I hope these statistics will be found very useful by research workers and those who are interested in educational policies and programmes.

I take this opportunity to thank all the State Governments and Union Administrations for their help and co-operation in supplying the material for this publication.

#### **EXPLANATIONS**

- 1. Academic Year—For the sake of uniformity, the academic year in these tables is taken to coincide with the financial year, i.e., to extend from 1st April, 1962 to 31st March, 1963.
- 2. The Statistics relate to only Recognised Institutions, i.e., those in which the course of study followed is either prescribed or recognised by the Government or by a University or a Board of Secondary and Intermediate Education constituted by law and which satisfy one or more of these authorities as the case may be, that, they attain a reasonable standard of efficiency. They are open to inspection and their pupils are ordinarily eligible for admission to public examinations and tests held by the Government or the University or the Board.
- 3. Research Institutions—Only those research institutions have been taken which provide facilities for teaching.
- 4. Enrolment—For definiteness, the enrolment in the institutions on 31st March, 1963 is taken.
- 5. Expenditure—In calculating the expenditure from Government, District or Municipal Board funds, all payments or contributions from fees and other sources, which are credited to such funds are deducted.
- 6. Local Boards include District, Municipal and Cantonment Boards and Town Area Committees.
  - 7. Examination Results include those of private candidates also.
- 8. Indirect Expenditure represents the amount incurred on direction, inspection, buildings, furniture, scholarships and other miscellaneous items. Its nature is such that it cannot be apportioned to each type of institution.
- 9. The figures are provisional at places due to non-availability of corrected figures from some States.

#### **INDIA**

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the States/Union Territories increased by 41.028 to 7,26,630. Of these, 13.6 per cent were managed by the Government, 36.1 per cent by local bodies and 50.3 per cent by private bodies (48.6 per cent aided and 1.7 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 5.42.81.442 to 5.79.77.474 (3.96.75,480 boys and 1.83.01.994 girls). They were 5.79,77,474 distributed as: pre-primary stage 0.3 per cent, primary stage 54.0 per cent, middle stage 23.0 per cent, high higher secondary stage 16.1 per cent, university stage (general education) 1.5 per cent, while the remaining 5.1 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 72.5 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 70.1, 28.7 and 13.5 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was in force in 1,164 towns and 90,762 villages. The number of pupils under compulsion on rolls was 1,37,13,494 (85,13,924 boys and 51,99,570 girls).

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 43.1 crores to Rs. 439.44 crores. The Government met 68.4 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the local boards, fees, endowments and other sources was 6.7, 16.8, 2.3 and 5.8 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 327.6 in an arts and science college, Rs. 98.1 in a high higher secondary school, Rs. 41.6 in a middle school and Rs. 29.7 in a primary school. The average annual cost *per capita* (of population) was Rs. 9.0.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 15,12,286 to 16.28,078 (12,87,972 men and 3,40,106 women). The trained teachers formed 65.3 per cent in high higher secondary schools. 70.8 per cent in middle schools and 65.1 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:38 in the primary, 1:32 in the middle and 1:25 in high higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in Arts & Science (Pass & Hons.) was 1.06,350 as against 99,279 in the previous year. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations decreased from 7.49,014 to 7.46,138. As many as 10,10,682 adults were made literate.

### ANDHRA PRADESH

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the State increased by 1,074 to 42,847. Of these, 6.9 per cent were managed by the Government, 86.4 per cent by local bodies and 6.7 per cent by private bodies (6.5 per cent aided and 0.2 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 42,34,893 to 44,34,388 (28,22,222 boys and 16,12,166 girls). They were distributed as: preprimary stage 0.2 per cent, primary stage 79.4 per cent, middle stage 11.5 per cent, high higher secondary stage 5.5 per cent, university stage (general education) 1.0 per cent, while the remaining 2.4 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 74.0 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 73.3, 21.4 and 11.0 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was in force in 301 towns and 24,918 villages. The number of pupils under compulsion on rolls was 34,610 (32,389 boys and 2,221 girls).

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 2.84 crores to Rs. 30.11 crores. The Government met 66.8 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the local boards, fees, endowments and other sources was 13.1, 13.5, 3.3 and 3.3 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 395.8 in an arts and science college, Rs. 93.2 in a high/higher secondary school, Rs. 49.3 in a middle school and Rs. 27.4 in a primary school. The average annual cost per capita (of population) was Rs. 8.0.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 1.19.502 to 1.26.155 (1.01.968 men and 24.187 women). The trained teachers formed 80.7 per cent in high/higher secondary schools. 77.6 per cent in middle schools and 87.0 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:40 in the primary, 1:27 in the middle and 1:23 in high higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in Arts & Science (Pass & Hons.) was 4705. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations was 39,221. As many as 34.610 adults were made literate.

They were distributed as: preprimary stage 0.2 per cent, primary stage 72.4 per cent, middle stage 14.5 per cent, high/higher secondary stage 9.1 per cent, university stage (general education) 1.6 per cent, while the remaining 2.2 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 88.8 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11. 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 73.5, 33.6 and 24.0 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was in force in 17 towns and 4,395 villages. The number of pupils under compulsion on rolls was 4,07,238 (2,44.687 boys and 1,62.551 girls).

