I N T R O D U C T I O N

This publication, which is brought out annually, gives a detailed analysis of Budget Provisions made by various States and Central Ministries for the development of Education during 1983-83. As per the set pattern, Budget Estimates for 1983-83 also include the Revised Estimates of the previous year 1981-82 and Actual Expenditure of 1982-83 for various programmes of Education being implemented in the States and at the Centre. The information contained in this publication has been compiled from Demands for Grants of the Central Ministries and the Budget Documents of the States and Union Territories as presented in the State Legislatures.

2. Besides giving all the details in respect of Plan and Non-Plan Expenditure Budgeted for 1983-83 by the States and the Central Ministries for various sectors of Education* it also includes the Expenditure incurred on Research, Training (Formal and Informal) by various Departments in the States and Central Ministries such as Department of Art & Culture, Agriculture, Health, Industry, Labour and Community Development etc. It however, excludes that portion of Budget Provisions which relates to Training facilities provided by the Departments for its own employees for improving their professional skills or for Vocational Training Courses*.

3. The Total amount of Budget Provision made for Education by various Education Departments of States and the Central Ministry of Education & Culture worked out to be Rs.4315.41 crores on Revenue Account (Rs.3997.51 crores in the State Sector and Rs.417.90 crores in the Central Sector) for the year 1983-83*. This is more than the Revised Estimates for 1981-82 both in the States and Central Sectors as it should be the corresponding figures of Revised Estimates for 1981-82 were reported to be as Rs.3919.51 crores (Rs.3546.61 crores in the State Sector and Rs.372.90 crores in the Central Sector) as against the Actual Expenditure of Rs.3374.29 crores (Rs.3150.39 crores in the State Sector and Rs.223.90 crores in the Central Sector).

4» The Total Budget Provisions made for Education for Education for 1933-33 on Revenue Account by the State Education Departments and the Central Ministry of Education constituted 11,5/2 of the Total Budget provisions on the Revenue Account in the State at the Centre, The percentage of Plan Expenditure on this account worked out to be 4.4% The corresponding figures for the previous years were 12,6,5 and 3.3, respectively.

5, Apart from the Revenue account, Education Departments, the Central Ministry of Education, Culture, also make some Budget provision for Capital works. The Budget Estimates on Capital Account (including Loans) for 1932-33 accounted for only Rs.65.54 crores (Rs.55.07 crores in the state sector and Rs.10.47 crores in the Central sector) and it forms only 0.4% of the Total Budget Provision of the country for 1932-33. If we add this expenditure on Capital Account to the Revenue Budget Estimates for Education, then the Total Budget Estimates for Education for 1932-33 in respect of State Education Departments and the Central Ministry of Education worked out to be Rs.4330.95 crores and this constitutes 7.9% of the Total Budget of the country.

6, Since Departments other than Departments of Education in the States and the Ministries other than the Central Ministry of Education & Culture also incur some expenditure on Education, it is desirable to add the Budget Estimates of these Departments for Education to get the total picture of public expenditure expended on Education in the country, as compiled in the Statements annexed with the public account, the Total Budget Provisions made by the States and at the Centre worked out to be Rs.37052 crores (Rs.331.99 crores on Plan and Rs.533.53 crores on the non-plan side). If we add this expenditure to the Budget Provisions made by the Education Departments then the Total Budget Provisions for Education on Revenue Account worked out to be Rs.5135.93 crores and this forms 13.3% of the Total Budget of the country in 1932-33 (24.3.5% in case of State sector and 5.3% in case of the Central sector). The percentage of the Plan Expenditure on this account worked out to be 7.4%.

In review of the over-all composition of the Budget Estimates as distributed among various sub-sectors of Education and between plan and non-plan in respect of Central and State sectors of Education Departments, following picture emerges:-

The Total Provision for Suction and Training (For a Union Account) under Revenue account, Capital account and Loans and Advances amounted to Rs. 5251.44 crores, comprising of Rs. 5135.00 crores under Revenue Account, Rs. 52.13 crores under Capital Account and Rs. 13.31 crores under Loans and Advances for the year 1932-33. Percentage of Provision for Education and Training to Total Provision on all the three accounts together (excluding Railway and Posts & Telegraphs) whereas the percentage provision for Education for individual accounts are 13.3% under Revenue Accounts, 0.7% under Capital Account and 0.1% under Loans and Advances respectively.

Augmented Expenditure on Education provided by Government of both the States; Central Government; and Government of Jammu and Kashmir are indicated below in Table (2).

The Total Budget provided for Education by the Education Departments of Jammu and States under all the three accounts (Revenue accounts, Capital Accounts and Loans and Advances) amounted to Rs. 4330.95 crores (Rs. 323.37 crores for Centre, Rs. 1052.58 crores for States) forming 3.05 of the total budget provision on all the three accounts. Out of this amount Rs. 54315.41 crores under Revenue account, Rs. 52.13 crores under Capital Account (outside Investment Account) and Rs. 13.41 crores under Loans and Advances. Corresponding percentage provisions of these accounts to respective Total Budget Provisions are 11.5, 0.7 and 0.13.

Table (3) below summarises the Total Budget provisions (Revenue Account) for Education of Education Departments as well as other Departments with break-up of Plan and Non-Plan provisions for the year 1982-83.

The combined Budget Provisions (Revenue Account) for Education and Training of the Central and Union Territories amounting to Rs. 5135.90 crores comprising of Rs. 4315.41 crores for Education Department and Rs. 820.49 crores for other departments for the year 1932-33. This total Budget for Education constitutes 13.3% for Man and 16.5% for Non-Plan) of the total respectively. Budget (Revenue account excluding Railways and Posts & Telegraphs). Further details of Central and State Budgets is as follows:-

C3.v3v.-1 Budget Provision (Revenue Account) for Education and Training including Grants-in-aid to States and Union Territories is Rs. 511.35 crores, comprising of Rs. 251.37 crores for Plan, Rs. 206.93 crores for Non-Plan. The Government Budget for Education and Training (Formal and Informal Education) constitutes 2.3% for Plan and 2.2% for Non-Plan) of the Total Central Budget (Revenue account) including Grants-in-aid to States and Union Territories excluding Railways and Posts & Telegraphs for the year 1932-33.

The Total Budget Provision (Revenue Account) of all States and Union Territories for Education and Training including Grants-in-aid from the Centre is Rs. 4674.55 crores (Rs. 503.35 crores for Plan, and 4171.20 for Non-Plan) constituting 24.3% (12.3% for Plan and 12.0% for Non-Plan) of the Total Budget (Revenue Account) for all States and Union Territories.

Table (4) shows the Plan and Non-Plan Expenditure on Education by States and Union Territories along with Total Budget and Savings on all sectors (excluding Railways and Post & Telegraphs) of the country.

• The Total Budget Provision (Revenue Account) of Education Departments of Central and States/Union Territories for the year 1982-83 amounted to Rs. 4315.41 crores, comprising of Rs. 481.23 crores for Plan and Rs. 3834.13 crores for Non-Plan forming 4.4% for Plan and 14.5% for Non-Plan to the Total Budget of all sectors (excluding Railways and Posts and Telegraphs). The Central Budget for Education Department is Rs. 317.90 crores (Rs. 126.87 crores for Plan and Rs. 191.03 crores for Non-Plan) whereas Budget provision for States/Union Territories is Rs. 3997.51 crores (Rs. 354.36 crores for Plan and Rs. 3643.15 crores for Non-Plan). Percentage provision of Centre and State Education Expenditure to the total respective Budget is 1.9% and 8.1% respectively.

Annex (1) of Appropriation Bill for 1932-33 provides for Sauc. tion in the Ministry of Education (Foruial and Xnforal Sducotion) (excluding Unilw's aid posts *OL* Telegraphs). This provision which is Rs. 511.35 crores in 1932-33 constitutes 2.8% of the Total Central Budget. The corresponding percentage of Budget Provision worked out to 3% in 1931-32.

