P R E F A C E

Reduction in regional imbalances of educational development is a major objective of the National Policy on Education. To promote this programme, it is necessary to collect statistics of educational development in the different regions of the country periodically and to publish them for information and use by all concerned.

The Ministry of Education publishes annually statistics of educational development in the different States of the Indian Union. But as imbalances of educational development between one district and another are far more pronounced than those between one State and another, it was decided to collect and publish statistics of educational development in the districts also every five years. Accordingly, such statistics were collected and published, for the first time, for the year 1960-61.

The study is now being repeated for the year 1965-66 and it is proposed to bring out a separate volume on the district educational statistics of every state. It will contain statistics for the year 1965-66 along with comparative data for the year 1960-61. To make inter-district comparisons possible, some important indices such as enrolment ratio, percentage of trained teachers, per capita expenditure on education, etc., will also be included.

In this programme of bringing out 16 volumes for all the States of the Union (except Nagaland), this volume is the first and is devoted to the educational statistics of districts in Andhra Pradesh. It has been based on the data collected from the State Department of Education, Andhra Pradesh.

I take this opportunity to express my appreciation of the cooperation and help received from the Director of Public Instruction, Andhra Pradesh and other educational authorities in the State.

I - INTRODUCTORY

The Ministry of Education publishes the statistics of education in India annually in their publication "Education in India, Vol.I and Vol.II". These publications give the statistics at the national and State levels, but do not provide district-wise statistics.

To fill up this gap, the National Council of Educational Research and Training brought out a volume entitled "Educational Statistics: District-wise" giving the bench-mark of educational data of various kinds for all districts for the year 1960-61. To make inter-district comparisons possible, some important indices such as enrolment ratios, percentage of trained teachers and per capita expenditure on education were also given. These comparative statistics show a wide range of variation between the districts in every respect.

It has now been decided to hold a similar review of educational development in the districts for the year 1965-66. Such periodic reviews are necessary for several reasons. For instance, they will help to judge the effectiveness of the measures taken to correct regional imbalances at the district level. Secondly, such collection and publication of data on different aspects of education at the district level will help the preparation of educational development plans for all districts so that they can be adopted, as recommended by the Education Commission, as the principal unit for administration, planning and development of school education.

This review will be divided into sixteen volumes - one volume being devoted to the educational statistics of the districts in every state (except Nagaland). The present volume, which is the first in the series, gives the data for each of the districts of Andhra Pradesh on number of educational institutions, population, teachers, expenditure

etc. at all levels of education. It also gives the rates of growth in different sectors from 1960-61 to 1965-66 and some important indices of educational development.

II - AREA AND POPULATION

Andhra Pradesh consists of 29 districts. Its total estimated population in 1966 was 396.01 lakhs (200.80 lakhs males and 195.21 lakhs females). The population of the State in 1961 was 359.83 lakhs (181.62 lakhs males and 178.22 lakhs females). The rate of growth of population during 1961-66 has been 1.9% per annum.

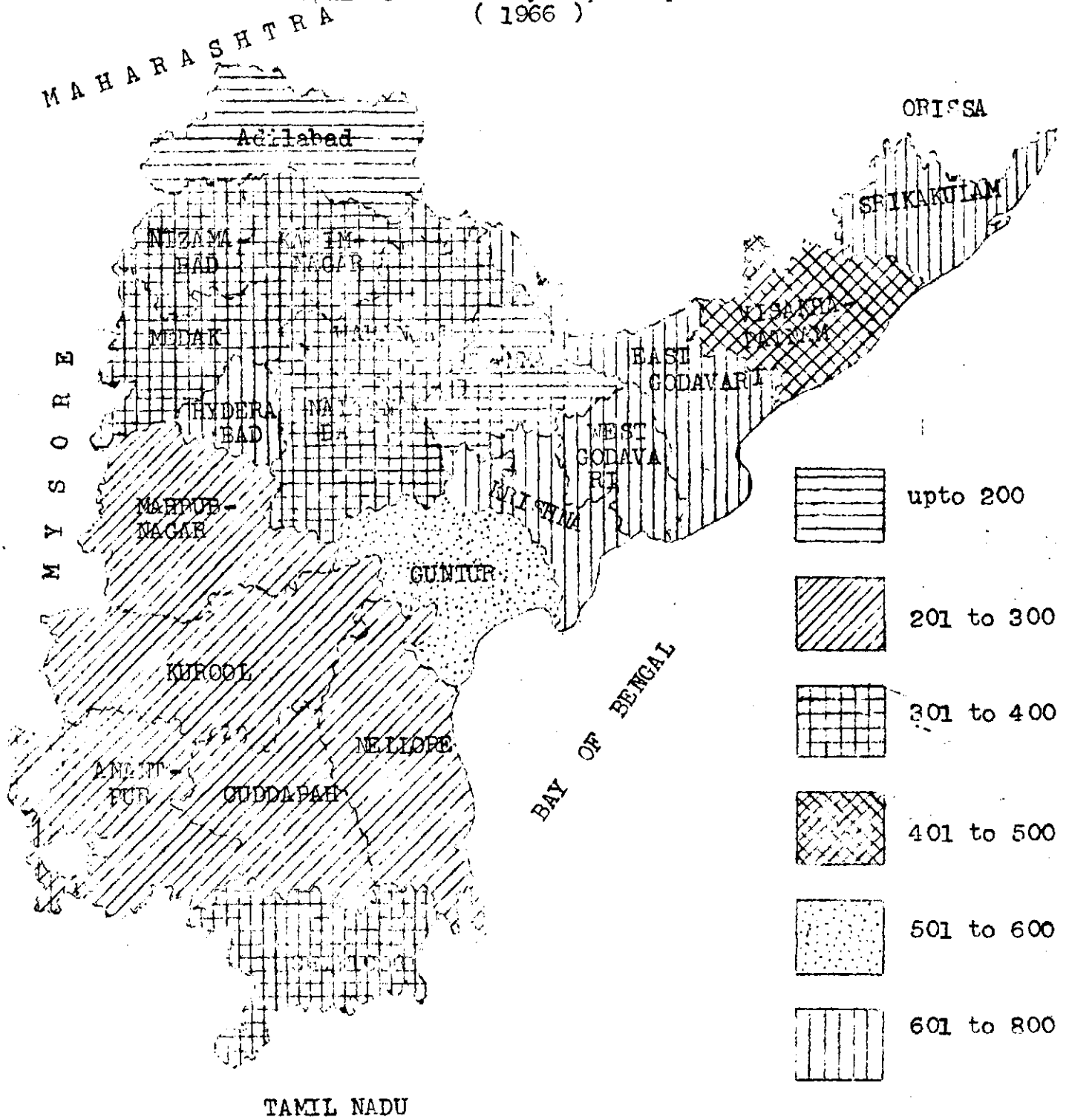
The overall density of population per square mile of the State was 329 in 1961 and 373 in 1966. In 1966, the density of population was less than 200 in two districts, Khammam (189) and Adilabad (176); between 200 and 300 in five districts, Anantpur (263), Cuddapah (249), Kurnool (226), Mahbubnagar (246) and Nellore (281); between 300 and 400 in six districts, East Godavari (389), Medak (364), Nalgonda (316), Nizamabad (332) and Warangal (311); and more than 400 in seven districts, East Godavari (686), Guntur (571), Hyderabad (700), Krishna (677), Srikakulam (660), Visakapatnam (485) and West Godavari (731). The density of population in India in 1966 was nearly 420 per square mile and in comparison to this, only the five coastal districts and Hyderabad, the capital, had a larger density than the all-India average. The detailed district-wise statistics are given in Table I.

The total population of the State in the age-group 6-11 in 1966 was 49.27 lakhs (24.65 lakhs ^{boys} and 24.62 lakhs girls). This shows an increase of 5.67 lakhs from 1961 to 1966 in the population in this age-group. The children in the age-group 6-11 formed 12.4% of the

total population of the State in 1966.

