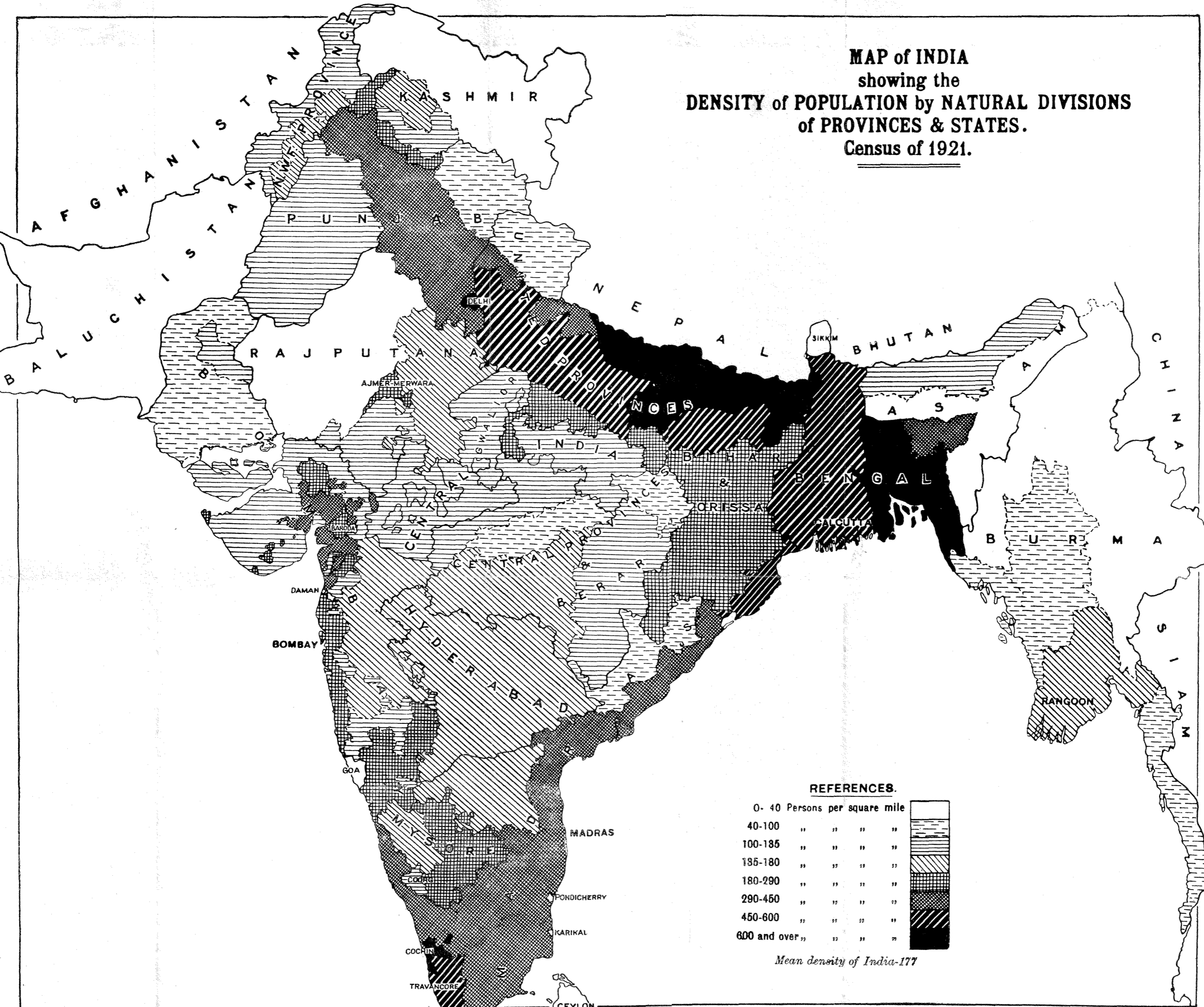
A number of maps representing various economic conditions in India have been incorporated in the book.
