## PREFACE

The Agricultural season of 1963-64 was on the whole a good one for production of most of the crops in the State.

The area under food grain crops increased from 113 lakh acres in the year 1962-63 to 122 lakh acres during the year under report. The increase is of the order of 7.8%. This increase was of the order of 9.0% in the case of cereal crops while in case of pulse crops the area has declined by 2.6%. The percentage increase in case of Wheat, Jowar, Bajri, Maize, Italian millets, Little millets, Common millets, other cereals is of the order of 18.9%, 19.1%, 3.6%, 0.5%, 37.0%, 42.3%, 8.8%, and 3.6% respectively. While in case of Rice, Barley, Ragi and Kodra the area has declined by 1.2%, 1.5%, 0.4% and 3.5% respectively. Amongst the pulses crops the area has increased in case of Gram Tur and Udid by 20.1%, 0.8% and 4.2% respectively. While it has decreased in case of Mug, Horse gram and other pulses by 25.8%, 12.8% and 6.4% respectively. The area under food crops has increased from 116.8 lakh acres in 1962-63 to 126.5 lakh acres during the year 1963-64. Thus the area under food crops has increased by 8.2 % during the year under report. The marked increased was of the order of 7.8% in case of food grain crops, 23.7% in case of sugar crops, 38.0% in case of condiments and spices crops and 3.7% in case of fruits and vegetables.

The production of food-grains has also increased from 22.9 lakh tons in 1962-63 to 26.6 lakh tons registering an increase of 15.9% during the year under report. This increase is of the order of 16.9% in case of cereal crops, while it is of the order of 3.7% in case of pulses crops. In cereal crops the production of Rice, Wheat, Jowar, Bajri, Barley, Italian millets, and Little millets has increased by 24.7%, 29.7%, 4.8%, 44.2%, 8.0%, 57.1% and 43.3% respectively, while in pulses crops the production of Gram, Tur, Black-gram has increased by 40.0%, 3.5% and 14.1% respectively. The yield per acre of Rice, Wheat, Rabi-Jowar, Bajri, Barley, Italian Millets, Little millets, Gram, Tur, Black gram has increased by 26.1%, 9.1%, 17.3%, 39.1%, 9.7%, 14.5%, 0.6%, 16.6%, 2.7% and 9.6% respectively.

The area under Groundnut has declined from 57.9 lakh acres to 45.6 lakh acres during the year under report. However

due to increase in yield per acre, the production has increased from 11.5 lakh tons in 1962-63 to 12.5 lakh tons in 1963-64. The area under Cotton has shown a slight decrease of 0.03 lakh acre *i.e.* the decrease is of the order of 0.1% only. While the production has decreased from 16.4 lakh bales in 1962-63 to 13.4 lakh bales in 1963-64. The production of Cotton has thus declined due to less yield per acre by 18.1%.

The area under non-food crops has decreased from 129.7 lakh acres in 1962-63 to 117.9 lakh acres in 1963-64 *i.e.*, by 9.1%. So far as fibre and fodder crops are concerned, the decrease is of the order of 0.2% and 0.6% respectively. While in case of Oilseed crops the area declined by 18.5%, the decline in area of non-food crops was mainly due to Groundnut crop which has decreased by 21.2% during the year under report.

The net irrigated area during the year was 17.7 lakh acres out of which 14.1 lakh acres was irrigated by wells only. The number of wells increased from 4.36 lakh in 1962-63 to 4.51 lakh in 1963-64. The area irrigated by Government Canal is 2.39 lakh acres which is higher than the previous year.

The farm harvest prices of Agricultural produce ruled higher in all crops during the year under report as compared to the previous year. The average rates of wages of carpenter and cobbler showed a slight decrease, while in the case of Blacksmith, field labour, other Agricultural Labour and Herdsman increased during the year under report.

According to quinquennial census of livestock conducted in March, 1961, there was an increase of 7.7% and 10.1% for Cattle and Buffaloes respectively. The number of breeding bulls however went down by 15.9%. Percentage decrease in sheep and goats were 15.6 and 15.7 respectively. While there was increase in number of horses and ponies and mules by 10.9 and 60.7% respectively. Poultry showed an increase of 10.2%.

As compared to 1956 census there has been an increase in the number of tractors by 144.8%, oil engines by 135.6%, electric pumps by 460.2%, ploughs by 18.0%, carts by 12.1% and Sugarcane crushers by 61.4%, while ghannis showed a decrease to the extent of 28.8%.

## **Season and crop Report of Gujarat State for the year 1963-64**

---

### **CHAPTER 1**

#### **SEASON**

The Agricultural season of the year 1963-64 was on the whole, a good one over a great part of the State. The season was characterised by adequate rains. The monsoon season commenced at appropriate time with sufficient rains in the month of June, 1963. Premonsoon rains were received in the month of May in the districts of Ahmedabad, Sabarkantha, Bhavnagar, Junagadh and Rajkot. As usual the regular monsoon set in the month to June and substantial and widespread rains were received during the month. Rainfall in June was 85.4 and 337.3 mm in the districts of Sabarkantha and Bulsar which was above the normal while it was 38.8, 28.0, 84.9, 50.3, 117.2, 31.0, 36.8, 28.8, 17.7 and 98.8 mm of Ahmedabad, Banaskantha, Baroda, Broach, Dangs, Kaira, Surat, Amreli, Bhavnagar and Junagadh respectively, which was below the normal and 5.6, 13.2, 4.3, 1.9, 5.6 mm at Mehsana, Godhra (Panchmahals), Jamnagar, Kutch and Rajkot respectively, which was very far from the normal.

