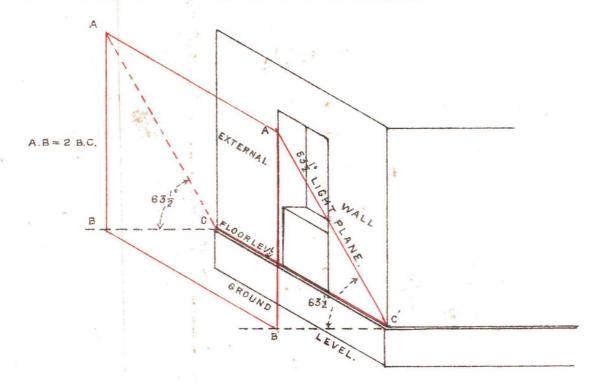

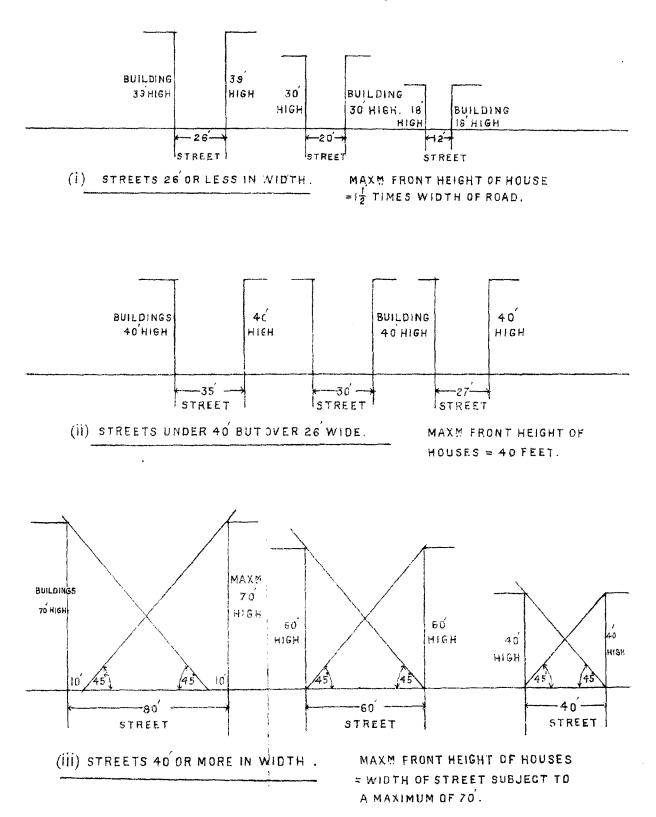


DIAGRAM Nº IV

TO BY SUCCESSIVE SET BACKS TOWARDS THE REAR.



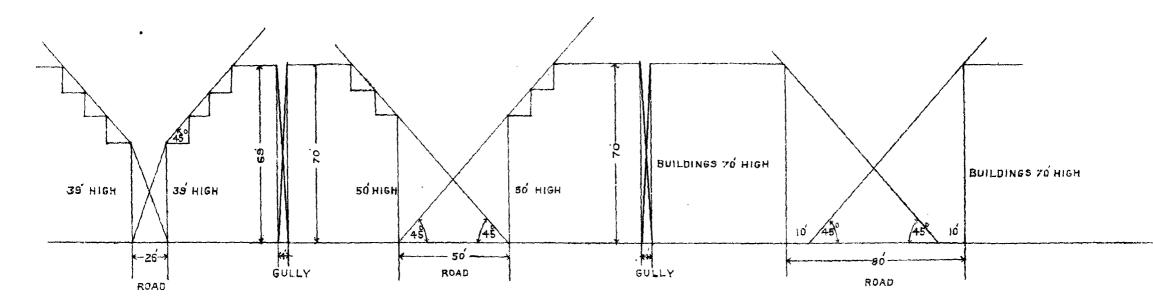
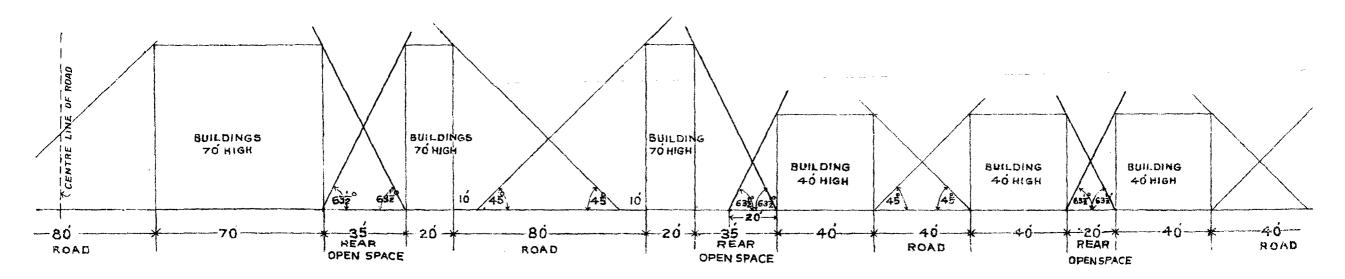

Notes on Street No. 251 of Samuel Street.

