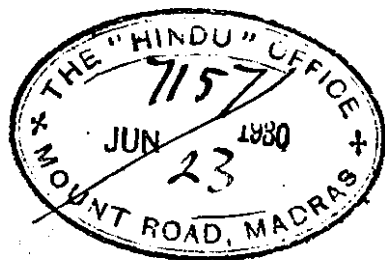

The Consultation and Diary Book of Joseph Collet Esqr. President and Governour & Council their proceedings & transactions in the Affairs of the Honble. United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies in the Presidency of the Coast of Choromandell. Begun the First of January 1719/20.

Your Hon^r. & C^t. having been pleas'd [to order me] to reply to the 2^d. paragraph of the President and Council of [Bengalls] letter to you dated the 5th. ult^o. in order to vindicate my self [from the] aspersions cast upon me by them, and particularly to [that of] my lavish management in the expences of the ship, I beg to offer the following reasons for my Justification.

So soon as ever the ship was order'd to [be re]pair'd, Cap^t. Jones the Master Attendant there was appointed for [the] management of the whole, and my business was only to keep account of what was sent on board for the use of the said ship, [& send] that account monthly to the Buxey there, and I assure your Hon^r. that I neither rec^d. nor paid any thing on acco^t. of the Charges of [y^r.] ship, the wages only excepted; Thus far indeed I acknowledge [to all] concern'd, that I sent for what stores I thought there was occasion but then the Gentlemen there were at their liberty to charge wh[at they] thought fit for the same, and perhaps finding the account [was right] they were willing to ward against censure that might be pas[t on] them by answering me; To this I beg leave to add that the [greater] part of her charges is for wages paid in Bengall, during the [many] months the ship lay unemploy'd there.

To the last part of the reflection in the P[re]sid^t. and Councils letter aforesaid about my being a very undeser[ving man] I am forbid in point of modesty to offer anything in my own [justifi]cation, but lodge my Appeal wth. yo^r. Hon^r. & C^t. who were my emp[loyers] however I shall beg leave to say, that during my stay at Ben[gal I do] not know of the least affront giv'n any of the Gentlemen there by [me] and therefore I am surpriz'd to think what could be the motive to [make] them to take away the reputation of one, whose livelyhood depend[ed on] his good name.

If by all that I have already said, I ma[y] be able to convince yo^r. Hon^r. & C^t. of my Innocence & integrity, it will be [a] greatest satisfaction to me that I can receive, having ever since [my] first entertainment in the Hon^{ble}. Comp^s. service been Zealous to a[ct] myself both their and your

Petition of John Clarke Factor read setting forth, that when he [was] Assistant to the Supra Cargoes of the Emelia from Bencoolen to B[enjar] he left no Attorney to receive the salary w^{ch}. might become due to [him] in the interim, and the Dep^y. Gov^r. there having Issued out the same to William Palmer the Sec^y. it remain'd in his hands, and he is since insolvent, wherefore he adds that the Hon^{ble}. Comp^s. are still Debtors to him, & the said Will^m. Palmer's Estate is indebted so much to them.

Comp^s. orders being that when we have two Chaplains one of them shall go to Fort S^t. David to officiate there, which is the present Case, ORDER'D that the Sec^r. acquaint Mr. Long, that we order him to get himself in a readyness to go down upon the young Darby now bound thither, or that if he had rather go by land, we give him liberty accordingly.

Rev^d. Mr. Long [to go] down to Fort S^t. [David] on the arrival [of] Rev^d. Mr. Wendy.

Charles Fleetwood infant whose Guardianship the President some time since accepted, & lately transferr'd to Mess^m. Elwick & Benyon being now arriv'd at the age of Twenty one years, as appears by his fathers prayer book produced before the Board, He attends, & receives an acco^t. Curr^t. of his Estate and the titles to the sev^l. Voyages wherein its employed and signs a full and ample discharge to them all, w^{ch}. was witness'd & is entred hereafter.

Joseph Collet Esq^r. late Gov^r. here to accompany him over in the year 1716 but soon after arrivall was desir'd to return back to Fort Marlbrô on the West [Coast] with a Lieutenants Commission, granted me by the Hon^{ble}. Edward Harrison Esq^r. then President & Gov^r. here along with M^r. Richard Farmer Deputy Govern^r. in whose time I made severall dangerous but successfull expeditions against the Companys enemys in those places and was afterwards sent by M^r. Thomas Cooke Successour to [M^r. Rich^d.] Farmer as Supra Cargo on a Voyage to Benjar, the hardships of [which] had nigh cost me my Life, by a dangerous fitt of sickness, during [my] absence Marlbrô Fort was unfortunately cutt off by the Natives [a]mong many losses I there

sustain'd, my Commission was one, but [after] my arrivall here upon my application to the Hon^{ble}. Joseph Collet Esq^r. he was pleas'd to grant me a new one for this place bearing date December the 3^d. one thousand seven hundred and Nineteen.

I now referr it to your Hon^r. &c^t. whether my former Commission for Lieutenant at the West Coast does not entitle me on my return hither a superiority to any Lieutenants whose Commissions were since that time given them here, wth. if yo^r. Hon^r. &c^t. allow of, I am then Superiour to Lieutenants Orrill, Sutherland and Gough but if it should be determin'd that a Commission given for a subordinate Factory gives one no title here, Your Hon^r. &c^t. will be pleas'd to observe that the Commission I receiv'd for a Lieutenant of this place from the late President since my arrival gives me a precedence to Cap^t. Gough, his former Commission being for a Subordinate Factory as well as mine; I beleive it is easy to prove that no mans Commission that was older was ever postpon'd to a younger Officer of the same rank but that all Officers takes post, according to the first date of their Commission, except they have been turn'd out for some fault or laid down in such case they become the youngest of the same Rank, but as I find your Honour &c^t. have been pleas'd to allow the superiority to Cap^t. Gough by giving him a Company, and as you have been also pleas'd to appoint me youngest Lieutenant of the Garrison in the Commissions now given out, I must confess I am at a loss to know what I have done to deserve it, on the contrary I can give sufficient proof that I have discharged my duty well and faithfully ever since I have had the honour to be employd, I therefore now begg leave to lay down the Hon^{ble}. David that when the Dawsonne is dispatch'd for England, there will be remaining to be brought in there upon the Contracts made in March & June last 1305 bales, which were 900 bales that he Computes at Vizagapatam (tho^u by the last advices they had but abo^t. 300 of them ready, & the rest can't well be expected before Sept^r. or Octo^r. next) together wth. the 1973½ to be brought in here will amount to 4678½ bales, which are all that are to come in upon all the Contracts made the last year at this place Fort S^t. David, & Vizagapatam.

Board, That believing the number of bales aforesaid will not be sufficient for the dispatch of all the shipping, which are expected from Europe, and may fall upon our hands by the latter end of January or february next ensuing he thinks it highly necessary to engage in a Contract with the Merchants forthwith at this place Fort S^t. David and Vizagapatam for as many bales as with the 4678½ aforesaid will be sufficient for the Tonnage we expect, and for what may accidentally drop in upon us.

Hereupon severall scruples and objections were rais'd by Mess^{rs}. Elwick, Benyon, Emmerson & Turton who declared, that they thought it would be more for the Hon^{ble}. Companys Interest to deferr entring upon a Contract till the arrivall of a ship from Europe, than to sett about it immediately, on acco^t. of a New list for Investment w^{ch}. might probably be sent out, and some of them urg'd that the bales remaining to be brought in upon the last years Contracts would be sufficient for the dispatch of all the shipping of the ensuing year.

The President then laid before the Board an account of the Tonnage that may reasonably be expected this year and the number of bales requisite for the same, w^{ch}. are as follows.

The GODFREY from the West Coast burthen about two hundred & Fifty tons, who is order'd to return hither after having reliev'd the settlement of Moco Moco, in case they can't give her a loading of pepper, w^{ch}. is much to be feared, or if they should be able to put on board her a small quantity, and she should by proceeding along the Coast get a little more, and then come hither, she will nevertheless require her full lading of bales, because it will be for the Interest of our Hon^{ble}. Masters to take it out, and divide it amongst the Coast & Bay ships to be dispatch'd from hence the same year, As their Tonnage will not at all be diminish'd by it, and the Commanders have agreed by their Charterpartys to carry such pepper home at half freight in consideration of that very particuar advantage w^{ch}. always accrues to them by its being shott loose in y^e. hold and taking up little or no room, as its interspersed amongst the bales, and consequently is clear proffit to the Owners. The Ge^o. Brigant. having been sent on purpose to relieve the Godfrey, she may be [for] the foregoing reasons expected, and being a ship of 250 Tons burthen w^{ch}. iron Kintilage on board, she may reasonably be believ'd to require . . . The next ship to be expected is THE CRAGGS FRIGAT about 400 Tons burthen: By a late letter from Mess^{rs}. Pyke & Caulier, we are ascertain'd of her safe arrivall at Batavia, and th^o they have form'd a resolution to repossess our Hon^{ble}. Masters of Fort Marlbr^o if possible, yet the wilderness of that project (owing to the weak condition they are in to undertake it, as having but 40 Soldiers and most of them by their own account sickly) affords us too much reason to apprehend their failure in that attempt; and in case of such a failure they have advised us in their letter aforementioned that they will come directly hither; It may be objected to this, that if They should not succeed at Fort Marlbr^o, but hear of the safety of our Settlement at Moco Moco They may proceed thither, and uniting their force make a 2^d. tryall, In answer whereto, Let it be granted, That they do hear of the safety of Moco Moco, & proceed thither; When they arrive it is probable they will find the Godfrey & George Brigantine there, and M^r. Pyke will doubtless peruse the orders & instructions we sent by them; If so He will find that we are unwilling to enter upon an expedition, that will be so expensive to our H. Masters without their previous knowledge & Consent and consequently will be deterr'd from going about it if he considers likewise the unwarrantableness of acting in such an important affair, or in any other, without leave from this board, while he is in a station subordinate to it; These and the like reasons may determine him to stay at Moco Moco, especially when he finds our people well establish'd there, & tolerably well secured or fortify'd, and that the place is commodiously situated for the pepper trade, and productive of a large quantity; If he resolves to stay, he will doubtless detain the Ge^o. Brigantine (till we can send over the Metchlepatam or Young Darby to relieve her) and return the Godfrey with the Craggs Frigat to us for a speedy dispatch from hence for England, to prevent that eating article of Demorage as much as possible—These Reasons being sufficient whereupon to ground our Expedition of having the Craggs Frigat to dispatch home from hence in August or Sept. next, we compute her burthen to be about 400 Tons, and therefore think it proper to make an allowance for her Cargoes (as her Kintilage consists of iron also) of bales. . . . The ships to be most expected next to the Godfrey & Craggs frigatt are from England, this year, in proportion to w^t. were sent us the last year; these were 4 in number Viz^t. It was then Objected by Mess^{rs}. Elwick, Benyon, Emmerson & Turton, That we were not certain of receiving as much Tonnage this year as we did the last, nor of a sufficient Stock of mony to pay for the goods still to be brought in upon the old Contracts, and to pay for what we may now Contract Besides.

To obviate these difficultys The President alledged That if the Tonnage sent out the last year was greater than usuall, the Investment was also greater but it is plain the Company could not send those ships out with a design that they should bring home the Goods order'd in that large list for Investment, because they must have known when they send them out, that it was impracticable to get those goods ready for their return a few months after, & it appears that the last years ships carried home mostly the Goods provided upon the March Contract, and that the 1/3^d. of the large List for Investment contracted for In June, remains at this time (or the most part of it) to be sent home upon the ships w^{ch}. the Comp^y. shall be pleas'd to send us out this year; and they well knowing (as doubtless they do) the necessity of it, and that this is the constant course or Channel in w^{ch}., their affairs run, we think there is no reason to apprehend their failure in making a suitable provision both of shipping & mony.

The President went on to say, That upon reading over the Consultation held by this Board the 22^d. of June last when M^r. Collet was President, he finds, That one third of the large list for Investm^t. Just then arrived, was agreed to be contracted for at that time, in order to lighten this years work, the meaning of w^{ch}. he takes to be in plain terms That the Board were willing to provide 1/3^d. of those goods then that the remaining 2/3^d. might not fail to be Compassed within the year following w^{ch}. is this now running, and those words he is of opinion imply an express Agreement to contract with the Merchants [for the remaining] 2/3^d. and that too as early as this time, Because, As 1/3^d. of that list for Investment was contracted for in June last to lighten this years work, that the remaining 2/3^d. allotted for this years work might the easier be compass'd within this year, Were we to deferr making a new Contract till May next, or till a ship arrives from England as Mess^{rs}. Elwick, Benyon, Emmerson & Turton propose, we should not then have time enough left to provide the said 2/3^d. and Compleat our last years orders, by the end of this year, which was the time the Board Agreed to compleat y^m. in, And therefore those Gentlemen abovemention'd who sign'd to that agreement, and now insist upon deferring the provision of the Goods till May next, (when it will be too late to get y^m. in by the end of December) do plainly prove, that they are for refusing to allow the Board time to put those agreements and orders in Execution, w^{ch}. they themselves have Joyned in making.

The President proceeded to say, that he observes in the Consultation of the 22^d. of June aforemention'd The Board acknowledge that when they made the Contract in March last, they had a great quantity of Goods upon hand and that they made that Investment for about as many Goods as compleated their preceding years orders; He adds that the proposal he now makes for a Contract, is exactly agreable to it, Which is, that a sufficient quantity of Goods may be provided to compleat our last years orders, to the end, that together w^{ch}. what remains upon the late Contracts, we may have wherewithall to dispatch the expected shipping, and such as may fall to

our share to send home; He further adds that since the Contract now, is proposed upon the same terms with what was made in March last, and that since the motives to enter upon this, are the same w^{ch}. induced the Board to agree to that; a dissent to this, past by those who readily came into that, is, in his opinion, very unaccountable. No objection was then made of staying for the arrival of a ship from England, tho' it was a month late in the year than at this time, and the King William was then daily expected from England for settling Dieu Island; and she did arrive in about two months and a half after the Contracts were Concluded; so that considering the large Quantity of Goods, which the Board in their Consultation beforemention'd acknowledge to have had on hand when the March Contract was made, The President is of Opinion, they might have waited for a New list of Investment with less inconvenience to our Hon^{ble}. Masters affairs at that time, than we can safely do at present, because we are more early in our entrance upon a Contract, & have not such substantiall reasons to expect a ship from England so soon. It was objected that some alteration might be made in the expected [list. To] this the President reply'd That our Investment would consist for the most part, of course Goods which were seldom known to be out of demand at home and for that reason little or no alteration could be expected as to the sorts, and that as for the Lengths and breadths they were already work'd up to as great a pitch as they can possibly be carried.

