P R E F A C E

Reduction in regional imbalances of educational development is a major objective of the National Policy on Education. To promote this programme, it is necessary to collect statistics of educational development in the different regions of the country periodically and to publish them for information and use by all concerned.

The Ministry of Education publishes annually statistics of educational development in the different States of the Indian Union. But as imbalances of educational development are more pronounced at the district than at the State level, it was decided to collect and publish statistics of educational development in the districts also every five years. Accordingly, such statistics were collected and published, for the first time, for the year 1960-61.

The study is now being repeated for the year 1965-66 and it is proposed to bring out a separate volume on the district educational statistics of every State. It will contain statistics for the year 1965-66 along with comparative data for the year 1960-61. To make inter-district comparisons possible some important indices such as enrolment ratio, percentage of trained teachers, per capita expenditure on education etc., will also be included.

This volume is devoted to the educational statistics of districts in Punjab State. It is based on the data collected from the State Department of Education.

I take this opportunity to express my appreciation of the co-operation and help received from the Director of Public Instruction, Punjab, and other educational authorities in the State and the staff of the Statistics & Information Division which has prepared this report.

I N T R O D U C T I O N

The Ministry of Education publishes the statistics of education in India annually in their publication 'Education in India - Vol.I & Vol.II. These publications give statistics at the National and State levels, but do not provide District-wise statistics.

2. To fill this gap, the National Council of Educational Research and Training brought out a volume entitled 'Educational Statistics - District-wise', giving the bench-mark of educational data of various kinds for all districts for the year 1960-61. To make inter-district comparison possible, some important indices such as, enrolment ratios, percentage of trained teachers and per capita expenditure on education, were also given. These comparative statistics show a wide range of variation between districts in every respect.

3. It has been decided to publish a similar review of educational development in the districts for the year 1965-66. Such periodic reviews are necessary for several reasons. For instance, they will help to judge the effectiveness of the measures taken to remove regional imbalances at the district level. Secondly, such collection and publication of data on different aspects of education at the district level will help in the preparation of educational development plans for the districts so that they can be adopted, as recommended by the Education Commission, as the principal unit for administration, planning and development of school education.

4. This volume gives data for each of the districts of Punjab in respect of population, number of educational institutions, enrolment, teachers, expenditure etc. at all levels of education.

5. The composite State of Punjab was reorganised with effect from 1-11-1966. Some hilly areas were merged with Himachal Pradesh and the State of Haryana was carved out of it. The reorganic

State of Punjab consists of eleven districts. This report has been divided into two parts. While part I gives complete district-wise data relating to 1965-66 alongwith requisite inter-pretation for the eleven district of the reorganised Punjab, part II gives only comparative data for 1960-61 in respect of those districts which were not affected as a result of the reorganisation of the State.

I - S U M M A R Y

The reorganised State of Punjab which has an area of 50,376 sq. kms. and 129.66 lakh of population, consists of eleven districts. In these eleven districts there were 9,205 educational institutions during the year 1965-66. The total enrolment in all types of educational institutions during that year was 18.95 lakhs forming 14.6 per cent of the total population of the districts. The percentage of enrolment receiving primary education to the population of the corresponding age-group 6-11 was 75.2 per cent as compared to the all India average of about 80 per cent. Facilities for Middle School education were provided to 34.3 per cent of the population of the age-group 11-14 as compared to all India average of 30.8.

The total number of teachers employed in all educational institutions was 55,803, of whom 35.7 per cent were women. The average number of teachers per thousand of population was 4.3. The teacher pupil ratio in Primary, Middle and Secondary schools was 1:43, 1:32 and 1:31 respectively.

The total direct expenditure on educational institutions was Rs.1,368.03 lakhs during 1965-66. 75 per cent of this expenditure was met from Government funds.

The per capita expenditure on education (by population) was Rs.10.6. The average annual cost per pupil in Primary schools, Middle schools and Secondary schools was Rs.36.1; Rs.56.1 and Rs.76.3 respectively. The average annual cost per student in arts and science colleges was as high as Rs.351.2