I. The house bearing Municipal Street No. 251 of Samuel Street is one of many houses occupying the whole depth (68' to 75') between Dongri Street and Samuel Street. Its history is set out here to illustrate how the evils resulting from the erection long ago of houses with very narrow gullies between them, have since been greatly intensified owing to the fact that the Municipality allow owners to build on their old plinths and add new storeys and do not require them to leave adequate side open spaces.

2. The diagram shows in section and first floor plan the house in question and its next door neighbours. The ground floors of all three are taken up by dark godowns, excellent breeding places for rats. The three houses will for short be termed No. 1, No. 2 and No. 3 here, No. 2 being street No. 251.

3. There was originally a 2' 2" gully between Nos. 1 and 2 and a 1' gully between Nos. 2 and 3 and conditions were bad enough, but not so bad as now, because the 3 houses were originally only 36' 3'', 33' 7'' and 12' 6'' in height respectively, whereas now they are respectively 46' 9'', 57' 7'' and 43' high. Meanwhile the only change made in the gullies has been the increase of the width of the 1' gully to 2' at one end, 3' at the other and 5' in the middle.

4. No. 3 was a ground floor building until 1894, when it was reconstructed on the same plinth with ground and three upper floors reaching a height of 43' at the eaves, although the road in front of it was only 32' broad.

5. The next house to be altered was No. 1 which was demolished in 1905 and reconstructed on the same plinth with ground and three upper floors reaching to a height of 46'9" at the eaves, although the street in front of it was only 30' broad.

6. No. 2 was at this time the lowest of the three houses ; but in 1911 it was made the highest, being reconstructed from the plinth with ground and four upper storeys reaching a height of 57'7'' at the eaves in the middle section shown in diagram.

7. By this time the by-laws of 1910 were in force and as there were three interior rooms on each floor dependent for light and air on the side gully to the south, the owner was required to broaden the gully to 6' opposite those 3 rooms : he, however, represented that room No. 4 was a dressing-room not to be used for human habitation at night : he was therefore permitted to limit the broadening of the gully to the length in front of rooms Nos. 2 and 3, and he has actually constructed the gully with a breadth of 5' at ground level and 5' 9'' at the highest point between houses. The gully is for most of its length under 3' in breadth; rubbish is thrown into it from the side windows, and it can never be properly kept clean. On the first and second floors, rooms Nos. 2, 3 and 4 are inadequately lighted and ventilated and, as a matter of fact, room No. 4 is used for human habitation at night.

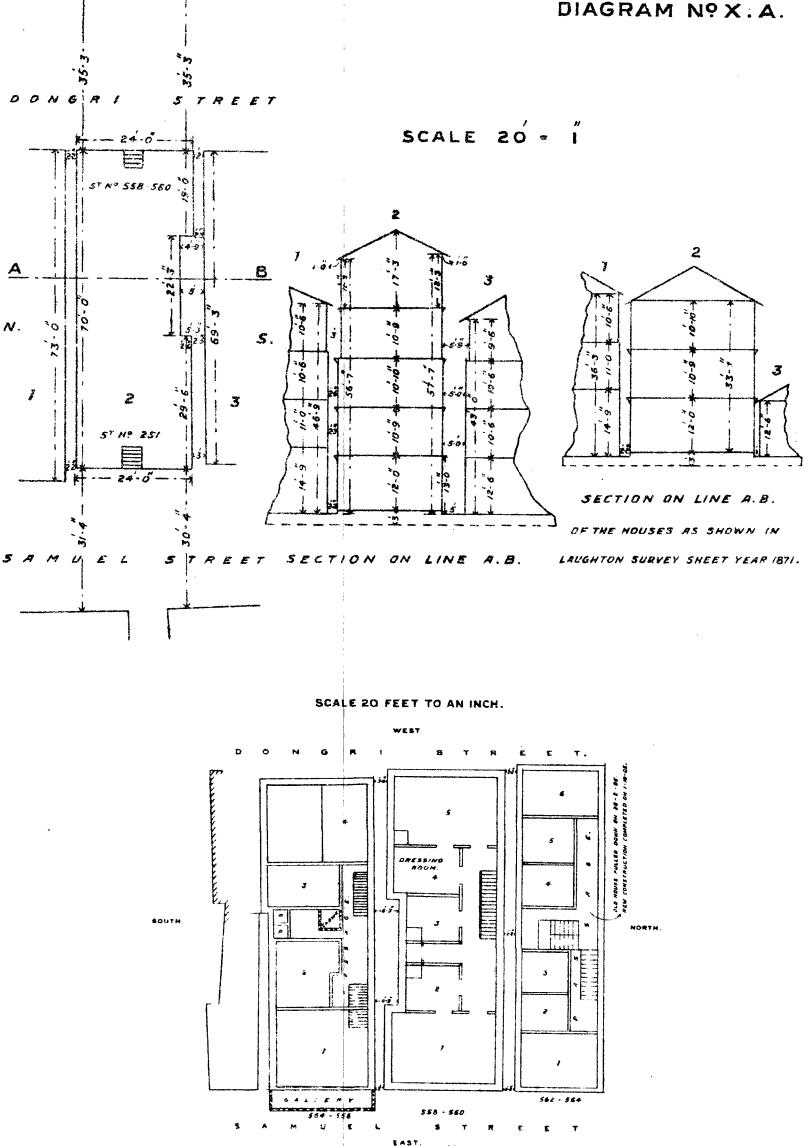
8. House No. 3 has no rooms depending on the gully between Nos. 2 and 3 for light and air, so the owner will never be required to set back his side wall. Similarly the owner of No. 2 will not be required to set back his north wall; and consequently rooms Nos. 2, 3, 4 and 5 in house No. 1, all of which are let as one room tenements, must always be extremely ill-lighted and ventilated on at any rate the two middle floors.

