Regional imbalances in the field of educational development prevailing in the country have to be reduced in order to create an infrastructure for a effective insasability. For this purpose it is essential to make collection of statistics from different regions.

To highlight the regional disparities in educational developments in different regions of the country it was decided to collect the educational statistics on district-wise basis and publish quinquennially viz. once in five years. Accordingly such statistics was collected and published by NCERT for the year 1960-61. Afterwarda the study was repeated for the years 1965-66 and 1970-71 by the Ministry. The current publication relates to the data for the year 1976-77.

I take this opportunity to express my thanks for the supply of the required data and other help received from the office of the Directorates of Primary & Secondary Education and the Directorate of Collegiate Education, Government of Rajasthan for bringing out this publication.

INTRODUCTION

The Ministry of Education and Culture collects and publishes the educational statistics at State Level on annual basis. However, keeping in view data is collected and published on quinquennial basis separately for each State. This volume is the fifteenth in series of the Educational Statistics - District-wise for the years 1970-71 - 1976-77.

2. For making inter-district comparisions, important educational indicators such as enrolment ratio, coefficient of equality for S.C. & S.T., teacher-pupil ratio, cost per student and population served by an institution etc., have been worked out at district level. These indices show range of variation among the districts and are of great use for formulating educational development plans at district level as recommended by the Education Commission.

II. AREA AND POPULATION

3. Rajasthan State consists of 26 districts. The number of districts in the State remained the same during the period 1971 to 1977. The total area of the state being 3.42 lakh Sq. Kms. also remained the same during the period under review. Among the districts the area varies from as high as 28,387 Sq. Kms. in case of Barmer to as low as 3,770 Sq. Kms. of Dungarpur.

4. The total population of the state was 257.12 lakhs (134.57 males and 122.55 females) in 1971. Among the districts the highest population was 24.77 lakhs in Jaipur and the lowest was 1.66 lakh in Jaisalmer. The population of the state is estimated to have increased to 3000221 lakhs (156.63 lakhs males and 143.58 lakhs females) in 1977. The annual growth of the population works out to be 2.7% during the period under consideration.

5. The density of population for the state as a whole was 75 per Sq. Km. in 1971 which is estimated to have increased to 87 by the year 1977. In 1977 the highest density of population was 214 in Bharatpur district followed by 211 in Udaipur and 206 in Jaipur. The most thinly populated districts are Jaisalmer (5), Bikaner (24) and Barmer (32). Statement 1 depicts the district-wise information on area, population and density of population figures for the years 1971 and 1977. Table 1 below gives district-wise percentage share of area and percentage share of population for the year 1977.

6. The total population as well as population of different age groups of the State for the years 1971 and 1977 are based on the population estimates available from the office of the Registrar General of India whereas the District-wise population estimates for the age groups 5-11, 11-14 and 14-17 for the year 1976-77 (as on 1.3.1977) have been worked out by using the following formula:

We assume that -

$$\frac{P_{6-11}}{P} = \frac{P_{6-11}^i}{P_i} = K, \quad i = 1, 2, 3, 4$$

Where K is estimated from the formula, $K = \frac{P_{6-11}}{P}$

P_{6-11} = 6-11 age group population of the State

P = Total population of the state

P_{6-11}^i = 6-11 age group population of the i th district.

P^i = Total population of the i th district.

7. For getting sex-wise break-up of the population in various age groups first the girls population is estimated by the above formula by replacing total population by the girls population. Boys population can be obtained by subtracting estimated girls population from the total estimated population.

8. Of the total population for the age-group 6-11 was 42.57 lakhs (22.09 lakhs boys and 20.48 lakhs girls) forming 14.2% in 1976-77. Population in age group 11-14 was

increased from 18.82 lakhs in 1971 to 23.48 lakhs (12.40 lakhs boys and 11.08 lakhs girls) in 1977. Population for age group 14-17 was 16.54 lakhs (8.75 lakhs boys and 7.79 lakhs girls) in 1971 which increased to 21.01 lakhs (11.09 lakhs boys and 9.92 lakhs girls) in 1977. Among the districts this population varies from 20.24 thousand in Jaipur to 1.36 thousand in Jaisalmer.