The apprehension of our want of money to pay for the Goods now proposed to be contracted for being again started as a Remora to this affair, The state of our Cash was Examin'd into, & Pag^s. 79232 : 2 : 54 found to be the ball^e. resting this day, besides Pag^s. 25604 : 14 : 7, due from M^r. Rich^d. Horden, Imp^t. Warehousekeep^r. which he says he shall be able to pay in very quickly, and both those sums amount to Pagod^s. 104836 : 16 : 61. The ballances that will be due to both our setts of Merchants when all the Goods are bro^t. in upon all the Contracts made here the last year, are Pag^s. 32193 : 29 : 44, and when they are paid, we shall even have a ballance of Pag^s. 72637 : 23 : 17 out of which if we allow Pags. 12637 : 23 : 17. to pay for what due to the Merchants at Fort St. David, that sum Joyn'd to the 13000 Pag^s. they have there in Cash, will doubtless satisfy that article and defray their Charges Garrison &c^t. pretty near till a ship may arrive with a supply from England so that when all the incumbrances in view are clear'd, we shall have Pag^s. 60000, in hand to enter upon a new Contract with all, (for our Revenues, & sales out of our Warehouses we Compute will bear our Expences now our buildings are near compleated) and we shan't have occasion to pay for any of the Goods to be bro^t. in upon the new Contract proposed till two or three m^{os}. hence, in w^{ch}. time it is probable we may receive Ten or fifteen Chests of Treasure from the West Coast (the Gentlemen there having directions to send us the overplus of what will satisfy their Occasions) and it's possible we may by that time also receive supply's from England; As for Vizagapatam we can't expect any draughts upon our Cash from thence for M^r. Symonds carried down with him Pag^s. 40000 in Rup^s. & Pagodas upon the Metchlepatam, in August last to pay for the Goods to be provided there.

The President still finding all the reasons he had giv'n were not satisfactory to some of the Members of the Board, acquainted them that he esteemed a list for Investment obligatory on us punctually to comply wth. equally wth. the express orders in our H. Masters letters, & to convince them thereof alluded to the 33^d. parag. of that receiv'd by the King William the last year w^{ch}. is as follows.

The Presid^t. further informs the board that 'twas particularly recommended him by the late Presid^t. Mr. Collett to set abo^t. a Contract as soon as possible.

The President further inform'd the Board, That it was particularly recommend- ed to him by the late President M^r. Collet to set about this Contract as soon as possible after his departure for the same reasons w^{ch}. he himself has already giv'n, besides w^{ch}. he desires the Board to consider, that this is the dry season fittest for washing & Curing of Cloth ; That most if not all the Goods remaining upon the last Contracts are already in our bounds, so that the Weavers being unemploy'd, will doubtless ingage wth. the Dutch, French & the Agents for the Interlopers unless we speedily sett them at work, That if we should be disappointed of the Rains we expect in April, & the devastations arising from the civill wars in the Country, should, as its fear'd they may, spread so far as to affect our trade, our Merchants would take a handle from our delay to Contract wth. them, and not consent to provide goods for us upon the terms they may at present, & therefore such an Opportunity as the present one should not be lost. That if we do not comply wth. the last list for Investment, & provide the remaining 2/3^{ds}. after the Agreem^t. in Consultation made the 22^d. June last as already mention'd, and after all the foregoing reasons that have been giv'n for the doing it, We may in case of Accidents by War, Famine & the like, (when we shan't be able to Contract if we would as we are able at present to do) perhaps be made accountable to the Hon^{ble}. Company for the damages w^{ch}. may accrue to them by our delay, & by such accidents attending it, for non-compliance with their last list for Investment ratify'd by an express order in their Gen^l. Letter. That if we should by contracting now for the remainder of the last list for Investment and by being disappointed of the expected Tonnage, have a surplusage on hand, We might make our Contract for the next year proportionably less, or ease the Gentlemen at the Bay by taking a ship off their hands besides the two which they usually send to fill up here ; That it has been hitherto thought an acceptable piece of service to the H. Comp^y. to provide a sufficient quantity of Goods, early for the dispatch of our shipping, although upon the failure of our Cash, we paid our Merch^{ts}. with Interest but the state of our Cash (as to its large ball^o.) as before represented is an undeniable Argument of the little reason we have to apprehend our being put to those streights ; That However when the Board Contracted in March last the ballance of their Cash the day they enter'd upon it was but Pag^s. 6582 : 27 : 48. being the 16th. of that month, and they were then indebted upon bond upwards of Fifty thousand Pagodas to Suncah Ramah &c^t. Merchants, that notwithstanding those disadvantageous circumstances they concluded a Contract for the then ensuing year without the least hesitation, thô they confess they had a large quantity of Goods upon hand, but it seems they thought themselves obliged nevertheless to comply with the preceding years orders. Upon comparing our present circumstances with those abovemention'd, We find the ballance of our Cash is like to be about 60,000 Pag^s. clear of all incumbrances, and that we are not indebted more than a trifle upon bond. It appears by the foregoing calculate that the Tonnage for y^e. ensuing year will require 13300 bales, and it is also possible that the Thistleworth & Borneo may come hither from Borneo to fill up here, not being able to compleat their business at that place, & hearing that the English are cutt off at Bencoolen to whom they were always wont to have recourse upon such occasions, But without making any provision for them, as their coming hither is least to be depended on we shall require 13300 bales, and there being 4678½ bales remain^d. to be brought in upon the last Contracts, It will be necessary to contract for 5000 bales more at least, of w^{ch}. 2000 with our Merchants here, 2400 w^{ch}. those at Fort St. David, & to give ord^r. to Vizagapatam for 600 to be provided there, and these together with what were contracted for in June last will about compleat the last list for Investment, & be sufficient to dispatch all the ships that may lye upon us to send home.

The Board notwithstanding all that had been urg'd by the President upon this occasion, not appearing unanimous, and it being absolutely necessary to determine this important affair one way or other before the Dawsonnes departure that our Hon^{ble}. Masters might be advised of the Russell, He desir'd that the Voice of every single Member might be given, beginning at the Youngest, as is usuall in such Cases, where severall of them differ in opinion from the rest.

The Voices of all the Members of the Board were accordingly in course declared, and separately minuted by the Sec^y. Whereupon they were summ'd up, and it appear'd that the Presid^t. & Mess^{rs}. Horden, Cooke & Fowke were entirely of opinion that it would be most for the Comp^s. Interest to contract forthwith for sev^l. Reasons w^{ch}. they separately gave (tho most of them were the substance of what the President had before laid down) and it appear'd likewise that Mess^{rs}. Elwick, Benyon, Emmerson & Turton were of the contrary opinion so that the decision was at length made for an immediate Contract w^{ch}. the Merchants by the Presidents Casting Voice.

Mess^{rs}. Elwick, Benyon, Emmerson & Turton then desired the liberty of delivering in the next Consultation their respective reasons for dissenting to the entrance upon a new Contract in this, which liberty was Granted them, & they are accordingly entered after this.

The Contract being agreed to be made the Merch^{ts}. were call'd in, & ask'd if they were willing to Contract for two thousand bales in Separate Contracts to be provided by the end of Sept^r. next in y^e. same proportions w^{ch}. that made in June last to w^{ch}. they readily consented, but being ask'd for an abatem^t. in y^e. price on acco^t. of the late fall of the price of Grain, they reply'd, it was as dear in the Country as ever; at length not being able to prevail upon them after many arguments, the Contract was concluded for 2000 bales upon the terms of the last addit^l. Contract and they were dismiss'd w^{ch}. a charge to increase the number of wash^{rs}. by all possible means.

That the Tonnage for the ensuing year will require 13,300 bales and tis also possible the Borneo ships may come hither.

the board not appear. unanimous notwithstanding. [what] the Presid^t. had urg'd. Put [y^e.] Affair to the members [beginning] at the youngest.

The Voices of the Membr^s. were accordingly declar'd & minuted and the decision at length made by the Gov^rs. Casting vote.

Mess^{rs}. Elwick, Benyon, Emmerson and Turton desires liberty to deliver in their separate reasons for their dissent.

The Merch^{ts}. called in [and] ask'd if they were willing to Contract for 2000 bales to be provided by the end of Sep^r. next. The Contract concluded for 2000 bales.

We cannot think it either necessary or advantagious for the Hon^{ble}. Company to enter into new Contracts with the Merchants upon the old list at this Juncture for the following reasons.

First.—That upon the present running Contracts here and at Fort S^t. David there are still standing out, and will be remaining after the dispatch of the Dawsonue, supposing her to take in 700 bales Viz^t.

We dayly expect from Vizagapatam	800
and ought to have by Sept ^r . according to the stock sent them more	500

These in all 4890, or exclusive of the additional 500 from Vizagapatam 4390 will be a sufficient stock of goods for the Godfrey and Craggs in July, supposing them to come here, and for two ships more of their burthen by October.

Being thus provided for our shipping to Octo^r., We are not under any apprehensions from loss of time by deferring our Contract, because th^o the Merchants were now bringing in Goods, they must lye by some months before they could be prepared to be laden on account of the quantity that still remains of the old Contract to be wash'd & c^t. Viz^t. 1333 bales, w^{ch}. according to what hath of late been perform'd will employ the Washers and Beaters at least four months, so that should we begin to contract three months hence, the Merchants would still be ready with goods sufficient to keep the Washers & c^t. constantly employ'd in curing, and till they are embaled they are of no advantage towards dispatching our ships, therefore we do not perceive any loss of time by not entering into new Agreements with the Merch^{ts}. yet, th^o we do conceive this difference, that we shall be obliged to part wth. considerable sums of money so many months sooner than we deferr our Contract to.

Secondly it is possible if not probable that we may have a ship from England by the latter end of April or beginning of May, when we shall likewise receive a fresh supply of Cash (our Nett ballance when the debts now due to the Merchants are paid being but about 30000 Pag^s.) a new list of Investment, an account of the whole Tonnage we are to expect and perhaps the Stock by them; so that we shall then be able to contract upon much surer terms, as well wth. relation to our Tonnage and stock as in Conformity to the new List, and we do not conceive any necessity for compleating an old List, when we have a new, because we presume the Company would always be best satisfy'd with having their latest orders put in Execution if possible, otherwise they would not take the advantage of the first Opportunity for altering their List, unless they design'd we should alter our Investments likewise w^{ch}. we shall have no room for doing this year, if a large Contract is now made, and if we overdo it in proportion to our Tonnage and Stock, we shall only run ourselves unnecessarily in debt, and what advantage can it be to the Company to have a Surplusage of Goods in their Godowns, whilst they are paying Interest for the same? and these inconveniences may certainly be avoided, if we wait the arrivall of an early ship from Europe.

Thirdly we are of opinion that though no ship should arrive in April, it will still be time enough in May to begin upon providing for the January shipping, w^{ch}. are all our present forwardness requires some supply for. In this case we can only Guess at the Tonnage we may expect, w^{ch}. we shall do by comparison with former years particularly the last, which was as large as has been for some time, and therein we find the Quota design'd for us was 1390 Tons; admitting y^e. same this year, We have already premised that 2390 bales will be on hand after the Godfrey & Craggs are dispatch'd, which is sufficient lading for 600 Tons, so that there remains 790 Tons only to be provided for in January next; This we will allow may require near 3000 bales, 500 whereof we have remark'd ought to be depended on from Vizagapatam,

the remaining 2500 are if an early ship arrives to be provided upon the new List here and at Fort S^t. David from May to January to compleat the expected Tonnage of this year; For here we must take notice that we have no reason to fear the West Coast shipping falling on our bands, because if the Company should have heard of the loss of that settlement they will send none that must lye upon us, and if they should not hear of it, the ships bound to that port will not probably be with us till March come twelve m^{os}.

Now as it appears to us that we shall stand in need of no more than 2500 bales, we cannot at all doubt of being able to provide them between May and January, notwithstanding all the difficultys that may be supposed, of which we think we labour'd under as great a share the last year, as may be suspected in any succeeding one, and we can by no means apprehend that our forbearance a few months to contract with our Merchants, in hopes of acting agreeable to fresh orders from the Company, will have any ill influence touching the Weavers in the Country, so as to put them upon new employments, for they will bring their Goods to the usuall Markets, and our Merchants will still be buying up to supply us against we call for them, as they depend we shall have occasion some time in the year, whether now or three months hence; and we only forbear paying for them till we want them; which we are of Opinion we cannot begin to do till May next; And for the foregoing reasons therefore are for deferring our Contract till then; Which we think fitt to declare we are not moved to by any spirit of Opposition or contradiction but by a sincere regard to the Interest of our Hon^{ble}. Employers according to the best of our Judgements.

C^o. and were bringing into Town, that upon being Complain'd to about it this morning by the Paymaster, as also of the people's being beat & imprisoned that were driving the Oxen, & refus'd to pay some mony, w^{ch}. the Metto people would have extorted from them, He sent the Cheif Dubash with some others to know the reason of such an insult, and to demand the delivery of our people whom he had imprisoned; The President adds, that instead of receiving a civil ans^wr. to that mes- age The Hovildar returned him a very sawcy one and Refused to lett the H. Comp^r. goods & people pass, thô the Cheif Dubash used many mild persuasive Argum^{ts}. with him for that purpose; at length not being able to prevail he Return'd and gave the President an acco^t. of what had passed, whereupon he Order'd the Cheif Peon with some others to go & Expostulate with him further, and in case of any Resistance to force the Hovildar to a Compliance, but when y^e. Cheif peon went to him he found him at the head of about 50 of his peons & people in a fighting posture, and upon going up to him to deliver the Presidents message, the Hovildar drew his Scimeter & struck at him, w^{ch}. he warded off wth. his Target, & thereby evaded being cutt down, The Cheif peon immediately drew a pistoll from his side and shott the Hovildar, w^{ch}. when he had done he wth. his people fell upon the rest, and kill'd two more, w^{ch}. terrify'd the rest so much that they ran away.

The Presid^t. acquaints the Board that y^e. Hovildar of the Metto near Egmore had prohibited our Oxen passing laden wth. Bricks and straw.

The Cheif Dubash sent to know the reason of such an insult y^e. Havildar returns a sawcy ans^wr. Cheif Peon sent to expostulate with him but found him at the head of fifty of his men, and when he went to deliver his Message from the Presid^t. he drew out his scimeter and struck at him the Peon drew out a Pistol and shott him.

The President adds, that he thinks the Peon has by this action show'd himself a trusty servant to the Hon^{ble}. Comp^r. & deserves encouragement; That if he had satt tamely down under this first insult we should not have failed of receiving many more of a higher degree, and that our showing our resentment upon this occasion will have a good influence upon all the Metto people and Junkaneers for the future; That least the matter should be represented to our Prejudice to y^e. Nabob, he has taken Care to transmitt an exact account of it to our Vacqueel at Arcot, & for the security of the Garrison has giv'n orders to the Officers to be upon a very strict guard for fear of surprize.

The Presid^t. represents that he thinks the Peon deserv^{ing} of a reward as a trusty serv^t. That the Presid^t. has taken care to advise the Nabob.

Robson and Pichier the H. Comp^s. two surgeons, who attending the Ward were in the sev^l. needfull Respects question'd concerning him, and after having assign'd severall Physicall Reasons for his being not yet Reinstated in a sound body & mind, they gave their finall Solution to the purpose, that he could not be yet perfectly recover'd, because obnoxious to relapse, as he had done more than once before, notwithstanding he was to all appearance *compos mentis*, It is therefore Agreed to take no further notice of this affair till the Surgeons report his perfect Recovery wth. this exception howev^r. that the present Trustees may discourse him about his making choice of others in their room, they being willing to resign them, trust to make him easy, w^{ch}. when they have done they may report his answer. A Copy of an Examination made by Thomas Cooke Esq^r. & C^t. Justices of the Choultry at a meeting the 5th. of April 1720.