9. If in future the owner of house No. I reconstructs his house, he can by slightly reducing its height to 44' avoid setting back his south wall by more than 2' in the middle. The Municipality will require the gully adjacent to rooms Nos. 2 to 5 to be broadened to 4': this breadth is proportionate to the height of No. 1, not to that of the much higher house No. 2, which obstructs the lighting and ventilation of the rooms in No. 1.

10. There are hundreds of similar cases all over the congested area of Bombay, and it is therefore not surprising to find that in several sections of that area the density of population exceeds 400 per acre and reaches as much as 638 per acre in spite of the demolition of many houses in Improvement Trust Schemes.

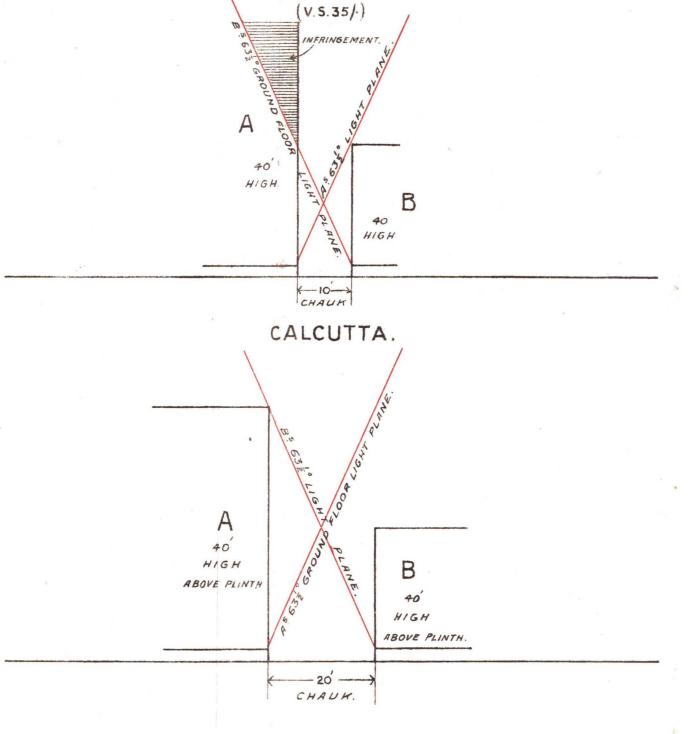

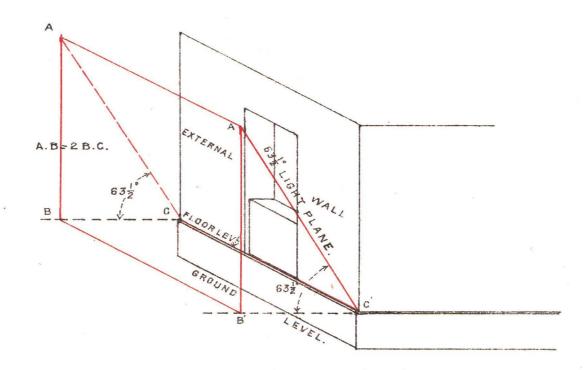

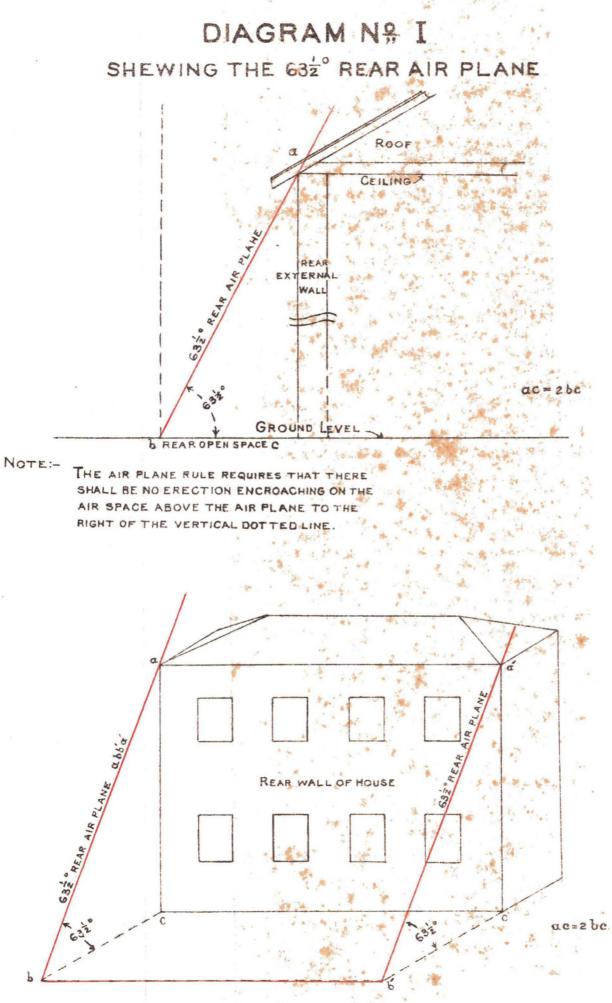

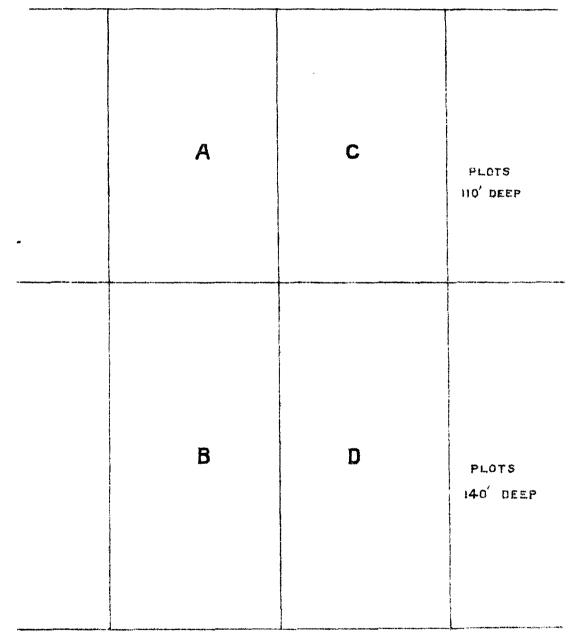

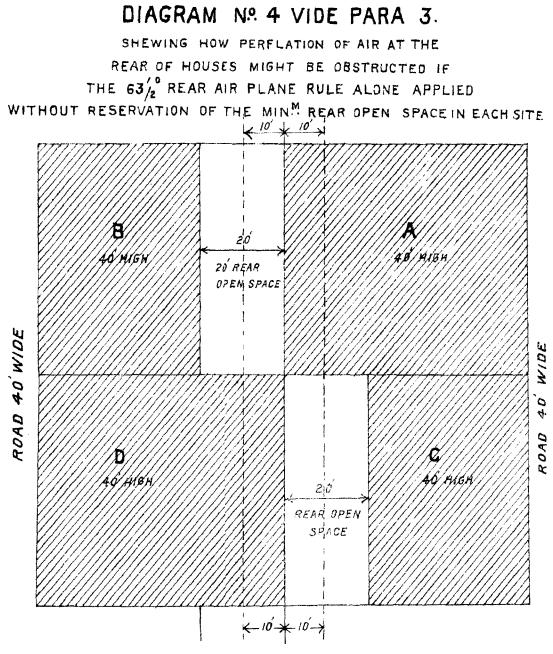
GROUND PLAN OF PLOTS

SHEWING BUILDINGS ENTIRELY INDEPENDENT OF ONE ANOTHER.