9. Thus of the total population of 300.21 lakhs in 1977 school going population in age group 6-17 was 87.06 lakhs (45.53 lakhs boys and 41.48 lakhs girls) forming 29.0%. School going population of boys is 29.10% and for girls 28.89% in 1977. District-wise estimated population figures for different age groups are given in Statement No.2.

III LITERACY

10. In 1971 the effective literacy rate viz. total no. of literates per one hundred of population excluding 0-4 age group was 22.6 for the state as a whole. The literacy rate for males was 33.9 whereas for females it was quite low i.e. only 10.1 at State level. Among the districts the highest literacy was in case of Ajmer (35.2) followed by Bikaner (30.3) and Kota (30.2). Jalore reported the lowest literacy rate viz. of 11.9 District-wise details of literacy can be seen from Statement No.3

IV GENERAL VIEW

(a) INSTITUTIONS

There were 24,638 recognised institutions of all types of education in 1970-71 in the state which increased to 26,433 in 1976-77. The increase works out to 7.2% during the period under review. In 1976-77 Jaipur had the highest number of institutions (2285) followed by Udaipur (1941) and Bharatpur (1602). The lowest number of institution (318) was in case of Jaisalmer.

(b) ENROLMENT

12. The total enrolment in all types of institutions was 25.17 lakhs in 1970-71 increased to 34.34 lakhs by 1976-77. The average annual growth of enrolment works to 6.1% during the period under consideration among the districts the percentage is the highest (12.2) in case of Jaipur and the lowest (0.5) in Jaisalmer.

13. The increase in enrolment was observed in all the districts. The maximum an increase has been observed in case of Barmer (27.7%), followed by Jalore (10.3%) and in case of Jodhpur (1.7%).

14. The sex-ratio of enrolment viz. number of girls enrolled for every 100 boys was 26 in 1970-71 which increased to 30 in 1976-77.

15. The total enrolment in all educational institutions as a percentage to the population increased from 9.8% in 1970-71 to 11.4% in 1976-77 for the state as a whole. Among districts it varied from 7.5% in case of Jalore to 14.6% in case of Kota.

(c) TEACHERS

16. Total number of teachers in all types of educational institutions in the state increased from 97,358 in 1970-71 to 1,22,713 in 1976-77 showing an annual growth rate of 4.34% during the period. Number of teachers increased in all the districts except Jalore and Sirohi for which there has been a considerable decrease in the teaching strength.

17. In 1976-77 out of total number of teachers in the state, 113,492 were employed in schools thus forming 92.5% of the total strength of teachers in all types of institutions. Among the school teachers 85.7% were trained. Among the districts this percentage varies from 95.1 in Ajmer to 83.7 in Jodhpur. The corresponding figure for the women teachers is 74.9% for 1976-77. District-wise particulars of trained and untrained teachers have been given in Statement No.6.

(d) EXPENDITURE

18. The total expenditure incurred on all types of institutions in the state increased from Rs.40.92 crores in 1970-71 to Rs.98.86 crores in 1976-77 showing an average annual growth rate of 23.6%. In 1976-77, the percentage share of expenditure was the highest in case of Jaipur (12.6%) and the lowest in case of Jaisalmer (0.5%).

19. The expenditure on education per head of institution was Rs.6608 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.37,451 in 1976-77. Among the districts educational expenditure per head of the institution varies from Rs. 72,883 in Ajmer to Rs.14,952 in Jaisalmer in 1976-77.

20. The educational expenditure per head of population was Rs.15.90 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.32.00 in 1976-77. The per capita expenditure among the districts varied from Rs.62.8 in case of Ajmer to Rs.13.9 in Barmer in 1976-77. The per capita expenditure increased in all the districts in 1976-77 as compared to that in 1970-71. District-wise educational expenditure, expenditure per institutions and per capita expenditure can be seen from Statement 7.