Cap^t. Fullerton impeaches Anthony for seducing three Europe Soldiers to desert the Garrison, and that he had conducted them to Arcot, who being Examⁿ'd denies that he had himself seduced them, but pretends that he has a brother, who is very like himself who perhaps may have done what thro^t mistake he is accus'd of, tho^t he confesses that he mett the Deserters at a place calld Penmadore about a day & a halfs Journey from Madrass, from whence he accompanied them to Arcot.

Cap^t. Fullerton for a further confirmation of wth. he accuses him of, produced the following Witnesses Viz^t.

Susannah the wife of Tho^t. Gray one of the Deserters affirms that the said Anthony came to her in S^t. Thoma and demanded of her one Pagoda by her husbands order for being his guide to Arcot, and upon her refusing to pay it, he gott her imprison'd for 2 days, when she paid him 13 fan^t. wth. was all the mony she had.

Ensign Eckman declares that the said Anthony confess'd to him that he had carried away Tho^t. Gray, and that now he was a prisoner he would make no further discovery, tho^t he was never so severely punish'd.

Jn^r. Trustee & Jn^r. Vowell Centinells declare that they had proposed to the said Anthony to desert & desir'd him to assist them, who did promise to carry them off, if they could carry wth. them their Arms and a small matter of mony, then he would provide them a house in the day time, & that they should travell in y^e. Night, telling them he had Carried away 3 Englishmen before, after they had made this Agreem^t. wth. him, they Secur'd him, & bro^t. him before y^e. Cap^t.

All the Witnesses offering to take their oaths to the truth of what they asserted, **AGREED** that this Examination be reported to the Gov^r. and Council, and the Prisoner remanded into Custody of the Marshall.

The President acquaints the Board that he has lately discover'd a conspiracy some time since form'd by the Inhabitants of the Chitty Cast of this place to revolt from the English Governm^t. & Shelter themselves und^r. the protection of the Portugueze at S^t. Thoma. That upon receiving notice thereof he confin'd two of the Hon^{ble}. Comp^s. Merchants, who are heads of y^e. Chitty Cast, as believing them to have been concern'd in the Conspiracy, w^{ch}. he detected by the following Accident.

Viceroy of Goa to the Chittys of this place, The Pilot of w^{ch}. (being a Portugueze fellow) having rec^d. sev^l. Presents from the Vice Roy, for w^{ch}. he had sign'd bills of lading to deliver to sev^l. of the Chittys here, accordingly upon his arrival enquir'd for those people, not knowing upon what errand the Galliot was sent hither, or what was the intent of sending those Presents ; The Person enquir'd of (thô a Portugueze) being well affected to the English, seeing him produced letter directed to Colloway Chitty, Ball Chitty, Nallapa Chitty, & Can Chitty &c^t. Inhabitants of the Chitty Cast in Madrass, began to Reflect within himself, what could be the meaning of the Viceroy of Goa's writing a letter, & Corresponding wth. a Set of people in this place, and hearing at the same time the Pilot say, that he had Presents to deliver to the Heads of them, It put him into a Consternation Especially considering that the Supra Cargo of the Ship, was publickly known to be a Villain & stood recorded as such.

The President adds that this person on being under a very great concern as apprehending some treacherous design by the odd circumstances w^{ch}. appear'd, Communicated to him, thrô the means of M^r. Horden all that had passed upon this occasion, whereupon he sent Lieutenant Fullerton & the pilote of the Galliot wth. a Serjeant & six men to apprehend the afores^d. Pareira in his house in the black town, but he, by their mistaking the way, had made his Escape, before they got to the house, when they enter'd, they found his wife there who deliver'd them sev^l. papers, w^{ch}. she found in her Husbands Escrutore, & they sealing up the said Escrutore brought it wth. them.

Thomâ & wrote in the Persian Language ; A Copy of Manuel De Oranzo, Comm^r. of Ship Jesu Maria Joseph from Goa, his instructions or ord^s.—Lists of presents from Goa on Jesu Maria Joseph to be sent to the Mogull, & Nabob Hussan Ally Gawn ; A Sealed lett^r. from the King's Councillour at Goa to Colloway Chitty, Ball Chitty, Nallapa Chitty, Marr Chitty &c^t. Inhabitants of the Chitty Cast in Madrass w^{ch}. was Order'd to be Open'd & being Translated into the English Language, they were all read & Copys of them Order'd to be transmitted home in our next Paquet.

The Board having heard a very full relation of this matter, immediately sent for the Pilote, & Summon'd the heads of the Chitty Cast to appear before them ; The former being present, severall Interrogatorys were put to him, & his answers were found to agree wth. y^e very letters & papers themselves, wth. respect to the Presents &c^t. put on board him ; but it appears that he was entirely ignorant of the Design, that was intrusted to the afores^d. Pareira whose ord^s. he was to follow implicitly ; The Pilote being dismiss'd the heads of the Chitty Cast appear'd amongst w^{ch}. were

the Agents for y^e. Comp^r. Left hand Merch^{ts}. who being askd concerning this affair, they confidently deny'd the^r. knowing any thing of the matter, but the Board being Satisfy'd of the Good grounds, which there are to suspect their Guilt, requir'd them forthwth. to give Security for their good behaviour concerning w^{ch}. they promis'd to discourse the rest of their Cast, & then return an answer, whereupon they were dismissed.

AGREED that the Goods bro^t. by the s^d. Perira be detain'd in the Sea Custom^{rs}. hands till further Orders.

The matter being very fully debated, It was at length AGREED, That as the aforementioned Pareira had brought severall sorts of Goods, as presents for the Great Mogull, & Sied Hussenally Cawn, they should be secured by the Sea Custom^r. till further ord^r. & that in ord^r. thereto a Serjeant & Six men, should be sent on board the Galliot und^r. the direction of the Sea Cust^r.

ORDER'D that the Secr^y. do affix a paper at the Sea Gate to give notice, That if any person or persons concern'd in this conspiracy will discover the same to the President or to any one of the Council, he or they shall have a handsome reward, and full pardon for themselves, and that he do enter a Copy of the said paper after this Consultation.

AGREED that the Chitty Cast be continued und^r. confinem^t. in ord^r. to get some further light.

AGREED, That the Hon^{ble}. Comp^r. Left hand Merch^{ts}. and the rest of the Heads of the Chitty Cast, be continued und^r. Confinem^t. in ord^r. to get some further light into this affair.

Mr. Jennings advices the Presid^t. that two English and two Dutchmen came thither fro^m. Tranquebar in a boate as also one fro^m. Tranquebar on the same subject.

The President acquaints the Board, that he is advised by M^r. Jennings D. Gov^r. of F^t. St. David, that there are two English and two Dutchmen come thither from Tranquebar in a boat, w^{ch}. they ran away wth. from a Danes ship lying in that road; He adds that y^e. Gov^r. of Tranquebar, has also wrote him a letter upon the same Subject wherein he Esteems them as Pirates, & desires they may be treated accordingly.

AGREED they be wrote for up.

AGREED that the President do write to M^r. Jennings to send them hither by the 1st. Opportunity.

The West Coast affair debated.

The Board having the last Consultation, agreed to come to some determination, at this (being the next Meeting) concern^s. the West Coast affairs, They were accordingly Debated, and it appearing upon examination into the Disputes that have been between Messieurs Pyke & Ballet about the Right of Authority in the Government of the West Coast, that there have been faults on both sides, & M^r. Ballet now standing Accused of a very heavy Charge both by M^r. Pyke & M^r. Willy of a design to set fire to the buildings at Moco Moco, & to retire to y^e. Dutch at Podang, and the Board being apprehensive, that if we should send M^r. Pyke over Deputy Gov^r. matters might not be so impartially Examin'd into, as would be necessary, on acco^t. of M^r. Pykes resentment of some injurys, he says he has rec^d. from M^r. Ballet, w^{ch}. whether reall or Supposed time must determine.

That its necessary. to send over a supravisor to enquire strictly into matters.

For these reasons we think it absolutely necessary to send over a Supravisor, who by being disinterested in either side may enquire strictly into y^e. matters of Fact, related both by Mess^{rs}. Pyke and Ballet & faithfully & impartially Judge, & determine between them, besides that he will perhaps have it in his power to reconcile, & accommodate all their private Picques and Differences.

Natives seem well inclin'd of the West Coast to the English.

And whereas by all the Acco^{ts}. both of Mess^{rs}. Pyke and Ballet now before us, the Natives at Bencoolen seem well disposed to a perfect reconciliation to the

English, & fearing that we may render ourselves liable to Censure from our Hon^{ble}. Masters, should we not embrace this fair Opportunity of resetting Fort Marlbrô & thereby prevent the greatest branch of our pepper trade from falling into y^e. hands of the Dutch, & being irrecoverably lost, It is unanimously

AGREED to enter upon the Choice of proper persons to be sent on an Expedition to Bencoolen forthwth. to Resettle Fort Marlbrô.

AGREED to enter upon the Choice of proper Persons for that Expedition.

It is further AGREED that M^r. John Turton be appointed Supravizor, & Deputy Gov^r. *pro Tempore* of the West Coast of Sumatra That he do carry over wth. him M^r. Isaac Pyke as second to succeed him as Deputy Gov^r. on his leaving that place.

Mr. Turton go Supravizor & Deputy Gov^r. to the West [Coast]. Mr. Pyke as second & to succeed in that Governm^t.

By the Elección of M^r. Turton as SupraViz^r. there being a Vacancy at this Board, The President proposed, that M^r. Joshua Draper should be admitted as Youngest of Council, & to remain nevertheless in his post of Secretary at his desire, Mess^{rs}. Elwick & Benyon & Emmerson dissented to that proposal, alledging that it was contrary to the Hon^{ble}. Comp^d. ord^{rs}. expressed in the 91st. paragraph of their letter ¶ the King William 1716, w^{ch}. was read through, and is hereafter recited.

The Presid^t. proposes Mr. Draper as Youngest of Council & to continue as Sec^{ry}. but Mess^{rs}. Elwick & Benyon and Emmerson dissented to that proposal alledg^d. 'Twas contrary to the Comp^d. Orders.

We observe what mention'd in parag. 113 ¶ Joseph, & the Cons. there "referr'd to, & parag. 93 ¶ Hannover, touching the filling up the Council according "to former ord^r. but y^e. will see in our General Lett^r. last year by the Mary, that we "would not have our Council to be less than Seven & we now say, whenever they are "no more, it will be so much the better, because an ill use hath been made by some "admitt^d. into our Councils in India, for they then thought they had a privilege to "be Exempt from any Controul, & to leave our business to others und^r. them, witho^t. "taking the same pains abo^t. it, as they used to be at before such promotion, thô we "would hope this is not the case of any of yo^r. Council for if it should, they ought "to be no longer therein yet it is not good for Young men, especially to come too "nigh the Temptation, nor to be advanced too soon, least their heads turn giddy, as "seem'd to be the case of M^r. Raworth.

The Para. of the Gen^l. Lett^r. relating thereto read.

All the Members of the Board except Mess^{rs}. Elwick, Benyon & Emmerson, very readily Agreed to the Presidents proposal of admitting M^r. Joshua Draper as Youngest of Council for the reasons w^{ch}. were given for the admission of Mess^{rs}. Benyon & Turton, who could not claim it by Seniority, but were taken in for their extraordinary merit, as is expressed by Gov^r. Collet in a former Gen^l. Letter, so that the Majority of this Board declaring their Agreement to admitt M^r. Joshua Draper as Youngest of Council, He took his place accordingly, & then begg'd leave to represent that in the way, w^{ch}. Mess^{rs}. Elwick, Benyon & Emmerson, dissented to his admission to the Board, he thought himself highly Reflected on by them, & gave his reasons verbally for the proof thereof, as well as to Justify his being brought to the Board, producing the instance of M^r. Turner's promotion when there were actually seven members before, and then desir'd liberty to committ all his thoughts to writing, w^{ch}. occur'd to him on that occasion, in order to be deliver'd in the next Consultation, & Enter'd after this, w^{ch}. Request was Granted him.

Mr. Joshua Draper taken to the board Elected by Majority of voices & took his place as youngest of Council.

Majority approving thereof I was accordingly Elected a Member for which favour I am to render my thankfull acknowledgments.

But three of y^e. Gentlemen Viz^t. Mess^{rs}. Elwick, Benyon and Emmerson, being pleas'd to dissent to y^e. Choice because they said it was Contrary to y^e. Hon. Comp^s. ord^{rs}. express'd in y^e. 91st. paragraph of their Lett^r. by y^e. King William Anno 1716, the sum & substance of which is That whenever y^e. Council consist of no more than seven it will be so much y^e. Better, & because I think in so Dissenting they have glanc'd some reflections at me which may Affect my Character at Home if I should remain Silent, & not ward them off. I beg'd leave of yo^r. Hon^r. & C^t. to clear myself in writing which I have endeavour'd to do in y^e. following arguments.

FIRST. I desire Liberty to prove (if I can) that I am not admitted to y^e. Board Contrary to y^e. Hon. Comp^s. ord^{rs}. in y^e. 91st. paragraph aforesaid.

SECONDLY. That there is no ord^r. at all in that paragraph.

THIRDLY. That what Mess^{rs}. Elwick, Benyon & Emmerson, call an ord^r. is no more than an opinion or advice.

FOURTHLY. That I am rightly & justly admitted to y^e. Board although the Hon^{BLE}. Comp^s. Opinion four years ago should appear for not letting y^e. number exceed seven.

FIFTHLY. That Mess^{rs}. Elwick, Benyon & Emmerson, have reflected upon my charactor in y^e. way w^{ch}. they have Dissented to my admission to y^e. Board.

SIXTHLY & lastly. That their Dissent is in reality an assent.

To y^e. first then Viz^t. That I am not admitted to y^e. Board Contrary, to y^e. Hon^{BLE}. Comp^s. orders in y^e. 91st. paragraph aforesaid.

It is well known that in y^e. true way of reasoning y^e. proposition is first laid down then comes y^e. reason & from thence is drawn y^e. Conclusion in y^e. 91st. Paragraph of y^e. Hon. Comp^s. Lett^r. aforementioned this way of reasoning may be observ'd y^e. words are to this purpose. Whenever y^e. Council Consist of no more then seven it will be so much y^e. better, this is y^e. proposition next comes y^e. reason because young men for y^e. sake of leaving their Business to others und^r. them for y^e. sake of power & Controwl which are temptations having been desirous of admission

to y^e. Board & having obtain'd it, an ill use hath been made of y^e. Latitude formerly given of filling up y^e. Board to nine in Number, a second reason for their Inclination to decrease that Number to seven, is to prevent those persons from coming to the Board who perhaps may have pretensions on acco^t. of seniority but none on acco^t. of Merit and are as they say of a Giddy unsettled temper. The proposition being at length laid down & two reasons assign'd y^e. Conclusion remains to be drawn, w^{ch}. with submission may be done in y^e. following manner, That whenever any of y^e. Hon^{ble}. Companys Servants within reach of the Board appear desirous of living an Idle Life when they seem ambitious of Power & Controul, or discover a giddy wild and unsettled temper that then such undeserving persons should be prevented by this Plea from Importuning y^e. Board to admitt them as members but this does not in any way exempt myself from being admitted at this time when there are seven already because y^e. Majority of y^e. Board (who are alwayes to be Esteemd y^e. properest Judges of mens merit) have by voating for my Election plainly shewd that they do not think me a person desirous of being in Council for y^e. sake of leaving my business to others und^r. me or desirous of Power & Controul or that I am of a Giddy unsettled Temper.

