STATISTICS OF CRIMINAL COURTS IN THE MADRAS PRESIDENCY

FOR THE YEAR 1920.

INTRODUCTORY NOTE.

I.—GENERAL.

On the 31st December 1920, there were in the Madras Presidency the following Criminal Courts:—

The High Court,

- 25 Sessions Courts (including one for Agency tracts),
- 6 Additional Sessions Courts (including 3 for Agency tracts),
- 25 District Magistrates' Courts,
 - 1 Additional District Magistrate's Court,
 - 4 Presidency Magistrates' Courts.
- 110 Subdivisional Magistrates' Courts,
- 32 Courts of Assistant and Deputy Magistrates' Courts without Divisional charges,
- 447 Subordinate Magistrates' Courts (including 136 Tahsildar-Magistrates' Courts),
- 180 Benches of Magistrates (on which 1,288 Honorary Magistrates had seats),
- 72 Special Magistrates' Courts,
- 4 Cantonment Magistrates' Courts, and
- 5 Honorary Magistrates' Courts.

In addition, the Subordinate Judges of Coimbatore, Gôdâvari, Kurnool, Salem, Tanjore and Tinnevelly exercised the powers of an Assistant Sessions Judge.

From the 1st December the Courts of the Agency Sessions Judges, Ganjam, Vizagapatam and Gôdâvari, ceased to exist; their places being taken by the Court of the Agency Sessions Division.

Of the Judges and Magistrates exercising original powers, 77 were Europeans and 861 were Indians and Anglo-Indians; and of those exercising appellate powers, 69 were Europeans and 148 Indians and Anglo-Indians. The four Benches of Magistrates established for the town of Madras worked throughout, and on the last day of the year 94 Honorary Magistrates had seats on them. The Egmore and Georgetown Benches disposed of 9,085, 5,750 and 76 cases, respectively, under the City Police Act, Hackney Carriage Act, and Indian Penal Code, and the Royapettah and Washermanpet Benches disposed of 5,257 and 3,075 cases, respectively, under the first Act, while the number of cases disposed of by each of the two latter benches under the Indian Penal Code was 31. They thus continued to render a substantial measure of assistance to the stipendiary Magistrates. In the year under review, new Bench Courts were established in the districts of North Arcot, Coimbatore, Guntur, South Kanara, Madura, Malabar, the Nilgiris, Salem, Tinnevelly and Trichinopoly; but the Salem Courts did not commence work during the year. Besides Magistrates of

the classes already mentioned, 3,151 Village Magistrates exercised criminal jurisdiction. The number is a decrease on the figures for 1919 (3,852), and is also below the average for the preceding five years (4,052).

The number of Village Magistrates trying cases was largest in Tinnevelly (571), Tanjore (446) and North Arcot (277) and smallest in Cuddapah (6), the Nilgiris (8) and Bellary (13).

Total number
of cases.

2. The total number of original cases instituted in the Criminal Courts during the year was 318,476 or 14,377 less than in the previous year. There was a general decrease in all districts, particularly in Kistna (4,084), Tanjore (2,933) and Trichinopoly (2,199). The Presidency town contributed 39,405 cases, Madura (20,198), Trichinopoly (19,155), Tanjore (17,956), Salem (17,955) and South Arcot (15,681). The total number of appeals preferred fell from 9,269 to 8,723, the average for the preceding five years being 9,704.

II.—ORIGINAL CASES.

Village
Courts.

3. In the Village Magistrates' Courts the total number of cases instituted fell from 10,453 to 8,692 and the number of persons tried by those Courts also from 17,024 to 14,413. Of these 15·48 per cent were convicted against 17·96 per cent in 1919. Several districts which returned the largest number of persons concerned in cases showed also a very low percentage of convictions :—Tinnevelly (4,620) 7 per cent, Tanjore (2,024) 6 per cent, Rāmnād (1,087) 8 per cent, and Guntūr (721) 8 per cent : on the other hand Salem with 904 cases filed shows a percentage of 12 per cent of the cases tried, Malabar (1,192) 16 per cent and North Arcot (958) 33 per cent. Explanations for this varying percentage of conviction are not forthcoming.

Bench
Courts.