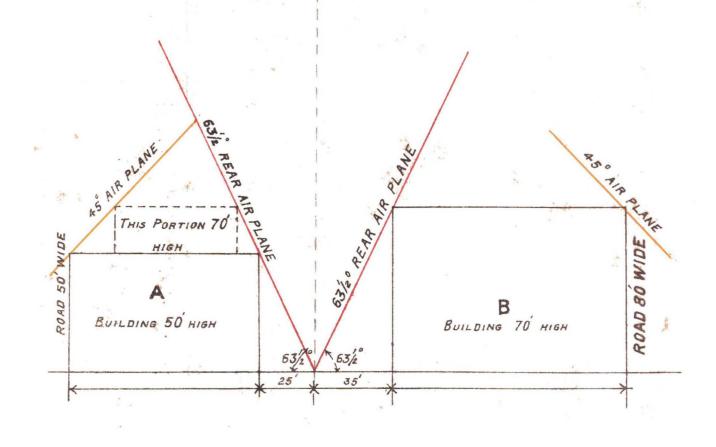

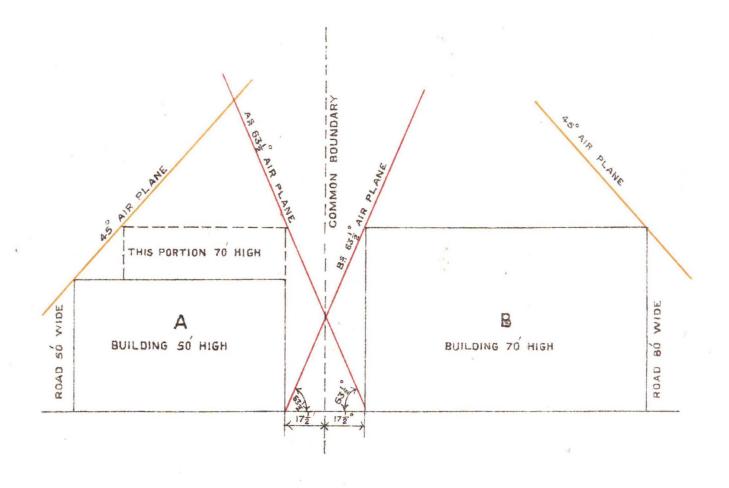
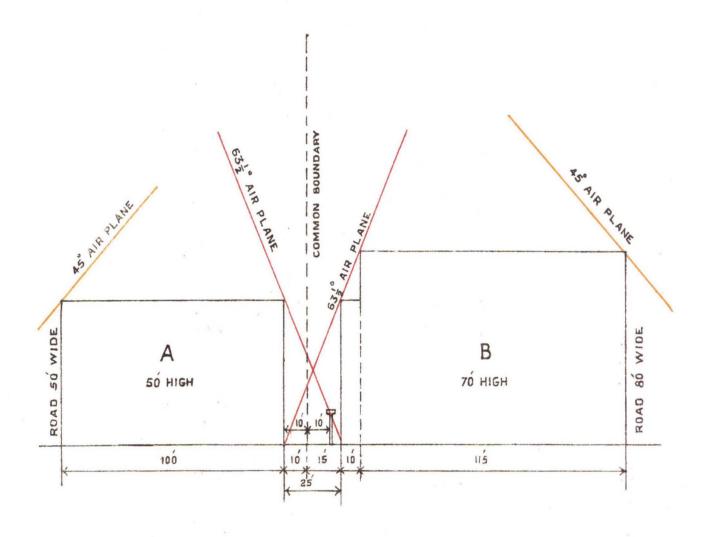

