Note.—This section exempts from taxation armory buildings and also exempts from taxation as personal property bonds, mortgages and other certificates of indebtedness secured by armory property.

Note.—The act provides for a tonnage tax on steam water craft and is by implication an amendment to subdivision 4 of section 8 of the general tax law. Boats paying taxes under this act are not subject to assessment under the provisions of the general tax law.

This act takes effect August 1, 1911.

such appraised valuation; and, on his refusal or neglect to make such payment, the tax collector shall levy upon such timber for collection in such fee in the manner provided by law for the collection of personal taxes.

Sec. 12. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

Norg.,--This act provides for private forest reserves and the exemption of same from taxation.

ACT 116 OF 1917.

Payment of state tax to countles.

Sec. 1. On the first day of December, nineteen hundred seventeen, and on the first day of December in each and every year thereafter, there shall be paid into the treasury of each county in this State in which may be located any State tax homestead or State swamp lands under the control and supervision of the Public Domain Commission, a tax of five cents per acre, or major portion thereof, of all such lands as shall belong to the State on the first day of December in each year, which tax shall be in lieu of all other taxes now levied against such State land under any

existing law. The money so received by any county shall be placed in the general fund and shall be expended under the supervision of the board of supervisors of such county upon the trunk line highways within such county in the manner prescribed by law and in accordance with the suggestions of the State Highway Commissioner: Provided, however, That if no such trunk line highways are established within the county in which such State tax homestead or State swamp lands are located, then the tax provided by this act shall be expended upon the highways of such county under the super-

vision of the board of supervisors and in accordance with the

county treasurers.

suggestion of the State Highway Commissioner. Sec. 2. The Public Domain Commission shall enter upon their records against each description of said lands the

amounts provided by this act and shall certify the same to the Auditor General, who shall draw his warrant on the State Treasurer therefor, to be paid out of any moneys in the general fund not otherwise appropriated. Such amounts shall be forwarded by the Public Domain Commission to the

Sec. 3. Section fifty-five of act number fifty-nine of the Public Acts of nineteen hundred fifteen, entitled "An act to provide for the construction and improvement of highways, to borrow money therefor, and the assessment and collection of taxes for the construction thereof, and to limit the sums of money to be paid by counties for highway purposes," is hereby repealed.

Note.—This act provides for the payment by the state of a tax of five cents an acre upon state lands to the county treasurer of the county in which the lands are located to be used for trunk line highways.

the first Monday in April in each year, certify to the supervisor or assessor of each township a description of the selected private forest reservations therein, and the name of the owner or owners thereof.

Sec. 9. It shall be the duty of the supervisor or assessor Idem. in each township to keep a record of all private forest reservations within his township as certified to him by the treasurer of said county, and he shall require the owner or his agent to subscribe under oath the extent and description of the land selected as private forest reservation and that the number of trees is as required by this act and that he will maintain the same according to the intent of this act.

Sec. 10. The said Board of Agriculture shall also prescribe Application the form of application and contract to be filed with the form of. treasurer of the county wherein such application shall be made, and form of notice by treasurer to supervisor or other assessing officer.

Sec. 11. It shall be the duty of the supervisor or assessor supervisor, to exto personally examine the various private reservations when etc., t the real estate is assessed for taxation, and to note upon his return, the condition of the trees, and that same are properly planted and continuously cared for, in order that the intent of this act may be complied with. If the said private reservation is properly planted and continuously cared for in accordance with the provisions of this act, such part of its value as is over and above one dollar per acre shall be exempt from all taxation: Provided, When any owner of a forest provise, reservation provided for in this act shall desire to cut and harvest trees in said reservation, except for firewood or building material for the domestic use of said owner or his tenant, he shall notify the tax assessor of his district of his said intention and after such trees are cut, and before their removal from the land, the owner shall make an accurate measurement or count of all the trees cut, and file with the assessor a true and accurate return of such measurement or count and of the variety and value of the trees so cut. assessor shall forthwith assess the stumpage value of the timber so cut and shall issue a license to remove said timber, which license shall be in effect upon payment to the collector of taxes of the district of a fee of five per cent of such appraised valuation. The assessor shall notify the clerk and the tax collector of his district of the issuance of such license. If any such timber is removed without payment of such license fee, it shall be the duty of the tax collector to levy upon such timber for collection of such license fee in the manner provided by law for collection of personal taxes. the owner of any such forest reservation desires at any time to withdraw his land from such classification, or fails to comply with the provisions of this act, the tax assessor of his district shall estimate the cash value of the timber on the stump and the owner shall pay a fee of five per cent of