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 1.28 crores to Rs. 11.68 crores. The Government met 77.2 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the local boards, fees, endowments and other sources was 0.8, 16.9, 4.4 and 0.7 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 214.0 in an arts and science college, Rs. 91.9 in a high/higher secondary school, Rs. 58.5 in a middle school and Rs. 25.8 in a primary school. The average annual cost *per capita* (of population) was Rs. 9.4

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 47.821 to 51.708 (44.550 men and 7.158 women). The trained teachers formed 15.6 per cent in high/higher secondary schools. 25.0 per cent in middle schools and 42.1 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:41 in the primary. 1:22 in the middle and 1:24 in high/higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in Arts & Science (Pass & Hons.) was 2,975 as against 1,941 in the previous year. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations increased from 10,961 to 18,632. As many as 15,206 adults were made literate.



#### **BIHAR**

During the year under the review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the State increased by 881 to 55.641. Of these, 1.8 per cent were managed by the Government, 22.4 per cent by local bodies and 75.8 per cent by private bodies (71.8 per cent aided and 4.0 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 47.89,150 to 49,10,253 (39,44,022 boys and 9,66,231 girls). They were distributed as: pre-primary stage 0.0 per cent, primary stage 71.8 per cent, middle stage 12.1 per cent, high higher secondary stage 8.0 per cent, university stage (general education) 1.8 per cent, while the remaining 6.3 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 87.0 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 57.6, 20.0 and 14.8 per cent respectively. Compulsory Education was in force in 16 towns and 8.294 villages. The number of pupils under compulsion on rolls was 4.96.109 (4.07.829 boys and 88.280 girls).

The total expenditure on recognised institutions decreased by Rs. 0.05 crores to Rs. 24.90 crores. The Government met 66.8 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the local boards, fees, endowments and other sources was 2.2, 20.0, 1.8 and 9.2 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 235.1 in an arts and science college, Rs. 64.5 in a high higher secondary school, Rs. 31.2 in a middle school and Rs. 18.8 in a primary school. The average annual cost *per capita* (of population) was Rs. 5.5.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 1.09,886 to 1.18,104 (1.07,974 men and 10.130 women). The trained teachers formed 38.6 per cent in high/higher secondary schools, 70.0 per cent in middle schools and 73.4 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:43 in the primary, 1:34 in the middle and 1:30 in high/higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in Arts & Science (Pass & Hons.) was 8.674 as against 8.202 in the previous year. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations increased from 52.743 to 52.961. As many as 1.56.452 adults were made literate.

#### **GUJARAT**

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the State decreased by 4.218 to 24.216. Of these, 3.8 per cent were managed by the Government, 71.7 per cent by local bodies and 24.5 per cent by private bodies (22.1 per cent aided and 2.4 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions rose from 32,38,810 to 32,83,116 (21,62,009 boys and 11.21,107 girls). They were distributed as: pre-primary stage 1.0 per cent, primary stage 65.7 per cent, middle stage 18.4 per cent, high higher secondary stage 10.4 per cent, university stage (general education) 1.2 per cent, while the remaining 3.3 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 65.1 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 84.8, 43.2 and 17.1 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was in force in 104 towns and 13,740 villages. The number of pupils under compulsion on rolls was 12,76,651 (7,70,646 boys and 5,06,005 girls).

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 4.9 crores to Rs. 26.3 crores. The Government met 65.0 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the local boards, fees, endowments and other sources was 7.0, 20.6, 0.6 and 6.8 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 327.4 in an arts and science college, Rs. 123.2 in a high/higher secondary school. Rs. 29.7 in a middle school and Rs. 41.4 in a primary school. The average annual cost *per capita* (of population) was Rs. 12.2.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 78,977 to 86,045 (63,324 men and 22,721 women). The trained teachers formed 62.0 per cent in high/higher secondary schools, 59.7 per cent in middle schools and 39.7 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:39 in the primary, 1:39 in the middle and 1:27 in high/higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in Arts & Science (Pass & Hons.) was 5,360 as against 5,061 in the previous year. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations increased from 40,071 to 42,656. As many as 19,596 adults were made literate.

#### JAMMU & KASHMIR

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the State increased by 321 to 4,879. Of these, 98.2 per cent were managed by the Government and 1.8 per cent by private bodies (1.7 per cent aided and 0.1 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 3,64,177 to 3,89,035 (2,93,568 boys and 95,467 girls). They were distributed as: pre-primary stage 6.3 per cent, primary stage 64.3 per cent, middle stage 18.9 per cent, high higher secondary stage 7.4 per cent, university stage (general education) 2.1 per cent, while the remaining 1.0 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 68.4 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 48.8, 28.8 and 12.7 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was not in force during the year.