4. The District Magistrate, Anantapur, reports that the first-class Benches at Tadpatri and Hindupur created under G.Os. No. 330, Home (Judicial), dated the 10th February 1919, and No. 1822, Home (Judicial), dated the 13th August 1919, have rendered valuable assistance. Other District Magistrates have not reported on the success of such experiments, but the District Magistrate, Chingleput, reports that there were no such benches in his district.

Regular
Magistrates'
Courts.

5. The number of cases instituted in the regular Magistrates' Courts in the mufassal was 279,071 against 294,656 in 1919, of which 6,645 were pending at the end of the year against 5,763 in 1919. The average duration from the beginning to the end of trial of cases disposed of by these Courts was 7·3 days against 8·6 in the previous year. Before Bench Courts the average duration was 2 days ; before Special Magistrates 2 ; before Sub-Magistrates 1½ ; before Assistant Magistrates 13 ; before Joint Magistrates 22 ; and before Deputy Magistrates 32. In the Sub-Magistrates' Courts, the average duration was highest in Nellore (26 days), Trichinopoly (23 days), Anantapur (21 days) and Bellary (18 days). In Deputy Magistrates' Courts, it was highest in Ganjam (69 days), the Nilgiris (60 days), Cuddapah (55 days) and Rāmnād (49 days). In Joint Magistrates' Courts the greatest delay occurred in South Arcot (4½ days), Tinnevelly (34 days), Malabar (31 days), the Nilgiris and Ganjam (27 days) and Guntūr (26 days). The system of fixing certain days of the week for the trial of police cases introduced in Kistna has been recommended for trial in other districts, but it is not known to what extent the experiment has been introduced elsewhere. It may be noted that during the year under report the average duration in Kistna rose from 5·4 days in 1919 to 7·02 and the number of witnesses detained for more than three days was 620 against 541 in 1919.

6. The total number of cases instituted in the Presidency Magistrates' Courts was 83,537 against 80,559 in 1919; and 155 cases involving 316 persons who had appeared before the Courts were pending at the close of the year. Only 18 of the persons concerned were in custody.

7. The number of cases committed to Sessions Courts in the mafassal was 1,753 against 1,943 in 1919. The Courts to which the largest number of cases were committed were the Courts of Coimbatore (133), Tinnevelly (127) and Kurnool and Agency Division (122). The increase in the number of cases committed to Sessions Courts was most remarkable in Agency Division (18), Tinnevelly (26) and South Kanara (20). There was a fall in North Arcot and Chittoor taken together (67), Cuddapah (36) and South Arcot (30). The total number of cases pending in all the Courts at the end of the year was 171 against 202 at the end of 1919, of which Tinnevelly and Coimbatore contributed the largest number, 26 and 17, respectively. The average duration of cases before Sessions Courts rose from 51 to 56 days. The average was highest in Ramnud (103 days), North Arcot (100 days) and Salem (81 days). The high average duration in Ramnud is attributed by the Sessions Judge to the protracted trial of some cases, the chief of them being the three batches of Kamudhi looting cases and to the adjournment of some cases owing to the absence of material witnesses. The delay in North Arcot is due to the transfer of cases from Chittoor, and the time taken for disposal in Salem, though high, represents an improvement on last year's figure. The total number of persons under trial was 5,412 against 6,044 in 1919, and of these 2,529 or 46.72 per cent were discharged or acquitted against 2,636 or 43.61 per cent in 1919.

8. The number of cases committed to the High Court Sessions was 40 against 54 in the previous year. Two cases were pending at the end of the year.

The High Court.

III.—APPEALS.

9. Of the persons sentenced by second and third-class Magistrates, 13,077 Magistrates' Courts. appealed to first-class Magistrates against 13,083 in 1919. The appeals of 1,164 persons were pending at the end of the year against 725 at the end of 1919. The average period which elapsed between the presentation of an appeal and its disposal in the courts of the Subdivisional Magistrates was 22 days against 17 in the previous year. The average was highest in Trichinopoly (45 days), Ramnud (41 days), North Arcot (37 days) and Bellary (28 days). The percentage of appellants successful in having their convictions reversed or the proceedings quashed was 31.94 against 31.26 in 1919.