(e) EXTENT OF COVERAGE OF S.C. AND S.T.

21. The total enrolment of S.C. students in the state was 373964 (528,179 boys and 45,785 girls) forming 10.9% of the total enrolment at State level. The enrolment percentage for S.C. boys was 12.4 and for girls it was 5.9. Among the districts the enrolment percentage for Scheduled Castes varied from the highest of 14.8 in Ajmer and Tonk to 3.3 in Banswara.

22. Percentage of S.C. population to total population in the state was 15.8 in 1970-71. The extent of coverage of S.C. population is estimated to be 69.0 in all types of educational institutions at state level in 1976-77. Among the districts the extent of coverage varied from 101.3 in Udaipur followed by Dungarpur (95.0) to 45.8 in Ganganagar. District-wise particulars of S.C. enrolment percentages and extent of coverage are given in Statement 3.

23. Total enrolment of S.T. community in educational institutions of the state was 225,305 in 1976-77. This comprised 202447 boys and 2258 girls. In terms of percentage this was 6.6% (7.6% boys and 2.9% girls). Percentage of S.T. enrolment to the total enrolment among the districts varied from 72.9 in Banswara to 0.1 in Bikaner.

V. PRE - PRIMARY EDUCATION

(a) Pre-Primary Schools.

24. There were only 26 recognised pre-primary schools in the state in 1970-71 which increased to 28 in 1976-77. 12 such schools were located in Ajmer District alone, the remaining 16 schools were scattered in 9 different districts.

In 1976-77, 16 schools were scattered in 3 different districts.

(b) ENROLMENT

25. Total enrolment in all the pre-primary schools increased from 2483 in 1970-71 to 3033 in 1976-77. However, the enrolment of children in pre-primary classes which was reported to be 6047 (3247 boys and 2806 girls) in 1970-71 increased to 27,352 (15,976 boys and 11,376 girls) by 1976-77. Among the districts the highest enrolment (6066) in Pre-primary classes was in Kota.

26. Population of S.T. community formed 12.1% in the State in 1976-77. The extent of coverage of Scheduled Tribes in all the educational institutions worked out to 54.5. Among the districts the variation in extent of coverage was too much. It was 50.0 in Churu and Gangawagar being the highest and the lowest in case of Jalore (23.2). District-wise enrolment of Scheduled Tribes and extent of coverage has been given in Statement 9.

(c) TEACHERS

27. Teachers in pre-primary schools increased slightly viz. from 99 to 102 during the period. In 1976-77, 75 teachers forming 73.5% were female.

(d) EXPENDITURE

28. Total expenditure incurred on pre-primary schools was Rs.4.52 lakhs in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.7.91 lakhs in 1976-77, showing an average annual growth of 12.5% during the period.

(e) S.C. AND S.T. ENROLMENT

29. The number of S.C./S.T. children studying in pre-primary schools have gone down considerably from 2999 in 1970-71 to 2093 in 1976-77. In 1976-77, the enrolment for 16 S.C. children and 491 Scheduled Tribes. Statement 10 gives district-wise details of pre-primary schools, enrolment, teachers expenditure and S.C. /S.T. children.

VI. PRIMARY EDUCATION

(a) INSTITUTIONS

30. Total number of primary schools decreased slightly from 19,612 in 1970-71 to 19,574 in 1976-77. This decrease is due to the upgrading of many primary schools into middle stage schools. In 12 of the 26 districts, the number of institutions increased whereas in the other 14 districts slight increase has been observed in the number of institutions.

31. The average area served by a primary school was 17.4 Sq.Kms. in 1970-71 which remained almost the same 17.5 Sq. Kms. during 1976-77.

32. Population served by a primary school was 1311 in 1970-71.

(b) TEACHERS

33. With decreasing in the number of primary schools in the state, the number of teachers also declined from 46,742 in 1970-71 to 42,141 (33,392 males and 8749 females) in 1976-77. In 1976-77 teacher employed in different districts varied from the highest of 3880 in Jaipur to 658 in Bundi. District-wise details are given in Statement 11.