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 0.48 crores to Rs. 3.49 crores. The Government met 90.5 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the fees, endowments and other sources was 5.3, 0.1 and 4.1 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 370.9 in an arts and science college, Rs. 83.4 in a high higher secondary school. Rs. 42.0 in a middle school and Rs. 27.6 in a primary school. The average annual cost per capita (of population) was Rs. 9.3.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 12.090 to 12.954 (10.431 men and 2.523 women). The trained teachers formed 68.2 per cent in high/higher secondary schools. 53.5 per cent in middle schools and 54.0 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:34 in the primary. 1:29 in the middle and 1:25 in high/higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in Arts & Science (Pass & Hons.) was 737 as against 638 in the previous year. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations decreased from 5,288 to 5,196.



#### **KERALA**

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the State increased by 212 to 10,609. Of these, 39.2 per cent were managed by the Government and 60.8 per cent by private bodies (60.3 per cent aided and 0.5 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 35,33,674 to 37,10,591 (20.26,874 boys and 16,83,717 girls). They were distributed as: preprimary stage 0.3 per cent, primary stage 58.9 per cent, middle stage 25.5 per cent high/higher secondary stage 13.2 per cent, university stage (general education) 1.2 per cent, while the remaining 0.9 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 86.3 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of almost cent per cent, 71.4 and 23.2 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was in force in 14 towns and 149 villages. The number of pupils under compulsion on rolls was 2,78,769.

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 0.62 crores to Rs. 22.65 crores. The Government met 85.1 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the local boards, fees endowments and other sources was 0.0, 10.9, 0.1 and 3.9 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 293.2 in an arts and science college, Rs. 62.5 in a high/higher secondary school, Rs. 42.0 in a middle school and Rs. 33.1 in a primary school. The average annual cost *per capita* (of population) was Rs. 12.8.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 1.11,157 to 1.15.805 (67.110 men and 48.695 women). The trained teachers formed 78.7 per cent in high/higher secondary schools, 83.4 per cent in middle schools and 90.1 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:39 in the primary, 1:27 in the middle and 1:25 in high/higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in Arts & Science (Pass & Hons.) was 3,619 as against 4,402 in the previous year. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations increased from 57,850 to 67,809.

#### MADHYA PRADESH

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the State increased by 1,399 to 37.214. Of these, 64.2 per cent were managed by the Government, 31.3 per cent by local bodies and 4.5 per cent by private bodies (3.9 per cent aided and 0.6 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 28,53,692 to 30,76,052 (23,81,278 boys and 6,94,774 girls). They were distributed as: preprimary stage 0.5 per cent, primary stage 77.1 per cent, middle stage 13.1 per cent, high/higher secondary stage 5.6 per cent, university stage (general education) 1.2 per cent, while the remaining 2.5 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 71.7 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 54.3, 19.3 and 9.0 per cent respectively. Compulsory Education was in force in 139 towns and 6,445 villages. The number of pupils under compulsion on rolls was 4,23,356 (3,78,329 boys and 45,027 girls).

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 2.92 crores to Rs. 27.82 crores. The Government met 83.6 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the local boards, fees, endowments and other sources was 3.7, 8.2, 0.9 and 3.6 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 407.8 in an arts and science college, Rs. 132.5 in a high/higher secondary school, Rs. 61.7 in a middle school and Rs. 43.0 in a primary school. The average annual cost per capita (of population) was Rs. 8.2.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 1.02.012 to 1.09.406 (94.118 men and 15.288 women). The trained teachers formed 51.7 per cent in high/higher secondary schools. 62.1 per cent in middle schools and 65.8 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:31 in the primary, 1:22 in the middle and 1:20 in high/higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in Arts & Science (Pass & Hons.) was 6.649 as against 5.551 in the previous year. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations increased from 35,197 to 45.588. As many as 18,680 adults were made literate.

#### **MADRAS**

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the State increased by 1,183 to 32,716. Of these, 5.6 per cent were managed by the Government, 65.2 per cent by local bodies and 29.2 per cent by private bodies (27.6 per cent aided and 1.6 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 49,33,068 to 53,43,870 (33,43,621 boys and 20,00,249 girls). They were distributed as: pre-primary stage 0.1 per cent primary stage 74.9 per cent, middle stage 15.7 per cent, high/higher secondary stage 6.4 per cent, university stage (general education) 0.8 per cent, while the remaining 2.1 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 61.7 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 91.8, 37.9 and 16.4 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was in force through out the State. The number of pupils under compulsion on rolls was 39,99,734 (23,91,177 boys and 16,08,557 girls).

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 5.3 crores to Rs. 43.97 crores. The Government met 64.1 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the local boards, fees, endowments and other sources was 15.7, 11.1, 8.0 and 1.1 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 368.4 in an arts and science college, Rs. 94.5 in a high/higher secondary school, Rs. 38.6 in a middle school and Rs. 33.8 in a primary school. The average annual cost per capita (of population) was Rs. 12.4.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 1,54,111 to 1,64,180 (1,08,963 men and 55,217 women). The trained teachers formed 91.2 per cent in high/higher secondary schools, 95.7 per cent in middle schools and 95.1 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:36 in the primary, 1:32 in the middle and 1:23 in high/higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in Arts & Science (Pass & Hons.) was 5,758 as against 5,355 in the previous year. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations increased from 39,157 to 51,380. As many as 1,603 adults were made literate

#### **MAHARASHTRA**

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the State increased by 29,856 to 2,69,720. Of these, 0.1 per cent were managed by the Government, 12.6 per cent by local bodies and 87.3 per cent by private bodies (87.0 per cent aided and 0.3 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 69,52,861 to 71,90,561 (45,56,682 boys and 26,33,879 girls). They were distributed as: pre-primary stage 0.5 per cent, primary stage 53.8 per cent, middle stage 16.4 per cent, high/higher secondary stage 9.5 per cent, university stage (general education) 1.2 per cent, while the remaining 18.6 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 63.0 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 79.9, 34.8 and 18.2 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was in force in 274 towns and 15,558 villages. The number of pupils under compulsion on rolls was 22,46,581 (13,27,854 boys and 9,18,717 girls).