The sowing operation of crops commenced immediately after receipt of rains and continued upto first week of July. In Jamnagar and Kutch districts, sowing was delayed due to inadequate rains. Crop growth and development was good up to the middle of August due to timely showers at short interval and proper sunshine. This enable cultivators to carry out required agricultural operations as and when needed. However during the last week of November, there were heavy unseasonal rains all over the State causing damage to crops like cotton, sesamum, castor, cumin, groundnut, vegetables etc. The harvesting of Kharif crops was delayed and some harvested produce lying in the field was damaged. But this unseasonal rains proved beneficial to rabi crops. The sowing of rabi crops like wheat could be started in time and was continued till December.

During the second fortnight of January 1964, many parts of the State were affected by severe cold waves. The resulting

frost caused damage to some extent to crops like cotton, tur, Rabi-jowar, castor, vegetables, gram, tobacco etc. This cold wave was experienced in most of the districts of the State.

Attack of cater piller on Coconut in Junagadh district and Aphids and white grubs on groundnut were reported.

The condition of water supply and fodder supply were reported adequate in all the districts except some parts of Saurashtra and Kutch District. Agricultural labour was adequate in all districts except Kutch district.

*Distribution of Rainfall.*—Table I compares the rainfall during the year under report with the normal rainfall of each district head-quarter station in the State. Following observations are made from the table :—

*Premonsoon rains.*—The premonsoon rains recorded was 28.6 mm at Ahmedabad which was above the normal while it was 6.2 mm, 5.8 mm, 3.2 mm at Himatnagar, Bhavnagar and Junagadh respectively which was below normal. No pre-monsoon rains were recorded in rest of the State.

*Monsoon Rain.*—583.3, 1675.9, 846.9 mm of rainfall was recorded at Palanpur, Ahwa, and Godhra respectively of Baroda division and 137.4, 566.5, 162.0, 433.0 mm at Jamnagar, Junagadh, Bhuj and Rajkot respectively of Rajkot division, which are below normals. It was 899.4, 954.0, 842.1, 976.3, 783.8, 941.5, 1158.4, 3093.1 mm at Ahmedabad, Baroda, Broach, Nadiad, Mehsana, Himatnagar, Surat and Bulsar respectively of Baroda division and 488.7, 596.7, 549.9 mm at Amreli, Bhavnagar and Surendranagar respectively of Rajkot division, which are above the normal.

*Post-Monsoon rains.*—The post monsoon rain recorded was 15.2, at Nadiad in Kaira district of Baroda division, which was below the normal while it was 77.0, 25.0, 82.3, 51.8, 80.6, 108.2, 60.9, 61.6, 68.8 mm at Ahmedabad, Palanpur, Baroda, Broach, Ahwa, Godhra, Himatnagar, Surat and Bulsar respectively of Baroda Division and 45.6, 140.3, 120.5, 69.9, 90.7 mm at Bhavnagar, Jamnagar, Junagadh, Rajkot and Surendranagar respectively of Rajkot Division, which was above normal. No post-monsoon rain was recorded in Mehsana during the year under report.

*Winter rains.*—The winter rain was recorded 2.5, 2.0 mm at Jamnagar and Bhuj respectively of Rajkot Division, which was below normal.

*Total Rainfall for the season 1963-64.*—The total rainfall for the season 1963-64 was 608.3, 1757.3, and 955.1 mm. at Palanpur, Dangs, and Godhra respectively of Baroda division and 280.2, 690.2, 205.2 and 504.7 mm at Jamnagar, Junagadh, Bhuj and Rajkot respectively of Rajkot division. At these places total rainfall was below the normal. It was 1005.0, 1036.3, 893.9, 991.5, 786.2, 1008.6, 1220.0 and 3161.9 mm at Ahmedabad, Baroda, Broach, Nadiad, Mehsana, Himatnagar, Surat and Bulsar respectively of Baroda division and 515.9, 648.1, and 640.6 mm at Amreli, Bhavnagar and Surendranagar of Rajkot division. The total rainfall at these places was above normal.

*Rajkot division.*—The monsoon during the year 1963-64 was not uniform so far as the onset of monsoon is concerned. The first showers of season were received in the second fortnight of June in Amreli, Bhavnagar, Surendranagar, Junagadh and Rajkot districts while in Jamnagar and Kutch districts the first showers were received in the first fortnight of July. The rains being sufficient for sowing in Bhavnagar, Jamnagar, Amreli, Junagadh and some part of Rajkot districts, the sowing operation was immediately started and was almost completed in the first fortnight of July. In Surendranagar and Jamnagar districts, the rainfall was not uniform and adequate and hence sowing was delayed upto the end of August. In some places of Surendranagar district resowing of cotton crop had to be done.

In Jamnagar and Kutch districts rains being inadequate the yield of crops like Bajri, Cotton and Groundnut were affected adversely.

Unseasonal rains in the month of November were received to some extent throughout the division, which damaged the harvested produce of kharif crops lying in the threshing yards. It also affected standing cotton crop of early varieties, while it proved beneficial for the late varieties of Cotton and rabi crops. In the second fortnight of January, there was severe cold wave and reports of frost damaging Cotton, Brinjals, Chillies and Castor crops were received from various parts of the division.

The attack of aphids in groundnut crop was reported from Amreli and Junagadh districts. Attack of striga on Sugarcane crop was noticed in Kodinar taluka of Amreli district. Coconut trees were affected by the black headed caterpillar in Una taluka and the attack of Ballworm on cotton crop was noticed in the month of January in Junagadh district. Timely measures were taken in these districts of the division against insects and pests.

On the whole, the year was a complete failure in Jamnagar and Kutch districts and some parts of Rajkot and Surendranagar districts where scarcity condition had to be declared.