II - AREA AND POPULATION

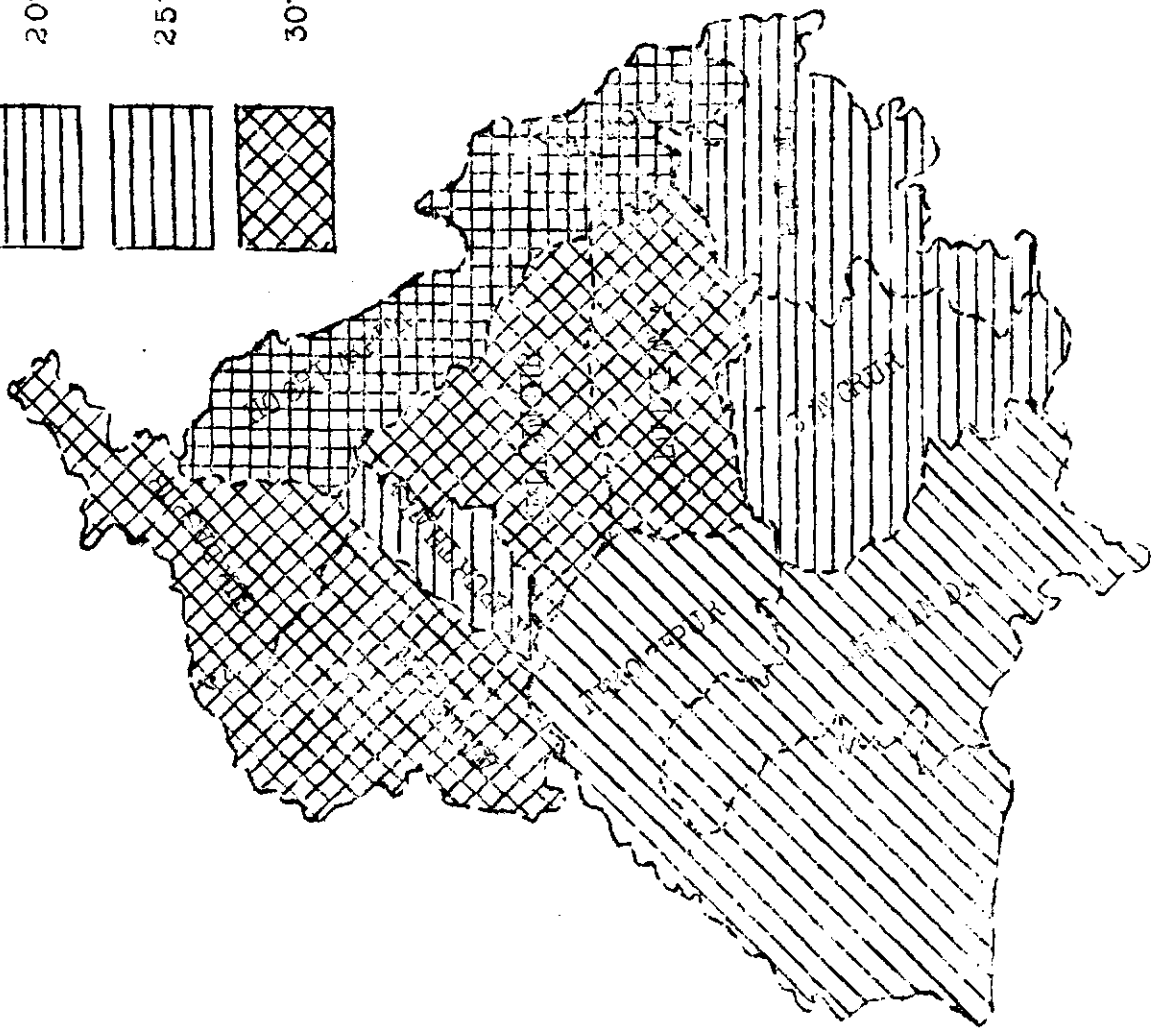
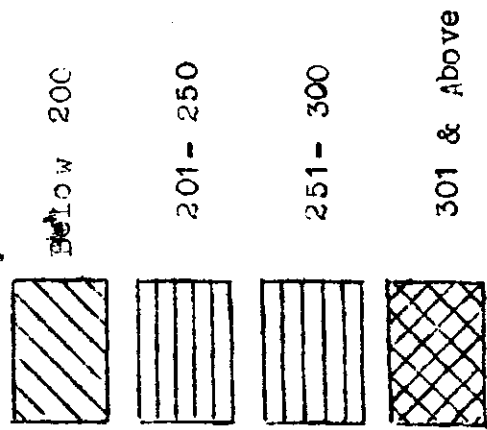
AREA

Punjab State is comprised of eleven districts and has a total area of 50,376 Kms. The area varies from 10,140 Sq. Kms. in Ferozepur to 1,634 Kms. in Kapurthala.

POPULATION

The total estimated population in 1966 was 129.66 lakhs. There were 69.79 lakh males and 59.87 lakh females. The overall density of population per square kilometer for the State was 257 in 1966. The highest density of population per sq. km. was recorded in Jullundur (413 per sq. km.) and the smallest was noted in Bhatinda (178 per sq. km.). The detailed district-wise statistics are given in Statement 'I'.

The total population of the children of the age-group 6-11 in 1966 was 17,73,300 (9,43,600 Boys and 8,29,700 Girls). This constituted 13.7 percent of the total population in the State. The number of children in the age-group 11-14 in 1966 was 9,49,300. This formed 7.3 percent of the population of the State. There were 11,34,600 children in the age-group 14-17 and this was 8.7 percent of the total population in the State. The distribution of the population in the different age-groups; district-wise is given in Statement 'II'.



III - TOTAL NUMBER OF EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, PUPILS, TEACHERS AND EXPENDITURE,
INSTITUTIONS AND ENROLMENT

The total number of educational institutions in Punjab during 1965-66 was 9,205. Ferozepur district had the largest number of institutions with its 1,266 institutions and Kapurthala district had the smallest number of institutions with its 383 institutions. The total enrolment in all types of institutions during the year was 18,95,196 including 24,195 students (20,779 Boys and 3,416 Girls) for which district-wise break-up was not available. Of the total 11,90,571 were Boys and 7,04,625 were Girls. The sex-ratio was 59 Girls for every 100 Boys enrolled in 1965-66. The total enrolment in educational institutions constituted 14.6 percent of the total population. District-wise details are given in Statement 'III'.

TEACHERS AND EXPENDITURE

In 1965-66 there were 55,803 teachers including 2,702 (2,160 Men and 542 Women) teachers of colleges for Professional Education and schools for Vocational and other education for which district-wise break-up was not available. Of the total, 19,896 (35.7%) were women teachers. The average number of teachers per thousand of population was 4.3 in the State.

The total direct expenditure on all types of educational institutions amounted to 13,68,02,758 in 1965-66. Per capita expenditure during this period worked out to Rs.10.6.

Statement IV also shows source-wise distribution of total direct expenditure on educational institutions during the year. It will be seen that 75.1 percent of the total direct expenditure on all educational institutions was met from government funds, 17.2 percent from fees, 0.3 percent from local body funds and the remaining 7.4 percent from other sources.

IV - PRE-PRIMARY EDUCATION

There were only 4 separate recognised pre-primary schools in the State. The enrolment in these schools as well as in the attached pre-primary classes was 766. The number of teachers in pre-primary schools was 9, of which 8 were women teachers. All the teachers were trained. The total annual expenditure on these schools in 1965-66 was Rs.28,011 and the average annual cost per student in these schools was Rs.134.7. Further details are given in Statement 'V'.

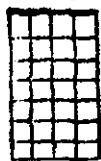
V - PRIMARY EDUCATION

NUMBER OF SCHOOLS

In 1965-66, the number of primary schools in Punjab was 6,947. The area served by primary school on an average was 7.3 sq. kms. District-wise details are given in Statement 'VI'.

