### Introduction

The Ministry of Education and Social Welfare publishes the statistics of education in India annually in their publication 'Education in India Vol. I and Vol. II'. These publications give the statistics at the national and state levels, but do not provide district-wise statistics.

2. To fill up this gap, the National Council of Educational Research and Training brought out a volume entitled 'Educational Statistics: District-wise giving the bench mark of educational data of various kinds for all districts for the year 1960-61. To make inter-district comparison possible, some important indices such as enrolment ratios, percentages of trained teachers and per capita expenditure on education were also given. These comparative statements show a wide range of variation between the districts in every respect.

3. It had been decided to have a similar review of educational development in the districts for the year 1965-66. Such periodic reviews are necessary for several reasons. For instance, they help to judge the effectiveness of the measures taken to correct regional imbalances at the district level. Secondly, such collection and publication of data on different aspects of education at the district level help in the preparation of educational development plans for the districts, so that, they can be adopted, as recommended by the Education Commission, as the principal unit for administration, planning and development of school education.

4. It was also decided that in case of State of Punjab which was a composite State in 1965-66 but was reorganised with effect from 1.11.1966, district-wise statistics might be published separately for the reorganised States of Punjab & Haryana and the Union Territory of Himachal

Pradesh on the basis of the areas of these units as on 1.11.1966. District-wise statistics for the reorganised States of Punjab and Haryana have already been published. There were ten districts in the reorganised territory of Himachal Pradesh which came into being after merging the hilly areas of composite Punjab. After becoming a State in 1971 the number of districts in Himachal Pradesh has increased from ten to twelve by reorganisation of the districts. The present volume gives data for each of the ten districts of Himachal Pradesh on number of educational institutions, pupils, teachers, expenditure etc., at all levels of education. To make inter-district comparisons possible, some important indices such as enrolment ratios, percentages of trained teachers, per capita expenditure on education etc. are also given.

5. The Ministry of Education and Social Welfare takes this opportunity to express its appreciation of the cooperation and help received from the Director of Education, Himachal Pradesh and other educational authorities in the State.

I. SUMMARY

In 1965-66 the State of Himachal Pradesh with an area of 56,019 sq. kms. and an estimated population of 32.2 lakhs, consisted of 10 districts. About 4,208 educational institutions catered to the educational needs of the people of the State. The total enrolment in all types of educational institutions during the year was 5.04 lakhs. This constituted 15.7 percent of the total population of the State. The percentage of enrolment at primary stage of education to the population of corresponding age-group 6-11 was 85.9 in the State as compared to the all India average of about 80 percent. Facilities for Middle School education were provided to 38.7 percent of the population of the age-groups 11-14 as compared to all India average of 30.8 percent.

The total number of teachers employed in all <sup>types</sup> educational institutions was 18,630, of whom 19.2 percent were women. The average number of teachers per thousand of population was 5.8. The teacher pupil ratio in Primary, Middle and Secondary Schools was 1:31, 1:24 and 1:25 respectively.

The total direct expenditure on educational institutions was Rs.394.31 lakhs during 1965-66. About 92.2 percent of this expenditure was met from Government funds.

The per capita expenditure on education (by population) was Rs.12.2. The average annual cost per pupil in Primary Schools, Middle Schools and Secondary Schools was Rs.52.7, Rs.90.5 and Rs.105.6 respectively. The average annual cost per student in Arts and Science Colleges was as high as Rs.427.5.

