## PREFACE.

The issue of this Report of the Proceedings of the First Annual Convention of the Canadian Tax Conference of the Citizens' Research Institute of Canada marks the beginning of another stage in the development of the science of taxation in this country. In the United States a similar organization has existed for some years and has made many worth-while contributions to reform in taxation methods. The Conference provides an open forum where the ordinary citizen and the specialist in taxation can exchange ideas and thus help build up all over Canada that widespread and intelligent interest in taxation problems without which no satisfactory solution can be expected.

The Institute in arranging for this First Convention was, of course, unable to forecast how many would be present. The result was that the only room available for the Convention was one the acoustic properties of which were not satisfactory. The notes of discussions were, therefore, somewhat incomplete, particularly where participation was general and rapid, and some parts had to be omitted. Delegates who find that some of their remarks do not appear will understand the reason. Next year, with the experience of this year to guide, arrangements can be made which will not interfere with the production of a verbatim report.

The papers and addresses are reproduced in full. The uniform high standard of these was the subject of much favorable comment. Will all those who get a copy of the Proceedings assist in securing the interest of other citizens? A large number of copies are still available for distribution. The price to non-members of the Conference is \$2 per copy. Members of the Canadian Tax Conference of the Citizens' Research Institute of Canada, whether organizations or individuals, will receive one copy gratis. Additional copies will be supplied at the rate of \$1 each to present members or to those taking out membership within the next three months.
