SEASON AND CROP REPORT OF THE PROVINCE OF BOMBAY FOR THE YEAR 1943-44.

CHAPTER I—CHARACTER OF THE SEASON.

The Agricultural Season of 1943-44, considering the *kharif* and *rabi* seasons together, was, on the whole fairly satisfactory and proved better than its predecessor. The regular monsoon commenced in the second week of June and adequate rains received over a greater part of the Province gave an impetus to the sowings of *kharif* crops and transplanting operations in rice tracts. In July, heavy rains were received over a greater part of the reporting areas, excepting the south-eastern regions of the Province. This excessive rainfall, late in July, was particularly heavy in parts of North Gujarat while in some localities in North Konkan, the rainfall accompanied by stormy winds, washed away the rice seedlings due to breaches in field bunds. In the south-eastern tracts of Deccan and Karnatak, the rainfall was generally deficient and in some areas crops showed signs of withering due to inadequate soil moisture. The activity of the monsoon declined by the middle of August; though the deficiency in rainfall was not so marked in Gujarat, the Konkan belt and the western regions of Deccan and Karnatak. The prolonged drought that persisted from the middle of July in the south-eastern tracts of the Province, arrested the normal development of *kharif* crops. The opportune rains in early September over a greater part of the Province had a beneficial effect in renewing crop vigour and growth. These rains also facilitated and expedited *rabi* tillage and sowings and gave promise of a successful *rabi* season. The break in rains at the end of September somewhat affected the normal crop growth in parts of Gujarat and East Karnatak. In October, the rainfall was mostly recorded in the first three weeks of the month and the precipitation towards the middle of the month was markedly excessive. These excessive rains damaged the standing and harvested *kharif* crops and slightly spoiled the quality of the produce. *Rabi* seedlings in low-lying situations were washed away and cotton was affected in some parts. The clear weather conditions that prevailed later in the month improved crop condition and afforded opportunities to proceed with the usual field operations. With some showers of rain in the first fortnight of November, in parts of Karnatak and the southern areas of Deccan and Konkan, the season was closed and the condition of the standing crops was generally satisfactory, excepting in the South-Eastern regions of Deccan and Karnatak. The cloudy weather conditions in December caused shedding of cotton buds in parts of Gujarat, while in the south-eastern tracts of Deccan and Karnatak, crops were adversely affected in growth and in some places showed signs of withering due to inadequacy of soil moisture and prevalence of eastern dry winds. In Gujarat *rabi* crops were damaged in places by field rats while wheat crop suffered from the incidence of rust in many areas of the Province, reducing the yield. The irregular showers accompanied by hail-storm in the month of March proved rather untimely and slightly affected the *rabi* crops lying in the threshing yards in places in Gujarat and Deccan and somewhat spoiled the quality of cotton in parts of Karnatak.

2. *Distribution of rainfall.*—Table I (pages 16-17) compares the rainfall during the year under review with the average annual fall of rain at each representative recording station in the Province. The average rainfall figures for each station have been supplied by the India Meteorological Department.

Kharif Rains.—The *kharif* rainfall in Gujarat exceeded the normal precipitation except at Broach and Surat where it was below the average. In Deccan these rains were in excess of the average, except at Jalgaon, Nasik and Sholapur where they were below normal. In Karnatak they were below normal, except at Bijapur, where they were in excess of the amount usually received. Except at Thana, the *kharif* rains in Konkan were below the average.

Rabi Rains.—These rains exceeded the average everywhere in the Province, except at Kaira and Godhra (Broach and Panch Mahals District) in Gujarat and Ratnagiri in Konkan, where they were below the average.

Hot Weather Rains.—This year these rains were in excess of the average in Karnatak and parts of the Deccan. In Gujarat these rains exceeded normal only at Surat.

CHAPTER II—AREA CULTIVATED AND UNCULTIVATED.

(Table II, pages 18-20)

3. Number of Villages.—The total number of villages in the Province decreased by seventy from 24,775 in 1942-43 to 22,705 during the year under report due to amalgamation with adjoining villages for administrative convenience as detailed below:—

- 12 villages in West Khandesh.
- 28 villages in East Khandesh.
- 7 villages in Nasik.
- 23 villages in Ahmednagar.
- 1 village in Poona.

Against the decrease of the above 71 villages, there is an increase of 1 village in Ahmedabad and thus the net result is the decrease of 70 villages in the Province.

4. Total area and Reporting and Non-reporting area.—The total and reporting areas decreased by 37,421 and 1,270 acres respectively, the decrease being noticeable mainly in Belgaum District of the Karnatak Division in both cases. The variations under non-reporting area generally correspond with those under reporting area.