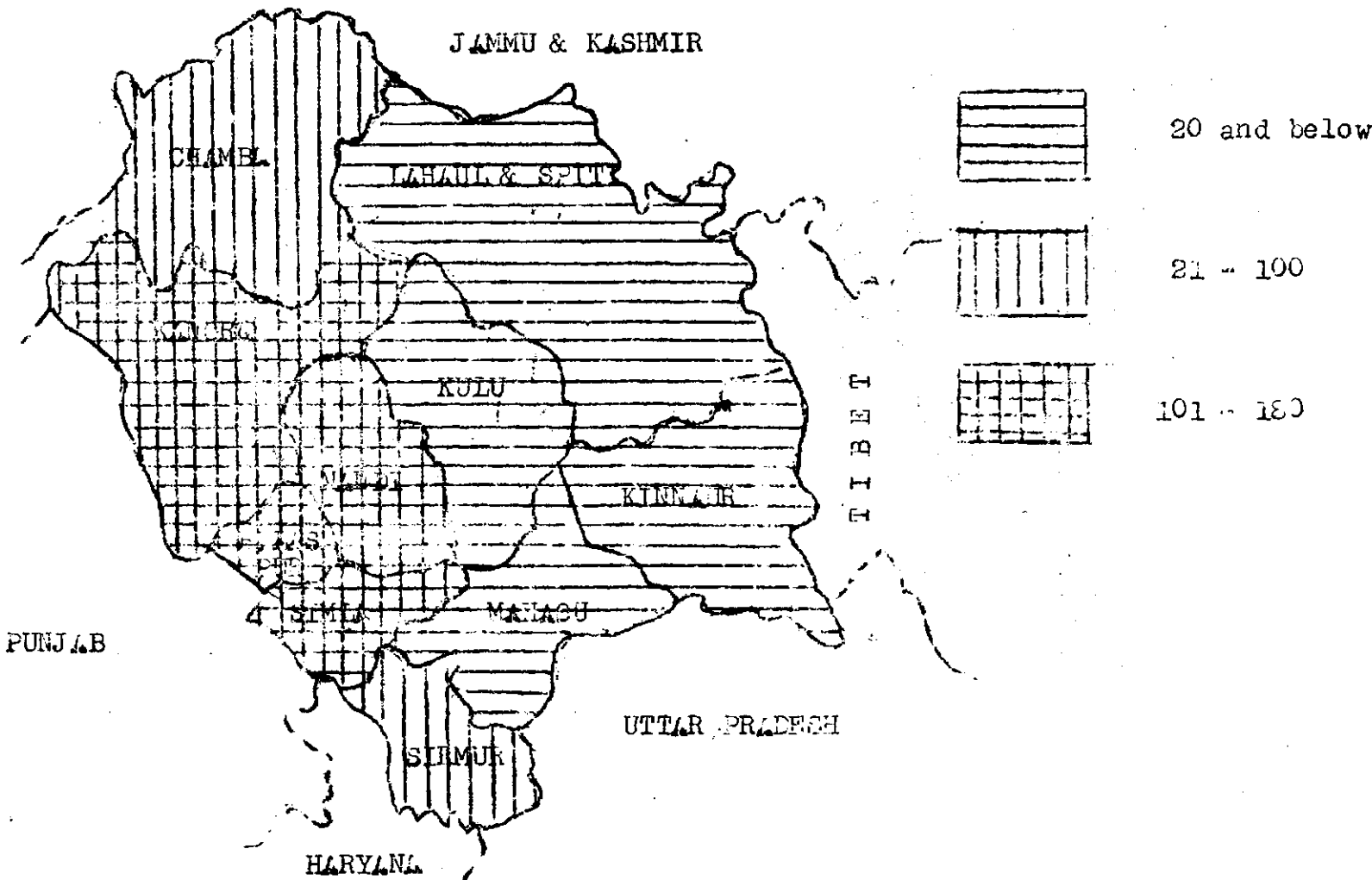
## II. AREA AND POPULATION

As on 1.11.1966, the reorganised Territory of Himachal Pradesh consisted of 10 districts. Now there are twelve districts in the State of Himachal Pradesh. The total area of the State is 56,019 sq. kms. The area of the ten districts varied from 1,163 sq. kms. in case of Bilaspur to 9,705 sq. kms. in Kulu. The population of the areas which now form Himachal Pradesh was 2,812.5 thousands in 1961. It is estimated to have increased to 3,820 thousand by 1966. The overall density of population per square km. in 1966 for the Territory was 57, varying from 162 per square km. in case of Kangra to 2 per square km. in respect of Lahaul & Spiti.

The total population of the children of the age-group 6-11 in 1966 was 4,17,000 (2,15,000 boys and 2,02,000 girls), which was 12.9 percent of the total population of the Territory. The number of children in the age-group 11-14 in 1966 was 2,21,000 (1,15,000 boys and 1,06,000 girls), which constituted 6.9 percent of the total population of the Territory. The population of the age-group 14-17 was 2,03,000 (1,05,000 boys and 98,000 girls). This formed 6.3 percent of the total population of the Territory. In the age-group 17-23, the population is estimated to be 3,50,000 (1,80,000 males and 1,70,000 females) and this formed 10.9 percent of the total population of the Territory. The population in the age-group 6-23 constituted 37 percent of the total population. The distribution of the population in the different age-groups, district-wise is given in Statement-II.

III. TOTAL NUMBER OF EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS PUPILS, TEACHERS AND EXPENDITURE  
INSTITUTIONS AND ENROLMENT

The total number of educational institutions in Himachal Pradesh was 4,208 in 1965-66. The total enrolment in all types of educational institutions during the year was 5,04,148 consisting of 3,44,289 boys and 1,59,859 girls. The sex ratio was 46 girls for every 100 boys enrolled in 1965-66. Among the districts, this ratio varied from 30 in Chamba to 65 in Simla. The total enrolment in educational institutions constituted 15.7 percent of the total population of the Territory. District-wise details are given in Statement III.

TEACHERS AND EXPENDITURE

The total number of teachers in all educational institutions in Himachal Pradesh was 18,630 of which 3,685 (20.4 percent) were women teachers. The average number of teachers per thousand of population was 5.8 in 1965-66 in the Territory.

The total direct expenditure on educational institutions was Rs.3,94,30,773. The expenditure per head of population in the Territory was Rs.12.2. The total direct expenditure incurred on educational institutions varies from Rs.1,47,57,899 in Kangra to Rs.5,29,117 in Lahaul & Spiti.

Percentage of distribution to total direct expenditure on educational institutions by different sources in 1965-66 is given in Statement-IV. It can be seen that 92.2 percent of the total direct expenditure on all educational institutions in Himachal Pradesh was met from Governments Funds, 4.9 percent from Fees, 0.2 percent from Local Boards Funds and the

remaining 2.7 percent from other sources. District-wise details are also given in that Statement.

#### IV. PRE-PRIMARY EDUCATION

All the districts of Himachal Pradesh except the districts of Kulu, Lahaul & Spiti and Simla had facilities for pre-primary education. The total number of pre-primary schools in 1965-66 was 13. The enrolment in these schools was 546. The number of teachers teaching in these schools was only 24. All the teachers were females and all were trained. The total annual expenditure incurred on these schools was Rs.47,507, giving an average annual cost per student as Rs.87.

