CHAPTER I

GENERAL SURVEY

1. *Introduction*—The year 1957-58 recorded further improvement in the content and scope of University education. More institutions were opened and facilities in existing ones expanded. New courses in important and specialised branches were introduced and increased facilities in technical and vocational education were provided. The University Grants Commission continued to extend its help to the universities for improving the pay scales of teachers in universities and colleges while considerable grants were sanctioned by Central and State Governments for the construction of new hostels, for enlarging laboratory and library facilities and for awarding scholarships for research and post-graduate education.

2. *Development of Education*—The Committee appointed under the chairmanship of Shri C. D. Deshmukh, Chairman, University Grants Commission, to work out the estimates of expenditure connected with the introduction of Three-Year-Degree courses in universities and their colleges, submitted its report during the year under review. The Committee has estimated that a sum of Rs. 25 crores would be required to introduce the reform and recommended that this sum should be shared between the Central Government and the University Grants Commission on one hand and the State Governments and private managements on the other in equal proportion. The Committee felt that a sum of Rs. 15 crores should be provided during the Second Five Year Plan period and the balance in the Third-Five-Year Plan. In so far as the Central Government is concerned, it is proposed to provide a sum of Rs. 5 crores for the Second Plan period. It is hoped that the Commission will be able to provide Rs. 2.50 crores during the same period, bringing the Central Government's share to Rs. 7.50 crores.

The Report of the Committee was considered at the Education Ministers' Conference held in September, 1957 and after a full discussion of the various recommendations made by the Committee, the Conference decided to endorse these recommendations. Twenty three universities have already accepted the scheme, and have either introduced or are taking steps to introduce it. Others have accepted the scheme in principle or are considering the various aspects of its implementation.

2.1. During the year, the University Grants Commission continued its efforts for the development of university education. Development grants of Rs. 1,89,76,020 were paid to the various universities, of which Rs. 25,98,115 were paid to the Central Universities while the remaining Rs. 1,63,77,905 were paid to the other universities. The development schemes included Rs. 57,64,317 sanctioned for Humanities, Rs. 32,58,390 for Science and Rs. 47,85,991 for Technology.

2.2. Other developmental activities of the University Grants Commission, during the year, covered the following:

2.2.1. *Improvement of Pay Scales of Teachers*—During the year, five more universities implemented the improved pay scales recommended by the Commission for university teachers. Grants amounting to Rs. 7,32,869 were made available to the various universities for this purpose. Besides the report of the Committee set up to consider the question of minimum qualifications for different categories of university teachers was received and referred to universities for their comments.

The Commission also prepared a scheme for the revision of scales of pay of teachers in affiliated colleges on the basis that the State Government/University/College concerned share 50 per cent of the increased expenditure in case of men's colleges and 25 per cent in the case of women's colleges, the rest being borne by the University Grants Commission.

The following pay scales were recommended:—

- Principals—Rs. 600—40—800.
- Heads of Departments—Rs. 400—25—700.
- Lecturers—Rs. 200—15—320—20—500.
- Tutors and Demonstrators—Rs. 150—200.

The Universities of Bombay, Calcutta, Osmania and Poona agreed to adopt these scales in some of their constituent and affiliated colleges.

2.2.2. Grants and loans totalling Rs. 11,05,000 and Rs. 1,75,000 were sanctioned to various universities for construction of hostels and staff quarters respectively.

2.2.3. To raise the academic standards and encourage research work, the Commission decided to give financial assistance to universities to improve libraries. A Committee was appointed to make recommendations on the various developmental aspects of university libraries.

2.2.4. *Student Welfare*—(i) The Commission decided to give financial assistance to universities for providing amenities such as non-resident centres, common-rooms, cheap cafeterias, health centres and student-homes.

(ii) A scheme for establishing health centres in the universities in order to meet the essential medical needs of students and members of staff was initiated.

(iii) The scheme for giving financial assistance for setting up student-aid-funds in universities was finalised and grants amounting to Rs. 59,295 were paid to different universities for this purpose during the year.

2.2.5. In addition to the scheme of grants for publication of approved thesis in Humanities, the Commission sponsored a scheme of grants to universities for the publication of monographs/pamphlets/books on special subjects/proceedings of seminars/lectures on special subjects by Visiting Professors. During the year a sum of Rs. 8,516 was sanctioned to different universities for this purpose.

2.2.6. The Commission agreed to the proposal of establishing a Buddhist Chair at Delhi University.

2.2.7. The Commission approved a scheme of establishing Gandhi Bhavans in universities proposed by the Gandhi Smarak Nidhi.

2.2.8. The Commission accepted a scheme for setting up Hobby Workshops in the universities.

2.2.9. Following the centenary grants paid to three universities, the Commission felt it desirable to make a token grant to colleges which had served the cause of higher education for 100 years or more. Accordingly, seven private colleges were paid rupees one lakh each.

2.2.10. *Examination Reform*—A Committee was appointed to examine the problems involved in the present system of examinations and propose remedies.

2.2.11. *Medium of Instruction*—The Committee appointed by the Commission to examine problems connected with the question of medium of instruction recommended that a proper foundation in English should be laid at the secondary school stage and that the change to an Indian Language should be preceded by an adequate preparation of sufficient literature in that language in all the subjects of study. It further recommended that even when a change in the medium of instruction was made, English should continue to be studied by all the university students.

2.2.12. The Commission instituted a scheme to encourage students to learn languages other than their own regional language.

2.3. *Technical Education*—The Central Government continued giving financial assistance to government and non-government institutions for the development of Engineering and Technological education. During the year, grants amounting to Rs. 67.14 lakhs were paid to various institutions for this purpose on the recommendations of the All India Council for Technical Education.

The existing pattern of Central assistance for the establishment and development of technical institutions was reviewed and a new pattern was approved. Under the new pattern, Central Government proposed to meet the entire recurring and non-recurring expenditure for all approved schemes of post-graduate courses and research in engineering and technology and special studies. As regards first degree and diploma courses, it was proposed that for the establishment of new institutions during the current plan period, Central assistance should be confined to 50 per cent of the recurring and non-recurring costs of the schemes. For the improvement and development of the existing Government institutions for first degree and diploma courses in the current plan period, the proposed Central assistance was 50 per cent of the recurring and non-recurring expenditure.

2.3.1. A meeting of the Joint Committee of the All India Council for Technical Education and Inter University Board was held on 28th September 1957 to consider the admission qualifications for degree and diploma courses in Engineering and Technology and the structural changes required in the professional courses as a sequel

to the reorganisation of Secondary education. The recommendations of the Committee included the following:

- (i) The first degree courses in Engineering and Technology be reorganised into five-year integrated courses with at least 6 months practical training.
- (ii) In order to provide for adequate studies in Physics and Mathematics which are essential for Engineering and Technology full-fledged departments for these subjects be established in all technical institutions providing degree or equivalent courses.
- (iii) For reorganising degree courses into a five-year curriculum along right lines, technical institutions be given necessary assistance by the Central Government, State Governments and University Grants Commission on the recommendations of the All-India Council for Technical Education and its Regional Committees.
- (iv) The Boards of Technical Studies of the All India Council for Technical Education prepare syllabii for five-year integrated degree courses in the different branches of Engineering and Technology.

2.3.2. Grants-in-aid were continued to be paid under the Fundamental Research Scheme to individual research workers in various branches of Science who experienced difficulties in the pursuit of their research work. During the year, grants totalling Rs. 2.45 lakhs were paid to 52 research workers.

2.4. *General Education Courses*—A group of 24 Indian teachers was sent to the U.S.A. in February, 1957 to study the organisation of General Education courses in some of the leading universities there. In exchange a group of nine experts in General Education was invited from the U.S.A. to serve as consultants to such universities as were introducing General Education courses.