*Baroda Division.*—Regular monsoon commenced in the second fortnight of June and it rained more or less evenly throughout the division till the end of first fortnight of July. At many places sowing was delayed upto to first week of July. From the middle of July there was a dry spell of about 10 to 15 days. By the end of July sowing operation for almost all kharif crops was completed except in Panchmahals district.

As the rains were late, transplanting of paddy had to be postponed at many places and in these areas the cultivations had to switch on to some other suitable crops. There were heavy rains on 6th and 7th July in some talukas of Bulsar district resulting in washing away of even paddy seedling and the transplanting had to be done again. During the month of August and first fortnight of September, there was uniform and sufficient rain resulting good start and growth of all crops. Thereafter there was day spell of about 30 days. Due to long dry spell of one month, paddy suffered and yield was adversely affected cultivators having necessary facilities had irrigated paddy crop. Transplanting of tobacco was completed by the end of August as favourable weather had prevailed, Aphids, trouble on groundnut was reported. Inadequate rains in middle of September, had also affected setting of new pods in groundnut crops.

The rainfall in the first fortnight of September, helped the Rabi crops. In some parts of Baroda division, rains was received in the second fortnight of October which had adversely affected the quality of Paddy, Bajri, erect type of Groundnut etc. while it helped the late varieties of paddy, Spreading type of Groundnut, cotton and rabi crops.

In the month of January severe cold wave advances affected crops like tobacco, cotton, tur, castor, cumin, chillies, banana and green vegetables resulting in heavy losses to cultivators.

During month of July and September, when there were heavy rains, low lying areas on the bank of rivers were affected to some extent. Cotton crop in Dholka taluka was badly affected. No serious trouble of flood was reported from any other part of the division.

No serious epidemic pests and diseases were reported during the period under report. However, pests and diseases, reported during the year under report are discussed here below—

Attack of Gujarat hairy cater piller was reported on crops like bajri, maize, paddy, cotton during the month of July in the part of Waghodia, Savli, Baroda, Jambugam and Sankheda talukas of Baroda district and Mehsana, Chanasma, Vijapur, Visnagar, Kadi and Kalol talukas of Mehsana district. The damage was negligible and all necessary control measures were taken in time.

Trouble of white grubs was reported on groundnut in some of the area of Kaira and Mehsana districts.

Incidence of spotted and pink ballworms was noticed over Gujarat with in varying intensity. But the damage was not very serious. Ergot was noticed on bajri crop in some parts of Kheralu taluka of Mehsana district, but damage reported was negligible. Blight on cumin was also reported in some parts of Mehsana district and damage caused due to this disease was from 5 to 10%. On the whole, the Agricultural year can be classed as fair.

## CHAPTER II

### CLASSIFICATION OF AREA

*(Table II)*

*Villages.*—The total number of villages reported in the state during the year under report was 19056, the same was reported as 19017 villages in census 1961.

*Area.*—The geographical area of state territories was 462310 acres, while reporting area for land utilization purpose was 457954 acres.

Out of this reporting area for land utilization purpose, the net cropped area during the year 1963-64, was 232602 acres *i.e.* 50.8% of the reporting area. This is 1.12% less than that of last year during which it was 235230 acres. The gross cropped area (*i.e.* the sum of net cropped area and the area sown more than once), was 244308 acres. This showed a decrease of 2218 acres and the percentage decrease works out to be 0.90%. During the previous year the gross cropped area was 246526 acres.

The Barren and unculturable land accounted for 24.7% of the reporting area during 1963-64 *i.e.* the area under barren and unculturable land was 113109 acres, showing a decrease of 0.47% over the previous year (this decrease is due to reason of classifying the same area under forest and land put to non-agricultural uses). This area in previous year was 113644 acres. The area under forest was 38959 acres which was 8.5% of the reporting area showing decrease of 0.35% of the reporting area over the previous year. In the previous year it was 39094 acres (this increase of 8.5% in the forest is due to forest area reported as given by the Chief conservator of forest). The area under land put to non-Agricultural uses increased from 12559 acres in the year 1962-63 to 12711 acres in the year 1963-64. The percentage increase works out to 1.21%. The area under permanent pasture and other works grazing land declined from 24962 acres in the year 1962-63 to 24692 acres in the year 1963-64. This, thus showed a decline of 1.08% while current follows showed an abnormal increase

from 11403 acres in the year 1962-63 to 15836 acres in the year 1963-64. The percentage increase is 38.88%. While the acreage under Barren and unculturable land, culturable waste land, land under miscellaneous tree crops and groves not included in the area sown and other fallowes land showed a decrease by 1.47%, 4.35%, 2.05% and 6.29 % respectively as compared to the area under these classes during previous year.

The area not available for cultivation which is the sum of land put to non-agricultural uses and Barren and unculturable land declined from 126203 acres in the year, 1962-63 to 125820 acres in the year 1963-64. The percentage decrease is 0.9%. This decrease in area not available for cultivation is due to the fact that some area under forest which was wrongly classified in this class has been restored to the proper class.

The area under other unculturable land which is the sum of Permanent pasture and other grazing land, land under miscellanious tree crops and groves not included in the net area sown and culturable waste land, has decreased from 40019 acres to 39110 acres in the year 1963-64. The decrease has been of the order of 2.3.%

The area under fallow land which is the sum of fallow land, other than current fallows and current fallow has increased from 17408 acres in the year 1962-63 to 21463 acres in the year 1963-64. The percentage increase in area under this class is 23.29%.