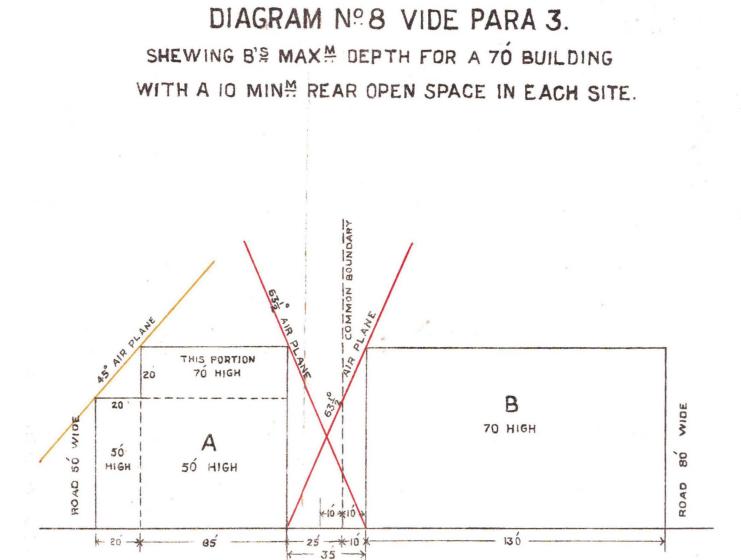

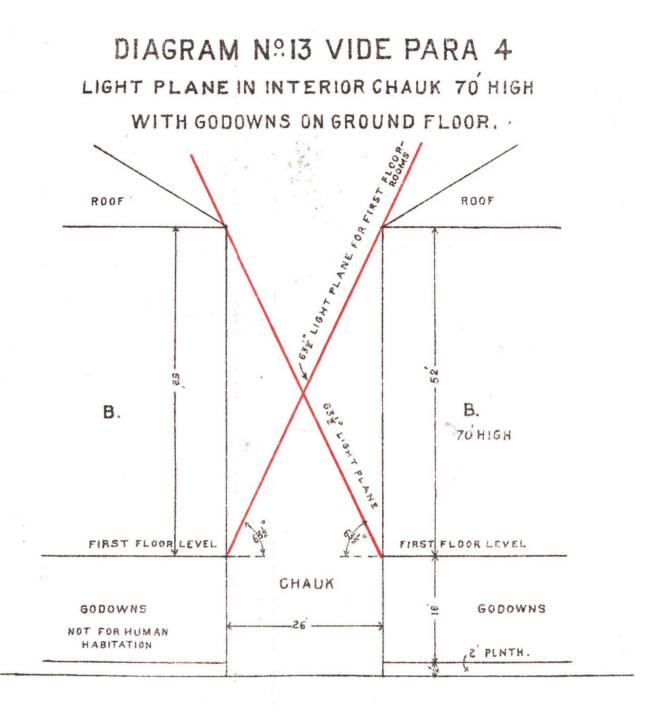

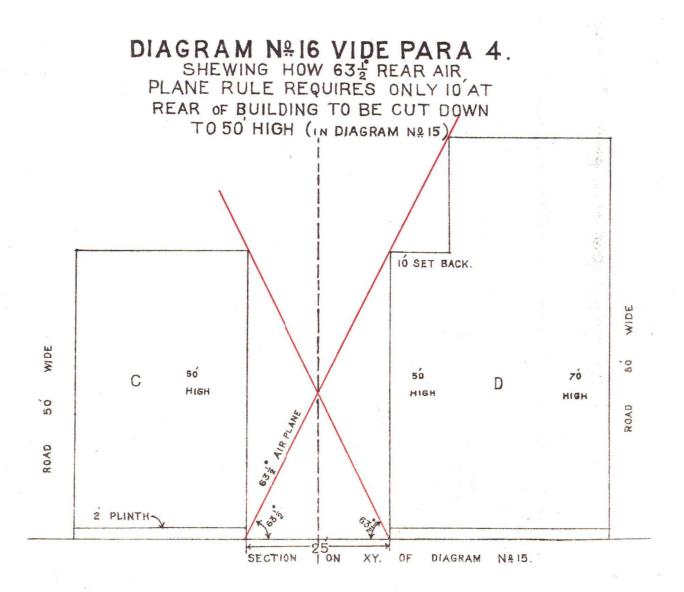
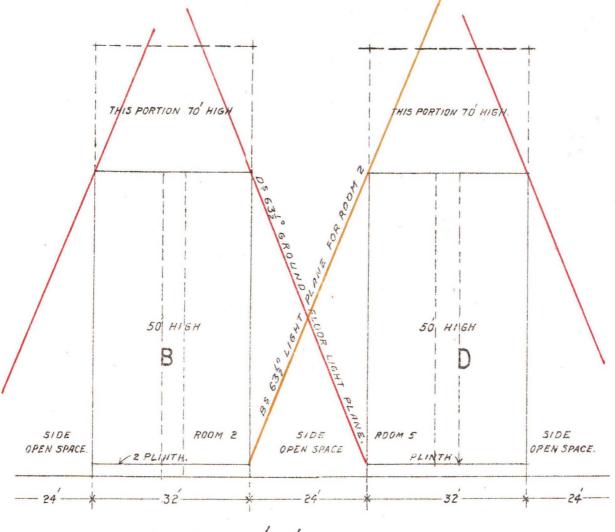