The number of children in the age-group 11-14 in 1966 was 26.01 lakhs (13.05 lakhs boys and 12.96 lakhs girls). The children in this age-group increased by 1.79 lakhs from 1961 to 1966 and formed 6.6% of the total population of the State in 1966.

There were 24.48 lakh children in the age-group 14-17 in 1966 (12.29 lakh boys and 12.19 lakh girls). The children in this age-group increased by 1.61 lakhs between 1961 and 1966 and formed 6.2% of the total population in 1966.

The youth in the age-group 17-23 in 1966 numbered 42.42 lakh (20.16 lakh males and 22.26 lakh females). The persons in this age-group increased by 3.41 lakhs between 1961 and 1966 formed 10.7% of the population in 1966.

The population in the age-group 6-23 formed 35.9% of the total population in the State in 1966. The distribution of the population in the different age-groups, district-wise, is given in Table II.

III - LITERACY

The general literacy rate in Andhra Pradesh, i.e., the number of literates per thousand of population was 212 in 1961. The literacy rate of males was 302 in 1961 for the State as a whole. The corresponding literacy rate for females in the same year was only 120.

In 1961, the literacy rate was highest in Hyderabad (350) and lowest in Adilabad (117). In the case of males also the highest literacy rate was in Hyderabad (459) and lowest in Adilabad (188). Similarly in the case of females, the highest literacy rate was again in Hyderabad (237) and the lowest in Adilabad (45). The details are given in Table No.III.

IV - TOTAL NUMBER OF EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS,
PUPILS, TEACHERS AND EXPENDITURE

In 1960-61, there were 38,559 educational institutions in Andhra Pradesh. The total number of such institutions in 1965-66 rose to 43,482. This includes all recognised institutions from the pre-primary to higher education.

Among the districts, the maximum number of institutions in 1965-66 was in Guntur (3,637), followed by Srikakulam (3,301) and Nellore (3,213). The district of Nizamabad had the smallest number of such institutions (987). The total enrolment in all types of educational institutions in 1960-61 was 37.18 lakhs (24.38 lakhs boys and 12.80 lakhs girls). In 1965-66 it rose to 49.28 lakhs (31.26 lakhs boys and 18.02 lakhs girls). The enrolment in educational institutions has, therefore, increased at a cumulative rate of 5.5 percent during the period. The rate of growth during the period in the enrolment of boys was 4.9 percent and in that of girls 6.8 percent.

There is a large variation in the percentage increase, during the period, of total enrolment and that of boys and girls among the different districts. Taken 1960-61 as base, the maximum increase in enrolment of boys and girls together was in Nizamabad district followed by Medak, Adilabad, Nalgonda, Khammam and Mahbubnagar and the minimum was in Guntur followed by East and West Godavari districts.

In the total enrolment, the sex ratio was 58 girls for every 100 boys enrolled in 1965-66 as against 53 girls for every 100 boys enrolled in 1960-61. This shows that the position has slightly improved. Among the districts, there were more than 70 girls enrolled for every 100 boys in the Coastal districts of East Godavari, Guntur, Krishna and West Godavari, 60-70 girls

for every 100 boys enrolled in Nellore and Srikakulam districts; 50-60 girls for every 100 boys enrolled in Anantpur, Chittoor, Cuddapah, Hyderabad, Kurnool districts; and less than 50 girls for every 100 boys enrolled in other districts. The lowest sex ratio in enrolment was in Karimnagar and Adilabad districts where only 28 and 29 girls respectively were enrolled for every 100 boys. The district-wise details are given in Table IV-A.

The total enrolment in educational institutions as a percentage of the total population in the State was 12.4 in 1965-66 as against 10.3 in 1960-61. The percentage enrolment to total population was 16-17 in Guntur, Hyderabad, Krishna and West Godavari. The lowest percentage enrolment to total population was in Adilabad (7.0), Karimnagar (7.4), Nizamabad (7.8), Nalgonda (8.0), Medak (8.0) and Mahbubnagar (8.1).

The total number of teachers in all educational institutions in Andhra Pradesh increased from 1,16,849 in 1960-61 to 1,57,107 in 1965-66. This shows a cumulative annual increase of 5.5 percent. The percentage of women teachers to the total number of teachers was nearly 20.1 in 1965-66, as against 18.1 in 1960-61, in the State as a whole. The percentage of women teachers in 1965-66 was highest in Hyderabad (41.7) followed by Krishna (27.8), Guntur (25.0), West Godavari (21.8), Kurnool (20.6), Nellore (20.4) and Visakhapatnam (20.0). Percentage of women teachers was the lowest in Karimnagar (6.6) and Srikakulam (7.2).

The number of Teachers per thousand of population was 2.3 in 1960-61 and it increased to 4.0 in 1965-66. Hyderabad district had the highest number of teachers per thousand population (6.7) followed by Krishna (5.1), Guntur (4.9), West Godavari (4.8), Nellore (4.8),

East Godavari (4.1), Guntur (4.1) and Kurnool (4.0). The lowest number of teachers per thousand population was in Adilabad (2.5), Karimnagar (2.7) and Nizamabad (2.9).

The total direct expenditure on educational institutions increased from 2,485.5 lakhs Rs. in 1960-61 to 3,573.0 lakhs in 1965-66. The direct expenditure has increased at a cumulative rate of growth of 7.2 percent per annum. The total expenditure per head of population was Rs. 6.9 in 1960-61. It increased to Rs. 9.0 in 1965-66.

As is to be expected, there is a large variation in the total direct educational expenditure among the districts. The per capita expenditure was the highest in Hyderabad district (Rs. 29.9), followed by West Godavari (Rs. 12.3) and Chittoor (Rs. 11.7); and the lowest per capita expenditure was in Adilabad and Karimnagar districts (Rs. 4.1 and Rs. 4.3 respectively).

The source-wise distribution of total direct expenditure on educational institutions in 1965-66 is given in Table No. IV-B. It will be seen from there that 77.3 percent of the total direct expenditure on all educational institutions in Andhra Pradesh was met from Government funds, 10.4 percent from fees and 7.6% from other sources and 4.7% from Local Body funds. In the case of comparatively under-developed districts like Adilabad, Karimnagar, Khammam, Mahbubnagar, Medak, Nalagaonda and Nizamabad more than 90 percent of the total expenditure was met from Government funds.

V - PRE-PRIMARY EDUCATION

The number of pre-Primary schools in the State increased from 47 to 112 in 1965-66. There were no separate pre-primary schools in Adilabad, Karimnagar, Kurnool, Mahbubnagar, Nizamabad, Srikakulam and Warangal. But in Adilabad, Nizamabad and Warangal there were pre-primary classes

and to other schools. The highest number of pre-primary schools was in Medak (38) districts.

The enrolment in these institutions and attached classes in other schools increased from 12019 to 12016 during the period. There were 90 girls for every 100 boys enrolled at the State level. The highest enrolment in pre-primary schools was in Hyderabad (6363) followed by Medak (1907).

There were 1035 students belonging to scheduled castes and scheduled tribes enrolled in pre-primary classes in 1965-66. Of this 470 were boys and 565 girls. In Adilabad, Anantpur, Karimnagar, Khammam, Kurnool, Mahabnagar, Nizamabad, Srikakulam and Visakhapatnam, there were no scheduled castes/scheduled tribes students enrolled in pre-primary classes.

The number of teachers in pre-primary schools increased from 95 to 139 during the period. The percentage of women teachers which was 86.3 in 1960-61 increased to 88.5 by 1965-66. Almost all the teachers, who were mainly women were trained in Guntur, Khammam, Krishna, Nellore, Visakhapatnam, West Godavari, Chittoor and Medak. At the State level 80 percent of the teachers were trained. However in Anantpur only 25% of the teachers were trained and in Hyderabad 47% and East Godavari 53%.