#### V. PRIMARY EDUCATION

##### NUMBER OF SCHOOLS

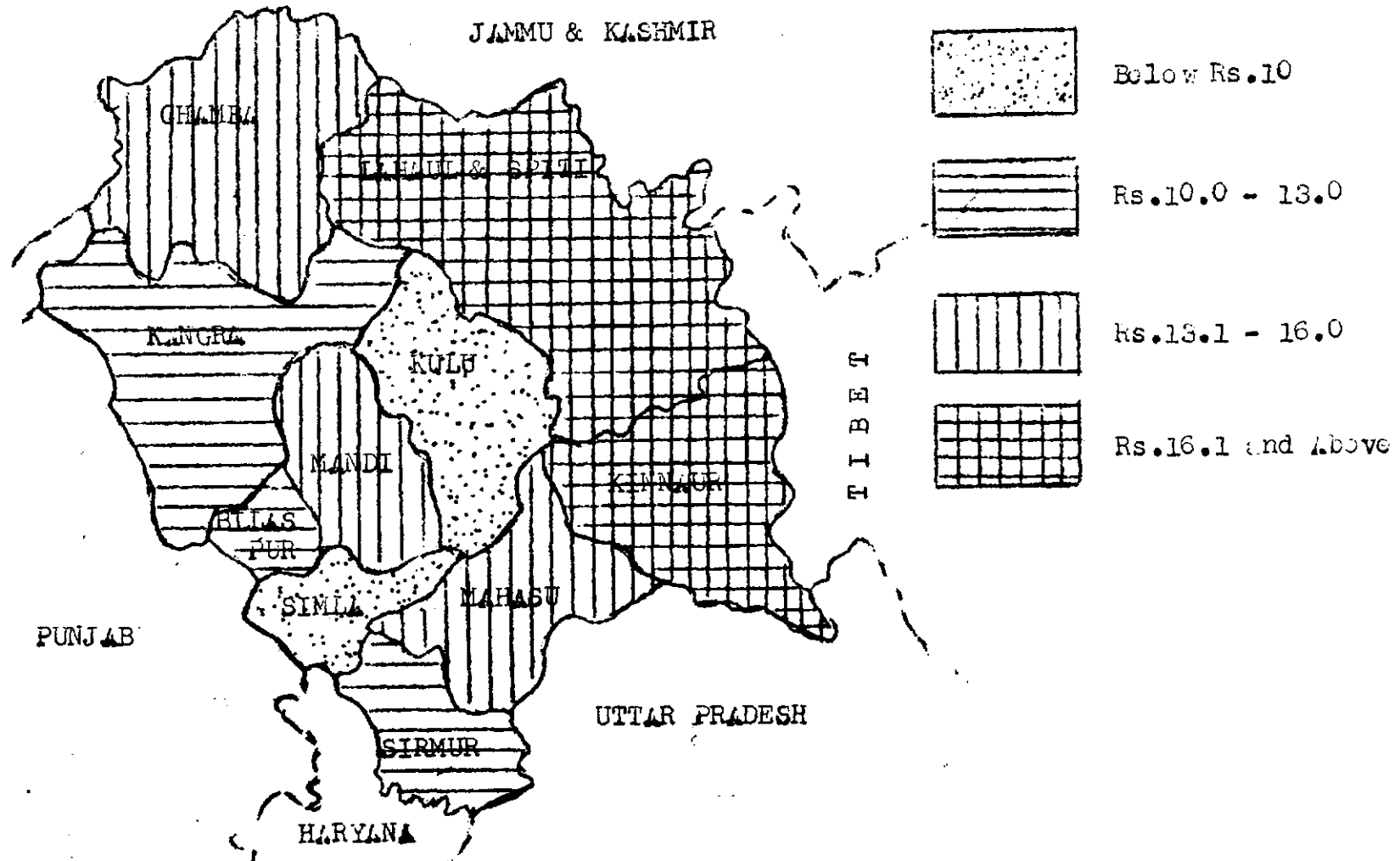
The total number of Primary schools in Himachal Pradesh during the year 1965-66 was 3,358. The area served by a primary School on an average was 16.7 sq. kms. District-wise details are given in Statement VI.

##### ENROLMENT

The enrolment in classes I to V in the State was 3,58,319 (2,28,845 boys and 1,29,474 girls) during 1965-66. The percentage of enrolment in classes I to V to the total population of the age-group 6-11, which gives an index of the facilities available at the primary stage of education in the Territory, was 85.9. In case of boys this percentage was 106.4 as compared to 64.1 in case of girls. District-wise details are given in Statement VII.

Statement VIII contains data relating to enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in Classes I-V in 1965-66. The total number of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes students enrolled in Classes I-V during 1965-66 was 62,047 comprising of 43,768 boys and 18,279 girls. The Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe children formed 17.3 percent of the total enrolment in classes I to V. The corresponding percentages were 19.1 for boys and 14.1 for girls.

#### TEACHERS

The total number of teachers catering to the needs of primary education in Himachal Pradesh during 1965-66 was 7,926. Of the total 19.2 percent were women teachers. As will be seen from Statement IX, Kinnaur District with 4.4% of women teachers in Primary schools was at the lowest ebb, as against the highest figures of 29.4 percent in respect of Sirmur District. 76.9 percent of the total number of primary school teachers were trained. Among males 75.1 percent were trained and among females 84.2 percent were trained.

The teacher-pupil ratio in primary schools in the territory was 1:31. However, it was very high viz. 1:44 in case of Kangra District and was only 1:15 in case of Chamba District.

#### EXPENDITURE

The amount incurred as direct expenditure on Primary Schools in 1965-66 was Rs.1,31,14,491. This amount was 33.3 percent of the total direct expenditure on education in Himachal Pradesh. The per capita expenditure on Primary Schools was Rs.4.1 while the while the average annual cost per pupil in primary schools was Rs.52.7.

## VI. MIDDLE SCHOOL EDUCATION

### NUMBER OF SCHOOLS

The number of middle schools in 1965-66 was 492. The population served by a middle school was 6,545 during 1965-66. District-wise details are given in Statement-XI.

