APPENDIX IV.

The following sources of supply are suggested for the appointment of Enumerators and Checkers:—

- (1) Stipendiary, full time or part time, Government servants, i.e., non-Gazetted Officers, Ministerial and literate Menial staff, in all departments of the Government of India and of the Provincial Government, including staff seconded for special duty.
- (2) Primary School teachers, and other employees of local bodies, including Panchayats, Notified Area Committees and Sanitary Committees; the staff of secondary schools, technical institutions, Colleges, etc., which are maintained directly by Government or by Associations subsidised by Government.
- (3) Secretaries of Co-operatives Societies and teachers of voluntary schools.
 - (4) Government Pensioners and Ex-military men on the Reserve.
 - (5) Listed candidates in Government offices.
- (6) Members of the Police Forces (only such of them as can be spared by the Heads of offices should be taken).
- (7) Representative Watandars and members of Watan families who have officiated.
- (8) Officiating Village Accountants and such Non-Watandar Village Patils as are suitable.
- (9) Non-officials whose status and education fit them for the wo. of Enumeration and whose local influence ensures efficient service. e.g. Inamdars, College Lecturers, Research students, Members of Local Bodies, Arbitrators and Organisers of Co-operative Societies, etc.