## CHAPTER III

### IRRIGATED AREA

*Sources of Water Supply.*—The sources of water supply are shown in Table III-A and summary table 'B'. During the year 1963-64 the No. of canals has been reported as 285, thus showing an increase of 1.4%. The mileage has also subsequently increased from 1397 to 1500 miles. The percentage increase is 7.4% over the previous year. While the No. of private canals and its mileage remains same as the last year. The main source of irrigation in Gujarat state is wells which accounts for more than  $\frac{3}{4}$  of the total irrigated area. The No. of wells reported were 451191 during the year 1963-64, while during 1962-63 the no. of wells reported was 436125. Thus the no. of wells has increased by 3.5%. The No. of oil engines was 67535 during the year under report. It has increased by 31.1% as compared to last year.

*Area irrigated by Well, Government canals and by tanks*  
was 79.8%, 13.5%, 2.6% respectively.

*Area irrigated.*—During the year under report only 7.5% of the total cropped area was irrigated. Total gross area irrigated has increased by 6.2% during the year under report.

Out of total gross irrigated area, food crops covered 12.2 lakh acres. Thus food crops accounted for 66.4% of the total irrigated area. While non-food crops covered 6.1 lakh acres i.e. 33.6%. Out of total gross irrigated area Paddy covered 9.1% wheat 25.0%, Jowar 7.4%, and Cotton 19.3% of the irrigated area.

Out of the total—irrigated area under food crops paddy covered 13.7%, wheat 37.8% and Jowar 11.1% while out of total irrigated area under non-food crops cotton covered 57.6% of the area.

As regards individual irrigated crops paddy constituted 12.5% wheat 43.0%, Jowar 3.5%, tobacco 14.2% and cotton 8.2% of the total irrigated area.

The details of percentage increase or decrease in area irrigated and area irrigated under different crops in comparison to area irrigated under food crops and non-food crops and also gross irrigated area is shown in summary table-C-1.

## CHAPTER IV

### CROPPED AREA

*Total Area under crops.*—During the year 1963-64 gross area of 244.31 lakh acres was sown in the state. This showed a decrease of 0.9% over the previous year. Out of the total sown area of the state an area of 143.25 lakh acres was in the Baroda division. While the remaining area of 101.06 lakh acres was in the Rajkot division.

Out of total gross cropped area food grain crops accounted for an area of 121.81 lakh acres. This works out to 49.9% of the gross cultivated area, which showed an increased of 7.8% over the previous year. The total food crops accounted for an area of 126.46 lakh acres or 51.8% of the gross cultivated area, which showed an increase of 8.2% over the previous years.

Amongst the food grains paddy accounted for an area of 13.3 lakh acres, wheat 10.6 lakh acres, Jowar 38.7 and Bajri 35.6 lakh acres.

Total cereals during 1963-64 accounted for an area of 110.1 lakh acres while total pulses allotted for an area of 11.7 lakh acres. Gram crop occupied 2.8 lakh acres and Tur crop 2.2 lakh acres. Amongst the principal crops, Rice crop showed a decrease of 1.2% while Wheat and Bajri showed an increase of 18.9% and 3.6% respectively over the previous year. Jowar showed an increase of 19.1% and cereals showed an increase of 9.0% over the previous year. While the area under Pulses crops declined by 2.6%, the area under Gram has increase by 20.1% and Tur by 0.8% over the previous year.

Table below shows the area under food and non-food crops in the two divisions of the state.

From the above table it can be seen that the area under food crops has increased in both the divisions during 1963-64 over that of 1962-63. The over all increase in respect of area under food crops was 8.2%.

The area under non-food crops during 1963-64 was 117.9% lakh acres. This area has declined in both the divisions. The over all decrease in area under non-food crops was 9.1%.

The area under cotton crop has decreased from 43.11 lakh acres to 43.08 lakh acres. Thus the area under crop has declined by 0.1% while the area under groundnut crop decreased from 57.93 lakh to 45.64 lakh acres. Thus there has been substantial fall of 21.2% over the previous year in the area under groundnut crop.

The area under total oilseeds crops thus decreased from 63.4 lakh acres to 51.7 lakh acres and its decline was 18.5%. Area under Drugs and Narcotics has increased by 3.9% while area under fodder crops decreased by 0.6%. The area under miscellaneous non-food crops has decreased by 13.5% over the previous year.

The observations in respect of major crops are given below :—

*Rice.—In Mehsana district rain received during the month of July was sufficient which facilitated the completion of transplanting of paddy in the begining of the month of August. In Kaira district transplanting of Paddy a was carried out from middle of July to middle of August. Due to heavy rains during the 2nd week of September, there were heavy floods in all rivers and the Khari river which passes through the heart of Paddy growing area of Mehmedabad and Matar talukas, caused considerable damage to Paddy crop. The attack of army worms was noticed on paddy area of Mehmedabad and Matar talukas of Kaira district. In Dangs district, sowing of paddy was started in the middle of July and the transplanting of Paddy was started in 2nd week of August and continued upto the end of August. Due to inadequate rainfall paddy crop was adversely affected resulting in low yield in Dangs district.*

In Panchmahals district even though onset of monsoon was rather late the condition of the Paddy crop was normal. In Surat and Bulsar districts transplanting of Paddy commenced in 1st week of July and continued upto 3rd week of August. There were heavy rains on 6th and 7th July 1963 in Southern part of Surat district, particularly in Bulsar, Umbergaon, Pardi and Dharampur talukas which resulted in Washing out of paddy seedlings and hence some cultivators had to repeat transplanting of paddy crop. In Broach district unseasonal rainfall during the last week of November, 1963, affected the late grown paddy. In Baroda district the condition of paddy crop was good, except slight attack of army worms which did not result in sizeable damage. At the state level the area of the crop was 13298 acres during the year 1963-64 which was less than the corresponding figure of the preceding year viz. 13457 acres. The area under paddy declined by 1.2% over that of previous year. While the production of paddy crop increased from 3939 to 4911 tons registering an increase of 24.7% over that of previous year.