Out of the Total Central Budget (Revenue Account) for Education, the share of Sauc. tion Department of Ministry of Education is Rs. 317.90 crores comprising of Rs. 126.67 crores for Plan and Rs. 191.03 crores for Non-Plan. This amount includes Rs. 44.59 crores (Rs. 32.92 crores for Plan and Rs. 11.67 crores for Non-Plan) provided for Grants-in-aid to States and Union Territories.

Table (5) gives sector-wise break-up of the Budgeted Expenditure on Education in the Central Sector of the Ministry of Education and Cultural Affairs, Department of Education for the years 1930-31 (Actuals), 1931-32 (Revised Estimates) and 1932-33 (Budgeted Estimates). From Table (6) it is observed that in 1932-83 a major share of Rs. 119.33 crores or 37.6% of the Total Budget of the Ministry of Education has been provided for University and other Higher Education including Book Promotion and Teacher Development programmes. A lion share of Rs. 114.58 crores out of Total Budget Provision of Rs. 119.33 crores for this sector is to be operated through University Grants Commission. Second priority is given to Technical Education Budget Provision of Rs. 72.13 crores or 22.7% of the Total is made for this sector. A substantial portion of Rs. 42.37 crores is provided for Engineering Colleges and Institutions under this sector, 32.81 crores or 10% budgeted for Sports & Youth Welfare, 31.50 crores for Secondary Education, 23.54 crores or 7.4% for Special Education and Rs. 13.13 crores forming 4.1% for Elementary Education. The remaining amount of Rs. 25.28 crores forming 3.0% is meant for Other Education Programmes including research Scholarships, International Co-operation and others.

Other than Ministries/Departments providing funds for Education and Training for the year 1932-33 as indicated in Statement (1) in Appendix - are in the order of precedence as (i) Ministry of Agriculture and Irrigation for Agricultural Education (Rs. 49.32 crores) (ii) Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (Rs. 35.97 crores), (iii) Ministry of Home Affairs (Rs. 33.27 crores), (iv) Department of Culture for promotion of Art & Culture, Archives, Museums, Public Libraries and Archaeological Survey (Rs. 14.33 crores) (v) Ministry of Social Welfare (Rs. 13.62 crores) (vi) Ministry of Railways (Rs. 11.16 crores), (vii) Ministry of Labour (Rs. 7.77 crores), (viii) Ministry of Industry (Rs. 6.532 crores) (ix) Ministry of Energy (Rs. 5.22 crores), (x) Ministry of Planning (Rs. 4.64 crores), (xi) Ministry of Information & Broadcasting (Rs. 3.95 crores), (xii) Department of Atomic Energy (Rs. 2.12 crores), (xiii) Ministry of Rural Development (Rs. 1.33 crores), (xiv) Ministry of Shipping & Transport (Rs. 1.62 crores), (xv) Ministry of Tourism and Civil Aviation (Rs. 0.97 crores) (xvi) Ministry of Supply and Rehabilitation (Rs. 0.37 crores), (xvii) Ministry of Works & Housing (Rs. 0.30 crores) and (xviii) Department of Environment (Rs. 0.15 crores).

The main schemes covered under Ministry of Agriculture are development of Agricultural Universities and Colleges, Government grants-in-aid to Food Grains Institutes, National Sugar Institute and Indian Institute of Catering Technology and Applied Nutrition etc. In addition, the Budget Provision has been made for extensive and Farmer's Training, Education and Training in Institutes of Fisheries, Forest Research Institute and Indian Council of Agricultural research for Educational schemes.

Important items under Health are :- With the Welfare and Medical Education Department, Government of India, grants are provided to various Colleges of Allopathy and Ayurvedic systems of medicine including Colleges of Nursing, Scholarships, and stipends to Government students, under the Allopathy system grants given to Lady Xirruig & S.I.C. Hospital, T.E.W. Delhi; Institute of Speeches and Hearing, Mysore National Institute of Medical Research, Chandigarh, Jawahar Lal Nehru Institute of Post-Graduate Medical Education and Research, Pondicherry; Raj Kuraari Aarit Kaul College of Nursing, New Delhi; Kasturba Health Society - Varanasi for Medical College at Varanasi National Academy of Medical Sciences.

Under Ayurvedic system, grants paid to Institute of Ayurveda, Jaipur Urdar-Graduate Institutions and A.K. Tibbiya College, Aligarh Muslim University.

Under Homeopathic system grants given to National Institute of Homeopathy, Calcutta.

Under Public Health, sanitation and Supply - grants provided to National Institute of Communicable diseases.

Apart from the above provisions have also been made for other schemes of Training and Informal Education under Welfare and Health Education publicity.

In case of Ministry of Labour, provision has been made for establishment and development of Education and Training in Industrial Training institutes and Workers Education.

Ministry of Planning have provided funds for Indian Statistical Institute, Calcutta and International Statistics Institute, the Hague under Department of Statistics,

Department of Science & Technology have made provision for Bhabha Institute of Calcutta; Birbal Sahani Institute of Palaeobotany, Lucknow and Wadia Institute at Himalayan Geology, Dehradun.

Ministry of Energy has provided funds for Education and Training through various Institutions in the country including universities and Central Mining Planning and Design Institute and Department of Coal and Department of Power.

Ministry of Shipping and Transport has provided funds for scholarships of Educational Training in Shipping and Transport.

In case of Ministry of Railways, the entire amount relates to Educational Welfare of staff children.

Under Ministry of Tourism & Civil Aviation, provision related to scheme of Educational Training in Civil Aviation.

The provisions made by the Ministry of Rural Development are meant for Land Reforms and Community Development Programmes.

Ministry of Industry have made provision for National Institute of Design under Department of Industrial Development, Industrial Education, Research & Training under Department of Heavy Industry, Small Industry Extension Training Institute of Tool Design and Institute of Management Development have also provided funds under Village and Small Industry and Institute of Handloom Technology provided funds from Handlooms and Handicraft.

Provision made by the Home Ministry is for the Education of Scheduled Castes & Scheduled Tribes and grant to National Fire Service College and National Civil Defence College,

Ministry of Social Welfare have provided funds for Education and Welfare of the Handicapped, Women Welfare and Family and Child Welfare.

Ministry of Information & Broadcastings have provided grants-in-aid to Film and Television Institute of India, Research and Training in mass communication under photo services and Training under Broadcastings,

Statement (2) in the Appendices of this brochure indicates Total Expenditure/Provisions incurred/proposed to be incurred by Education Departments and other Departments of all States/Union Territories on Revenue Account for the year 1930-81 (actuals), 1931-32 (Revised Estimates) and 1932-83 (Budget Estimates), it may be seen from this Statement that expenditure incurred by States/Union Territories has been depicted under two broad heads i.e. Education Department and Other Departments with further details as follows: Education and Training, (Formal and Informal). During 1930-81, Actual Expenditure on Education incurred by Education Departments of all States/Union Territories was Rs. 3150.39 crores, whereas by other Departments, it was Rs. 542.02 crores, comprising of Rs. 420.91 crores for Education, Rs. 74.23 crores for Training and Rs. 16.33 crores for Informal Education. The Total Expenditure (Revenue Account) on Education in States/Union Territories Rs. 3692.41 crores in 1930-31 formed 24.1% of the Total Revenue Budget of the country.

The Revised Estimates of 1931-82 for Education provided by Education Departments of all States/Union Territories is Rs. 3346.63 crores, the corresponding provisions made by other Departments have amounted to Rs. 623.55 crores comprising of Rs. 497.02 crores for

Education, Rs. 9.26 crores for Training and Rs. 42.27 crores for Informal Education. The Total Revised Estimates for Education in States/Union Territories (Rs. 4275.18 crores) constituted 24.31 of the Total Budget (Revenue Account) for **11** States/Union Territories in 1931-32.

