Prior to the 72-73 academic session the Instruction at the Primary Stage was Assamese. In some selected schools like Lohitpur, Jairampur etc. in which the student population is predominantly Hindi speaking and in some Border Area Schools the medium of instruction was Hindi. There was a parallel Hindi medium section at Pasighat.

From the 72-73 session a total simultaneous switch-over of the medium of instruction from Assamese Hindi to English has been effected at the Primary Stage as per demand of the local people.

HIGHER SECONDARY SCHOOL STAGE: Prior to 72-73 Assamese was the medium of instruction at the High School Stage (VII to X) for all subjects other than Maths. and Science. Math and Science were taught through the medium of English. The schools - (1) Tawang High School, Kameng District & (2) Jairampur High School in the Itanagar District. In these two schools as in the case of Assamese medium schools Maths and Science were taught through the medium of English. All these schools at the time were affiliated to the Board of Secondary Education, Assam.

All High Schools of A.P. have been converted into Higher Secondary Schools from the 72-73 Session and have since been affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education. The medium of instruction has since been switched over to English from the 72-73 session.

Two types of schools, High (VII to VIII) and Higher Secondary (VIII to XI) were in existence in A.P. prior to 72-73 session; and these school stages