*Wheat.*—In Kaira district the late rains however proved beneficial to ensuring crop of dry wheat in the Bhal tract of Cambay taluka and the yield of dry Bhal wheat was quite satisfactory. The condition of wheat crop was reported good in Baroda and Bhavnagar districts. In Mehsana district sowing of dry and irrigated wheat was completed before the end of October and harvesting was completed in the month of April. In Surendranagar and Junagadh districts due to inadequate rains area under wheat suffer a set back. In other districts the condition of wheat crop was reported normal. At the state level, the area and out turn of wheat crop were 10628 acres and 357 tons respectively, during the year 1963-64 while the corresponding figure of the preceding year were 8939 acres and 2754 tons respectively. Thus both area and production registered an increase of 18.9% and 29.7% respectively.

*Kharif Jowar.*—In Surendranagar district the condition of Kh. jowar crop was reported poor due to inadequate rainfall. In Junagadh district Kh. Jowar crop was affected to some extent due to two to three dry spell in the monsoon season. In Kutch district kharif Jowar under rainfed area mostly failed due to scanty rains. In Surat and Bulsar districts due to unusual rains in the month of August and September,

the crop of Kh. Jowar was some what adversely affected which resulted in reduction in out-turn in some extent. At the state level area under Kh. jowar was 34200 acres during the year 1963-64 which was higher than the corresponding figure of the preceeding year viz. 27841 acres. Thus it registered an increase of 22.8% while the production actually decreased from 3141 tons to 2764 tons, registering a decline by 12.1% over the previous year.

*Rabi-Jowar.*—In most of the districts of Gujarat State the effect of last rains in the month of September, and in some parts in October, proved benificial to the Rabi-jowar. At the state level area under Rabi-jowar was 4508 acres during the year 1963-64, which was less than the corresponding figure of the proceeding year viz. 4657 acres, thus it declined by 3.2% but the production of Rabi-jowar crop increased from 1276 to 1449 tons registering and increase by 13.6% over the previous year.

*Bajri.*—In Jamnagar and Kutch district due to inadequate rains, yield of Bajri was affected adversely. In Mehsana district due to heavy rainfall in the mont hof September, Bajri cropw hich was ready for harvest, got damaged to some extent in almost all the talukas except Harij and Sami talukas and a mild attack of Eargot disease was reported on this crop in Kheralu taluka. On the whole, the crop condition was good most of the districts of the state. The area and out-turn of Bajri crop increased from 34353 acres and 5286 tons to 35583 acres and 7621 tons or by 3.6 % and 44.2%, respectively during the year under report.

*Maize.*—Rainfall was not uniform and adequate and hence the crop suffered to some extent, resulting in low yield of the crop. At the state level, the area has slightly increased from 5719 acres to 5748 acres, thus showing a marginal increase of 0.5%, while the outturn decreased from 2799 tons to 2484 tons registering a decline by 11.3% in comparison to the previous year.

*Ragi.*—This crop is mainly grown in Baroda division, At the state level area and production slightly decreased from 1628 acres and 588 tons during the previous year to 1622 acres and 571 tons. The decline by 0.4% and 2.9% respectively during the year under report is of marginal nature.

*Gram*.—In most of the districts of Gujart state, the effect of the last rain, received in the months of September and October proved beneficial to gram crop. The area and out turn went up from 2349 acres and 430 tons during the previous year to 2821 acres and 602 tons.

Thus the area and production both registered an increase to the extent of 20.1% and 40.0% respectively over the previous year.

*Cotton*.—In Mehsana district, due to Frost about 40% of the Cotton crop was affected. At the same time attack of spotted ballworm and pink ball worm was also noticed in Kalol taluka of the district resulting in damage to the crop to some extent. In Junagadh district due to extreme cold spell in the month of January, 1964 the crop suffered resulting in lowering of the production by about 3% while in Surat and Bulsar districts, the damage to the crop of cotton varied from 2 to 5%. In Kaira district cotton crop area was affected due to heavy frost to the extent of 80% during the month of January. In Baroda district cotton crop was sown in June as usual, Initially crop was growing vigourously however, due to dryspell during the middle of July, crop suffered to some extent. In Sabarkantha district frost adversely affected the cotton crop. In Broach district an attack of spotted ballworm in Cotton was noticed. In general severe cold waves during January 1964 affected the cotton crop in the state. The area and out turn of the state declined from 43111 acres and 16424 bales during previous year to 43015 acres and 13426 bales. Thus the decline was of the order of 0.1% and 18.3% respectively during the year under report.

*Groundnut*.—In Mehsana district, attack of Groundnut grubs and aphids on groundnut crop were noticed with the result, about 5 to 8% of the crop was damaged. In Kaira district, Aphids and white grubs were reported on groundnut in Kapadvanj taluka of the district. In Bhavnagar district, aphids and Tikka disease were noticed on groundnut crop to more or less extent in most of the talukas of the district. In Jamnagar district inadequate and irregular rain affected the yield per acre adversely. In Panchmahals district the aphids trouble was observed in the month of August, 1963, but damage was not of serious nature. Unseasonal rains received in November proved

determental to the spreading variety of groundnut. In Surat and Bulsar districts, an attack of aphids on groundnut was reported and heavy rains in November, 1963 damaged the groundnut crop at harvesting stage. In Amreli district Tikka disease was noticed on groundnut crop. On the whole the season can be termed normal baring few pockets having some pests and disease trouble for the groundnut crop. At the State level, area decreased from 57931 acres to 45642 acres while output increased from 11485 tons to 12466 tons. Thus even though the area under groundnut crop declined by as much as about 21.2% the production was higher by 8.5%.

