## **Prefatory Note.**

FINANCE DEPARTMENT.

1862—1868.

THE papers in this section are naturally of a very varied nature. As the province develops the originally simple financial machinery becomes more and more complex. Customs played a large part in the finance of those early days and the weekly returns of the salt excise are of some interest, as are those of opium.

The number of local treasuries steadily increased during the period and one feature is the introduction of the system of Money Orders in 1866. In 1868 we have the proposal for the establishment of a "Peoples Bank" at Amritsar but the scheme was not looked on with favour by the authorities.

Pensions and gratuities awarded occupy a very large space in the series. Another feature of the period is the way in which the Punjab was infested with wild beasts at this time. Each Deputy Commissioner had at his disposal a fund for the destruction of wild beasts and judging by the frequent applications for increase under this head of allotment, a vigorous destruction must have been going on and this is the case in nearly all Districts.