Budget Provision of 1932-33 for Education made by Education Departments of States is Rs. 3997.51 crores as against Rs. 677.01 crores by other Departments which comprises of Rs. 519.10 crores for Education, Rs. 105.02 crores for Training and Rs. 52.92 crores for Informal Education. The Total Rs. 4874.55 provision for Education (& Rs. 4874.55 crores) forms 24.33 of the Total Budget (Revenue Account) for all States and Union Territories in 1932-33.

Besides, it has also been observed that total expenditure on Education Departments and other Departments of all States and Union Territories increased from Rs. 3392.41 crores in 1930-31 (Actuals) to Rs. 4275.13 crores in 1931-32 (Revised Estimates) by Rs. 882.72 crores or 26.3%. Similarly this expenditure has gone up from Rs. 4275.13 crores in 1931-32 to Rs. 4674.55 crores in 1932-33 (Budget Estimates) registering an increase of Rs. 399.42 crores or 9.3%.

Statement (3) in the Appendices indicates State-wise Total Budget provision (Revenue account) on Education made by Education Departments and other Departments of the States/Union Territories with further break-up into Plan and Non-Plan provisions for the year 1932-33. This Statement shows that the Total Budget provision made by Education Departments for all States/Union Territories amounted to Rs. 3997.51 crores comprising of Rs. 354.36 crores for Plan and Rs. 3643.15 crores for Non-Plan. Expenditure incurred in the year by both Education and other Departments is Rs. 4674.55 crores comprising both Rs. 553.36 crores for Plan and Rs. 4115.69 crores for Non-Plan.

Table (6-a) depicts the State wise percentage of Plan and Non-Plan expenditure to the total respective Budget for the year 1932-33.

Among States, the percentage of PI-in Expenditure on Education by Education Department to Total Plan Budget (avenue account) was reported highest by Rajasthan (1.3/2) and lowest by Gujarat (1.3/2). Among Union Territories, this percentage is varied from 7.9,2 (lowest) in Lakshadweep to 28.9/2 (highest) in Chandigarh. On the other hand Non-Plan Expenditure is reported highest by Gujarat 45.0,2 and the lowest by Nagaland 14.4,2. Among Union Territories this percentage varies from 31.4% highest in Delhi to 8.3,2 (lowest) in Arunachal Pradesh.

Similarly, in case of both by Education and Other Departments, the percentage of Plan Expenditure on Education is reported highest by Rajasthan (23.3,2) and the lowest by Jammu & Kashmir 2.4,2. Among Union Territories, this percentage varies from 39.5/2 highest in Chandigarh to 7.9,2 lowest in Lakshadweep. On Non-Plan side, the highest by Kerala 51,3,2 and lowest by Nagaland 15.4,2. Among Union Territories, this percentage was in the range of 9,2,2 (lowest) in Arunachal Pradesh to 33.3,2 (highest) in Delhi.

Statement (4) in the Appendices indicates State/Union Territory wise details of Total State Budgeted amount (Revenue Account) and the percentage of expenditure or proposed to be incurred on Education and Training to the Total State Budgets for the year 1930-81 (Actuals), 1931-32 (Revised Estimates) and 1982-33 (Budget Estimates) In 1930-31, the Total Actual Expenditure incurred on Education and Training for all States/Union Territories was Rs.3692.41 crores constituting 24.1/2 of the Total State Budgets (Revenue account). Revised Estimates for the year 1931-32 came to be Rs.4275.18 crores forming 24.3% of the Total State Budgets. The Budget provisions for the year 1982-33 amounted to Rs.4674.55 crores, constituting 24.3,2 of the Total State Budget.

On percentage basis the highest percentage of Budget for 1932-33 is observed in case of Kerala 36.1,2 followed by Bihar 30.0% and Assam 27.5,2. Among Union Territories, the position was occupied by Delhi 33.0% followed by Dadra & Nagar Haveli 23.1% Chandigarh 24.9%. The lowest percentage is observed in case of Arunachal Pradesh 10.8,2. Table (7) gives the State/Union Territory wise percentage revision for Education to the Total State Budget (avenue account).

Table (8) below summarises the amount incurred or proposed to be incurred on Education and Training by Education Departments and other Departments for the years 1980-81 (Actuals), 1981-82 (Revised Estimates) and 1982-83 (Budget Estimates)*. Besides, break-up of Plan and Non-Plan Expenditure has also been given. The percentage of Plan Expenditure to the Total Expenditure on Education was 9.4% in 1980-81 (Actuals) which increased to 11.9% in 1981-82 (Revised Estimates) and again rose up to 12.0% in 1982-83 (Budget Estimates).

Statement (5) in the Appendices depicts the picture of Plan and Non-Plan Expenditure on Education provided by Education Departments of all States/Union Territories for the years under report. Percentage of Plan and Non-Plan Expenditure to the Total Expenditure of Education Departments has also been worked out separately for all States/Union Territories. While the percentage of the Plan Expenditure to the Total Expenditure on Education was 7.0% in 1960-61 (Actuals), it increased to 9.2% in 1981-82 (Revised Estimates). The figures are 8.9% during 1982-83 (Budget Estimates), as a result of the change in classification introduced in which grants-in-aid from the Centre are no more reported on the State side.

Statement (6) in the Appendices shows Total Plan Expenditure on Education incurred or proposed to be incurred by Education Departments and other Departments along with percentage of Total Plan Expenditure to the Total Expenditure on Education for all States/Union Territories for the years under review. Total Plan Expenditure for all Departments (Education and other Departments) during 1980-81 (Actuals) was Rs.348.61 crores forming 9.4% of the Total Expenditure on Education and Training. The Revised Estimates of 1981-82 amount upto Rs.510.47 crores (11.9%) and Budget Estimates for 1982-83 rose to Rs.558.86 crores constituting 12.0% of the Total Expenditure.

Table (9) below summarises the position of Plan Expenditure on Education provided for all States and Union Territories. The major portion of the expenditure side which amounted to Rs. 3343.80 crores in 1980-81 (Actuals), Rs. 3764.71 crores in 1981-82 (Revised Estimates), Rs. 4115.69 crores in 1982-83 (Budget Estimates). On the basis of percentage, this expenditure is to the extent of 90.6% in 1980-81 (Actuals), 88.1% in 1981-82 (Revised Estimates) and 88.0% in 1982-83 (Budget Estimates).

Table (10) indicates the State wise percentage of Plan Expenditure of Education Departments to Total Expenditure on Education for the years under review. The percentage taken together for all States and Union Territories, was 7.0% in 1980-81 (Actuals), 9.2% in 1981-82 (Revised Estimates) and 8.9% in 1982-83 (Budget Estimates). It is observed that in 1982-83, among States, the highest percentage of Plan Budget Estimates was provided by Sikkim 40.1% followed by Meghalaya 18.8% and Assam 16.6%. The lowest percentage of 4.3% is observed in case of Gujarat. Among Union Territories, this percentage was in the range of 11.7% in Chandigarh to 30.1% in Arunachal Pradesh.

III - PERCENTAGES OF DISTRIBUTION OF EDUCATION

Table below depicts the percentage of Educational Expenditure, for different sectors of Education for all States and Union Territories for the year 1960-81 (Actuals), 1931-82 (Revised Estimates) and 1982-85 (Budget Estimates). It is seen that in 1931-32 the highest percentage 43.4% of Total Budget has been provided for Primary Education, second priority is given to Secondary Education, having a proportion of 31.2% and the third position is occupied by University and other Higher Education with 13.2% of the Total Budget for Education Departments. The remaining 7.2% is distributed among Technical Education 2.7% Special Education 1.4%, Sports & Youth Welfare 1.4% and other Educational Programmes 1.7%.

The detailed State-wise analysis of Budgeted Expenditure on various sectors of Education is depicted in subsequent paragraphs.