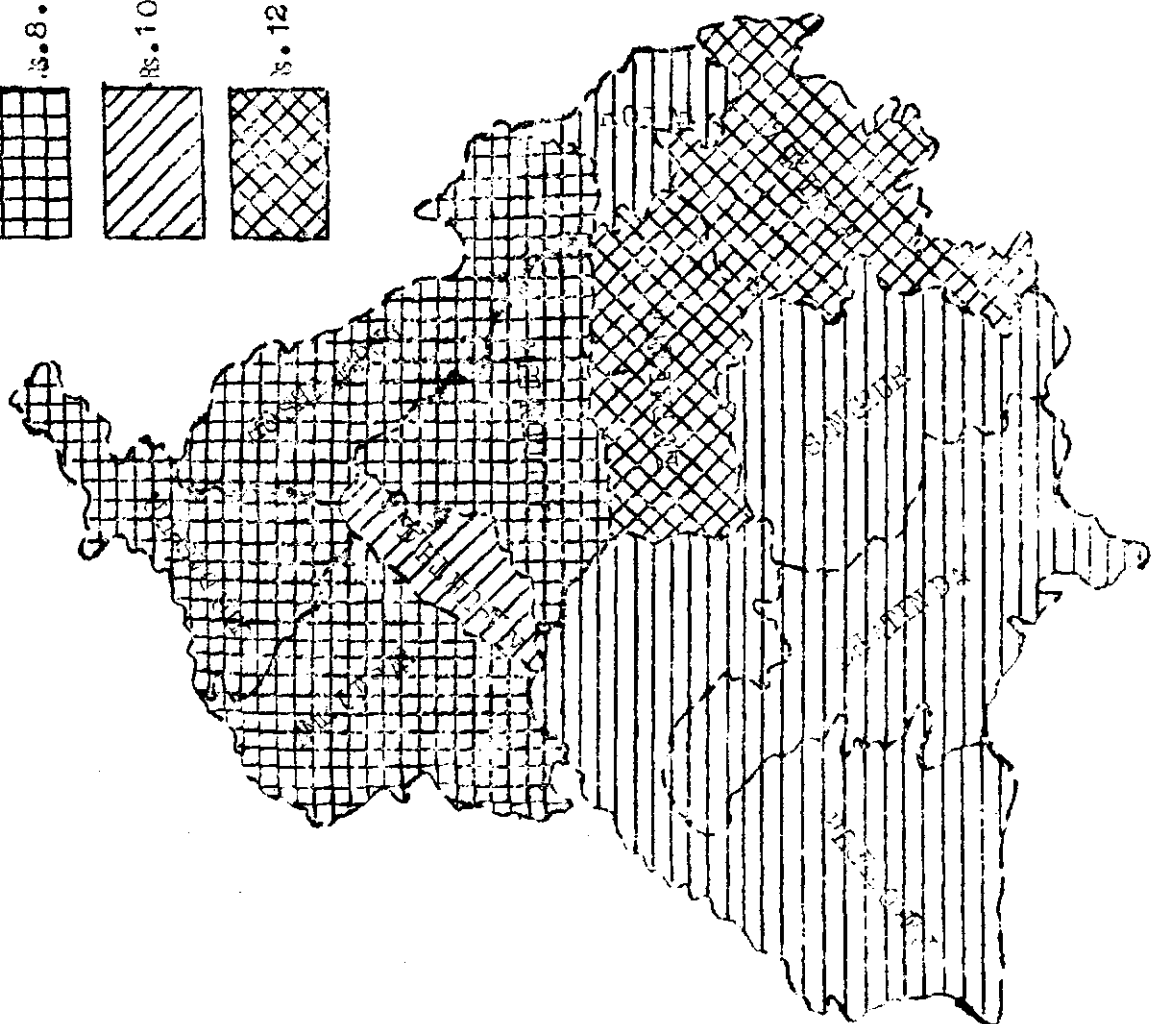

ENROLMENT

The total enrolment in classes I to V during the year 1965-66 in Punjab was 13,34,107. Of this, 7,99,638 were Boys and 5,34,469 were Girls. The percentage of enrolment in classes I to V to the population in the age-group 6-11 was 75.2. The corresponding percentage for Boys was 84.7 and for Girls it was 64.4. District-wise details are given in Statement 'VI'.

Statement 'VII' indicates the enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes children in classes I to V in 1965-66.

There were 2,05,995 Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes students enrolled in 1965-66 in Punjab. Of the total enrolment, 1,43,724 were Boys and 62,271 were Girls. Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribe children formed 15.4 percent of the total enrolment in classes I to V. In the case of Boys the percentage was 18 while in the case of Girls it was 11.7.

TEACHERS

The total number of teachers teaching in Primary schools during the year was 21,757. The percentage of women teachers to the total number of teachers in Primary schools was 36.9. It will be seen from Statement 'VIII', that the percentage of women teachers to the total number of teachers varies from 17.5 (Bhatinda district) to 47.4 (Amritsar district). Of the total number of teachers 97.7 percent were trained. Among Males 98.6 percent were trained and among Females 96.2 percent were trained. The pupil-teacher ratio in Punjab in 1965-66 in primary schools was 43. District-wise details are given in Statement 'VIII'.

EXPENDITURE

The direct expenditure on primary schools in Punjab during the year 1965-66 was Rs.3,35,25,517. It constituted 24.5 percent of the total direct expenditure on education in State. The percapita expenditure on primary schools was Rs.2.6. The average annual cost per student in primary schools in 1965-66 was Rs.36.1. District-wise details are given in Statement 'IX'.