These three articles be objected against in a mans Charactor I beg leave to take notice of a Part, They are Viz^t.

FIRST. An Idle Lazy Disposition

SECONDLY. An Imperious mind

THIRDLY. The want of Sence & Solidity.

In answer to y^e. first I need only say That my having Voluntarily taken upon me to act as Sec^{ry}. and be of Council at y^e. same time is a sufficient Argument that I have not coveted an admission to y^e. Board for y^e. sake of leaving my Business to others & consequently is a full proof that I am not of an Idle disposition.

To y^e. Second about power & Controul I have never yet acted in a station where I had an opportunity to exercise any & therefore it has not been in y^e. power of any body to judge one way or the other, all that I shall add upon this Head is that I firmly beleive those persons who suspect my eagerness of com^s. to y^e. Board to proceed from a desire of power & Controul did realy seek that advancem^t. themselves wth. a desire to exercise it & y^e. reason of this belief arises from a French Motto w^{ch}. I have frequently mett with that is *Hon i Soit qui maly pense*, or evil be to them that evil think.

I shall say nothing else to y^e. last article about y^e. want of sence & solidity, but that y^e. persons who Consented to make me Sec^{ry}. and had no better opinion of my Capacity gave up their own reason & y^e. Interest of y^e. Hon^{ble}. Company out of Complaisance, or elce they did not know what they were doing & now having replyd to y^e. three particulars I proposed I think it necessary to excuse myself for having spoken in my own behalf with this universally allow'd maxim that self Commendation is always allowable in cases of detraction.

Having done with y^e. first Gen^l. head I come now to y^e. second & third to prove that in y^e. Paragraph quoted by Mess^{rs}. Elwick, Benyon and Emmerson, there is no ord^r. at all but an opinion or advice.

To the end that I may do this clearly I shall beg leave to define y^e. matter of an ord^r.

In my humble opinion 'tis that by which we are to understand a Command expressd in a peremptory form of words and it had Generally a Penalty annex'd to it which with respect to the Company is incufing their displeasure & its Consequences & it requires no great penetration to discern that there is no command or order in y^e. words it had better been done, & that it amounts to no more then an advice or opinion.

As to the fourth head that I am rightly & Justly admitted to y^e. Board altho y^e. Hofi. Comp^s. opinion four years ago should appear for not letting y^e. number of y^e. Board exceed seven by all the observations I have made upon y^e. Comp^s. Lett^{rs}. I

find that thô they give such & such directions they generally leave them discretionally to y^e. Presid^t. & Council to be put in Execution & for this reason because though at y^e. writing of those Lett^{rs}. it may appear necessary to act so, or so, yet before y^e. rec^t. of them (which is generally six months difference in time) a thousand accidents may Intervene which make it advisable to take other measures so that were it the Comp^s. opinion four years ago y^e. Members of y^e. Board should not exceed seven in number the Presid^t. & Council have an undoubted power to increase that number whenever y^e. majority of them shall say they see a just occasion.

To y^e. fifth Article Viz^t. that Mess^{rs}. Elwick, Benyon & Emmerson, have reflected upon my Charactor in y^e. way which they have dissented to my admission to y^e. Board & this I prove in y^e. follow^g. manner.

That as I have already prov'd what they call an ord^r. to be no more than an advice or opinion & Little more than a proposition, grounded upon such, & such reasons & seeing y^e. y^e. Company could never expect their advice, opinions or propositions to be made good by us unless such reasons appear'd, & seeing further more that Mess^{rs}. Elwick & c^t. having been guided by y^e. reasons mentiond und^r. my first head have follow'd y^e. Comp^s. advice or opinion, I have provd und^r. y^e. same head, that those reasons do not relate to me, then of course I have provd that that advice, opinion, Proposition (or if it was an ord^r.) does not relate to me, but as those reasons (as I said und^r. the first head) are to exclude men of scandalous Characters from the Board, they by applying those reasons to my case have endeavor'd to make my Charactor scandalous which I think is sufficient to prove they have highly reflected upon me.

I now come to prove y^e. 6th. & last article I proposd (which may perhaps seem a Paradox) That Mess^{rs}. Elwick, Benyon, & Emmersons Dissent is a real assent.

It has before been said that Mess^{rs}. Elwick, Benyon and Emmerson, Dissented to my admission to y^e. Board for one reason namely, That it was Contrary to y^e. Comp^s. ord^r. express'd in y^e. 91 Paragraph of a Lett^r. then mentioned; In my second & third heads I have fully provd that there is actually no ord^r. in that Paragraph if then they Dissented as beleiving there was an ord^r. & afterwards there is prov'd to be none the reason for y^e. Dissent Ceases & Consequently y^e. Dissent itself; if y^e. Dissent Ceases an assent comes of Course because men must assent if they see no reason to Dissent, or else they must Dissent for no reason at all and it is Directly contrary to y^e. Comp^s. Ord^r. to Dissent witho^t. giving Substantiall reasons, and this renders them liable to more then Censure proves their Judgm^t. to be weak Interrupts y^e. Comp^s. Affairs, trifles away the time that should be employ'd in them & bespeaks them not qualified to judge of other matters.

Having at length in my humble Opinion and with all submission & defference to y^e. Opinion of this Board made good y^e. Sevⁿ. Argum^{ts}. which I proposd to go upon I beg leave to give an additional Reason for my having been justly & rightly admitted to y^e. Board though there are already seven Members at it includ^g. y^e. Presid^t. since I have had y^e. Hon^r. to act as Sec^y. to y^e. Board I more than once have known y^e. time when precedents were thought a sufficient sanction for acting in any dubious Case. I remember when M. George Torriano was proposd to be admittd as a covenanted serv^t. in y^e. degree of a Factor he was also proposd to be admitted as a Factor for three years only; some of the then members of the Board (who might know it was Contrary to y^e. Comp^s. ord^r. to admitt a Factor for three years only witho^t. their privious knowledge & Consent) tho^t. y^e. likelyest way to gain their Point would be to produce a Precedent, & they accordingly mentiond M^r. Sam^l. Synnock; whereupon M^r. Toriano was chosen for three years & thereby he would have superceeded me at the Expiration of it nevertheless I acquiesd, as supposing Board Esteemd him a more deserving man then my Self, for I know that Plea to be unanswerable because y^e. Hon^r. Comp^s. in y^e. 45 Parag^r. of their Letter by the Mary dated y^e. 12 Jan^y. 1714 Expressly tell us that Merrit not seniority is to be regard^{ed} & here it is to be noted, that Precedents hav^e. been thought a Sufficient sanction

even for disobeying the Comp^s. ord^s. by those very Gentlemen who now Dissent to my being taken into Council for that which in y^e. worst sence is but contrary to what might seem y^e. Comp^s. Opinion four years ago.

- It was with hopes of the like Success, which Jñ. Toriano mett wth. that I produced y^e. Instance of M^r. Turner to favour my admission to the Board, I laid before yo^r. Hon^r. &c^t. y^e. Consultation of y^e. 5th. of Sept^r. 1717 wherein it is expressly said, there being a Vacancy at this board upon M^r. Josiah Cookes Resignation Agreed that M^r. Nathaniel Turner be admitted as young of Council. The Board then Consisted of seven members as appeard by the foregoing Consult: Viz^t. The Presid^t. & Mess^{rs}. Frederick, Jennings, Horden, Cooke, Legg, & Fowke & notwithstanding M^r. Turner was admitted as an eighth at the same time making it a Standing Rule that when y^e. Board was reduced to Seven it should be concluded there was a vacancy w^{ch}. I take to be y^e. plain sence of y^e. foregoing quotation. This admission of M^r. Turners was two years after y^e. Company had wrote out their Sentiments upon which Mess^{rs}. Elwick, Benyon & Emmersons Dissent is grounded, Our Hoff. Masters have not Disapprov'd the Presid^t. & Councils Conduct. in admitting M^r. Turner to y^e. Board though it before Consisted of seven members and therefore as no dislike is express'd it is to be taken for granted they approve it thô by a tacit approbation for by y^e. observation I have made upon their Lett^r. I perceive they seldom reply to any particulars which are not refer'd to them for their Opinions or where they do not think fitt to show their Dislike.

The great Concern I have upon me for meeting wth. opposition in coming to this Board after y^e. repeated assurances I rec^d. from y^e. late Presid^t. of obtaining that favour & after all y^e. pains I have taken in my Hoff. Masters service to deserve it will (I hope) plead an excuse for drawing out this paper to so great a length, The principal design of it having been to ward off some Reflections Glanc'd at me by M^r. Elwick, Benyon & Emmerson, in their dissent w^{ch}. I thought might affect my Character if I remain'd silent, & therefore I hope what I have said will be a sufficient defence & preserve me in y^e. good Opinion of my Hoff. Masters, as well as of this Board, w^{ch}. I shall endeavour to maintain so long as I have y^e. Hon^r. to continue in their service against all y^e. Detraction of envy; & having at length made an Apology for y^e. trouble I have herein given this Board, I shall submitt y^e. whole of what I have said with y^e. greatest Difference Immaginable to yo^r. Hon^r. &c^s. better Judgm^t. & conclude with assurance that I am through a deep sence of yo^r. favours ever oblig'd to approve myself

Comp^s. of Sold^{rs}. in this Garrison (as enterd after this Consultation) whereun he offers his service to go upon the intended expedition as Command^r. of the military upon the West Coast und^r. the Supravizor and desiring that in such case his Company may be kept vacant for him in his absence, and that no Lieutenant may be placed thereto during that time, He also desires that in case of the Supravizors mortality, he may carry with him a power to return that he may not be detain'd there longer than is consistent wth. his inclinations, all w^{ch}. requests being judg'd reasonable they are Granted him, & his service be well accepted with those concessions for his encouragement.

Having seriously consider'd upon my necessity in this Voyage proposed, w^{ch}. is that at our coming out of England the forty Soldiers were put on board just at our coming away, when it was impossible to get a supply of provisions, that number was also Augmented by twenty five persons coming on board at St. Helena where I could have no recruit likewise, w^{ch}. has exhausted them very much. Then at our arriving on the West Coast, Fort Marlbrô not being in y^e. Possession of the English, was obliged to keep them longer on board, by w^{ch}. means am reduced to so miserable a Streight, that I have no more than six weeks provisions on board, M^r. Drake was pleas'd to tell me he believ'd he could have twelve Casks ready in Twenty days, but I am fully satisfy'd that the provisions of this Country cannot keep any time at sea & should they prove bad must run the Risque of perish^e. by want, & should that happen, it must be a great loss to the Comp^a. and the Own^r. besides our own lives. This I beg you'll be pleas'd to take into yo^r. Consideration & am

May it please your Hon^{rs}. to know that in Obedience to your order and Command we whose names are hereunto subscribed being appointed to survey the Ship Craggs Friggot do humbly Certify that we have surveyed the said Ship within board and without and she appears to us to be a strong new ship and in good order and Condition.

We asked the Carpenter what water the ship made, he said 6 inches in 12 hours we asked him if he cou'd not stop that Leak which let in the 6 Inches water in 12 hours he said he cou'd do it very well but it must be in smoother water than there is here at present here being now too great a swell and he said he did not take it to be a Leak but that the ship wanted Caulking near the waters Edge but her Bottom is tight.

We ask'd him how this Ship came to want so much Caulking he said she lay a long time on the West Coast and Rode out several great storms and that she being a new Ship it was usual for a new Ship to want more Caulking than a ship at a second Voyage. The Carpenter desired us to note it is not usual to fit ships here for a Voyage Home and that this place is not Convenient for it because he must reap off the Cants of the Lower whales to come to the Seam under them and to search the Butts and scarfes of both the Whales & that in all new ships it is necessary so to do or else the Goods will be Damaged.

We ask'd him in how long time the ship could be fitt to take in Goods and have all that work done he spoke of and what other work should be necessary he said in 20 days more but if the weath^r. were favourable than in 17 or 18 days for he said that work must be done upon a stage we ask'd him if he cou'd not work on a stage now, he desired us to go about the ship in a Boat and see if we cou'd then stand upon a stage. Whereupon M^r. Pyke desired the Carpenter to go in the Yawl with M^r. Cartwright and M^r. Murray who went and look'd at the Ships Whales afore and abaft and when they came in were ask'd if they thought any man could work on a stage in such Weather they said that after the Change of the Moon fairer weather & smoother water might be expected but that the Ship must be lightend more & heeled.

As to the Caulking the ships Decks and her upper works they are about it and seem to work hard but as a new ship does require more Caulking than another ship we believe it may take up as much time as the Carpenter mentions to fit her for a Voyage as she ought to be.

In Testimony hereof we have hereunto Subscribed our names this 25th. day of May A. Domini 1720 on Board the said Ship Craggs is [...].

The most humble representation of Thomas Blake Commander of the Ship Craggs SHEWETH that as soon as your Hon^r. & C^a. had thought fitt to Confirm him in his Command of the said Ship as Successor to Cap^t. John Wynn Deceased he repaired on Board and has order'd an Exact Account of all Stores, Provisions & C^a. to be taken that are at present on Board which Accounts are now writing out in order to be laid before your Hon^r. & C^a.

I do also humbly Represent to your Hon^r. & C^a. that not two hours before we sett sail from the Downes we had thirty men sent on Board as Soldiers in the Hon^{ble}. Companys service wholly unknown and Unexpected by us before they having been shipd on Board another ship; and that because of maintaining them about nine months on those provisions laid in for the Ships Company we have all been Reduc'd to very great Straits.

That during the said nine months many of the said Soldiers fell sick which occasion'd the Expence of most of our medicines and by the blessing of God with very good advantage there having been but one of all the soldiers dyed of sickness during the whole Passage and though we Carried four Chests of Medicines of the Hon^{ble}. Companys to the West Coast, out of which M^r. Pyke often promised we shou'd be recrutaed for what our Docter had used for the aforesaid Soldiers and for thirty eight of the Companys Coffree Slaves belonging to their late Settlement at Bencoolen which we took in at Battavia, and though when we came to Moco Moco M^r. Ballet was Informd and seemd sattisfied of wth. had been done and told us he wou'd make good M^r. Pykes promise in that particular yet when we had deliver'd those medicines all on shoar (which were the Intire quantitys sent to Fort Marlborough for the whole West Coast) we could never gett any Recruit of medicines from the said M^r. Ballet.

That because of the Scantiness of our provissions and the badness of them we have been able to procure abroad the Officers and Sailers on board the ship have made many heavy and not unjust Complaints.

That on our Arrivall here (where we promised our selves and the people all proper redress to those Complaints for their future encouragement) yet the fresh provisions we have been able to procure though the best price is paid for them have been so Extreemly bad that the people on Board have refused to eat them Aledging it to be sickly and infected meat and not better than Carreign; they have throw'd over board several Cows and after some days fasting have killd and eat the Capt^t. Hoggs and after them have fed upon the English salt Provisions, many of them declaring that they were resolv'd not to proceed the Voyage unless a Sufficient quantity of wholesome Provisions were laid in for them.