The total direct expenditure of these schools decreased from Rs.1.64 lakhs to Rs.1.39 lakhs during the period. This expenditure formed 0.065 percentage of the total direct expenditure on education in 1960-61 and 0.039 percentage in 1965-66. Direct expenditure on pre-primary schools in 1965-66 was more than in 1960-61 in nine districts and was less in the remaining districts.

VI - PRIMARY EDUCATION

The number of primary schools in Andhra Pradesh has increased from 34,040 to 37,320 during the period under review. The increase in the number of primary schools was highest in Adilabad district which was followed by Nellore, Medak, Nalgonda and Chittoor. The increase of institutions was the lowest in Krishna, Warangal, Guntur, West Godavari, Karimnagar, East Godavari and Hyderabad. The areas served by a primary school at the State level has decreased from 3.1 sq. miles to 2.8. In a district where the educational facilities are comparatively more developed, the area served by a primary school will be smaller than in another where the facilities for primary education are comparatively meagre. On the basis of this criteria, it can be seen that in Srikakulam, West Godavari, Krishna, East Godavari and Guntur districts, where the area served by a primary school is less than 2 sq. miles, the facilities for primary education have developed much more than in districts like Adilabad, Khammam, Mahbubnagar, Kurnool, and Warangal where the area served by a primary school is more than 4 sq. miles.

The population served by a primary school has increased slightly from 1057 in 1960-61 to 1061 in 1965-66 considering the State as a whole. Among the districts, the population served by a primary school in 1965-66 was the highest in Hyderabad (1765) followed by Karimnagar (1487), Warangal (1465), Nizamabad (1331) and Nalgonda (1277). The districts having the minimum population served by a primary school are Cuddapah (728), Nellore (809), Anantpur (876) and Chittoor (899). Table V gives the district-wise position.

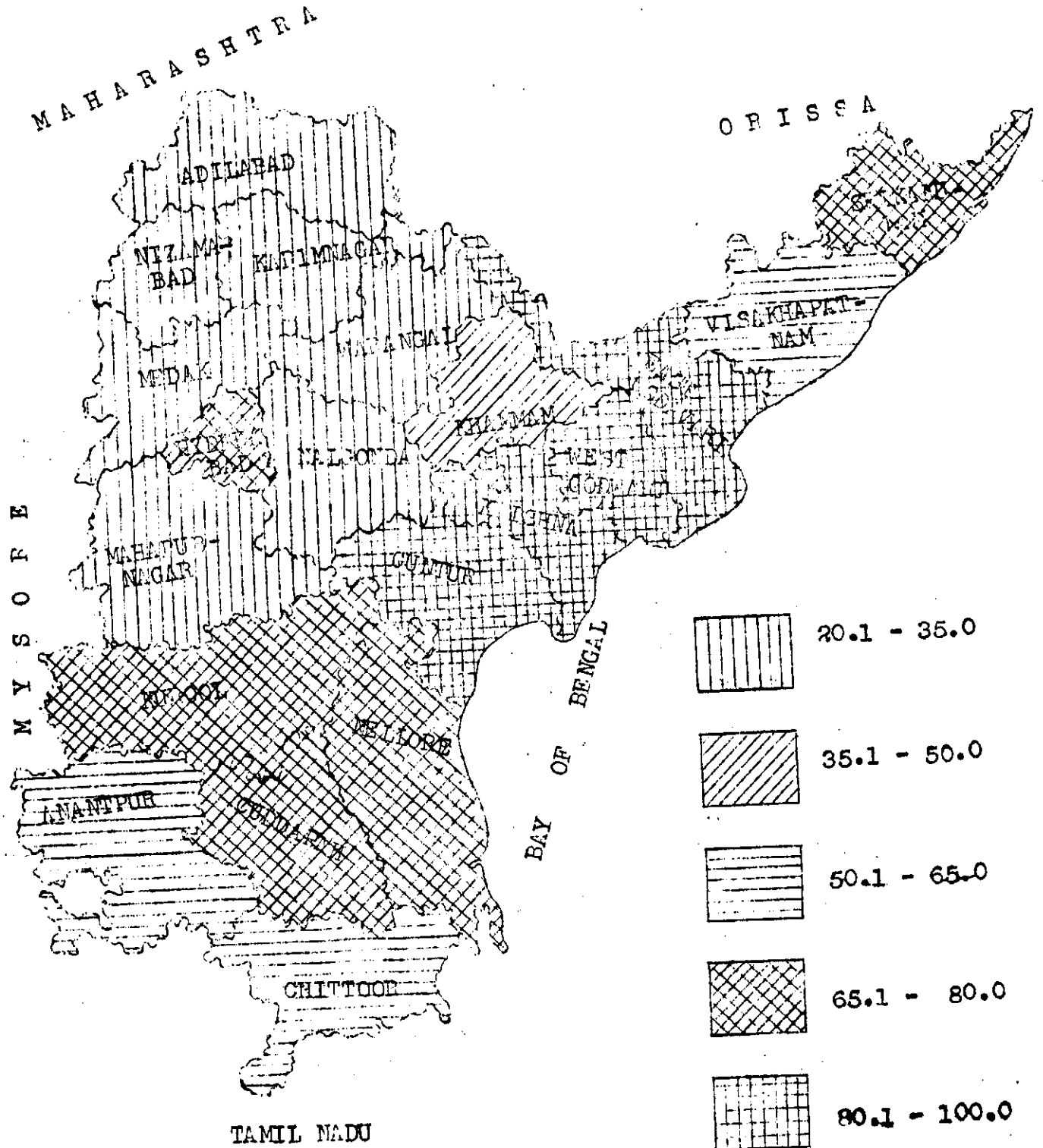
The enrolment in classes I-V in the State has increased from 29.8 lakhs to 37.7 lakhs during the period. This shows cumulative growth rate of 4.7% per annum. The growth rate in the enrolment of boys during the period was 4.0%, whereas in the case of girls it was 5.8%. The increase in enrolment in classes I-V was highest in Nizamabad district followed by Adilabad, Khammam. It was lowest in West Godavari, Guntur and East Godavari districts.

The percentage of enrolment in classes I-V to the total population in the age-group 6-11 gives an index of the facilities created for primary stage of education. In Andhra Pradesh the percentage of enrolment in classes I-V to the population in the age-group 6-11 has increased from 68.3 in 1960-61 to 76.5 in 1965-66. In the case of boys, this has increased from 84.3 to 91.1 and in the case of girls, from 52.2 to 61.9. In 1965-66 in the districts of Cuddaph, Guntur, Krishna, Kurnool, Nellore and West Godavari the percentage enrolment of boys is more than 100%. It is between 90 to 100 in Anantpur, Chittoor, East Godavari, Hyderabad and Srikakulam, it is between 80 to 90 in Visakhapatnam, it is the lowest in Nalgonda, Adilabad, Karimnagar, Mahbubnagar and Nizamabad (60-70) percent. As far as enrolment of girls is concerned, facilities were available for nearly 97% in West Godavari followed by 96% in Guntur. In all other districts, excepting Krishna (88%), East Godavari (81%), Nellore (76%), Cuddapah (71%), Srikakulam (71%), Kurnool (66%) Hyderabad (66%) and Anantpur (64%), the percentage of enrolment of girls was less than 60%. The lowest percentage of enrolment of girls was in Adilabad (22.0) followed by Karimnagar (22.3), Nizamabad (26.7) and Medak (28.2).

