FIRST I order my Ship with the Goods that are on her as appears by the papers I have in my Escutore to be sold and pay the ships Company one months Wages due to the last of June of the Year as also pay the Master, Mate, and the Carpenter their Wages, Item pay my two Peons Bandy and Nausen Pattamy and I declare that Bandy did not serve me for about ffour months he has been sick therefore I order to cut out of his Wages the said 5 months Item I order to dispose of my Godown and the Ground Betty lived upon the said Ground begins from the Washers Town and ends near the River Item I order my Trustees to recover and receive all Demands I have on the Mallay Men agreeable to the Tenour of my papers in my Escutore Item I Declare I have at Bengall two boys he that is called Manoel I Give to my son Daniel and Boy Janico I Give to my son Mathews Item I declare that all the Slave Wenches and Girls who serve and attend on Maria are her own and as such she can do of them what she will Item I mean the slave Girls are only her's as for Magdolena and Bidna they are ffree Item it is further my Will That Susannah and her Husband Alexander shall serve Nonha Sophia two years which when is over they shall become free and no Body can oblige them to serve her any longer, Item I declare that Leonor is ffree and she was never my Slave. ITEM I declare that Victoria Diana and Brizida belong to the said Leonor and her mother Item I acknowledge to be indebted unto Leonor 15 Buncals which I desire my Trustees to pay her fully. Item my Will is that no one person shall open or look into the Chest of the said Leonor and whatever is in that Chest belongs to her Excepting a Mallay Dagger that is mine. ITEM I leave Cezar and Jacob to serve my son Pichy two years. ITEM I give Diago and his Wife their Freedom, and also Vallantee is ffree, and they deserve it for the good services they have done to me. Item I desire my Trustees by all means to adjust accounts with my Nephew Matheus Famlidem at Persia Item I declare that I have in my hands 3,000 Madras Rupees belonging to Jannicky Willeboorts Daughter of my Brother Peter Willeboorts which I order my Trustees to pay accordingly Item I desire that all my Effects may be sold and my just debts paid and that the remaining Bulk of my Estate to be equally divided between my sons and Daughters Item I declare that I owe to my Writer Francisco Xavier for 8 years service (he has served me faithfully) which I desire my Trustees to pay him with Equity. Item I desire my Trustees also to pay to Natalia the sum specified in the Book Item I acknowledge to be indebted to Padre Fray Monal de Santa Maria the money he lent me and LASTLY I desire my Trustees above named to Execute and perform all and whatever I have in this My Will directed and also I order and beg that this my Will may not be opened read nor published until God takes me to himself and I do hereby Revoke and make void all former will or Schedule by me heretofore made in any manner or fform whatsoever and Declare this my Will write in this sheet of paper to be my only true and last Will and Testament which I Cause to be made IN WITNESS whereof I have hereunto set my hand with the Witnesses who were present in Atcheen the day Month and year above Written.

IN THE NAME OF JESUS CHRIST AMEN This Will is to be Confirmed after my death according to the Testimony of Saint Paul.

I Zachary De Avateek do confess and declare before God and my Ministers that all my accounts and Transactions are fully Incerted and entred into my Books except three large Account Currents belonging to Gregory de Agazar, Magan De Aga Perry, and Issa Gully de Avateek Shaudullah; also the accounts of Macurtoom Yauhoopah which is wrote down to the year 1716 since which time I have no Accounts; The three large account Currents are not Entred in the Book by reason the said persons have had some disputes with their Masters and mine on account of Insurance Premium upon Bills and Defeciencies in the sale of Goods. The account depending Between the said Macurtoon Yanhoopah since the year 1716 will plainly appear by the Letters wrote to me and my Masters I and said Macurtoom Yanhoopah have been Copartners and in the year 1714 I came out from Europe, since which time the difference in accounts betwixt us must be settled and adjusted.

In the Year 1720 I was in Gombroon and being in Haste to dispatch for Ispahan was obliged to leave all the Piece Goods I had with Beethan. On my Arrival at Syrash was informed my master was run away so that at my coming to Ispahan I lodged in the Armenian Convent, but the Kings Officers sealed up all my Effects for my Masters debts, when after the Expiration of 7 or 8 months It was agreed upon to refer the Case to Arbitration In Pursuance thereof Arbitrators were Chosen who drew up a General Account Current of all my Dealings in the East Indies including the account of my Transactions during my stay at Gombroon and from thence to Isapan also the Effects I delivered to Beethan with the Charges during my Imprisonment All which are incerted in the Europe Waste Book together with what I paid to my Masters Creditors and all the Charges I defrayed which said Book I left at Ispahan but the Receipts I have got by me and are all passed into Account Currents some of which are Entred into the Waste Book.

I have also 4 large Account Currents two of which are in Copartnership with Aveat de Zeany and my Masters the other two Betwixt Macurtoon Yanhoopah, my Master and self, All the Accounts relating to my Masters ffactors, Adventurers &c. are all Included in the afs^d. large Account Curr^t. as also what other Accounts I have with my Masters are therein incerted and fully Entred.