VI - MIDDLE SCHOOL EDUCATION

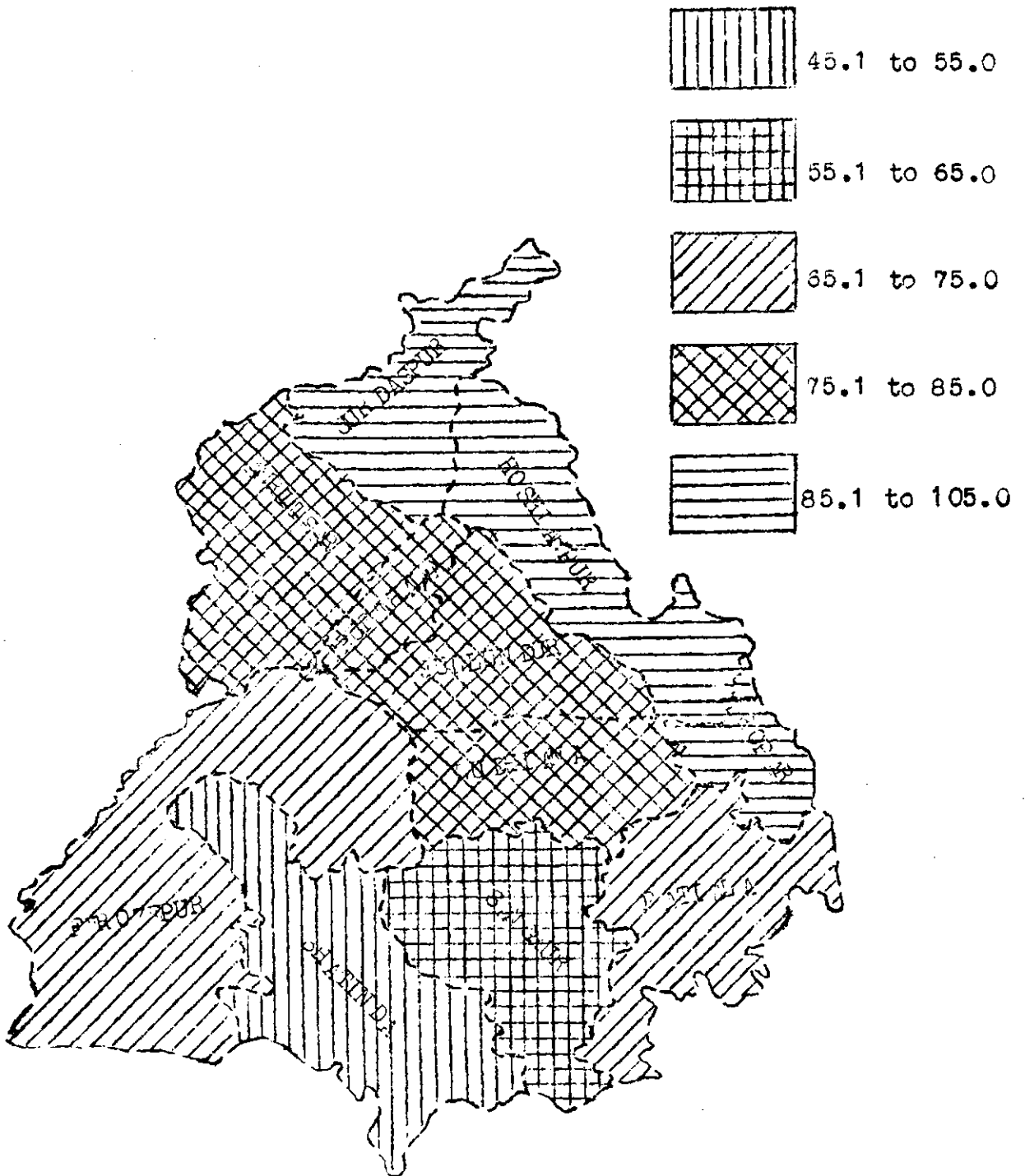
There were 840 Middle schools in Punjab during 1965-66. The area served by a Middle school was 60.0 sq. kms. The population served by a Middle school was 15,436 in 1965-66. Statement 'X' gives the District-wise details.

ENROLMENT

The total enrolment in classes VI-VIII in Punjab in 1965-66 was 3,25,984 of which 1,00,033 were Girls. The enrolment was highest in schools located in Amritsar district (43,949) and was the lowest in Kapurthala district (13,039). The percentage of enrolment in classes VI-VIII to the population in the age-group 11-14 gives an index of the facilities created at the middle stage of education. In Punjab, the percentage of enrolment in classes VI-VIII to the population in the age-group 11-14 was 34.3 (44.6 per cent for Boys and 22.6 percent for Girls). District-wise details are given in Statement 'XI'.