That since Cap^t. Wynns death in order to pacify the people on Board I have sent off foulds goats & C^a. but to Continue feeding seventy five men on such provisions were an Extravagancy the Owners would never allow it amounting to more than the ships Freight would pay for.

That upon making proof of one of the best peices of meat salted here I find it so eaten up with salt that it will be nothing elce in a months space, and have been informd likewise that at least 20 beast may be packed up in one Cask they being so Extreemly small and lean so that I can in no ways rely on those Provisions.

These premises being taken into Consideration I hope your Hon^r. &c^a. will not Oblige me to take off such salted meat as when fresh the people as above have refused to eat least by any Mutiny or Insurrection in the ship we should be obliged instead of prosecuting our intended Voyage to make some fatal Deviation to seek proper food, the unhappy Consequences whereof might reach farther than at first view can be Descernd.

As to the fitness of the ship to proceed on this intended Voyage she is a new ship and good yet wants such necessary work to be done to her as may take up time to perform in this Road which because your Hon^r. &c^a. should be fully satisfied in and the necessity thereof, I humbly pray you would be pleasd to appoint her to be survey'd least my repeating these repairs should look like an unwillingness to proceed on the Voyage which is far from me.

I hope your Hon^r. &c^a. will please in a case of so great Consequence to excuse my earnestness in representing a thing which to my weak judgment appears so Obviously to Concern the welfare and Preservation of the ship, so many lives and the Hon^{ble}. Companys Estate I am

John Wynn lately Deceas^d and also one signd by your self wherein your said ship Craggs Friggatt is Represented to be not in a Condition to undertake the aforesaid Voyage in pursuance of our orders by reason of her not being well and sufficiently Victuald and stored and whereas her Commander and part owners have by Charter Party bearing date the 2^d. January 1718 obliged themselves to keep the said Ship Craggs Friggatt well and sufficiently Victuald and furnishd with all necessary stores to knable her to go as well from Port to Port in India as from England to India to be imploy^d in Trade and as in Warrfare if so required by the Hon^d. Company or their assig^[ns] and whereas further more you the said Cap^t. Tho^s: Blake have in a paper bearing date the 24th. Inst^t. represented the Condition of your Ship Craggs to be such (as well with Respect to the ship as her Provisions) as we can by no means think it safe to depend on for the security of the Hon^d. Companys Estate and for the performance of the intended Voyage, and whereas you have thought fit to excuse your scantiness of Provisions by the Plea of having thirty Soldiers sent on board you unexpectedly in the Downs we think it necessary to tell you that we Esteem it no Plea at all because you had it in your Power to recruit at S^t. Helena which is a Garrison that is always kept fully stored for the Supply of Shipping and we cannot learn that you had any other Excuse because for making a Deviation to Battavia in your outward Passage than the getting a Supply of Salt Provisions which we are well assured might easily have been procured, and whereas to prevent all delays in our Expedition to the West Coast we have thought fitt to assist you salting of a sufficient quantity of Provisions for your Voyage and have been at a large expence on that Account which Provisions you have nevertheless Rejected and whereas by the report of a survey made and signd by Mess^{rs}. Isaac Pyke, Elias Cartwright and David Murray bearing date the 24th. Inst^t. the said Ship Craggs Friggatt does not appear to be in a Condition to enter forthwith upon her Intended Voyage but will require Considerable time to Refitt; We the said President and Council aforesaid finding our design^d Expedition to the West Coast thereby much Retarded to the very great Detrement of the Hon^d. Company as well by Loss of time (which may perhaps Occasion the Intire Loss of the West Coast) as by the charge of Demurrage from the 30 Ultimo (being the time when the service of the Craggs Friggat was Demanded for the West Coast) and apprehending severall Losses and inconveniences will accrue to the said Hon^d. Company by the said ship Craggs Friggat not being in a Condition for our Service, We the President and Council aforesaid do therefore for and in Behalf of the Hon^d. Company aforesaid Protest against you Thomas Blake Commander of the said Ship Craggs Friggat as also the Charter Party men and the Owners of her the said ship for all Losses and Damages by Demurrage or other ways which the Hon^d. Company aforesaid may sustain by the said ship not being in a Condition to proceed on her Voyage to the West Coast and home for which a written order was deliver^d Cap^t. John Wynn the Commander the 30th. day of last month whose Inability to Comply with that order renders this Protest of full force and Vertue from that day. Consultation of the 7th. of Febr'y 1716/17, he finds mention there made of a paper sign'd by the heads of every Cast, (a Copy whereof is entred after y^o. Consultation) wherein the penalty of desertion is made Confiscation, & the forfeiture of the Hon^{ble}. Comp^s. protection, The President adds that he has made a strict enquiry for that paper, as knowing how much our Hon^{ble}. Masters depend upon the force of that Obligation for the good behav^r. of the people in future (as they have been pleased to Express themselves in their Gen^l. Letter the last year) and that he is informed by the Chief Dubash, that after it was sign'd, it was by himself deliver'd to the late Presid^t. M^r. Collet, & what became of it afterwards he cannot tell.

The Presid^t. informs the board, that he finds in the Cons^t. the 7th. Febr'y. a paper sign'd by the Heads of the several Casts, wherein the penalty of desertion is Confiscation.

The Chitty's being call'd in again, the Copy of the said paper (as entred after the Consultation afore referr'd to) was shown to them, & they were ask'd if they had not set their hands thereto, w^{ch}. all (except one or two) positively denied and being Required to sign it afresh, as the necessary security for their good behaviour, & to clear up all suspicion of their intentions to desert they also peremptorily Refused to Comply, & thereupon they were dismiss'd second time.

A Copy of the sd. Paper shown to the Chitty's and ask'd to sign it who actually refus'd.

The Board at length finding them Obstinate thought it proper to come to some determination concerning them, & after having debated the matter very fully, The Presid^t. proposed the suspension of the Hon^{ble}. Comp^s. two Chitty Merch^{ts}. for the following reasons, Viz^t.

That the Comp^s. Chitty Merch^{ts}: be suspended the service for the following reasons.

FIRST, Because they stand accused of having formed a design of deserting this Governm^t. & putting themselves und^r. the protection of the Portugueeze at St. Thoma, whom it appears by the Vice R^{oy} of Goa's letters to them they invited thither for that Purpose, and as the desertion of the Chitty cast (w^{ch}. are commonly Judged to be about half the Inhabitants of this place) would be an undoubted Prejudice to y^o. Hon^{ble}. Comp^s. affairs upon this Coast, the Chittys (who formed that design) are certainly to be esteemed as enemys to their affairs, & guilty of treachery to them.

First in design. to desert this Governm^t.

SECONDLY, That all treachery in Governm^t. tends to the subversion of it.

That Treachery in Governm^t. tends to the subversion of it.

THIRDLY, That they who conspire to subvert & betray a Government are no longer to be trusted in places of Importance to the Governm^t. but are to be suspected as Traytors to it, & treated accordingly.

That Persons of such dispositions ought not to be trusted wth Employ^s. of Import-ance.

M^r. Elwick then offer'd security for the two Chitty Merchants as far as Ten thousand Pag^s. for their Appearance 6 m^o. hence, but being ask'd if he would Sign the Security paper in their behalf aforementioned (w^{ch}. they themselves were demanded to sign) and being also ask'd if he would suffer the penalty w^{ch}. the Chittys must suffer in case their accusation should hereafter be turn'd into a Conviction, he refus'd y^m. both; and being told by some of the Board, that the security w^{ch}. he offer'd was no more than bail for their Appearance Six m^o. hence, & that According to the laws of our Nation all Persons taken up upon suspicion of Treason are forthwth. Imprison'd without bail or mainprize, M^r. Elwicks motion was thereupon Rejected.

Mr. Elwick offers security for the two Chitty Merch^{ts}.

The Presid^t. then proceeded to say That as all the Members of the Board in the Consultation of the 25th. ult^o. have expressly said, they were satisfy'd of the good grounds, w^{ch}. they had to suspect their Guilt, & in suspicion thereof requir'd them forthwith to give security, that is to say, to sign the paper aforementioned, they Viz^t. the Chittys by refusing to give such security, of course increase our suspicion, &

TO THE HON. FRANCIS HASTINGS ESQ^r.

PRESIDENT & GOVERNOUR OF FORT ST. GEORGE & C^a. COUNCIL.

Whereas your Hon^r. & C^a. Council have been pleased to cause a Protest to be delivered to me Thomas Blake Commander of the Ship Craggs Frigate by M^r. Joshua Draper Yo^r. Hon^r. & C^a. Secretary in which protest I the said Thomas Blake am very much Concern'd to find how much your Hon^r. & C^a. have been misinform'd Concerning the state and condition of my Ship Craggs.

Wherefore in answer to your said Protest I the under written Thomas Blake in behalf of all those Honour^{ble}. Gentlemen who are Proprietors and Owners of the said Ship Craggs do crave leave to answer as follows.

FIRST as to myself I utterly deny that I have ever delivered in any paper representing the Craggs Frigate not to be in a Condition to undertake her Voyage and do assert that She is well and sufficiently stored with all Tackle apparell and Furniture properly belonging to a Ship but as to Provisions, although she was fully and Compleatly Victual'd for the number of men appointed by Charter Party to be sent on Board. yet one of the Hon^{ble}. Companys Ships nam'd the Hannover having mett with a misfortune which disabled her direct proceeding on the Voyage, there were thirty men taken out of her and sent on board the Craggs not more than two hours before we sail'd, so that the Compliance with the Hon^{ble}. Companys orders therein has Caused us to Expend 9 months Provisions for feeding and maintaining the said 30 men which we have the utmost Reason to expect shou'd be supply'd to us by a Recruit of wholesome and proper Food in India instead whereof very much to my surprize I am served with a Protest.

In which Protest I am sorry to observe you think IT IS NECESSARY TO TELL ME that obedience to the Hon^{ble}. Companys orders in the last mentioned particular about the thirty Soldiers IS ESTEEM'D TO BE NO PLEA AT ALL, because it is there asserted THAT WE HAD IT IN OUR POWER TO RECRUIT AT S^t. HELENA WHICH IS A GARRISON THAT IS ALWAYS KEPT FULLY STORED FOR THE SUPPLY OF SHIPPING. To the Contrary whereof I do assure your Hon^r. & C^a. that the Garrison of S^t. Helena was not itself supply'd with such Stores as salted Beef and Pork the Last year from England and those they had remaining of their Old stock was reserv'd for their Homeward bound shipping who cannot be otherways supply'd because though that Climate is abundantly cooler than this yet from long Experience it has always been found that the Meat kill'd there cannot be so sufficiently cured and preserv'd there as to keep above a month or six weeks at the very farthest neither can a Ship outward Bound be permitted according to the Hon^{ble}. Companys orders to Continue or stay there Longer than the very time spent in unloading and therefore Consequently cou'd not (though the S^t. Helena Beef were fitt for salting) have time to salt it and Repack it as ought to be done and at Batavia no such thing is to be procur'd but by private hands and that with Difficulty but as I myself was then but little on shoare and had not then the Command of the Ship I cannot take upon me to give so exact account thereof.

However I very well remember that when ashoar at Moco Moco Garrison on the West Coast instead of being assisted there as we ought to have been we were not fully supply'd wth. Buffelo but were often obliged to Victual our people with Europe salted Provisions, M^r. Ballet the Cheif there alledging that neither Beef nor Buffelo to Victual the Ship was to be had and that they had difficulty enough to find fresh meat sufficient for the Hon^{ble}. Companys Servants on shoar.

And on our arrival in this Port of Madrass we have found the Provisions in the manner Represented to Your Hon^r. & C^a. Council in my other paper to which please to be Referr'd.

And whereas Your Hon^r. & C^a. are pleased to mention that on a survey made on the Ship Craggs by Mess^{rs}. Isaac Pyke, Elias Cartwright and David Murray the said Ship did not appear to be in a Condition to enter forthwith upon a Voyage if you please to Reperuse the Report of that Survey you will find the ship to be a new strong Ship and fitt for service and needing nothing to be done to her but what is Required and necessary for all Ships whatever in the Hon. Companys service that

have been fourteen months off the Ground and your Hon^r. will find farther that the Carpenters proffered to make her fully fitt to take in goods for England in 20 days or less in case the weather permitted which I think was so reasonable Especially when the Charter Party always allows 30 days after a Survey that I did not imagine a protest could be grounded thereon therefore cannot but think I have the greater misfortune to be protested against in such a manner when I was so ready so willing and so very desirous to perform the Voyage and as I am most sure I am in no unreadiness but the want of necessary Provisions for the ship in the room of those parted with to the 30 Soldiers in Obedience to the Honourable Companys Express orders.

To prevent myself or Owners of the said Ship Craggs having any Loss or Damage thereby, I do hereby in the name and behalf of the said Owners of the Craggs Frigatt and in my own name and behalf Protest against the Hon^{ble}. United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies for all Consequences that do have may or shall happen to proceed from their putting, the before mentiond 30 Soldiers on Board I do also protest against the Cheif and Council of the Garrison of Moco Moco for not fully supplying the ship with fresh provissions during the time he oblig'd us to Continue there which forced us to expend upon our Europe Salted Provisions I do also Protest against the Mess^{rs}. Isaack Pyke, Elias Cartwright and David Murray in case they after they had Surveyd the ship have reported her unfit to proceed the Voyage being well assured they knew the ship to be a strong good ship and fitt to undertake any Voyage.

And lastly I esteem it my duty so I must ask leave to Protest and do hereby Protest against the Hon^{ble}. Francis Hastings Esq^r. President and Governour of Fort St. George &c^a. and his Council for not supplying me with such wholesome and good Provisions as in obedience to the Honour^{ble}. Companys orders have on their accounts been expended for the aforesaid 30 Soldiers here being a Garrison which I have reason to suppose is fully provyded with all necessary Provisions &c^a. that may be for the Companys Service.

I shall now ans^r. the report of Mess^{rs}. Rich^d. Horden and Thomas Cooke appointed to examine my Acco^{ts}. and I hope to state matter of Fact in so clear a light as to give Yo^r. Hon^r. & C^t. a quite different sence of my managem^t. but I cannot forbear owning the inexpressible concern, I am under to find so heavy a charge on my Charzeter as is contain'd in this report.

In its preamble it is said my Diary is very imperfect, and thereby an incapacity is alledg'd of making any discoveries I can only say in ans^r. to that, that whatever explanation is demanded, I am in the utmost readiness to make it. But that those acco^{ts}. have been allways wrote in that method and have yearly been transmitted to the Hon^{ble}. Company.

As for the remarks made on my May months Acco^t. the Articles w^{ch}. are most particularly excepted against are Raisins, Almonds, and Soy, as for the others, they are char^d. at the same rates wth. those provided for Acco^t. Fort Marlbrô so that they will fall more properly under notice when I come to treat of the Provisions made for that settle^t.

The prime cost of this Commodity is Pag^s. 12½ ₹ Candy they are charg'd at RAISINS. a higher rate, then those in the West Coast Acco^t. the less being so considerable upon their being retailed out in such small quantitys, as a pound or half of a pound.

The different charge of this Commodity proceeds from the same cause.

ALMONDS.