ITEM

ITEM I have one Large Account Current with Coja Nazar Jacob Jan containing 7 or 8 pages which is part of my Account Current with my Masters and is lodged in the hands of said Coja Nazar Jacob Jan whereof I have a Copy But not receiving the Ballance due to me from my masters I put the same in Court Judgment thereon was given in my behalf, I being now at present under some disorder of Body do make this my last Will and Testament hereby appointing John Stratton Reg^r. my Executor to receive all the moneys due from my Masters &c. in the best manner he may or can.

ITEM I have also a further account with Coja Nazar Jacob Jan which I have not yet settled for which I sued him in the Mayors Court This account must be settled with him there is in his hands a Factorage Bond for 24,000 R^s. in my own and sons names unsealed which must be taken in the Writings Belonging to him are in Escrutore and are to be given him But whatever sums appears due on the aforesaid two accounts must be received from said Coja Nazar Jacob Jan.

ITEM The debt due from Coja Nazar Jacob Jan depending in Bengal must be received which sum is in Copartnership with Macurtoom Yanhoopah which is to be Divided and my share thereof to be placed to the Credit of my Masters and my Joint Account and out of the money received must pay the following persons Viz^t.

To Coja Arratoon De Mokell Rup^s. 1684 $\frac{1}{2}$ as ₹ Bill of Exchange payable to Coja Truce dated March 10th. 1731. 5 M^{os}. after date.

This last sum was the Charges of Nazar Jacob Jan which are Entred in the Waste Book in part of which sum said Coja Nazar Jacob Jan gave me 4th. Sep^r. 1734. 18 P^s. Sheersucker and Cashersoy 7 P^o. of Gingham some of which was sold and the rest I returned him again.

ITEM To Coja Nazar Jacob Jan P^s. 52. in ready money and Rice from April 11th. 1735 to Octo^r. 8th. But Coja Nazar Jacob Jan is D^r. to me thereon P^s. 32. as wrote down and Entred in Waste Book.

ITEM My Executor M^r. John Stratton shall receive 5 ₹ Cent Commission after all which the remainder of my Estate to be given to my lawful sons and Heirs Gregory and Avateek.

In the Account Current of Coja Aga Pieri De Pannoos Anno 1715 he gave me Credit for 72 Pagodas bad debts from which he received Pag^s. 45. Anno 1736 I accounted the same with his sons to the amount of P^s. 100. in part of which I received 90 P^s. so the Ballance remaining with Interest is 13 P^s. which Bond I have delivered into the hands of Holland Goddard as being their Trustee Note the dividend of said P^s. 13 and the above mentioned 90 must be placed to account of Coja Lazaroo's deceased and Coja Macurtoom Yanhoopah mine and my masters to each man's Equal share and proportion thereof But my masters share to be placed to his Credit in Account.

ITEM To the Estate of my Son Johannes Coja Shaffer Chureek stands indebted 250 Dollars full Weight and the same being put into Court Anno. 16. I paid Charges P^s. 7 for which I made Macurtoom Yanhoopah D^r. by reason he took up the 250 Dollars on Respondentia also Anatoon De Marzavelly was indebted to Stock of my said sons P^s. 16. 18. 0 for which I made Coja Arratoon D^r. and on account of the said 250 Dollars I received in Court P^s. 446. out of which I deducted P^s. 43. 30 for Charges I was at before with above mentioned P^s. 7 so that the remainder P^s. 402. 6. I divided into three shares two or which Belonging to

Coja Arratoon, whose Executor is Coja Parsidon Then on account of the above mentioned P^s. 16. 18 computing compound Interest thereon amounted to P^s. 92. 26. which said sum I deducted from Coja Arratoons two shares and the Remainder I paid to his Executor Coja Parsidon being P^s. 175 which I Wrote down in my Waste Book and then for the P^s. 92. 26 I Gave my Masters credit and gave them D^r. for the abovementioned P^s. 7 for Charges which with Compound Interest computed thereon amounts to P^s. 39 Further 2/3 of 134. P^s. before mentioned Belonged to my Masters for which they must have Credit in Account.

ON my departure from Europe I at sundry times demanded my Account Current from my Masters but they trifled and would not give it me Therefore according to my Own Book I drew out the Account Current betwixt me and my Masters But Sundry piece Goods which they received from me I have not debted them for. ITEM

Relating to the Account Current betwixt Coja Macurtoom Yanhoopah and my Masters they pretended there was a Ballance due to them from said Coja Macurtoom Yanhoopah But at the same time they had nothing to shew whereby the said Ballance did appear and at the time of my Master Coja Avateek's departure from Amsterdam he was indebted to Coja Mucurtoom Yanhaoopah for which debt he gave a Bond, and as I was inform'd both from my master Coja Avateek and also from other persons that he my said master had given a General discharge for Coja Macurtoom Yanhoopahs Factorage But neither that nor the account Current settled betwixt them does he care to shew me, However I wrote out an Account Current Betwixt my master and Coja Macurtoom Yanhoopah also a Duplicate thereof and desired an answer Whether that account Current was right or no. Note that the Ballance of Coja Lazaroo's account is a large Sum which Ballance is due from and must be received of my Master as I have mentioned in my Account Current with my Master. ITEM

