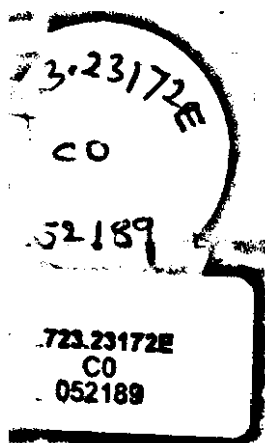

SIR,

In continuation of my report on the revision settlement of Erandol Táluka, No. 47 of 8th February last, I have the honour to submit, for the consideration of Government, proposals for the original survey settlement of the village of Ringangaon referred to in paragraph 4 of the above report. The village was formerly inám but lapsed to Government in 1879 on the death of the late inámdár.

2. Ringangaon is situated about 12 miles to the north-east of the táluka town of Erandol. On the north it is bounded by the village of Savda, on the south by the village of Pautana, on the east by the village of Pimpalkotasim, and on the west by the villages of Chortake and Pimpalkota Khurd, all of which belong to the Erandol Táluka.

3. The measurement and classification were carried out in this village on the system always followed in preparation for a first survey settlement.

4. The climate may be considered as very healthy and very favourable for the cultivation of valuable crops of many kinds.

5. There is only one Government school in the village, supported by local funds, with an average daily attendance of 10 boys.

6. In addition to a weekly bazar held every Monday in the village itself, the villagers also visit the large bazar towns of Jalgaon, Mhasávad and Erandol, which are distant only a few miles, to dispose of their goods and replenish their agricultural stock.

7. The population is shown by the special census taken by the Revenue Department in July last, to amount in all to 1,220 souls; houses number 263, of which 29 are thatched and the remaining 234 are flat-roofed and generally well built.

8. The working cattle number 366 and are amply sufficient to cultivate the whole of the assessed land of the village, namely, some 4,376 acres. Cows, buffaloes and their young number 404 in all, and there are 60 goats. The total number of wells in working order is 49; of these, 22 are used for drinking purposes only, and 27 for irrigation. There are 84 carts in the village principally employed in the carrying trade between the railway stations and large market towns.

9. Appendix D gives the revenue history of the village under report for the past 10 years, from which it will be seen that the area actually occupied and the annual collections have been perfectly constant. There have been no remissions of revenue for the last 10 years, and there are no outstandings whatever.

10. Judging from the whole of the above statistics as to the condition and the favorable situation as regards climate and markets, I have no hesitation in proposing for this village the same maximum rate which has been sanctioned for the surrounding villages. The following précis of Appendix E. gives the estimated result of this treatment:—

11. It will be observed from the above statement that the total estimated increase amounts to Rs. 2,367, equal to 59.4 per cent. on the assessment hitherto levied.

12. There are 122 acres of land irrigated from wells on which the dry-crop rate only will of course be levied, and which, thus assessed, will yield Rs. 312 assessment.

13. The Government unoccupied land amounts to acres 239 assessed at Rs. 192.

14. The subjoined statement shows the result of the proposed settlement under every head:—
