PREFACE

THIS work is the result of a thesis accepted for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy in 1929 by the Economics Department of Harvard University, Cambridge, United States of America. While the thesis was in preparation, the suggestions of Professor John H. Williams and Mr. R. G. Hawtrey, British economist visiting Harvard at the time, were invaluable in matters pertaining to central banking and foreign exchange. Miss Catherine Tatnall of Harvard University was particularly helpful.
