The main aim is to highlight the Inter-district variations in a State by giving educational data at district level with the help of some important indices such as enrolment ratio, percentage of trained teachers, pupil ratio etc.

In order to ascertain whether the educational imbalances are added or narrowed down with time, the data for the year 1981-82 has been compared with that for the year 1976-77.

INTRODUCTION

Regional imbalances in the field of educational development exist in different parts of our country due to social, environment and other factors. With a view to , highlight these imbalances in the educational sector, Ministry of Human Resource Development brings out the Publication "Educational Statistics : District-Wise" quinquennially separately for States and Union territories.

A volume of this nature was brought out for the last quinquennial year of 1976-77 in respect of each State/UT by this Ministry.

In order to make inter-district comparision possible, some important indices like enrolment ratios, percentage of trained teachers, area served by a primary or middle school etc, have been worked out for the years 1976-77 and 1981-82. These indices show wide range of variation among different districts which help in formulation of educational plans at district level.

II AREA AND POPULATION

4. Union territory of Mizoram came into being in 1972. Total area of the UT is 21,081 sq.Kms. as per 1981 census. Three districts form the UT, having Aizawl (12588 Sq.Kms.) as the biggest district.

5. Population of the whole UT is only 4.94 lakhs (2.57 lakh males and 2.37 lakh females) as most of its region is hilly. Aizawl district alone constitutes 69% of the whole population of the UT. The density of population of the UT worked out to 17 per Sq.Km. Appendix 1 gives district-wise area and population.

6. The population of different age groups for the Union territory as a whole and different districts for the year 1976-77 and 1981-82 estimates on the basis of census Figures for the years 1971 and 1981 respectively available from the office of the Registrar General of India. District-wise estimates of population in the age groups 6-11, 11-14 and 14-17 have been based on the following formula :-

7. By using above formula total Population and girls Population has been estimated for each district and respective figures have been worked out for boys by simple subtraction method.

8. Similar formulae are used for estimating Population of the districts for age groups 11-14 and 14-17.

9. Of the total Population of 6.69 lakhs estimated for the age group 6-11, boys and girls each formed 50% for the year 1981-82. Similarly estimated Population of 11-14 age group is 3.15 lakhs forming 1.61 lakh boys and 1.54 lakh girls. For age group 14-17 the estimates are worked out 2.92 lakhs forming 1.46 lakh each for boys and girls in 1981-82.

10. Thus of the total population of 49.37 lakhs, the school going population of 6-17 age is approximately 12.76 lakhs (6.42 lakhs boys and 6.34 lakhs girls) and forming 25.7 % of the total population. District-wise details of population in the age group 6-11, 11-14 & 14-17 are given in Appendix 2.

III - LITERACY

11. According to 1981 census the literacy rate for the Union territory as a whole was 59.9 %. For males it was reported as 64.5 % and for females

54.9 % . It is also interesting to note that literacy rate for S.C. Community was reported 84.4 % which is significantly higher than that for total population. For S.T. community it was 59.6 %. Details can be seen from Appendix.3

IV - GENERAL REVIEW

(a) INSTITUTIONS

12. Number of institutions at school level increased from 1029 in 1976-77 to 1513 in 1981-82 giving an increase of 47 % during the period. It is interesting to note that 950 of the total number of institutions are located in Aizawl alone. District-wise details are given in Appendix 4.

(b) ENROLMENT :

13. The total enrolment in all types of recognized institutions of school level increased from 123.7 thousands in 1976-77 to 128.8 thousands or 4.1 % during the period under review. The total enrolment in 1981-82 consisted of 68.9 thousands boys and 59.9 thousands girls. Among the three districts Aizawl alone accounted for 63.5 % of the total enrolment in 1981-82. Percentage of girls to total enrolment is worked out to be 46.5 % for the year 1981-82 against 47.0 % in 1976-77. District-wise particulars are given in Appendix 4.

(c) Extent of coverage of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes

14. Of the total enrolment 1,29,500 comprising 68,399 boys and 61,101 girls viz. almost all was of S.T. community . Percentage enrolment worked out to 99.1 (99.1 % for boys and 99.0 % for girls) for scheduled Tribes.District-wise details can be seen from Appendix 6.

(d) TEACHERS :

15. There were 3,958 teachers in 1976-77 in all types of schools in the Union territory of Mizoram which increased to 5533 in 1981-82 showing an average annual increase of 8.0 % . Among the three districts Aizawl has the highest share of 63.56' of total number of teachers in the state during 1981-82 . Women teachers formed 25.3 % unlike most of the States..in India, having very high percentage of trained teachers. There were only 42.9 % trained teachers in Mizoram during 1981-82 . In the major district of Aizawl 44.2 % were trained. District-wise details can be seen from Appendix 5.

V. PRE-PRIMARY EDUCATION

16. There are no recognised pre-primary schools in Mizoram. Pre-Primary schools previously existing in the Union Territory were long back upgraded into primary schools.