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 0.7 crores to Rs. 56.8 crores. The Government met 59.8 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the local boards, fees, endowments and other sources was 8.9, 24.7, 1.0 and 5.6 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 358.7 in an arts and science college, Rs. 118.7 in a high/higher secondary school, Rs. 38.7 in a middle school and Rs. 39.6 in a primary school. The average annual cost *per capita* (of population) was Rs. 13.7.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 1,59,112 to 1,68.669 (1,27.345 men and 41.324 women). The trained teachers formed 66.2 per cent in high/higher secondary schools. 77.5 per cent in middle schools and 58.7 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:36 in the primary, 1:38 in the middle and 1:25 in high/higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in Arts & Science (Pass & Hons.) was 11.805 as against 12.314 in the previous year. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations increased from 85,770 to 94,237. As many as 5,24,149 adults were made literate.

#### **MYSORE**

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the State increased by 200 to 36,263. Of these 56.2 per cent were managed by the Government, 16.9 per cent by local bodies and 26.9 per cent by private bodies (26.3 per cent aided and 0.6 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 33,08,278 to 36,62,342 (23,11,738 boys and 13,50,604 girls). They were distributed as: preprimary stage 0.6 per cent, primary stage 68.9 per cent, middle stage 16.1 per cent, high higher secondary stage 9.0 per cent, university stage (general education) 1.0 per cent, while the remaining 4.4 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 60.5 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 85.2, 28.2 and 14.7 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was not in force during the year.

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 2.2 crores to Rs. 24.0 crores. The Government met 72.9 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the local boards, fees endowments and other sources was 3.5, 10.2, 0.3 and 13.1 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 285.0 in an arts and science college, Rs. 105.1 in a high/higher secondary school, Rs. 32.9 in a middle school and Rs. 28.2 in a primary school. The average annual cost per capita (of population) was Rs. 9.7.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 90,408 to 93,784 (75,637 men and 18,147 women). The trained teachers formed 60.4 per cent in high/higher secondary schools, 66.3 per cent in middle schools and 48.3 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:40 in the primary, 1:38 in the middle and 1:25 in high/higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in Arts & Science (Pass & Hons.) was 3.080 as against 2.270 in the previous year. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations decreased from 40,246 to 38,653. As many as 21,891 adults were made literate.



### **ORISSA**

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the State increased by 2,438 to 31,881. Of these, 33.1 per cent were managed by the Government, 0.5 per cent by local bodies and 66.4 per cent by private bodies (63.7 per cent aided and 2.7 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 17,75,262 to 19,43,862 (13,72,661 boys and 5,71,201 girls). They were distributed as: pre-primary stage 0.0 per cent, primary stage 82.6 per cent, middle stage 6.5 per cent, high higher secondary stage 4.9 per cent, university stage (general education) 0.8 per cent, while the remaining 5.2 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 93.4 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-group 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 68.9, 14.2 and 6.2 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was in force in 1 town and 8 villages. The number of pupils under compulsion on roll was 4,807 (3,493 boys and 1,314 girls).

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 2.55 crores to Rs. 10.61 crores. The Government met 80.0 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the local boards fees, endowments and other sources was 1.0, 8.8, 3.8 and 6.4 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 367.8 in an arts and science college, Rs. 117.0 in a high/higher secondary school, Rs. 78.1 in a middle school and Rs. 24.9 in a primary school. The average annual cost *per capita* (of population) was Rs. 5.8.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 51,935 to 58,859 (56,502 men and 2,357 women). The trained teachers formed 42.8 per cent in high/higher secondary schools. 32.0 per cent in middle schools and 47.9 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:34 in the primary, 1:20 in the middle and 1:21 in high/higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in Arts & Science (Pass & Hons.) was 889 as against 1,559 in the previous year. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations increased from 10,584 to 10,559. As many as 46,369 adults were made literate.

#### **PUNJAB**

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the State increased by 1 to 17,793. Of these, 88.9 per cent were managed by the government, 4.0 per cent by local bodies and 7.1 per cent by private bodies (4.4 per cent aided and 2.7 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 27.31,882 to 29.12,443 (19,74,778 boys and 9,37,665 girls). They were distributed as: preprimary stage 0.0 per cent, primary stage 71.2 per cent, middle stage 18.0 per cent, high higher secondary stage 6.9 per cent, university stage (general education) 1.8 per cent, while the remaining 2.1 per cent, received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 71.4 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 74.1, 38.0 and 15.9 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was in force in all towns and villages except Lahaul and Spite districts. The number of pupils under compulsion on rolls was 7,23,733 (4.59,627 boys and 2,64.106 girls).