Taking both the boys and girls together, facilities existed for over 100% of the population in the age-group 6-11 in Guntur followed by West Godavari. Over 90.0% in two districts, namely, Krishna and Nellore. In Anantpur, Cuddapah, East Godavari, Hyderabad, Karnool and Srikakulam, the percentage enrolment was between 80 to 90; and in other districts, it was lower than even 80%. The lowest percentage of enrolment was in Adilabad (44.3%) followed by Karimnagar (44.6%). It will thus be seen that districts, like Adilabad, Karimnagar, Mahbubnagar, Medak, Nalagonda, Nizamabad, Warangal and Khammam are very much behind the other districts in the development of primary education, especially for girls. The district-wise details are given in Table VII(A).

Table VII(B) gives the enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in classes I-V in 1965-66 together with the percentage of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes population to the total population and the extent of coverage of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in the enrolment in classes I-V. There are nearly 5.97 lakh scheduled castes and scheduled tribes children enrolled in classes I-V in Andhra Pradesh in 1965-66. Of this 3.67 lakhs were boys and 2.30 lakh were girls. The scheduled castes and scheduled tribes formed 15.8% of the total enrolment in classes I-V. The corresponding percentage was 16.3 for boys and 15.1 for girls. There is large variation in the percentage of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes pupils to the total enrolment in classes I-V among the district. For both boys and girls taken together, this percentage varies from 8.3% in Nizamabad to 24.7% in Khammam. This variation will of course depend upon the variation in the percentage of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes population to the ^{total} population

in the different districts.

Columns 11, 12 and 13 of the Table gives the extent of coverage. Extent of coverage is defined as the percentage of percent scheduled castes and scheduled tribes students enrolled to total enrolment to the percent scheduled castes and scheduled tribes population to total population. These columns show whether the percentage of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes enrolled in classes I-V is similar to percentage of enrolment of all the children from total population in classes I-V. If the extent of coverage is 100%, this will show that the percentage enrolment of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes and the percentage population of scheduled castes/tribes to the total population are the same. For Andhra Pradesh as a whole the extent of coverage for the boys and girls together was 90.3%. The extent of coverage was 93.1% for boys and for girls 86.3%. Among the districts the percentage of coverage varies from 41.9 in Mahbubnagar to 194.4 in Krishna for both boys and girls together. Extent of coverage was more than 100 in Krishna, Kurnool, Guntur, Anantpur, Cuddapah and West Godavari. In the case of boys Anantpur, Cuddapah, Guntur, Krishna, Kurnool and West Godavari the extent of coverage was more than 100%. In the other districts it varied from 48.9% in Mahbubnagar district to 98.9% in Srikakulam. In the case of girls the extent of coverage was more than 100% in Anantpur, Cuddapah, Guntur, Krishna, Kurnool and West Godavari. In other districts the extent of coverage varied from 25.7% in Karimnagar to 94.3 in Srikakulam district.

There were 73886 teachers in primary schools in Andhra Pradesh in 1960-61 and their number increased to 79923 by 1965-66. The number of teachers in primary schools increased

in all districts excepting Warangal. The maximum increase was in Adilabad and Medak. In 1960-61 only slightly more than 18% were women in 1960-61. The percentage of women teachers in 1965-66 was 21%. In 1965-66 percentage women teachers was highest in Hyderabad (48.7) followed by Krishna (33.9) and Guntur (30.5). In Adilabad district 5.6% of the teachers were women. Of the total number of teachers in 1965-66, 92.9% were trained. Among males 92.4% were trained and among females 94.2% were trained. The percentage of trained teachers has increased from 1960-61. In the year 1960-61 only 82.9% of the total teachers were trained and only 80.9% males teachers were trained. However, in the case of women teachers in 1960-61 92.2% were trained. There is large variation among the percentage of trained teachers among the districts. Considering the year 1965-66, mostly all the teachers were trained in Anantpur, Chittoor, Cuddapah, East Godavari, Guntur, Krishna, Kurnool, Nellore, West Godavari, Srikakulam and Visakhapatnam. The percentage of trained teachers was lowest in Adilabad (39.0) and Nalgonda (61.5) among males and in Adilabad (46.1), Medak (30.8) and Nizamabad (62.2) among females.

The pupil-teacher ratio in Andhra Pradesh in 1965-66 in primary schools was 40. Among the districts the pupil-teacher ratio was the lowest in Hyderabad followed by Adilabad, Mahabubnagar and Medak and the highest pupil-teacher ratio was in Anantpur district. Since the progress of primary education in many of the districts is much below the average, the low pupil-teacher ratio in districts like Adilabad, Karimnagar, Mahabubnagar etc. may be due to the non-utilisation of the available facilities in full. The district-wise details are given in Table IX.

The direct expenditure on primary schools has increased from Rs.788 lakhs in 1960-61 to Rs. 1185 lakhs in 1965-66. The cumulative annual growth rate of expenditure was 8.0 per cent during the period. The direct expenditure on primary schools as a percentage of the total direct expenditure on education in Andhra Pradesh has increased from 31.7 to 33.2 during 1961-66. Among the districts the percentage of expenditure on primary schools to total direct expenditure on education in 1965-66 was highest in West Godavari (58.9%) followed by Srikakulam (54.2%), Cuddapah (49.8%) and Adilabad (46.2%) districts and the lowest percentage was in Hyderabad (8.8%) district. As can be seen, this percentage is highest in less developed districts than in the others. The direct expenditure per capita on primary schools in Andhra has increased from Rs.2.2 to Rs.3.0 in the last five years. In 1965-66 the highest per capita expenditure on primary schools was in West Godavari (Rs.7.3) followed by Chittoor (Rs.4.7) and Nellore (Rs.4.0) districts and the lowest per capita expenditure on primary schools was in Karimnagar (Rs.1.4) followed by Nalgonda (Rs.1.7), Adilabad (Rs.1.9) and Warangal (Rs.1.9) districts. During 1965-66, for the State as a whole the average direct expenditure per student per annum was Rs.37.2. The highest cost per student was in West Godavari (Rs.63.7) followed by Chittoor (Rs.55.3) and Hyderabad (Rs.50.1) districts and the lowest cost was in Anantpur district (Rs.23.9). The details are given in Table IX.

MIDDLE SCHOOL EDUCATION

The number of middle schools in Andhra Pradesh has increased from 1,466 to 2,578 during the period. This shows a cumulative growth rate of 11.0 in the number of middle/senior basic schools per annum. The highest increase in the number of middle schools during the

period was in Krishna District followed by Khammam, Warangal and Karimnagar districts. In all these districts the number of middle schools nearly doubled during the period. Even in other districts the number of middle schools increased substantially.

The average area served by a middle school which was 72.5 square miles in 1960-61 decreased to 41.2 square miles during the period. Among the districts, in Adilabad, Anantpur, Chittoor, Cuddapah, Khammam, Kurnool, Mahbubnagar, Nellore, Nizamabad and Visakhapatnam, the area served by a middle school is more than the Andhra Pradesh average in 1965-66. In Adilabad, Anantpur and Kurnool the average area served by a middle school is more than 100 sq. miles. In Hyderabad and Krishna the average area served by a middle/senior basic school was only 12.7 and 15.6 sq. miles respectively.

The population served by a middle school has decreased from nearly 24,545 to 15,361 during the period. In 1965-66, the average population served by a middle school is more than the State average in eleven districts out of 20. The district-wise details are given in Table X.