5. Cropped Areas.—The gross and net cropped areas increased by 2·8 per cent and 2·3 per cent. respectively as compared with the previous year, the increase being marked in Gujarat, Deccan and Karnatak. The twice cropped area, on the other hand, showed an increase of 21·0 per cent. which was shared by all the Divisions in the Province. The assessed area remained almost the same as last year, while the unassessed area increased by 16·7 per cent. as compared with the previous year. The increase being due mainly to favourable rains and the "Grow More Food Crops Campaign". An area of about 127,000 acres of forest land was given out for temporary cultivation, of which 112,000 acres were in the Deccan, 21,000 acres in the Konkan and 4,000 acres in Gujarat. About 102,000 acres of culturable waste or "other uncultivated land excluding current fallows" in Deccan (74,000 acres), in Gujarat (10,000 acres), in Konkan (15,000 acres) and in Karnatak (6,000 acres) and about 29,000 acres from others were also utilized in a similar way.

CHAPTER III—CROPPED AND IRRIGATED AREAS.

(Tables III and IV, pages 21-33)

(Table IV-A, page 34)

6. Total Areas under Crops and Irrigation.—The total area under crops showed an increase of 817,000 acres or 2·8 per cent. during the year under report, the increase being shared by Gujarat, Deccan and Karnatak, while there was a slight decrease in the Konkan. The total area under irrigation showed a reduction of 23,000 acres or by 2·4 per cent.

7. Food Crops—(a) Total Area.—Among the main food crops the total area under rice showed a decrease of 108,000 acres or 5·1 per cent. as compared with that of the previous year. The decrease being shared by the Deccan, Gujarat and Konkan. The decrease is markedly in Poona and Ratnagiri District and is not due to any unfavourable season but due to incorrect acreage reported in the past by the Revenue authorities. Against this the Karnatak showed a slight increase. In the case of wheat the total area increased by 233,000 acres or by 17·5 per cent. mainly in the Deccan, Gujarat and Karnatak due to good rains, favourable prices and the propaganda of Grow More Food Campaign. The area under bajri decreased by 206,000 acres or by 3·9 per cent. during the year under report, the decrease being shared by the Deccan and Gujarat. Against this, there was a slight increase in the Karnatak, especially in the Bijapur District due to favourable and adequate rainfall. The area under gram advanced by 60,000 acres or by 14·3 per cent. as compared with the previous year, the increase being shared by all the Divisions of the Province except Gujarat. The area under jowar increased by 208,000 acres or by 2·8 per cent. during the year under report, the increase being shared by almost all the districts in the Deccan and Karnatak.

(b) Irrigated Area.—The irrigated area under rice remained almost stationary as compared with the previous year. The area under wheat showed a reduction of 20,000 acres or by 10·5 per cent. In the case of jowar, the area decreased by 8,000 acres or by 2·8 per cent., the decrease being mostly in the Deccan and Gujarat. The area under bajri showed a reduction of 10,000 acres or by 12·3 per cent. the decrease being shared mostly by the Deccan. Under sugarcane, the area which is mostly irrigated showed an increase of 10,000 acres or by 9·5 per cent. during the year under report. The area under fruits and vegetables remained almost stationary as compared with the previous year.

8. Non-Food Crops.—The total area under cotton advanced by 186,000 acres or by 6·5 per cent. The irrigated area under cotton, on the other hand, showed a decline of 7,000 acres or by 57·7 per cent. as compared with the previous year due mainly to insufficient supply of water from irrigation sources. The tobacco acreage also decreased by 24,000 acres or by 18·7 per cent. during the year under report, the decrease being shared mainly by the Deccan and Karnatak. The total area under oil-seeds increased by 184,000 acres or by 8·9 per cent. as compared with the previous year, the increase being shared by all the divisions of the Province except Konkan. Among oil-seeds, the area under groundnut advanced by 99,000 acres or by 7·8 per cent., while under sesamum the area showed a reduction of 31,000 acres or by 15·6 per cent. during the year under report.

9. *Kharif and Rabi Areas.*—The following table compares the areas under Kharif and Rabi crops during the year under report with those of the preceding two years :—

It will be seen from the above table that the Kharif area during the year under report showed a decline below that of the last year (1942-43), but it showed an increase over the year 1941-42. The rabi area showed an increase over that of the last year, 1942-43, but a decline below that of the year 1941-42. The net result of these variations was that the total area under cereals and pulses increased by 295,000 acres or by 1·4 per cent, over the area under these crops during the last year (1942-43) and by 1,068,000 acres or by 5·4 per cent, over the year 1941-42.