The reports of these two groups were received and discussed at a conference convened by the Ministry of Education and Scientific Research at Hyderabad in December, 1957. The introduction of General Education courses has been accepted by almost all the universities and many of them have actually introduced these courses in one form or the other.

2.5. *Development of Women's Collegiate Education—Central Assistance for State Plans*—The Central Government continued providing assistance to State Governments upto 50 per cent of the approved expenditure for their schemes relating to the development of women's education at collegiate level.

3. Another major event in the field of University education was the holding of a Conference of Vice-Chancellors, Education Secretaries of States and other eminent educationists in New Delhi from the 20th July to 1st August 1957 to discuss the problems of university administration. In the conference, the following major topics came up for discussion:

- (i) Vice-Chancellor's office.
- (ii) Problems of University finance.

- (iii) Constitution and composition of University bodies.
- (iv) Problems affecting University teachers.
- (v) Problems affecting University students.
- (vi) Relations between Universities and Boards of Secondary Education.

4. *Foreign Assistance and Exchange of Personnel*—Foreign assistance in the form of library books, laboratory equipment, experts etc., was continued during the year. Six distinguished educationists drawn from different universities of U.S.A. arrived in India under the auspices of the India Wheat Loan Educational Exchange Programme.

4.1. Under the 'Village Apprenticeship Scheme', 2,000 university students and teachers were selected during 1957-58. The scheme, which aims at developing a realistic spirit of social service and understanding of the problems of rural reconstruction in India, is financed from the funds made available for the purpose by the Ford Foundation in India.

4.2. Under the 'Operational Agreement No. 41 of T.C.M.' signed between the Government of India and the U.S.A. for the development of Home Science Education and research in India, books and scientific equipment worth \$46,370 were received. Besides the services of 8 technicians and facilities for the training of 10 Indian teachers were utilised upto 31st March, 1958.

5. *Scholarships*—The various schemes of scholarships for providing facilities for meritorious and poor students in their higher education were continued during the year. A brief account of these scholarships for the year under review is given below :

- (i) Six hundred and eighty scholarships to various universities/Institutions under the Research Training Scholarship Scheme and 28 fellowships under the National Research Fellowship Scheme were sanctioned. The total expenditure on these two schemes amounted to Rs. 14.35 lakhs.
- (ii) To conduct research in various branches of Humanities, 34 scholars were selected for grant of scholarships of Rs. 200 p.m. each.
- (iii) The number of post-Matriculation scholarships granted under the Government of India scheme to the students belonging to Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes was increased. During the year 44,415 students were granted scholarships amounting to Rs. 202.20 lakhs under this scheme.

Besides, various other Central Schemes were in operation to provide opportunities to Indian students for studies abroad. These included Central Overseas Scholarship Scheme; Agtha Harrison Fellowship; Fully Paid Overseas Scholarship Scheme; Union Territories Overseas Scholarship Scheme; Foreign Languages Scholarship Scheme; Programme for Exchange of Scholars between India and China; Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes Overseas Scholarship Scheme; Passage Grants Scheme etc.

- (iv) The University Grants Commission awarded 64 post-graduate scholarships of Rs. 100 p.m. each and 37 research fellowships of Rs. 150 p.m. each in various subjects of Humanities and Social Sciences.

6. *Youth Welfare*—Various Youth Welfare Schemes were in operation for providing recreational activities to students. Grants were sanctioned for schemes relating to Students' Tours, Youth Hostels, Youth Leadership and Dramatics Training Camps, etc. Under the scheme for setting up Youth Welfare Board and Committees to implement Youth Welfare Programme, grants amounting to Rs. 25.904 were sanctioned to various universities.

The Fourth Inter-University Youth Festival was held at New Delhi in November 1957 in which sixteen hundred students from 36 universities, Jamia Millia, Delhi and Kashi Vidyapeeth, Banaras participated. A grant of Rs. 2.98 lakhs was sanctioned for the festival. Besides, Government of India also sanctioned grants amounting to Rs. 12.385 to 4 universities to enable them to hold Inter-College Youth Festivals.

Main Developments

A brief account of the major developments in the field of University education is given below.

AGRA

(a) It was decided to start (i) M.Sc. (Statistics) class in the Institute of Social Sciences and (ii) M.A. (Linguistic) class in the Institute of Hindi Studies from July, 1958.

(b) A new Faculty of Technology was established in the University.

(c) By an amendment of the First Statutes of the University, candidates were debarred from appearing at the LL. B. examination as private candidates for external degrees.

(d) Panjabi was added to the Modern Indian Languages recognised for B.A. examination.

(e) For specialising at M.Sc. Final stage. Soil Chemistry was added to the branches of chemistry recognised for M.Sc. Final examination.

(f) 'Basic Education' was included in the list of subjects for specialisation for B.T. degree.

(g) The ordinance relating to Ph.D. degree was amended by deleting the clause requiring three years' residence within the jurisdiction of the University prior to supplication for that degree.

ALIGARH

(a) The university decided to introduce the following new courses:

- (i) M.A. and M.Sc. in Statistics.
- (ii) One year diploma course in Statistics.
- (iii) Post-graduate diploma course in Business Administration.
- (iv) Diploma course in Steno-typing.

(b) Fine Art, Domestic Science and Music were proposed to be included in the list of optional subjects for the B.A. and B.Sc. degrees for women candidates only.

(c) General Education was introduced as a compulsory subject for the under-graduate students in the Faculties of Arts and Science. A modified form of General Education course was also introduced in the syllabus for B.Sc. Engineering.

ALLAHABAD

The scales of pay of university teachers were revised. Instead of 3 categories, teachers under revised pay scales were divided into 2 categories with pay scales as under:

ANDHRA

(a) Classes in Pre-university course of study were started in colleges affiliated to the university as a first step towards the implementation of the scheme of reorganisation of university education.

(b) The following new courses were started:

- (i) Master's degree course in Business Administration.
- (ii) M.Sc. degree course in Chemistry with Analytical Chemistry as a special subject.
- (iii) Post-graduate diploma course in Social work.

(c) It was decided to start with effect from the year 1958-59 (i) three year Pass degree courses, (ii) four year Honours degree courses and (iii) Pre-professional courses.

(d) Curriculum for post-graduate diploma course in Tuberculosis (T.D.D.) was adopted.

(e) It was decided to replace the existing B.Sc. (Hons.) course in Chemical Technology by a B. Technology Course in Chemical Engineering.

ANNAMALAI

(a) Post-graduate course in Social Sciences of two years' duration leading to M.A. degree was started.

(b) The following new courses were instituted:

- (i) Three-year courses for B.A., B.Sc., B.O.L., B.Mus., and B.Com. degrees.
- (ii) M.Sc. in Geology.
- (iii) Post-graduate diploma course in Applied Geology.
- (iv) Pre-professional course in Agriculture.

(c) Plant Physiology was offered as an additional subject for M.Sc. degree examination in Botany.

BANARAS

(a) The following new courses were instituted:

- (i) M.Sc. (Engg.) in Electrical Machine Design.
- (ii) M.Sc. (Mining).
- (iii) M.Sc. (Metallurgy).
- (iv) Post-graduate diploma course in spectroscopy.

(b) It was decided to introduce Pre-university courses from July, 1958.

(c) The scales of pay of lecturers in Central Hindu College (Kamacha), Ayurvedic College and the College of Music and Fine Arts were revised as Rs. 250—20—450—25—600 with effect from 1st April 1958.

BARODA

(a) Three-year degree courses in B.A., B.Sc. and B.Com. were introduced.

(b) Pre-Medical course of one year's duration after the Preparatory Science or the old First Year Science of Intermediate stage was started in the Faculty of Science. For courses in Technology and Engineering, instead of starting any pre-professional class the University added the Pre-professional year to these courses and reorganised them into integrated five and four year courses respectively.