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 4.49 crores to Rs. 26.02 crores. The government met 76.0 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the local boards, fees, endowments and other sources was 0.2, 16.6, 3.8 and 3.4 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 336.4 in an arts and science college, Rs. 63.8 in a high/higher secondary school. Rs. 47.3 in a middle school and Rs. 30.2 in a primary school. The average annual cost per capita (of population) was Rs. 12.2.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 65,915 to 73,870 (53,184 men and 20,686 women). The trained teachers formed 82.6 per cent in high/higher secondary schools, 83.8 per cent in middle schools and 82.4 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:45 in the primary, 1:32 in the middle and 1:33 in high/higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in Arts & Science (Pass & Hons.) was 12.176 as against 9.378 in the previous year. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations decreased from 72.416 to 60.567. As many as 12.051 adults were made literate.

#### **RAJASTHAN**

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the State decreased by 759 to 27,560. Of these, 12.3 per cent were managed by the government, 84.8 per cent by local boards and 2.9 per cent by private bodies (2.1 per cent aided and 0.8 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions rose from 17,81,110 to 18,97.123 (15,61,070 boys and 3,36,053 girls.) They were distributed as: preprimary stage 0.2 per cent, primary stage 73.8 per cent, middle stage 13.9 per cent, high/higher secondary stage 5.6 per cent, university stage (general education) 1.1 per cent, while the remaining 5.4 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 70 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 49.9, 19.3 and 8.7 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was in force in 6 towns and 706 villages. The number of pupils under compulsion on rolls was 75,565 (55,378 boys and 20,187 girls).

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 1.27 crores to Rs. 16.03 crores. The government met 84.8 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the local boards, feet endowments and other sources was 0.1. 9.2, 4.3 and 1.6 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 502.3 in an arts and science college, Rs. 132.2 in a high/higher secondary school, Rs. 63.3 in a middle school and Rs. 37.8 in a primary school. The average annual cost per capita (of population was Rs. 7.6

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 57.311 to 62.095 (54,329 men and 7,766 women). The trained teachers formed 50.4 per cent in high/higher secondary schools, 60.0 per cent in middle schools and 59.2 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:33 in the primary, 1:25 in the middle and 1:22 in high/highe secondary schools.

The output of graduates in Arts & Science (Pass & Hons.) wa 4,144 as against 2,980 in the previous year. The number of student declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examination decreased from 28,940 to 22,861. As many as 64,920 adults were madiliterate.

#### UTTAR PRADESH

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the State increased by 3,347 to 58,467. Of these, 4 per cent were managed by the government, 84 per cent by local bodies and 12 per cent by private bodies (8.5 per cent aided and 3.5 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 65,80,292 to 72,98,899 (56,79,468 boys and 16,19,431 girls). They were distributed as: pre-primary stage 0.2 per cent, primary stage 74.4 per cent, middle stage 14.4 per cent, high/higher secondary stage 8.0 per cent, university stage (general education) 1.1 per cent, while the remaining 1.9 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 76.9 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the agegroups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 54.7, 21.7 and 13.3 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was in force in 95 towns and 1.687 villages. The number of pupils under compulsion on rolls was 6,70,543 (5,52,827 boys and 1,17,716 girls).

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 5.37 crores to Rs. 50.31 crores. The government met 58.6 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the local boards fees, endowments and other sources was 6.1, 20.9, 1.1 and 13.3 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 316.5 in an Arts and Science College, Rs. 103.8 in a high higher secondary school, Rs. 50.5 in a middle school and Rs. 19.8 in a primary school. The average annual cost per capita (of population) was Rs. 6.5.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 1,77.150 to 1.92.804 (1.63.276 men and 29.528 women). The trained teachers formed 70.9 per cent in high/higher secondary schools, 75.5 per cent in middle schools and 65.5 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:43 in the primary, 1:25 in the middle and 1:27 in high higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in Arts & Science (Pass & Hons.) was 14,869 as against 16,196 in the previous year. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations increased from 1.08,226 to 1.15,258. As many as 10,231 adults were made literate.

#### WEST BENGAL

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the State increased by 1,904 to 43,273. Of these, 2.2 per cent were managed by the government, 62.6 per cent by local boards and 35.2 per cent by private bodies (31.2 per cent aided and 4.0 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 43.83.296 to 47.54,600 (31,99.651 boys and 15.54,949 girls). They were distributed as: pre-primary stage 0.3 per cent, primary stage 71.7 per cent, middle stage 13.3 per cent, high higher secondary stage 5.5 per cent, university stage (general education) 2.4 per cent, while the remaining 6.8 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 72.8 per cent of pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 76.6, 26.9 and 11.7 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was in force in 37 towns and 15.011 villages. The number of pupils under compulsion on rolls was 12.09.752 (7,53.776 boys and 4,55.976 girls).