### ENROLMENT

The enrolment in classes VI to VIII in Himachal Pradesh in 1965-66 was 85,601 of which 16,714 were girls. The percentage of enrolment in classes VI to VIII to the population in the age-group 11-14 gives an index of the facilities available at the middle stage of education. In Himachal Pradesh, the percentage of enrolment in classes VI to VIII to the population in the age-group 11-14 was 38.7 (59.9 percent for boys and 15.8 percent for girls). The District-wise details are given in Statement XII.

The percentage of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe Students to the total enrolment in classes VI to VIII in 1965-66 was 15.3. The corresponding percentages for boys was 15.9 and for girls it was 12.9.

### TEACHERS

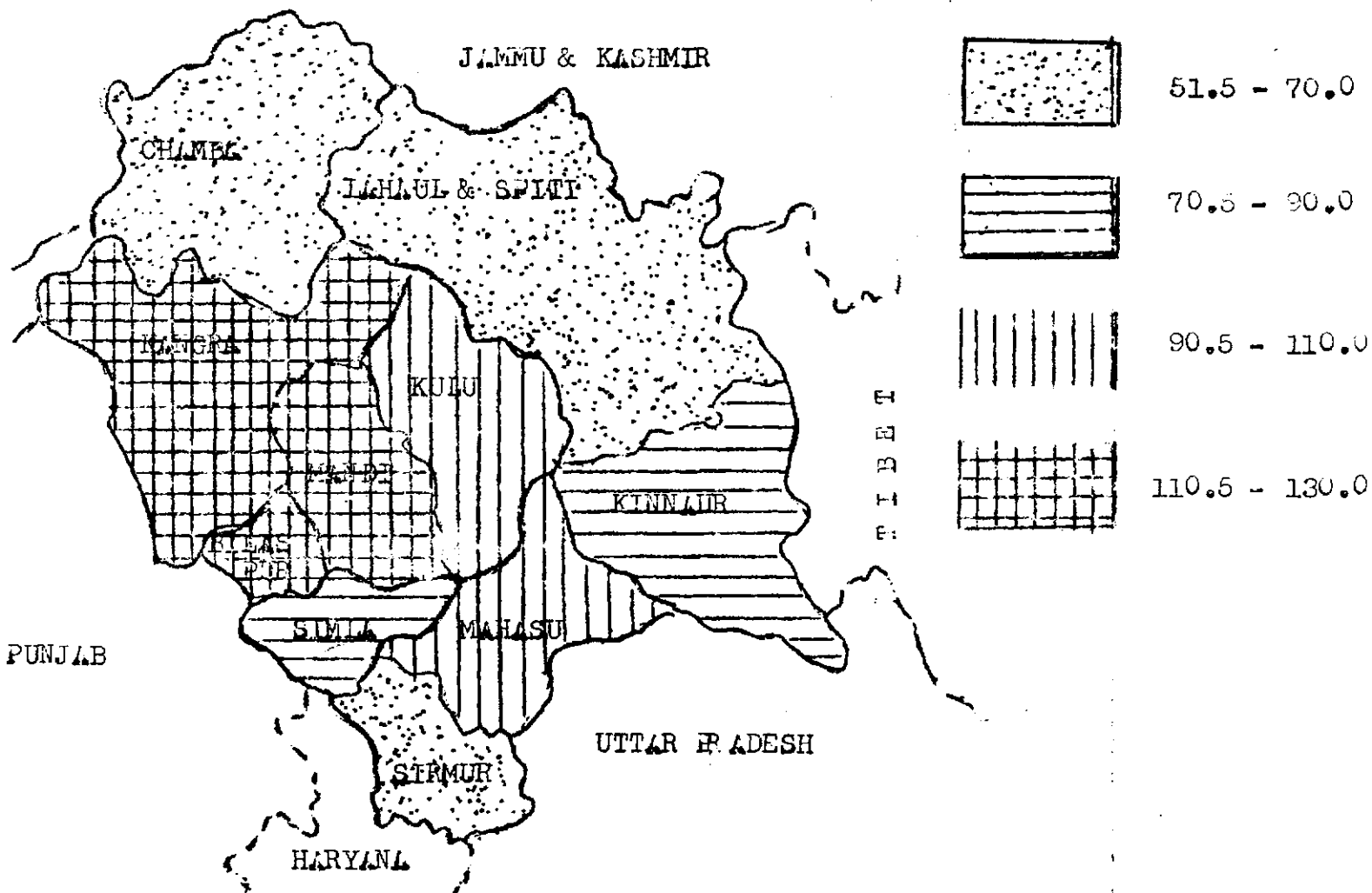
There were 3,702 teachers in middle schools in Himachal Pradesh in 1965-66. Of these, 19.6 percent were women. The percentage of trained teachers was 84.7 (Men teachers 83.7 percent and women teachers 88.8 percent). The statement XIV indicates the position of trained teachers in each district.

Teacher pupil ratio in middle schools in the territory in 1965-66 was 1:24. It

Percentage Enrolment in Classes I-V to population in the Age-Group 6-11 (boys) - 1965-66