10. *Area irrigated from different Sources of Irrigation.*—The area irrigated by Government Canals increased by 14,000 acres or by 5 per cent, as compared with the previous year, the increase being mainly noticeable in the Deccan. Irrigation by private canals, on the other hand showed a decrease of 1,000 acres or by 1·7 per cent. Well irrigation declined by 53,000 acres or by 8·5 per cent, during the year under report, the decrease being shared by all the Divisions. The area irrigated by tanks showed a decrease of about 11,000 acres or by 7·1 per cent, while the area irrigated from other sources increased by 21,000 acres or by 81·5 per cent, as compared with the previous year, the increase being noticeable in all the Divisions of the Province.

The ratio of irrigated area to the net cropped area was 4·0 per cent, during the year under report.

CHAPTER IV—OUTTURN OF CROPS.

(Table V, pages 35-37 and V-A, pages 38-54)

11. *Kharif Crops.*—Among food grain crops, the estimated outturn of rice, jowar and bajri ranged between 53 and 92, 50 and 87 and 50 and 76 per cent, respectively of the normal in the Province. Sesamum yielded between 50 and 92 per cent, of the normal.

The yield of cotton varied from 56 to 89 per cent, of the normal.

12. *Rabi Crops.*—The outturn of wheat ranged between 50 and 78 per cent, of the normal except in Thana district where it was full normal. The outturn of jowar varied from 58 to 85 per cent. The yield of gram was between 53 and 92 per cent, while that of tobacco ranged between 50 to 92 except in Bijapur district where it was only 42 per cent, of the normal.

Among oil seeds linseed returned between 50 and 83 per cent. of the normal, while in the case of rape and mustard, the yield varied from 50 to 75 per cent., but in Surat district it was as much as 93 per cent. Sugarcane which is a perennial crop returned between 67 per cent. of the normal and a full normal yield while in Sholapur district it was as much as 125 per cent. of the normal.

13. *Cotton.*—As regards the actual outturn of cotton as estimated by the number of bales, it may be stated that so far as the area factor in the Bombay Province including Indian States is concerned, there was an increase of 164,000 acres or by 4·0 per cent. when compared with the previous year. The total area stood at 4,265,000 acres during the year under report as against 4,101,000 acres in the preceding year. The total outturn in the Province including Indian States also increased by 135,000 bales or by 18·2 per cent., i.e. from 744,000 bales in the previous year to 879,000 bales during the year under report.

CHAPTER V—PRICES.

(Table VI, pages 55-57)

14. The following remarks indicate the major variations in the average prices, prevailing at harvest time, of the principle articles as compared with those of the previous year:—

The average price of rice ruled higher by about one seer to one and one-half seer per rupee, and that of wheat showed slight variations. The average price of jowar was dearer from about one and one-half seer to nearly two and three-fourth seers per rupee, of bajri from one and one-half seer to nearly two seers per rupee in all the Divisions of the Province. Except in the Karnatak where the average price of tur dal was a little cheaper, it was dearer elsewhere from one-half of a seer to one and one-sixth seer per rupee; the price of gram ruled dearer from one-half of a seer to one seer per rupee, while that of Nachni rose from one and four-fifth of a seer to three seers per rupee. The average price of gur showed slight variations, while that of tobacco was higher from one-sixth of a seer to one and one-third seer per rupee.

15. The following table compares the prices of Broach cotton ruling at Bombay during the year under report with those of the previous year and the average of the preceding five years. The price of Jarila cotton at Bombay was given last year and has also been given this year as prices of Khandesh and Kumta descriptions of cotton (for which prices were quoted in previous years) were not available during those two years, these being not tenderable under the new Indian Cotton Contract.

It will be seen from the above table that the prices of both the varieties (Broach and Jarila) of cotton were somewhat lower than those of the previous year and this fall in price was chiefly due to less demand by the mills owing to shortage of coal. The price of Broach cotton during this year as in the previous year showed, however, an abnormal rise over the average price of the preceding five years mainly due to war situation. In the subjoined table the prices of Broach cotton ruling at Bombay have been given for those months for which they were available :—

The average price of dry grass ruled higher from two and a half annas to fourteen annas per Indian Maund and that of *jowari kadbi* rose by one and one-half rupee in the Karnatak, the price being nearly stationary in the remaining Divisions of the Province. The price of rice straw in the Konkan was higher by about ten annas per Indian maund.

CHAPTER VI—AGRICULTURAL STOCK.

(Table VII, pages 58-61).

16. Under Government orders contained in Government Resolution, Revenue Department, No. 5072/28, dated 19th January 1944, the special annual cattle census was taken in February-March 1944 and the result of it is given in detail in the Table VII.

Appendix E summarises the total strength under each main head during the year under review (i.e. 1943-44) as compared with the last quinquennial census of livestock held in 1939-40.

Variations in total number of cattle and buffaloes.—The total number of cattle and buffaloes is now returned at 92.36 lakhs. This is 5.1 per cent. below the figure of 1939-40.