(c) The subject of General Education was incorporated in the regular curriculum in the first two years of the new three-year degree courses in Arts, Science and Commerce. General Education was also introduced in the first two years of degree courses in Fine Arts and Home Science and in the Pre-Medical and the first year of the new integrated Technology and Engineering degree courses.

BIHAR

A new faculty of Fine Arts and Crafts was established.

BOMBAY

(a) The following new courses were introduced:

- (i) Post-graduate diploma in Industrial Management.
- (ii) Degree of Master of Automobile Engineering.

(b) Courses of study in Psychology were introduced for B.A. and M.A. degrees.

CALCUTTA

(a) University College of Medicine started functioning.

(b) Cardiology and Epidemiology were included in the list of subjects for P.Phil. degree in Medicine.

DELHI

(a) A new faculty of Music and Fine Arts was established.

(b) The following new courses were instituted:

- (i) Diploma course of Anaesthesia.

- (ii) Diploma course in Child Health.
- (iii) M.Sc. course in Bacteriology.
- (iv) M.Sc. course in Nutrition.

(c) African Economics was introduced as an optional subject for students of M.A. (Economics).

GAUHATI

Department of Sanskrit started functioning.

GORAKHPUR

The university started functioning during the year with 6 post-graduate teaching departments of Ancient History and Culture, Commerce, Education, English, Psychology and Sanskrit and 12 affiliated colleges.

GUJARAT

(a) The enrolment of external students, which was confined only to those who knew Gujarati and resided in Gujarat University area, was extended to all Gujarati knowing students including those staying outside the limits of Gujarat University area.

(b) The following new diplomas were instituted:

- (i) Diploma in Anaesthesia.
- (ii) Diploma in Labour Laws and Practice.
- (iii) Diploma in Taxation Laws and Practice.

(c) The University School of Psychology started functioning.

(d) Provision for the study of Hindi at post-graduate level was made.

JABALPUR

The University started functioning during the year with 15 affiliated colleges. Necessary steps were taken to establish 9 teaching departments in subjects for which adequate facilities were not available in the colleges.

JADAVPUR

A degree course in Telecommunication Engineering was introduced.

JAMMU AND KASHMIR

(a) By an amendment in the University Act a separate Faculty of Social Science and an independent Board of Post-Graduate Studies were constituted.

(b) It was decided to allot 1/5th of the total marks in each subject of the University examination at degree and post-graduate stages for progress shown in the college tests and for regular attendance.

(c) It was laid down as statutory requirement that only such candidates could appear for the Honours examinations in Oriental, Classical and Modern Indian Languages as have already passed an examination of this or any other University.

KARNATAK

- (a) Three new departments of English, Philosophy and Sociology were established.
- (b) Three-year degree course was introduced.

KERALA

- (a) The following post-graduate departments were started:
 - (i) Department of Education.
 - (ii) Department of Politics.
 - (iii) Department of Psychology.
- (b) Classes in three-year degree course were started.

KURUKSHETRA

Department of Sanskrit Started functioning with admissions in M.A. (Sanskrit Class).

LUCKNOW

The necessary ordinances relating to the institution of M.A. degree in Public Administration were passed.

MADRAS

- (a) Department of Architecture was established.
- (b) Three-year-degree courses and pre-professional courses were introduced.

MYSORE

- (a) Pre-university course of one year duration was introduced.
- (b) General Education was incorporated as a subject of study in Pre-university and three-year degree courses.
- (c) Kannada was introduced as a medium of instruction in the pre-university classes besides English.

NAGPUR

- (a) The following new courses were introduced:
 - (i) M.Sc. in Applied Geology.
 - (ii) Four-year degree course in B.Sc. (Home Science).
 - (iii) Pre-university courses in Faculties of Arts, Science, Commerce and Agriculture.
- (b) One year diploma course in teaching was instituted in place of the existing two-year course.
- (c) It was decided to introduce diploma courses in French and German.
- (d) The scheme for organising post-graduate teaching on inter-collegiate basis was approved.

II

OSMANIA

(a) Three-year degree course and Pre-professional courses in Engineering and Medicine were introduced.

(b) Diploma courses in Russian and Italian and degree course in Mining Engineering were introduced.

PANJAB

(a) The following new courses were introduced:

(i) Post-graduate course in Engineering.

(ii) Degree course in Dairying.

(b) The syllabus of the following courses was approved:

(i) Diploma course in Library Science.

(ii) B.A. Honours Schools in Sanskrit and Economics.

(iii) M.A. Honours Schools in Sanskrit and Economics.

(c) Students of I.A., B.A. and B.Com. were permitted to answer questions in Hindi, Punjabi or Urdu besides English.

(d) Sindhi and Tamil were included in the list of additional optional subjects for Intermediate and B.A. examinations.

(e) Men candidates were permitted to offer Art and Music as elective subjects for Intermediate and B.A. examinations.

PATNA

A new course of M.Sc. in Medical Science was introduced.

POONA

(a) Post-graduate course in Hydraulics and Dam Engineering was introduced.

(b) It was decided to institute a post-graduate diploma in Clinical Pathology.

RAJASTHAN

(a) It was decided to introduce three-year degree course in the Faculties of Arts, Science and Commerce from the session 1959-60.

(b) With the introduction of the subject of 'Economics and Public Administration' for the post-graduate Classes in the Department of Economics, the name of the department was changed to 'Department of Economics and Public Administration'.

(c) The university allowed the option of answering questions in Hindi at B. Ed. examination.

(d) The Department of Geology started M.Sc. class in Geology.

ROORKEE

(a) Degree courses in Tele-communication and Architecture were introduced.

(b) It was decided to introduce:

(i) Three-year course for diploma students.

(ii) Post-graduate course in Photo-grammetry.

(iii) Short-term refresher course in Public Health Engineering.

S. V. VIDYAPEETH

Pre-university courses in Arts, Science, Commerce and Agriculture were started.

SAUGAR

(a) Department of French and German was amalgamated with Department of English.

(b) The Pharmaceutical Chemistry section of the Chemistry Department became a full-fledged Department of Pharmacy. Post-graduate course in Pharmacy was also instituted.

(c) The following new courses were instituted:

(i) Post-graduate course in Ancient History and Culture.

(ii) Diploma Course in Sanskrit, Hindi and Yogic Instructions.

(d) Subjects of Geography and Anthropology were added in the under-graduate courses.

SRI VENKATESWARA

The following new courses were introduced:

(i) Pre-university courses.

(ii) M.A. (Hons.) in Economics and Philosophy.

(iii) M.Phil. in English, Economics, Mathematics, Philosophy, Chemistry, Physics and Zoology.

(iv) M.Sc. in Chemistry, Physics, Mathematics and Zoology.

UTKAL

(a) Post-graduate Departments of Philosophy and Sanskrit were established.

(b) Post-graduate course in Education and diploma course in Statistics were introduced.

VIKRAM

University Schools of Studies started functioning with M.A. (Economics, Philosophy, Political Science, Sanskrit), M.Com., M.Sc. (Chemistry, Physics) and diploma in Library Science courses.

VISVA-BHARATI

(a) Two-year M.A. course was introduced in place of the existing one-year M.A. course.

(b) Three-year Honours course was remodelled and the Pass course abolished. Main features of the three-year Honours course were:

(i) Introduction of General Education as compulsory subject.

(ii) Provision for awarding distinction in recognition of a certain standard of proficiency.

(iii) Integration of languages (both Indian and foreign) in the structure of the course.

(iv) Assignment of 20 per cent of the total marks to tutorial work.

CHAPTER II
STATISTICAL SURVEY

Institution

(A) *Universities*

With the establishment of the 4 new universities of Gorakhpur, Jabalpur, Kurukshetra and Vikram during the year under review, the number of universities rose to 37. Table I gives details about the years of their foundation/reconstitution, territorial jurisdiction and type, as well as the faculties provided and the medium of instruction/examination.

