IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN I Ann Hammond of Fort St. George in the East Indies Widow being Weak in Body but of sound mind, Memory, and understanding Do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament. First I recommend my soul to God and my Body to be decently Buryed at the Discretion of my Executor hereafter named, and in the next place I will that all my just Debts and Funeral charges be paid and discharged and as to what worldly Estate it hath Pleased God to Bless me with I give and dispose thereof as follows. I Give my slave Boy named Lewis to Cap^t. Lewis Tornery of Vizagapatam, and my slave Boy named Casaz to my Well Beloved Brother Captain George Bright To hold to them their Executors administrators and assigns. ITEM I give my slave Girl named Domingo to my well Beloved Sister Mary Stratton, and my slave Girl named Nelle to my well beloved Sister Phillis Hopkins To hold to my said Sisters during their Natural Lives respectively at whose severall Deaths I will to each of them my said slave Girls their Freedom. ITEM I Give devise and bequeath unto my neice ANN BRIGHT Daughter of my said Brother my slave Girl named Sallam to be delivered to her immediately after my Death and the summ of One hundred Pagodas Current of Madras to be paid her at the age of Twenty one years or day of Marriage with the Interest or produce that shall arise in the meantime therefrom but in case of her Death before the said age or Marriage then the same shall fall into the residuum of my Estate. ITEM I give devise and bequeath all my Wearing apparell whatsoever to my said Sisters Mary Stratton and Phillis Hopkins to be divided between them share and share alike. ITEM I Give devise and bequeath unto my said Brother George Bright and my Sisters Mary Stratton and Phillis Hopkins all the rest residue and remainder of my Estate whatsoever and wheresoever to be equally divided amongst them share and share alike. AND I do nominate constitute and appoint my well beloved Brother John Stratton whole and sole Executor of this my Will hereby revoking disannuling & making void all other and former wills by me at any time heretofore made in Word or Writing. IN WITNESS whereof the said Testatrix hath hereunto sett her Hand and seal in Fort St. George aforesaid this Eighteenth day of December In the Year of our Lord One Thousand seven hundred and Forty four.

I CONSTITUTE and appoint my well belov'd uncle Charles Savage Esq^r. of London sole Executor for the performance of this my Last Will and Testament DATED in FORT ST. GEORGE this Twenty ninth day of December In the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and Forty three.

GEORGE ON THE COAST OF CHORAMANDELL being at this present Writeing in a good state of health, with perfect mind and memory after giving my most humble, and hearty thanks to almighty God for the Enjoyment of the same; hoping forgiveness of all my sins comitted against his Divine Majesty and the Errors of my Life past, and Redemption from the punishment due to them thro' the sufferings merits and mediation of my Blessed Lord and saviour JESUS CHRIST I now by his Grace call to mind the certainty of Death and the uncertain Time of it's approach for which reason, I do think it necessary to make my Last Will and Testament; And do now make it in manner and form following In the first place, I will I Order, and do Direct, that all my Funeral Charges, just and Lawfull Debts and what Legacys and Bequests herein after-mention'd be duly Discharged, and satisfied for the due performance of all which, and what more thing or things I shall or may hereafter think fit and proper to appoint and have done or Will Order or Direct, I do hereby Nominate, Ordain and Constitute my dear and Well beloved sons EDWARD FOWKE, JOSEPH FOWKE, and FRANCIS FOWKE Lawfull Executors to this my Last Will, and Testament Enjoining them strictly as it is their Duty to fulfill it in every article. *Imprimis* I do Give and Bequeath to my Beloved Cozen MARTHA ROGERS in Cork in Ireland, if alive one Year after my Decease, the sum of Thirty Pounds sterling but if she should be Defunct before the remittance of the said sum can reach her, I then and in such Case Will and Direct, that it Devolve to my Estate, and be accounted as part thereof. Item I Will and Bequeath to my very Loveing Friend the reverend Doct^r. Charles Long Minister of Cheiveley in Berkshire the sum of Fifty Pounds sterling, and to his Wife Elizabeth, Twenty pounds sterling. ITEM I Give and Bequeath to M^{rs}. Hannah Greenhaugh the sum of Thirty pagodas for Mourning. Item I Give and Bequeath to my friend M^r. Thomas Cooke the sum of One Hundred pagodas and to his Wife M^{rs}. Grace Cook the sum of Thirty Pagodas for mourning. ITEM I do Give and Bequeath to my son in law Cap^t. John Holland and to my Daughter Sophia his wife, and to their son Richard Holland to each of them the sum of One Hundred Pagodas. ITEM I do Give and Bequeath unto Mary Flora Daughter of Maria Flora deceas'd the small house situate in the Pedda Nagues Petta in the Oilmaker's street, which I bought of Villante Harris as ^{of} Bill of Sale Register'd bearing Date Jan^{ry}. the 5th. 173⁸ doth more fully appear—I also Give and Bequeath to the said Mary Flora the sum of Five Hundred Pagodas to be pay'd unto her at the age of Twenty One years: (she being Born the 6th. day of February anno 1736/7) or the day of her marriage which shall first happen provided she spontaneously Embrace and profess the protestant Religion and continue in the same if otherwise, I do hereby Bequeath unto her no more than the sum of One hundred Pagodas. MOREOVER Dureing the time ere she arrives at the age of Twenty One Years, or the day of Marriage, I Will I order and do Direct that the sum of Five Pagodas be duly pay'd her the first day of every month after my Decease, for her Cloathing, and subsistance: also the further sum of Five Pagodas ^{per} Month for her schooling and Education and for the due performing fulfilling and Discharging this Bequest now mentioned, I Will I order and do Direct that such a sufficient part of my Estate either in houses, Money, or other Effects shall be kept seperate, Deposited and secured in such manner as may be lawfully judged most proper on such occasion, or for such use and Behoof as of the said Mary Flora. MOREOVER for the due Executing of this part of my Last Will and Testament I do Desire and Charge my Dealy beloved sons and Executors-aforenamed dureing her Orphan, or unmarry'd state to inquire and Examin