1. ELEMENTARY EDUCATION

Statement (7) in the Appendices gives the State-wise picture of Budgeted Expenditure on Elementary Education for the years under report. It is observed that Total Expenditure on Elementary Education during the year 1980-81 (Actuals) was Rs. 1528.31 crores, comprising of Rs. 86.13 crores for Plan and Rs. 1442.18 crores for Non-Plan which formed 48.5% of the Total Expenditure on Education Departments. Among the States, this percentage was highest in case of Bihar 73.5% and the lowest in case of Sikkim 29.8%. Among Union Territories, the highest provision of 68.3% was provided by Dadra & Nagar Haveli and the lowest 20.9% was reported by Chandigarh.

In 1981-82 (Revised Estimates), this expenditure went up to Rs. 1723.29 crores (Rs. 126.89 crores for Plan and Rs. 1596.40 crores for Non-Plan), constituting 47.3% of the Total Expenditure on Education Departments of all States/Union Territories. Among States, this percentage was highest in Nagaland 60.1% and the lowest in Sikkim 31.5%. Among Union Territories, A. & N. Islands acquired the top most position by providing 61.8% of Total Expenditure on Education Department, whereas Chandigarh provided the lowest 20.2%.

In 1983-83 (Budget Estimates), this expenditure went up to Rs. 1935.10 crores, inclusive of Rs. 138.97 crores for Plan and Rs. 1796.13 crores for Non-Plan. The percentage provision of Total Expenditure on Elementary Education to the Total Expenditure of Education Departments of different States worked out to be 48.4%. Among States, the percentage provision was largest in Assam and Jharkhand 59.9% and the lowest in case of Sikkim 32.2%. Among Union Territories, top place was occupied by A. & H. Islands with 61.9% and the lowest position by Chandigarh with 18.7%.

Statement (8) in the Appendices, indicates the State-wise details of the Budget Provision for Elementary Education under different Sub-Heads for the year 1983-83 (Revenue Account). A major portion of 33.7% of Total Expenditure on Elementary Education is proposed for Government Elementary Schools located in all States/Union Territories. This percentage varies from State to State in accordance with the proportion of management. Among States, Jharkhand, Jammu & Kashmir, Punjab and Sikkim proposed Budget Estimates of more than 90% followed by Assam, Madhya-Pradesh, West Bengal and Tripura more than 80%. In Bihar, Jharkhand and Karnataka this percentage was more than 70%. The corresponding percentage for Andhra Pradesh, Rajasthan and Kerala were 69.7%, 60.3% and 40.3% respectively. Percentage provision for the remaining States is between 0.3% to 5.1%.

Among Union Territories, cent per cent provision was made by Arunachal Pradesh followed by Chandigarh, Goa, Daman & Diu, Lakshadweep and Pondicherry more than 90% and A. & N. Islands more than 80%. Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Khasi States budgeted 71.5% and 71.4% respectively. Less than 1% provided by Delhi.

The Total Provision for Elementary Education is meant for assistance to Elementary Schools provided by Local Bodies. Among States, Gujarat and Maharashtra proposed Budget Estimates of more than 80% followed by Karnataka, more than 80% and Andhra Pradesh and Orissa more than 70%. Haryana and West Bengal provided only 34.5% and 33% respectively. Percentage provision for the remaining States is between 0.1% to 80%. Among Union Territories, no provision exists for Local Board, Institutions except in case of Delhi 58.9% and Khasi States 73%.

20.5% of the Total Budget for Elementary Education is meant for assistance to Non-Government Elementary Education Schools of all States/Union Territories. Uttar Pradesh provided the highest 91.5% followed by Jharkhand 50.7% and Tamil Nadu 22.6%. Madhya Pradesh provided only 25.2%. Percentage provision for the remaining States and Union Territories is less than 20% except in case of Delhi 21.9%.

Out of these funds under Elementary Education is meant for Direction and Inspection 1.7%, Teachers Training 1.3% and other Education 14.6%.

Table (12) below gives State/Union Territory-wise percentage of expenditure on Elementary Education to Total Expenditure of the Education Departments for the year 1980-81 (Actuals), 1981-82 (Revised Estimates) and 1982-83 (Budget Estimates).

2. SECONDARY EDUCATION

Statement (9) in the Appendix records, State-wise details of the Budgeted Expenditure on Secondary Education for the years under report. The Total Expenditure on Secondary Education for all States/Union Territories in 1980-81 (Actuals) was Rs. 1016.25 crores, comprising of Rs.43.93 CROR for Plan and Rs.972.32 crores for Non-Plan constituting 32.3% of the Total Expenditure on Education Departments of the States and Union Territories. Among States, the percentage was highest in case of Sikkim 59.1% and the lowest in case of Bihar 16.8%. Among Union Territories, the largest percentage was observed in case of Delhi 63.77% and the lowest in case of Arunachal Pradesh 11.8%.

in 1981-82 (Budget Estimates) the Total Expenditure on Secondary Education rose up to Rs. 119.6 crores (Rs. 87.13 crores for Plan and Rs. 32.47 crores for Non-Plan) forming 32.1% of the Total Expenditure on Education. Proportions of all States/Union Territories. Among States, the highest percentage provision was made by Sikkim 56.2% and the lowest by Bihar 18.8%. Among Union Territories, this percentage was highest in Delhi 69.8% and the lowest in Chandigarh 11.7%.

In 1983-84 (Budget Estimates), Total Budget Provision for Secondary Education, gone up to Rs. 1245.45 crores (Rs. 89.07 crores for Plan and Rs. 1156.38 crores for Non-Plan) constituting 31.2% of the Total Budget Provision of Education Department for all States/Union Territories. Among States, the highest percentage occupies top most position in Sikkim 58.1% and the lowest in Bihar 19.1%. Among Union Territories, Delhi provided the highest percentage of 67.6% and Arunachal Pradesh and Chandigarh the lowest 11.1%.

Table (IO) in the Appendix depicts the details of Budget Provisions under for Secondary Education under different States for the year 1983-84. It is observed that a major portion of the Total Budget Provision for Secondary Education meant for assistance to Non-Government Secondary Schools. Among States, the highest percentage of this proportion is seen in West Bengal 95.2% followed by Assam 89.4% Gujarat 86.5% and Maharashtra 84.7% Uttar Pradesh, Orissa and Meghalaya have provided 74.0%, 68.4% and 60.6% respectively for assistance to Non-Government Secondary Schools. Kerala and Karnataka have proposed more than 50% whereas Tamil Nadu has provided 31.5%. Remaining States are in the range of 1.4% to 19.6%. Among Union Territories Goa, Daman & Diu proposed to spend 85.8% and Kizoram 55.5% for other Territories except Delhi with 20.0% is below 10%.

The proportion of expenditure proposed to be spent on Government Secondary Schools is Rs. 451.44 crores or 37.1% of the Total Budget Provision made for Secondary Education by all States and Union Territories. State-wise percentage provision is highest in Madhya Pradesh 94.1%, Bihar, Haryana, Jammu & Kashmir, Madhya Pradesh, Punjab and Rajasthan have provided more than 50%. Proportion provision for Jammu & Kashmir, Tripura, Nagaland, Tamil Nadu, Kerala and Karnataka are 79.8% and 73.4%, 64.1%, 51.5% and 34.5% and 30.5% respectively. Remaining States are in the range of 0.6% to 23.05%. Among Union Territories, 100% provision is made by Arunachal Pradesh and Lakshadweep, followed by A. & N. Islands 90.6% Chandigarh 86.3% Dadra & Nagar Haveli 84.7%. Remaining Territories are in the range of 11.7% to 44%.

6.2% of the Total funds for Secondary Education is being spent as grants-in-aid to Local Bodies for Secondary Schools and the remaining 8.5% is distributed among Direction and Inspection 2.9%, Scholarships 0.7%, Technical Training 0.7% and Other miscellaneous items 4.2%.

Tablo (13) indicates the distribution of provisions made for Secondary Education Schools under different managements according to percentage slabs.

