

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

I N May, 1929, the Principal of the Hertfordshire Institute of Agriculture suggested to the Advisory Economist for the eastern counties Province that an economic survey of the agriculture of the county would provide "an extraordinarily interesting variety of data, and would assist the Institute to make intimate contact with a very large number of farmers." The present publication is the outcome of that suggestion.

The survey was commenced at the end of September, 1930, and has thus taken just over nine months to complete. (The first three months were occupied in collecting farm records) and in this the staff of the Hertfordshire Institute of Agriculture co-operated very fully by assuming responsibility for no less than one-third of the field work. Indeed, co-operation between the Hertfordshire Institute and the Cambridge University Farm Economics Branch has been maintained throughout the whole enquiry, and any credit which this *Report* may merit is due as much to the one as to the other of these two bodies.

The following took part in the collection of farm records:—Messrs. R. McG. Carslaw, H. W. Gardner, W. He Kirkpatrick, J. W. Reid, G. Ll. Rogers, J. Hunter-Smith, and H. R. Williams. The arduous, and mainly tedious, work of analysing the data secured has been carried out by Mr. P. E. Graves, assisted by Mr. T. J. Hunt. Mr. J. W. Reid has contributed largely to Chapters I and III, and, together with Mr. Hunter-Smith and Mr. Gardner, has materially assisted in the editing of these pages.

To the three hundred Hertfordshire farmers who so generously provided the information on which this publication is based the most sincere thanks are accorded. It is hoped that the information here provided will recompense them, at least in some measure, for the inconvenience and trouble to which they were frequently put.