The enrolment in classes VI-VIII in Andhra Pradesh has increased from 4.08 lakhs to 6.51^{lakhs} during the period. This shows a cumulative growth rate of 9.2% per annum. The growth rate in the enrolment of boys in these classes during the period was 8.1% per annum whereas in the case of girls it was 12.4%. There were 36.7 girls for every 100 boys enrolled taking the State as a whole in 1965-66 which is comparable to 36.8 at the All-India level. Taking 1960-61 as base, the increase in enrolment in classes VI-VIII was highest in Adilabad district followed by Nalgonda and Khammam and Krishna districts. Even in other districts

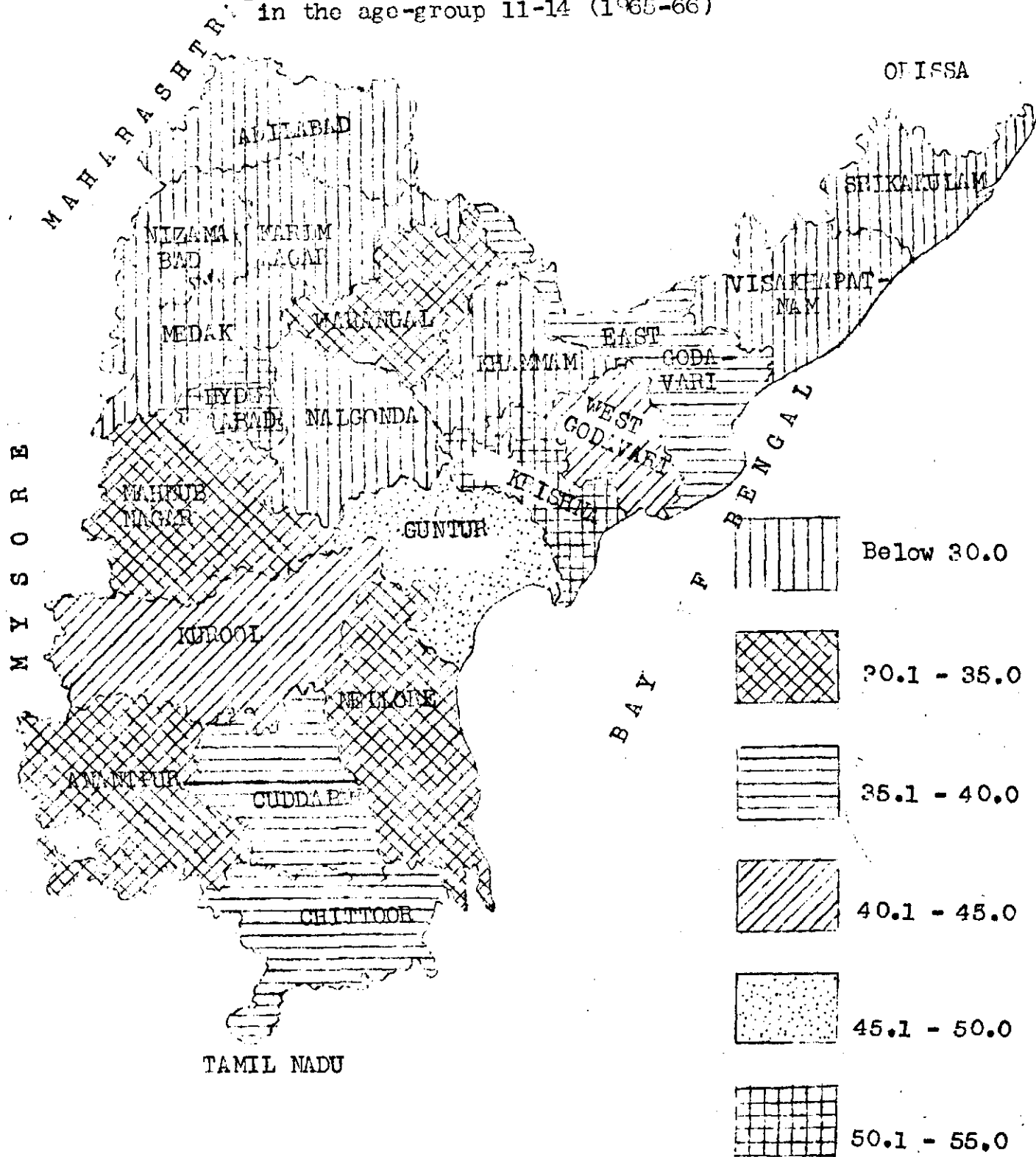
the increase was substantial.

The percentage of enrolment in classes VI-VIII to the population in the age-group 11-14 gives an index of the facilities created for middle stage education. In Andhra Pradesh the percentage of enrolment in classes VI-VIII to the population in the age-group 11-14 has increased from 16.8 to 25.0 during the period. In case of boys, the percentage has increased from 26.0 to 36.5 and in case of girls from 7.6 to 13.5. As for the variation among the districts in 1965-66, in Hyderabad and Krishna the percentage enrolment in these classes was more than 40 and in Guntur and West Godavari it was between 30-40. The lowest percentage of enrolment was in Adilabad (13.3) district followed by Medak (15.1), Nizamabad (16.2) and Karimnagar (17.2) districts. In the case of boys in Guntur, Hyderabad, Krishna, Kurnool and West Godavari districts the percentage enrolment in classes VI-VIII was more than forty. The percentage enrolment was between 30-40 in Anantpur, Chittoor, Cuddapah, East Godavari, Mahbubnagar, Nellore and Warangal districts. The percentage enrolment of boys was between 20-30 in Adilabad (22.8) followed by Medak (26.7), Nizamabad (27.0), Nalgonda (28.5), Karimnagar (29.6), Srikakulam (29.3) and Visakhapatnam (28.9) districts. As for girls, percentage enrolment in Hyderabad and Krishna alone was more than thirty. The lowest percentage being in Medak (3.6) followed by Adilabad (3.8), Karimnagar (4.9), Nizamabad (5.6), Mahbubnagar (6.1) and Nalgonda (6.9). Thus it is seen that as far as middle stage education is concerned, the districts of Adilabad, Medak, Karimnagar, Mahbubnagar, Nizamabad are lagging very much behind the other districts in the State. The district-wise details are given in Table XI.

Of the total enrolment in classes VI-VIII in 1965-66 9.9% boys and 9.7% girls belonged to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes communities. Both boys and girls together formed 9.9% of the total enrolment in these classes. The extent of coverage in enrolment of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes in classes VI-VIII was 56.6% only. In the case of boys this percentage was 56.6 and in the case of girls 55.4. Thus it is seen that the middle school education of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes students is very much lagging behind the general population. Among the districts, only in Guntur and Kurnool the extent of coverage of both boys and girls taken together was more than 100%. In these districts the extent of coverage of boys was more than 100% and of girls was around 95%. Of the other districts the extent of coverage of boys was highest in West Godavari (90.4%), Cuddapah (85.0%), Krishna (75.4%), Nellore (73.8%), East Godavari (66.2%), Anantpur (65.8%), and Hyderabad (64.7%). Extent of coverage of boys was lowest in Medak (20.3%) followed by Mahbubnagar (22.6%). The extent of coverage among girls was highest, only of the remaining districts, in East Godavari (83.6%) followed by West Godavari (82.9%), Cuddapah (79.7%), Nellore (72.6%), and Krishna (72.0%). In Mahbubnagar the coverage was the lowest (12.8%). Next in order was Adilabad (13.8%) and Karimnagar (18.8%). Taking both boys and girls together the extent of coverage was the lowest in Mahbubnagar (21.0%) followed by Medak (24.0%), Adilabad (26.9%) and Karimnagar (28.1%).

There were 20,209 teachers in the middle schools in Andhra Pradesh in 1965-66, as compared to 13,352 in 1960-61. Of these 23.3% and 24.1% respectively were women. The number of teachers in middle schools, as the number of middle schools, has increased substantially

During the period 1960-61 to 1965-66 in almost all districts. At the State level there is a marked increase in the percentage of women teachers in middle schools and this is shared by all districts including Adilabad, Chittoor, Hyderabad, Krishna and West Godavari. The number of trained teachers formed 85.9% of the total number of teachers in 1965-66. The percentage of trained men teachers was 85.7 and women teachers was 86.7. The corresponding percentage in 1960-61 were 77.0, 46.8 and 81.5 respectively. This shows that the percentage of trained teachers among the total number of teachers and specifically among male teachers has increased substantially at the State level and also in many of the districts. This is because the facilities for training of teachers have been increased with the expansion in the number of middle schools and the total number of teachers employed. Of the total number of teachers, more than ninety percent were trained in twelve districts and Adilabad, with lowest percentage of trained teachers, had 65.3% trained teachers. Among female teachers in eleven districts more than ninety percent of them were trained and in the case of males, in twelve districts. Adilabad with 39.2 percent of female teachers trained and Karimnagar with 48.8 percent of male trained teachers were lowest in the State.