(c) ENROLMENT

34. Enrolment in classes I-V was 17.49 lakhs (13.58 lakhs boys and 3.91 lakhs girls) in 1970-71 which is reported to have increased to 23.68 lakhs comprising 17.93 lakhs boys and 5.75 lakhs girls by 1976-77 at the state level. This shows annual growth rate of 5.9% during the period. The growth rate for boys comes out to 5.3% and for girls 7.0%.

35. The enrolment ratio in classes I-V to the population of age group 6-11 gives an index of facilities created at the primary stage of education. For the Rajasthan State as a whole this ratio increased from 46.7 to 55.6 during the period 1970-71 to 1976-77. The corresponding enrolment ratio for boys increased from 68.7 to 81.2 and

for girls from 22.1 to 28.1 during the period under consideration. Taking both boys and girls together this enrolment ratios among the districts varied from the highest of 75.0 in Jhunjhunu followed by 72.0 in Kota to 36.6 in Barmer in 1976-77. In 11 districts the enrolment ratio was more than that for the state. District-wise details of enrolment are given in Statement 12. Enrolment figures in 1976-77 as percentage of 1970-71 for the districts are given in Table No.2 below:

(d) S.C. AND S.T. ENROLMENT

36. Of the total enrolment 3.06 lakh belonged to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe communities in 1970-71 in Classes I-V. Of this enrolment S.C. & S.T. boys were 2.79 lakh forming 20.5% of total enrolment of boys. S.C. & S.T. girls in classes I-V formed

7.4% of total enrolment of girls in these classes. In 1976-77 S.C. enrolment formed 12.3% (44.0% boys and 7.1% girls. Taking boys and girls together the enrolment percentage for SC/ST varies among the districts as high as from 17.5 in Ajmer to 3.3 in Banswara. In classes I-V S.T. students formed 7.6% (8.9% boys and 3.7% girls) Among the districts there is a large variation of S.T. enrolment percentage which varies from 56.6 in Banswara to 0.1 in Bikaner in 1976-77. The percentage of S.C. and S.T. population was 15.8 and 12.1 respectively in 1970-71. Extent of coverage of S.C. and S.T. students separately is estimated to be 77.9 and 62.0 respectively in 1976-77. District-wise details of enrolment of S.C. and S.T. in primary classes are given in Statement 13.

The coefficient of equality or extent of coverage is defined as:

$$I = \frac{\text{Percentage of S.C./S.T. enrolment to total enrolment}}{\text{Percentage of S.C/S.T. population to total population}} \times 100$$

(e) EXPENDITURE

37. The expenditure on all primary schools of the state increased from Rs.12.61 crores in 1970-71 to Rs.27.10 crores in 1976-77 showing the average annual growth rate of 19.3% during the period under review. The expenditure is reported to have increased in all the districts. Expenditure incurred on primary schools as percentage of total educational expenditure was 30.8% in 1970-71 which slightly decreased to 27.5% in 1976-77 for the state as a whole. In 1976-77 among the districts the highest percentage was in case of Bhilwara (74.1%) and the lowest in Jaipur (12.5%).

38. The average expenditure for a primary school was Rs.64.3 thou. in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.138.9 thou. in 1976-77 at State level.

39. The expenditure on primary schools as per head of population in the state worked out to Rs.6.1 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.9.1 in 1976-77. Among the districts it varied from Rs.54.6 in Bhilwara to Rs.3.1 in 1976-77.

40. The average cost per student in primary schools was Rs.88.8 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.169.7 in 1976-77. The cost per student varied among the districts from Rs. 5407.9 in Bhilwara to Rs.84.2 in Barmer in 1976-77.

41. In 1970-71 one teacher was available for every 31 students in primary schools where as facilities in this respect slightly decreased as 1 teacher had to serve 30 students on an average. Statement 14 gives district-wise details of expenditure on primary schools, expenditure per head of population, cost per student and teacher pupil ratio in primary schools. Table 3 below gives expenditure per head of population, percentage share of expenditure on primary schools, cost per student and teacher pupil ratio in primary schools.

