

NOTE.

On the 19th May 1891 a letter was addressed by the Chairman of the Commission to the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, requesting that instructions might be given to Her Majesty's Representatives in the principal European countries and in the United States to forward for the use of the Commission any publications which might have been recently issued in those countries bearing upon certain specified questions connected with the inquiry of the Commission. together with Reports containing such information as Her Majesty's Representatives might be able to supply.

In accordance with this request the Foreign Office obtained and forwarded to the Commission a large number of books, documents, and Reports drawn up by Her Majesty's Diplomatic or Consular Officers.

Some of the Reports last mentioned have been published as part of the Foreign Office series, but in order to arrange upon a systematic plan the information obtained from the Foreign Office and that derived from other sources, the Secretary of the Commission was directed to prepare Reports compiled from all these materials. These Reports are published in connection with the proceedings of the Commission, but the Commission is in no way responsible for the statements of fact or opinion which they contain.