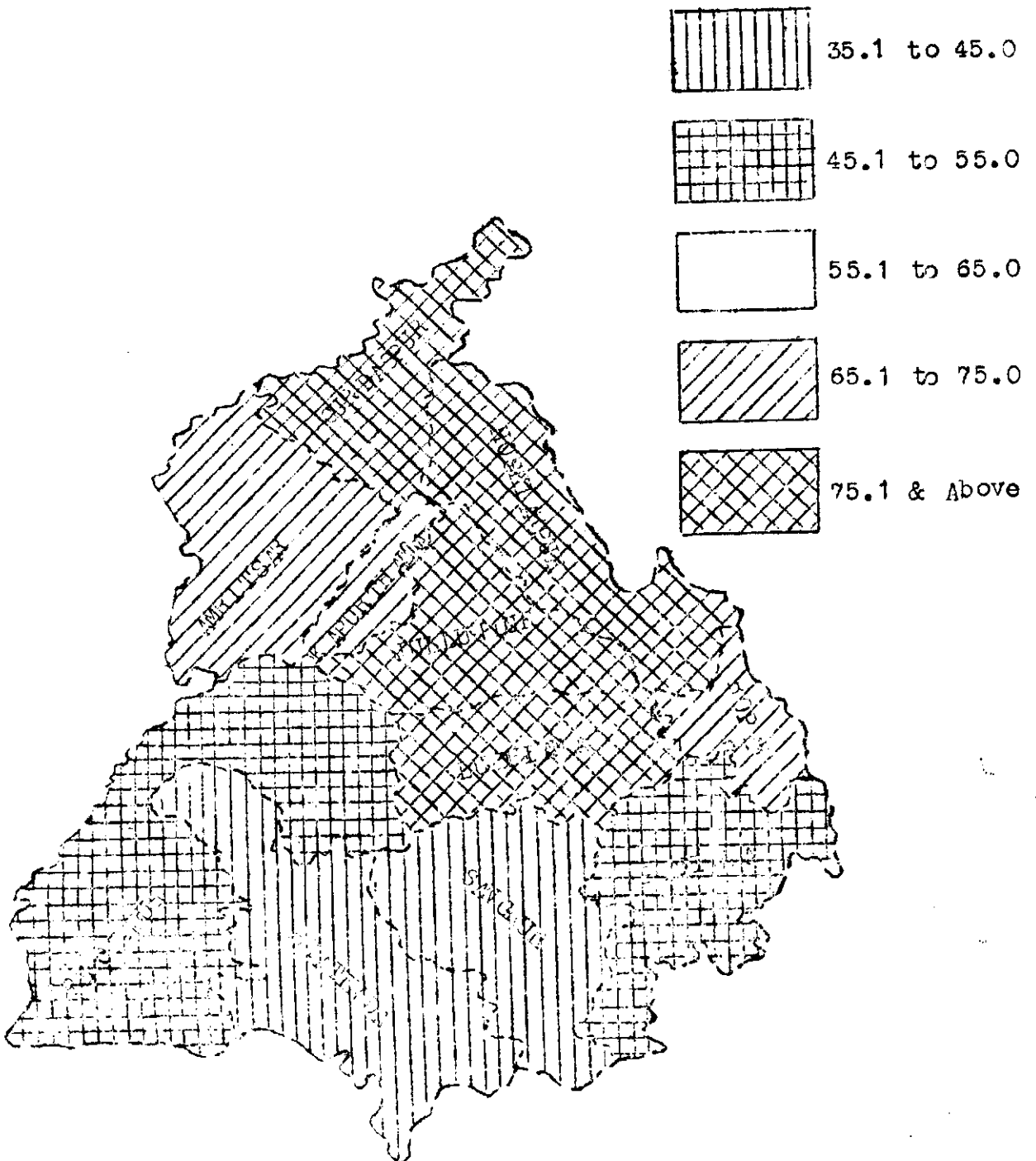

Statement XII gives the enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes children in classes VI-VIII. In 1965-66 there were 36,501 scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students enrolled in classes VI-VIII. Of the total enrolment 31,615 were Boys and 4,886 were Girls. The percentage of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students to the total students enrolled in classes VI-VIII was 11.2. The corresponding percentage for Boys was 14.0 and it was 4.9 for Girls.

TEACHERS

The total number of teachers in Middle schools in Punjab in 1965-66 was 7,964. Of this, 4,600 were Men and 3,364 were Women. At the State level, the percentage of women teachers to total number of teachers in Middle schools was 42.2, 96.1 percent of the total teachers teaching in Middle schools were trained. In the case of Men this percentage was 96.6 and in the case of Women it was 95.4. The pupil-teacher ratio in 1965-66 in the Middle schools was 32. Statement 'XIII' gives the district-wise data.

EXPENDITURE

The total direct expenditure incurred on Middle schools amounted to Rs.1,41,01,204 in 1965-66. The per capita expenditure on Middle schools was Rs.1.1. The cost per student per annum in Middle schools in 1965-66 was Rs.56.1. Statement XIV gives district-wise position.

VII - TRANSFER RATES FROM PRIMARY STAGE TO MIDDLE STAGE

Generally the transfer rate from Primary stage to Middle stage is calculated with the enrolment in classes VI in a particular year as a percentage of enrolment in class V in the previous year. However, since the class-wise enrolment is not available district-wise and also because the district-wise statistics are not available for consecutive years, the transfer rate here has been calculated with the enrolment in classes VI-VIII as percentage of enrolment in classes I-V in the same year. The transfer rates calculated as stated above are given