Proviso.

through the original or government title to set aside, vacate or annul the said deed or the title derived thereunder: Provided, That as to all lands heretofore deeded to the state under the provisions of said section one hundred twenty-seven of said act two hundred six of the public acts of eighteen hundred ninety-three, the title of the state thereto shall be deemed to be absolute and complete after a period of six months from the taking effect of this act, and no suit or proceeding shall thereafter be instituted by any person claiming through the original or government title to set aside, vacate or annul said deed or deeds or the title derived thereunder.

This section is constitutional and valid in limiting the time to six months in which to institute proceedings to vacate or annul any tax homestead deed,—
Beuthlen v. Dillon, 160 M. 399; Chido v. Williams, 180 M. 367; Darrow v. Minneapolis, St. Paul and Sault Ste. Marie R. R. Co., 188 M. 664.



ACT NO. 188 OF 1917.

Sec. 1. The public domain commission is hereby authorized Primary and empowered to sell and dispose of any primary school, eschool land, swamp, tax homestead or other lands held by the state subject to the control of the said public domain commission, in pieces or parcels of less than a legal subdivision, to any telephone, telegraph, transmission or power company or corporation, for a right of way over and across any such lands, and the board of agriculture is also hereby authorized to sell or dispose of any agricultural college lands not included within the forest reserve in the counties of Alcona and Iosco, in pieces or parcels of less than a legal subdivision, to any telephone, telegraph, transmission or power company for a right of way over and across any such agricultural college lands. Any of such lands shall not be sold or disposed of Minimum for any right of way for less than twice the appraised value sale price. per acre of such lands at the time of the withdrawal of such lands from sale.

Norg.—The act provides for the sale by the Public Domain Commission or the Board of Agriculture of the right of way across state lands to telephone, telegraph, power and railroad companies.

ACT NO. 74 OF 1988.

Section 1. The auditor general is hereby authorized to certain cancel the taxes of the years eighteen hundred eighty-five and cancelled. eighteen hundred eighty-six upon all descriptions of land on which the taxes remain unpaid as shown by the records in his office. Such cancellation when made shall operate to exfor the taxes of such years. Upon the cancellation of the amount of such tax, the state, county, township, city or village shall stand the loss of their portion of such tax.

Sec. 1. (4160) All deeds heretofore or hereafter made Certain decupon sale of land reserved and withheld from entry under prima face the homestead right in pursuance of section one hundred title. thirty-one of act two hundred six of the public acts of eighteen hundred ninety-three, and acts amendatory thereto shall be prima facie evidence of title in fee in the grantee named in such deeds of the land described therein.

All deeds based by the state land commission upon sale of tax homestead lands convey an absolute title.—Chido v. Williams, 169 M. 267.

Sec. 1. (4161) After the expiration of six months from when state and after the time when any deed made to the state under title details. the provisions of section one hundred twenty-seven of act two hundred six of the public acts of eighteen hundred ninetythree, being the general tax law, and acts amendatory thereto, shall have been recorded in the office of the register of deeds for the county in which the land so deeded shall be situated, the title of the state in and to the same shall be deemed to be absolute and complete, and no suit or proceed-ing shall thereafter be instituted by any person claiming