VII. MIDDLE SCHOOL EDUCATION

(a) INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS

42. Total number of middle schools in the state was 2035 in 1970-71 which increased to 4923 in 1976-77. The schools increased in all the districts. Among the districts the highest number of middle schools was 436 in Jaipur followed by 360 in Udaipur and the lowest in Jaisalmer (44) followed by Sirohi (72) in 1976-77. The average area served by a middle school was 163.2 Sq. Kms. in 1970-71 for the state as a whole whereas in 1976-77 a middle school was available for an area of 69.4 Sq. Kms. in the State.

43. During 1970-71, on an average a middle school was available for every population of 12,635. The situation improved in 1976-77 as a middle school was available for a population of 6092 persons. Among the districts the population served by a middle school varied from as low as 4,414 in Jaisalmer to as high as 7198 in Barmer.

44. The total number of teachers employed in middle schools was 22,146 in 1970-71 which increased to 44,265 in 1976-77 at the annual growth rate of 16.6% during the period under consideration. District-wise details of institutions and teachers are given in Statement 15.

(b) ENROLMENT

45. Total enrolment in middle schools was 5.18 lakhs in 1970-71 which increased to 11.15 lakhs by the year 1976-77 at state level. At the same time enrolment in middle classes for the state as a whole was 4.22 lakhs (3.57 lakhs boys and .68 lakh girls) in 1970-71 and by the year 1976-77 the enrolment in these classes has gone up to 5.09 lakhs (4.77 lakh boys and 1.32 lakh girls) at the annual growth rate of 6.7% during the period. Among the districts the highest enrolment is 13.5 thds in Jaipur followed by 38.6 thds. in Alwar and the lowest in case of Jaisalmer (2.66 thds.).

46. The enrolment ratio at the middle stage which is defined as the percentage of enrolment in classes VI-VIII to the total population in the age group 11-14 years gives an index of facilities created at the middle stage education for the state as a whole the enrolment ratio was 22.4% (35.8% for boys and 7.7% for girls) in 1970-71.

In 1976-77 the enrolment ratio increased to 25.1%. In case of boys it increased to 30.4% and for girls to 10.1%. In 1976-77 the percentage enrolment among the districts was the highest in case of Jhunjhunu (56.8) followed by Ajmer (34.2) and the lowest of 14.8% in Barmer and Jalore both. District-wise details of enrolment in middle education classes are given in Statement 16. Table 4 below indicates district-wise position of enrolment in 1976-77 as percentage of enrolment in 1970-71:

(c) ENROLMENT OF S.C. AND S.T.

47. In 1970-71 total number of S.C. and S.T. students enrolled in classes VI-VIII was 56,173 (33457 boys and 2716 girls) constituting 13.3% of the total enrolment in these classes at state level. In 1976-77 the enrolment of S.C. in classes VI-VIII was 50773 (47916 boys and 2781 girls) forming 8.6% of total enrolment. Boys and girls separately formed 10.1% and 2.4% of their total respective enrolments. Of the total enrolment S.T. students formed 4.9% (Boys - 5.9% and girls - 0.8%).

48. The extent of coverage of S.C. and S.T. students in classes VI-VIII was as high as 47.7% in 1970-71.

49. The extent of coverage works out to be 54.3% for Scheduled Castes and 40.5% in case of Scheduled Tribes. District-wise details of enrolment for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes are given in Statement 17.

(d) EXPENDITURE

50. Total expenditure on middle schools for the state as a whole was Rs.7.28 crores in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.22.89 crores after 6 years in 1976-77 showing an annual increase of 35.7% in expenditure during the period under consideration. The total expenditure incurred on these schools doubled in case of 6 districts and tripled in 20 districts during the period under consideration. Among the districts expenditure incurred on middle schools varies from the highest of Rs.16.58 lakhs in Jaisalmer to Rs.133.78 lakhs in Ajmer followed by Rs.131.97 lakhs in Gangaur and Rs.129.93 lakhs in Bharatpur.