10. The number of persons who appealed to Sessions Courts against the decisions of first-class Magistrates was 2,226 against 2,683 in 1919. The number of persons whose appeals were pending at the end of the year was 247 against 207 at the end of 1919. The average duration of an appeal in the Sessions Courts rose from 31 days in 1919 to 35 days. The average was highest in Chittoor (48 days), Nellore (61 days) and Trichinopoly (55 days). The percentage of appellants who had their convictions reversed or the proceedings quashed was 22.67 against 22.28 in 1919.

11. The number of appellants to the High Court was 1,633 against 1,527 in 1919. The Government appealed against the acquittal of 43 persons, the average for the preceding five years being 46. The appeals of 692 persons were rejected in limine, 162 convictions were set aside and orders of acquittal in respect of 8 persons were set aside on appeal by Government, 4 accused being convicted, and new trial being ordered in the case of the other 4 persons, the acquittals in the case of 7 persons being upheld and the remaining cases being left pending. In the case of 442 persons the finding and sentence were maintained after notice and in 144 cases the sentences were reduced or otherwise altered. New trial or further inquiry was ordered in the case of 13 persons. The appeals of 275

persons were pending at the end of the year against 328 in 1919. The average duration of an appeal was 49 days against 43 in 1919. The percentage of entirely successful appellants was 7·36 against 10 per cent in 1919.

IV.—REFERENCE AND REVISION.

Magistrates' Courts.

12. The number of applications for revision presented in the District Magistrates' Courts was 759 against 779 in 1919. The District Magistrates took up the same number of cases (11) *suo motu* or on reports from their Sub-divisional Magistrates as in the previous year.

Sessions Courts.

13. In Sessions Courts 512 applications for revision were presented, or 49 less than in the previous year; and the number of cases taken up by them *suo motu* was 32 against 41 in 1919.

The High Court.

14. The number of revision petitions received in the High Court was 807, a decrease of 83 on the figures for 1919. 75 cases were reported by District Magistrates and Sessions Judges and 56 were taken up by the High Court *suo motu*. Death sentences on 108 persons were referred to the High Court for confirmation under section 374 of the Criminal Procedure Code. The sentences on 61 persons were confirmed, those on 25 persons were commuted to transportation for life, those on 3 to rigorous imprisonment, and the sentences on 29 persons were reversed and acquittal ordered. Of the cases referred by Sessions Judges under section 307, Criminal Procedure Code, on the ground that the verdicts were wrong, the verdicts on 7 persons were upheld, the verdicts on 4 were modified and those on the remainder (10 of "guilty" and 33 of "not guilty") were reversed.

Trial by jury and with the aid of assessors.

15. The number of persons tried by jury was 2,038 and in the case of 1,944 persons the Judges accepted their verdict. The number of persons tried with the aid of assessors was 2,543. In the case of 1,667 persons the Judge agreed with all the assessors, in the case of 321 he differed from one or more of them, and in the case of 555 he differed from all the assessors.

The jury system.

**Detention of witnesses—
(a) Magistrates' Courts.**

16. The jury system on the whole is reported to have worked satisfactorily.

17. The number of witnesses detained for more than three days was largest in the Trichinopoly district. In that district, it rose from 799 in 1919 to 1,128 in 1920 and in Madura from 252 to 416; in the case of neither of which is any explanation given. The figures remained unduly high in Salem (731) and in Tinnevelly (668). The detention in all cases occurred almost entirely in the Sub-Magistrates' Courts.

(b) Sessions Courts.

The number of witnesses detained in Sessions Courts for more than three days was largest in Tinnevelly (621), Salem (252) and Trichinopoly (238). The increase is particularly marked in Tinnevelly and Coimbatore. The figure in Tinnevelly, which is equal to 41 per cent of the witnesses examined, is attributed to the unexpected protraction of about 20 Sessions cases, and to the number of witnesses often summoned for the defence, though eventually not examined. The first of these explanations is also given for the detention of witnesses in Salem.

Dismissal of complaints under section 203, Criminal Procedure Code, and compensation awarded to complainants.