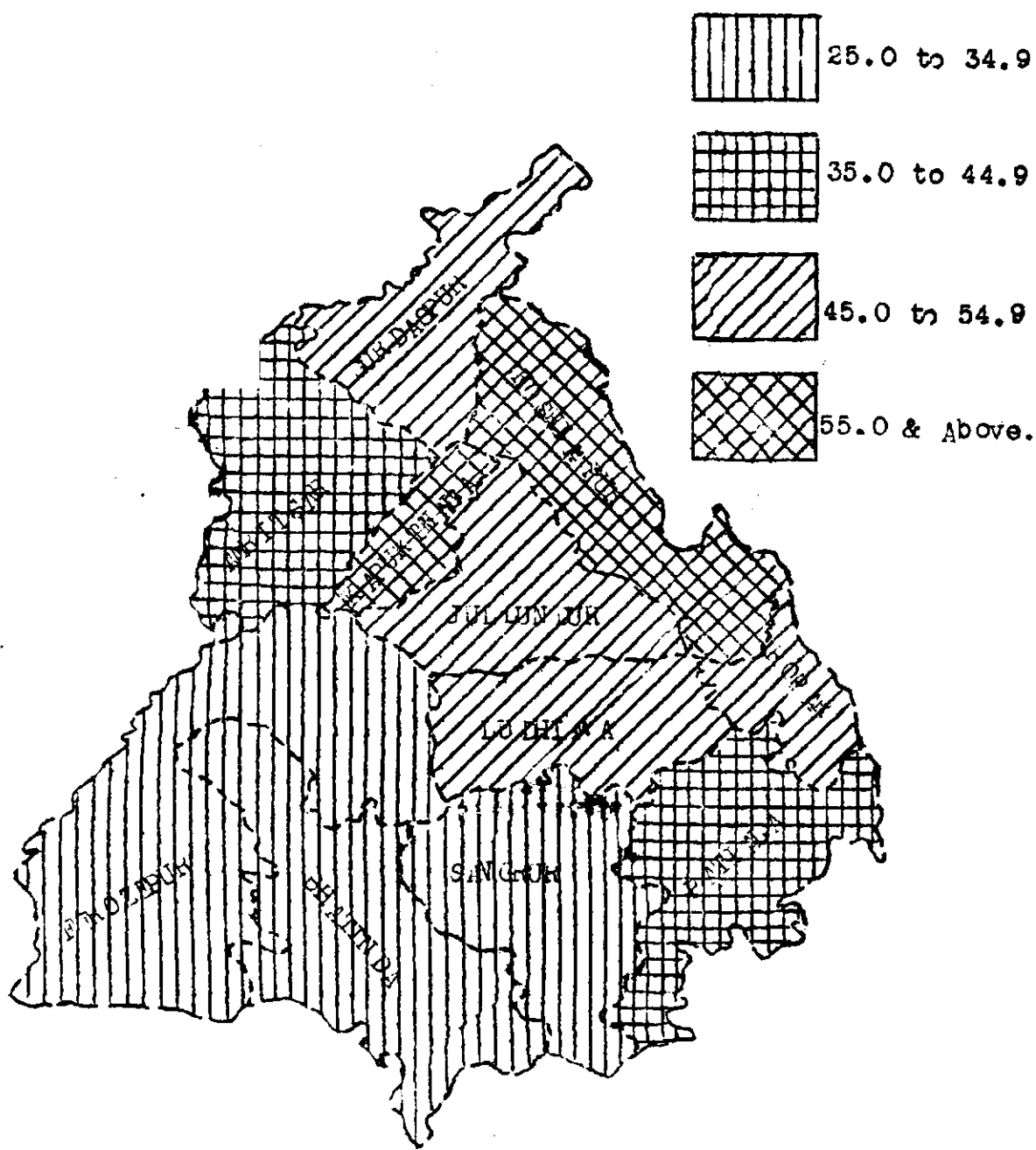

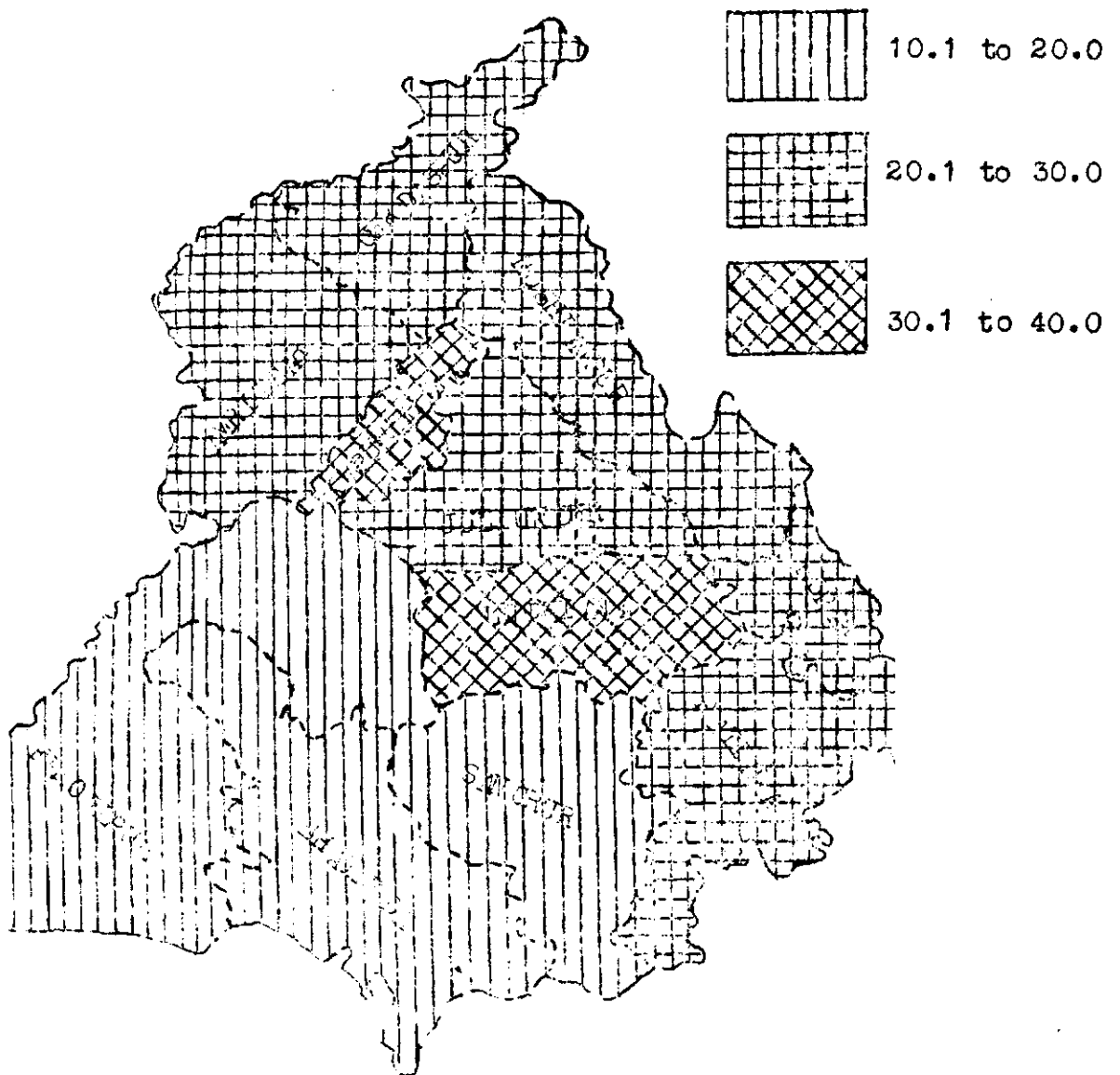

At the State level, the transfer rate from Primary stage to Middle stage was 24.4 percent during 1965-66 for both Boys and Girls together. In the case of Boys, the transfer rate was 28.2 percent and in the case of Girls it was 18.7 percent.