The pupil teacher ratio in 1965-66 in the middle schools at State level was 30. This ratio has exceeded the State average in eight districts, viz. Anantpur, Chittoor, East Godavari, Guntur, Krishna, Srikakulam, Visakhapatnam and West Godavari. In all other districts the pupil teacher ratio was less than the State average. The district-wise details are given in Table XIII and XIV.

The direct expenditure on middle schools has increased from Rs.181 lakhs to Rs.321 lakhs during the five year period under consideration. The direct expenditure increased at a cumulative rate of growth of 11.2 per annum. Among the districts the direct expenditure has more than trippled in Guntur district, and more than doubled in Khammam, Krishna, Medak and Nellore districts. The expenditure on middle schools as a percentage of the total direct expenditure on education in Andhra Pradesh increased from 7.3% to 9.0% during the period. The corresponding increase in the percentage expenditure is seen in all the districts. The direct expenditure per capita on middle schools which was only Rs.0.5 in 1960-61 has increased to Rs.0.8 by 1965-66 at the State level. Among the districts the per capita expenditure on middle schools in 1965-66 was the highest in Hyderabad district (Rs.2.1) followed by Warangal district (Rs.1.2). The per capita expenditure was the lowest in Anantpur (Rs.0.2), Kurnool (Rs.0.4) and Srikakulam (Rs.0.4). The average direct expenditure per student per annum in middle schools in Andhra in 1965-66 was Rs.52.6. This expenditure was the highest in Nellore district (Rs.75.6) followed by Guntur (Rs.72.6) and Hyderabad (Rs.72.1) districts and was the lowest in Anantpur (Rs.30.9) and Krishna (Rs.31.8) districts.

Transfer Rate from Primary Stage to Middle stages

Generally the transfer rate from primary stage to middle stage is calculated by the enrolment in class VI in a year as a percentage of enrolment in class V in the previous year. However, since the class-wise enrolment is not available district-wise, the transfer rate here has been calculated with the enrolment in classes VI-VIII as a percentage of the

enrolment in classes I-V in the same year. At the State level the transfer rate as defined above has increased from 13.7 to 17.3% during the period under consideration for both boys and girls together. In the case of boys the transfer rate has increased from 17.2% to 21.2% and in the case of girls from 8.1% to 11.5%. The district-wise position of transfer rate in 1965-66 is given below:-

Among boys the lowest transfer rate from primary stage to middle stage was in Srikakulam (15.5%) followed by Nellore district (17.2%) and Visakhapatnam district (17.8%). The highest transfer rate was observed in Hyderabad (39.4%). Among the girls again the lowest transfer rate was in Srikakulam (5.8%) followed by Medak (6.7%), Kurnool (7.6%) and Cuddapah (7.6%). The highest transfer rate among girls was in Hyderabad (26.2%) followed by Krishna (19.6%), Warangal (13.8%). Taking both boys and girls together the lowest ^{rate is} in Srikakulam district (11.4%) followed by Nellore (13.7%) and Visakhapatnam district (14.0%) and the highest transfer rate was observed in Hyderabad district (28.1%). At the all-India level the transfer rate was 22.1% for boys; 14.8% for girls and 19.6% for both sexes together in 1962-63. This has increased to 23.6%, 15.6% and 20.8% respectively by 1965-66.

VIII - HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION

The number of high/higher secondary schools in Andhra Pradesh increased from 1224 in 1960-61 to 2297 in 1965-66. This shows a cumulative growth rate of 12.2 per annum. Among the districts the maximum percentage increase in the number of high/higher secondary schools was in Nalgonda followed by Karimnagar, Warangal and Medak.

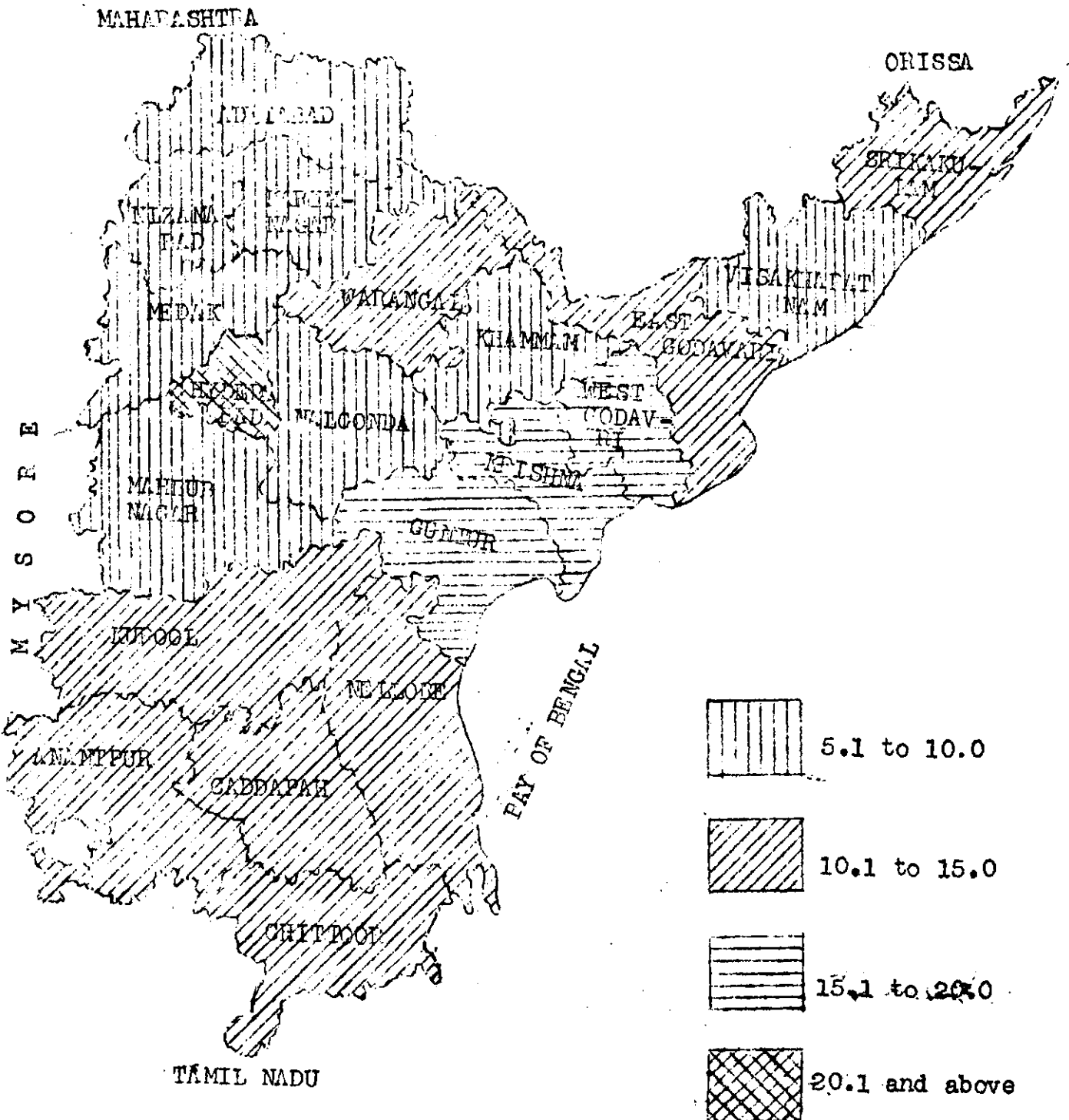
The area in square miles served by a high/higher secondary school which was 86.8 in 1960-61 reduced to 46.3 during 1965-66 in the State as a whole. The highest area served by high/higher secondary school in 1965-66 was in Adilabad district (175.2 sq. miles), followed by Cuddapah (79.0 sq. miles) and the lowest in Hyderabad (14.40 sq. miles) district. The population served by a high/higher secondary school which was 29398 in 1960-61 reduced to 17240 in 1965-66 at the State level. Among the districts the population served by a high/higher secondary school in 1965-66 was about 10915 in Hyderabad, 13861 in Khammam, 14559 in Krishna and 14793 in Kurnool. On the other hand in Adilabad district a high/higher secondary school served about 31000 population and in Visakhapatnam district about 27,400. Table XV gives the district-wise details.