51. Expenditure incurred on middle schools at per head of population was Rs.2.8 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.7.16 in 1976-77 at state level. In 1976-77 among the

districts the expenditure per head of population varies from Rs.11.7 the highest in Bikaner to Rs.4.2 the lowest in Jaipur.

52. Total expenditure made on middle schools for the state as a whole formed 17.8% of the total educational expenditure in 1970-71. This percentage increased to 23.2% by 1976-77. In the latter year among the districts percentage expenditure for middle schools varied from the highest of 49.4% in the lowest of 9.8% in Jaipur.

53. Cost per student in middle schools was Rs.140.5 in 1970-71 for the state as a whole which increased to Rs.206.0 in 1976-77. Among the districts it varied from Rs.312.4 in Jaisalmer followed by Rs.295.2 in Barmer to Rs.112.6 in Jaipur in 1976-77. In 15 districts cost per students in middle schools works out to more than the State average.

54. For the State as a whole pupil teacher ratio in middle schools was 23 in 1970-71 which was slightly increased to 25 in 1976-77 at state average. Among the districts it varied from 31 in Pali followed by 30 in Jhunjhunu and Sikar to 13 in Jaisalmer to 20 in Bhilwara and Barmer. As may be quite clear, there exists an negative correlation between the cost per student and pupil teacher ratio in Middle schools. This implies that when cost per student increased pupil teacher ratio decreases and when cost per student decreased pupil teacher ratio increased. Statement 18 indicates the district-wise details of expenditure on middle schools, expenditure per head of population, cost per student and pupil teacher ratio. Table 5 below indicates percentage of educational expenditure to the total expenditure, expenditure per head of population and cost per student for the districts separately.

VIII. HIGH/HIGHER SECONDARY SCHOOLS

(a) INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS

55. There were 1027 high/Higher Secondary Schools in the State in 1970-71 which increased to 1451 in 1976-77 showing an average annual growth rate of 6.9% during the period under consideration. In 1976-77 the highest number of such institutions (467) was in Jaipur followed by (101) each in Ajmer and Udaipur and the lowest in Jaisalmer (3).

56. In 1970-71 the average area served by a high/higher secondary school was 377.2 Sq.Kms. Conditions improved in 1976-77 as for every 235.8 Sq. Kms. one such institution was available. In 1976-77, the average area served by a High/Higer Secondary School varies from 65.2 Sq. Kms. in Jhunjhunu followed by 84.0 Sq. Kms. in Ajmer to 4205.1 Sq. Kms. in Jaisalmer.

57. Average population served by a High/Higer Secondary School in the state was 25,036 in 1970-71. In 1976-77 increased educational facilities were available as for every population of 20,690, one such institution was no available. In the year 1976-77

average population served by a High/Higher Secondary School varied from 11,896 in Jhunjhunu to 40,953 in Jalore.

58. Total number of teachers employed in High/Higher Secondary Schools in the State was 20,404 in 1970-71 which increased to 26,984 in 1976-77 showing average annual growth rate of 20.1% during the period. Statement 19 shows district-wise statistics of High/Higher Secondary Schools, teachers employed area and population served by High/Higher Secondary Schools.

(b) ENROLMENT:

59. Enrolment in High/Higher Secondary Schools was 5.60 lakh in 1976-77 against 4.35 lakh in 1970-71. Enrolment in classes IX-XI in the State increased from 2.03 lakh (1.77 lakh boys and 0.31 lakh girls) in 1970-71 to 2.92 lakh (2.42 lakh boys and 0.50 lakh girls) in 1976-77 at the annual growth rate of 6.7% during the period. Corresponding growth rate among the boys was 6.1% and for the girls 10.2%. It may be seen that the enrolment in these classes has increased in all the districts. In 1976-77 enrolment varied from 39,002 the highest in Jalore followed by 21,709 in Ajmer to 1,305 the lowest in Jaisalmer.