Among the Boys the highest transfer rate (35.4 percent) was Kapurthala district. The lowest transfer rate (23.2 percent) was observed in Ferozepur district. Among the Girls, highest transfer rate (24.1 percent) was in Kapurthala district, and the lowest (16.1 percent) was in Ropar district. Taking both Boys and Girls together, the highest transfer rate (30.8 percent) was in Kapurthala district, the lowest transfer rate (20.7 percent) was in Ferozepur district. At the all India level, the transfer rate was 47.3 percent in the case of Boys, 35.3 percent in the case of Girls and 44.2 percent in the case of both sexes-together.

VIII - HIGH SCHOOL EDUCATION

NUMBER OF SCHOOLS

There were 985 High/Higher Secondary Schools in Punjab in 1965-66. Amritsar district had the highest number of High/Higher Secondary Schools (132) and Ropar district had the smallest number of schools (41). The area in sq. kms. served by a High/Higher Secondary school in the State as a whole was 51.1. The population served by a High/Higher Secondary school in the State was estimated to be 13,163. The district-wise details are given in Statement 'VI'.

ENROLMENT

The total enrolment in classes IX to XI in the State during 1965-66 was 1,51,349. Of this, Girls accounted for 43,729. The percentage of enrolment in classes IX, X and XI to the population in the age-group 14-17 was 13.3. The corresponding percentage for Boys was 17.8 and for Girls it was 8.2. Statement XVI gives district-wise details.

Statement XVII gives the enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes children in classes IX to XI. There were 16,613 Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes students enrolled in classes IX to XI. Of this, 15,020 were Boys and 1,593 were Girls. The percentage of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students to the total enrolment in classes IX to XI was 11.0. In the case of Boys this percentage was 14 and in the case of Girls it was 3.6.

TEACHERS

The total number of teachers teaching in High/Higher Secondary schools during 1965-66 in Punjab was 20,806. Of the total number of teachers, 7,495 were women. 90.7 percent of the total number of teachers were trained. 88.9 percent of the Male teachers and 93.9 percent of the Female teachers were trained. The district-wise position can be seen from Statement XVIII. The pupil-teacher ratio in High/Higher Secondary schools was 31.

EXPENDITURE

The total direct expenditure on High/Higher Secondary schools amounted to Rs. 12,00,00,000 in 1965-66. The per capita expenditure in High/Higher Secondary schools was only Rs. 37 in Punjab. The percentage of total direct expenditure on High/Higher Secondary schools to the total direct expenditure incurred on all types of educational institutions during 1965-66 was 35.5. The cost per student in High/Higher Secondary schools in 1965-66 came to Rs. 76.3. District-wise data is given in the Statement 'XIX'.

IX - TRANSFER RATE FROM MIDDLE SCHOOL STAGE TO HIGHER SCHOOL STAGE

Since the class-wise enrolment at the Middle stage as well as at the Higher secondary stage is not available district-wise, the transfer rate has been calculated with the enrolment in classes IX to XI as percentage of enrolment in classes VI to VIII of the same year. At the State level, taking both Boys and Girls together the transfer rate from Middle stage to Secondary stage for the year 1965-66 was 46.4 percent. The transfer rate in the case of Boys was 47.6 percent and it was 43.7 percent in the case of Girls.