The total enrolment in high/higher secondary schools in 1965-66 was nearly 9,73,114. The enrolment in classes IX-XI increased at the State level from 1,96,184 to 3,41,922 during the period. This shows a cumulative growth rate of 10.8% per annum. In the case of boys the enrolment in these classes grew at the rate of 9.9% per annum and in the case of girls the growth rate was 14.8% per annum. The sex ratio of enrolment in classes IX-XI which was 19.0 girls for 100 boys in 1960-61 increased to 25 girls per 100 boys at the State level.

At the all-India level there were 28.8 girls enrolled in these classes for every 100 boys in 1965-66. Among the districts the increase in enrolment was highest in Adilabad district followed by Chittoor and Nizamabad. The increase in other districts also was substantial.

The percentage enrolment in classes IX-XI to the population in the age-group 14-17 increased from 8.3% to 13.1% during the period. In the case of boys the percentage enrolment increased from 14.0% to 20.8% and in the case of girls from 2.7% to 5.4%. The percentage enrolment to the corresponding population in 1965-66 was highest in Hyderabad (30.9%) followed by Krishna (19.9%), Guntur (15.7%), West Godavari (15.3%) and East Godavari (14.5%). The lowest percentage enrolment was in Adilabad (6.6%) and Medak (8.1%) districts). Table XVI gives the district-wise data.

Table XVII gives the enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in classes IX-XI. Of the total enrolment in classes IX-XI in 1965-66 nearly 27,100 students belonged to the scheduled castes and scheduled tribes communities. Of this nearly 21,000 were boys and 6,100 were girls. The percentage of scheduled caste and scheduled tribe students to the total enrolment was 7.9 taking both the sexes together at the State level. In the case of boys the percentage enrolment to the total was 7.7 and in the case of girls 8.9. The extent of coverage of scheduled caste and scheduled tribe students in the enrolment in classes IX-XI was 45.1% at the State level. In the case of boys the coverage was 44.0% and in the case of girls it was 50.9%. The extent of coverage of both boys and girls together varied from 95.0% in Kurnool district to 17.1% in Adilabad district. This shows that the ratio of enrolment of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes students to their population is much less than that of other

students in classes IX-XI in all most all districts.

Table XVIII gives the district-wise statistics of teachers. The total number of teachers in high/higher secondary schools increased from 24,937 in 1960-61 to 44,823 in 1965-66. Of the total number of teachers in 1965-66, 18.2% were women. The number of teachers increased during the period at a cumulative growth rate of 11.4% per annum.

The increase in the number of teachers in high/higher secondary schools is shared by all the district. Taking 1960-61 as base, the percentage increase in the number of these teachers was highest in Nalgonda, followed by Warangal and the percentage increase was the least in Hyderabad district.

Of the total number of teachers at the State level, 16.6 percent were women in 1960-61 and 18.2% in 1965-66. The percentage of women teachers, in the latest year, among the districts varied from 48.1 percent in Hyderabad and 20.4% in Visakhapatnam to 7.1% in Srikakulam.

Percentage of trained teachers in high/higher secondary schools, was comparatively high in Andhra Pradesh. This percentage, taking all teachers, stood at 80.5 in 1960-61 and has increased to 83.0 by 1965-66. Of the men teachers 80.7% were trained in 1960-61 and 83.0% in 1965-66. In the case of women teachers corresponding percentages were 79.8 and 83.2 respectively. Among the districts, of the total teachers, more than 90% were trained in Anantpur, Chittoor, Cuddapah, East Godavari, Guntur, Krishna, Visakhapatnam and West Godavari. Of the teachers in high/higher secondary schools in Nalgonda only 60% were trained. The percentage of trained men and women teachers in the different districts followed more or less the same pattern as the percentage trained among total number of teachers.

The pupil-teacher ratio in high/higher secondary schools was 22 in 1965-66 at the State level. This ratio varied from 25 in Hyderabad district to 18 in Medak and Srikakulam districts.

The total direct expenditure on high/higher secondary schools which was nearly Rs. 648.2 lakhs in 1960-61 increased to 1047.0 lakhs by 1965-66. The direct expenditure has increased a cumulative growth rate of 9.4% per annum during the period. The increase in direct expenditure during the period on high/higher secondary schools was highest in Nalgonda followed by Warangal, Mahbubnagar and Medak districts. In these districts the expenditure has more than doubled. The direct expenditure on high/higher secondary schools was 26.1% of the total direct expenditure on education in Andhra Pradesh in 1960-61. This has increased to 29.3% in 1965-66. Among the districts, the percentage expenditure on high/higher secondary schools in 1965-66 was highest in Nalgonda (45.4%) followed by Karimnagar (44.3%) and Khammam (42.1%) district. At the other end of the scale was the Visakhapatnam district with 13.1 percent as the expenditure on high/higher secondary school followed by Chittoor with 18.4 percent.

The per capita expenditure on high/higher secondary schools which was only Rs. 1.8 in 1960-61 increased to Rs. 2.6 in 1965-66. Of the 20 districts in Andhra Pradesh in 5 districts the per capita expenditure on high/higher secondary schools in 1965-66 was less than Rs. 2/- and in one district (school) even less than Rs. 1/-.

The cost per student in high/higher secondary schools in Andhra was Rs. 107.6. The cost per student varied among the districts from Rs. 146.0 in Medak to Rs. 70.9 in Visakhapatnam. District-wise data on direct expenditure are given in Table XIX.

Transfer rate from Middle School stage to High School stage

Since the class-wise enrolment at the Middle stage as well as at the high school stage is not available district-wise, the transfer rate here has been calculated with the enrolment in classes IX-XI ^{as} a percentage of enrolment in classes VI-VIII of the same year. At the State level the transfer rate has increased from 48.1% in 1960-61 to 52.6% in 1965-66 taking both boys and girls together. In the case of boys, the transfer rate has increased from 52.2% to 57.5% during the period. At the same time the transfer rate of girls has increased from 34.1% to 39.2%. The district-wise position of transfer rate in 1965-66 is given below.

Among the boys, the lowest transfer rate from middle stage to high school stage was in Guntur (49.9%) district followed by Khammam (50.1%) and Visakhapatnam (51.1%) districts. The highest transfer rate was observed in Hyderabad (76.3%) and Srikakulam (64.7%) districts. The lowest transfer rate among girls was in Nalgonda (25.2%) and Karimnagar (28.9%) districts and highest transfer rate was in Hyderabad (55.1%) and Kurnool (46.9%) districts. Taking both boys and girls together, the ^{lowest} transfer rate was observed in Khammam (45.4%) district and highest transfer rate in Hyderabad (68.3%) district. At the all India level the transfer rate was 47.3% in the case of boys, 35.3% in the case of girls and 44.2% in the case of both sexes together in 1962-63.

