose from 18 to 51 owing to the necessity for the adoption of strict measures in selected cases of persistent defaulters, while in the latter it fell from 55 to 10, due to the generally favourable conditions of the season. The figures in column 18 represent forfeitures mostly under the Sind Fallow Rules. Two persons were dealt with under section 157 of the Land Revenue Code for wilful evasion of payment of assessment.

17. Miscellaneous Revenue not included in the Talebands.

The total amount of realizations under this head was Rs. 94,504 as against Rs. 92,920 in the previous year. The increase is due to a rise in the receipts under the head "Interest on advances under the Land Improvement Loans Act and the Agriculturists' Loans Act".

RESOLUTION.—Except in some parts of the Northern Division which suffered from the erratic nature of the rainfall, and an untimely frost, the season of 1910-11 was better than had been experienced for several years throughout the Presidency proper; while in Sind the year is reported to have been generally favourable except in the Karáchi district, where the crops were damaged by excessive early rains and subsequent drought.

2. The demand for the current year in the Presidency proper amounted to $312\frac{3}{4}$ lákhs. Of this, 310 lákhs were collected, three-fourths of a lách was suspended, and 2 lákhs remained unauthorisedly in arrears at the close of the year.

3. The total balance of authorised and unauthorised arrears on account of previous years outstanding at the beginning of the year amounted to 56 lákhs. From this sum $11\frac{3}{4}$ lákhs were written off as irrecoverable, and out of the balance of $44\frac{1}{4}$ lákhs, 12 lákhs were formally suspended, $28\frac{3}{4}$ lákhs recovered and $3\frac{1}{2}$ lákhs left in arrears.

4. The total net demand in the Presidency proper thus came to 357 lákhs, of which $338\frac{3}{4}$ lákhs were collected. The total outstanding arrears at the end of the year were $18\frac{1}{4}$ lákhs, as compared with 56 lákhs in 1909-10 and $94\frac{3}{4}$ lákhs in 1908-09. The steady reduction in the amount of outstanding arrears is a satisfactory feature, though the balances in Ahmedabad, Kaira, Thána, Ahmednagar, Poona and Dhárwár still call for attention.

5. The generally favourable character of the season in Sind resulted in an increase of nearly 3 lákhs of acres in the area under cultivation, and of 10 lákhs of rupees in revenue. The net revenue demand of the year was $107\frac{3}{4}$ lákhs, of which $103\frac{1}{2}$ lákhs were collected. Less than a lách had actually to be suspended during the year, while $3\frac{1}{2}$ lákhs of unauthorised arrears remained outstanding at its close. In addition, there were arrears of revenue on account of previous years amounting to nearly 9 lákhs, of which half a lách was written off as irrecoverable. Of the remainder, 4 lákhs were collected, and $4\frac{1}{2}$ lákhs were left in arrears, rather less than a third of which had been actually suspended. The total balance of

authorised and unauthorised arrears at the close of the year was $8\frac{1}{2}$ lakhs as against 9 lakhs at the close of the preceding year. This small reduction in the figure of the outstanding arrears is disappointing in view of the favourable character of the season. The arrears in the Karáchi and Hyderabad districts are especially heavy and it is hoped that every effort will be made to reduce them to a more reasonable figure.

3. 6. The demand for tagái in the Presidency proper was smaller than in the previous year—8 lakhs having been actually distributed, 4 lakhs less than in 1909-10. The amount for collection, including $8\frac{1}{2}$ lakhs of arrears, was $41\frac{1}{4}$ lakhs, of which $37\frac{3}{4}$ lakhs were collected, leaving $3\frac{1}{2}$ lakhs in arrears. Government are pleased to note the substantial reduction of outstanding arrears that has been effected in every district except Kaira and the Panch Maháls, more particularly in the districts of Ahmednagar, Poona and Bijápur where the arrears were specially heavy. In Kaira the balance of unauthorised arrears at the close of the year appears to be unnecessarily large. The year was admittedly a good one and borrowers should have had no difficulty in repaying their instalments, which have now been fixed so as to render their payment as little burdensome as possible. In Sind, advances amounted to $8\frac{1}{2}$ lakhs. Six lakhs were due on account of the current demand, and $4\frac{1}{2}$ lakhs on account of arrears, of which $4\frac{3}{4}$ lakhs and $2\frac{1}{4}$ lakhs respectively were recovered. The total unauthorised arrears at the end of the year amounted to $3\frac{3}{4}$ lakhs, of which $1\frac{3}{4}$ lakhs were due in Karáchi district alone, and $1\frac{1}{2}$ lakhs in Lárkána and Hyderabad districts. The figures for the whole province show a reduction in arrears of tagái of three-fourths of a lách only as compared with those of the preceding year, which cannot be regarded as satisfactory. Government cannot lay too much emphasis on the necessity for punctuality in the recovery of instalments of tagái both in the interest of the borrower as well as in that of Government itself.