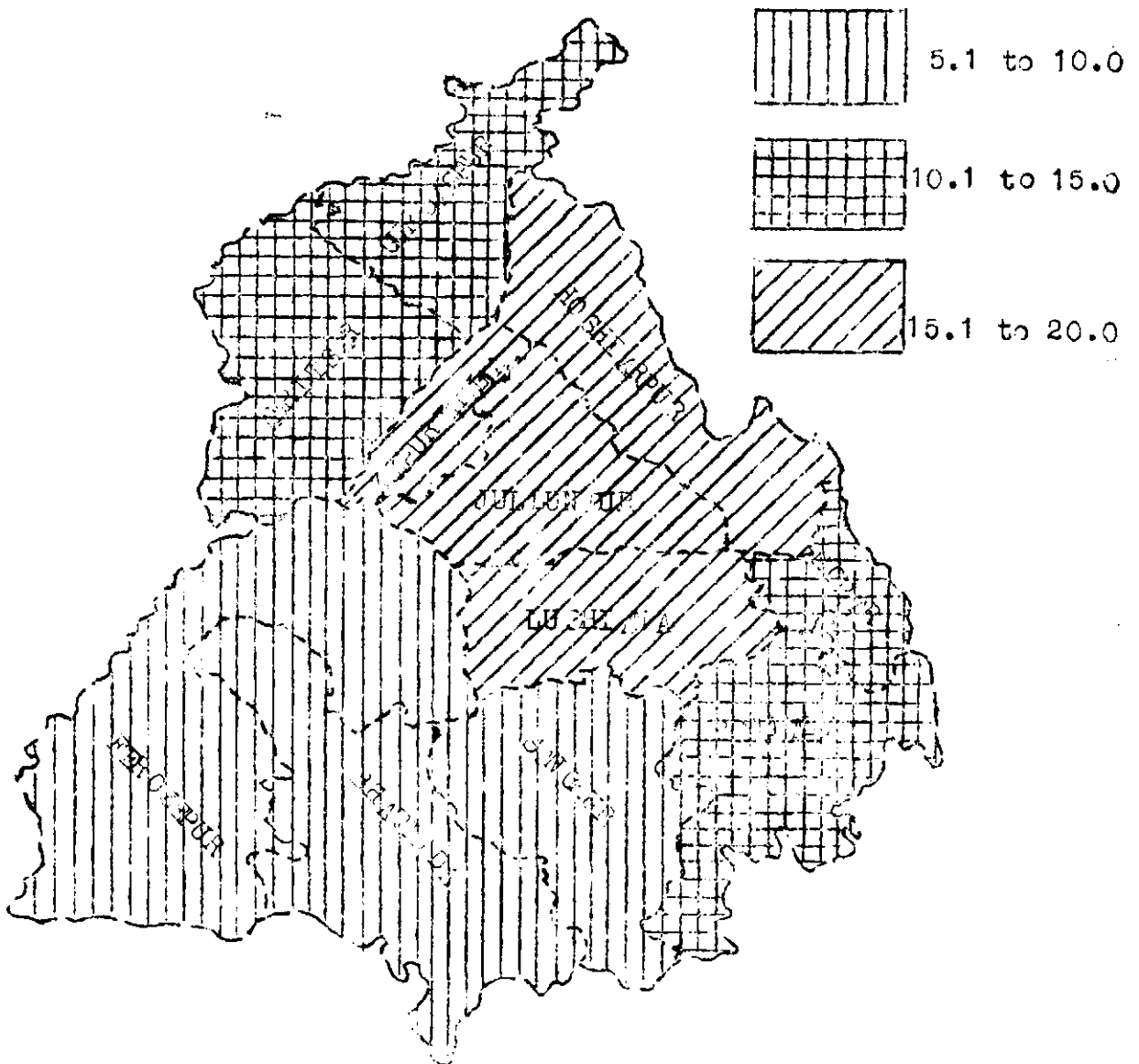

Among the Boys, the lowest transfer rate from Middle stage to High school stage was in Bhatinda district (41.8 percent), followed by Gurdaspur (42.1 percent) and Ferozepur (42.7 percent). The highest transfer rate was observed in Jullundur (51.2 percent) followed by Ludhiana (50.8 percent) and Sangrur (50.8 percent) district. The highest transfer rate for Girls was in Patiala district (51.1 percent) and the lowest transfer rate was in Ropar district (37.3 percent). Taking the both sexes together the highest transfer rate was in Ludhiana (50.8 percent) and the lowest transfer rate was in

Bhatinda (40.5 percent). At the all India level, the transfer rate was 47.3 percent in the case of Boys, 35.3 percent in the case of Girls and 44.2 percent in the case of both sexes taken together.

X - TEACHERS' TRAINING INSTITUTIONS

There were 14 teachers' training institutions of Post-graduate standard and 15 institutions of Under-graduate standard making a total number of teachers' training institutions as 29. The total number of students enrolled in teachers' training institutions of collegiate standard in the State during 1965-66 was 12,507.

XI - VOCATIONAL AND TECHNICAL SCHOOLS

There were only 89 Vocational, Technical schools in Punjab during the year 1965-66, District-wise break-up of these institutions is given in Statement 'XVI'. The total number of students enrolled in these institutions was 11,105. Of this, 9,111 Boys and 1,994 were Girls. The total direct expenditure incurred on these institutions in 1965-66 amounted to Rs. 63,59,718. District-wise details of the enrolment and expenditure relating to these institutions are not available.

XII - HIGHER EDUCATION

NUMBER OF INSTITUTIONS

In 1965-66, the total number of institutions imparting higher education in Punjab was 103. Of these, 2 were Universities, 62 were Arts and Science colleges, 20 were colleges conducting medical courses, 10 Engineering colleges, 29 Teachers' Training colleges, 7 other Professional colleges, and 3 colleges for special education. Every district of the Punjab had one or more Arts and Science college. Except Ropar and Sangrur districts, all the districts had Teachers' training colleges.

ENROLMENT

Besides an enrolment of 3,173 students in polytechnics for which district-wise breakdown is not available the total enrolment in the institutions of higher education in the States in 1965-66 was 57,865. Of this total 2,706 were in University Teaching Departments, 40,473 in Arts and Science colleges, 1,401 in Engineering college, 3,421 in Medical colleges, 6,737 in Teachers' Training college. In other colleges of Professional and Special Education the enrolment was 3,127. It will be seen from the Statement XXIII that there was a large variation in the total enrolment in institutions of higher education as well as in the different types of institutions among the districts.

At the State level, of the total enrolment, 12,246 (9,310 Boys and 2,936 Girls) were enrolled in Pre-University/Intermediate classes; 17,059 (9949 Boys and 7,110 Girls) in B.A. Pass and Hons. course; 9,723 (8,498 Boys and 1,225 Girls) in B.Sc. Pass and Hons. courses; 1,320 (914 Boys and 406 Girls) in Post-Graduate classes; 12,507 (4,857 Men and 7,650 women) in Teachers' Training colleges and 13,198 (11,744 Boys and 1,454 Girls) in other colleges of Professional and Special education. Statement 'XXIV' gives district-wise break-up to the enrolment in courses for higher education according to standards of education.

Statement 'XXV' is related to the enrolment of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribe students in classes for higher education. There were 2,763 Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes students, comprising of 2,526 Boys and 237 Girls, enrolled in classes for higher education. The percentage of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe students to the total enrolment in classes for higher education was 4.2. The corresponding percentage for Boys was 5.6 and for Girls it was 1.1.

TEACHERS

The total number of teachers teaching in institutions of higher education in 1965-66 in Punjab was 4,018 (3,283 Male teachers and 735 Female teachers). Of the total 363 (346 Males and 17 Females) were teaching in Universities and Research Institutions; 2,169 (1,735 Men and 434 Women) in colleges for General education and 1,486 (1,202 Men and 284 Women) in colleges for Professional and Other education. District-wise details are given in Statement 'XXVI'.

EXPENDITURE

The total direct expenditure incurred on higher education during the year under report amounted to Rs.4,02,15,827. Of this, expenditure on Arts and Science Colleges accounted for Rs.1,42,12,160, Medical colleges for Rs.51,23,936, Engineering colleges Rs.16,36,498, Teachers Training colleges Rs.17,06,001, Colleges for Professional and Other education Rs.25,64,942 Universities Rs.1,49,72,281. The percentage of expenditure on Higher education to total direct expenditure was 29.4. The cost per student in Arts and Science colleges was calculated as Rs.351.2, in Engineering colleges Rs.1,168.1, in Teachers Training colleges Rs.253.2 and in University Teaching Department Rs.5,533.