Statement (11) in the Appendices indicates State-wise Budgeted Expenditure on Special Education for the years under review. In 1980-81 (Actuals), the Total Expenditure for this sector was Rs. 3680 crores (Rs. 5.88 crore for Plan and Rs. 20.92 crore for Non-Plan; constituting 1.2% of the Total Expenditure on Education Departments of all States/Union Territories. Among States, percentage coverage of this sector is highest in case of Nagaland 4.4% and the lowest in case of Andhra Pradesh 0.1%. Among Union Territories highest percentage provision was seen in case of Mizoram 5.8% and the lowest in case of Arunachal Pradesh 0.3%.

In 1981-82 (Revised Estimates), this expenditure increased to 50.54 crores (26.70 crores for Plan and 23.84 crores for Non-Plan) forming 1.40 of the Total Expenditure on Education Departments for all States and Union Territories. Among States, percentage coverage is highest in case of Tripura 5.80 followed by Haryana 5.00, Bihar and Jharkhand 3.10 each and Assam 2.80. The remaining States are in the range of 0.40 to 1.70. In case of Union Territories, the highest percentage is observed in Jammu & Kashmir (6.3) and the lowest in case of Goa, Daman & Diu 0.50.

In 1982-83 (Budget Estimates), this expenditure is shown to have gone up to 55.36 crores (26.51 crores for Plan and 28.85 crores for Non-Plan) constituting 1.40 of the Total Expenditure on Education Departments for all States and Union Territories. Among States, the percentage coverage is highest in case of Tripura 7.20 followed by Haryana 5.00, Bihar 3.50, Jharkhand 3.10 and Assam 2.80. Remaining States are in the range of 0.4 to 1.80. Among Union Territories, highest percentage is observed in case of Mizoram 5.5 and the lowest in case of Arunachal Pradesh 0.60.

Statement (12) in the Appendices explains State-wise details of the Budget Provision made for Special Education under different Sub-Heads during the year 1982-83 (Revenue Account). It is seen that top priority is given to Adult Education under this head and a share of Rs. 26.08 crores (Rs. 20.14 crores for Plan and Rs. 5.94 crores for Non-Plan) forming 47.1% of the Total Budget made for all States/Union Territories. Among States, in case of Haryana, the Total Provision for Special Education is meant for Adult Education. The States of Maharashtra and Tripura have provided more than 900. States like Gujarat and Madhya Pradesh have budgeted more than 800. Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Karnataka, Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand and Jammu & Kashmir provided more than 500. Remaining States are ranged between 18.60 to 48.70. Among Union Territories, the whole provision of Special Education is proposed for adult education by Arunachal Pradesh and Lakshadweep. More than 900 is proposed by Goa, Daman & Diu and Chandernagore. In case of Delhi, it is 82.90. Remaining Territories are in the range of 7.60 to 47.10. Dadra and Nagar Haveli provided no funds for this head.

Next priority is given to Sanskrit Education under Special Education. An amount of Rs. 12.71 crores (Rs. 0.72 crores for Plan and Rs. 11.99 crores for Non-Plan) forming 22.90 of the Total Budget provision for Special Education of all States and Union Territories has been provided for Sanskrit Education. In

terms of percentages, top priority is given to Rajasthan 63.1%, followed by Uttar Pradesh 58.1% and Andhra Pradesh 36.3%. Remaining States are in the range of 0.1% to 19.27%. In case of Union Territories, no provision exists for Sanskrit Education except Goa, Daman & Diu 7.4% and Pondicherry 0.2%.

Rs. 4,41 crores or 8.0% of the Total Expenditure on Special Education for all States/Union Territories is proposed for Modern Indian Languages and Literature on the basis of percentage among States, the highest percentage is observed in Nagaland 64.1% followed by Jammu & Kashmir 45.1%, Himachal Pradesh 30.3%, Punjab 37.3% West Bengal 34.6% and Karnataka 23.1%. Remaining States are in the range of 0.1% to 12.0%. Haryana and Sikkim have no provision for this Head. In case of Union Territories, the entire provision of Special Education is proposed for Modern Indian Languages by Dadra & Nagar Haveli followed by A & N Islands 36.8% and 3.9%. Remaining Territories have not made any provision for this Head.

Rs. 0.25 crores or 0.5% of the Total Funds for Special Education of all States/Union Territories is proposed for Commercial Institutes and Rs. 11.91 crores or 21.5% for other Special Education Programmes.

Table (15) below indicates the State-wise percentage provision of Budgeted Expenditure on Special Education, for the year 1980-81 (Actuals) 1981-82 (Revised Estimate) and 1982-83 (Budget Estimates).

4. ADULT EDUCATION

Statement (13) in the Appendices shows State wise details of Budgeted Expenditure on Adult Education for the years under review separately which have already been included under Special Education. Actual expenditure in 1980-61 for Adult Education was Rs. 17.75 crores (Rs. 12.58 crores for Plan and Rs. 5.17 crores for Non-Plan) forming 0.6% of the Total Expenditure of Education Departments for all States/Union Territories. Percentage coverage, among States, was highest in case of Sikkim 2.7% and the lowest in case of Kerala 0.04%. In case of Union Territories, this percentage was in the range of 0.2% to 1.2% while no provision has been made by Dadra & Nagar Haveli.

Revised Estimates in 1981-82 rose up to Ps. 24,48 crores (Ps. 18.38 crores for Plan and ft. 6,10 crores for Non-Plan) constituting 0.7% of the Total Expenditure on Education Departments for all States and Union Territories. Percentage provision among States was highest in case of Assam 2.1% and the lowest in case of Himachal Pradesh and Jammu & Kashmir 0.2%. Among Union Territories, this percentage was in the range of 0.4% the lowest in case of Chandigarh to 1.4% the highest in case of J&K Lakshadweep.

Budget Provision in 1982-83 is estimated to have increased to 26.08 crores (fc. 20.14 crores for Plan and 5.94 crores for Non-Plan) forming 0.7% of the Total Expenditure on Education Departments for all States/ Union Territories. State-wise percentage is highest in case of Tripura 6.9% and the lowest in case of Himachal Pradesh and Jammu and Kashmir 0.2%. Among Union Territories this percentage is varied from 0.3% lowest in case of Chandigarh to 1.3% highest in case of Lakshadweep.

Table (16) gives statewise percentage provision for the years 1980-81 (Actuals), 1981-82 (Revised Estimates) and 1982-83 (Budget Estimates).

5. UNIVERSITY EDUCATION

Statement (14) in the Appendices gives State wise details of the Budgeted Expenditure on University and Higher Education for the years under review. Actual Expenditure in 1980-81 for this sector was Rs.384.90 crores (Rs.43.13 crores for Plan and Rs.341.77 crores for Non-Plan) forming 12.20 of the Total Expenditure incurred by Education Departments of all States and Union Territories. Percentage provision among States varied from 19.60 (highest) in Andhra Pradesh to 2.60 (lowest) in Sikkim. Among Union Territories, top place was occupied by Chandigarh 44.50 and the lowest by Delhi 0.50, whereas no provision has been made by Dadra & Nagar Haveli for this sector.

Revised Estimates for the year 1981-82 for this sector rose up to Rs.495.64 crores (Rs.52.44 crores for Plan and Rs.443.20 crores for Non-Plan) constituting 13.60 of the Total Expenditure incurred by Education Departments of all States/Union Territories. Percentage coverage, among States, was highest in Manipur 21.30 and the lowest in Sikkim 2.90. Among Union Territories, this percentage was largest in case of Chandigarh 45.00 and the lowest in case of Delhi 0.40.

Budget Provision for this sector in 1983*83 is estimated to have increased to Rs. 528.74 crores (Rs. 45 crores for Plan and Rs. 474.24 crores for Hon-Plan) constituting 13.20% of the Total Expenditure incurred by Education Departments of the States and Union Territories*. Among States, the percentage varied from 21.00% highest in case of Manipur to 2.40% lowest in case of Sikkim. Among Union Territories Chandigarh placed on the top 46.10 and Delhi at the bottom 0.50*. Dadra & Nagar Haveli has made no provision for this sector,

Statement (15) in the Appendixes explains Sub-Head wise details of the provision made under University and Higher Education for the year 1983-83*. A sum of Rs. 62 crores (Rs. 62 crores for Plan and Rs. 186.03 crores for Non-Plan) forming 36.30% of the Total Budget provision made for Higher Education is meant for assistance to Government Colleges*. However, this provision varied from State to State. The highest proportion of this provision is made by Uttar Pradesh 70.50 and the lowest by Bihar 0.030, Sikkim has not made any provision for this Head. Among Union Territories the higher percentage provisions for this Head is shown by Goa, Daman & Diu 68.60 followed by Mizoram 5.50 and Chandigarh 7.00. Remaining Territories have made no provision for this Head.