60. At the state level, enrolment ratio at the High/Higher Secondary classes i.e. enrolment in class IX-XI as percentage to the population of corresponding population in the age group 14-17 years increased from 12.6% to 13.9% during the period of six years. In case of boys it increased from 20.2% to 21.8% and in case of girls from 4.0% to 5.0% during the period under consideration. In 21 districts the enrolment percentage increased during the period under review. In 1976-77 among the districts the enrolment percentage varied from 4.7% in Jalore district to 23.7% in Jalore. District-wise details of enrolment are given in Statement 20. Table No.6 below gives enrolment in 1976-77 as percentages to that of 1970-71 and percentage of girls enrolment.

(c) ENROLMENT OF S.C. & S.T.

61. In 1970-71, of the total students 10.3% were of scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe community. In 1976-77, 7.3% enrolment was of Scheduled Castes and 3.8% Scheduled Tribes in Classes IX-XI at State level. Scheduled Caste boys accounted for 3.4% of total pass enrolment whereas S.C. girls accounted for 1.6%. Among the Scheduled Total girls Tribe their percentage enrolment was 4.5% and 0.5% respectively when compared enrolment to the total boys & girls enrolment. Among the districts the percentage of in the Scheduled Caste enrolment varied from 10.2 in Jalore followed by Tonk (10.1) to the State. lowest in Banswara (3.4).

62. In 1970-71 the population of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes taken together was 27.9% and the extent of coverage or coefficient of equality was estimated to be 36.9 in classes IX-XI. In 1976-77 the extent of coverage works out to be 46.2 for Scheduled Castes and 31.4 for Scheduled Tribes separately in high/higher secondary classes. District-wise details of S.C. on S. T. Enrolment are given in Statement 21.

(d) EXPENDITURE

63. Total expenditure on high/higher secondary schools in the State was Rs.10.46 crores in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.23.82 crores in 1976-77. Annual growth rate of expenditure works out to 21.2% during the period of six years. There has been appreciable increase in expenditure in all the districts except Banswara during the period under review. Among the districts the expenditure incurred on high/higher secondary schools varied from Rs.2.20 crores the highest in Ajmer to Rs.11.27 lakhs the lowest in Jaisalmer district in 1976-77.

64. Expenditure on high/higher secondary schools as per head of population was Rs.11.1 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.7.1 in 1976-77 for the State as a whole. In 1976-77 among the districts it varied from Rs. 16.5 the highest in Ajmer to Rs. 5.1 the lowest in Barmer and Jalore each. In 10 districts the expenditure on high/higher secondary schools was equal or more than the State average.

65. Per capita expenditure in high/higher secondary schools was Rs.240.2 in 1970-71 which increased to Rs.425.2 in 1976-77. In 1976-77 among the districts cost per student varies from Rs.649.0 in Phalwara followed by Rs.568.3 in Jaisalmer and Rs.568.2 in

Banswara to Rs.224.7 in Jaipur. In 14 districts per capita expenditure in these schools was more than the state average. Pupil teacher ratio remained 21 in both the years of comparison. In 1976-77 pupil teacher ratio was the highest in Gangargar (25) and the lowest in Bhilwara (7). There is a negative correlation between cost per student and pupil teacher ratio i.e. average cost per student is the highest where the pupil teacher ratio is the lowest and vice-versa. Statement 22 gives district-wise details of expenditure on high/higher secondary schools. Table 7 below gives district-wise particulars of expenditure on high/higher secondary schools as percentage of total expenditure, expenditure per head of population, cost per student and pupil teacher ratio.

IX. PROFESSIONAL, VOCATIONAL, SPECIAL AND OTHER (SCHOOL) EDUCATION

65. Total number of institutions of professional, vocational, special and other (school) education was 1711 in 1970-71 including substantial number of social adult institutions. In 1976-77 the number of institutions declined to 171. In 1976-77 four districts namely Barmer, Jalore, Pali and Dungarpur had no such institution. Total enrolment of these institutions was 49,200 (42,599 boys and 6,601 girls) in 1970-71. The enrolment also decreased to 38711 comprising 27,643 boys and 11,063 girls.