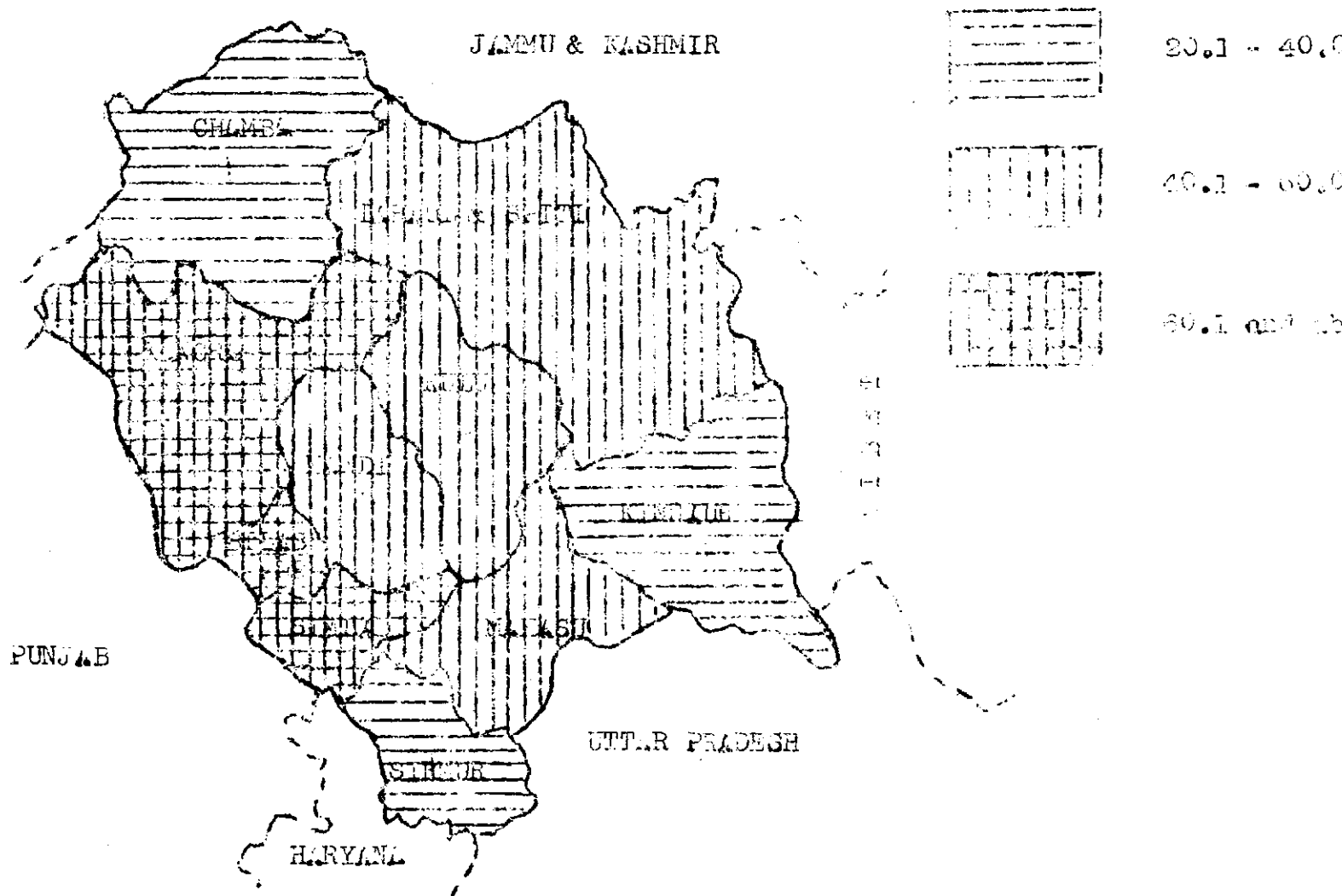

was very high viz. 1:39 in case of Kangra district and was very low i.e. 1:4 in case of Lahaul & Spiti.

EXPENDITURE

The total direct expenditure on middle schools in Himachal Pradesh during the year 1965-66 was Rs.79,17,821. The percentage of expenditure incurred on middle schools to the total direct expenditure was 20.1. The direct expenditure per capita on middle schools was Rs.2.5 in 1965-66 at the State level. The average direct expenditure per student per annum in middle schools in Himachal Pradesh in 1965-66 was Rs.90.5. The cost per student per annum in middle school varied from Rs.726.3 in Lahaul & Spiti to Rs.39.0 in Simla. The District-wise position is given in Statement XV.

TRANSFER RATE FROM PRIMARY SCHOOL STAGE TO MIDDLE SCHOOL STAGE

Generally, the transfer rate from primary stage to middle stage is calculated with the enrolment of Class VI in a particular year as a percentage of enrolment of Class V in the previous year. However, since the class-wise enrolment is not available for each district separately and also because the district-wise statistics are not available for consecutive years, the transfer rate has been calculated with the enrolment of classes VI-VIII as a percentage of enrolment in classes I-V in the same year. District-wise transfer rates calculated as stated above are given in the table below:-

Among the boys, the lowest transfer rate from primary stage to middle stage was in Kinnaur (15.2%) and the highest was in Sirmur (56.8%). In the case of girls the lowest transfer rate was observed in Kinnaur (7.4%) and the highest was in Sirmur. Taking both boys and girls together, the lowest transfer rate was in Kinnaur (12.9%) and the highest rate was in Sirmur (54.7%). The transfer rate for the territory as a whole was 30.1 percent in case of boys, 12.9 percent in case of girls and 23.9 percent for all children.