#### **Yield per acre :**

During the year under report, districtwise crop estimation surveys were conducted on the principal crops viz., Paddy, Kh. Jowar, Rabi-jowar, Wheat, Bajri, Maize, Kodra, Gram, Cotton, Groundnut and Tobacco and the estimated yield per acre was 827, 181, 720, 753, 480, 968, 775, 478, 122, 612 and 8.38 lbs. respectively.

*Kharif crops.*—The estimated yield per acre of Kh. crops based on the crop estimation surveys are given below :—

From the table given above it can be seen that for Rice, the average yield/acre of the State increased from 656 lbs. to 827 lbs. *i. e.* by 26.1%. This increase, was noticed in both the divisions. In Baroda division it increased from 656 lbs. /acre in 1962-63 to 826 lbs/acre in 1963-64, while in Rajkot division it increased from 635 lbs/acre to 859 lbs/acre. The increase in yield/acre in Baroda and Rajkot division was of the order of 25.9% and 35.5% respectively. In case of Kh. Jowar, the average yield/acre of the State showed a decline from 253 lbs. to 181 lbs. Thus it declined by 28.5%. This decrease was noticed only in Baroda division, where it decreased from 476 lbs. to 298 lbs. The decrease was of the order of 37.4 % while in Rajkot Division it increased from 95 lbs. to 116 lbs. registering an increase of 22% during the year under report at the State level. The average yield/acre of Bajri showed an increase of 39.1% increasing from 345 lbs. in 1962-63 to 480 lbs. in 1963-64. The increase noticed in Baroda and Rajkot divisions was from 398 lbs. and 279 lbs. in 1962-63 to 514 lbs. and 438 lbs. or 29.1% and 57.0% respectively during the year under report.

The average yield/acre of Tur and Sesamum (based on the anna estimation *i. e.* traditional method by revenue department) for the two divisions of the State are shows below :—

The average yield/acre of Tur crop showed an increase from 446 lbs. to 458 lbs. or by 2.7% during the year under report. Tur is grown only in Baroda division. In case of Sesamum crop the average yield of the State showed a decrease of 10.2%. The yield/acre of sesamum crop declined from 187 lbs. in 1962-63 to 168 lbs. in 1963-64. The decrease was

mainly noticed in Rajkot division from 150 lbs./acre in 1962-63 to 124 lbs./acres in 1963-64. The percentage decrease was 17.39%. It increased in Baroda division from 236 lbs./acre in 1962-63 to 245 lbs. per acre. Thus it increased by 3.8% during 1963-64 over that of previous year.

*Rabi crops.*—The estimates of average yield/acre at State level and its two divisions of the State for Rabi crops based on crop estimation surveys are shown in the table below :—

From the table given above it can be seen that in the year 1963-64 the State average yield/acre in case of wheat crop increased by 9.0%. It increased from 690 lbs. in 1962-63 to 753 lbs./acre during the year 1963-64. The increase however was noticed in Baroda division only, where it increased from 642 lbs. in 1962-63 to 747 lbs. i. e. by 16.4% during the year under report. While it declined in Rajkot division from 801 lbs./acre in 1962-63 to 770 lbs./acre in 1963-64. Thus it declined by 3.9% in Rajkot division during the year under report. In case of Rabi-jowar, the average yield/acre at the State level registered an increase of 17.3% increasing from 614 lbs/acre in 1962-63 to 720 lbs./acre in 1963-64. This increase was noticed in both the division of the State.

The estimated average yield/acre of Gram crop for the State increased from 410 lbs. in 1962-63 to 478 lbs. registering an increase of 16.6 % during the year 1963-64. It increased from 409 lbs. in 1962-63 to 480 lbs. i.e. by 17.3% in Baroda division and from 417 lbs. in 1962-63 to 465 lbs. i. e. by 11.5% in Rajkot division in 1963-64. The average yield/acre of Rape and Mustard at the State level, increased slightly from 453 lbs. in 1962-63 to 454 lbs. during the year under report. It decreased from 456 lbs. in 1962-63 to 455 lbs. in Baroda division while it increased from 269 lbs/acre in 1962-63 to 280 lbs./acre in Rajkot division in 1963-64. Thus it decreased by 0.2% in Baroda division and increased by 4.1% in Rajkot division.

*Cotton, Sugarcane and Tobacco.*—The estimated average yield/acre of Cotton (Lint) and Tobacco (based on C.E.S.) and Sugarcane (Gul) (based on anna estimation figures of Revenue Department) are shown in the table given below :—

The average yield/acre of Cotton (Lint) at the State level recorded an decrease from 149 lbs/acre in 1962-63 to 122 lbs./acre during the year 1963-64. Thus the yield/acre in case of Cotton crop declined by 18.1% decreasing from 175 lbs. in 1962-63 to

132 lbs. declining by 24.6% in Baroda division. While in Rajkot division it increased from 84 lbs./acre in 1962-63 to 101 lbs./acre registered an increase by 20.2% in the year 1963-64. The average yield/acre of Sugarcane (Gul) at the State level recorded an increase from 4921 lbs/acre in 1962-63 to 5036 lbs/acre in 1963-64. Thus it registered an increase of 2.3% only. It decreased in Baroda division from 5182 lbs. in 1962-63 to 5047 lbs. in the year 1963-64 declining by 2.6% while it increased in Rajkot division from 4759 lbs/acre in 1962-63 to 5029 lbs/acre. Thus in Rajkot division yield/acre in case of Sugarcane crop (Gul) registered an increase of 5.7%. The average yield/acre in case of Tobacco crop at the State level recorded a decrease from 931 lbs/acre in the year 1962-63 to 838 lbs/acre, it declined by 10% during the year 1963-64. Tobacco crop is mainly grown in Baroda division only.