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 4.78 crores to Rs. 42.91 crores. The government met 64.8 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the local boards fees, endowments and other sources was 2.5, 26.2, 1.8 and 4.7 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 269.3 in an arts and science college. Rs. 102.0 in a high/higher secondary school. Rs. 70.8 in a middle school and Rs. 30.9 in a primary school. The average annual cost per capita (of population) was Rs. 11.7.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 1.33.536 to 1.42.682 (1.22.838 men and 19.844 women). The trained teachers formed 35.7 per cent in high/higher secondary schools, 17.4 per cent in middle schools and 37.5 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:33 in the primary, 1:22 in the middle and 1:27 in high higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in Arts and Science (Pass & Hons.) was 17,623 as against 14,528 in the previous year. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations increased from 53,838 to 60,774. As many as 66,648 adults were made literate.

#### A. & N. ISLANDS

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the Union Territory increased by 9 to 139. Of these, 99.3 per cent were managed by the Government and 0.7 per cent by aided private bodies. The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 7,667 to 8.559 (5.426 boys and 3.133 girls). They were distributed as: pre-primary stage 0.5 per cent, primary stage 79.2 per cent, middle stage 11.6 per cent, high higher secondary stage 3.8 per cent, while the remaining 4.9 per cent received professional and special education of school standard. Nearly 64.4 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 84.7, 24.9 and 10.7 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was not in force.

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 1.80 lakhs to Rs. 17.86 lakhs. The Government met 99.5 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from fees was only 0.5 per cent and that from endowments and other sources was almost nil. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 289.8 in a high higher secondary school, Rs. 96.1 in a middle school and Rs. 88.0 in a primary school. The average annual cost per capita (of population) was Rs. 26.7.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 279 to 327 (244 men and 83 women). The trained teachers formed 93.4 per cent in high higher secondary schools, 76.6 per cent in middle schools and 63.0 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:27 in the primary, 1:23 in the middle and 1:17 in high higher secondary schools.

The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations decreased from 15 to 12. As many as 296 adults were made literate.

#### DADRA AND NAGAR HAVELI

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the Union Territory increased by 19 to 74. Of these, 86.0 per cent were managed by the Government, and 14.0 per cent by aided private bodies. The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 4,096 to 5,401 (4,122 boys and 1,279 girls). They were distributed as pre-primary stage 1.5 per cent, primary stage 79.2 per cent, middle stage 11.7 per cent, high/higher secondary stage 4.3 per cent, while the remaining 3.3 per cent received professional and special education of school standard. All the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 50.3, 11.5 and 3.9 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was not in force.

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 1.81 lakhs to Rs. 3.87 lakhs. The Government met cent per cent of this expenditure. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 151.1 in a high higher secondary school, Rs. 35.3 in the middle and primary schools. The average annual cost per capita (of population) was Rs. 5.4.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 123 to 149 (116 men and 33 women). The trained teachers formed 50 per cent in high higher secondary schools and 27.0 per cent in middle schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:44 in the primary, 1:35 in the middle and 1:15 in high higher secondary schools.

The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations increased from 5 to 16.

#### **DELHI**

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the Union Territory increased by 207 to 1.841. Of these, 20.4 per cent were managed by the Government, 64.7 per cent by local bodies and 14.9 per cent by private bodies (13.5 per cent aided and 1.4 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 5.53,703 to 6.19,258 (3.65,412 boys and 2.53,846 girls). They were distributed as: pre-primary stage 0.9 per cent, primary stage 56.0 per cent, middle stage 23.0 per cent, high higher secondary stage 12.5 per cent, university stage (general education) 3.0 per cent, while the remaining 4.6 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 15.9 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 100.0, 81.1 and 46.1 per cent respectively.\* Compulsory education was in force in 1 town and 349 villages. The number of pupils under compulsion on rolls was 78.404 (43.950 boys and 34.454 girls).

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 1.83 crores to Rs. 13.74 crores. The Government met 57.4 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the local boards, fees, endowments and other sources was 20.3, 15.5, 0.7 and 6.1 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 549.2 in an arts and science college, Rs. 186.9 in a high/higher secondary school. Rs. 94.8 in a middle school and Rs. 74.6 in a primary school. The average annual cost per capita (of population) was Rs. 49.3.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 18,333 to 22,631 (12,735 men and 9,896 women). The trained teachers formed 92.9 per cent in high higher secondary schools, 99.2 per cent in middle schools and 99.7 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:34 in the primary, 1:28 in the middle and 1:24 in high/higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in Arts & Science (Pass & Hons.) was 2,642 as against 2,805 in the previous year. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations increased from 9.031 to 12.017. As many as 7,205 adults were made literate.

#### GOA, DAMAN AND DIU

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the Union Territory increased by 46 to 707. Of these, 64.6 per cent were managed by the Government and 35.4 per cent by private bodies (6.9 per cent aided and 28.5 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 66.923 to 85,200 (52,878 boys and 32,322 girls). They were distributed as: pre-primary stage 1.4 per cent, primary stage 77.6 per cent, middle stage 11.7 per cent, high/higher secondary stage 5.9 per cent, university stage (general education) 1.0 per cent, while the remaining 2.4 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 74.7 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 80.5, 25.6 and 14.3 per cent respectively.