For breeding purposes (bulls and bull-buffaloes).—The total number under this head increased by 31,000 or by 58.5 per cent. as compared with the last census. The increase was contributed by almost the whole of Karnatak and part of the Deccan.

For milk production (cows and she-buffaloes).—These showed a decrease of 641,000 in number or by 19.6 per cent. as compared with the census of 1939-40. The decrease was noticed in all the Divisions of the Province. The decrease was mainly due to famine conditions and cattle diseases.

Young stock.—The number under this head showed a decline of 842,000 in number or 11.7 per cent. as compared with that of 1939-40. The decrease

was shared by many of the districts in Gujarat, Karnatak, Konkan and part of the Deccan.

Cattle for work and not in use for breeding.—The number under this head showed an increase of 454,000 or 13·1 per cent. over that of 1939-40.

Sheep.—The total number of sheep showed a decline of 116,000 in number or 5·5 per cent. as compared with the last census of 1939-40. The decrease was shared by all the divisions of the Province except Deccan where there was some increase.

Goats.—The number under this head showed a decline of 95,000 in number or 3·3 per cent. as compared with the figure of the last census. The decrease was shared by all the divisions of the Province.

CHAPTERS VII AND VIII—CONDITION OF THE AGRICULTURAL POPULATION.

17. As already stated in Chapter I of the Report, the Season under review was on the whole satisfactory and proved better than the preceding year. The season would have been better but for excess kharif rains in Gujarat and Deccan and deficient rains in south eastern regions of the Province. The scarcity and famine conditions in Bijapur and part of Sholapur that prevailed in the preceding year improved a good deal in that tract during the year under report.

18. Taking the Province as a whole there was an appreciable increase in the food crop production during the year under report as compared with the previous year. As a result there was a general sufficiency of food and fodder all over the Province except in Bijapur where the situation was not so satisfactory as it should be owing to the past two scarcity years. The following tabular statement compares the actual acreage sown and the estimated tonnage of foodgrain crops produced in different Divisions of the Province during the years 1942-43 and 1943-44:—

19. The above table indicates that there is a general increase in acreage and outturn and it is mainly due to favourable season and vigorous propaganda of the "Grow More Food Crops Campaign". The reduction in acreage in Gujarat, South Deccan and Konkan is mainly due to reduction in the area under rice and bajri in Gujarat due to unfavourable season, reduction in the area under rice, jowar and wheat in Poona and of bajri in Sholapur and

Ahmednagar and of rice in Ratnagiri. The reduction of acreage under rice and jowar in Poona and of rice in Ratnagiri is not due to any unfavourable season but due to more accurate estimates proposed by the Revenue Authorities during the year under report by field to field inspection against the rough estimates supplied during the past year. The increase in the acreage and outturn in Karnatak during the year under report is shared by all the districts in Karnatak and is due to favourable season.

20. During the year under report, the economic conditions resulting from the world war continued to influence the prices of agricultural products which maintained their upward trend. The pressure on transport facilities continued. Speculation in and hoarding of food grains and other commodities were checked by Government by taking timely and widespread measures. Prices of all foodgrain crops were controlled and organised distribution (rationing system) was undertaken in all important cities of the Province. Public confidence was thus restored and it had a stabilising effect on prices of agricultural products.

21. The following is a statement of prices prevailing at harvest time for agricultural products:—

22. The economic condition of agricultural population was on the whole satisfactory as the agriculturists realised better prices for food crops and concessions from Government under the "Grow More Food Campaign". Agriculturists took keen interest in agriculture by intensive and extensive cultivation and by bringing uncultivated land into cultivation. On the other hand they had to face adverse circumstances owing to shortage of agricultural land-less labour which migrated to industrial and textile concerns in urban areas. The cost of cultivation increased due to the difficulty of securing compost and farm yard manure and groundnut cake and other manures. This condition has aggravated due to abnormal rise in the prices of fodder, wooden and iron implements and machinery required for agricultural purposes and of working cattle required for farming.

23. Owing to intensive propaganda carried on under the "Grow More Food Campaign" there has been general increase in the area under food crops and proportionate decrease under non-food crops like tobacco. More land and lands not cultivated hitherto were brought under cultivation. The concessions offered by Government, coupled with the assurance given to the cultivators for the purchase of their produce, helped the situation.

24. The condition of cattle was generally satisfactory. Owing to pressure on land, the prices of working cattle increased abnormally. Haemorrhagic Septicæmia, rinderpest, foot and mouth and other animal diseases prevailed as usual but it did not assume such proportion, as to seriously interfere with the normal progress of agricultural operations, except in North Gujarat and South Konkan.

25. Owing to the intensification of war efforts there was a large demand for labour for various military, textile and industrial concerns and the wages of labour in general and along with it of agricultural labour in particular exhibited an upward tendency as compared with those ruling during the preceding year.