Of these universities, Agra continued to be purely affiliating and Bombay a teaching and federal one. With the addition of Kurukshetra University, the number of teaching and residential universities rose from 10 in 1956-57 to 11 during the year. The universities of Gorakhpur, Jabalpur and Vikram were of teaching and affiliating type and with their addition the number of such universities increased to 24.

(B) *Teaching Departments*

The number of university teaching departments during the year was 343—14 more than that of the previous year. In fact 21 new departments were started during the year, but the department of French and German of Saugar University was merged with their department of English while six departments of Sri Venkateswara University were amalgamated to form University College. The university-wise distribution of the new departments is given below:—

(C) Colleges

The number of colleges maintained by or affiliated to various universities rose by 64 from 1,107 in 1956-57 to 1,171 during 1957-58. With the establishment of the new universities of Gorakhpur, Jabalpur and Vikram and also on account of the changes in territorial jurisdiction of some of the universities conforming to the boundaries of the reorganised states, 81 colleges were transferred from one university to another. Thirty colleges disaffiliated from Agra University were transferred to the universities of Gorakhpur (9), Rajasthan (4), Saugar (2) and Vikram (15); one college from Andhra University to Sri Venkateswara University; 2 colleges from Kerala University to the University of Madras; 25 colleges of the Madras University to the Universities of Kerala (18) and Mysore (7); 5 colleges of Osmania University to the University of Karnatak and 18 colleges of Saugar University to the Universities of Jabalpur (17) and Vikram (1). Besides, Rajasthan University transferred twenty of its intermediate colleges to Rajasthan Board of Secondary Education and one college of Saugar University was closed down. The additional 85 colleges opened during the year were distributed among 20 universities as follows: Agra 6, Andhra 2, Baroda 1, Bihar 10, Calcutta 11, Delhi 1, Gauhati 2, Gorakhpur 3, Gujarat 3, Karnatak 5, Kerala 8, Madras 3, Osmania 2, Punjab 4, Poona 3, Rajasthan 3, Saugar 5, Sri Venkateswara 2, Utkal 2 and Vikram 9.

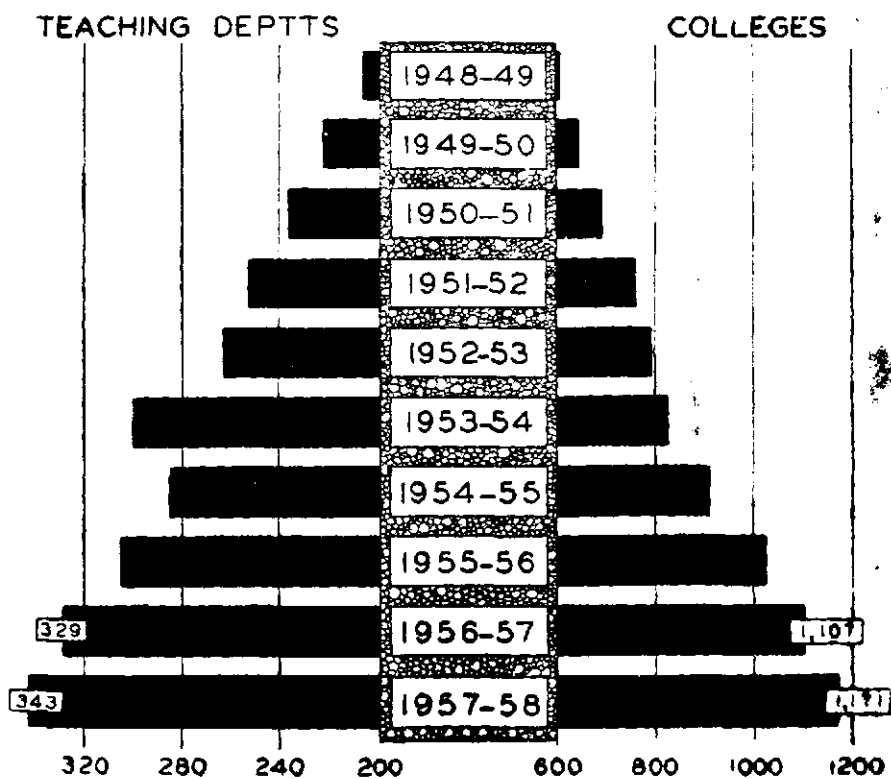
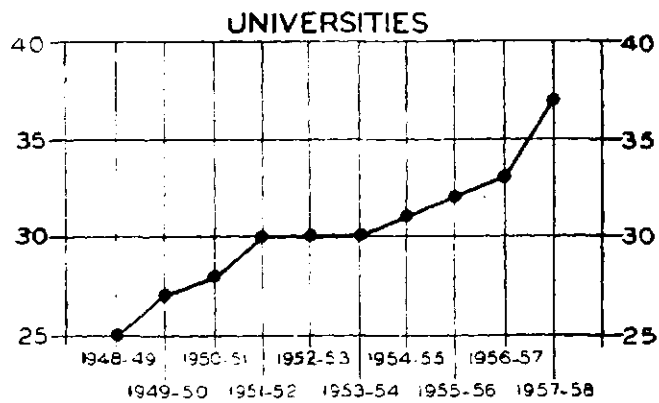
Of the 1,171 colleges in 1957-58, 226 were university/constituent colleges and 945 affiliated/associated colleges (Table II) the corresponding number for 1956-57 being 220 and 887 respectively. As regards their management, private bodies controlled 63.6 per cent of the colleges, Government 26.6 per cent and the universities 9.5 per cent. Local Boards administered only 0.3 per cent of the colleges.

Table III gives the number of colleges by type of education. Of the total, 604 colleges provided instruction in general education—which includes the study of Arts, Science, Oriental Learning, Theology, Home Science, Social Work, Music, Fine Arts etc.—326 in professional education and the remaining 241 in general as well as professional education. Further classification of colleges for professional education is given below:

Besides, 241 colleges for general education had 284 classes for professional education attached to them. Their details are as follows: Classes for Agriculture 13, for Commerce 179, for Education/Teachers' Training 38, for Engineering and Technology 8, for Law 23, for Medicine 16, for Physical Education 1 and for other subjects like Business Management, Journalism and Library Science 6.

(D) *Boards of Intermediate Education*

There were 4* Boards of Intermediate Education, viz., Board of High School and Intermediate Education, Uttar Pradesh, Allahabad; Board of Secondary Education, Madhya Bharat Region, Gwalior (M.P.); Board of Secondary Education, Rajasthan, Jaipur and Central Board of Secondary Education, Ajmer, which functioned as examining bodies for Intermediate as well as some other examinations. During the year 951 colleges were affiliated to them for Intermediate Examination, of which 81 were also affiliated to the Universities for degree/post-graduate courses.

Pupils

The total number of students enrolled in university teaching departments, constituent colleges and colleges affiliated to universities and boards of intermediate education rose from 7,69,468 (6,62,677 boys and 91,893 girls) in 1956-57 to 8,27,341 (7,08,962 boys and 1,18,379 girls) during 1957-58, showing an increase of 13.9 per cent as against the corresponding increase of 8.0 per cent during 1956-57.

Table IV gives a detailed account of enrolment in universities and boards of intermediate education. The enrolment in the universities ranged from 1,24,379 in Calcutta, 57,603 in Punjab and 57,160 in Bihar

to only 547 in Visva-Bharati and just 21 in the newly established university of Kurukshetra. In 15 universities it varied between ten thousand and fifty thousand while in 17 Universities it varied from one thousand to ten thousands. As regards the boards of intermediate education, the enrolment in the colleges of Uttar Pradesh Board alone was 81.4 per cent of the total enrolment for intermediate classes in all the colleges affiliated to boards.