18. Of the 119,233 cases for disposal under the Indian Penal Code, 16,545 or 13·83 per cent were rejected under section 203, Criminal Procedure Code, against 15·11 per cent in the preceding year. The disposals under this head vary from 2,029 (15,485) in South Arcot, and 1,971 (17,433) in Salem to 205 (9,008) in Ramnad and 57 (6,812) in the Nilgiris, the figures in brackets showing the number of cases for disposal. The bulk of the disposals under this section were of cases of (a) hurt, (b) criminal force and assault, (c) theft, (d) mischief, (e) trespass

and (f) criminal intimidation and insult, which nevertheless show percentages of acquittal or discharge of persons actually under trial of (a) 87 per cent, (b) 91 per cent, (c) 58 per cent, (d) 89 per cent, (e) 76 per cent and (f) 90 per cent. It would seem that neither this section nor section 250, Criminal Procedure Code, which was enforced only in the case of 1,852 persons against 2,052 in the previous year, is being sufficiently employed, despite repeated insistence on their utility in recent administration reports. The percentage of convictions in cases tried under the Indian Penal Code was 43·50 against 40·08 in the previous year.

19. The number of cases reported under the Indian Penal Code during the year was 111,677 against 121,779 in 1919. The decrease is noticeable under the heads of criminal force and assault (— 3,075), theft (— 2,818), hurt (— 1,185), criminal intimidation, insult and annoyance (— 938) and criminal breach of trust (— 475). There was an increase in offences under Chapter X—Contempts of the lawful authority of public servants (229), offences under Chapter XVII—offences against property (cheating) (155) and those under Chapter XVI—offences affecting human body (affecting life) (114). The number of murder cases tried was particularly high in Coimbatore (52), Tinnevelly (40) and Kurnool (36) and was in excess of the normal in several other districts. In Coimbatore it may be noted that, while the number of murders charged rose from 62 to 76, dacoities and robberies decreased from 48 to 18. In Madura the number of murders reported rose from 48 to 95, and a decrease in theft in that district is attributed partly to the working of the Criminal Tribes Act and partly to the institution of the panchayat system in Kallar villages towards the end of the year. On the whole there was a decrease of cases under the Indian Penal Code which is attributed to a better season and a slight lowering of prices. Those districts, where crime showed an increase, in general attribute it to the local bad season, viz., Anantapur, Guntur and Kurnool. In Anantapur the prevalence of crimes of violence is attributed to the almost universal existence of village factions.

20. The total number of sentences passed during the year was 223,801 of which 52 were of death, 246 of transportation, 7 of penal servitude, 23,693 of rigorous imprisonment, 4,406 of simple imprisonment, 92 of forfeiture of property, 194,220 of fine and 1,085 of whipping. The amount of fines imposed was Rs. 11,38,718, of which a sum of Rs. 55,316 was paid to complainants under section 545, Criminal Procedure Code. 911 persons were bound over to keep the peace, of whom 633 were not given any additional punishment. 1,864 persons were ordered to give security for good behaviour; and for failing to give such security 1,839 persons were imprisoned. Of the total sentences of imprisonment passed, 5,414 (19 per cent) against 5,084 in 1919 and 3,845 in 1918, were for periods of 15 days and under (apart from those passed by Village Magistrates). This increase in the number of short term sentences is viewed with dissatisfaction. The number of persons confined in stocks, a punishment now abolished by the Madras Village Courts Act Amendment Act, was 98 against 222 in the previous year. 341 persons were released on probation of good conduct under section 662, Criminal Procedure Code, against 358 in the previous year. Proceedings had to be taken against 48 offenders for failure to observe the conditions of their recognizances as compared with 8 in 1919 and 25 in 1918.

21. 2,389 boys and 378 girls were convicted during the year. The number of juvenile offenders was particularly large in Madras (443), Salem (295) and Guntur (266). The convictions fall under the following heads:—Indian Penal Code (grave crime) 3, Indian Penal Code (other offences) 1,917, Forest Act 866, Criminal Tribes Act 37, Municipal Act and Bye-laws, City Police Act and Towns Nuisance Act 721, and under other Acts 126. Of the 378 convictions against girls 284 were under the Forest Act. The sentences on 33 boys were commuted to detention in the Reformatory School, 43 were discharged after admonition and 19 were delivered to their parents or guardians.

22. The total number of cases reported during the year under the Madras Forest Act was 18,220 against 16,989 in 1919, of which 16,298 were found to be true. The District Magistrates report that only 358 cases were taken up by the Subdivisional Magistrates, or 71 more than in 1919. The Honourable the Judges regret that in spite of repeated reminders the instructions in G.O. No. 152, Judicial, dated the 19th January 1914, are not being carried out.