In Reference to the account of Partnership betwixt him and me Note that there is a Ballance due to me from him which said Ballance my Executor one of sons, and master Coja Avateek must Jointly write to him a Letter about it, and receive the Ballance due thereon. ITEM

I have drawn out and Account Current wherein are included the dealings and Transactions which has Occurred in Trade with all persons I Traded with also account of all Adventurers received and how and in what manner disposed of and sold and what ever Disputes or Differences arose thereon I have particularly mentioned and wrote down under each mans Account Current for your Government. ITEM

IN THE NAME OF THE Most Holy Trinity, Father, Son and Holy Ghost, Three persons one only true God in whose Law I profess to Live and dye as a Christian believing in every thing that the Holy mother church of Rome teaches and Comands.

KNOW ALL MEN unto whom these presents shall come that in the year of the nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ 1744 on the first day of June I Francisco Gonsalves being in my perfect sense and understanding made this my last will and Testament in the best manner I could.

Imprimis I pray the Virgin Mary our Lady, and all the Saints & Angels of the Heavenly Host to be my Intercessors and to beg of God the pardon of my sins, which I have Committed against his Divine Majesty.

I desire Don Jeronimo de Ita and the most Reverend Father Severin Vicar of this Church of Madras that they will please out of Charity to be my Executors to dispose of what I shall hereafter herein desire, and on default of D°. Jeronimo, the person my wife shall think fit to name.

I DECLARE that I am a native of this City of Madraspatnam Ligitimate son of Francisco Gonsalves and of Johanna Pereira, I was married with Leonora Acart, by whom I had two Daughters, one named Johanna the other Christina I declare that I Gave Johanna in marriage to Robert Stringfellow and gave her a portion of 1000 Pagodas, I also gave Christina in Marriage to Joseph da Cunha DEssa, and

gave her a portion of 750 P^s. but that portion had an Increase of 90 P^s. because it happened that when I went to pay the portion after they were married, those Pagodas were not then current which were current before (at the time that we agreed upon the marriage) but the Star pagodas, which were 12 ¹/₂ cent better than the others.

AT present I am married with Dona Manuela de Souza Rodoalho whom I leave my Heiress after paying my debts devises and Legacys.

WHEN it shall please God to think of my soul I desire that my Body may be Buried in this Church St. Andrew, in the same Grave wherein my Mother was Buried, and that a solemn office be made with as many Priests as can be had and I pray every one of them in case they say Masses that day, that they may be applied for my soul.

I Leave ten pagodas to be distributed among the poor Beggars in Madras I Bequeath a small house I have in the Petta that I bought of Raphael Ferr^a. Milhares to my Grand Child and God Child Anna Maria on condition it be delivered to her after she is married, and until that time it shall be in the disposal of my wife; and also should it happen that my said Grand Child should dye before she is married the said house shall remain to my wife I bequeath another small House which I have at the Great Mount to my God daughter Francisca the daughter of Anthony de Souza and Johanna Lebrum both deceased with the same conditions as that I leave to my Grandchild I Bequeath unto my two God sons one named Bento, the other Domingos (alias Mango) to each of them 50 P^s. to be paid them when they are 12 years old, and that they go into the service of any Gentleman that they will take them for their servants; and if Mago dies before that time I Give the whole to Bento, and should both dye this money shall be my Wifes, and in Case my Wife should dye before that time, this money shall be applied towards the maintenance of my said two Godsons, as far as it will go.

I BEQUEATH to my Daughter Christina, the sum of 160 P^s. that she may not complain that her sister had more than she but if in the meantime she should dye I Bequeath the aforesaid money to my Grand Daughter Anna Maria, I leave my Books and Wearing apparel at the disposal of my Wife that she may divide between my God sons what will serve them of it, the rest she may give to some of her acquaintance Ecclesiastick or Seculars.

To my Slaves of either sex I Bequeath their freedom and Liberty on condition that the Girl Maria shall serve my wife 5 years and the Girl Luzia my daughter Christina 5 years, The Boy Timor Joseph shall serve my wife 10 years I Bequeath Lucretia her freedom and Ten pagodas shall be given her and she may go away when she pleases.

AND thus I have finished my Will in the best manner I could and I Constitute my Wife Donno Manuela de Souza Rodoalho my Universal Heir^{ess} (having promised it her) after discharging her debts devises and Legacys.

DESIRE of all the Justices to see it thus fulfilled and kept Intirely as I have above desired and I declare this to be my last Will and Testament wrote with my own hand writing and sealed with my accustomed seal and marked in presence of the underwritten Witnesses in Madras the day Month and year *Ut Supra*.