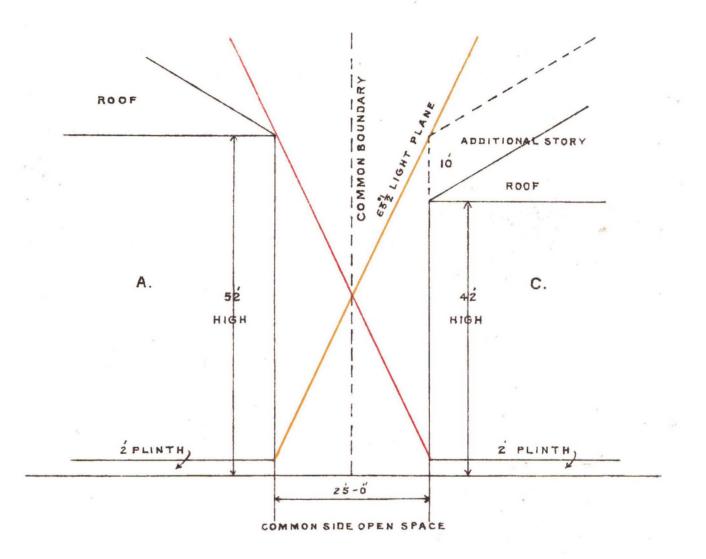


DIAGRAM Nº 19 VIDE PARA

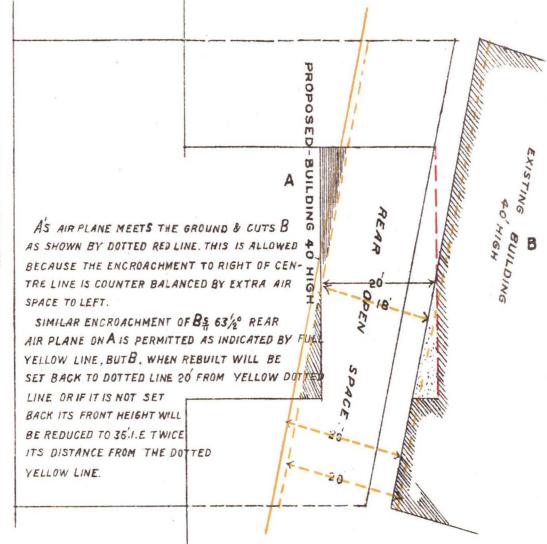

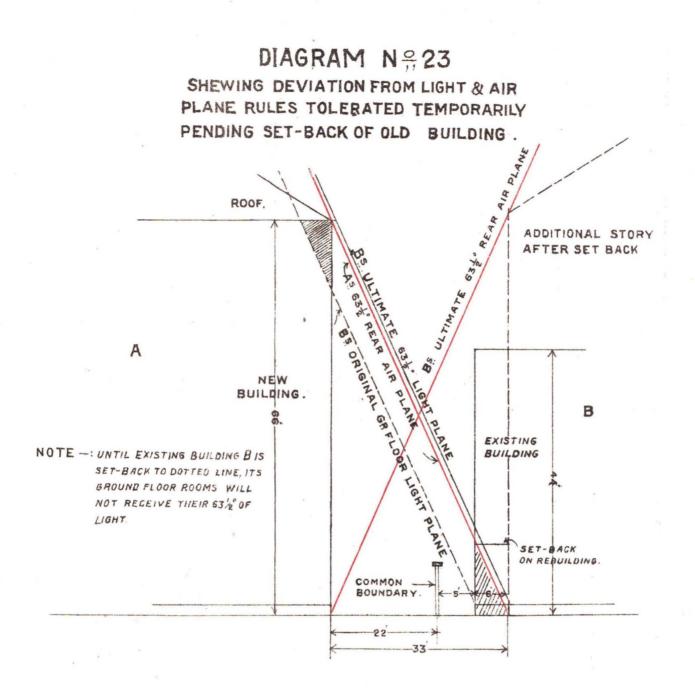

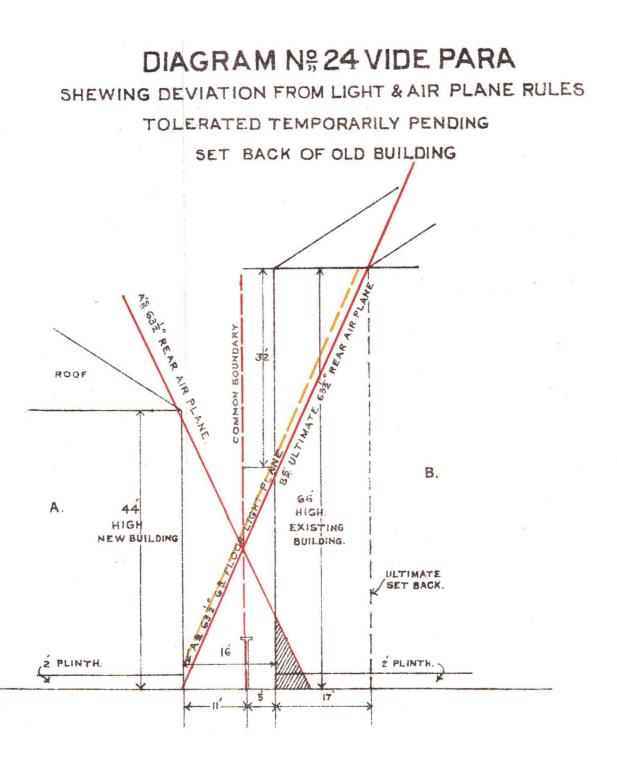
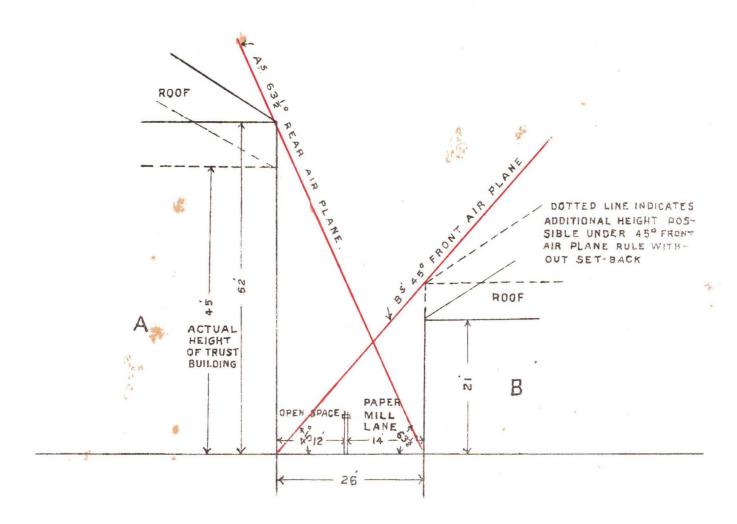


DIAGRAM Nº 25. SHEWING CASE IN PAPER MILL LANE REFERRED TO AT END OF PARA 7.