VI. PRIMARY EDUCATION

(a) Institutions and Teachers

17. The number of primary schools increased from 510 in 1976-77 to 745 in 1981-82 in Mizoram at an average annual growth rate of 9.2 %. Major number of 480 primary schools existed in Aizawl district only. In 1976-77 a primary school served average area of 41.3 Sq. Kms. However the position has improved considerably during the 5 years review period and for every area of 28.3 Sq. Kms. a primary school was made available in 1981-82. At the same time a primary school was serving average 663 habitants in 1981-82 whereas in 1976-77 a primary school was available for the population of 788 persons. District-wise position can be seen from Appendix 7.

18. Total number of teachers in primary schools in 1981-82 was 2551 out of which there were 37.7 % female teachers. Also of the total teachers of such schools in the Union territory 53.1 % were trained. Among men 65.7 % were trained and among women teachers only 45.6 % were trained. District-wise details are given in Appendix 9.

(b) ENROLMENT :

19. The enrolment in primary schools in Mizoram was 81708 in 1976-77 which declined to 77,476 in 1981-82. At the same time the enrolment in primary classes (A, B, I, II & III) also declined from 77,641 (40,275 boys and 37,366 girls) in 1976-77 to 77,476 (40,394 boys and 37,082 girls) in 1981-82. The percentage of girls in primary stage of education remained the same viz. 48.1 in 1976-77 and 1981-82. This decrease may be on account of decline in birth ratio, although according to the estimated figures worked out there is an increase in the population in the age group 6-11 year.

20. The percentage of enrolment in primary classes to the total population of the 6-11 age group viz. the enrolment ratio ~~is~~ the index of facilities created at the primary stage. In Mizoram this percentage was 137.7 % in 1976-77 and the same is worked out to be 115.8 % during 1981-82. The corresponding enrolment percentage for boys & girls were 120.6 % and 111.0 % respectively. District-wise details can be seen from Appendix 8.

(c) ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED TRIBES :

21. In 1976-77 in primary classes 99.3 % were scheduled tribes. S.T. boys were 99.4 % and S.T. girls 99.2 %. In 1981-82 too, of the total enrolment 77,177 belonged to S.T. Communities which formed 99.6 % (99.7 % boys and 99.5 % girls). Extent of Coverage of S.T. students at the primary stage of education in the U.T. is worked out to be 106.5 % in 1981-82. The corresponding coverage separately for boys and girls in primary classes of the U.T. are worked out as 110.9 % and 102.1 % respectively during 1981-82. District-wise position can be seen from Appendix 10.

(d) PRIMARY EDUCATION IN RURAL AREAS :

22. Out of 745 primary schools in the Union territory as many as 657 were located in rural areas. of those 351 forming 88.2 % were reported to be located in the rural areas of Lunglei district only. The enrolment of children in these schools was 65,936 (35,344 boys and 30,592 girls) which formed 86.7 % of total enrolment in this schools. Appendix 11 gives district-wise details.

(e) HABITATIONS WITH OR WITH OUT PRIMARY SCHOOLS

23. It has been observed that there were 721 habitations in the Union Territory out of which 390 were in Aizawl alone 510(72 %) of these habitations only had a primary schools and the remaining 211 habitations were covered by primary schools located in the neighbouring habitations. In the main district of Aizawl's 61 % habitations had primary schools . It may be interesting to note that as many as 211 habitations in Mizoram were without a primary schools and all these habitations did not have such schools even upto a distance of 2 Kms. from them. District -wise details can be seen from Appendix 12.

VII. MIDDLE SCHOOL EDUCATION

(a) INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS

24. Total number of middle schools in the Union territory increased from 224 in 1976-77 to 340 in 1981-82. Of these 220 existed in Aizawl district only. On an average a middle school was available for every 94.1 Sq. Kms of area in 1976-77 The situation improved during the span of 5 years and a middle school could be made available for every 62 Sq. Kms area during 1981-82.

25. In 1976-77 an average Population of 1794 persons was served by a middle school in the whole Union Territory but the facilities were improved during the period under review as a result of which for every 1452 persons, a middle school was available in the year 1981-82. Appendix 13 shows the district-wise position.

26. In 1981-82 there were 1736 teachers comprising 1463 male teachers and 273 female teachers in middle schools of the union territory. Out of these 1179 or 67.9 % were teaching in Aizawl district only. Of the total number of teachers 37.6 % were trained. Among male teachers only 36.6 % were trained whereas among women teachers 43.2 % were trained. Details can be seen from Appendix 15.

(b) ENROLMENT :

27. Total enrolment in middle stage in the union territory was 23575 (12943 boys and 10632 girls in 1976-77 which increased to 26119 (14238 boys and 11881 girls) in 1981-82. The annual growth rate is worked out at 2.1 % during the period. Of the total enrolment at the middle stage as much as 70.3 % of the enrolment was contributed by Aizawl district only.

28. The percentage of enrolment in classes VI-VIII to the population of the age group 11-14 viz. enrolment ratio is the index of facilities available at the middle stage of education. In the Union territory this percentage is worked out to be 82.9 during 1981-82. For boys the enrolment percentage was 88.4 and for girls 77.1. District-wise details can be seen from Appendix 14.