This Article is valued by report only at Pag^s. 1 and 1¼ ₹ Gallon, I say it cost me one Pag^a. and a half ₹ Gallon the same charge has allways been made, and allow'd in all my former Acco^{ts}. w^{ch}. if recourse had been made to those of my Predecessors, will appear, to be under the same charge & I may dare say, the most a stew^d. can make on Soy can be but small, even in the greatest process of time (all disadvantages being consider'd) as the charge of Bottles, Corks, Breakage and the like.

SOY.

I shall now proceed to ans^r. the severall objections given on my Charges on Stores laid in for Acco^t. of the West Coast.

BENGALL RICE, is the first article w^{ch}. the report says was worth but 36 Pag^a. ₹ Garse as tis more then probable but Pegu Rice may be there meant, for sure I am that I gave to Pattachum and Tonda [*a few words lost*] ₹ Garse w^{ch}. was the then harvest price that any of this sort of Rice could be procur'd at as is evid^t. by my engaging in a quantity of above twenty Garse as the same in Comp^y. wth. M^r. Thomas Theobald and this same sort of Rice has ever since continued rising and is now from 43 to 44 Pag^a. ₹ Garse.

FINE RICE 100 Mercaul was bo^t. of Annada Mootamarra Cap^t. Orrils serv^t. to May the 19th. @ Pag^s. 64 ₹ Garse thô the report allows but 55 Pag^s. ₹ Garse.

PADDY 1 Garse was bo^t. of Perra May the 18th. @ Pag^s. 22 · 8. — ₹ Garse thô the report values it @ Pag^s. 19 only.

BENGALL WHEAT 200 Mercaul was bo^t. of Shiver Cunda May the 19th. @ Pag^s. 45 ₹ Garse, w^{ch}. valued by the report only @ 40 Pag^s.

BRAMINY BUTTER 500 Measures bo^t. of Comrapa from 8 to 8½ Measures ₹ Pag^s. thô the report asserts it to be at a constant rate of nine Measures ₹ Pag^s.

KISMASSES were bo^t. last Augst. at Cap^t. Wottons outery at the Sea Gate as ₹ his note dat^d. Sep^r. 1st. 1719 @ Pag^s. 31 ₹ Candy I have sold to several @ Pag^s. 35 ₹ Candy, and am ready to produce a muster of this sort w^{ch}. (I do not noe) will justifie the reasonableness of my Charge.

RAISINS 1 Candy were bo^t. of Nina Chitty May the 19th. @ Pag^s. 12½ ₹ Candy thô the report allows them to be worth but eleven Pag^s. ₹ D^o.

ALMONDS, were bo^t. by ord^r. of Gov^r. Collet last Augst. at Cap^t. Wottons outery at the Sea Gate @ Pag^s. 24 ₹ Candy, as appears by his note dat^d. Sep^r. 1st. 1719 so that the advantage upon this article can be but very inconsiderable and that time must be tho^t. the properest to lay in Persia Stores, especially since the dearness of this Commodity was so extravagant in the preceeding year.

CANDLES NOT COURSE The Wax was bo^t. on the 12th. day of May @ Pag^s. 45 ₹ Candy, so that allowing the loss in its being melted down added to the Cooley hire and other Charges on making Candles the advantage (I hope) will then appear but very small in proportion to what the report speaks.

BENGALL CANDLES, had the price of that Commodity been more narrowly examin'd into, it would have appear'd to have been nearer eighty then sixty Pag^s. & Candy as & M^r. Thomas Bulkley's note dat^d. May the 12th. and now they are not procureable even at eighty, seventy Pag^s. being the prime cost at the Bay.

BATAVIA ARRACK, I know not how to state this Acco^t. better than by appealing to the Hon^{ble}. Presid^t. whether 40 Pag^s. & Leag^s. was not the Prime cost w^{ch}. that additional of Leakage, w^{ch}. amo^{nt}. to at least Pag^s. 2 more & Leag^s. so that I cant but appear to be a very heavy looser of @ least Pag^s. 240 w^{ch}. consideration, I could not but have hoped might have had some weight even tho. I had exceeded the market price, w^{ch}. therefore I begg may be referr'd to M^r. Francis Hugonin, and likewise produce a note sign'd by Lewis Melicque w^{ch}. testifies the same.

As for those Articles of Pickles, Glass ware, Ectra, &c^t. w^{ch}. are only suggested to be amiss, I shall only say that most of them are not provided by me but that I beleive them agreable to the Markt price otherwise I should not have inserted them in this Acco^t.

I have now laid before yo^r. Hon^r. &c^t. a very impartiall state of my proceeding for w^{ch}. I referr to the notes of Paym^t. or rather to the Merch^{ts}. themselves that I cannot but think the advantage must appear very inconsiderable when proportion'd to what the report observes, especially when you will please to reflect on the large sum of above fourteen hund. Pag^s. and the time since it was advanced and I hope I have not been wanting in my duty as to my care and pains in making the Provisions, since some sort of the stores lay'd me under some difficultys to procure them I say I hope these considera. will influence Yo^r. Hon^r. &c^t. to entertain a more favourable Opinion of me, that I have studied the Interest of my Masters as far as reason and Justice to my self permitt, and have in every respect acted as becomes

I had Charg'd the Company so much money by setting fire to it & going away to the Dutch at Pedang appealing for the truth thereof to a letter transmitted hither by Mr. George Willy late of Councill there; upon perusal of that Letter I find much the same accusation and am very well pleas'd to find also its author w^{CH}. is Mr. Lewis Deane so that by Mr. Pyke's reference to Mr. Willy and Mr. Willy's appeal to Mr. Deane I have at length trac'd out the author of this Accusation; In order then to prove that Mr. Deny's to have laid any such thing to my charge beg leave to recite a part of a Consultation held at Moco Moco the 5TH. March Last relating to that particular w^{CH}. is as follows:—

And Whereas Mr. Geo^R. Willy still persists Mr. Deane did tell him in Sept^R. last that the Cheif Councill & C^A. Civil power were all agreed to sett fire to the Paggar and go to the Dutch at Padang, Mr. "Deane in Vindicat. of the Cheifs reputation make "Oath that he never made any Such Proposals, but on the Contrary says he has "often heard him declare to maintain the Companys Factory whilst his mony lasted "and provisions were procurable and for further security find out a Peon at his own "cost in order to be sent to Pedang for supplys and did write a Letter to the Gov^R. "and Councill there which Mr. Deane was to have been bearer of but he was "unfortunately cast away at Manduta Barr and the Prow stav'd, better that this "examinat^N. was made into at the first repealing but nothing of fact could be "prov'd.

I hope this recital will be sufficient to clear my Innocence in the perticular to which it relates.

I shall now proceed to the next article which is reflecting on the Government of Fort St. George and how this can ever be imagin'd agST. me I can't conceive after they had conferrd upon me the Cheifship of the Hon^{BLE}. Companys affairs on that side preferable to Mr. Pyke himself.

As to the Confining Cap^T. Wynn he himself has declar'd to the contrary in his Letter to his Officer which Mr. Pyke did not think fit to take notice of in his diary.

As to the firing two guns at M^r. Pykes boat it was only to bring 'em too having occasion to talk further wth. him before he went on board and that is the usual signal in such cases.

As to my being interrested wth. the Councill in purchas^e. M^r. Pykes things I intirely deny it but am apt to beleive M^r. Pykes attornys may not have dealt so well by him as he expected and he is willing to lay the blame on somebody.

As to my having defrauded the Comp^a. in the Buildings at Moco Moco It is a false and malicious aspersion and how M^r. Pyke could be a judge by staying there so little a while without the inspection of the acco^{ts}. or any thing else that could give him any light into that perticular I can't comprehend, He says they cost the Comp^a. 27000 dollars I herewth. deliver your Hon^r. &c^a. an acco^t. of their cost wth. a draught w^{ch}. amounts to Dollars 15000 to the last of April 1719 and ab^t. 2000 dollars since were spent in additional buildings, so that in this perticular M^r. Pyke has falsely accus'd me in no less than 10,000 dollars.

There are several other perticulars here and there in M^r. Pykes diary w^{ch}. I have not perticulariz'd in this paper for fear of being too tedious and troublesome to your Hon^r. &c^a. and they are glanc'd me under the word they mean y^t. I suppose myself and Councill, whom he terms myself and my accomplices.

I hope Your Hon^r. &c^a. by what I have here said and what I can offer further will fully be convinc'd of my innocence in every perticular wth. w^{ch}. I am (I think) unjustly charg'd and If so I humbly desire I may have such satisfaction made me by Mess^{rs}. Pyke & Willy as your Hon^r. &c^a. shall think a just reparation for all the damages I might possibly have sustain'd by the loss of my Charactor, the distruction of which tis evident M^r. Pyke has aim'd at, I think myself happy in having Yo. Hon^r. &c^a. for my Judges in these affairs being satisfyd of your impartiality and whatever you determine concern^e. them will be a full satisfaction to him who is wth. all possible Respect.

Horden & Cooke deliver into the Board their observations upon the Stewards reply to their examinations of his acco^t. the said paper being read was order'd to be enter'd after this Consultation and M^r. Drake Steward was call'd in who appearing before the board was ask'd what further he had to offer on that occasion. He endeavour'd to excuse himself by pleading that he had been oblig'd to Issue out his own money for provission of dieting stores for the Companys use and that he thought some allowance might reasonably be made him for the Interest of his money and for Losses w^{ch}. he might sustain by Waste.

M^r. Cooke the Paymaster then assur'd the board that he never refus'd to advance the Steward money when he came to demand it, M^r. Drake then urg'd that the exorbitant charges in his acco^t. (as we term'd it) were but agreeable to what his Predecessors had made and such as himself had also made during the whole time he had acted in the Stewards Employ. Mess^{rs}. Horden & Cooke according to promise in their paper before mentiond then made a recapitulation of all the Facts charg'd by them upon the Steward in their report of their examination of his acco^t. and it appear'd thereby that the Steward had Charg'd from 50, 60, & 70 to 100 ^{pp} Cent upon most of the articles by him provided w^{ch}. we beleive Our Hon^{ble}. Masters will think a very extravagant Int^t. for less than a months use of money and It is to be noted that the reason of the Stewards being that time out of money was the Paymaster's having an Order from the President not to pay the Stewards bill for, the West Coast provisions because that bill was then under examination and he did not know but that the board might think fit to order such a deduction to be made out of the said bill as should be judgd equivalent to the exorbitancy of the several Charges and a suff^t. satisfaction for the same.

Thomas Cooke to have been at the West Coast and that is doubtless the reason why he was nam'd in the afores'd. Commission And as It has been always accustomary for any member of this board sent from hence to that place to preserve his title nevertheless to this Station at this board, Our Hon^{ble}. By the Vice Roy of Goa's Letter to the President it appears, that he's willing to conceal as much as possible the Chittys, and his own design, By his principal Ministers Letter to the President it appears, that he has also endeavour'd to stifle the matter By writing in dark, and obscure terms, and both these Letters seem to have been contriv'd and drawn up together, for fear of contradicting each other in so nice an affair, as the endeavour^s. to wipe off the impressions we had rec^d. of the Chittys and their treachery to this Government: But we cannot at all think ourselves oblig'd to regard the purport of those two Letters, because it can't be suppos'd, that the Vice Roy of Goa & his Prime Minister, would be engag'd in a Combination wth. the Inhabitants of this place to prosecute a design, w^{ch}. might tend to the destruction of it, and then make an ingenuous confession of their whole proceeding; The Vice Roy of Goa's Letter to Mons^r. St. Hillair (between whom there has been a very great Intimacy) is the Letter then to be regarded in this case; For tis very reasonable to suppose that the Vice Roy might communicate the real matter of Fact to his intimate Friend, and at the same time be cautious of making such a Confession to the Govrn^r. of a place whose Government he had endeavour'd to subvert for fear of bringing himself in trouble, and Disgrace; The Purport of the said Letter being very strictly examin'd into, The following expression was remark'd. The Letter w^{ch}. he (meaning Francisco Perrera Boury) "brôt me; wth. the procuration of the "Chittys of Maddrass, as well as the Attestation of a religious Augustine (who "without doubt has abundance of Merrit) have brought me into a Labyrinth" By this Letter (which is what we are to depend upon) it appears, that the Chittys did send a procuration, or Letter of Attorney to the Vice Roy of Goa, in order to c[arry on] Criminal Correspondence wth. him as in former Consultations was s^d. to have been Charg'd upon them.

But receiving a blow or two more from them, he gave them one fanam then another and afterwards a third, upon continuing their usuage to him and repeating their demands, he threw down his purse and bid them look if there was any more. Then the Prisoler Righting told him If he had no more than three fanams he would give him more. If he would go with him to the Gov^rs. Garden, but instead of carrying him thither, they led him to another Garden near the Choultry where he afterwards heard him cry out, The Dubash further deposes that when he would have follow'd them they shoved him and bid him be gone, and as he was going away he saw Righting take the Club from Grott. After this they went to town and a soldier by name Clark (whose house they were in ask'd them how came they so bloody who said they had been fighting. The Dubash afterwards went to look for a Matt to sleep on saw Righting look over some silver things, and upon demand[ing] leave to go home he deny'd him, Clark again ask'd them how came they so bloody who replyd as before that they had been Fighting.

And Your Petitioner further sheweth that since his arrivall to this Coast from Manilha he hath been very unjustly prosecuted for several debts he formerly contracted at New Spain and that place th^o the said Debts are not due nor the Demands Lawfull Your Petitioner (as he can prove well) having lost all his Effects in a boat sending them on board a Galleon w^{ch}. Lay sixty Leagues distance from the Harbour of Manilha Whereby Your Petition^r. was so far reduc'd that (he can also prove) he brot. with him to this Coast not above the Value of One hundred Dollars.

And Your Petitioner further sheweth that several Letigious Persons Armenians & C^s. have & do make it their Business for a small matter to buy up his Papers and Obligations at Manilha & C^s. places in order to prosecute him for the whole amount of such obligations under the Moors Government as they did last Year Wherefore Your Petitioner humbly Prays Yo^r. Hon^r. that no such papers may be valued or admitted in Action against Your Petitioner especially considering that severall Persons who had the Misfortune to meet wth. such losses as Your Petitioner in Manilha are not troubled as Your Petitioner hath been in these parts, Your Petitioner Prays Your Hon^rs. & C^s. favour and protection and shall as In Duty bound

The Presid^t. acquaints the Board that he has call'd this Cons. on extraordinary Occasion that is to lay before them a declaration of the repeat^d. affronts he has rec'd from M^r. Elwick as also his incapacity for the Comp^t. business.

Mr. Elwick ord^d. to with draw.

The Presid^t. Declarati. maturly consider'd and most of the Members Agreed to the truth of the several Articles alludg'd ag^t. him.

The Facts to prove his incapacity was then consider'd, wherenpon Mr. Draper delivers in a paper (as enterd after this Cons.)

The Presid^t. resolution to sitt no longer at the board if Mr. Elwick continu'd.

References had to the Comp^t. Letters to find out an Instance of the like nature, but no were to be found. The Presid^t. desires y^e. Opinions of the board whither Mr. Elwick had not incurrd suspension.