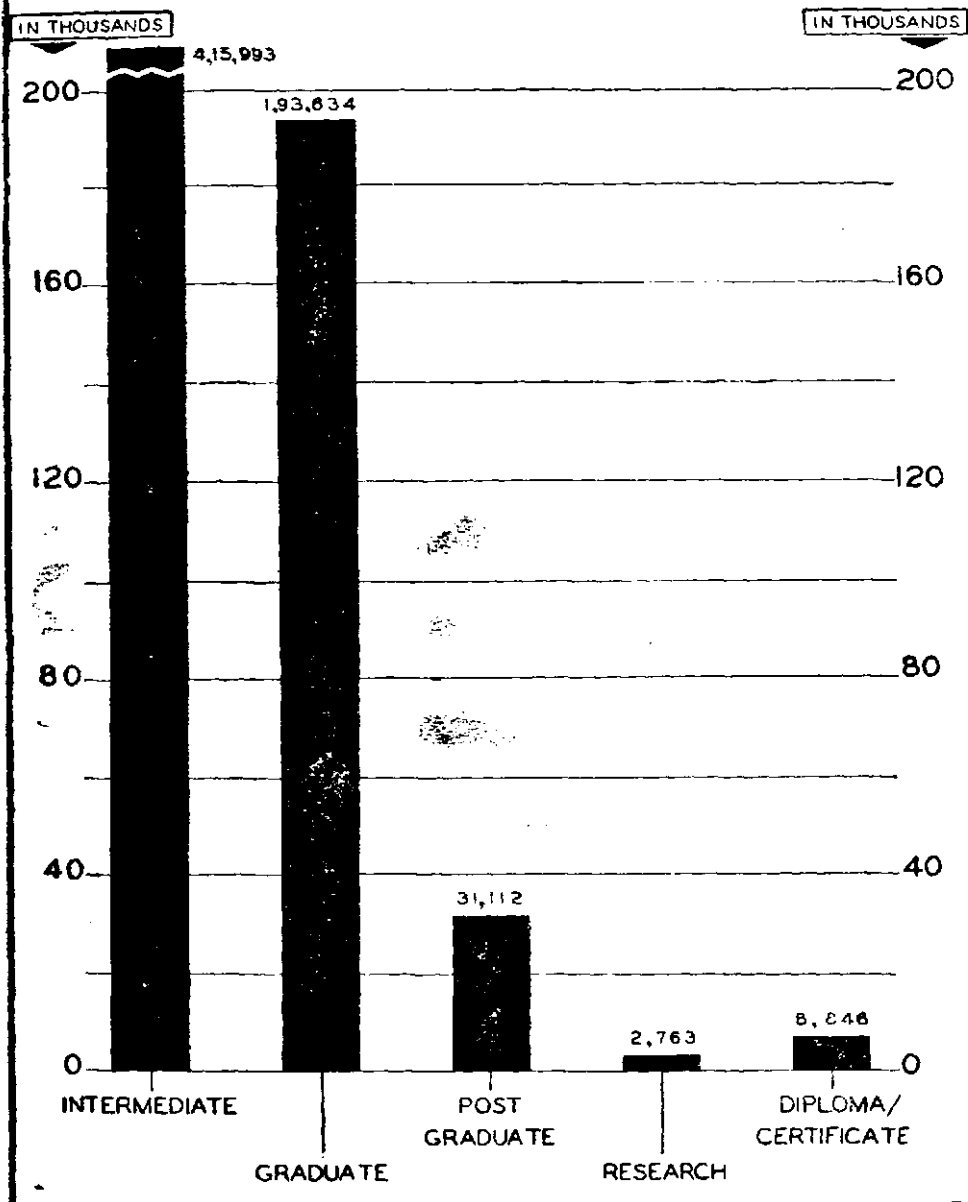
As compared to 1956-57, the enrolment in 1957-58 increased in all the universities except in the case of Agra, Aligarh, Madras, Osmania, Rajasthan, Saugar, Sri Venkateswara and Visva Bharati. Evidently the decrease in the enrolment in the case of Universities of Agra, Madras, Osmania, Rajasthan and Saugar was mainly on account of the transfer of some of their affiliated colleges to other universities/Boards, while in the case of Aligarh, Sri Venkateswara and Visva-Bharati it was due to the introduction of the three-year degree course in place of the old four-year degree course with intermediate stage. Numerically, the largest addition in enrolment was shown as usual by Calcutta University (10,628) followed by the Universities of Bihar (9,113), Vikram (7,085) and Panjab (6,431). Of the remaining universities, 10 universities reported a rise varying between one thousand and six thousands, while in 15 universities it was less than one thousand. On percentage basis, Roorkee University reported the highest increase of 58.3 per cent. It was followed by the Universities of Jadavpur (42.6 per cent), Sardar Vallabhbhai Vidyapeeth (29.5 per cent), Baroda (24.6 per cent), Gujarat (24.5 per cent), Mysore (22.9 per cent). The lowest percentage of increase was in Banaras (0.1 per cent).

Of the total enrolment of 8,27,341 in the universities and colleges, 6,50,348 students (78.6 per cent) were enrolled for general education and 1,76,993 students (21.4 per cent) for professional or technical education. The corresponding percentages for the year 1956-57 were 79.2 and 20.8. The increase in the enrolment for general education was of the order of 6.7 per cent and that for professional and technical education 10.7 per cent during 1957-58 as compared to 8.1 per cent and 7.4 per cent respectively during 1956-57.

The distribution of the total enrolment by stage of education was as follows: intermediate stage 55.1 per cent, graduate stage 38.1 per cent and post-graduate and research stage 5.0 per cent. The remaining 1.8 per cent were taking diploma and certificate courses. The details of enrolment by type and stage of education are given below:—

Girl students, numbering 1,18,379 constituted 14.3 per cent of the total enrolment. Of these, 1,07,506 (90.8 per cent) were enrolled in general education and the remaining 10,873 (9.2 per cent) in professional and technical education.

Teachers

The total number of teachers working in the universities and their colleges (excluding those teaching in colleges affiliated to boards of intermediate education) rose from 36,504 (32,554 men and 3,950 women) in 1956-57 to 39,872 (35,425 men and 4,447 women) during the year under review. The rate of increase, during 1956-57, was 9.9 per cent (9.3 per cent in the case of men teachers and 15.3 per cent in the case of women teachers) as compared to 9.2 per cent (8.8 per cent in the case of men teachers and 11.2 per cent in the case of women teachers) during 1957-58. The distribution of teachers by type of institution is given below:—

