#### THE COLLECTOR OF KOLA'BA.

Belgaum, 23rd September 1901.

Sir,

I have the honour to submit, through you for the consideration of Government, proposals for the original settlement of the village Kotimbe in the Karjat Táluka of your Collectorate.

- 2. The measurement and classification of the lands of this village, including Phalni field work, were performed by the Survey Department in 1900 before its abolition, but the settlement report has been handed over to be written by the Land Records Department.
- 3. This village was formerly considered "Dharmadaya-Inam" and was neither measured nor assessed at either the Revenue or Revision Surveys with the other villages of the taluka.

However after a long enquiry into the alienated rights of the village (the history of which has been compiled by Sir James Campbell and which is now in the Collector of Kolába's files), Government decided in their Resolution No. 5661, dated 15th August 1899, that "The Inámdárs of the village of Kotimbe are liable to full assessment on all lands, whether rice or varkas, which are not specified in the sanads granted to the Inámdárs, in pursuance of the summary settlement accepted by them, and that they cannot lawfully oppose the survey of such lands. The survey should be carried into effect without further delay."

4. By the survey of this village the area of different descriptions of lands and soil is as follows:—

5. The village under report is inhabited and its total population according to the Imperial Census of both 1891 and 1901 is shown below:—

- 6. There are only 5 wells in the village; of these 4 are used for the drinking supply of human beings and 1 for cattle and other purposes.
- 7. The village under report is situated slightly to the east of the centre of the taluka and is surrounded by Government villages of one group.

These Government villages are described in detail in paragraph 38 of the Report on the Karjat Táluka included in Government Selection No. CCXXIV—N. S., and a reference to the report and map alluded to will show that the village falls naturally into the 3rd group with a maximum rice rate of Rs. 4 and a drycrop rate of Re. 1. These rates were fixed as far back as 1889.

8. The estimated result of the proposed rates is given below for easy reference:—

- 9. Besides the above Government occupied land, there is inam rice land measuring 27 acres and assessed at Rs. 94.
- 10. The village was hitherto considered inám and the amount of "Mámul" which was recovered every year was Rs. 157; of these Rs. 31 only were collected on behalf of Government and Rs. 126 for the Inámdárs.
- 11. As the village under report has been assessed in accordance with the rates prevailing in the adjoining Government villages of the taluka, I request that if the proposed rates are sanctioned, they should expire concurrently with those of the other villages of the taluka, viz., in the year 1918-19.

Sir,

I have the honour to forward to you a copy of a Report No. 1234 of 23rd September 1901, to me by Mr. Lushington, Superintendent of Land Records and Agriculture, S. D., on the survey of the village of Kotimbe, táluka Karjat, with his proposals for the assessment rates which he proposes to introduce.

- 2. Government in their Resolution No. 5661, Revenue Department, of 12th August 1899, directed that the village of Kotimbe should be surveyed and full assessment levied on all rice and varkas land which was not specified in the sanads granted to the Inámdárs under the Summary Settlement.
- 3. This area amounts to 1,121 acres, exclusive of unassessed area and forest.
- 4. The village falls into the third group of villages described in paragraph 38 of the report on the Karjat Táluka, Government Selection No. CCXXIV with a maximum rice rate of Rs. 4 and a dry-crop rate of Re. 1.
- 5. I agree, therefore, entirely with Mr. Lushington's proposals in paragraphs 8 and 11 and I would propose that assessment should be levied at the rates mentioned in paragraph 8.
