PREFACE

I HAD intended to complete in this second volume my short survey of the history of the British Working-class Movement. But, as soon as I began to reduce to order my accumulated material, I saw that it would be impossible to do this without making the second volume nearly twice as long as the first. It seemed, moreover, that there was a natural break in the story just about the end of the century. The Victorian age appeared to be a chapter complete in itself, and deserving to be dealt with as a rounded whole. I therefore decided to make a second break about 1900, and to complete my study in three volumes instead of two.

Just as, in the first volume, I was trying to present a coherent account of the successive waves of working-class revolt against the new economic and social conditions created by the Industrial Revolution, so here I have attempted to present a picture of the new working-class movements which, from about 1850 onwards, based themselves on an acceptance of Industrialism, and an attempt to make the best of the new structure of economic society. For a time this acceptance was to a great extent an acceptance, not only of Industrialism, but also of that individualist Capitalism in which the new industrial order was first embodied. Later, it found expression in a Socialism which, hostile to Capitalism, was no less definitely based on accepting Industrialism as the basis of social organisation.

In my first volume I had to stress the unity of the entire Workingclass Movement—the common basis and the close actual connection of the early experiments in Trade Unionism, in Co-operation, and in Radical political reform. Here, in dealing with the Victorian era, I have rather to lay stress on the division of the workers' movement into a number of distinct and separate expressions. Co-operation and Trade Unionism drifted apart; independent working-class political action was for a time submerged. The various working-class movements, pursuing strictly limited aims, rarely felt the need for united effort or community of policy. But, as the "Golden Age" of Victorian Capitalism passes away and gives place to the new age of Imperialism and international economic rivalries, we shall see the aims and attitude of the working-class movements gradually changing, and the idea of united organisation again emerging side by side with the re-emergence of a wider, anti-capitalist aim.

As in the previous volume, I have aimed only at an outline study, and have excluded footnotes and references to sources. I wish to emphasise the point that the books mentioned at the end of each section are no more than a few selected references for further reading, confined for the most part to works which are easily accessible. In this volume, they fail at a good many points to cover the ground, for there are still many uncharted tracts in the history of the workers during the Victorian era. There is no study at all of working-class politics during this period, and no adequate account of Trade Union development. I have been driven, therefore, to a considerable use of old newspapers, pamphlets and reports. Especially have I drawn largely on the valuable collection of books and papers originally made by George Howell, and now housed in London at the Bishopsgate Institute.