The number of teachers in university teaching departments rose by 11.3 per cent and that in university/constituent and affiliated colleges by 9.1 per cent. The corresponding percentages for the previous year were 3.7 in the case of university teaching departments and 10.3 in the case of university/constituent and affiliated colleges. 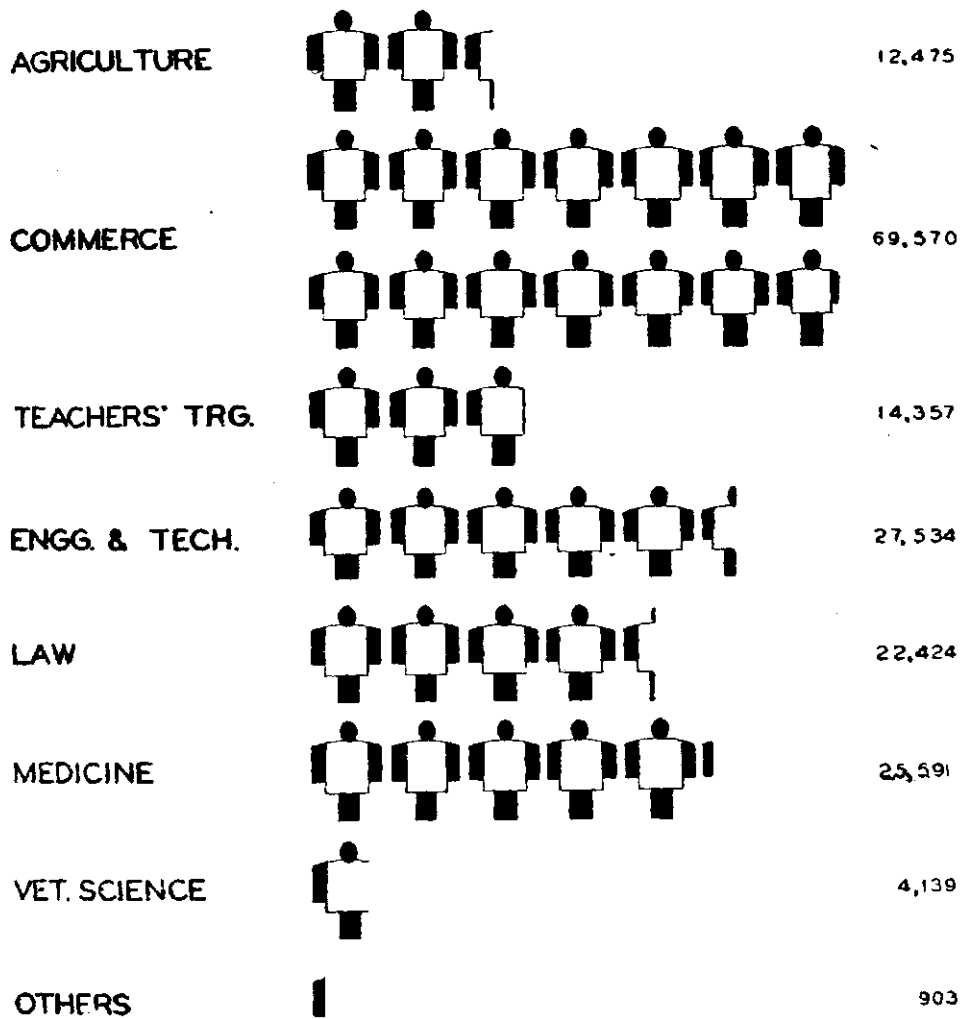

Of the total number of 39,872 teachers, 27,560 (69.1 per cent) were teaching general education courses and the remaining 12,312 (30.9 per cent) professional education courses. The corresponding percentages for the previous year were 71.1 and 28.9. For further university-wise details, reference may be made to Table VIII.

The disparity in the pay scales of teachers working in universities and colleges continued to persist. The scales varied from university to university and even within the same university from college to college under different managements. But efforts were continued during the year to revise the pay scales of teachers in order to bring them on par with the pay scales recommended by the University Grants Commission in the Second Five Year Plan.

Table IX shows the scales of pay of lecturers, readers and professors working in university teaching departments and colleges maintained by the Universities. As in 1956-57 the universities of Andhra, Annamalai, Baroda, Bihar, Kerala, Madras, Mysore, Nagpur, Patna, S.N.D.T. Women's and Visva-Bharati were the only universities where the minimum scale of lecturers was less than Rs. 250. Some of

these universities, however, improved their minimum of the scales which ranged during the year between Rs. 150 to Rs. 225 as compared to Rs. 100 to Rs. 125 in the previous year. In the case of readers and professors, the universities of Agra, Aligarh, Allahabad, Banaras, Bombay, Calcutta, Delhi, Gujarat, Jadavpur, Jammu and Kashmir, Karnatak, Lucknow, Punjab, Poona, Rajasthan, Roorkee and Saugar gave the same or a higher start than Rs. 500 to readers and Rs. 800 to professors as recommended by the University Grants Commission. Besides, the reader's scale in universities of Gauhati and Kurukshetra started at Rs. 500 and professor's scale in universities of Gorakhpur, Jabalpur and Nagpur at Rs. 800.

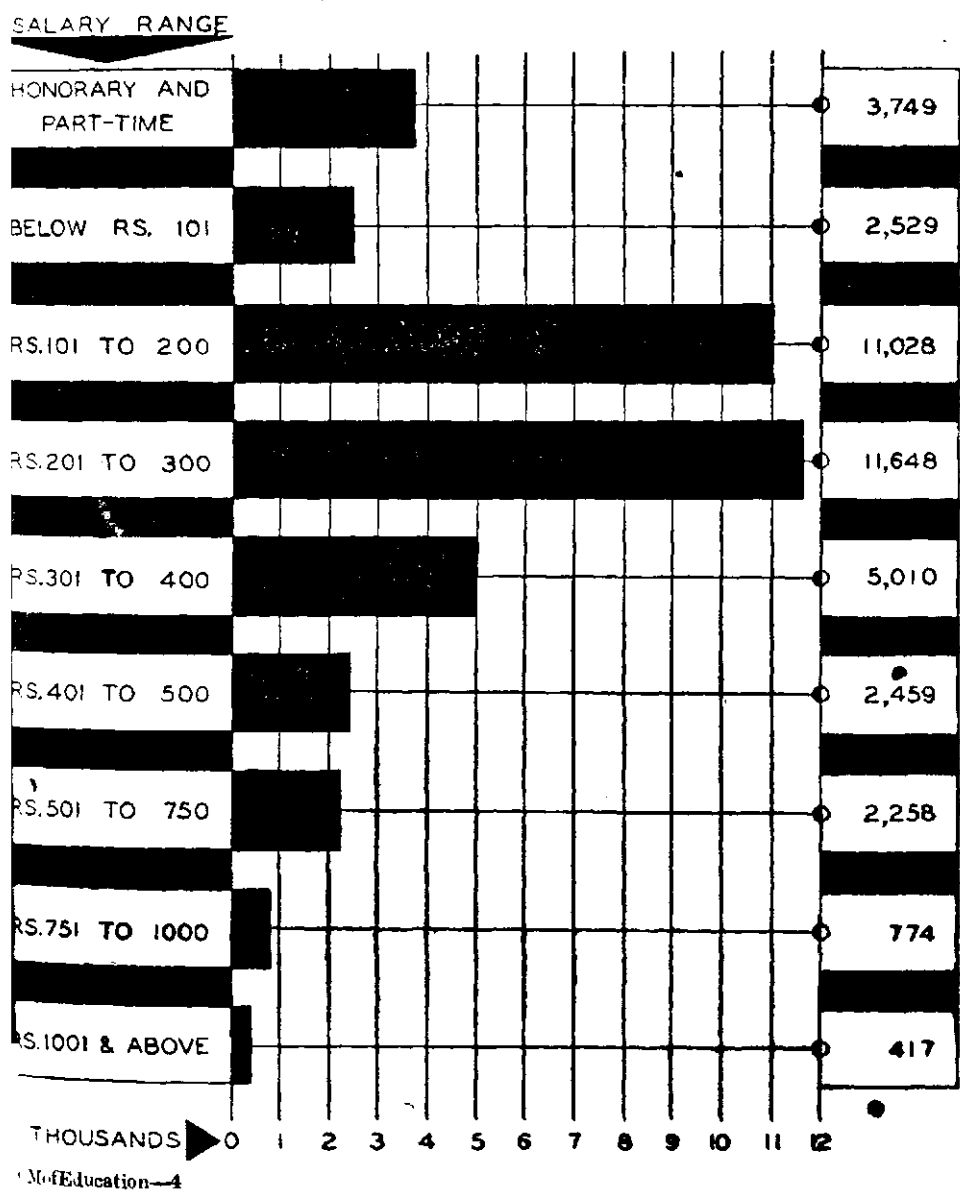

The above statement reveals that about half of the teachers (excluding honorary/part-time) received a monthly salary upto Rs. 232 per month and that only 9.6 per cent of them received a salary exceeding Rs. 500 per month.