The total expenditure on recognised institutions was Rs. 0.67 crores. The Government met 54.0 per cent of this expenditure while the contribution from the local boards, fees, endowments and other sources 0.0, 27.1, 4.2 and 14.7 per cent respectively. On an average the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 285.8 in an arts and science college, Rs. 81.9 in a high higher secondary school, Rs. 39.7 in a middle school and Rs. 41.4 in a primary school. The average annual cost per capita (of population) was Rs. 10.5

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 1,161 to 2,736 (1,584 men and 1,152 women). The trained teachers formed 32.3 per cent in high/higher secondary schools, 14.2 per cent in middle schools and 19.0 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:36 in the primary, 1:26 in the middle and 1:28 in high/higher secondary schools.

The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations was 959.

#### HIMACHAL PRADESH

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the Union Territory increased by 396 to 2.241. Of these, 14.8 per cent were managed by the Government, 80.4 per cent by local bodies and 4.8 per cent by private bodies (4.8 per cent aided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 1,27,092 to 1,52,628 (1,16,570 boys and 36,058 girls). They were distributed as: pre-primary stage 0.2 per cent, primary stage 72.3 per cent, middle stage 16.4 per cent, high higher secondary stage 5.3 per cent, university stage (general education) 0.6 per cent, while the remaining 5.2 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 90.9 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 69.0, 31.8 and 11.0 per cent respectively. Compulsory Education was not in force.

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 0.21 crores to Rs. 1.60 crores. The Government met 14.2 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the local boards, fees, endowments and other sources was 82.3, 2.3, 0.2 and 1.0 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 759.6 in an arts and science college, Rs. 99.6 in a high higher secondary school. Rs. 84.3 in a middle school and Rs. 65.6 in a primary school. The average annual cost per capita (of population was Rs. 11.3.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 6.513 to 7.207 (6.130 men and 1.077 women. The trained teachers formed 82.9 per cent in high/higher secondary schools, 71.2 per cent in middle schools and 59.9 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:22 in the primary, 1:16 in the middle and 1:22 in high/higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in arts and science (Pass & Hons) was 57 as against 43 in the previous year. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations increased from 1.425 to 2.442. As many as 3.047 adults were made literate.

#### L. M. AND A. ISLANDS

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the Union Territory remained the same. All the institutions were managed by the Government. The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 4,695 to 5,325 (3,658 boys and 1,667 girls). They were distributed as: primary stage 67.2 per cent, middle stage 13.9 per cent, high/higher secondary stage 4.0 per cent, while the remaining 14.9 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly cent per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 97.7, 25.8 and 5.5 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was not in force during the period under report.

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 1.84 lakhs to Rs. 8.87 lakhs. The Government met cent per cent of this expenditure. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 132.8 in a high/higher secondary school, Rs. 117.3 in a middle school and Rs. 85.9 in a primary school. The average annual cost per capita (of population) was Rs. 35.5.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 116 to 191 (145 men and 46 women). The trained teachers formed 88.2 per cent in high/higher secondary schools 92.9 per cent in middle schools and 91.1 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:29 in the primary, 1:23 in the middle and 1:19 in high/higher secondary schools.

The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations was 13. As many as 239 adults were made literate.

#### **MANIPUR**

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the Union Territory increased by 369 to 3,033. Of these, 9.2 per cent were managed by the Government, 56.8 per cent by local bodies and 34.0 per cent by private bodies (16.9 per cent aided and 17.1 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 1,79,958 to 1,96,481 (1,26,663 boys and 69,818 girls). They were distributed as primary stage 63.7 per cent, middle stage 20.9 per cent, high higher secondary stage 10.8 per cent, university stage (general education) 1.3 per cent, while the remaining 3.3 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 88.7 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 100.0, 55.0 and 47.2 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was not in force during the year.

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 19.32 lakhs to Rs. 146.58 lakhs. The Government met 25.0 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the local boards, fees, endowments and other sources was 62.4. 7.2, 5.0 and 0.4 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 230.8 in an arts and science college, Rs. 70.8 in a high higher secondary school, Rs. 63.1 in a middle school and Rs. 40.4 in a primary school. The average annual cost *per capita* (of population) was Rs. 17.9.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 7.679 to 8,553 (8.050 men and 503 women). The trained teachers formed 16.0 per cent in high higher secondary schools, 10.2 per cent in middle schools and 15.3 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:22 in the primary, 1:18 in the middle and 1:27 in high/higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in arts & science (Pass & Hons.) was 248 as against 97 in the previous year. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations increased from 885 to 1,903. As many as 3,900 adults were made literate.

#### **NAGALAND**

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the Union territory increased by 95 to 651. Of these, 96.2 per cent were managed by the government and 3.8 per cent by private bodies (2.9 per cent aided and 0.9 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 52,655 to 58,666 (37,724 boys and 20,942 girls). They were distributed as: primary stage 72.5 per cent, middle stage 22.3 per cent, high higher secondary stage 4.6 per cent, university stage (general educational) 0.2 per cent, while the remaining 0.4 per cent received professional special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 95.5 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 97.7, 37.7 and 12.8 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was not in force during the year under report.