Next priority programme under University Education is assistance to Universities for Non-Technical Education. This amounted to Rs. 154.57 crores (Rs. 81 crores for Plan and Rs. 140.76 crores for Non-Plan) forming 28.20% of the Total Budget Provision made for Higher Education by all States/Union Territories. State-wise percentage provisions is highest in case of Bihar 89.80 and the lowest in case of Tamil Nadu 6.30. Meghalaya, Nagaland and Sikkim have made no provision under this Head. Among Union Territories, no provision for this item is made except in the case of Chandigarh 5.50, Goa, Daman & Diu 17.80 and Mizoram 0.10,

An amount of Rs. 96.63 crores (Rs. 8.85 crore for Plan and Rs. 87.78 crores for Hon-Plan) or 18.30% of the Total Budget Provision for Higher Education has been provided for assistance to Government Colleges. 100% provision for this Head is made by Sikkim State. In case of other States, this percentage is highest in Manipur 83.70 and lowest in Bihar 1.50. Among Union Territories, Arunachal Pradesh and Lakshadweep 100.00. In case of Other Territories, highest percentage coverage is in A. & N. Islands and Pondicherry 86.50 and the lowest in Goa, Daman & Diu 9.50*

Share of other items under this sector are Direction and Inspection 0.40, Scholarships 1.80, Other higher Educational Programmes 1.00 and Pre-University Education 13.00.

'Sts-'jem.v.r'; (i S) in the Appendices gives State-wise details of Budgeted Expenditure on Technical Education for the years under report. Actual Expenditure in 1980-81 for this sector was Rs.87.34 crores (Rs.15.26 crores for Plan and Rs.72.03 crores for Non-Plan) constituting 2.20% of the Total Expenditure incurred by Education Departments of all States/Union Territories. Among States, percentage coverage was highest in case of Kerala 3.30 and the lowest in case of Himachal Pradesh, 0.60, while Sikkim has made no provision for this sector. Among Union Territories, this percentage varied from 15.50 highest in Chandigarh to 0.50 lowest in Mizoram. Union Territories like A. & N. Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Lakshadweep have made no provision under this sector.

Budget Estimates for 1981-82 went up to Rs.100.42 crores (Rs.20.20 crores for Plan and Rs.80.22 crores for Non-Plan) forming 2.57% of the Total Expenditure incurred by Education Departments for all States and Union Territories. This percentage varied from State to State, the highest percentage was observed in case of Kerala 3.70 and the lowest in case of Bihar 0.70. Among Union Territories, this percentage was in the range of 16.90 highest in case of Chandigarh to 0.40 lowest in Mizoram. States/Union Territories like Sikkim, A. & N. Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Lakshadweep have made no provision for this sector.

Budget Estimates for the year 1983-84 rose up to Rs.109.94 crores (Rs.23.08 crores for Plan and Rs.86.86 crores for Non-Plan) constituting 2.80% of the Total Expenditure on Education Departments for all States and Union Territories, this percentage was highest in case of Tamil Nadu 4.50 and the lowest in case of Bihar 0.60. Among Union Territories, top rank place was occupied by Chandigarh 19.0 and the lowest by Mizoram 0.30. States/Union Territories like Sikkim, A. & N. Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Lakshadweep have made no provision under this sector.

Table (17) in the Appendices indicates the Sub-Headwise details of Expenditure on Technical Education for all States and Union Territories during 1982-83 (Budget Estimates). Sub-Headwise Budget Provision proposed by all States/Union Territories for Technical Education for the year 1983-84 is given below.

It has been seen from the above summary that the largest share is given to Engineering and Technical Colleges and Institutes of Higher Education with provision of Rs. 43.06 crores (Rs. 7.49 crores for Plan and Rs. 35.57 crores for Non-Plan) or 39.2% of the Total Budget Provision for Technical Education made by all States and Union Territories. In terms of percentage among States, the highest percentage provision is observed in Madhya Pradesh of 56.9% and the lowest in case of Andhra Pradesh 13.3%. Among Union Territories, this percentage is highest in Chandigarh 74.1% and lowest in Goa, Lakshadweep & Jammu & Kashmir 32.7%. States like Himachal Pradesh, Jammu & Kashmir, Manipur, Meghalaya, Nagaland and Sikkim and Union Territories like A.N. Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Lakshadweep, Mizoram and Pondicherry have made no provision for this head.

A large share also goes to Polytechnic Schools of Arts & Crafts and Institutes of Higher Education which have provided Rs. 40.93 crores (Rs. 7.87 crores for Plan and Rs. 33.06 crores for Non-Plan) constituting 37.2% of the Total Provision made for Technical Education by all States and Union Territories. In terms of percentage, the highest provision of 77.7% is made in case of Himachal Pradesh and the lowest in case of Kerala 14.9%. Among Union Territories, this percentage is 100% in Mizoram. In case of other Union Territories, it is highest in Pondicherry 63.1% and lowest in Chandigarh 19.8%. States like Sikkim and Union Territories like A. & N. Islands, Arunachal Pradesh, Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Lakshadweep have made no provision for this head.

From the above summary and details given in Statement (19) it can be seen that highest priority goes to Youth Welfare scheme. An amount of Rs.35.31 crores comprising of Rs.5.43 crores from Plan and Rs.29.86 crores from Nrn-Pl-viricide for this item. Percentage coverage is 6.30 of the Total Budget Provision provided for Sports & Youth Welfare. Among States this percentage was highest in case of Madhya Pradesh 91.0 and lowest - Manipur 14.40. Among Union Territories, this percentage is 100 in Arunachal Pradesh. In case of other Territories this percentage is in the range of 2.00 in Lakshadweep to 67.80 in Delhi.

Next priority goes to Sports & Games. An amount of Rs.10.74 crores (Rs.6.52 crores for Plan and Rs.4.22 crores for Kovi-Plan) constituting 18.90 of the Total Budget Provision for Sports and Youth Welfare. Among States, the highest percentage is observed in Sikkim 57.10 and lowest in Tripura 14.25. Among Union Territorial, this percentage is 100 in Dadra & Nagar Haveli. In case of other Territories it is in the range of 1.7, Him Chandigarh to 49.70 in Goa, Daman & Diu. Arunachal Pradesh, Lakshadweep, Mizoram and Pondicherry have made no provision for this Head.

Shares of remaining Sub-Heads are Direction and Administration Rs.5.21 crores or 9.20, Physical Education Rs.3.91 crores or 6.90 and other Programmes under Sports & Youth Welfare sector Rs.1.55 crores or 2.70.

8. OTHER EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMMES

State-wise (2p) in the Appendices shows State/Union Territory-wise Budget Provision proposed for Other Educational Programmes for the years under review. It includes Direction and Administration, Scholarships, Research, Training and other miscellaneous expenditure, which cannot be allocated to any specific sector of Education, actual Expenditure in 1980-81 was Rs. 51.82 crores (Rs. 5.67 crores for Plan and Rs. 46.15 crores for Non-Plan) constituting 0.10 of the Total Expenditure made for Education Departments of States/Union Territories. Among States, the highest percentage was observed in Tripura 5.20 and the lowest in Karnataka 0.20. Among Union Territories, it varied from 0.60 in Chandigarh to 19.10 in Arunachal Pradesh.