The President acq^{ts}. the board that he has call'd this Consultation on a very extraordinary occasion in ord^r. to lay before us a declaration concerning the Repeated affronts that he had receiv'd from M^r. Nathaniel Elwick a member of this board and also his Incapacity for the service of the Hon^{ble}. Company. The said Declaration being read before the board (as enter'd after this Consultation) and Duly Consider'd M^r. Elwick was ORDERD to withdraw In pursuance of the Hon^{ble}. Companys orders that no memb^r. of the board should Continue sitting while such cases relat^d. to himself were examining.

M^r. Elwick being withdrawn the Presidents Declaration was more maturely consider'd and most of the Members of the board AGREED that one or other of them was assur'd of the truths of all the Facts Charg'd on M^r. Elwick by the President in relation to his behaviour at this board as well as in the Place.

The Facts alludg'd to prove his Incapacity were then Consider'd and thereupon M^r. Draper deliver'd in a report (as enterd after this Consultation) was read and observ'd to prove one Article of M^r. Elwicks remissness. All the other Instances of his Negligence were well enuff known to most of the Members of the board & therefore did require no further Proof.

The Latter Clause of the Presidents Declaration was then Consider'd wherein he pleas'd to publish his full resolutⁿ. to sitt no longer as President at this board If M^r. Elwick should continue a Member of it.

Upon recourse to the Hon^{ble}. Companys Lett^{rs}. in order to find out some directions in such out of the way cases, no such appear'd and therefore We judg'd it a Case of an Extraordinary nature, We observ'd however y^e. suspension (in severall parag^{hs}.) is made a Penalty of a refractory disorderly behaviour as well of Negligence & remissness in business. And apart of the 4th. Clause of the 109th. parr^h. of the Letter by the Duke of Cambridge referring thereto; The President desir'd the Opinion of the board If M^r. Elwick has not incurrd the Penalty of Suspension.

The Matter being debated for some time The Board thought fit to come to the following agreement.

The matter for some time debated.

That as M^r. Elwick on acco^t. of his refractory, disorderly & Insolent behaviour to the President has most Justly incurr'd the Penalty Order'd by Our Hon^{ble}. Masters to be Inflicted in such cases as well as on acco^t. of his negligence & remissness in his business (w^{ch}. penalty is no less than suspension) and as the Hon^{ble}. President has been pleas'd to put the matter upon so important an Issue as to declare to us all that he will not sit any longer as President; If M^r. Elwick is continued at this board, We think ourselves under a necessity of suspending [Mr. Elwick who has been guilty of remissness in his Business as well as of indecent behaviour to the President and to the rest of the board rather than to part] wth. the President who has so long suffered M^r. Elwicks Insolence & pass'd by his Remissness as well as behav'd himself to us all, wth. the Greatest Candour, Mildness, & decency Imaginable. It is therefore

The Members of the board think themselves oblig'd to suspend Mr. Elwick upon y^e. result of the Presid^t. in asserting in a most positive manner y^t. if Mr. Elwick continued at the board, to sitt no longer as Presid^t.

AGREED & RESOLV'D that M^r. Nathaniel Elwick be suspended forthwith from the Hon^{ble}. Companys Service (*Officio et beneficio*) till the Hon^{ble}. Comp^{as}. Pleasure can be known concerning him.

Companys orders did not allow of a sufficient Latitude for so doing Altho they could not but Confess that he had not behav'd himself to the President so respectfully as he ought to have done.

The Purport of M^r. Drapers rep^t. ment^d. in the foregoing p^t. of this Consult^a. being agrd. Considerd ORDⁿ. that the Secretary do collect in the debt w^{ch}. has been so long due from the Old Farmers of the measuring Duty amo^{ts}. to Pag^s. 170 : 30 & pay the same into Cash.

The purport of M^r. Drapers report considered ORDⁿ'd the Sec^r. collect the debts due fro^m the old measuring Farmers amounts. to Pag^s. 170 : 30.

A DECLARATION made by Francis Hastings Esq^r. Presid^t. to rest of the Council in Consultation the 8th. day of August 1720.

GENTLEMEN,

As you must all be (doubtless) sensible that the design of our Constant assemblies here is to Consult wth. each other about such measures as are most proper for advancing the Interest of our Hon^{ble}. Employers You must likewise be sensible that nothing can contribute so much to the enabling us to think and to act What is most for the advancement of their Interest as to think and to act wth. Mildness Calmness and Moderation and in order to this a decent modest behaviour and a becoming difference and respect to myself as President and to each other (which will always preserve Decorum) are of absolute necessity.

But instead of meeting wth. such a behaviour from the Person who has been some time next to myself at the board and who ought to have shown a good example to others I have ever since my accession to this Chair been affronted abus'd & insulted and Maltreated by him, I mean M^r. Nathaniel Elwick, You must all be sensible wth. what arrogance he has behav'd himself at this board to myself in particular and of my long forbearance to resent it w^{ch}. has made him more and more Insolent till at length he is become insufferable and this I shall now make appear.

In Consultation the 19th. Ultimo I thought myself oblig'd in Justice to my Hon^{ble}. Masters to represent to you his negligence and remissness in the Warehouse that they might thereby have an opportunity of seeing how little he had deserv'd the very great favours they had conferred on him and how much they were mistaken in the Qualificatⁿ. of the man M^r. Elwick being enrag'd at it did by way of revenge against me for that representation immediately tell the board that it would draw strange storys on the stage and that the Consequence must take its Course. You may remember Gentlemen I return'd no answer to that menace but order'd what he had said to be minuted *verbatim* at his desire. It is now three Weeks since that Consultation was held sevⁿ. others have been held in the *Interim* and M^r. Elwick has not once offer'd to explain himself on that Occasion so that the reflection remains upon my character without any satisfaction being made me for the reproach.

In the Paper of Desent w^{ch}. M^r. Elwick del^d. in agst. Mess^{rs}. Draper & Wright enterd after the Consultatⁿ. of the 14th. ultimo he has taken a very unbecoming Liberty wth. my Character He tells the board therein very plainly that I speak what I do not think and that when I am sure of the Point I put things to the Vote. These Reflections I have hitherto pass'd by In hopes he would soon have been Sensible of his Errors But I am now sorry to find those hopes turn'd into despair.

—FORT ST. GEORGE, AUGUST 1720—

Upon the Dismission of M^r. George Torriano from the Hon^{ble}. Companys service the last Consultatⁿ. (in pursuance of a possitive order that none such should be continued) M^r. Elwick being much enrag'd (for no other apparent reason than that of M^r. Torriano's being a Serv^t. to him in a private Capacity) Sawcily ask'd me as I was ris^g. from Consultation when I would proceed in the affair of the Chittys who had been very ill us'd, repeating their ill usage to me twice or thrice after the Consultation was broke up He also urg'd before I could reply that they had been unjustly confin'd a long time and deny'd the necessarys of Life, He was no sooner gone but I sent for the Choultry Dubash who has the Principal care of those Prisons where the Chittys are confin'd and ask'd him in the Presence of Mess^{rs}. Draper & Wright concerning their treatment, He replyd that they wanted for no manner of Sustenance and that they were at that time in as good health as ever they had been, The Choultry Dubash and others who have the care of that Prison will no doubt declare the same before this board and as for their Imprisonment It is by order of this board for Criminal Correspondencys agreed & sign'd to by M^r. Elwick himself and therefore his Scandalous, False & Mallicious Aspersion is not only an Obloquy thrown upon myself Bnt upon all the Members of this board since they all Consented and sign'd to their Imprisonment for the reason before Given.

Thus Gentlemen I have laid before you the particulars of M^r. Elwicks Insolent Behaviour towards myself as well as towards the several Members of this board. I shall now proceed to represent to you his General behaviour Since my accession to this Government. Most of you must needs be acquainted how Industrious (It is said) he has been in perswading both the English and Native Inhabit^{ts}. of this place into a Motion that the Company would appoint him to this Government and Displace myself; The consequences of this have been frequent Caballs Irregular Assemblys and Degrees of Conspiracy to bring over the People to affront my Person and the dignity of my Post, being prompted by a Notion that it was their private Interest to disperse myself thô then Governour In hopes my Government would not be of long Continuance, some of you Gentlemen must needs be well acquainted with what I have often told you that what I apprehended from those practices was little less than Mutiny several Corruptions having been endeavour'd where they were most likely to take effect and some were too likely to have succeeded.

Having thus given you an acco^t. of M^r. Elwicks behaviour I shall now lay before you some parts of the Hon^{ble}. Companys orders w^{ch}. I think will prove the unwarrantableness thereof, In Page 57 of the book of Standing orders now lying before the board you will find this Parrag^h. applicable to the Present subject,

“When any of our Council differ in Opinion from the President let their objections be made in such a decent manner as is due to the Person whom we have entrusted wth. the Cheif authority of that place, before whom we will always have the Ensings of that authority born.”

In the latter Clause of the 109th. Parrag^h. of the Hon^{ble}. Court of Directors Letter by the Duke of Cambridge lately receiv'd they are pleas'd to enjoyn all the members of this board to behave themselves in a modest and respectfull manner & whether M^r. Elwick has behav'd himself to me in such a manner and Whether a behaviour contrary to what is before Order'd by our Hon^{ble}. Masters is not breach of their Orders I desire you to declare.

As for M^r. Elwicks Refractory, disorderly, wayward, factious, seditious, turbulent and arrogant behaviour You'l find the Companys sentiments on such occasions interspers'd among their several Letters.

GENTLEMEN

I have now laid before you an acco^t. of M^r. Elwicks Ill behaviour I have given you a specimen of the Hon^{ble}. Companys Orders in relation to such a behaviour and make a reference to you for your Opinions thereupon, I shall now give you three Instances that M^r. Elwick is no more fit for the Station he has born and that w^{ch}. he now bears on acco^t. of his Quallifications than he is on acco^t. of his demeanour.

—FORT ST. GEORGE, AUGUST 1720—

In January last before Mr. Collets depart. Mr. Elwick in order to magnify his Performances in y^e. Warehouse assur'd him that there were 1200 Bales on hand w^{ch}. would be sufficient to fill up the Dawson on her arrival here without sending her to Fort S^t. David and thus the Comp^a. were advis'd in the 5th. Parragⁿ. of our Letter to them by the K^t. William in January last when Mr. Collet was departed and the Dawsons arrivd I began to examine into the Number of bales that were ready to put on board her and I found Mr. Elwick had been Guilty of a strange misrepresentation The number of Bales fell so very far short of what he had assur'd the board there were on hand that we were oblig'd to send the ship to fill up at Fort S^t. David w^{ch}. Occasiond a very great Loss of time and much eudanger'd her pass^a. It being so late as the 22^d. of February last before she saild from thence for England.

In Consultation the 19th. ultimo (You know) I represented to you Mr. Elwicks remissness in the Warehouse in not having sorted any Cloth since the Dawsons departure thô out of a perverse Obstinate temper when the Chitty Merchants were under confinement he demanded their releasement in order (as he said) to go and sort some Cloth, One of the Members of this board did in that very Consult^a. declare that Colloway Chittee was under Confinement at the time of his being One of the Hon^{ble}. Companys Merch^{ts}. and that nevertheless the Cloth was duly brôt. in & sorted w^{ch}. is sufficient to prove that there is no necessity for the Merchants being present during the time of sorting and Consequently proves that Mr. Elwicks excuse for not sorting on acco^t. of the Merchants confinement is only a weak & groundless pretence for Idleness w^{ch}. is sufficient to convince you of his remissness in the Warehouse business.

I shall next endeavour to convince you of his Negligence in his place of Accomptant, The Gomasters of the R^t. Hand Merchants at Fort S^t. David have pressd me from time to time for payment of the Bal^a. of their account for the month of May last amounting to several thousand Pagodas, that Acco^t. was deliver'd to Mr. Elwick the Accomptant the next Consultation after it was rec^d. in order to be examin'd and the reason of Its not being yet paid arises from Mr. Elwicks not having reported that Acco^t. to be right and this may give the Merchants a handle to accuse us of not being Punctual in our Payments w^{ch}. may possibly prove a discredit to the Hon^{ble}. Company and Consequently a very great prejudice to their affairs.

In Mr. Drapers report to this Board herewth. deliver'd you, You will find he observ'd in the time of his Secretaryship that Mr. Elwick had Omitted to lay before you the Purport of what he himself has now represented to you and deferr'd acquainting you therewth. for some time, But beleiving it to no purpose to wait any longer he thought it better to Interpose in an affair w^{ch}. did not properly fall within his own employment than to sit still and see the Hon^{ble}. Comp^a. suffer by not having their Debts duely Collected in.

I shall now comprize the whole of what I have said in a very few words and then referr the matter to your Consideration, I think in my Conscience that Mr. Elwick is not fit to remain at this board on acco^t. of his Insolent behav^r. at it, and also on acco^t. of his Incapacity and Negligence, and therefore I now declare to you all that I am fully resolv'd not to sit any Longer as President, If he is Continued a Member of it, To w^{ch}. Declaration I have set my hand in Fort S^t. George this 8th. day of August 1720.

Hon^r. therewth. although it does not fall within the business of my own perticular Employ^{mt}.

In consideration of the great supplys of silver the French have rec^d. at Pondicherry I am of Opinion that the Price of Silver wont be more than 15 dollars tho' their Merchants have been paid in silver at $7\frac{1}{2}$ ₹ Seer when the Market price at Arcot was $14\frac{13}{16}$ ₹ 10 pagodas so that besides the risque and Charge of Carriage they must lose $2\frac{3}{16}$ ₹ Cent.

The whole of what I receiv'd during the two years of my being Paymaster being but inconsiderable to the 10 & C^t. Mr. Frederick charges me wth. The particulars of w^{ch}. If occasion requires I am ready to attest upon oath, This I could not think wronging the

Company nor any ways unreasonable for the hazard I run of my mony wth. people whom the Company never would allow to be trusted wth. theirs and was well assur'd from the Persons under me that a Tasharif Present had been Customary to my Predecessors on the like occasions Amongst wth. M^r. Frederick was one who rec^d. the same more or less as your Hon^r. &c^a. may be satisfy'd If you'l please to examine the Conicoplys and servants that were under him When Paymaster.

Notwithstanding these accusations against me and thereupon the strictest methods and Rules laid down by the Gov^r. and Council to my successors Pray let it be observ'd that they have not been better nor cheaper serv'd since and I dare presume to say they never will.

As to the Chinam and the Damage the Comp^a. imagine they have sustain'd thereby I referr your Hon^r. &c^a. to M^r. Ways report of the inner Fort buildings herewth. deliverd you wth. will plainly make appear that I am wrongfully charg'd and that the Company have been gainers by the damages made good to 'em by the Conicoply and Dubash who paid into their Cash on that acco^t. Pag^a. 875 whereas the difference was at first Computed to be but 625 out of wth. I think some allow^a. might have been made for its waste in Quantity and Quality for the time it had been laid in store for wth. a paymaster can be noways answerable.