*Cotton.*--During the year 1963-64 the total area and outturn of Cotton crop were 43.08 lakh acres and 13.43 lakh bales as against 43.11 lakh acres and 16.42 lakhs bales respectively, during the preceding year. Thus there was a marginal decrease of 0.1% in respect of area under cotton crop while its outturn declined by as much as 18.2%. The table below gives the total area and outturn of cotton in two divisions and at the State level during the year 1962-63 and 1963-64.

**CHAPTER VI**  
**PRICES**  
*(Table VI)*  
Summary Table--F

Table VI of the report gives the average prices during the harvest period of the principal crops in different districts of the State. At the State level the prices of Agricultural produce of all commodities viz., Rice, Wheat, Jowar, Bajri, Barley, Ragi, Maize, Kodra, Turdal, Gram, Sugarraw (Gul), Cotton, Potatoes, groundnut, Castorseed, Linseed, Rape and Mustard, Sesamum, Tobacco, Ginger, Pepper and Mesta (Ambadi) etc. rules higher during the year under report in comparison with the preceding year.

The behaviour of the average harvest prices of the principal agricultural commodities at the State level and in both the divisions as compared with these of corresponding period of the previous year are summarised below :—

At the State level, the price of Rice (Paddy) was Rs. 9.18 per 20 kg. which was higher by 18.8% than that of the previous year. The prices were higher by 18.9% and 15.9% in Baroda and Rajkot divisions respectively. The price of wheat which was Rs. 13.16 per 20 kgs. was higher by 25.0% as compared with that of the previous year at the State level. The prices were higher by 23.8% and 25.8% in Baroda and Rajkot divisions respectively. The average price of Jowar was Rs. 8.68 per 20 kgs. which was higher by 14.4% at State level. The prices were higher by 17.6% and 14.4% in Baroda and Rajkot divisions respectively. The average prices of Bajri which was Rs. 9.60 per 20 kgs. was higher by 13.2% at the State level. The prices were higher by 23.2% and 12.1% in Baroda and Rajkot divisions respectively. The average price of Maize was Rs. 8.17 per 20 kgs. which was higher by 26.9% at the State level. The average prices of Tur-dal and Gram were on Rs. 14.78 and Rs. 9.84 per 20 kgs., were higher by 29.8% and 23.9% than those of previous year. The increase in price of gram was 23.9% and 47.8% in Baroda and Rajkot divisions respectively. The prices of Cotton (unginned) was Rs. 25.19 per 20 kg. while it ruled higher by 10.3% at the State level. These prices were higher by 11.4% and 11.9% in Baroda and Rajkot

divisions respectively. The average price of Sugar raw (Gul) which was Rs. 20.06 per 20 kgs. was higher by 68.8% at the State level. The average price of potato was Rs. 7.05 per 20 kgs. which was higher by 33.8% at the State level. The average price of Groundnut was Rs. 13.19 per 20 kgs. which was higher by 12.7% at the State level, it was also higher by 5.7% and 12.5% in Baroda and Rajkot divisions respectively. The average price of castorseed was Rs. 12.69 per 20 kgs. which was higher by 9.7% at the State level. The average price of Rape and Mustard which was Rs. 19.13 per 20 kgs. was higher by 18.1% of the State level. The average price of Sesamum which was Rs. 19.21 per 20 kgs. was higher by 14.5% at the State level.

**CHAPTER VII**  
**AGRICULTURAL WAGES**  
*(Table VII)*  
**[Summary Table G]**

According to the Manual of Revenue accounts, Agricultural labour is classified under three categories viz., (a) skilled labour (b) ordinary labour and (c) field labour. Skilled labour comprises of Carpenters, Blacksmiths and Cobbler. Ordinary labour consists of Load carrying coolies, well diggers, masons or carpenter assistants, earth workers etc., while field labour comprises of ploughmen, sowers, harvester, reapers, weeders and transplanters etc. and herdsman whose main work is to collect live-stock from different owners and to feed them in the Jungle during the day and bring them back in the evening to the owner's places.

Table VII of the report gives district-wise figures of wages of different classes of Agricultural labour. On perusal of summary table 'G' it can be seen that during the year under report, the wages of all categories showed a slight upward change. The average rates of wages of Carpenters showed a slight decrease from Rs. 4.86 during the year 1962-63 to Rs. 4.85 during the year under report, that of Cobbler decreased from Rs. 4.08 to Rs. 4.07. The average rates of wages of Blacksmith showed increase from Rs. 4.46 during the year 1962-63 to Rs. 4.51 during the year under report, that of field labour from Rs. 2.00 to Rs. 2.05 while for other Agricultural Labour it increased from Rs. 2.00 to Rs. 2.01 and of herdsmen from Rs. 1.71 to 1.73.

## CHAPTER VIII

### LIVE-STOCK

(*Table VIII*)

[Summary Table H]

Table VIII of this report gives the details of livestock, Poultry and Agricultural machinery and Implements as per quinquennial census of live stock conducted in March, 1961 by the Director, Bureau of economics and statistics, Gujarat State, Ahmedabad, summary Table 'H' gives the total No. of livestock, poultry, Agricultural machinery and implements under each main head.

The number of bovine animals increased from 87,38,976 to 94,73,136 during five years *i. e.* an increase of 8.4% over last quinquennial.

