

INTRODUCTORY NOTE.

The statistical tables in this volume have been reproduced from the Report on the Scheme of Preferences resulting from the Ottawa Trade Agreement for the year 1934-35, with later figures inserted, as far as possible, up to the end of October 1935. Tables II and V in the Introductory Chapter and some of the tables on pages 22, 25, 31, 33, 78, 88 and 103 of Chapter II of the Report dealing with exports from India have not been included in this volume as no later figures are available. No changes have been made in the abstract statements on pages 133 to 150 of Chapter II and pages 178 to 189 of Chapter III showing the course of Indian export and import trade and the U. K. import trade in the articles enjoying preference, or in Appendices II to VI to the Report. These statements and Appendices also therefore do not appear in this volume.

The references at the head of the tables in the volume are to the pages of the main Report.
