PREFACE

The youth force of the country, if appropriately harnessed, constitute the most powerful instrument for social, cultural and economic change. The imperative need of the hour is to offer to young people the possibility to contribute more to the development of their country and of the local community to which they belong; to involve youth in taking part in decision making; to offer challenges to the idealism and zeal of youth; to provide opportunities for channelising their energies; and to make available more facilities for the fulfilment of their aspirations and of their occupational, educational, cultural, social and other needs.

Many programmes and schemes aimed at these goals and needs are already being implemented by governmental and non-governmental agencies. Their efficiency and usefulness are varied. Their appeal and attractiveness for youth's imagination are diversified. But, basically, all of them have some potential for youth work and youth activities.

What is now needed is to arouse wider interest among young people in these programmes. The foremost need is to make available sufficient information about these programmes, their nature, purposes and methods of implementation. Many of these lend themselves very well to youth involvement. This inventory represents an effort to bring together the basic information about some of the schemes of the Central Ministries for ready reference of young people, youth workers and youth associations.

It is especially meant to serve the Coordinators and youth participants of the Nehru Yuva Kendras which are already established in 94 Districts. It is expected that ultimately all the Districts will be covered by a network of Nehru Yuva Kendras. One of the primary objectives of the Kendras is to provide a range of challenges and opportunities for non-student youth in the age group 15-25, which will enable them to participate in meaningful developmental activities. The function of the Nehru Yuva Kendra Coordinators is primarily that of a catalyst and more particularly:

to stimulate and coordinate various co-operative and developmental programmes already under implementation at the district level which offer opportunities to youth for direct participation;

- to encourage and organise youth for utilising and taking advantage of various governmental schemes;
- to stimulate youth energies and imagination to enrich the implementation of different programmes, to harness their innovative spirit for their own personal and collective benefit;
- to organise educational, promotional and training activities, which will enable young people to participate more vigorously and efficiently in developmental activities, and particularly to take advantage of schemes intended to increase employment opportunities or generation of self-employment.

The Nehru Yuvak Kendra Coordinators will find in this Inventory some indications for widening their work, for new directions in which they can move, for identifying and harnessing untapped resources and for promoting the Coordination between schemes and programmes which are often isolated.

The material in this Inventory has been based on the annual reports of the various Central Ministries for the year 1973-74. The nature and purpose of the programme/scheme (brief description) including financial provision. **The Applied Nutrition programme aims at stimulating self help activities for optimum use of available food resources in the rural areas. Education in respect of basic nutritional principles is combined with production and preparation of protective foods through community gardens, poultry farming and fish culture. It is designed to make the community conscious of nutrition, impart nutrition education to mothers and bring about a change in the food and dietary habits through local production, demonstration, cooking and feeding. The programme is implemented in collaboration with UNICEF, FAO, WHO and is operated through the Community Development Blocks. By 1973-74, 1181 blocks were covered. Additional 700 new blocks are proposed to be covered under the scheme in the country. An outlay of Rs.20 crores has been provided in the Fifth Plan.**

General information as to how the resources available under the scheme could be harnessed for the purpose of youth activities. **The scheme can be taken advantage of for promoting activities of Yuvak Mandals and Mahila Mandals which exists in various blocks. The objective is the development of cattle. Three such programmes with foreign collaboration are working at present under the Indo-Swiss project near Munnar (Kerala) a brown swiss herd has been established and crossbreeding has taken up at the base farm for developing animals suited to economic milk production in the area. A semen station has been started at Mavellikara (Kerala) with frozen semen of brown swiss breed. An extension centre has been set up at Paermodu under this scheme. Under the Indo-Swiss project in Punjab a base farm has been set up at Patiala with imported brown swiss cattle along with a frozen semen station and extension and cross breeding work. The pure red dane herd station under the Indo-Spanish Project in Karnataka has provided high quality bulls for taking cross breeding work. Under the project sub stations are set up at Munirabad and Kudige and Dhanwar (being set up). For cattle development work in Meghalaya an Indo-Danish Project has been finalized.

Three more such farms are being set up at Alamadhi (Tamilnadu) for 'Murrah buffaloes', Koraput for 'Jersey breed' and Andeshnagar (H.P.) for 'Holsteni Friesian breed'. The Central Jersey cattle breeding farms at Hessarghatta (Bangalore) is also distributing bull calves to various states/union territories and private institutions for cattle development work.