Revised Estimates in 1981-82 **gone down to** Rs. 49.45 **crores** (Rs. 7.72 for Plan and Rs. 41.73 for Non-Plan) forming 1.20 of the Total Expenditure on Education Departments for all States/Union Territories. Among States, the highest percentage is in case of Tripura 7.40 and the lowest in case of Karnataka 0.30. Among Union Territories, highest percentage is in Arunachal Pradesh 31.30 and lowest in Chandigarh 0.90.

Budget for 1982-83 allocated to Rs. 66.19 crores (Rs. 7.70 for Plan and Rs. 58.49 for Non-Plan) constituting 1.70 of the Total Expenditure on Education Departments for all States and Union Territories. Among States, the highest percentage is in case of Nagaland 7.40 and the lowest in case of Karnataka 0.30. Among Union Territories, highest percentage is in Arunachal Pradesh 32.20 and the lowest in Chandigarh 0.90.

Statement (21) in the Appendices depicts Sub-Head-wise details of Budget Provision made for Other Education Programmes during 1982-83. From this Statement it has been observed that major portion of Rs. 36.96 crores or 55.80% of the Total Expenditure on Other Educational Programmes for all States/Union Territories is proposed to be spent on Other Education Schemes. Second priority under this sector goes to Direction and Administration with an amount of Rs. 16.58 crores or 25.10% of the Total Budget Provision for Other Educational Programmes for all States and Union Territories. Remaining Rs. 12.65 crores or 19.10% is distributed among the Scholarship Rs. 6.76 crores or 10.20%, Research (Rs. 2.40 crores or 3.60%) and Training Rs. 3.49 crores or 5.30%.

Table-I (2P) below indicates States/Union Territory-wise percentage of Budgeted Expenditure on Other Education Programmes to the Total Expenditure on Education Department.

In Statement (22) it has been seen that in 1980-81 (Actuals), out of the Total Expenditure Rs. 3,150,39 ON all sectors of Education for all States and Union Territories, a major share of Rs. 1,528.31 crores or 48.5% of the Total Expenditure on Education Department was provided for Primary Education, followed by Secondary Education Rs. 1,016.25 or 32.3% and University and Other Higher Education Rs. 349.01 or 11.2%. Remaining Rs. 220.93 crores or 7.0% is distributed among Technical Education (Rs. 87.34 crores or 2.8%), Sports & Youth Welfare (Rs. 44.93 crores or 1.49%), Special Education (Rs. 36.80 crores or 1.2%) and Other Educational Programmes (Rs. 51.81 crores or 1.69%),

Statement (23) indicates the Revised Estimates for the year 1981-82. These Estimates show that a major amount of Rs. 1,723.28 crores or 47.3% was provided for Primary Education followed by Secondary Education Rs. 1,169.35 crores or 32.1% and University and Other Higher Education Rs. 495.64 crores or 13.69%. Remaining Rs. 258.36 crores or 7.0% are proposed to be spent on Technical Education Rs. 100.42 crores or 2.7% and Sports & Youth Welfare Rs. 57.94 crores or 1.69%, Special Education Rs. 50.54 crores or 1.4% and Other Educational Programmes Rs. 49.46 crores or 1.39%.

Statement (24) gives details of the Total Budget Provision proposed to be spent on various sectors of Education by Education Departments of States/Union Territories for the year 1982-83 (Budget Estimates). As seen the first priority is given to Primary Education (Rs. 1,935.10 crores or 48.4%) followed by Secondary Education Rs. 1,245.45 crores or 31.29% and University and Other Higher Education Rs. 528.74 crores or 13.29%. Remaining Rs. 263.22 crores or 7.29% are proposed to be spent on Technical Education Rs. 109.95 crores or 2.7% and Other Educational Programmes Rs. 66.17 crores or 1.7%, Sports & Youth Welfare Rs. 56.74 crores or 1.49% and Special Education Rs. 55.36 crores or 1.4%.

Statements (25, 26 & 27) in the Appendices indicate All India Expenditure on various Educational sectors of all States/Union Territories and at the Centre with a breakdown of Plan and Non-Plan Expenditure for the years 1980-81 (Actuals), 1981-82 (Revised Estimates) and 1982-83 (Budget Estimates) respectively. These statements indicate the interesting variations in the development of Education in different States/Union Territories as well as that of General Government (Department of Education) and also the priority accorded to different sectors of Education in view of the amount and percentage to Total Expenditure on Education by Centre and States/Union Territories.

Statement (25) indicates the Actual Expenditure on various sectors of Education during the year 1980-81. It has been seen that Primary Education sector has received the first priority Rs. 1,537.25 crores or 45.69% followed by Secondary Education Rs. 1,036.90 crores or 30.7% and University Education Rs. 483.67 crores or 14.3%. Remaining Rs. 316.48 crores or 9.49% of the Total are to be spent on Technical Education Rs. 136.95 crores or 4.09%, Other Educational Programmes Rs. 70.78 crores or 2.19%, Sports & Youth Welfare Rs. 59.67 crores or 1.89% and Special

STATEMENT (26) GIVES DETAILS OF Revised Estimates of Total Budget provision proposed to BE spent on various sectors of Education by Education Departments of States/Union Territories as well as that of Central Government, (Department of Education) for the year 1981-82. It is observed that a major share has been provided to Primary Education (Rs. 1734.54 crores or 44.3%) followed by Secondary Education (Rs. 94.63 crores or 30.4%) and University and other Higher Education (Rs. 599.52 crores or 15.39%). Remaining Rs. 391.17 crores or 10% of the Total Budget provision are proposed to be spent on Technical Education (Rs. 164.14 crores or 4.1%), Sports and Youth Welfare (Rs. 88.54 crores or 2.3%), other Educational programmes (Rs. 71.35 crores or 1.89%) and Special Education (Rs. 67.15 crores or 1.89%).

Statement 27) indicates the Total Budget Estimates proposed to be spent on various sectors of Education for the year 1982-83. This statement shows that a lion share has gone to Primary Education (Rs. 1948.23 crores or 45.2%) followed by Secondary Education (Rs. 1277.05 crores or 29.6%) and University & other Higher Education (Rs. 648.12 crores or 15.09%). Remaining (Rs. 442.01 crores or 10.2%) of the Total Budget Provision for Education are proposed to be spent on Technical Education (Rs. 182.11 crores or 4.25%), other Educational programmes (Rs. 91.47 crores or 2.19%), Sports and Youth Welfare (Rs. 89.53 crores or 2.19%) and Special Education (Rs. 78.90 crores or 1.89%).

V- Relationship between Budgeted Expenditure on Education and National income

Table (21) below indicates the State wise relationship between Budgeted Expenditure on Education for all Departments of Revenue Account and Net Domestic product for the available years of various States and Territories for the purpose of comparative study. The percentage of Total Budgeted Expenditure of States/union Territories to the Net Domestic Product is also worked out.

It is observed from Table (21) that while Total Budgeted Expenditure on Revenue Account of all India level during 1980-81 formed 22.9% of the Total Net National Income, only 2.9% of the National Income was provided in the Budgets of the Education Departments, when the provision for Education for all Departments including Education Departments is taken into account this percentage works out to 3.5%.

While making Inter-State comparison, it is seen that percentage of Budgeted Expenditure of Education Departments to the Net Domestic product of the States varies from 1.9% lowest in case of Bihar to 9.4% highest in case of Manipur, Andhra Pradesh, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Punjab and Uttar Pradesh have provided less than the All India average percentage of 2.9%. The other States/Union Territories which have provided more than the All India average percentage are Assam 3.3%, Bihar 3.1% & Himachal Pradesh 6.1% & Jammu & Kashmir 4.5%, Karnataka 3.3% & Kerala 5.7%, Madhya Pradesh 5.5%, Orissa 3.4%, Rajasthan 3.5%, Tamil Nadu 3.6%, Tripura 7.0%, West Bengal 3.0%, Delhi 3.3% & Goa, Daman & Diu 4.1% and Pondicherry 3.4%.