*Cattle*.—There is an increase in the number of cattle from 60,89,415 to 65,56,555 registering an increase of 7.7% over that of the preceding quinquennial census of livestock taken in April, 1956. The no. of breeding bulls over three years went down from 17537 to 14757 *i. e.* registering a decrease of 15.9%. This decline was due to the general tendency to utilise the bulls kept for breeding purposes, for other works also. It is therefore likely that a substantial number of the breeding bulls might have been enumerated as "working bulls" and consequently included in that category. On the other hand the no. of other males over three years recorded an increase from 2714767 to 30,31,118 registering an increase of 11.6%. The no. of breeding cows over three years recorded an increase of 11.5% *i. e.* increased from 1634407 to 1822683 while the No. of other cows over three years went down from 26376 to 14972. This decrease is of the order of 43.2%. The no. of young stock decreased by 1.4% and have gone down from 16,96,328 in 1955-56 to 16,73,025 in 1960-61.

*Buffaloes*.—The total no. of buffaloes increased from 2649561 to 2916581 and thus increased by 10.1% over that of 1955-56.

Breeding bulls over three years increased from 9873 to 10051, the percentage increase was 1.8%. The no. of other

males over three years increased from 19495 to 29945 *i. e.* increased by 53.6%. The no. of breeding buffaloes increased from 1474699 to 1683609 registering an increase of 14.2%. The no. of other buffaloes over three years increased from 14380 to 18768 *i. e.* it increased by 30.5%. The no. of young stock increased by 3.8% from 1131114 to 1174208 over that of 1955-56 census.

*Sheeps and Goats.*—The no. of sheeps decreased from 17,53,880 to 14,81,033 registering a decrease of 15.6%. The no. of goats also decreased from 26,37,706 to 22,23,499 registering a decline of 15.7% as compared with the corresponding number in the year 1955-56.

*Horses and Ponies.*—The total no. of horses and ponies increased from 102060 to 113198 *i. e.* it increased by 10.9%. The number of males over three years decreased from 28269 to 24802 registering a decline of 12.3% from while the no. of females over three years increased by 12.2% *i. e.* from 46223 to 56017. The number of young stock increased by 17.4% *i. e.* from 27568 to 32379 as compared with the corresponding number of the 1955-56 census.

*Mules, Donkeys, Camels and Pigs.*—The number of mules registered an increase from 524 to 842. The number of donkeys decreased from 121805 to 113387 *i.e.*, a decline of 6.9%. The number of Camels increased from 43664 to 44092 while the number of pigs increased from 415 in 1955-56 to 5211.

*Total Livestock.*—The total no. of livestock increased from 1,33,99,030 to 1,34,54,395 registering a marginal increase of 0.4% over that of 1955-56 census.

*Poultry.*—The total no. of poultry increased from 18,59,371 to 20,48,284 registering an increase of 10.2%. The no. of fowls (Hens, Cocks and Chickens) increased from 18,54,211 to 20,36,240. This increase is of the order of 9.8% while the no. of ducks (ducks, drakes and ducklings) increased from 3923 to 5480 increasing by 39.7% over that of 1955-56 census.

*Agricultural Machinery and Implements.*—Since 1955-56 when last census was taken ; the no. of ploughs, carts, sugarcane crushers, oil-engines, electric pumps and tractors increased from

13,27,167 to 15,65,464, 63,23,15 to 70,8767, 3912 to 6,316, 19,097 to 44,992, 1112 to 6,229 and 819 to 2005 respectively. The percentage increases of these items works out to 18.0%, 12.1%, 61.4%, 135.6%, 460.2% and 144.8% respectively. The number ghanies decreased from 5760 to 4100, a decline of 28.8% when compared with the corresponding number of the year 1955-56 census.

---

## CHAPTER IX

### AGRICULTURAL OUT-LOOK

As mentioned in chapter I of the report, the Agricultural season of 1963-64 was on the whole a good one over the greater part of the State. Regular monsoon was started in June, as usual and substantial rainfall was recorded and preparatory tillage of Kharif crops like jowar, bajri, cotton, paddy and maize was in progress. The sowing of kharif crops commenced and remained in progress till the end of August. The condition of the sown crops was reported to be satisfactory throughout the State except Jamnagar and Kutch district. The sowing of Rabi crops like wheat was started in October and continued till December. The condition of crops was reported to be good and satisfactory. On the whole Rabi-sowing was satisfactory except in Jamnagar and Kutch district.

The table below gives comparative idea of the actual acreage sown and the outturn of food grains produced in the State and in each divisions in 1963-64.

It will be seen from the above table that the area under food grains crops in the State had registered an increase from 113.04 lakh acres in the year 1962-63 to 121.81 lakh acres in the year 1963-64. The increase in Baroda division was from 74.42 lakh acres in 1962-63 to 77.38 lakh acres in the year 1963-64, while in Rajkot division it increased from 38.62 lakh acres in the year 1962-63 to 44.43 lakh acres in the year 1963-64. The outturn of foodgrain crops at the State level showed an increase from 22.94 lakh tons in 1962-63 to 26.58 lakh tons during 1963-64.

Thus the increase was noticed in both the divisions of the State.

Live-stock and fodder condition was on the whole satisfactory in Baroda division. In Rajkot division though the condition was generally satisfactory, in Jamnagar and Kutch districts, where the rainfall was inadequate, the condition was below normal.

The table below shows average prices of Agricultural commodities prevailing at harvest time in the year 1962-63 and 1963-64.

The centres mentioned in the above table are the representative markets and accordingly the prices of Agricultural produce in these markets indicate the general trend in the commodities in the State.

The favourable Agricultural condition resulted in the better yield in case of some of the crops. The cost of living had increased with the rise in the prices of grains and foodstuffs in both divisions viz., Rajkot and Baroda. The year can be termed a complete failure from Agricultural point of view for district Jamnagar and Kutch, and some part of Rajkot and Surendranagar districts, where scarcity conditions had to be declared.
