The agricultural seed sold in Vermont in 1933 as a whole was of good quality comparing well with that sold during most of the years since the law went into effect in 1913.

Only one sample was short in respect to purity and less than 7 percent of the entire number were deficient in respect to viability. Several of the failures in viability are to be charged up to overlarge numbers of hard seed and, perhaps, in some cases to the length of time between the vendor's test and that made during the past summer by the Station's seed analyst.