(c) ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED CASTE AND SCHEDULED TRIBE

29. Out of total enrolment of 26,119 in middle classes 25,833 viz. 98.9 % belonged to Scheduled Tribes community. Percentage enrolment for boys works out to 99% and for girls 98.8 % Extent of coverage for S.T. student works out to 105.7 % in classes VI-VIII in 1981-82. District-wise details can be seen in Appendix 16.

(d) MIDDLE EDUCATION IN RURAL AREAS

30. On comparing it has been seen that out of total number of 340 middle schools in Mizoram Union territory 274 were located in Mizoram in rural areas only. The largest number (129) of middle schools are located in Aizawl only in 1981-82. However in middle classes in rural areas the total enrolment was 20557 which comprised 11390 boys and 9267 girls. Details can be seen from Appendix 17.

(e) HABITATIONS WITH OR WITHOUT MIDDLE SCHOOLS

31. Appendix 18 depicts position of middle schools in habitations of the Union territory. Of the total number of 721 habitations in Mizoram, Only 190 or 26.3 % had middle schools with in them. In the main district of Aizawl 99 habitations out of 390 had middle schools.

ENROLMENT BY STANDARD IN CLASSES (I-VIII)

32. Appendix 19 depicts class-wise enrolment in classes I to VIII for each district separately. It has been observed that total enrolment for whole the union territory was 30,177 in class I in 1981-82 but in the same year, enrolment in class VIII was 8174 being 27.1 % of that in class I. Decreasing trend of enrolment in classes has been observed in all the higher grades with the exception of one or two in all the district. This shows the prevalence of low retention rates or high drop out rate at the elementary stage.

VIII. HIGH/HIGHER SECONDARY EDUCATION

(a) INSTITUTIONS AND TEACHERS

33. Number of high/higher secondary schools in the union territory increased from 110 in 1976-77 to 141 in 1981-82. Of 141, 101 high schools existed in Mizawl district only.

34. On an average a high school was available for every 191.7 Sq. Kms. in 1976-77. But situation improved during the 5 years period and for every 149.5 Sq. Kms a school could be made available in 1981-82.

35. The average population served by a high school was 3654 in 1976-77 whereas in 1981-82 the same was available for average population of 3501 persons during 1981-82. District-wise details can be seen in Appendix 20.

36. In 1981-82 there were 946 teachers comprising 819 male teachers and 127 female teachers, employed in high schools. District-wise details can be seen in Appendix 22.

(b) ENROLMENT

37. In 1976-77 the enrolment in high school classes was 14256 which increased to 19,162 in 1981-82 at the average annual growth of 6.9 % during the period under rev: cw. In 1981-82, the percentage of girls enrolment was 44.8 %.

38. The enrolment ratio in high school classes improved from 46.8 % in 1976-77 to 65.6 % in 1981-82. The enrolment ratios separately for boys & girls were 72.4 % and 58.8 % respectively. District-wise details are given in Appendix 21.

(c) ENROLMENT OF SCHEDULED TRIBE STUDENTS

39. In the Union territory there were 18540 Scheduled Tribe students forming 10239 boys and 8301 girls in 1981-82. These Scheduled Tribe students formed the substantial part of the total enrolment in the union territory viz. 96.8 %. The separate percentages for scheduled Tribe boys and girls being 96.8 % and 96.7 % respectively. In 1976-77 the percentage for scheduled Tribe students to total enrolment was 99.3% and the same percentage was for boys and girls also. In 1981-82 the percentage of scheduled Tribe population to total population was 93.5 %. Thus the extent of coverage in 1981-82 is worked out to be 103.4 %. District-wise details are given in Appendix 23.

(d) HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION IN RURAL AREAS

40. In 1981-82, 115 of the total number of 141 High schools were located in rural areas. Of these 84 existed in Mizawl district alone. The total enrolment in these schools was 17,743 forming 92.6 %. The enrolment in High school classes in rural areas constituted 70 % boys and 30 % girls.

IX. PROFESSIONAL, VOCATIONAL, SPECIAL AND OTHER EDUCATION

41. A wide spread development in the field of professional, Vocational, Special and other education has been observed as the number of such institutions increased from 185 in 1976-77 to 287 in 1981-82. In Chhingtui ^{/ pui} the institutions increased from 10 to 107 and in Lunglei from 5 to 31 during the period.
42. Enrolment in these institutions increased from 4319 to 7952 during the period. The increase in enrolment works out to at the average annual ratio of 17 %. It is also interesting to note that of the total enrolment in professional, vocational and special education girls formed 52.4 % in 1981-82.
43. There were 300 teachers forming 262 men and 38 women teaching in these institutions of professional, vocational special and other education during 1981-82. The number of teachers employed in such institutions were 262 in 1976-77.
44. It has also been observed that all the students enrolled in these institutions were of scheduled Tribe Community in both the years under review. District-wise position of institutions, enrolment, Scheduled Tribe enrolment and teachers can be seen in Appendix 25.