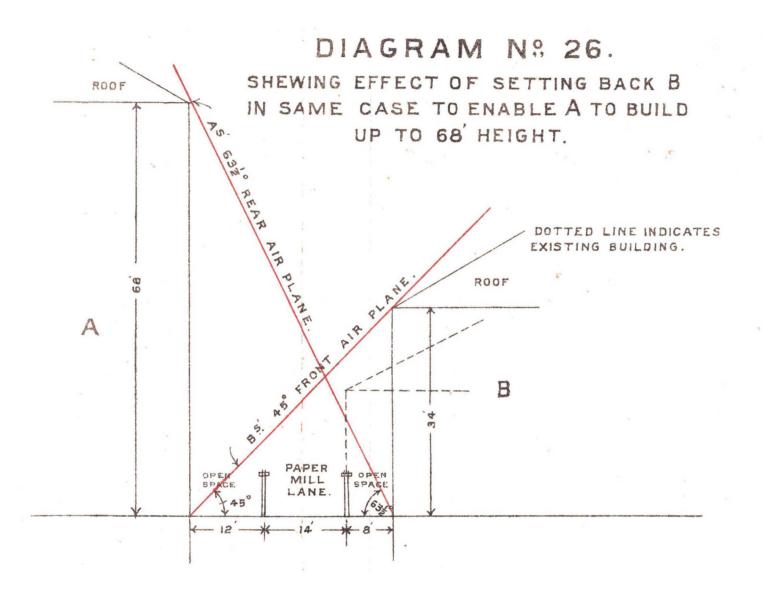
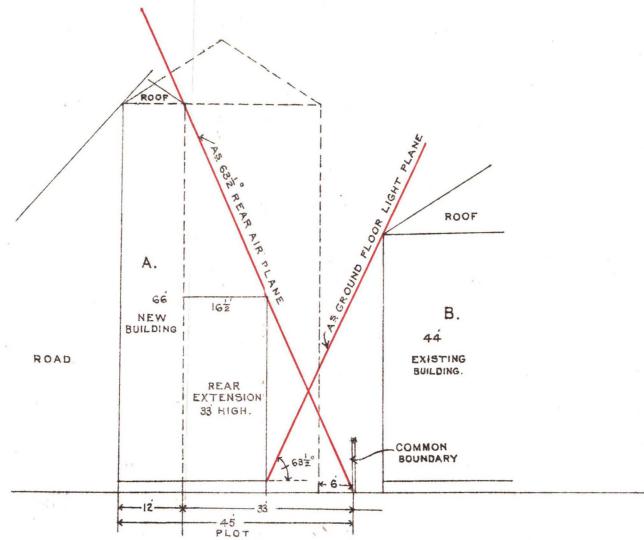


DIAGRAM N%27 VIDE PARA

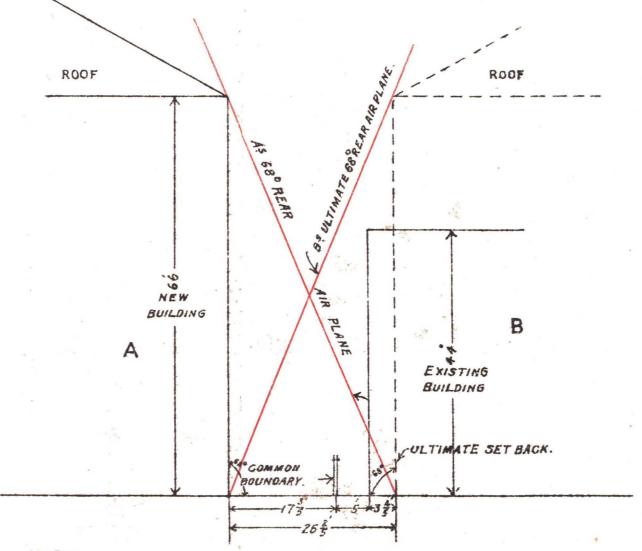

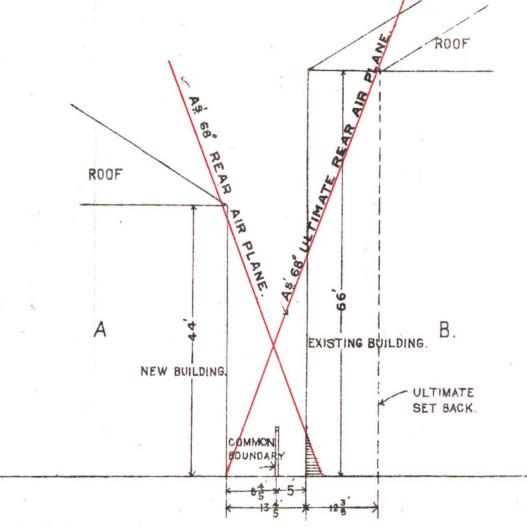
