Sir,

I have the honour to submit the annual report on the working of the Indian Companies Act, 1913, in the Presidency of Bombay for the year ended the 31st March 1915, together with the prescribed statements. As in former years, details in respect of the Societies registered under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 and the Provident Insurance Societies Act V of 1912 have also been embodied in this report.

2. The period covered by the report comprises the first year during which the new Indian Companies Act VII of 1913 has been in force. Besides a considerable increase in the routine work the Act has thrown heavy responsibilities on the Registrar and the office in general in respect of the scrutiny and examination of companies' affairs. In accordance with the decision of Government a full-time Registrar was appointed and his duties as Sub-Registrar of Bombay were, after his full-time appointment, performed by another Officer. The office establishment was to a certain extent strengthened during the course of the year. J. C. D. Almeida, Esquire, was in charge of the office during the whole year under review.

3. During the year the number of companies registered was 15 only as compared with 66 in the previous year. Among these new companies, one was limited by guarantee and the rest were limited by shares. The Surat Nemchand Melapehand Nursing Fund Association is the company classed in the former category and was registered under a license granted under Section 26 of the Act. The Bombay Gas Company, Ltd., which since 1865 had been shown as an Indian Company registered under Act XIX of 1857, was found to have filed its papers under the provisions of Section 22 of the Bombay Act V of 1863, being "an Act to confer certain powers on the Bombay Gas Company, Ltd., and to enable Government to confer similar powers on other companies registered and incorporated for the purpose of manufacturing and supplying gas". On the basis of the opinion of the Honourable the Advocate General, Bombay, the company was, on its filing papers under Section 277 (1) of the new Act, removed from the list of the Indian Companies to that of the British and Foreign companies. The Century Flour Mills Company, Ltd., has been added to the list since its registered office has been transferred to this Presidency under Section 12 (2) of the Act. A Society by the name of the Countess of Dufferin Dispensaries Society, Surat, which was registered on 11th October 1895 under Section 26 of the Indian Companies Act, 1882, but was subsequently considered to be a Society under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860, has been transferred to the list of Companies limited by guarantee.

5. Some of the companies of all classes registered in 1913-14, but specially among the Banking, Insurance, Navigation and Cotton Industries were floated in that year in order to obtain the benefit of registration under the milder registration law then in force. A certain decrease in the number of new companies registered during the year under report can, therefore, safely be ascribed to this circumstance. The Banking crisis in 1913-14 followed by the financial stringency due to the war has naturally adversely affected the whole of the industrial community and has caused or accelerated the ruin of some of the less solid concerns, whilst persons who propose to float new companies are no doubt wisely holding back until the financial skies are less overcast. These causes in combination with the greater stringency of the new law have caused a period of stagnation in respect of the operations of existing and in the registration of new companies. It is to be observed that many of the companies of doubtful repute and inefficient management have ceased to carry on business owing to the additional responsibilities thrown on their officers. There appears to be every likelihood that when the country has resumed its normal condition at the end of war, the commercial community will take full advantage of the provisions of the Companies Act and that the number of new companies registered will be largely increased. Rather contrary to the general expectation very few persons have as yet availed themselves of the advantages of obtaining registration as private companies under the new Act, but this is probably owing to the general dislocation of trade and commerce and ignorance of the advantages of such registration.

The above table exhibits a net increase of 497 documents. The documents in items Nos. 8 to 10 and some of the documents, such as declarations of compliance, consents of Directors, etc., which are included in the item No. 7 headed "Miscellaneous", are required to be registered under the new Act exclusively. It is, therefore, apparent that the number of documents usually registered has greatly decreased. The decrease in items Nos. 1 and 2 is accounted for by the reduced number of new companies registered. The decrease under item 4 is partly attributable to the fact that the new Act permits the holding of general meetings after a period not exceeding 15 months from the last meetings instead of 12 months as before. Returns under Act XXI of 1860 (item 12) were not sent in as readily as in former years in spite of calls. The variation in respect of other items is due to ordinary fluctuations.

7. During the year under report 43 companies went into liquidation or otherwise became defunct as compared with 46 in the previous year, and of these 43 companies 14 were finally dissolved in the year under review. In six cases the winding up was ordered by Court. Two companies were removed from the registers and dissolved under the powers vested in the Registrar by Section 247 of the Act. The rest went into voluntary liquidation. In the case of 9 companies that were under liquidation on or before 31st March 1914, the proceedings have been completed and they have been dissolved. The number of companies limited by guarantee that went into liquidation was 5 and they have been included in the number of companies which went into liquidation mentioned above.