frequently the person or persons who have or may have the Care of the said Mary Flora whether the said Monthly allowances be duly appropriated to the uses aforesaid and as Design'd; which, hope will be with all humanity and Charity, be Considered as reasonable. But in Case it should please God to take her out of this Life before the age of Twenty One Years or the Day of Marriage, My Will is and I do hereby order that the said Monthly allowances shall then Cease, and what I have herein bequeath'd her Devolve to my Estate and be accounted as firm part thereof to be distributed and Dispos'd of in the same manner. ITEM I do Give and Bequeath unto my slave Wench named Minga the sum of Twenty Pagodas and her Liberty and to her son Antonio the sum of Forty Pagodas and to all her children Males and Females their Liberty. ITEM I do Give and Bequeath to my slave Wench named Francisca the sum of Twenty pagodas and her Liberty; also to all her Children their Liberty, Item I do Give, and Bequeath to my son Edward Fowke my slave Boy Named Placebo and to all the rest of my slaves whether male or Females; I do hereby Give them their Freedom and Liberty, No person whatsoever haveing any Claim or Title to any of them, nor shall hereafter have by Virtue of this my Last Will and Testament, I also Give and Bequeath to my former slave Wench named MAGDELANA in regard that she hath serv'd my Wife and self many years the sum of Twenty Pagodas. ITEM I do give and Bequeath to Peter Blacknall Watchmaker in London the sum of Thirty pounds sterlz. AND WHEREAS I have Given all my Children the sum of One Thousand pagodas each for the small presents made to them by their God fathers or God Mothers at their Baptism to make them equal in ther [sic] Fortunes But to my Daughter Sophia Holland, I Gave her Five Hundred Pagodas more at her marriage, also Five hundred more to each of my sons Edward Joseph and Francis: so That I have hitherto made an equal Distribution of what part of my Estate I can spare them in my Life time. I do therefore Will Order and Direct that after my Funeral Charges, and Lawfull Debts are Discharg'd; also the Legacys and Bequests herein mention'd, I WILL I Order and do Direct that the Residue or remaining part of my Estate both real and personal be equally Divided among my Four Children, namely my sons Edward, Joseph, and Francis Fowke whom I have appointed Executors to this my Last Will and Testament as afores'd. together and my aforesam'd Daughter Sophia and her Lawfull Issue, I do further Will Order and hereby Direct that all my Houses, House furniture silver and Gold plate Jewels Goods and all things that it hath pleas'd God to Bless one with at my Departure from this Life be fairly sold at auction or publick outcry and the nett Fourth part thereof I do hereby Leave and Bequeath to each of my Four Well beloved Children aforesam'd. Upon the sale of my houses, I would enjoin them as well as advise them to prevent any future Disputes, or Quarrels, or Law suits to be very carefull and Exact in the measuring of the Grounds and Walls to be mention'd in the Bills of Sale to whom they must belong; which, in my Opinion the most Friendly, and Neighbourly way would be to make them all party-Walls, that is to say, and my meaning is, The Walls that part 'em to belong to One house as well as to that adjoining; This I only mention by way of advice But this particular I leave to their own discretion Only I would further advise em to mention this in the Titles or Bills of Sale that neither party shall have the priviledge or power to strike out any sort of Lights, or break down such party Walls without the mutual consent given by Each other in Writeing, which is the thing I would do myself was. I to Dispose of, or sell them in my Life time I do further Will and Direct that whatsoever person or persons of my Legatees herein named shall Dye before his, her's or their Legacys are made payable by Virtue of this my Last Will and Testament it shall be Lawfull for my said Executors to bring the same to the Credit of my Estate and be accounted part thereof: The same I do say and Direct by and of the shares belonging to my Four Children herein aforesam'd; that is to say whatsoever person or persons of them shall depart this Life before the Distribution of their shares as aforesaid that share or shares shall by Virtue hereof devolve to the surviveing or remaining person or persons of them in Equal shares, and to his, her's, or their Lawfully Issue—So haveing thus Disposed of all my Temporal Blessings I recomend my Dear Children to the Favour and Blessing of God whom I Beseech in his due time to send us all a Blessed Departure; and afterward, a joyfull Resurrection both of Soul and Body unto Life Eternal ALL the foregoing being Wrote with my own hand, and upon these Three sides of Paper, which I do
