In the present issue of the Statistical Abstract rupees have been converted into pounds sterling at the rate of 15 rupees to the £ in the returns for 1899-1900 and 1900-1901, except in cases where the retention of the rupee appeared to be more appropriate. For earlier years rupees or tens of rupees have been retained, except in the general statements of Revenue and Expenditure, where the pound will be found throughout.

New Tables have been added relating to Port Blair Convict Settlement, Capital Expenditure by Government, Net Revenue and Expenditure, Ways and Means of Home Government, Famine Relief, Gold Reserve Fund, Merchandise Marks, Port Trusts, Vessels Built and Registered in India, Vital Statistics, Lunatic Asylums, and Inventions and Designs.