Examination Results

Table XI gives the results of annual and supplementary post-Matriculation examinations conducted by the universities and boards of intermediate education. During the year 1958, 6,75,908 students (5,68,889 boys and 1,07,019 girls) appeared of whom 3,16,501 (2,61,253 boys and 55,248 girls) passed. Corresponding figures for the year 1957 were: number appeared 5,76,192 (4,90,173 boys and 86,019 girls) and

Of the 1,27,942 degrees conferred by the universities during 1958, 1,10,379 were for graduation; 17,098 for post-graduation, and 465 for doctorate. Again, of the 1,10,379 scholars who secured graduate degrees, 73,058 or 66.2 per cent graduated in humanities and sciences (general education) and the remaining 37,321 or 33.8 per cent in professional and technical education courses. Similar break-up for the 17,098 post-graduate degree was: general education 14,722 or 86.1 per cent and professional education 2,376 or 13.9 per cent. 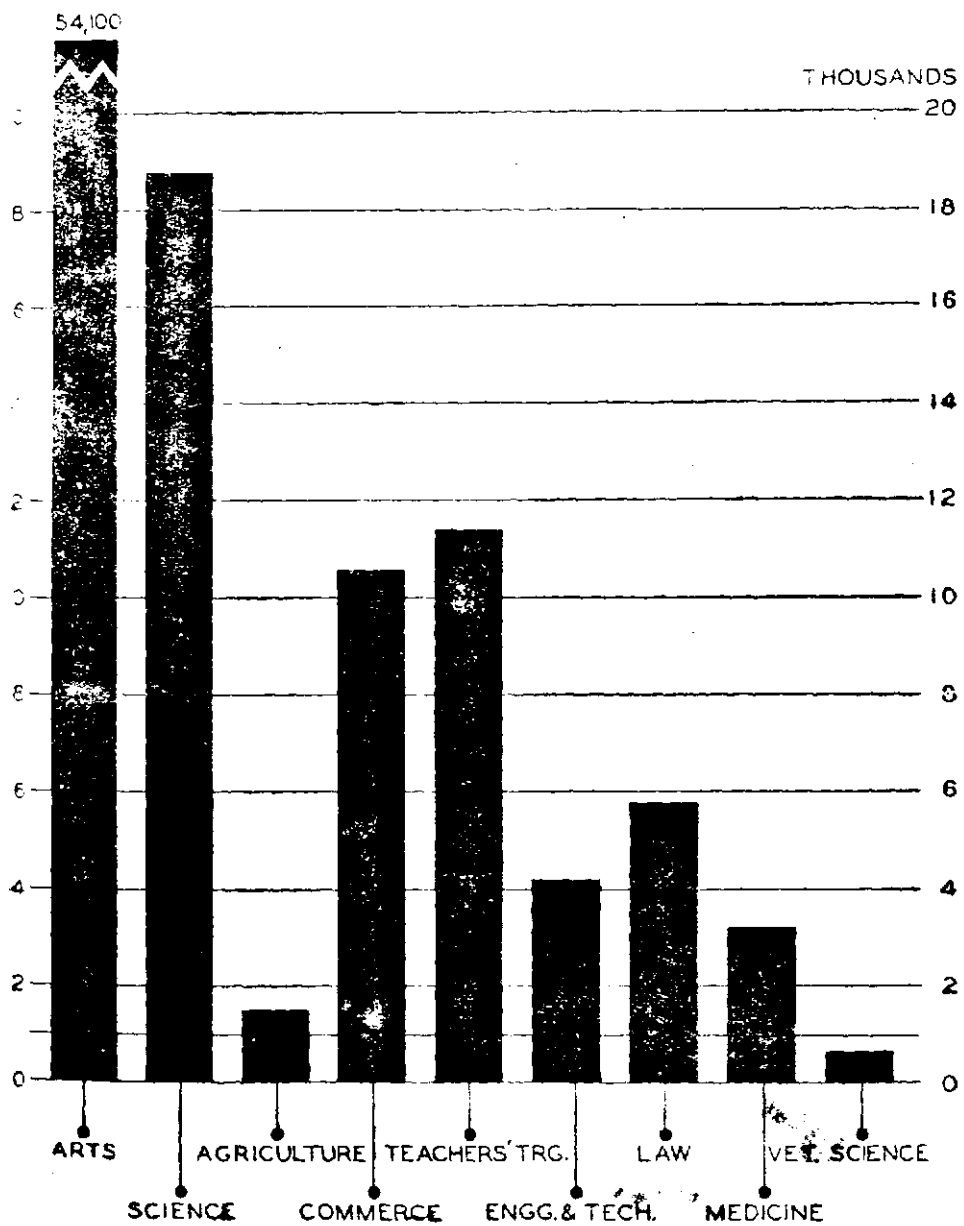

Girls constituted 15.8 per cent of the candidates who appeared in the post-matriculation examinations conducted by the universities and the boards of intermediate education. The pass percentage among the girl candidates during the year was 51.6 per cent as against 54.4 per cent in the previous year. Of the 23,221 girl students who received degrees during the year, 20,073 secured bachelors' degrees, 3,106 master's degrees and 42 doctorate degrees. The break-up of the girl students awarded bachelor's degree was: in Arts 13,305; in Science 2,149; in Home Arts/Home Science 125; in Music and Fine Arts 9; in Oriental Learning 4; in Agriculture 4; in Commerce 84; in Education (Teachers Training) 3,631; in Engineering/Technology 1; in Law 140; in Medicine 618 and in Veterinary Science 3.

As regards intermediate examination 3,28,014 students appeared during the year of whom 1,38,725 passed, giving a pass percentage of 42.3. The distribution of those who passed the examination was: in Arts 85,596; in Science 40,658; in Agriculture 1,654 and in Commerce 10,817.

Besides the degree and intermediate examinations 35,442 students (29,002 boys and 6,440 girls) qualified for Pre-University examinations and 14,392 (9,883 boys and 4,509 girls) for various other diplomas and certificates. For further details reference may be made to Tables XI and XII.

Finances*Income*

During the year 1957-58, the universities and their constituent and affiliated colleges reported a total income of Rs. 48.32 crores as compared to 43.57 crores in 1956-57. This marks an increase of 10.9 per cent during this year as against an increase of 15.2 per cent during the previous year. The distribution of income from various sources is given below:

During the year, the income of the universities and the constituent colleges maintained by them amounted to Rs. 19.00 crores as compared to Rs. 17.45 crores in the previous year. The percentage increase during 1957-58 was 8.9 as against 13.7 in 1956-57. Table XIII gives details of the income of the universities and constituent colleges maintained by them. The total income contributed by the various

sources was: government and local board funds 56.6 per cent, fees 29.6 per cent, endowments 0.9 per cent and other sources 12.9 per cent. Corresponding percentages for the previous year were: Government and local board funds 54.7, fees 29.5, endowments 1.0 and other sources 14.8.

Table XIV gives the details of income of affiliated and such constituent colleges as were not maintained by the universities. The total income of these colleges amounted to Rs. 29.31 crores during the year as compared to Rs. 26.12 crores in the previous year. This shows an increase of 12.2 per cent during 1957-58 as against 16.2 per cent during 1956-57. The contribution of government and local boards towards the total income of these colleges was to the tune of 53.1 per cent, of fees 35.9 per cent, of endowments 1.5 per cent and of other sources 9.5 per cent. Corresponding figures for the year 1956-57 were: government and local boards 51.5 per cent, fees 37.0 per cent, endowments 1.5 per cent and other sources 10.0 per cent.