It can also be seen from this Table that while percentage of Total Educational Expenditure to the Total State Budget is 19.99% in Bihar the percentage of Education Budget to the State Income is only 2.4%. On the other hand in case of Manipur, percentage of Education Budget to the Total State Budget is 21.3% and the percentage provision for Education to the Total State Income is 11.8%. It shows that though Government of Bihar and Manipur are providing almost equal in terms of their Total Budgets yet there is variation in terms of percentage provision for Education to the State Income, Similar variations are also observed in case of other States which can be glanced better from the Table.

VI - FJDOETED EXPERT TORE ON EDUCATE ON ICAPITAL ACCOUNT

This Head accommodates the Capital Expenditure outside the Revenue Account and Loans and Advances for all States/Union Territories and at the Centre. Capital Expenditure and Loans for Education are quite meagre in comparison with the Expenditure on Revenue Account.

Table (22) indicates Provision of Capital Expenditure outside the Revenue Account and Loans for Education Departments of all States and Union Territories and at the Centre for the years 1980-81 (Actuals), 1981-82 (Revised Estimates) and 1982-83 (Budget Estimates). It is observed from the Budget Estimates of 1982-83 that while the Education Department at the Centre made a provision of Rs.5.57 crores or 0.1% of the Total Capital Account for the organisation of Asian Games to be played in 1982 and for Technical Education. Under Capital Account (outside the Revenue Account) has been made under Loans for Education Departments at the Centre. Substantial part of this amount is provided for construction of Hostels and staff quarters for Regional Engineering Colleges Rs.0.70 crores under Technical Education and Loans to Punjab University for its development Rs.0.20 crores. Remaining Rs.0.004 crores is proposed as Other Educational Loans to Punjab University for its developmental loans. Besides Rs.4.00 crores are proposed to provide loans to States/Union Territories. Rs.4.00 crores of these loans are proposed to provide to State Governments under National Loans Scholarship scheme.

The Total Capital Expenditure outside Revenue Account and Loans for Education Departments of all States/Union Territories amounted to Rs.46.56 crores and Rs.8.51 crores respectively.

Statement (28) in the Appendices indicates State-wise Capital Expenditure outside Revenue Account and Loans for Education made by Education Departments of all States/Union Territories amounted to Rs- 39.86 crores constituting 1.2% of the Total Capital Account outside Revenue Account for all States/Union Territories. Among States, this percentage is highest in case of Tamil Nadu 5.0% and lowest in Bihar 0.2%. Among Union Territories, this percentage is in the range of 1.1% lowest in Dadra & Nagar Haveli to 8.2% highest in Arunachal Pradesh.

During 1980-81 (Actuals), Total Loans provided by Education Departments of all States/Union Territories amounted to Rs.6.59 crores forming 0.2% of the Total Loans and Advances of all States/Union Territories. Among States, the highest percentage provision is seen in Kerala 4.0% and the lowest in Jharkhand 0.2%*. Among Union Territories this percentage is in the range of 0.6% highest in Goa, Daman & Diu to 0.2% lowest in Pondicherry.

Statement (29) in the Appendices shows Revised Estimates of Capital Expenditure on Education for all States/Union Territories in 1981-82 which increased to Rs.48.78 crores forming 1.2% of the Total Capital Expenditure outside Revenue Account for all States/Union Territories. This percentage varies from 0.4% lowest in Gujarat, Maharashtra and Uttar Pradesh to 3.8% highest in Tamil Nadu. Among Union Territories the highest percentage is observed in Arunachal Pradesh 9.1% and the lowest in Lakshadweep 0.6%.

Loans and Advances for Education proposed by Education Departments of all States and Union Territories amounted to Rs. 335 crores or 0.3% of the Total Loans and Advances for all States/Union Territories. Among States, this percentage is highest in case of Sikkim 8.5% and the lowest in case of Assam and Punjab 0.03%. States Nagaland and Rajasthan have made no provision for this Head. Among Union Territories, this percentage is in the range of 0.1% to 1.2%.

Statement (30) in the Appendices shows State/Union Territory wise Capital Expenditure outside Revenue Account and Loans for Education provided by Education Departments for the year 1982-83 (Budget Estimates). Total Budgeted Capital Expenditure outside Revenue Account proposed for Education amounts to Rs. 46.56 crores forming 0.9% of the Total Capital Expenditure outside Revenue Account for all States/Union Territories. This percentage is seen highest in case of Sikkim 4.5% and the lowest in case of Andhra Pradesh 0.02%. Among Union Territories, it ranges from 0.7% lowest in Mizoram to 10.5% highest in Arunachal Pradesh.

Provision of Rs. 8.51 crores is made for Loans for Education by Education Departments of all States/Union Territories taken together constituting 0.3% of the Total Loans and Advances for all Departments. No provision for Loans is made in Nagaland and Rajasthan. Among the States, the highest percentage provision is made in case of Sikkim 7.8% and the lowest in case of Tripura 0.01%. Among Union Territories, this percentage varies from 0.01% lowest in Chandigarh to 1.2% highest in Goa, Daman & Diu. No provision for Loans has been made by Arunachal Pradesh and Mizoram.

Table (23) below indicates the State/Union Territory-wise percentage provisions for Education to the Total State Budget Capital Account and Loans and Advances for the years 1980-81 (Actuals), 1981-82 (Revised Estimates) and 1982-83 (Budget Estimates).

Statement (31) in the Appendices gives in summary form of the Budget Provision for Education by Education Departments under all the three Accounts i.e. (i) Revenue Account, (ii) Capital Account (outside Revenue Account) and (iii) Loans & Advances during the year 1982-83. The provisions have been indicated separately for each State and Union Territory and at the Centre for Education under Education Department.

It may be seen from Cols. (3, 6 & 9) of this Statement that during 1982-83 the Total Budget Provision for Education by Education Departments of all States/Union Territories and at the Centre under Revenue Account, Capital Account outside Revenue Account and Loans and Advances amounts to Rs. 4315.41 crores. Rs. 52.13 crores and Rs. 13.41 crores respectively. Cel. (3) of the Statement indicates Total Revenue Account for Education Departments Rs. 4315.41 crores which comprises of Rs. 30.66 crores for States, Rs. 130.89 crores for Union Territories and Rs. 317.20 crores at the Centre. According to State wise distribution of funds for Education by Education Department under Revenue Account, the highest amount of Rs. 434.46 crores is proposed by Madhya Pradesh followed by Uttar Pradesh Rs. 406.14 crores and West Bengal Rs. 382.89 crores.

Similarly under Col. (6) Total Capital Expenditure on Education comes to be Rs. 52.13 crores comprising of Rs. 32.55 crores for State Education Departments; Rs. 14.01 crore for Union Territories Education Departments and Rs. 5.57 crores at the Centre.

Total amount of Rs. 13.41 crores as Loans for Education is shown under Cel. (9) which includes Rs. 8.47 crores for States, Rs. 0.04 crores for Union Territories and Rs. 4.90 crores at the Centre.

On the basis of percentage, 20.8% of the Total Revenue Account of all Departments for all States/Union Territories has been provided for Education while 1.7% is proposed by the Centre. The combined percentage of Education Departments of State/Union Territories and at the Centre to Total Budget (Revenue Account) works-out to be 11.5%.

The percentage provision on Capital Expenditure outside Revenue Account of Education Departments for all States/Union Territories works-out to be 0.9% while 0.1% is proposed by the Centre. The combined percentage provision for States/Union Territories and at the Centre is 0.7%.

Share of Loans for Education by Education Departments of all States/Union Territories to the Total Loans and Advances is 0.3% while 0.1% is proposed by Education Department at the Centre. The combined percentage provision for States/Union Territories and at the Centre works-out to be 0.1%.

Combined percentage provision made by Education Departments of all States/Union Territories and at the Central Revenue Account, Capital Account (outside Reserve Account) and Loans to the Total Revenue Account, Capital Account and Loans & Advances works-out to be 8.0% (15.456 for States/Union Territories and 1.2% at the Centre)