VII - HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION

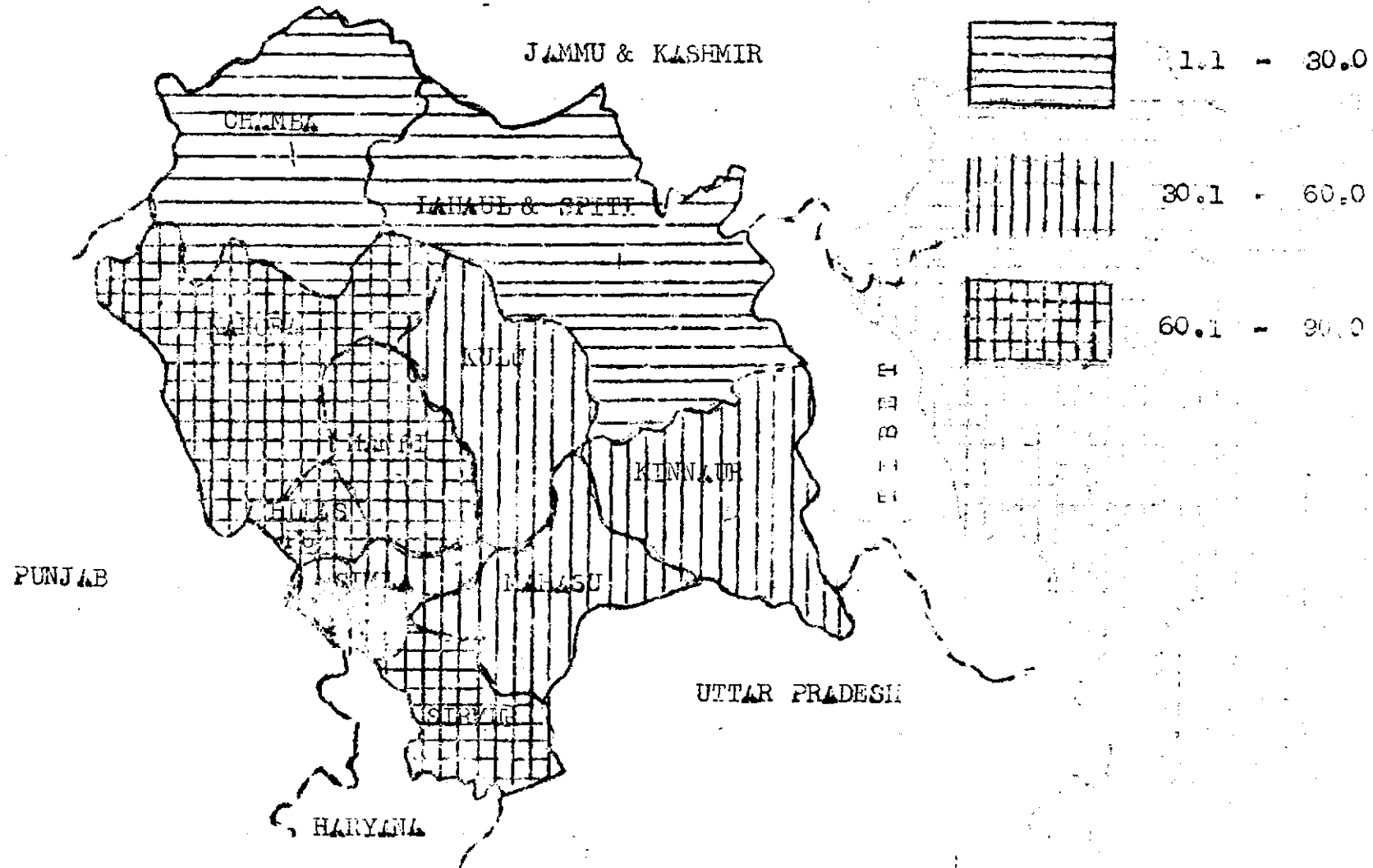
NUMBER OF SCHOOLS

The number of high/higher secondary schools in Himachal Pradesh was 306 in 1965-66. The area in sq. kms. served by a high/higher secondary school in the territory as a whole

Percentage Enrolment in Classes VI-VIII to population in the Age-Group 11-14 (Boys) - 1965-66