8. There appear to be a number of companies which are defunct and I shall, in the current year, avail myself of the provisions of Section 247 of the new Act to strike them off the register. The reason for the closing down of some concerns has been given above in paragraph 5.

9. The aggregate number of companies existing at the close of the year was 608 as compared with 635 for 1913-14. The statement below gives a

comparison of the capital as it stood at the close of the year under review and the preceding year :—

It is apparent from the above that though the number of companies working and the authorised capital thereof are reduced, the working capital, *viz.*, paid up capital, is increased by Rs. 1,98,69,463. The number of companies limited by guarantee was 19, with 11,630 members as against 22 with 16,785 in the previous year.

10. During the year under report 114 companies increased their capital by Rs. 63,12,500 in authorised, Rs. 2,75,58,085 in subscribed and Rs. 2,63,04,414 in paid up capital against an increase of Rs. 30,50,000 in authorised, Rs. 5,95,45,900 in subscribed and Rs. 3,30,03,942 in paid up capital in the preceding year.

11. Thirty companies reduced their capital, the reduction in the authorised, subscribed and paid up capital amounting to Rs. 48,25,000, Rs. 56,08,775 and Rs. 45,02,504, respectively, including the capital of the Bombay Gas Company, Limited, which is transferred to the list of companies established outside British India and whose authorised, subscribed and paid up capital is Rs. 45,00,000, Rs. 42,00,000 and Rs. 42,00,000 respectively.

12. Fees realised on the registration, filing or recording of documents amounted to Rs. 20,782-6-0, of which Rs. 30 were received after the close of treasury on 31st March 1915 and will be accounted for in the year 1915-16. A comparative table showing receipts for both the years 1913-14 and 1914-15 is given below for ready reference :—

The above statement discloses a decrease in the amount of fees by Rs. 10,304-14-0. This is almost entirely attributable to the smaller number of new companies registered, and in all probability if the year had been a normal

one, there would have been a substantial increase in the fees. The reason for the decrease in the number of resolutions is to a large extent due to the fact that the increase in the amount of authorised capital was smaller than in the previous year. Except for the item of fees under the Indian Life Assurance Companies Act the other items are small and call for no special remarks. The cause of the falling off in registration under the latter Act is that there is no obligation on the part of such companies to file any document with the Registrar under this Act. The companies have an option to file Balance Sheets either under Section 13 of the latter Act or under Section 134 of the Indian Companies Act, 1913. The items of increase under the other heads are now.

13. The expenditure during the year amounted to Rs. 12,795-0-11 against Rs. 2,478-5-3, showing an increase of Rs. 10,316-11-8—

The increase in salaries is due to the creation of the officer's post and the increase in the strength of the establishment sanctioned by Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 2799, dated 25th March 1914, and Government Resolution, Financial Department, No. 3140, dated 26th August 1914. Fees paid to the members of the Auditors' Council are sanctioned by Government Resolutions, Revenue Department, No. 7949, dated 26th August 1914, and No. 13059, dated 29th December 1914. This latter item is also new. In addition to the special grant of Rs. 1,000 sanctioned by Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 3535, dated 15th April 1914, a sum of Rs. 455 transferred from "Rent" was utilised to meet the charges for the supply of furniture, books and petty articles for the new office. There was no separate postage grant for this office. The joint grant of the Sub-Registrar of Bombay and of this office was therefore distributed between the two offices. The sum of Rs. 60, which was allotted as the share of this office, was found insufficient and an additional sum of Rs. 95 out of "Rent" had to be appropriated. This accounts for the increase under contingent charges.

14. The offices of certain companies subject to the provisions of Section 136 of the Indian Companies Act, 1913, requiring them to exhibit statements of assets and liabilities, were examined by the Assistant Registrars in the mofussil and by the head clerk in Bombay.

15. Under the provisions of section 277 of the Act, 1913 companies established outside British India, which have places of business in this Province, have filed their papers. A list of these companies appears in Appendix A.

The Indian Societies Registration Act, XXI of 1930.

16. Though there appears to be a desire on the part of the public to procure registration and get corporate status for religious and charitable bodies, there is little or no improvement in respect of the forwarding of the annual lists of managing bodies under Section 4, as in the majority of cases the

returns were only obtained after requisitions. The societies registered during the year 1914-15 were 15 and their names are as follows :—

17. Out of the 10 Provident Insurance Societies on the register at the close of the year 1913-14, two went into liquidation. Of the list at the end of this paragraph, the first four framed their rules under Section 6 of the Act, but the final approval thereof by the Registrar was not obtained until after the end of the year. Two are reported to have ceased to carry on business and one became defunct. The last took no steps to frame its rules and will be dealt with according to law :—
