#### APPENDIX IV.

Extract from the Report of the Committee on the Agrarian rondition in Champaran. Volume I, Chapter 2, paragraph 12, page12.

#### SPECIAL CASE OF RAJGHAT CONCERN.

Finally, we desire to refer to the peculiar conditions of the Rajghat Factory (Manager, Mr. Apperley), where no incident of tenancy is claimed but where written contracts had been entered into by the tenants for growing of indigo in consideration of freedom from rent enhancement. On the expiry of these contracts, this arrangement was continued by mutual consent, and consequently the factory refrained from applying for rent enhancement at the proper time during the revision settlement. At our local enquiry we were informed by the tenants that they now desired to abandon indigo. Under these circumstances, it is only reasonable that the factory should be enabled to apply for a general enhancement of rents in accordance with the settlement procedure, but as the time limit for this procedure under section 105 of the Bengal Tenancy Act has already expired, this is impossible unless the Government takes action under section 112 of the Bengal Tenancy Act. Failing this course, we recommend that the special legislation should contain a clause enabling this concern to take advantage of section 105.

#### APPENDIX V.

Extract from resolution No. 6296-R., of the Committee of Bihar and Orissa on the Champaran Agrarian Committee Report, paragraph 12.

### THE CASE OF THE RAJGHAT, ETC.

The ease of the Rajghat Factory has been mentioned by the Committee as on calling for special treatment. No incident of the tenancy is claimed but written contracts were entered into by the tenants for the growing of indigo in consideration of freedom from rent enhancement. On the expiry of the contracts this arrangement was continued by mutual consent and the Factory refrained from claiming in the settlement courts the enhancement of rent which might otherwise have obtained. The tenants now desire to give up indigo, and the Committee consider that an opportunity should be afforded to the Factory to sue for enhancement of rent, for which the time ordinarily admissible under section 105 of the Bengal Tenancy Act has expired. His Honour in Council agrees that this is a case in which the provisions of section 112 of the Act might reasonably be applied, and he proposes therefore to move the Governor-General in Council to sanction a settlement of rents in the villages of this concern under that section.

#### APPENDIX VII.

#### CORRECT TRANSLATION OF SATTAH.

I, Mahabir Rai, son of Baram Rai, by caste Bhumihar, a cultivator and inhabitant of village Baijnathpur, Tappa Khada, pargana Majhowa, district Champaran.

Whereas I took the sum of Rs. 7-8-0 the half of which being Rs. 3-12-0 as advance on my account out of my own free will for sowing indigo in 15 kathas of my land at 3 kathas per bigha of land of my occupancy to the ordinary lagan under the lagan of occupacy of my holding from 1302 Fasli to 1321 Fasli from your honour J. J. Menad, Esqr., Managing Proprietor of Lalsaraya concern according to the details mentioned below:—

- 1. That I shall sow indigo in the field measuring 15 kathas of the land of the first class to be chosen by the manager of the factory for the time being from my fields according to the 3 kathas lagan (Tin-kathia lagan) year by year to the end of duration of this sattah and will according to the order of the factory cultivate indigo land and will plough and do tamni, uchhtani and other works concerning the cultivation of indigo on the land according to the desire of the manager, the field will be measured by the manager with lagga of 8. Haths and I shall at the proper season sow indigo seeds which I shall borrow from the factory under the direction of the manager and the manager will measure my land according to his choice out of my holding for the purpose of indigo cultivation for the future year, in the month of chaiyat and Baisakh. I shall cut the crops of the said land in next Aswin and will use the lands in such way as stipulated in the Sattah.
- 2. After sowing indigo I will be present on the land at every time when the manager himself or the amlas of the factory will go to visit the land and settle the rate of the land sown with the indigo and I will not object to whatever rate they will consider proper to fix, and will also get on account of the indigo land at Rs. 20 for the first class and Rs. 10 for the land on which indigo will not grow and the rent of my whole holding will be paid by me.
- 3. I shall cut and load the indigo plants on carts at the time of mahai. I shall not put forth any objection in this matter.
- 4. In the month of Aghan year by year when my account of indigo will be settled by the factory I shall be present at the factory and will take the account of malchhat and will give the Farkhati of it to the factory. And I also shall receive the new advance for future from the factory year by year. I shall receive my account on cash or it will be deducted from my rent if it will be due by me to the factory. There will be no objection as to the deduction of the balance (fazil) from my new advance and I shall also have to repay the above saltah advance in cash or get it otherwise satisfied in my account at the end of the period of this saltah.
- 5. If according to this sattah I or my heirs will object to sow indigo, within the period of the sattah according to my lagan then the factory will have power to cultivate indigo itself on my indigo land by means of factory ploughs and coolies. The expenses of such cultivation will be deducted from my indigo account as will be settled by him (manager) at the time of mal chhat. If I or my heirs will interfere in this then the proprietor or manager or his heirs and representatives will have power to realise three times of the damage of the first class mal, namely, at Rs. 60 per bigha annually from me or my heirs and representatives. In this I or my heirs will have no objection, I therefore being aware of the contents of this sattah execute this sattah that it may be of use at the required time.

Be it known that the said saheb (proprietor or manager) or their heirs and representatives will not demand from me or my heirs any additional rent for the increase of area which may be found in excess of my holding or which may so come by measurement in view of executing this sattah till the duration of this sattah. If this is demanded then the said demand will be liable to be rejected by competent court.