IX - TEACHER TRAINING INSTITUTIONS

In 1960-61, there were 145 teacher training institutions in Andhra Pradesh of these 137 were of school/under-graduate college standard and eight were post-graduate colleges. In 1965-66, there were only 132 teacher training institutions in the State consisting of 13 schools, 110 under-graduate colleges and 9 post-graduate colleges. In 1965-66, there was a school and/or under-graduate college in every district. Graduate/Post-graduate colleges were in existence, in 1965-66, in East Godavari, Guntur, Hyderabad, Kurnool, Nellore, Srikakulam, Visakhapatnam and Warangal districts. The maximum number of teachers training institutions, in 1965-66, was

in Guntur (20) followed by Hyderabad (12) and the least in Adilabad (2), Karimnagar (3) and Nalgonda (3).

The enrolment in teacher training institutions, including in teacher training classes attached to other institutions, increased from 15868 in 1960-61 to 19641 in 1965-66. Of the total enrolment in 1965-66, 5208 were in school classes and 14433 in college classes. Among the districts, the enrolment in school classes was highest in Anantpur (591), followed by Warangal (512) and Guntur (508). In the case of college level classes the highest enrolment was in Guntur (1701) followed by Hyderabad (1473) and East Godavari (1425) and the lowest in Adilabad (169) and Nizamabad (284).

X - VOCATIONAL AND TECHNICAL SCHOOLS

The number of vocational and technical schools increased from 60 to 123 during the period. This excludes the number of teacher training institutions. The total enrolment in these institutions (including that in attached classes to other institutions) increased from 10241 to 22266 during the period at a cumulative annual rate of growth of 14.8%.

The enrolment in Vocational and Technical Schools including teacher training as a percentage of the enrolment in classes IX-XI was 12.7 in 1960-61. This percentage has increased to 14.5 by 1965-66. The increase was nominal due to the reclassification of some institutions which were considered as schools in 1960-61 as under-graduate colleges in 1965-66. Of the total enrolment in Vocational and Technical schools (excluding Teachers Training) in 1965-66, 79.6% were boys, whereas in 1960-61 about 96.2% were boys.

The total direct expenditure on vocational and technical schools, excluding teacher training schools, decreased from 108.6 lakhs to 105.0 lakhs during the period. The direct expenditure on these schools, as a percentage of the total direct expenditure on education in the State, decreased from 4.4% to 2.9% during the period.

XI - HIGHER EDUCATION

The total number of institutions of higher education, including Universities, increased from 124 in 1960-61 to 290 by 1965-66. During the period the number of universities have increased from three to four. The number of Arts and Science colleges increased from 63 to 99, Medical colleges from 12 to 15, Engineering colleges from five to six and Teacher Training colleges from 8 to 9 and other colleges for Professional and Special education from 32 to 46. There is at least one Art and Science college in every district in 1965-66. In Hyderabad there were 23 Arts and Science colleges followed by Guntur (10). There was only one college each in Adilabad, Cuddapah and Medak districts. Teacher training colleges of undergraduate level (110) were in existence in all the districts. Table XXI gives the district-wise data.

The total enrolment in institutions for higher education in Andhra Pradesh in 1965-66 was 1,02,777. Of this 58,466 (56.9%) were in Arts and Science colleges, 5,286 (5.1%) in engineering colleges, 8,100 (7.9%) in medical colleges, 17,628 (17.2%) in teacher training colleges and 7,406 (7.2%) in colleges for other professional and special education. Table XXIII gives the enrolment in higher education by stages in 1960-61 and 1965-66. The enrolment in higher education has increased more than 1.7 times during the period. The growth rate in

enrolment was 10.7% per annum during the period. In the case of boys the growth rate was 9.6% per annum and in the case of girls the growth rate was 16.3% per annum.

The increase in enrolment in higher education was highest in Mahbubnagar and Medak districts followed by Karimnagar and Nizamabad. The enrolment in higher education as a percentage of the population in the age-group 17-23 which was 1.5 for both sexes together in 1960-61 increased to 2.3 by 1965-66. The percentage enrolment to the corresponding population in 1965-66 was more than 2% in Chittoor, East Godavari, Guntur, Hyderabad, Krishna, Visakhapatnam and Warangal. In Adilabad, Karimnagar, Medak, Nalgonda, Nizamabad and Srikakulam districts the percentage enrolment was less than 1%, least being in Adilabad district (0.3%). As for boys the percentage enrolment has increased from 2.7 to 4.1 and that for girls from 0.4 to 0.8.

Of the total enrolment in higher education stage 27,612 (27.7%) was at the graduate level in Arts & Science and 2958 (3.0%) at post-graduate and research level. The enrolment in professional/special education courses, other than teachers training was 28369 (28.5%).

There were 6363 students of scheduled castes and Scheduled tribes studying in classes of higher education in 1965-66 in Andhra Pradesh. Of this 5323 were boys and 1040 were girls. The enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in higher education courses as compared to the enrolment from the general population was low. The extent of coverage of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes children of both sexes was 36.6% at the State level. In the case of boys it was 37.1% and in the case of girls it was 33.1%. Only in one district namely Guntur the extent of coverage was 88%. In the case of all other districts the

Extent of coverage was more than 50% in four districts, 20% - 50% in eleven districts and less than 20% in the remaining four districts. Extent of coverage was the least in Adilabad. (5.1%). In this district there were no scheduled caste/tribe girls in higher education. Table XXIV gives the details.

District-wise statistics of teachers in institutions of higher education is given in Table XXV. The number of teachers in institutions of higher education has increased from 4739 to 8419. Of the total number of teachers in 1965-66, 17.4% were women. The highest number of teachers (4168 i.e. 50%) were in Arts and Science colleges, 3498 (41.5%) were in colleges for professional and other education. The pupil teacher ratio in Arts and Science colleges varied from 6 in Adilabad to 17 in Hyderabad and Mahbubnagar, the State ratio being 14. As in the case of enrolment, the increase in the number of teachers was the highest in Mahbubnagar district. In Karimnagar, Medak and Nizambad the number of teachers has increased more than 4 times.

The total direct expenditure on institutions of higher education increased from Rs. 666.0 lakhs to 894.8 lakhs during 1960-61 to 1965-66. Of the total expenditure in 1965-66, 30.3% was on Arts and Science colleges, 13.7% on Medical colleges, 6.1% on Engineering colleges, 4.4% on teacher training colleges of post-graduate and under-graduate levels and 7.7% on colleges of other professional and special and other education. The expenditure on Universities and Boards of education formed 37.8% of the total direct expenditure on higher education. The expenditure on higher education has grown at a cumulative rate of growth of 5.3% per annum during the period. In 1965-66 the direct expenditure on higher education

found 25.0% of the total direct expenditure on education in Andhra Pradesh as compared to 26.8% in 1960-61. The percentage expenditure on higher education to total direct expenditure in 1965-66 was highest in Hyderabad (57.5) followed by Visakhapatnam (49.7%) and the least in Srikakulam (3.4%). In eight districts the percentage expenditure in higher education was less than ten.

The average direct expenditure on higher education per student per annum in 1965-66 in Andhra was Rs.464 in Arts and Science colleges, Rs.1030 in Engineering colleges, Rs.1512 in Medical colleges and Rs.875 in teacher training colleges. The expenditure per student in Arts and Science colleges varied from Rs.919.7 in Adilabad district to Rs.350.5 in Khammam district. Similarly there was wide variation in the expenditure per student among the districts in colleges of other type of education. District-wise details are given in Table XXVI.

Summary

To summarise, it can be said that there is large variation in the educational development among the districts of the State. Districts like Adilabad, Medak, Karimnagar, Nizamabad and Mahbubnagar are very low in the ladder and the Districts of Hyderabad, Guntur, East Godavari, West Godavari, Krishna and Nellore are very high. However, the rate of growth of under developed districts are much more than the others thereby indicating that efforts are being made to bridge the gap as early as possible.