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 0.14 crores to Rs. 065 crores. The government met 89.4 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the fees, endowments and other sources was 1.9, 3.5 and 5.2 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 505.5 in an arts and science college, Rs. 162.2 in a high higher secondary school, Rs. 103.1 in a middle school and Rs. 59.3 in a primary school. The average annual cost *per capita* (of population) was Rs. 17.5.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 1.751 to 2.189 (2.026 men and 163 women). The trained teachers formed 10.1 per cent in high/higher secondary schools, 6.1 per cent in middle schools and 16.8 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:26 in the primary, 1:29 in the middle and 1:26 in high/higher secondary schools.

The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations was 157 and this figure was the same as in the previous year. 16 adults were made literate.

### N.E.F.A.

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the Union Territory increased by 25 to 190. All the Institutions were managed by the Government. The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 7,895 to 9,182 (8,004 boys and 1,178 girls). They were distributed as: preprimary stage 1.1 per cent, primary stage 86.3 per cent, middle stage 9.2 per cent, high higher secondary stage 2.9 per cent, while the remaining 0.5 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. All the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 11.3, 7.1 and 5.0 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was not in force during the year under report.

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 1.90 lakhs to Rs. 29.60 lakhs. The entire expenditure was borne by the Government. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 240.2 in a high higher secondary school, Rs. 162.3 in a middle school and Rs. 106.4 in a primary school. The average annual cost *per capita* (of population) was Rs. 7.6

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 456 to 509 (461 men and 48 women). The trained teachers formed 62.2 per cent in high/higher secondary schools, 79.8 per cent in middle schools and 71.1 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:21 in the primary, 1:16 in the middle and 1:12 in high/higher secondary schools.

The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations was 22 and this figure was the same as in the previous year.

### **PONDICHERRY**

During the year under review, the total number of recognised educational institutions in the Union Territory increased by 20 to 461. Of these, 74.8 per cent were managed by the Government, 0.7 per cent by local bodies and 24.5 per cent by private bodies (24.1 per cent aided and 0.4 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 54.414 to 57.834 (35,835 boys and 21.999 girls). They were distributed as: pre-primary stage 3.3 per cent, primary stage 69.3 per cent, middle stage 15.0 per cent, high/higher secondary stage 6.4 per cent, university stage (general education 0.5 per cent, while the remaining 5.5 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 61.7 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 85.2, 32.3, and 14.3 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was not in force during the year under report.

The total expenditure on recognised institutions increased by Rs. 0.36 crores to Rs. 1.33 crores. The Government met 94.7 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from the local boards, fees, endowments and other sources and 0.1, 3.9, 1.3 and 0.0 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 865.2 in an arts and science college, Rs. 84.7 in a high/higher secondary school, Rs. 55.1 in a middle school and Rs. 36.2 in a primary school. The average annual cost *per capita* (of population) was Rs. 34.4.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 1.591 to 1.762 (1.164 men and 598 women). The trained teachers formed 55.0 per cent in high/higher secondary schools, 63.0 per cent in middle schools and 57.5 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:40 in the primary, 1:31 in the middle and 1:23 in high/higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in Arts & Science (Pass & Hons.) was 9 as against 16 in the previous year. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations increased from 355 to 744. As many as 2,046 adults were made literate.

Of these, 35.4 per cent were managed by the Government, 59.2 per cent by local bodies and 5.4 per cent by private bodies (4.9 per cent aided and 0.5 per cent unaided). The total number of pupils in these institutions also rose from 1,52,196 to 1.75,174 (1,14,293 boys and 60,881 girls). They were distributed as: pre-primary stage 7.8 per cent, primary stage 63.6 per cent, middle stage 11.5 per cent, high/higher secondary stage 4.2 per cent, university stage (general education) 0.8 per cent, while the remaining 12.1 per cent received professional and special education of both school and college standards. Nearly 78.3 per cent of the pupils came from rural areas. Educational facilities available for the school going children of the age-groups 6-11, 11-14, 14-17 were to the extent of 66.5, 26.3, and 10.4 per cent respectively. Compulsory education was not in force during the year under report.

The total expenditure on recognised institutions decreased by Rs. 9.03 lakhs to Rs. 1.73 crores. The Government met 95.0 per cent of this expenditure, while the contribution from fees, endowments and other sources was 2.8, 1.6 and 0.6 per cent respectively. On an average, the annual cost of educating a pupil was Rs. 428.4 in an arts and science college, Rs. 120.4 in a high/higher secondary school, Rs. 98.9 in a middle school and Rs. 45.5 in a primary school. The average annual cost per capita (of population) was Rs. 14.4.

The teachers working in recognised schools for general education increased from 4,675 to 5,142 (4,154 men and 988 women). The trained teachers formed 33.8 per cent in high/higher secondary schools, 46.9 per cent in middle schools and 28.4 per cent in primary schools of the total strength of the staff. The teacher pupil ratio was 1:31 in the primary, 1:17 in the middle and 1:21 in high/higher secondary schools.

The output of graduates in Arts & Science (Pass & Hons.) was 331 as against 212 in the previous year. The number of students declared successful in the Matriculation and equivalent examinations increased from 1.175 to 1.501. As many as 16.360 adults were made literate.