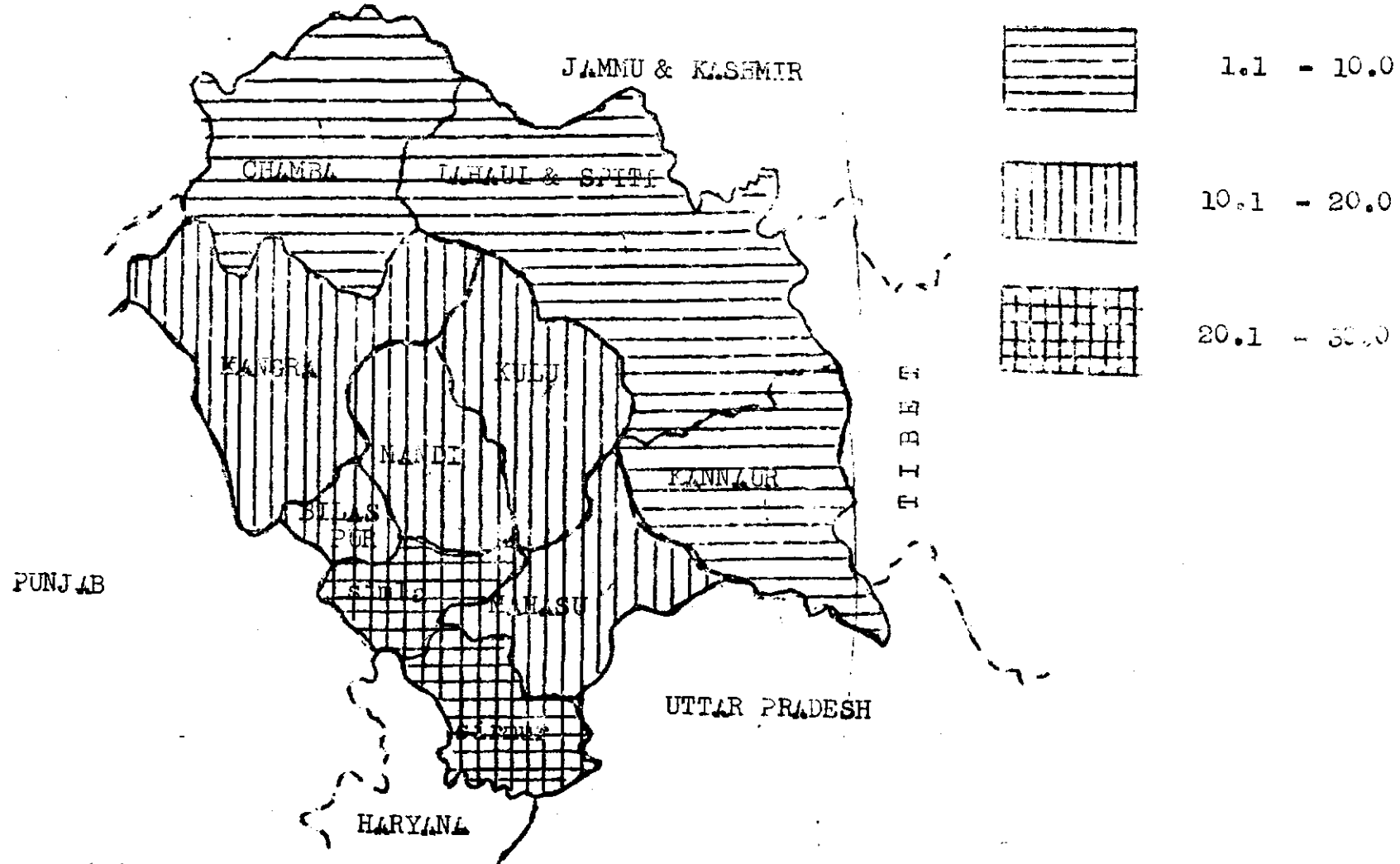

was 183.1. The average population served by a high/higher secondary school was 10,523. District-wise details are given in Statement XVI.

#### ENROLMENT

The total enrolment in classes IX-XI in 1965-66 was 33,339 of which 5,521 were girls. The percentage enrolment in classes IX to XI to the population in the age-group 14-17 was 16.4. The corresponding percentages for boys and girls were 26.5 and 5.6 respectively. Statement XVII gives the district-wise details.

Statement XVIII gives the enrolment of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students in classes IX to XI. The number of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students enrolled in classes IX-XI in Himachal Pradesh during the year 1965-66 was 3,421. Of these, 3,065 were boys and 356 were girls. The percentage of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students to total enrolment was 10.3. In case of boys this percentage was 11.0 and in case of girls it was 6.4.

#### TEACHERS

The number of teachers teaching in high/higher secondary schools in Himachal Pradesh during the year 1965-66 was 5,728. There were 1,294 women teachers. 88.4 percent of the total number of teachers in high/higher secondary schools were trained. District-wise details are given in Statement XIX. The pupil teacher ratio in high/higher secondary schools was 1:25 in 1965-66. The ratio varied from 1:33 in case of Kulu district to 1:12 in Chamba district.

#### EXPENDITURE

The total direct expenditure on high/higher secondary schools in 1965-66 was Rs.1,49,04,271.

It formed 37.8 percent of the total direct expenditure incurred on educational institutions in the territory during the year 1965-6

The per capita expenditure on high/higher secondary schools was Rs.4.6 in 1965-66. The cost per student in high/higher secondary schools in the territory was Rs.105.6. Statement XX shows district-wise details of the expenditure.

TRANSFER RATE FROM MIDDLE SCHOOL STAGE TO HIGH SCHOOL STAGE

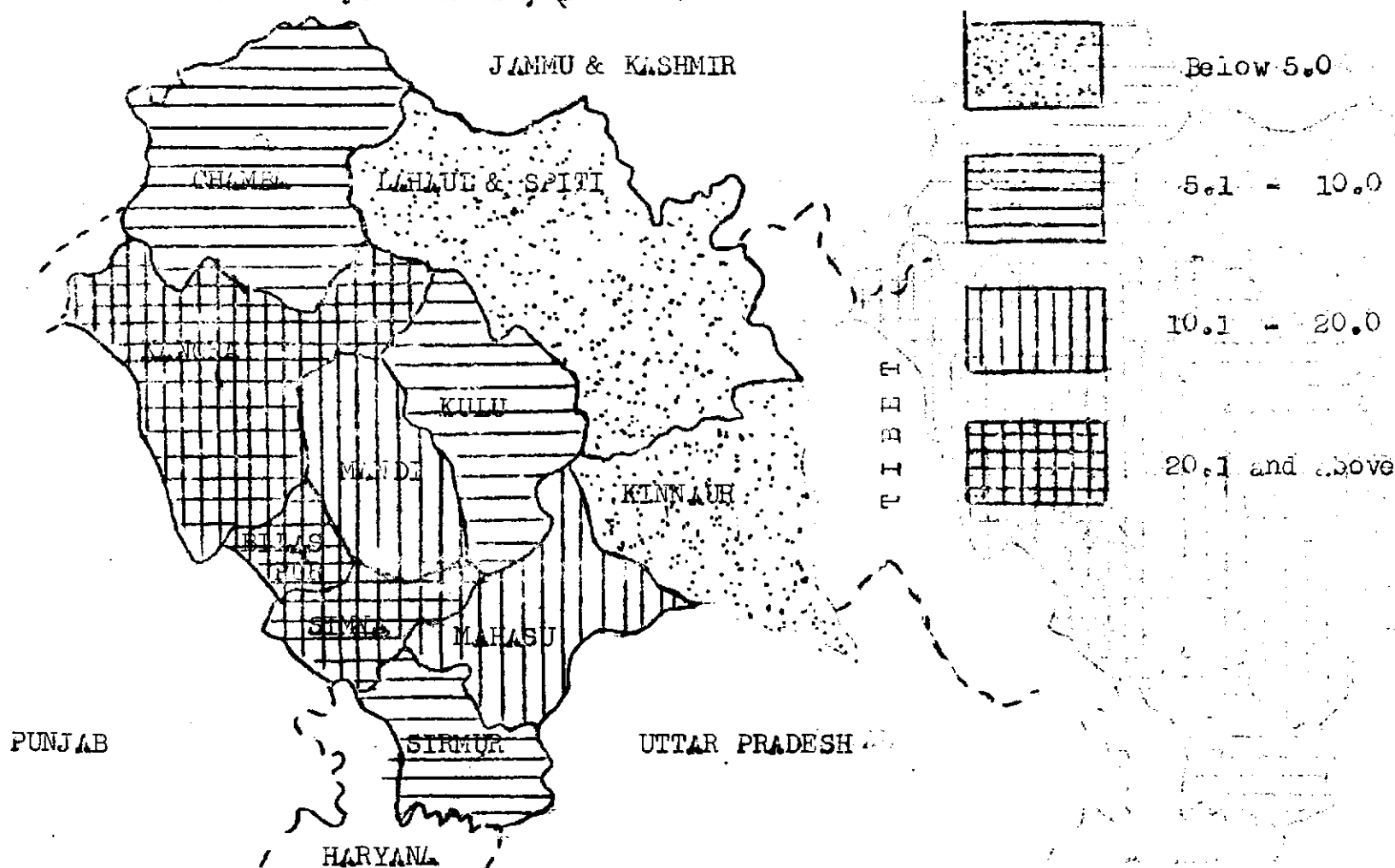
Since the class-wise enrolment for each district at the middle stage as well as at the high school stage is not available, the transfer rate has been calculated with the enrolment in classes IX to XI as percentage of enrolment in classes VI to VIII of the same year. The transfer rate from middle to secondary stage was 38.9 in 1965-66. The corresponding figure for boys was 40.4 and for girls it was 33.0. District-wise position of transfer rate in 1965-66 is given below:-