Before I conclude I must take the Liberty to object against M^r. Fredericks evidence the Conicoply Condapah who he affirms to have spoke English perfectly well wth. I am sure all that are at this board who can remember him must know it to be false, He was a vile rouge and well deserv'd the just Punishm^t. Inflicted on himself w^t. did really only save the hangman the labour, Whatever fraud has been committed in this article of Chinam, he must have been the Person guilty of it, for t'was him that paid all the poor people for the Chinam brôt into the Town (except what I advanced myself to the Country People) his aim and design was to be made Cheif Conicoply under the Paymaster On wth. acco^t. I was offer'd before I was out of the employ not less than Pagodas 400, but knowing how great a rogue he was I scorn'd to accept it, seing he had faild in his project and know^s. there had been some differences between me and M^r. Frederick in all probability he asserted these falsitys to him think^s. by that means to ingratiate himself into his favour thereby to gain his ends of being made Cheif Conicoply. This is all I have to offer relating to the Chinam and am altogether Ignorant of any abuses therein by the Conicoply Durmiah or my Dubash Juggana who have already sufficiently paid for what damage the Company have sustaind thereby.

That I may not trouble your Hon^r. with a separate Paper I shall herein desire you will please to referr to the Hon^{ble}. Companys consideration the 100. they are please to order me to refund for provisions 1^d. in by the Steward for my passage to the West Coast and hope they will consider that the Provisions were not laid in for me alone, Besides myself there was M^r. Hubbard second of Council two soldiers & both our serv^{ts}. that tooke their pass^a. on the same Brigantine for whom the provisions were design'd as well as myself, what Liquors were left was carr^d. ashore and expended at their table wth. was y^e. greatest part of what we had to drink some months after our arrival, and as I beleive the Comp^a. will have no reason to find fault wth. my management before our misfortunes, I hope they will please to order the payment of 100 pounds due to me for Gratuity sallary for one years service as Suprvisor and Dep^{ty}. Gov^r. of the West Coast besides some allowances I did expect they would have made me monthly for my Private table after the Generall table was laid aside, wth. put me to the Charge of upwards of 300 ^{Doll} mens. I shall be oblig'd to your Hon^r. &c^a. If you'l please to incert this in your Generall Letter to them by the Godfrey & am.

About 7 years since Tilla Chitty borrow'd of Moota [Marr] Chitty at 4 sev^l. times pag^s. 800 & gave 4 bonds Viz^t. one for [...] d^o. 250, d^o. 150, d^o. 100 some time after he borrowd more 200 for w^{ch}. he gave Moota Mar for his Security A small Bag of Jewells, some time aft^r. Moota Marr hear^e. that Tilla Chitty had a Quantity of Rice & Grain ab^t. 23½ Garse dem^{ded}. his mony. The s^d. Tilla Chitty find^e. y^e. price of grain fall as he could not get prime cost for it des^d. Moota Mar to have [pati]ence for a small time & he wo^d. pay him Upon w^{ch}. Moota Marr Request^d. y^t. y^e. grain might be put in his possession for his bett^r. security. Accordingly by a writ^e. y^e. said Tilla [Chitty] makes ov^r. y^e. s^d. grain upon Moota Marrs promis^e. him to have y^e. 4 % of sell^e. it pay^e. him his princip^l. & Int^t. might enjoy the [. . .] So Tilla Chitty keeps y^e. key of the Godown & Moota Mar pa[ys] his Crop on y^e. door wth. a promise y^t. he would not trouble [y^e.] s^d. Tilla Chitty till he co^d. sell his goods for advantage.

But Contrary to his promise in the begin^e. of Gov^r. Collets time y^e. s^d. Moota Marr dem^{ded}. his mony again w^{ch}. yⁿ. oblig^d. s^d. Tilla Chitty to think of sell^e. s^d. rice and Grain & replied y^t. his partner was at Palliacat y^t. he wo^d. go & talk wth. him & at his return would sell y^e. s^d. grain & discharge his bonds to w^{ch}. Moota Mar seem'd very well satisfied. Accordingly s^d. Tilla Chitty put his Chests & Escrutores in one room wth. the keys of his house wherein was some rice & other Effects & c^a. leav^e. one room only to his Aunt who look'd aft^r. his house.

But as soon as Tilla Chitty was gone for Palliacat Moorta Mar came to Tillys house & brake open y^e. doors of y^e. rooms where his Chest & Escrutores were & find^e. y^e. keys open y^e. S^d. Chests & Escrutores wherein were sev^l. Respond^e bonds to y^e. amo^t. of 800 pag^s. Viz^t. to Pegu 100, to Arakan 100 to Manilha 600 besides y^e. abund^{oo}. of other things as rice afores^d. & c^a. w^{ch}. wⁿ. Tilla Chittys Aunt perc^d. she

ran & call'd Pond^{ry}. Noche Narrⁿ. to witness y^o. base villany done by Moota Marr Chitty to her Nephew but aft^r. his ransack^s. y^o. house she went directly to Palliacat to acq^t. her Nephew of Moorta Mar his plunder^s. or rifling his house in his abs^{ce}. upon w^{ch}. Tilla Chitty consider^s. how he might redress himself but know^s. Moota Mar to be a rich man & in fav^r. wth. y^o. Gov^r. was af^d. to return to Madrass.

Soon after w^{ch}. it hap^d. to prove a year of Famine & y^o. rice afores^d. sold at y^o. yⁿ. Common price would have am^{ted}. to near 2000 pagodas That Moota Marr hav^s. rifled y^o. house as afores^d. took wth. him y^o. key of the godoⁿ. wherein y^o. s^d. rice & c^a. were con^{td}. without any legal powers so to do & some time after one Carpa Chitty a relatⁿ. of the said Tilla Chitty came to Madrass to see y^o. place the said Moota Mar hear^s. thereof seiz'd on y^o. s^d. Carpa Chitty (tho no ways concern'd in y^o. s^d. affair) & would have oblig'd him to have paid the s^d. debt of 800 pag^a. To w^{ch}. the s^d. Carpa Chitty answer'd y^t. as his kinsman had given security he had no man^r. of concern in y^t. affair notwth. stand^s. y^o. Innocency of y^o. s^d. Carpa Chitty y^o. s^d. Moota Marr Chitty confin'd him y^o. s^d. Carpa Chitty in a godown of his own without any legal pow^r. so to do by y^o. w^{ch}. severity after two or 3 days confinem^t. and almost starv'd wth. hunger the s^d. Moota Marr Chitty forc'd the s^d. Carpa Chitty to mortgage y^o. s^d. Tilla Chittys house for 400 pag^a. w^{ch}. he had no mann^r. of right to do & to make it app^r. y^o. more legal (by some means or other) got it registered in the Mayors Court.

That ab^t. two years aft^r. y^o. s^d. Tilla Chitty wrote a priv^{te}. Letter to Modram Chitty to beg his assist^a. in y^o. righting him in this p^o. of Injustice upon w^{ch}. the said Modram Chitty ans^d. him y^t. if he would come to town he need not fear being molested for he had Int^t. enuff to prev^t. y^t. & upon y^o. s^d. Tilla Chittys coming to town The s^d. Modram Chitty promis'd to assist him by Petition^s. the Gov^r. and Council.

Moota Marr hear^s. hereof sent to Modram Chitte and desir'd he would desist from acquaint^s. The Gov^r. & c^a. for he would referr y^o. matter to him & he would stand to his arbitration to w^{ch}. Modram Chitte ans^d. how could he be an Arbitrator in an affair wherein you have been guilty of house break^s. and dispos^s. of the Effects of a poor man wth.out any legal Authority so to do and that to the value of near 3000 pagodas, to w^{ch}. was returned ans^r. from Moota Mar Chitty that he had not done y^o. s^d. Tilla Chitty much damage therefore desir'd y^t. he might be so far favour'd by Moodram Chittee as y^t. he would espouse y^o. Cause and make y^o. matter up between the said Tilla Chitty and Moota Mar.

Upon w^{ch}. reply Moodram Chitty sent for Tilly Chittee and ask'd him w^t. he would have him to do in this affair To w^{ch}. s^d. Tilla Chitty ans^d. since I am a poor man and have been so long out of the place & in no mann^r. of trade or business do w^t. you will so I have but somew^t. of my Effects again That thereupon Moodram Chitty took upon him to be Umpire but never could get Moota Mar Chitty to a meeting but always delay'd & put it off from time to time till such time y^t. Gov^r. Collet had made a new Cont^t. wth. y^o. Merch^{ts}. & had given Moota Mar Chitty a fine pallankeen Upon w^{ch}. find^s. himself so much in y^o. fav^r. of Gov^r. Collet instead of mak^s. restitutⁿ. to Tilla Chitty threaten'd. to have him put in prison w^{ch}. oblig'd y^o. s^d. Tilla Chetty to return to S^t. Thoma for sanctuary. Ab^t. a month since the s^d. The other bond for pag^s. nine and three quarters is not to be found Whether it be conceal'd designedly or not by any of the partys Concern'd we know not but several of the Arbitrators Namely Ponnagette Narso, Arreapa and Surah Vinketash who acknowledge to have Seen it do allow it to be invalid and that it was not allow'd to be in Force by the rest of the Arbitrators.

In compliance wth. your order of last Consultation I have made a strict inquiry into the affair depending between Major John Roach and the trustees to the Estate of Cap^t. Freak Godwin dec^d. w^{ch}. I now lay before Your Hon^r. & C^A. in the following remonstrance.

About the month of May in the year 1715 Major Roach deliver'd to Cap^t. Freak Godwin a parcel of Rubies and Emeralds to the amount of 220 pagodas consign'd to said Cap^t. Godwin and M^r. Elisha Ellil at Bencoolen wth. orders in case they could not be dispos'd of within the time that he the s^d. Cap^t. Godwin should continue there they should be deposited in the hands of M^r. Collet then Dep^y. Gov^r. there to be sold by him and M^r. Elisha Ellil as opportunity should offer, But Contrary to those orders Cap^t. Godwin carry'd the said Rubies and Emeralds to Batavia and left them in the hands of M^r. Peter Mandet a Dutch Merchant of that place, but upon whose risque or for whose acco^t. the said Mandet was to dispose of those goods the note from under his hand doth not Express.

On the 27th. day of August 1716 Cap^t. Godwin arriv'd here from the West Coast and Batavia and being at the Majors one day he drew out of his pocket the afores^d. Peter Mandets rec^t. for the Rubies and Emeralds left in his hands the Major thereupon expostulated with him and ask'd him why he carry'd his goods with him to Batavia contrary to express order and left them in the hands of a person altogether unknown to him Cap^t. Godwin reply'd that he had intrusted M^r. Mandet wth. a very considerable value of his own and that he was a very responsible man Whereupon the Major told him that he had not so much as heard of his name before, and that he himself was the person from whom he expected his Goods Cap^t. Godwin at that time walk^g. to and fro in the Majors Room immediately stop'd and tak^g. him by the hand promis'd him (as being an old acquaintance and unwilling to enter into disputes of Law or the Like) that as Gov^r. Collet would in a short time send him back to Batavia he would certainly bring the Goods or their amount in Sugar freight and Commission free, The Major being satisfy'd wth. that assurance took a Copy of the aforesaid Peter Mandet's note wth. a design only (to prove his Claim on Cap^t. Godwins Estate in case of an accident and to the truth of this relation The Major offers to take his Oath.

About the month of August 1716 Cap^t. Godwin went for Bengall (wth. an intent as he and every body else thought to enter upon his West Coast Voy^g.) and from there he wrote the Major a Letter wherein he made a repetition of the afores^d. promise (as the Major himself affirm[s]) But that Letter is by accident mislaid or lost However Contrary to every ones expectation Cap^t. Godwins Voyage was alter'd and he was sent from thence to Surat as Command^r. of the Sampson and arr^d. here the 12th. June 1717 he then went down to the Bay in ship Falconbridge & from thence proceeded to the West Coast the beginning of January 17¹⁷/₁₈ and that Cap^t. Godwin might not forget his promise the Major wrote him a Letter directed to him at the West Coast in order for to meet him there w^{ch}. Letter is dated Sep^r. 27th. 1717 and this may serve to strengthen and Confirm the Major's assertion that such a promise was actually made him the very express words of that Promise being incerted in that Letter.

—FORT ST. GEORGE, DECEMBER 1720—

On the 23^d. January 17th Cap^t. Godwin return'd hither from the West Coast but the Major was then absent having taken his pass^s. for Bengall on the Ship Harrison the 8th. October 1718 and thô the Copy of the said Peter Mandets note was left in his Wifes hands, she knew not how to make the demand as being ignorant of the particulars of that affair and Cap^t. Godwin had scarce time enuff after his arrival to settle any acco^t. hav^g. brôt ashoare wth. him a very dangerous distemper under w^{ch}. he Labour'd for about three weeks & then died.

Thus I've laid before Your Hon^r. & c^a. the most particular acco^t. that I could learn concern^g. this affair Hereby it appears that after Cap^t. Godwin had found himself Guilty of breach of orders in carry^g. the Majors goods with him to Batavia and Leaving them there in the hands of a person altogether unkown to the Major without a warrant for so doing) made him that actual promise as before related by way of Compensation for the damage he was like to sustain by hav^g. employ'd his mony where there was little or no hopes of hav^g. any tollerable return, But it may be objected that the Majors Word (who is the plaintiff) is not to be taken in this case, But this is answerd by the Majors having declar'd his readiness to take his Oath to the truth of the particulars before Recited, And he do's presume to hope that in reason and Equity Your Hon^r. & c^a. will not reject that offer It has been urg'd in behalf of the defend^t. that when the Major found Cap^t. Godwin guilty of breach of orders he should have protested against him in due time and Form and that such an omission in point of Law was a plain indicatⁿ. that the Major was well satisfy'd wth. what Cap^t. Godwin had acted in that affair and that he took the whole risque upon himself But that being only a Certain point of severity us'd amongst Merchants from one to another, As supposing all to be equally acquainted wth. Mercantile forms and Customs It is presum'd that the Major who is a Soldier by Profession (not a Merchant) may very well be excus'd for being Guilty of an Omission (so term'd) in a matter not at all suppos'd to be wth. in his province especially when he could not have done it in point of honour and Friendship.

With submission to your Hon^r. & c^a. better Judgem^t. it is thought the affair will turn upon these two points Whither the Majors Oath shall be accepted in relation to Cap^t. Godwins promise and Whether after his oath is accepted that promise shall be thought Obligatory enough to make Cap^t. Godwins Estate become accountable for his non Compliance therewth. But of these Yo^r. Hon^r. & c^a. are the properest Judges and therefore I forbear to offer my opinion therein submitting the Whole to your determinatⁿ. and remain^g. wth. all possible Respect.

Companys Factory Mr. Cromelin had also orders to treat me wth. respect and give me all the assistance in my affairs he was capable of either in return to Bombay or any other part I had a mind to transport myself.

After having sign'd the Books paid the Ballance and taken an Inventory of the Stores w^{ch}. was mutually sign'd by us both Upon y^e. delivering up my charge to Mr. Cromelin I told him that having neither occasion or inclinⁿ. to serve y^e. Company any Longer I had determin'd to lay it down & return to England w^{ch}. he & the rest of the Comp^{ys}. servants having agreed to they paid me my sallary to that time, and I left the Factory.

As to my coming here it was partly my Interest and partly Curiosity to see the place but had I had the least thought I should have met wth. the treatment I have done I would gladly have relinquish'd any advantage how great so ever and suspended my Curiosity till a more Favourable Occasion.

This is what I have thought fit to offer to your Hon^r. & C^a. that I may have a determinate Answer to the Petition before deliver'd you that as the time of the ships departure draws nigh I may regulate my affairs accordingly I am wth. respect