67. Out of total enrolment S.C./S.T. students were 2490 (2204 boys and 286 girls) in 1970-71. In 1976-77 there were 2439 S.C. students and 867 S.T. students.

68. Total number of teachers employed in these institutions however increased from 832 in 1970-71 to 1538 (1143 boys and 395 girls).

69. The expenditure incurred on all type institutions of professional, vocational, Special and other (School) education was Rs.13.79 lakhs in 1970-71 which increased by more than six times to Rs.84.77 lakhs in 1976-77. This expenditure included Rs.7.65 lakhs on the institutions of Music and Fine Arts, Rs.9.08 lakhs on institutions for the handicapped and Rs.68.04 lakhs for the institutions of oriental studies. Statement 23 gives district-wise particulars of number of institutions, enrolment, teachers and expenditure for the institutions of professional vocational, special and other (school) education.

X. HIGHER EDUCATION

(a) INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS:

70. Total number of all types of institutions of higher education was 277 in 1970-71 which increased to 251 in 1976-77. Out of the total number of higher institutions in the State there were 3 universities, 1 Deemed to be university, 3 Agricultural Colleges, 23 institutions of Education, 2 Engineering Tech. and Architecture colleges, 1 Law College and 9 Medical Colleges. The number of Arts, Science & Commerce Colleges was 102. All the district in the State had atleast one college.

71. Total number of teachers employed in all institutions of higher education

increased from 7135 in 1970-71 to 7603 in 1976-77. District-wise details of institutions and teachers are given in Statement No. 24.

(b) ENROLMENT:

Total enrolment in all types/higher education courses was 99,303 in 1970-71. In 1976-77 the enrolment increased to 144,737 of this 21,015 were studying in universities and Deemed to be University, 76,150 in Arts, Science & Commerce Colleges, 1431 in Agricultural and Forestry Colleges, 4175 in institutions of Education, 927 in Engineering Colleges, 367 in Law Colleges, 4165 in Medical Colleges and 5897 in institutions of other higher education. District-wise details are given in Statement 25. Statement 26 also furnishes district-wise particulars of enrolment in General Higher Education and Professional Higher Education for Rural & Urban Higher Education for the year 1976-77. Total stage-wise enrolment in General higher education was 87,044 (69,969 boys and 17,075 girls) and 31922 (27352 boys and 4570 girls).

(c) ENROLMENT OF S.C. AND S.T.

In 1970-71 the enrolment of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Communities jointly was 2173 (3119 boys and 54 girls) forming 3.2% of total enrolment in classes of higher education. In 1976-77 the corresponding enrolment of Scheduled Caste Community was 1572 consisting 5751 boys and 161 girls. On the other hand 3044 students (2968 boys and 76 girls) of Scheduled Tribe Community were enrolled in 1976-77. Percentage enrolment of Scheduled Caste students and Scheduled Tribe Students was 4.1 and 2.1 respectively in classes of higher education in 1976-77. District-wise details of S.C. & S.T. enrolment have been given in Statement 26.

(d) EXPENDITURE

Total expenditure on all types of institutions of higher education was Rs. 10.39 crores in 1970-71 which increased to Rs. 21.07 crores in 1976-77 at the annual growth rate of 21.0%. Total expenditure on institutions of higher education in 1976-77 formed 10.3% of total educational expenditure of the State. Out of it 21.0% is under consideration.

on higher education Rs.7.35 crores (30.5%) was on universities and the Deemed to be University, Rs.13.59 crores (56.5%) on Affiliated Institutions, Rs.1.91 crores (7.9%) on affiliated institutions of below degree and Rs.1.22 crore (5.1%) on Board of Secondary Education. Of the total expenditure on Affiliated Institutions (Degree level) the substantial part viz. 56.7% was incurred on Arts, Science and Commerce Colleges in 1976-77. Statement 28 gives district-wise details of expenditure made on institutions of higher education.