Among the boys, the lowest transfer rate of 15.4 percent from middle stage to high school stage was in Sirmur district. The highest transfer rate of 69.2 percent was observed in Simla. In the case of girls the lowest transfer rate was noted in Lahaul & Spiti and the highest transfer rate was observed in Simla. Taking the both boys and girls together, the lowest transfer rate was in Sirmur (16.6 percent) and the highest rate was in Simla (66.8 percent). At the State level the transfer rate was 40.4 percent in case of boys, it was 33.0 in case of girls and 38.9 percent in case of all children.

#### VIII. TEACHER TRAINING INSTITUTIONS

There were only 18 teacher training institutions in Himachal Pradesh during the year 1965-66. Of these, 15 were of under-graduate standard and only 3 were of post-graduate standard. The total enrolment in these institutions was 2,232. District-wise position is given in Statement XXI.

#### IX. HIGHER EDUCATION

##### INSTITUTIONS

The total number of institutions for higher education in the Territory in 1965-66 was 24. Of these, 11 were arts and science colleges, 3 were engineering colleges, 3 were teacher training colleges (Post-Graduate Standard) and 7 were colleges for Other professional and special education. Except Kinnaur, Kulu and Lahaul & Spiti, each district of Himachal Pradesh had one or more arts and Science colleges. District-wise details are given in Statement XXII.



ENROLMENT

During 1965-66, the total enrolment in institutions for higher education in Himachal Pradesh was 7,199. Of these 4,036 students were studying in arts and science colleges, 624 in engineering colleges, 2,232 in teacher training colleges and the remaining 307 in colleges for other professional and special education. Statement XXIII gives the district-wise details of this enrolment.

Statement XXIV gives the enrolment in classes for higher education by stages of education in 1965-66. There were 6,972 students getting higher education of which 1,907 were girls. Stage-wise distribution shows that 1,340 students (1,212 boys and 128 girls) were enrolled in Pre-University/Intermediate, 1,775 (~~1,235~~ boys and 6,20 girls) in B.A. (Pass and Hons.), 1,149 (620 boys and 529 girls) in B.Sc. (Pass and Hons.), 1,363 (1,262 boys and 1,001 girls) in Teacher Training and 1,005 (907 boys and 98 girls) in other professional and special education. Only 2 percent of the population of the age-group 17-23 in the territory received higher education. In case of boys this percentage was 2.8 and in case of girls it was 1.1.

Total enrolment of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students in classes of higher education in 1965-66 in the territory was 450. Of these, 369 were boys and 81 were girls. The percentage of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students to the total enrolment in higher education was 6.5. The corresponding percentage for boys was 7.3 and for girls 4.2. District-wise details are given in Statement XXV.

TEACHERS

There were 562 teachers in institutions of higher education. 473 were male and 89 were female. The number of teachers teaching in arts and science colleges was 264 and there were 298 teachers in colleges for professional and other education. The pupil-teacher ratio in arts and science colleges was 15. District-wise position is given in Statement XXVI.

EXPENDITURE

The total direct expenditure on higher education during 1965-66 in Himachal Pradesh was Rs. 34,02,827. Of this, Rs. 17,25,385 was spent on arts and science colleges, Rs. 5,36,651 on engineering colleges, Rs. 7,84,620 on teacher training colleges and the remaining Rs. 3,56,171 on other professional and special colleges.

During the period under report the direct expenditure on higher education formed 8.6 per cent of the total direct expenditure on education in the Territory.

The average annual direct expenditure per pupil in case of arts and science colleges in Himachal Pradesh during the year 1965-66 was Rs. 427.5. In case of engineering colleges, it was Rs. 860, and in case of teacher training colleges, it was Rs. 351.5. Districtwise position is given in Statement XXVII.