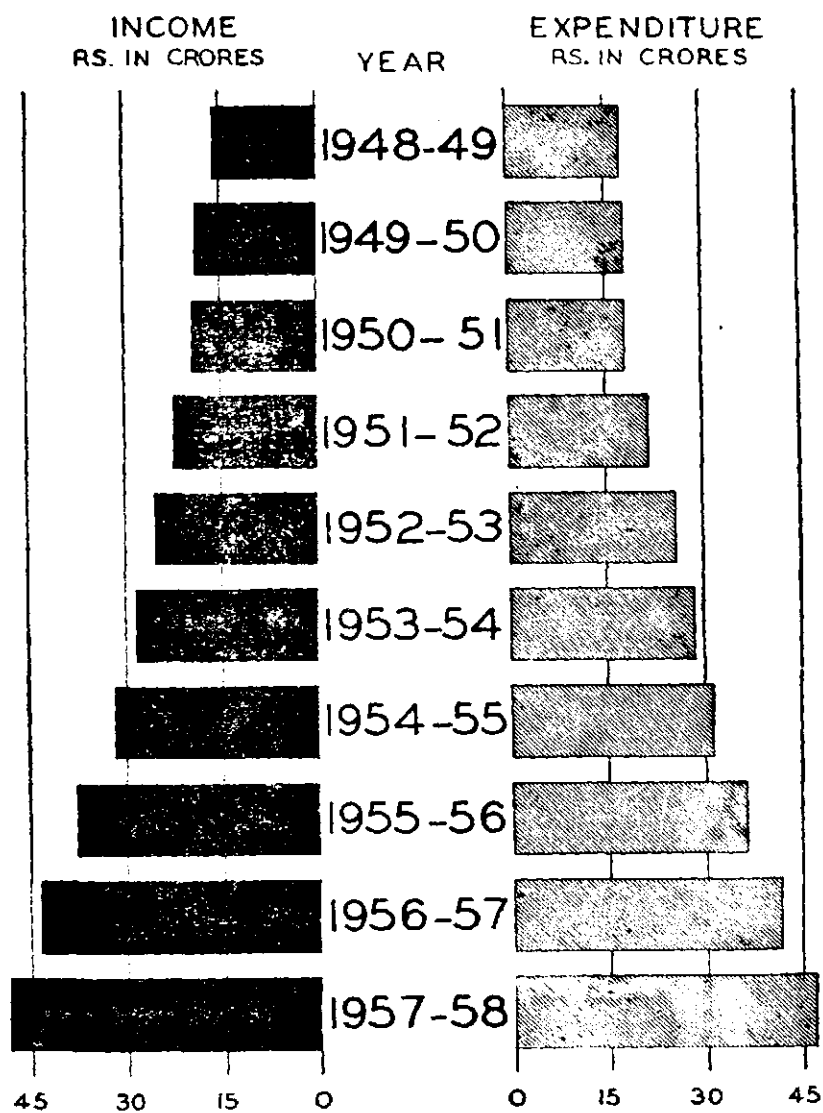
Expenditure

The total expenditure of the universities and their colleges rose from Rs. 41.99 crores during 1956-57 to Rs. 47.11 crores during 1957-58. The rate of increase during the year was 12.1 per cent as against 14.7 per cent during the previous year. Of the total, Rs. 36.23 crores were spent on recurring items and Rs. 10.88 crores on non-recurring items. The distribution of the total expenditure by heads of charge is given below:

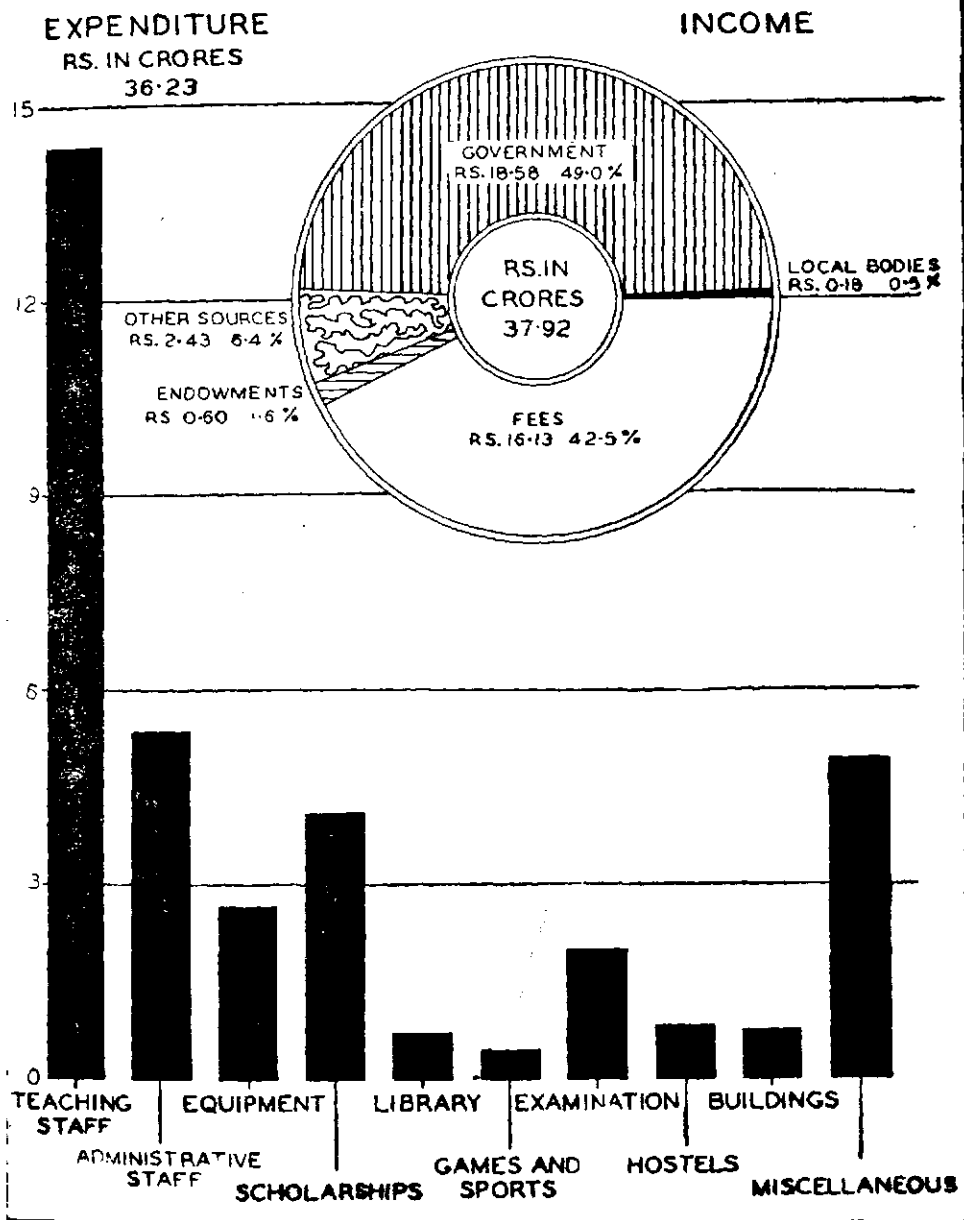

During the year, the total expenditure on affiliated and such constituent colleges which were not maintained by the universities was Rs. 30.03 crores. Libraries

Library facilities were provided to the students by almost all the universities and colleges in varying degrees. The total stock of books in all these libraries (excluding those in the colleges attached to boards of intermediate education) comprised of about 125 lakhs of volumes, giving on an average nearly 15 volumes per student. Of the total number of volumes, nearly 25 lakhs were available in university libraries, 35 lakhs in libraries of university/constituent colleges and the remaining 65 lakhs in those of the affiliated colleges. Corresponding stocks of books for the previous year were: university libraries 29 lakhs, libraries of university/constituent colleges 28 lakhs and libraries of affiliated colleges 62 lakhs. The detailed statistics of libraries in universities and their colleges are given in Table XIX.

Appendix—Evening Colleges

During the year, 40 colleges affiliated to various universities provided facilities for evening courses. The total enrolment in these colleges was 19,095 (18,853 boys and 242 girls) and the number of teachers working in these colleges was 740 (733 men and 7 women). The university-wise details of evening colleges/courses are given in the 'Appendix' at the end of Statistical Tables.
